## TIN TYPE GAL UP IN TIME

My Meadowview Farm homebred **Tin Type Gal** (Tapit) nabbed **Thrilled** (Uncle Mo) in the final strides to win the GIII Miss Grillo S. by the length of her nose Sunday at Belmont Park. Settled in mid-pack as longshots **Chinchilla Dust** (Freud) and **Look Who's Talking** (Cape Blanco {Ire}) set a measured pace up front, Tin Type Gal surged up three wide on the far turn and loomed a threat after three-quarters in 1:12.55. Thrilled was first to overtake the tiring pacesetters from the rail, but Tin Type Gal was finding her best stride late and powered to the lead in the final strides.

"You have to think about the [Oct. 30 GI] Breeders' Cup [Juvenile Fillies Turf], that's why we're here," confirmed winning trainer Graham Motion. "We're all pointing for those races. I was thrilled with the way she ran."

My Meadowview owner Len Riggio was also impressed with his filly's effort.

"I think it was great," Riggio said. "The jockey rode her great, she didn't even breathe heavy after the race. She looks like the real deal. She's a homebred and it feels good when you see them growing up. Looks like the Breeders' Cup is next; we're talking about it."

### SEPTEMBER MARKET: STEADY

There's a lot to be said for market stability, and as others have commented in the last couple of days, the Keeneland September market can only be described as 'steady.' A look at the accompanying Weekly Sales Ticker confirms this: the gross for North America's most important yearling sale finished up at \$281,496,100, for 2,745 yearlings sold, an average of \$102,549.

These figures were slight improvements on 2014, when 2,819 yearlings sold for \$279,960,500 and averaged \$99,312; but the 2015 figures mirror almost exactly the results from 2013, when 2,744 yearlings sold for \$280,491,300, and averaged \$102,220. So: 2,745 yearlings sold this year, compared to 2,744 in 2013; the gross was \$1,004,800 higher than in 2013, and the average increased by \$329, or three-tenths of one percent. That's a steady market; the only real difference is that with 256 more yearlings (6.5%) catalogued this year than in 2013, the clearance rate from the catalogues dropped from 70.2% two years ago to 65.9% this year, a drop of 4.3%. **Cont. p11**

**Tin Type Gal Up in Time (cont. from p1)**

“We had a very good break and I got into a good position,” winning rider Luis Saez said of his trip aboard Tin Type Gal. “When we came to the three-eighths [pole], I had so much horse. I asked her a little just to see what I had and she took off, so I thought, ‘Well, let’s go.’ I saw the other one coming through on the rail and I got a little worried when he got through. But I knew I had a lot of horse and when we got to the end, she fought with the other one and we beat them.”

Favored **Llanita (GB)** (Rock of Gibraltar {Ire}), making her U.S. debut, was in traffic in upper stretch and swung out five wide for running room to get up late for fourth.

Tin Type Gal was making her third start in the Miss Grillo. The chestnut filly was a well-beaten seventh while making her debut over a sloppy track in a 5 1/2-furlong off-the-turfer at Saratoga July 30. Stretched out to 1 1/16 mile and over a firm turf course, she graduated by one length at the Spa Aug. 23.

“She’s a nice filly,” trainer Graham Motion said. “I always thought she went better on the synthetic, which makes you think turf, but to be honest, I think she’ll handle the dirt. I think she’ll be a superior grass horse.”

Tin Type Gal is out of 2007 GI Personal Ensign S. winner Miss Shop (Deputy Minister), a half-sister to graded stakes winner and freshman sire Trappe Shot (Tapit). Miss Shop is also a half-sister to stakes winner Shop Again (Wild Again), the dam of Grade I winner Power Broker (Pulpit), stakes winner Fierce Boots (Tiznow) and Fast Retailing (Malibu Moon), the \$1-million Keeneland September yearling of 2013 who was a first-out winner at Saratoga in July. Miss Shop was bred to Super Saver this year.

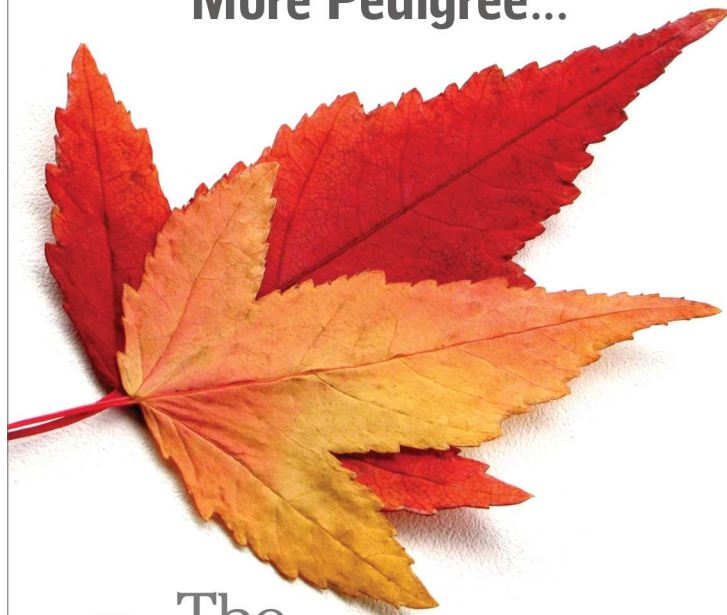

Alert Bay, who captured the GII Mathis Brothers Mile over this course and distance last December, was third over the main track in the Aug. 16 GIII Longacres Mile and returned to the lawn to take the Sept. 7 Rolling Green S. at Golden Gate last time out. The dark bay gelding settled off the pace while racing off the rail through an opening quarter in :22.69 and was inching closer after a half in :45.74. He tracked Avanzare three wide as they moved to challenge Big Cazanova entering the lane. Alert Bay kicked into another gear in the final furlong to overtake Big Cazanova and win going away. Winning trainer Blaine Wright credited owner Peter Redekop for the victory. "This was Mr. Redekop's decision to run here," Wright said. "I had a different race, but he wanted to keep him stretched out...this horse likes to be up near the running and is set up real good with a fast pace. I've never had such a versatile, hard-hitting horse as him; he can run on any surface. Obviously, he's best on turf but he can run on dirt and even Tapeta. Today was a blessing, Mr. Redekop deserves all the credit here." Asked if the Gi Breeders' Cup Mile was an option for Alert Bay, Wright said, "I'd certainly have to [think about Keeneland.] We faced a good group of horses today and now we'll get him back home, evaluate him, talk it over with Mr. Redekop and see what goes on from there. We kind of looked at it a while ago but we had a tough time getting going this year, getting him back to form. This past month has done well for him. It's almost like the switch gets flipped. It's been a real pleasure to train this type of horse. I really hope the Breeders' Cup is a possibility. This race should certainly let us think about it. He came out well and he wasn't breathing too hard."

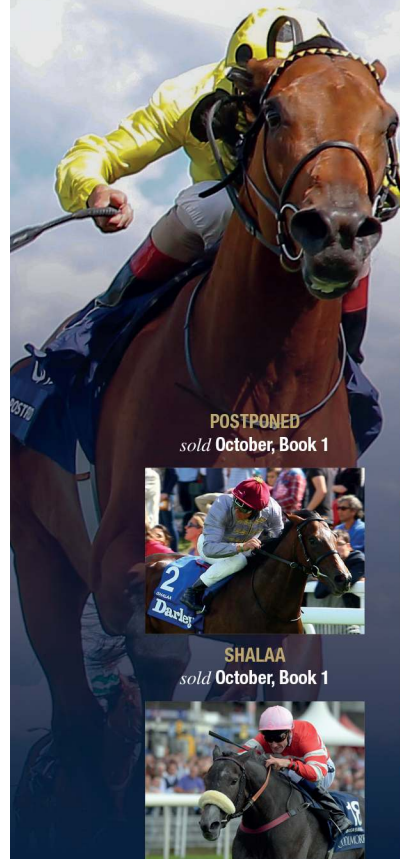

Local hopeful Shotgun Kowboy, who had made all six of his previous starts at the Remington Park oval, grabbed the lead from the start and held on late to become the second Oklahoma-bred to win the Oklahoma Derby in just his second start of the year. The dark bay gelding was third in the Kip Deville S. a year ago before taking the Oct. 17 Oklahoma Classics Juvenile S. He added the Clever Trevor S. Nov. 7 before ending his 2-year-old campaign when second, beaten a head by Bayerd (Speightstown) in the Dec. 14 Remington Springboard Mile S. He resurfaced with an 11 1/4-length romp versus state-bred allowance foes Aug. 29. Stretching out past a mile for the first time in his career, Shotgun Kowboy broke alertly and was in front the first time under the wire. He was pressed on the lead through fractions of :22.99 and :46.99 while under a snug hold and skipped clear willingly turning for home before determinedly holding off Desert Dynamo. Winning owner, breeder and trainer C.R. Trout said his instructions to jockey Clifton Berry were simple. "Here is the horse, he's yours for the next couple of minutes," Trout said he told Berry. "Do whatever you want to do and he did." For his part, Berry said, "I wanted him to get out of the gates good. I was surprised we were there [on the lead]. I took a hold of him, but nobody came and he was cruising, so I let him do it." Trout added, "We have been blessed. We've got a good team and they do a super job." The unraced Shotgun Jane produced a filly by Include in 2014, a colt by Mr. Nightlinger in 2015 and she was bred back to Midnight Lute. **Cont. p6**

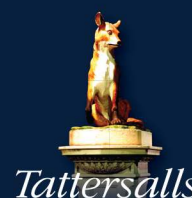

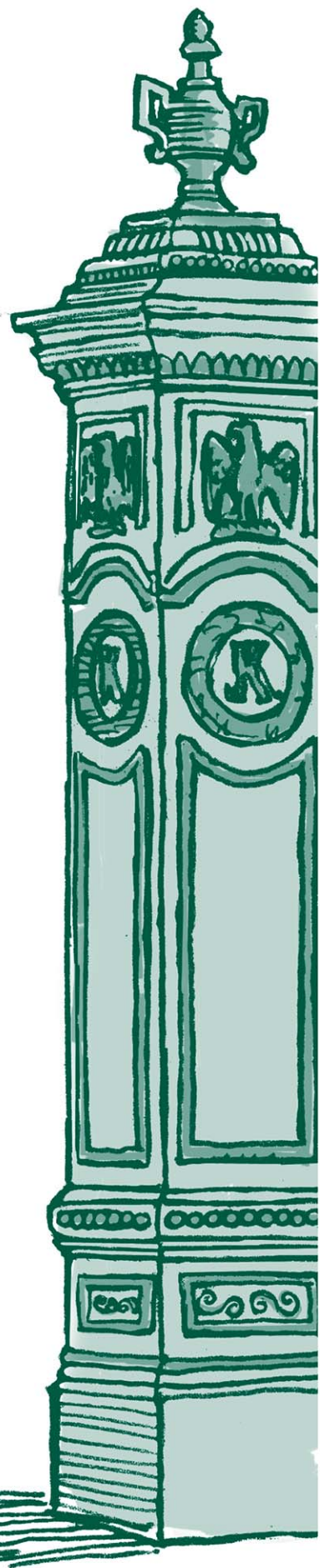

**ON TO BC TURF FOR KITTEN**

**Big Blue Kitten** (Kitten's Joy) is on target for the Oct. 31 GI Breeders' Cup Turf after his record-setting victory in Saturday's GI Joe Hirsch Turf Classic.

"It's nice to have the course record on Big Blue Kitten's resume," reported trainer Chad Brown, who also trains Turf Classic runner-up **Slumber (GB)** (Cacique {Ire}). "The horse deserves it. He came in as a 2-year-old for us and he's a horse that's been very consistent, reliable, and hard-knocking."

Brown said Big Blue Kitten will continue to train at Belmont Park before shipping to Keeneland for the championships.

"I don't see any reason to move Big Blue Kitten early," Brown explained. "He likes training in New York, so we're just going to leave him here and if all goes well bring him to Keeneland the week of the Breeders' Cup. I'll need to speak with each of the ownership groups for Slumber and **Shining Copper** (Aragorn {Ire}) [fifth after setting the pace in Turf Classic] and see what they want to do as well."

Brown also gave an upbeat bulletin on undefeated MGISW **Lady Eli** (Divine Park), who continues to recover from laminitis. The 3-year-old filly was last seen winning the July 4 GI Belmont Oaks.

"She's doing terrific right now," Brown said. "She's over at Dell Ridge Farm and she's been turned out a couple times a day and she's really enjoying that. All the members of her team are really happy with her progress. The plan is to give her a couple months in Kentucky and I plan on taking her back into my care maybe the end of November, beginning of December, down to Palm Meadows and start her back in light training."

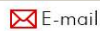

### September Market: Steady *(cont. from p1)*

But three years of market stability at Keeneland September doesn't tell the whole story. Recall that as far back as 2003, the first year after the July sale was 'suspended' (and, of course, it's still on sabbatical), there were 2,969 yearlings sold at Keeneland September, for a gross of \$274,125,300, and an average of \$92,329--figures roughly comparable to today, except that 8% fewer yearlings sold this year than in 2003, for about 3% more revenue, and an average about \$10,000 higher (11%). But in between we experienced a massive rise, and a massive fall.

In 2004, the Keeneland September Sale broke the \$300-million barrier for the first time, with a gross of \$324.9 million and an average of \$96,410. In 2005, the gross was \$384.3 million and the average \$108,420 for 3,545 yearlings sold. The gross and average peaked in 2006, when 3,566 yearlings sold for \$399,791,800 (that was one \$210,000 bid short of \$400 million) and averaged \$112,427. In 2007, the number sold peaked at 3,799--that's 1,054 more (38%) than in this year's sale, which tells us something about the decline in the North American foal crop.

Then, in 2008, the World Financial Crisis hit. The 2008 September Sale declined, but not precipitously: 3,605 yearlings brought just under \$328 million and averaged \$90,984. The real crash in the horse market actually started the day after the 2008 September Sale ended, and it lasted for exactly 12 months, until the end of the 2009 September Sale. At that sale, 3,159 yearlings grossed \$191,859,400 and averaged \$60,734--a drop of about 40% in gross and a third in average from the 2008 sale.

Though the U.S. horse market bottomed out in 2009, it would be four years before it really recovered. If you refer back to the Sales Ticker, you see that the September Sale grossed \$198 million in 2010; \$223 million in 2011; and \$219 million in 2012, when only 2,516 yearlings sold--the lowest number since the suspension of the July sale.

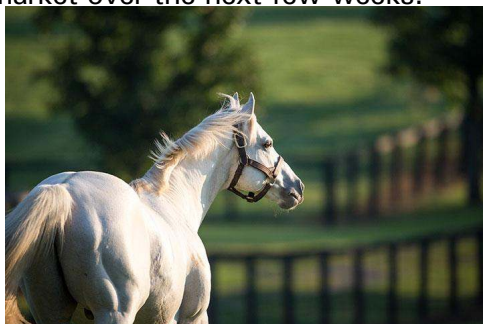
Thus, the September 2013 sale marked the end of this recession in the North American Thoroughbred market: the number sold (2,744) increased by 9% from 2012; the gross jumped by 28%--\$60 million--and the average rose 12%, to \$102,220, marking the first time the average had edged above \$100,000 since 2007. So when we say the market has stabilized the last three years, it's important to think about that in the context of the 12 years going back to 2003, since when the September Sale rose to a gross of almost \$400 million, then crashed to a gross under \$200 million. The North American foal crop has dropped by about a third since 2008.

Correspondingly, a \$280 million gross is a 30% drop from a \$400 million gross (2006); so, when we say the Keeneland September Sale has stabilized, it really has--but with about a third fewer horses than there were seven years ago.

The recovery in the major European sales came a year earlier, in 2012; in that year, Tattersalls' October 1 Yearling Sale saw a 32% rise in gross, from about \$83 million in U.S. money to \$109 million. Since then the October 1 gross has risen again, about another 16% through 2014, when the October 1 gross converted to about \$127 million and averaged around \$377,000, well above the Keeneland September Book 1 average of around \$300,000. Goffs has its two-day Orby Sale starting tomorrow, followed by the one-day Sportsmans Sale on Thursday. The Orby section grossed €38,450,000 in 2014, up from €34,745,500 in 2014 and €27,214,500 in 2013. That's a 41% increase in two years. With a total of 21 yearlings by Galileo (14), Dubawi (1) and Frankel (6) at Goffs, and 56 catalogued by the three sires at Tattersalls October 1, it would not be a surprise to see continued sustained growth in the European yearling market over the next few weeks.

There are still plenty of yearling sales to come in North America, but with well over 3,000 yearlings already sold, we can get a pretty fair idea of the rankings--[click here](#) to see a list of the top 50

North American sires by yearling average, through the end of the September Sale. Gainesway's Tapit (47, avg. \$620,297) and Claiborne's War Front (24, avg. \$574,375) recorded far and away the highest averages. Three other sires have averaged over \$300,000: Darley's Medaglia D'Oro (36, avg. \$352,500) and deceased Street Cry (16, avg. \$321,625); and WinStar's Distorted Humor (32, avg. \$313,281). Six other sires have averaged over \$200,000: Darley's Bernardini (\$269,500); Taylor Made's deceased Unbridled's Song (\$268,325); Lane's End's deceased Smart Strike (\$254,375); WinStar's Speightstown (\$241,567); Hill 'n' Dale's new acquisition from Lane's End, Curlin (\$226,230); and Spendthrift's Malibu Moon (\$216,339). Close up behind them are Ashford's new commercial star, Scat Daddy (\$199,020); the leading first-crop yearling sire on average, WinStar's Bodemeister (64, avg. \$191,125) and another WinStar stallion, Tiznow (\$190,064). American Pharoah's sire, Pioneerof The Nile, ranks 15th, with 44 yearlings averaging \$182,227; he, too, stands at WinStar.

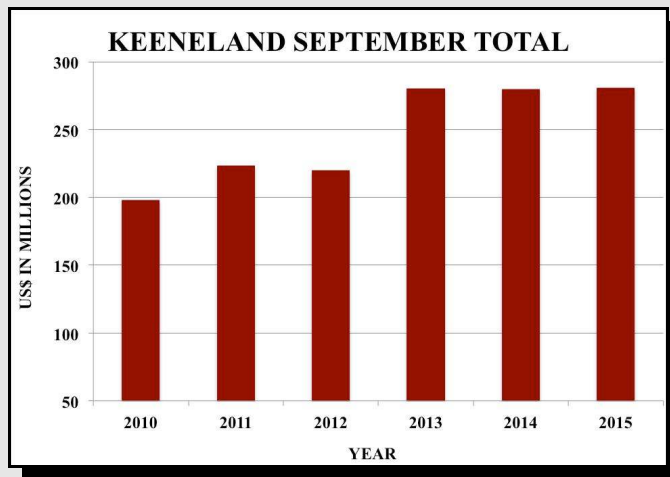

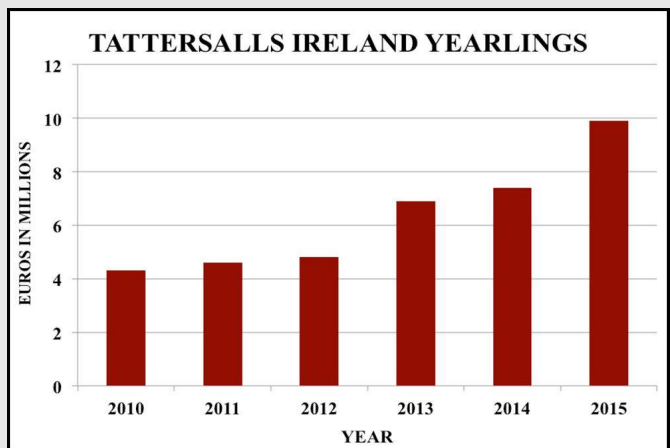

"As discussed in the column, Keeneland September 2015 was slightly up on 2014 but looked almost exactly like 2013: there were 2,745 sold (2,744 in 2013), gross \$281,496,100 (\$280,491,300), average \$102,549 (\$102,220); the clearance rate from the catalogue dropped by 4.3%, though, from 70.2% in 2013 to 65.9% this year. The 2013 sale had marked the end of the Thoroughbred Recession in North America, as the gross increased from 2012 by 28%, or \$60-million. Now we cross the Pond."

Bodemeister, as noted, has averaged \$191,125 to top North American F2014 sires. Lane's End's The Factor (61, avg. \$150,475) and Union Rags (52, avg. \$136,942) come next, followed by Darby Dan's Jersey Town (14, avg. \$108,250) and Gainesway's Tapizar (46, avg. \$98,913). Both The Factor and Tapizar are \$15,000 stallions with \$100,000 medians, 6.7 times their stud fees; that invariably suggests a high standard of individual. Another 10 F2014 stallions have averaged over \$50,000 so far, headed by: Darby Dan's Shackleford (46, avg. \$83,108); Gainesway's To Honor And Serve (43, avg. \$80,034); and Airdrie's Creative Cause (28, avg. \$78,678). But now, for the next three weeks, we'll be talking mostly about European first-crop yearling sires: Juddmonte's Frankel; his immediate victims on the racetrack, Newsells Park's Nathaniel and Coolmore's Excelebration; and their contemporaries. Breaking her maiden at the fourth attempt in Hoppegarten's G2 Diana-Trial over 10 furlongs May 24, **Nightflower** was eighth in the G1 Prix de Diane (French Oaks) over a half-furlong further at Chantilly June 14 before coming home to be second in the German equivalent, the G1 Preis der Diana at a mile and three at Dusseldorf Aug. 2. Eking out a touch more to fill the same spot in the G1 Grosser Preis von Baden over a mile and a half last time Sept. 6, the chestnut stepped out of her bridesmaid dress to enjoy the limelight in her own right at last. Settled in behind the leading trio after the initial exchanges, **Nightflower** {Ger} approached the furlong pole and drew away to win with authority. "In Baden-Baden, she hit the front too soon and began to look around and if she keeps in this condition the Group 1 races in Munich or Italy could be an option," trainer Peter Schiergen said. "I think her owner would like to continue having fun with her next year and not retire her to the breeding shed just yet."

The German raider **Red Dubawi**, a distant fourth last time behind the well regarded **Vadamos (Fr)** (Monsun {Ger}) in the G2 Oettingen-Rennen at Baden Baden, ran the race of his life to snatch the G1 Premio Vittorio Di Capua at San Siro. The 7-year-old's cause was helped when the clerk of the course watered the track Saturday morning, despite a heavy thunderstorm soaked the San Siro area Wednesday. The ground turned to soft with the watering and **Red Dubawi** found his top level. He had a nice stalking trip and kicked for home strongly when jockey **Andreas Suborics** found a gap.

Red Dubawi, a dual group winner in Germany last season, looked in fine shape and jockey Andreas Suborics said, "The ground was perfect for him and he really fired. I expected a good run but not an easy win".

The French-trained Bookrunner ran a brave race despite the soft ground and his jockey Umberto Rispoli said, "The watering compromised my chances. The trainer decided to run Bookrunner here because good ground was expected. Not a single drop of rain fell in the area for four days and the ground was soft. That is simply unfair." The soft ground played against Kaspersky, who set a strong pace and flattened a bit in the closing stages, to finish fourth, beaten by Circus Couture. Kaspersky's trainer Endo Botti also was unhappy with the ground commenting, "My horse was ready to run a big race and he did it. On good ground the results would be different."

Possibly the third string of the Ballydoyle trio, Port Douglas ultimately had the most heart with blinkers applied to take Aidan O'Brien past the previous record of 14 wins in this race set by Dr Vincent O'Brien. Impressive on debut over seven furlongs at Leopardstown June 11, the bay was the 9-10 favorite when readily beaten by Sanus Per Aquam (Ire) (Teofilo {Ire}) in second back over that course and distance

July 9 and was again below expectations when fourth as the 8-11 pick for the Listed Canford Cliffs S. over an extended seven furlongs at Tipperary last time Aug. 7. Sent up to take the early lead off True Solitaire by Emmet McNamara, he was tackled and passed by that rival with a quarter mile remaining. Back alongside soon after, he gained a slight edge 50 yards out and held on grimly to prevail, with his stable companion Beacon Rock producing a strong staying effort late on.

"He won his maiden well, but was very lazy the next twice so we put blinkers on and his work really did improve with them," Port Douglas' trainer explained after the winner had survived an inquiry having drifted into True Solitaire in the final drive. "He's a real nice horse who battled well and will be a lovely middle-distance colt for next year. I was very happy with Beacon Rock, who was a little bit green throughout the race but was coming home really well. The first two could run again in the G1 Racing Post Trophy [at Doncaster Oct. 24] or something like that." Jockey Emmet McNamara added, "He was tough and battled well. He stays very well and the blinkers helped him. Aidan said to let him keep coming forward from halfway and he really picked up to grind and try for me."

"I always thought she wanted to go a mile and she ran today to get more experience. She is crying out to go a mile this year. They went a good gallop, she came home well and I'm delighted with that."

**STALLION DUTIES DILUTING RACE QUALITY**

There could be no better illustration of the dearth of good young horses in Australia progressing on through the ranks into weight-for-age company than the fact that the G1 Underwood S. at Caulfield on Saturday produced a thrilling finish in which three 8-year-olds flashed across the line together. Furthermore, two of the three had never scored at the highest level, with only the runner-up, the 2013 G1 Caulfield Cup and 2014 G1 Caulfield S. winner Fawkner (Aus) (Reset {Aus}) having previous Group 1 success on his CV. A solid programme of weight-for-age races, contested by a nucleus of proven stars, has traditionally been a strong suit of Australian racing. That, though, is currently not the case, now that it has become the norm for the best young horses to retire to stud almost

as soon as their ability has become apparent. The principal victim has been racing in the spring, when the 3-year-olds generally keep to their own age group. The Underwood S. result tells this tale clearly.

This observation is not meant as a slight to the winner Mourinho (Aus)

(Oratorio {Ire}), a stalwart of racing in Melbourne and a source of pride and joy to his connections since being bought as a yearling for A\$36,000 at the Inglis Classic Yearling Sale in Sydney in 2009, bred by Mrs. F. Ovenstone and offered by Little Wych Stud of Bathurst, NSW. What he is not, though, is another Phar Lap, winner of the Underwood Stakes in 1931; nor an Ajax, a Royal Gem, an Aquanita, a Tobin Bronze, a Bonecrusher, an Octagonal, a Tie The Knot, a Northerly or an Elvstroem.

Just as Mourinho is proving a star for his connections, so has his dam Benevolent (NZ) (Generous {Ire}) proved to be a wonderful servant for Mrs. Ovenstone and for Little Wych. Unraced herself, she is by a good stallion (the 1991 Derby winner Generous (Ire) (Caerleon) who has a particularly good record as a broodmare sire) and comes from a family which has enjoyed some success down under since her US-bred dam Regal Spy was exported to the antipodes, where she raced successfully in South Australia in the 1980's before retiring to stud in New Zealand. Regal Spy was a lovely addition to New Zealand's broodmare ranks, being by Sir Ivor from a winning half-sister to Storm Bird's dam South Ocean. She duly bred five winners, headed by the Star Way filly Prieur Way (NZ), winner of eight races including a Group 3 at Rotorua. Benevolent started her breeding career in New Zealand with coverings by the top-class stallions Volksraad (GB) (Green Desert) and Thorn Park (Aus) (Spinning World). From these she bred the winners Dementieva (NZ) and Forest Beauty (NZ). **Cont. p16**

Subsequent to her move to Australia, she has bred two considerably better horses, both by coverings at Coolmore Australia: Mourinho and the Group 3 winner Molto Bene (Aus), a daughter of Royal Academy.

Mourinho is a member of the first Australian crop of the high-class Danehill horse Oratorio (Ire), who shuttled between Coolmore's properties in Ireland and New South Wales for several seasons prior to being sold to Avontuur Stud in South Africa four years ago. A Group 1 winner at both two and three when trained by Aidan O'Brien, Oratorio was outstanding in the second half of his 3-year-old season in 2005, defeating the Derby winner Motivator (GB) (Montjeu {Ire}) in both the G1 Eclipse S. at Sandown and the G1 Irish Champion S. at Leopardstown. He retired to stud in 2006 at a fee of €30,000. However, his results were not as good as one might have hoped, and the fact that his fee had dropped to €9,000 by the 2011 season tells its own tale. It was strange that Oratorio fell from grace so quickly, bearing in mind that he sired the quinella--courtesy of Beethoven (Ire) and Fencing Master (Ire)--in England's top juvenile race, the G1 Dewhurst S., with his first crop in 2009. However, neither of that pair 'trained on', while the most notable horse whom he subsequently sired in Ireland (Military Attack {Ire}), who began life racing in the UK as Rave, under which name he landed two competitive handicaps at Ascot in 2011) did his best winning in Hong Kong. Furthermore, despite coming up with the Australasian Group 1 winners Banchee (NZ) and Manawanui (Aus) in his first and second Australian crops respectively, his flow of good horses conceived in New South Wales was a steady stream rather than a torrent.

It is not uncommon to see Coolmore stallions ending up in South Africa if they are deemed to be disappointing in their original homes. Sometimes they come up with some real stars after they have left. Duke Of Marmalade (Ire) (Danehill), for one, has had a terrific year in Europe in 2015, thanks to the Classic-winning 3-year-olds Star Of Seville (GB), Nutan (Ire) and Simple Verse (Ire).

Leading British sprinter **Tropics** (Speightstown) has been ruled out of action for the rest of the season. He has got a bit of a sprained tendon and it is better if we don't risk it with him and sit tight for next season. We thought about running him, but we thought it would be better to give him time off and bring him back in the spring. We have just got to be patient with him."

### MECCA TEAM ALL SET FOR ABBAYE

G1 Nunthorpe S. winner **Mecca's Angel (Ire)** (Dark Angel {Ire}) has delighted connections in her final serious workout ahead of her Parisian assignment in next Sunday's G1 Prix de l'Abbaye at Longchamp. Her regular rider Paul Mulrennan steered the 4-year-old filly in her gallop and expressed his satisfaction commenting, "She's in great condition and I'm really looking forward to it. Her coat is great, her weight is good and she was jumping out of her skin." Her victory at York, where she got the better of Wesley Ward's Acapulco (Scat Daddy) represented a first at Group 1 level for both Mulrennan and trainer Michael Dods and Dods is hoping the ground does not dry out too much in Paris over the next few days. "As long as it's good or on the easier side of good she'll go. It was very soft there yesterday. I know it's a dryish forecast, but hopefully at this time of year it won't dry up too much," said the Yorkshire trainer. "The ground is important and if we didn't have our ground we wouldn't be running. She's had one run at Longchamp and was very impressive. We're looking forward to it and just hoping she gets her conditions and is drawn in the center," added Dods.

British trainers have an excellent record in the race and another Yorkshire based trainer going to Paris with high hopes is David O'Meara. He runs defending champion **Move In Time (GB)** (Monsieur Bond {Ire}) and speaking to *The Racing Post* O'Meara reported, "He's probably in better form going into the race than this time last year. **HOBBS MAY YET SWERVE ARC**

John Gosden plans on making a late decision over the participation of G1 Irish Derby winner **Jack Hobbs (GB)** (Halling) in next Sunday's G1 Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe. The trainer also has the brilliant **Golden Horn (GB)** (Cape Cross {Ire}) in line for the race and is reluctant to pitch his two star colts against each other for a second time. As it stands Gosden could wait an extra fortnight and aim Jack Hobbs at the G1 Champion S. at Ascot and

rely on Golden Horn as his main Arc hope. "We are very much watching the weather," said Gosden. "It is autumn and we've had a huge amount of rain in August and September, so anything's possible. Jack Hobbs is a horse who can run in the Arc next year and I think it would

Gosden is in the enviable position of probably having the two best middle distance 3-year-old colts in Britain and Ireland and his problem of keeping them apart is a problem most trainers would relish. "Golden Horn has proven himself superior and I don't see the point in going to Paris to find out that again when the Champion Stakes is 13 days later. Jack Hobbs' owners are very clear that the Arc and the Champion are equal and they're just as happy to go to Ascot," explained Gosden.

stages. He crept ever closer rounding the final turn and when asked to kick in upper stretch, put the race to bed in a handful of strides before winning by daylight. As he did in the Leger, Tantal--the second highest-priced offering at Tattersalls Ireland in 2013--ran on to be second and complete a 1-2 finish for the auction house.
