



BEHOLDER PROVES UNBEATABLE

After putting in one of the most spectacular performances of the season when defeating males in the GI Pacific Classic Aug. 22, **Beholder** (Henny Hughes) easily captured her third straight renewal of Santa Anita's GI Zenyatta S. in what was the equivalent of a paid workout. With this victory, the two-time champion earned an all expenses paid trip to Keeneland for the GI Breeders' Cup Distaff, which she won in 2013 and was forced to miss last year due to illness, but she is likely to face males in the GI Breeders' Cup Classic instead. **Cont. p6**

SOARING TO THE BREEDERS' CUP

Unbeaten 'TDN Rising Star' **Songbird** (Medaglia d'Oro) made easy work of Saturday's GI Chandelier S. at Santa Anita, a 'Win and You're In' event for the GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies, coasting home to a sensational 4 1/2-length wire-to-wire decision over **Land Over Sea** (Bellamy Road). Her final time of 1:43.79 was just a shade over a second faster than Nyquist (Uncle Mo)'s final clocking in the GI FrontRunner S. held earlier on the card. "It lived up to the expectations," Hall of Fame jockey Mike Smith said. "She opens that stride up and she has such a high cruising speed. Not only does she have the ability, but she has the mind to go with it. There are so many horses with that kind of ability, but a lot can get to them." **Cont. p9**

Big Blue Kitten settled in well back as rabbit Shining Copper ensured plenty of pace, opening up a double-digit lead early through impossible splits for the distance of :23.79, :47.18 and 1:11.45. The 7-year-old began to advance rapidly as the leader threw in the towel approaching the straight, and was stacked four or five wide as he asserted past the quarter pole. Hitting the front in the blink of an eye, he took several awkward strides approaching the line, but was never in serious threat of relinquishing his advantage.

Big Blue Kitten's winning time bested the course record of 2:24.36 posted by Fantastic Light in the 2001 GI Breeders' Cup Turf.

"He's just such a good horse, so honest and puts you to it all," said veteran pilot Joe Bravo, who was celebrating his latest highlight in what has been a banner year in the saddle.

"You're watching the pace, but it's kind of nice to sit back and see the pace unfolding. The pace was sort of 'stop go, stop go' but at the top of the stretch, I said 'go' and he said 'okay.' I had my hands full with him but I thought, 'hey, let them catch us now... When it comes down to it, he's an amazing horse and he deserves to hold a track record. He's done so good that he makes you look good."

Big Blue Kitten kicked off his season successfully in the local Gill Fort Marcy S. May 2, and was second to Slumber in the GI Manhattan S. June 6. He took a second GI United Nations S. at Monmouth July 5 over that same runner and Twilight Eclipse, and was last seen missing by a neck in the GI Arlington Million Aug. 15--just 3/4 of a length in front of Shining Copper.

"I thought they both ran terrific," Chad Brown said of the top two. "[Saturday], Big Blue Kitten got the better of Slumber at a mile and a half. I'm proud of both horses. The race pretty much went the way I expected. Shining Copper has run admirably all summer as the pacemaker for us; nearly won a couple of Grade Is. I didn't want to deter from our plan of him being the pacemaker, and we stuck with that plan. He did his job and set up the race for Big Blue Kitten and his stablemate. Maybe with 70 yards to go, I was a little concerned, but he had enough." **Cont. p4**

Park last April. Rock Fall entered riding a perfect four-for-four season, including a dazzling performance while making his stakes debut in the GII True North S. at Belmont June 5 and a hard-fought decision over The Big Beast (Yes It's True) in Saratoga's GI Alfred G. Vanderbilt H. last time Aug. 1.

Not much of a secret in this one, Rock Fall tracked from a perfect spot in third as Wildcat Red (D'wildcat) and Weekend Hideaway (Speightstown) knocked heads through sharp opening splits of :22.23 and :45.21. Ranging up three wide turning for home, Rock Fall was immediately collared to his outside and headed by Stallwalkin' Dude as they straightened off the turn.

Hand-ridden by a confident Javier Castellano, Rock Fall battled back from along the inside to turn back Stallwalkin' Dude down the lane and held off a smart late rally from that one's stablemate to record his second straight at the highest level.

"He's blessed with a lot of natural talent, but to go along with that, he's got a lot of fight, which is great," trainer Todd Pletcher said. "There are a lot of similarities between him and his sire [Speightstown] and the way they train. You wouldn't necessarily know they're as good as they are. Watching in the mornings, he can be a little idle, but you just have confidence that come game time he'll show up. He takes care of himself well. I was a little worried, I didn't quite overdo it with training coming into this race. I wanted to get this one and still have something for the Breeders' Cup, so I was hoping I didn't cut it too close and he pulled it out. It's a fine line between running well in the prep and hoping you have something left for the Breeders' Cup. He's been winning races since March and seven in a row so we just want to continue ticking over."

Rock Fall is the first foal from the multiple stakes winner Renda (Medaglia d'Oro). Her 2-year-old Barbarenda (Sidney's Candy) debuted with a sharp victory at Gulfstream last weekend. She also has an unraced 3-year-old colt by Super Saver and a yearling filly by Bodemeister, who brought \$300,000 at this year's Keeneland September Sale. She was bred to Paynter this spring.

'TDN Rising Star' Wedding Toast was backed like she was ready to roll off the bench here, and the Sheikh Mohammed homebred did just that with another dominating performance. The dark bay capped a four-race win streak in Aqueduct's GIII Comely S. in November of 2013, but made just one start at four when second to MGISW Princess of Sylmar (Majestic Warrior) in the Cat Cay S. in Ozone Park. She resurfaced this January to take Gulfstream's seven-panel Miami Shores H. Jan. 7, but settled for third at odds-on behind House Rules (Distorted Humor) in that venue's GIII Rampart S. some six weeks later. Fourth in Keeneland's GI Madison S. Apr. 4, she found her best form again when annexing the local GII Ruffian S. by four lengths May 9, and followed up with a commanding five-length defeat of champion Untapable (Tapit) in the lucrative GI Ogden Phipps S. here June 6.

Able to get the lead without trying particularly hard for it, the chalk doled out splits of :24.11, a quicker 47.57, and 1:11.28. Curalina and Catch My Drift made runs at the leader turning for home, but she quickly shut the door on those advances to score in hand.

"[The layoff was] not much of a concern if you saw her worktab," said conditioner Kieran McLaughlin. "Last week, she worked three quarters in [1:12 3/5 at Greentree Sept. 11], so she's been fit. She just had a little foot issue and we had to skip the [GI] Personal Ensign [at Saratoga Aug. 29] and then, thinking about it, we thought this was a better spot anyway because she loves the one turn. As good form as she's in, she'll be able to handle two turns [in the GI Breeders' Cup Distaff]. She's won at two turns. But this race was here and it's a Grade I, so it worked out well. I don't say it very often, but I asked [Jose Lezcano] not to give her a hard race if he didn't have to because she looked that good on paper. We have a big race in five weeks. Couldn't have asked for better, it really went perfect."

Wedding Toast is out of an unraced half-sister to MGISW Congaree (Arazi) and GISP Sangaree (Awesome Again). Godolphin had previously won this race three times--in 2002, 2008 and 2009--with Saeed bin Suroor trainees Imperial Gesture, Cocoa Beach and Music Note.

Firing a six-panel bullet here in 1:12 4/5 Sept. 18, Beholder was hammered down to heavy favoritism in this overmatched field, whose other entrants were all at double digit odds with the second choice being GISW Warren's Veneda (Affirmative) at 11-1. Away well from the outside post in this nine-horse affair, the Spendthrift colorbearer was floated out wide on the first turn, but was quickly settled in to sit in a two-wide fourth under the expert guidance of Gary Stevens through an opening quarter in :23.43. Inched closer to look the pacesetter My Sweet Addiction in the eye after a half in :47.43, the bay stuck her head in front, but had yet to be asked by Stevens as she glided around the far turn into the stretch. Still motionless in the irons, Stevens took a look over his shoulder to see he was clear of the pacesetter with no one else even

close. It was obvious the plan was to save something for the Breeders' Cup as the Hall of Fame pilot remained still in the saddle and allowed Beholder to simply canter home the easiest of winners. It was not only the dual Eclipse winner's third victory in the Zenyatta, but it was also her ninth win at the highest level.

"Richard [Mandella] has a big smile on his face," Stevens said. "He told me yesterday, 'I want to win but by no means do I want to knock her out.' We couldn't have scripted it any better. I told him that he might have to tack-walk her in the morning because she pulled up full of it."

"It really was pretty much what I had hoped for from her," Hall of Famer Richard Mandella said. "I hate to say 'easy,' but it really did look easy. She needed to run because she had nothing but rest since the Pacific Classic. She had one good workout, the rest was just rest, so she needed the race or a really good work or several good works. I actually thought with the [high] temperatures, maybe I shouldn't run. Then I thought, if I scratch her, something else could come up, then everything would be messed up, so I stuck with it and I'm glad I did."

Named champion 2-year-old filly in 2012 following a close second in the GI Del Mar Debutante S. and a win in the GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies, Beholder proved to be just as good at three with victories in the GI Las Virgenes S. and GI Santa Anita Oaks prior to finishing a close second to Princess of Sylmar (Majestic Warrior) in the GI Kentucky Oaks. She reeled off three more wins, including her first Zenyatta and the 2013 Distaff, to clinch her second consecutive championship title. The bay kicked off an abbreviated 2014 campaign with a win in the Santa Lucia S. here and was fourth to champion Close Hatches (First Defence) in Belmont's GI Ogden Phipps S. before returning to Arcadia to take her second Zenyatta. Forced to miss a title defense in the Distaff due to illness, she was also scratched from the Fasig-Tipton November sale and owner B. Wayne Hughes decided to race her another season.

That decision proved to be a wise one as Beholder returned better than ever with another win in Santa Anita's Santa Lucia S. Apr. 10. Easily winning this venue's GIII Adoration S. June 13, the 5-year-old romped by seven lengths in the GI Clement L. Hirsch S. in Oceanside Aug. 1. Facing males and trying 1 1/4 miles for the first time in Del Mar's GI Pacific Classic Aug. 22, Beholder easily disposed of her rivals and cruised home to become the first female winner of the race by a jaw-dropping 8 1/4 lengths.

Beholder's stakes-winning dam Leslie's Lady (Tricky Creek), who is also responsible for GISW Into Mischief (Harlan's Holiday), has an unraced 2-year-old filly named Leslie's Harmony (Curlin) and a weanling colt by Scat Daddy.

Taking up her preferred position at the head of affairs while trying two turns for the first time here, the Fox Hill Farms runner ticked off early splits of :23.14 and :46.85 while maintaining an unpressured advantage. Showing the way off the turn for home as Land Over Sea attempted to make a run at her, Mike Smith shook the reins, and it was immediately all over.

"It was very exciting," Jerry Hollendorfer's assistant trainer Dan Ward commented. "It was just what we wanted. She showed she can go two turns and now we've got five weeks [until the Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies Oct. 30]."

Smith added, "She's so intelligent, she's so smart and listens to everything I tell her. I got her to fall asleep there on the lead, but she fell asleep too much! I had to wake her up a little bit at the eighth pole, but after that, she jumped back into the bridle and it was over."

He continued, "She acted up a little bit at the break. I think breaking in front of the crowd the first time made her a little nervous. I was lucky to get away as well as I did, but she's so big and strong that when those horses came together on her, it just made her go forward."

A runaway debut winner sprinting at Del Mar July 26, Songbird proved much the best after dueling clear to a 5 1/2-length victory in the seven-panel GI Del Mar Debutante S. Sept. 5.

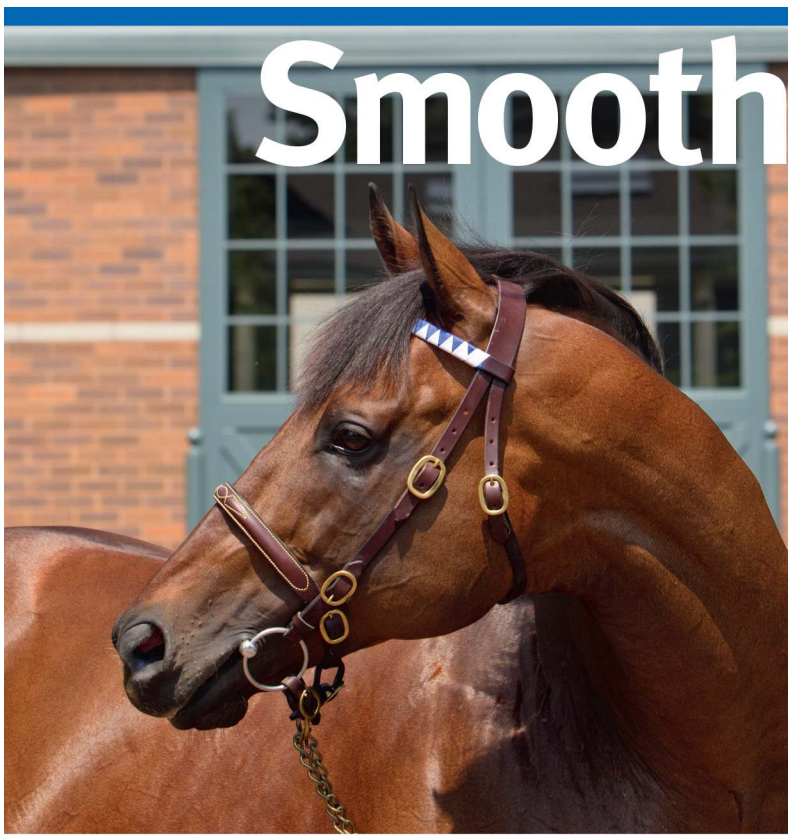

The bay took the next logical step in the Aug. 8 GII Best Pal S. at Del Mar, and there was no doubt about the outcome this time around, as he attended the pace three wide before racing away to best Swipe by better than five lengths. Those two renewed acquaintances once again in the GI Del Mar Futurity Sept. 7 and the outcome was not quite as decisive, but equally convincing, as Nyquist bounded home 3 3/4 lengths to the good of Swipe, with **'TDN Rising Star'** Blameitonthelaw (Blame) further back in third.

Nyquist broke alertly enough, but found himself the meat of a sandwich early as Go Long (Congrats) pushed through to lead at the fence and Mt Veeder (Ghostzapper) raced to his outside. The heavy chalk

raced a bit greenly and ducked out into the first turn, causing Mt Veeder to take some evasive action, but settled in from second through an opening couple of furlongs in :23.04. Blameitonthelaw traveled comfortably along the inside from fourth, just ahead of Swipe, who was

kept beneath Kent Desormeaux as they reached the midpoint of the backstretch. Nyquist was asked to come after Go Long leaving the three-eighths marker and he went for home, but Mt Veeder wasn't done quite yet, and that kept Swipe on hold for an extra fraction of a second. Nyquist came just wide enough off the turn to allow Desormeaux the chance to send Swipe through that tight spot, and although the two rivals brushed 100 yards from the wire, Nyquist stayed on for the narrow success. A stewards' inquiry into the stretch run yielded no change.

"That stretch run was probably a treadmill test for the cardiologist," trainer Doug O'Neill commented. "I guess I'm OK, but that was truly so exciting, but when you're 3-5 [actually 1-2] or whatever his odds were, you're thinking you're going to win by five [lengths] geared down, the jockey looking under his arm, all that stuff. This one, Mario really had to ride a smart race after the way it started and through the stretch. He did a great job."

The winner's dam is a half-sister to Seeking the Sky (Storm Cat), herself the dam of GI Met Mile hero Sahara Sky (Pleasant Tap). Seeking Gabrielle, who RNAD for \$80,000 carrying Nyquist in utero at the 2012 Keeneland November sale, is represented by a yearling filly by Blame, who was purchased by Bridlewood Farm for \$330,000 to top the ninth session of the Keeneland September sale. Barren to Curlin this year, she was bred to Flatter in 2015.

of that tiring rival in the lane and sailed clear to earn the first Grade I victory for both himself and his trainer Victor Garcia. "I expected him to run big," Garcia said. "He had a lot of trouble in his last race. He was washed out, stumbled from the gate, was four or five

wide both turns and only got beat a length and a quarter. I worked the horse twice and he worked real good. Tyler [Baze] was real happy with it. We'll go to the Breeders' Cup [Classic], absolutely. This will be my second Breeders' Cup. I ran a filly named Approved to Fly in 1988 [fourth in the Juvenile Fillies]."

Baze added, "This is his fourth race and from the very beginning Victor [Garcia] told me he could really run and he proved it. I worked him last week and ever since I've been on him down at Del Mar he's turned into a monster work horse in the morning; he really wants to do it. Last week, Victor wasn't here, he was at the Keeneland Sale. He called and told me to go seven eighths in 1:28. I literally breezed him in 1:25. I called him and told him 'that's as easy as he wants to go and he did it the right way.' I told him to dress up for [today] because I'm expecting him to run big and he did."

A debut winner going seven panels at Santa Anita June 27, Smooth Roller won his two turn debut by a nose in a Del Mar optional claimer Aug. 1 and finished fourth after a trouble trip last time in that venue's one-mile Harry F. Brubaker S. Aug. 26. His dam has an unraced juvenile colt names Jungang Sinhwa (Harlan's Holiday) and was bred to Animal Kingdom this year.

Not a lot of fillies are brave enough to go through a hole like that but she just rocketed through there and I was lucky to get the good trip."

Motion's assistant Anne Sinchak added, "She's been a class act. She loves the track, she loves the heat, and it's beautiful here. You just have to keep them happy, and they'll run the way they like to... I think the race just fit. She's been training well, and Graham seems to like it here--we do well here. It fit well in her schedule, and it's a 'Win and You're In' race."

forced to steady sharply in the lane.

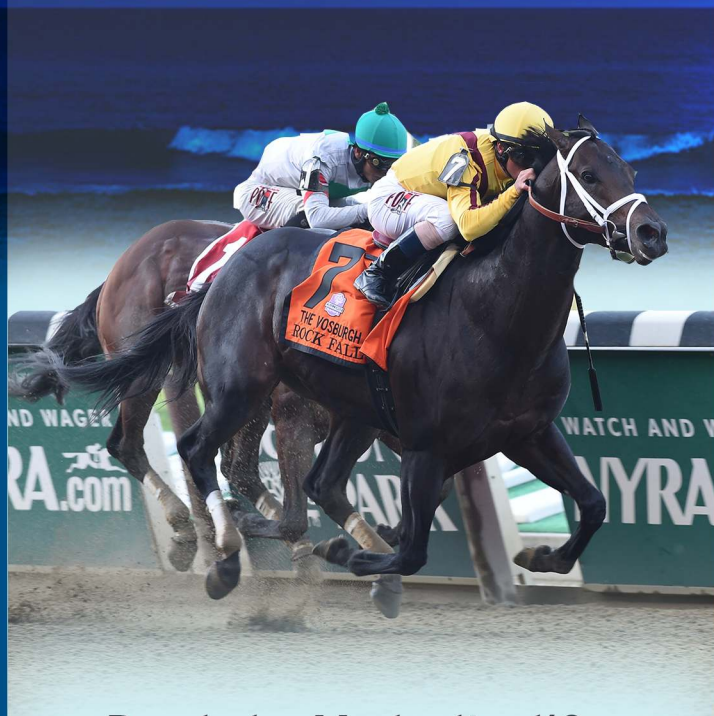
"He broke very good and he was in a good position the whole way," said rider Jose Lezcano of the winner's trip. "At the half mile pole, everybody started to move a little bit and the pace started to quicken, so I had to move with the group. After that I got cut out, but this is a very talented horse. He does everything easy. When everyone started moving, I had some pressure and was a little out of it, but he still did everything right. He's a very nice horse. The last time I rode him, he was a little bit lugging on the bit, but this time he was very relaxed and after this race, I have a lot of respect for him. He's a very nice and talented colt."

Isotherm becomes the first stakes and graded stakes winner in the U.S. for his sire (by Lonhro {Aus}), whose first North American-sired runners are juveniles. Australia's 2004 Racehorse of the Year and 2011 leading sire stood at Darley's Jonabell Farm from 2012-2014. He currently resides at Darley Kelvinside.

Isotherm is the first foal to race out of MSP Game for More. He has a yearling full-sister (who sold for \$95,000 at Keeneland September to Equix's Brendan Heeney) and a weanling half-sister by Gio Ponti. Game for More was bred back to To Honor and Serve.

"We bought him in the Keeneland September sale last year," noted owner Matthew Schera of Isotherm. "We all loved him. Everyone can see he's one of the prettier horses around. I kept telling everyone that he trains better than he ran last time, but he still won, so we kind of expected something more today and it looks like he came out and he did it. We even think he likes the dirt too, so we'll see down the road for that. As long as he comes out good and he's healthy, we'll go to Keeneland for the [Oct. 30 GI] Breeders' Cup Juvenile Turf."

"She's a nice filly, a real sweet-looking, athletic type [that] seems to have a decent turn of foot," Brown said of the former. "She's breezed twice for us and she seems to be improving. I wish we had her longer, but based on what I saw in her latest breeze, she deserves a shot in the race."

Brown has won this race the past three years with Watsdachances (Ire) (Diamond Green {Fr}); Testa Rossi (Fr) (Dr Fong); and Lady Eli (Divine Park). He also won it with Maram (Sahm) in 2008. Maram and Ladi Eli, of course, went on to victories on the big stage in the GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies Turf.

Team Valor International and Gary Barber's **Belvoir Bay (GB)** (Equilano {Fr}), a handicap winner at Goodwood July 31, also makes the trip across the pond. She was last seen finishing fourth in Goodwood's seven-furlong G3 Prestige S. Aug. 29. Richard Hannon Jr. trains.

Thrilled (Uncle Mo), a game debut winner at the Spa Aug. 9, was a well-beaten second in a soggy renewal of the P.G. Johnson Sept. 3. "She came out of the [last] race in good form," trainer Todd Pletcher's assistant Byron Hughes said. "She looks good, very fit and has been training very well. We hope for a big effort."

A Santa Anita optional claimer winner off the trainer change from Jeff Bonde to Jerry Hollendorfer May 30, he was most recently a close-up third with a bit of stretch trouble in Del Mar's El Cajon

Aug. 29.

ANOTHER SOLID SEPTEMBER IN THE BOOKS

Yearlings by Tapit and War Front were in demand. John Ferguson and Ben Glass struck early and often. And there were improvements in the middle and lower sections of the market. All in all, it was a successful, and yes, mostly predictable, conclusion to the 12-session Keeneland September Sale Saturday in Lexington. But there's nothing wrong with predictability these days, not with visions of turmoil still lingering in the industry's rearview mirror.

"It was as strong, steady two weeks of selling," said Keeneland Director of Sales Geoffrey

Russell. "The momentum generated during Book 1 carried on through the end of the sale, and we surpassed the 2014 gross on Friday's second-to-last session. It was a good sale."

First, the numbers. From a catalog of 4,164, Keeneland sold 2,745 yearlings for \$281,496,100. The resulting average was \$102,549, up 3.3% from \$99,312. The record-equalling median was \$50,000--the same as it was in 2014 and in 2013.

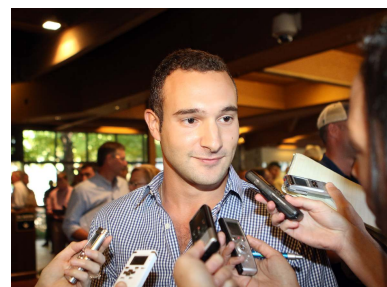
In 2014, from a catalog of 4,181, Keeneland sold 2,819 horses for \$279,960,500. The RNA came in at 24.2%. Last year, it was 21.8%.

Topping September was a Gainesway-consigned colt by resident stallion Tapit who sold to Mandy Pope's Whisper Hill Farm for \$2.1 million. Pope outbid, among others, trainer Bob Baffert and client Kaleem Shah to secure the Hip 614, a son of Silver Colors (Mr. Greeley).

"He was a super colt, and had all the qualities you look for in a yearling," said Gainesway's Michael Hernon. "His granddam was the Kentucky Derby-winning filly Winning Colors, and the right people ended up on him. Mandy Pope was determined to buy him. Hopefully, he's a good one. We'd be delighted to have him back as a stallion and stand him for her."

The colt was among the 11 seven-figure yearlings at September. Last year, there were 13, led by the \$2.2-million and subsequently group-placed Air Vice Marshal (War Front).

There was a new look to the September Sale. Keeneland tweaked last year's format, shortening Book 1 from four days to three, while adding horses to each day. "The new format worked well," said Russell. "Our goal was to get as many horses in front of buyers as possible. The way we laid it out, the Book 2 buyers

were out there when the Book 3 horses were here, and I think that helped the sale along the way." One striking aspect of the sale was the remarkable variation of buyers at the top of the market. There were 31 horses who brought \$700,000 or more at September. Twenty-five of them were purchased by separate entities, as listed on the sales sheets, though some--such as the \$1.5-million Bernardini filly out of Pilfer that Justin Zayat signed for--were bought for partnerships that included other buyers on the list. (Zayat was teaming with the Coolmore partners.)

"I think it's very positive for the market," said Russell. "It's good to see these horses spread around to numerous people. It shows that people are willing to spend. Pre-2008, the top was dominated by two entities [Coolmore and Darley], and now it's spread around much more, and I think that helps the industry."

If there was great variation to the buyers who acquired the upper-echelon horses, some observers said there just simply wasn't enough of them to push the market forward at that level. Or, at the very least, the increasing selectivity of those buyers meant significant soft spots.

"The most interesting thing I saw was the composition and behavior of the buyers and lookers," said Bluewater Sales's Meg Levy. "The momentum ramped up drastically from Book 1 to Book 2, and the buying bench broadened dramatically."

Bloodstock agent Ben McElroy agreed.

"I think we all were a bit taken aback by the 30% RNA rate after the first week, but Book 2 and Book 3 picked up, and it was certainly a vibrant market during the second week," said McElroy.

That vibrancy was evidenced by the fact that, in 10 of the sale's 12 sessions, the highest-priced yearling exceeded the top price of the corresponding session last year.

Both Levy and McElroy said that vet reports played a big factor in getting horses sold.

"We had a very dry July and August, and there seemed to be quite a lot of sesamoiditis when you went to vet them," said McElroy. "If you're a practical person, that shouldn't really be an issue. But it had an effect, I think."

There was good foreign participation at the sale, with operations like Japan's Shadai Farm appearing on the docket. But Russell said a bullish U.S. dollar might ultimately have had a limiting impact.

"There were some buyers who maybe didn't buy as many as they had in the past," he said. "And I think we were missing some people because of the strength of the dollar. But we don't have much control of that."

Russell was encouraged by the success that relatively recent entrants into the North American market had as both breeders and buyers. Goncalo Torrealba, whose family purchased a majority interest in Three Chimneys Farm in 2012, bred two of the sale's top four horses, including the \$1.65 million Tapit--Pure Clan colt and the \$1.5 million Bernardini--Pilfer filly. Mandy Pope's Whisper Hill Farm, meanwhile, bred the \$1.45-million War Front--Betterbetterbetter (Ire) filly.

"It's always good to see new investors--especially those who have come in at the higher level--do well in the market," said Russell. "Goncalo Torrealba, Mandy Pope and Don Alberto all had very good sales. And they haven't just invested heavily in horses. Mr. Torrealba and Don Alberto [the operation that acquired the old Vinery property] have also invested heavily in Central Kentucky, having bought major farms here. That's a positive for the longevity of our business."

And the Winners Are...

Perennial leader Taylor Made Sales Agency once again topped the consignors list by gross at September, with 256 horses sold for \$32,822,200 (\$128,212 average). Second on that list was Lane's End, with 179 sold for \$25,156,900 (\$140,541 average), followed by Gainesway, with 119 sold for \$23,489,900 (\$197,394 average).

The latter had what Gainesway's Michael Hernon called a "breakout sale," having sold three of the top four horses. In addition to the \$2.1 million Tapit topper, Gainesway sold both of the Three Chimneys-bred horses to make seven figures.

"It was a great group of horses, probably the best we've brought over in recent memory," said Hernon. "There were no holes across the board, and they were really well received."

Hernon thanked Torrealba in particular, and related a story about the Three Chimneys chief.

"Mr. Torrealba is friends with [Gainesway owner] Antony [Beck], and was over at the farm a few years ago," he said. "I got to spend some time with him down at the stallion complex. I happened to ask him back then who would consign some of these horses produced by the good mares he was buying. And he looked me in the eye and said, 'You.' In any case, Three Chimneys afforded us a big opportunity to sell for them, and we're glad their horses sold well. They were top horses, and were very well produced by the farm."

Darley rep John Ferguson was September's leading buyer, with 24 horses purchased for \$8,235,000 (\$343,125 average). Crupi's New Castle ranked next, with 24 bought for \$7,085,000 (\$295,208 average). Gary and Mary West's farm manager Ben Glass was the leading buyer by head, with 26 purchased for \$5,550,000 (\$213,462), and was the sale's third-leading buyer by gross.

War Front and **Tapit** once again dominated the stallion rankings. War Front had 21 sell for an average of \$600,714; Tapit had 32 sell for \$526,875.

The GI Arkansas Derby winner **Bodemeister** (Empire Maker) led all freshman sires with 48 sold for an average of \$178,583. That wasn't a surprise to Ben McElroy.

"I liked the Bodemeisters a lot," McElroy said. "You could see the Empire Maker in them. They're racy, nice horses, though I don't know how early they'll be."

McElroy said the same couldn't be said for the surprise third-ranked freshman sire (with more than one sold), **The Factor** (War Front), who averaged \$124,298 off an initial fee of just \$15,000.

“You'd probably fancy they'd be early,” said McElroy. “He's by one of the top sires in America, he was lightening quick, and he ran on the dirt. He seems to be getting horses who will go on both turf and dirt, and you'd think they'd be precocious. It will be interesting to see how many wind up in Europe.”

WATSDACHANCES KEEPS BEVERLY D.

In an eight-page decision handed down Friday by the Illinois Racing Board, the decision to disqualify **Secret Gesture (Ire)** (Galileo {Ire}) from first to third in the GI Beverly D. S. Aug. 15 for coming across and interfering with **Stephanie's Kitten** (Kitten's Joy) was upheld, as was a \$1,500 fine handed down to Secret Gesture's jockey Jamie Spencer. The action allows **Watsdachances (Ire)** (Diamond Green {Fr}), who outfinished Stephanie's Kitten for second and was the adjudged winner, to keep the race.

In his decision, Marc Laino, the former executive director of the Illinois Racing Board, laid out the testimony provided in a hearing held Sept. 16 and 17 in

downtown Chicago during which the IRB called as witnesses the stewards on hand for the Beverly D., jockeys Irad Ortiz Jr. (Stephanie's Kitten) and Joe Bravo (Watsdachances) and jockey Angel Cordero. Darrel McHargue appeared on behalf of

the connections of Watsdachances, while Spencer and expert witnesses Bernie Hettel and Steve Cauthen testified on behalf of the petitioners in the case, Qatar Racing and Newsells Park Stud, who were represented by Karen Murphy. Cordero testified despite the opposition of the petitioners, while Cauthen's testimony was allowed over the objection of the IRB and Joel Turner, the attorney representing the connections of Watsdachances.

Secret Gesture led into the final stages of the 9 1/2-furlong Beverly D., but came out from the "two to the five path," according to Laino's report and came across Stephanie's Kitten, whose jockey Ortiz was forced to "check and pull up to avoid clipping heels [sic] or colliding with 'Secret Gesture.'" ([video](#)). During his testimony, Arroyo, a former jockey and chief steward and the only of the three stewards to vote in favor of allowing Secret Gesture to keep the race originally, stated that he felt that "Ortiz exaggerated or feigned his

checking maneuver knowing he was not going to place first in the race.” Arroyo, who voted in favor of the decision to penalize Spencer for careless riding, did stipulate that he too would have acted in the spirit of safety ahead of winning if put in a precarious situation.

For his part, Spencer admitted that Secret Gesture drifted out to her right in the lane, but that he took corrective action and was “clear of Ortiz at all times, including when he crossed in front of Ortiz.” Though other testimony from Hettel and Cauthen attempted to implicate Ortiz as the guilty party, Laino wrote that their statements were outweighed by those of Ortiz, Bravo and Cordero, among others, whose testimony was deemed “more credible” and was supported by the multiple angle video entered as part of the evidence.

Ultimately, the petitioners’ assertion that Ortiz ‘grandstanding’, or overreaction, cost he and Stephanie’s Kitten a clear second-place finish, was “not supported by the evidence or the testimony.” Laino writes that, “It is clear Ortiz’s action to check his horse and pull up was solely to avoid collision and injury or become unseated.” He goes on to say that Ortiz assumed a riding position immediately after the incident.

The decision to uphold the disqualification came only days after the Qatar Racing team successfully argued that Simple Verse (Ire) (Duke of Marmalade {Ire}) was wrongly stripped of the victory in the G1 St Leger S. at Doncaster.

After a clueless beginning when last of eight in the six-furlong Olympic Glory Conditions S. on Newbury's Lockinge card May 16, Shalaa has come forward in leaps and bounds and quickly set the record straight with a maiden win in this town a fortnight later 10 days prior to registering an upset in the July S. Defying a subsequent three-pound penalty when following up from the front in the Richmond at Glorious Goodwood July 30, the bay had to deal with the testing surface that often blights Deauville in the Aug. 23 Prix Morny, but was just too good for the admirable G2 Prix Robert Papin and G2 Flying Childers S. scorer Gutaifan (Ire) (Dark Angel {Ire}) regardless of unfavorable ground conditions. Kept company by Ajaya (GB) (Invincible Spirit {Ire}) throughout the early stages of this prize, Shalaa's relentless tempo eventually saw off that rival and it was only Buratino who gave any kind of threat as Newmarket's undulations came into play. Johnston runner a brief glimpse of hope as he lost some sparkle running downhill, he was able to reassert his superiority on the rise to the line.

“He didn't feel that great coming down into the dip and changed his legs a few times which cost him momentum, but showed good determination as he could easily have given up,” Dettori commented. “He's the fastest 2-year-old I've ridden. In the mornings, you put him behind a horse and he goes to sleep but at the races I haven't met a horse fast enough to lead him yet. On a flatter track, he would see it through to the line much better and if he stays a mile next year he'll be the next Frankel, but from what I see he is a sprinter.”

“He's been on the go since March and I was a little mindful to bring him here fresh,” trainer John Gosden said. “He was probably a little short of work, but at this stage of the year if you keep working the 2-year-olds you can flatten them. He's gone very fast--Ryan Moore came in and said he'd never been so fast over the first four furlongs over the Rowley Mile as he had in this race--and he's got a bit unbalanced going into the dip and changed his legs three or four times, but all in all we're delighted with him.” Gosden added, “He's the fastest 2-year-old I've had and is very professional--Harry [Herbert] said he was clocking 41mph there and that is very quick. He's got a good mind on him, too, which is very important and he reminds me of Oasis Dream, who broke the juvenile record here. He was also champion sprinter at three and this horse looks like a pure fast 2-year-old who will be a fast 3-year-old.”

The runner-up's conditioner Mark Johnston said of Buratino, "I just wonder if he was an early-season horse, but one thing I do know is the horse is very well and everything was right for today. Not seeing another rival when inflicting a heavy defeat on the subsequent maiden winner Sharja Queen (GB) (Pivotal {GB}) and the Listed Roses S. scorer Shadow Hunter (Ire) (Arcano {Ire}) on her racecourse bow at the July meeting, Lumiere entered the Lowther with unquestionable natural ability but lacking experience of battle, and that played against her as Besharah swept by on the rain-deadened ground. Sent straight into the lead under a daringly positive ride from William Buick, she relished being able to dominate as she had on her debut, but looked likely to be reeled in as Illuminate pounced inside the last furlong. She was joined on the run to the line, but never headed and gave that distinctive battling surge that typifies a Mark Johnston runner to repel that previously unbeaten rival. "I was pretty sure she was very good and was not as disappointed as you might think in the Lowther," her trainer said. "She'd not seen another horse before in a race and she did stick on there. Coming here today, I hadn't been as nervous before a race for a long time because I thought she's the best I've had for a long time. She had gone in her coat and was probably the biggest, tallest and rangiest horse here. I was sure she would stay, even though we also know she is very fast and has a tremendous cruising speed, so I told William to ride her with confidence. I am very hopeful she will stay a mile next year and told connections last week I thought she would win the Guineas--I hope I'm right."

Illuminate's trainer, Richard Hannon, said of the runner-up, "I thought the race was set up for us, but she just didn't go by. She ran a super race and traveled very well, she just got tired when she hit the rising ground."

Lumiere's fourth dam is Outstandingly (Exclusive Native), Eclipse champion 2-year-old filly and winner of the GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies and Hollywood Starlet S. Lumiere's dam, Screen Star, has a yearling colt by Exceed and Excel (Aus).

were very confident with how he had worked coming into this," Highclere's racing manager Harry Herbert commented. "Frankie said he is learning still, but was much better today and we head to the G1 Racing Post Trophy [at Doncaster Oct. 24] next. This is the first time he has been in a race, as his natural ability had taken him through his first two races. He hits the ground a little bit hard, so we wouldn't risk him on fast ground this year, but when he's a fully mature horse there would be less concern on that score." Herbert hinted the mile Classics could be on the agenda next year. "The 2000 Guineas has to be the race to aim at, as he has plenty of speed and pedigree-wise there is a big question mark about the Derby," he said. "He is so relaxed and goes through the motions so easily, so perhaps he could stretch out beyond a mile and a quarter next year." Dettori added, "He had to go through a gap and hit the front plenty early enough and thought he'd done enough, so it was a good learning curve for him. He's got a bright future and a mile is a minimum."

Alex Cole, racing manager for Deauville's part-owner Fitri Hay, said of the runner-up, "He's a lovely horse that needs further and we are just looking forward to next year with him. The faster the ground the better for the horse."

Foundation becomes the third group winner for Europe's leading first-season sire Zoffany after his Royal Ascot-winning duo Illuminate (Ire) and Waterloo Bridge (Ire). Foundation has a handful of talented marathoners in his extended pedigree, including G1 Prix Royal-Oak winner Ardross (Ire) (Run the Gantlet) and G1 St Leger scorer Scorpion (Ire) (Montjeu {Ire}) under his third dam. Foundation's dam, Roystonea, has a yearling filly by Canford Cliffs (Ire) and a colt foal by Iffraaj (GB).

Veteran gelding Mourinho, let go at 16-1 here, earned a first Group 1 win for both himself and his trainer, Peter Gelagotis. A dual Group 3 winner in his younger years, Mourinho was pitched into Group 1 company for the first time in last year's 2000 meter Mackinnon S., where he finished seventh. He bounced back three weeks later when dropped back to 1200 meters to take the G2 Australia S. at Moonee Valley, and returned after a summer holiday to be third in the G1 C.F. Orr S. going 1400 meters over this strip. Victorious over another veteran Group 1 gelding, Happy Trails (Aus) (Good Journey), in the G2 Peter Young S. Feb. 28, Mourinho faltered to finish 13th in the G1 Australian Cup two weeks later and was shelved for the remainder of the autumn. The bay got back to his winning ways when taking the G2 Lawrence S. first-up over 1400 meters of this track Aug. 15, and entered this off a soundly beaten sixth in the G2 Dato'Tan Chin Nam S. at Moonee Valley three weeks ago. Settling down third, four lengths off the lead of The Cleaner on the fence racing down the backstretch, Mourinho and jockey Vlad Duric maintained their position as the field began to bunch approaching the 500 meter mark. Making their bid three-wide at the top of the lane, the winner needed the length of the stretch to wrangle the lead from The Cleaner, who was nailed by a fast-finishing Fawkner for second as Mourinho got his nose on the line just in time. Mourinho is expected to target the G1 Cox Plate

Oct. 17, and Duric told *Racing and Sports*, "He definitely can be competitive but I'm not going to sit here and crow he can win a Cox Plate, it's such a difficult race. I'm just glad he's won the race today and gets in now and we get our chance."

CHAMPION SIRE ZABEEL DIES

Zabeel (NZ) (Sir Tristram {Ire}--Lady Giselle {Fr}, by Nureyev), multiple champion sire in Australia and New Zealand the sire of 44 Group 1 winners, has died at age 29 at Sir Patrick Hogan's Cambridge Stud in New Zealand, where he was born and stood at stud since his retirement from racing in 1991.

Hogan revealed Zabeel passed away peacefully in his paddock, and said in a statement, "Zabeel was a sire who excelled at the very highest level and was able to carry on where his own great sire, Sir Tristram, had left off. He contributed to the Thoroughbred industry and excelled above all expectations, and having enjoyed his retirement for the past few years he will be sadly missed by all here at Cambridge Stud. He will be buried alongside his sire Sir Tristram in the very same tradition, with his tail facing the sunrise and his head facing the sunset."

"Zabeel gave so many people though his progeny the greatest thrill of winning so many races at the highest level," Hogan continued. "He surpassed all stallions that have come before him, past and present, in New Zealand. Four Cox Plates and three Melbourne Cups--what more can you say? So a big thank you from us all and God bless, rest in peace."

Bred by Hogan and campaigned by Sheikh Hamdan bin Rashid Al Maktoum, Zabeel was trained initially by Colin Hayes through his first two seasons and then Hayes's son, David, as a 4-year-old. His most important victory came in the G1 Australian Guineas, and he retired to Cambridge Stud with seven wins from 19 starts.

Hogan told the *TDN* in a 2013 feature that Zabeel was initially not well received by trainers, but they quickly changed their tune once his first crop began to find their feet.

"Trainers found they were difficult to handle, and they were a bit light-fleshed and a bit soft in the brain," Hogan noted. "So the next year when they came back to the sales at Karaka, a number of trainers said, 'look, we want to see your yearlings, but we don't want to see any more Zabeels. We don't think they're going to be any good.' But the following year, the third time back at the sales with the third crop, they changed

their tune and said, 'we want to see all the Zabeels you've got available.' It took a bit of time for Zabeel to get up and running with his progeny, but once he did, it's history now." [Click here](#) for the *TDN* feature.

Zabeel's first crop included the 10-time Group 1 winner Octagonal (NZ), bred by Hogan out of his blue-hen producer Eight Carat (GB). Octagonal, whose wins included the Australian Derby, Cox Plate, Australian Cup and Sires' Produce S., is carrying on the sire line through his Australian champion sire-son Lonhro (Aus).

That first crop also included Group 1 winners Jezabeel (NZ) and Cronus (NZ), and the high-class winners continued to flow. His 44 Group 1 winners also include Might and Power (NZ), who recorded a rare G1 Caulfield Cup, G1 Melbourne Cup and G1 Cox Plate triple; four-time Group 1 winner Sky Heights (NZ); Hong Kong superstar and G1 Dubai Sheema Classic winner Vengeance of Rain (NZ); and G1 Melbourne Cup winner Efficient (NZ).

Like many champion sires, Zabeel has also excelled as a broodmare sire. His daughters have produced 26 Group 1 winners, including G1 Cox Plate winner Ocean Park (NZ) (Thorn Park {Aus}); five-time Group 1 winner It's A Dundee (NZ) (High Chaparral {Ire}); four-time Group 1 winner Atlantic Jewel (Aus) (Fastnet Rock {Aus}); and G1 Crown Oaks winner Samantha Miss (Aus) (Redoute's Choice {Aus}).

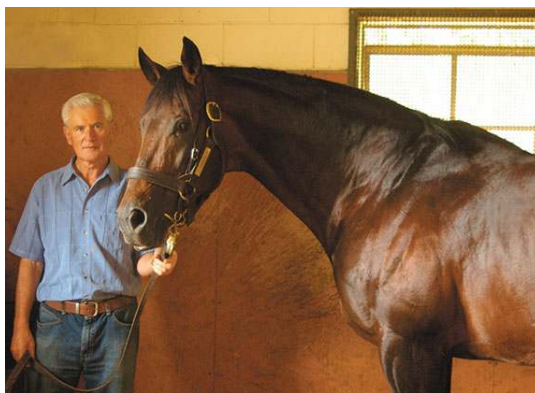
Zabeel was pensioned from stud duty in December 2013 after failing to get any of the around-30 mares bred to him in foal that season. His accolades thus far include four New Zealand sire championships and three New Zealand broodmare sire championships; two

Australian sire championships and three Australian broodmare sire championships; and 15 Dewar Stallion Trophies, an award presented by the New Zealand Thoroughbred Breeders' Association that recognizes the New Zealand stallion with the highest progeny earnings in Australia and New Zealand each season.

Zabeel's final crop of yearlings this year numbers five--four fillies and one colt--with two of those to be offered at New Zealand Bloodstock's Karaka sale in January. Hogan himself led the last

one through the ring, a colt consigned by Cambridge Stud that sold for NZ\$160,000.

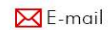
