### TAKE CHARGE BRANDI RETIRED

Willis Horton's **Take Charge Brandi** (Giant's Causeway--Charming, by Seeking the Gold), last year's champion juvenile filly, has been retired from racing. The 3-year-old filly has been sent to Hill 'n' Dale Farm while connections decide on breeding or auction plans.

"You hate to see a champion retire, but it was the right thing to do," said trainer D. Wayne Lukas. "This family has been so good to me and Willis Horton. Take Charge Brandi was supremely talented and determined."

Tabbed a 'TDN Rising Star' after her debut win at Churchill Downs, Take Charge Brandi shocked the field in last year's GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies, scoring a front-running victory at 61-1. She added the GIII Delta Downs Princess S. a few weeks later and cemented her championship with a determined victory in the GI Starlet S.

"I almost ran her in the GI Los Alamitos Futurity the week after the Starlet and think she would have been very tough to beat," Lukas revealed. "She reminds me of Serena's Song in her determination and natural ability. She is the complete package and has everything you look for in a great broodmare prospect."

Take Charge Brandi, whose second dam is broodmare of the year Take Charge Lady (Dehere), is out of a half-sister to Horton's champion sophomore Will Take Charge (Unbridled's Song), as well as Grade I winner Take Charge Indy (A.P. Indy). She is a half-sister to Take Charge Tressa (War Front), who topped last year's Fasig-Tipton Saratoga sale with Horton's winning bid of \$1.25 million.

"She was a great champion and we just ran out of time making the Breeders' Cup again," said Horton. "She owns the best pedigree in the stud book and loved to win races. The family has been great to me, owning champion Will Take Charge, and we are very high on her half-sister Take Charge Tressa."

On the board in six of 11 starts, Take Charge Brandi retires with five wins and earnings of \$1,692,126.

A decision on whether the filly will be bred or offered at the Keeneland November sale is expected in the coming weeks.

### BAYERN TO HILL 'N' DALE

Kaleem Shah's 2014 GI Breeders' Cup Classic winner **Bayern** (Offlee Wild--Alittlebitearly, by Thunder Gulch) has been officially retired and will take up stud duties next season at John Sikura's Hill 'n' Dale Farms.

"Bayern was a super talented horse," said trainer Bob Baffert. "He had tremendous speed and carried that speed to win the Breeders' Cup Classic over a very good field and won the [GII] Woody Stephens wrapped up in near track-record time. He is a great-looking horse and a rarity in that he could beat the best sprinters and carry his speed a mile and a quarter. Not many horses can do that. On his day he was a super brilliant horse. Something was bugging him this year that we could never figure out even though he trained great. It's time to retire the horse and be thankful of all he has accomplished."

Bayern romped home by 7 1/2 lengths in the Woody Stephens S. last year, completing the seven furlongs in 1:20.75. He also dominated the GI Haskell Invitational and GII Pennsylvania Derby, both over nine furlongs, before ending his campaign with a dramatic victory in the 1 1/4-mile Classic. **Cont. p3**

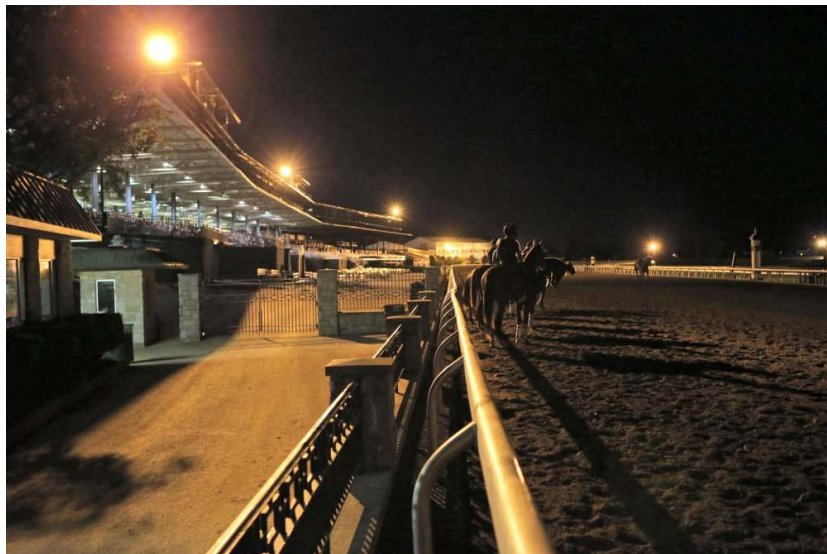

In 2015, he was third in the Gil San Diego H., as well as Saturday's GI Awesome Again S.

Bayern was a \$320,000 Fasig-Tipton Midlantic juvenile of 2013.

"Bayern is a great type, medium sized, beautifully balanced and very powerful," said Donato Lanni, who selected the colt out at the Midlantic sale. "His work was fantastic at the Maryland sale and I told Bob we had to buy him. He was our pick of the sale and everyone loved the horse. He cost \$320,000, but we were determined to buy him whatever it took."

Bayern joins a Hill 'n' Dale stallion roster which recently added top sire Curlin to its line-up.

"I love the brilliance, the physical horse and the fact that he hails from the Courtly Dee pedigree," Sikura said of his roster's newest addition. "His race in the Woody Stephens was breathtaking. I was there and was awed by how fast and easy he won in near track-record time. I love deep reproducing pedigrees and I don't think there is a more prolific family in the stud book than Courtly Dee and her daughters. Bayern has all the parts and we can't wait to receive him here at the farm."

Bayern, whose third dam is the blue hen mare Courtly Dee, is also from the family of group winner Bertolini and graded stakes winners Assateauge, Kindergarten Kid and Rainha da Bateria. His half-brother by Scat Daddy sold for a sale-topping \$1.4 million at this year's Fasig-Tipton Florida sale.

On the board in 10 of 15 starts, Bayern retires with six wins and earnings of \$4,454,930.

"Bayern gave me and my family great joy, I am looking forward to breeding my best mares to him and can't wait to see his foals," Shah said. "He gave me the ultimate thrill winning the Breeders' Cup Classic and I hope to win important races with his progeny. I keep my mares at Hill 'n' Dale, so I will get to visit him regularly."

"There are a lot of similarities between him and his sire and the way they train. You wouldn't necessarily know they're as good as they are."  
 So said Todd Pletcher as part of his assessment of Rock Fall after the GI Vosburgh S., in which the son of Speightstown booked his ticket to the Breeders' Cup Sprint.

And that's not the only similarity between father and son.

John Moynihan, bloodstock adviser to Rock Fall's owner Barbara Banke, provided some fascinating insights following a dazzling display on the colt's third start. This came at Belmont in June last year, when the colt earned 'TDN Rising Star' status. Apart from telling everyone that Rock Fall is "a fast, fast, fast, fast horse," Moynihan explained that "Todd thought he was going to be a top 2-year-old last year, but we were derailed by injuries."

Fortunately these injuries were not serious enough to significantly delay Rock Fall's debut, as he made his first start in the April of his 3-year-old campaign and gained his first victory a month later. Although he was to spend more than nine months on the sidelines following his 'Rising Star' performance, his career has been much less prone to the type of interruptions which affected Speightstown's career. You may remember that Speightstown saw little or no action at the ages of two, four and five.

But as everyone knows, those interruptions didn't prevent Speightstown developing into a champion sprinter as a 6-year-old in 2004. Now, Rock Fall seems to be well on target for the same award, but at the substantially earlier age of four, as he has been following in Speightstown's footsteps.

The six-year-old Speightstown won the GII True North Breeders' Cup H., and Rock Fall won it even more decisively. Speightstown next won the Alfred G. Vanderbilt H., which in 2004 was a Grade II, and Rock Fall again emulated his sire in this Saratoga contest, now a Grade I contest. He had to show courage as well as speed, though.

The similarities ended when Rock Fall again fought his way to a narrow victory as a very short-priced favorite for Saturday's Vosburgh S. Speightstown had also started odds on to win the Vosburgh, but had to settle for a modest third place behind the Brazilian import Pico Central.

With no Pico Central among his opponents in the Breeders' Cup Sprint at Lone Star Park, Speightstown ended his career on a high, getting first run on the favorite Kela to clinch the Eclipse Award. As a winner of his last seven starts, Rock Fall must have as good a chance as any of emulating his sire one more time when the action moves to Keeneland--especially when Pletcher says he had tried to keep something in reserve for the Sprint in training Rock Fall for the Vosburgh.

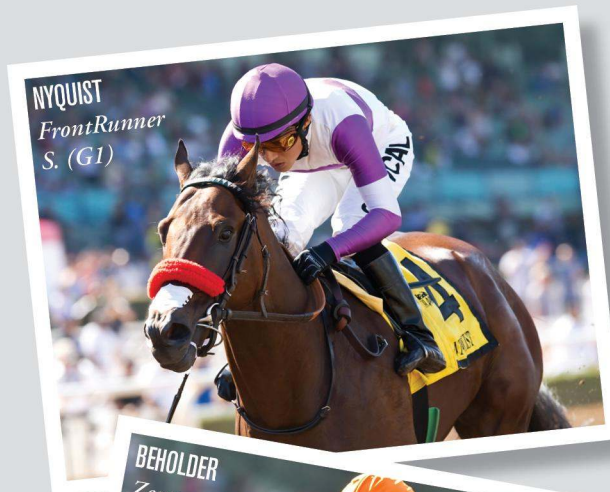
With his three graded victories, Rock Fall has been the star of the Speightstown show in 2015, though there have also been American graded successes for Barbados, Recepta, Speightster and Force The Pass, as well as notable foreign performances by Tropics in England and by Reynalduthewizard and Tamarkuz in the UAE.

Their wins have come from six furlongs to a mile and a quarter, with Force The Pass's success in the GI Belmont Derby Invitational making him the fourth son of Speightstown to become a Grade I winner over a mile and a quarter. **cont. p6**

His predecessors were Haynesfield (Jockey Club Gold Cup), Golden Ticket (Travers S.) and Seek Again (Hollywood Derby). Clearly, Speightstown's talents as a sire are very varied, both in terms of distance requirements and racing surface.

Speightstown will be 18 in 2016, though, so the search is on for his rightful heir. Munnings is staking a strong claim, despite having had fewer than 100 starters from his first two crops. He leads the second-crop sires not only by cumulative earnings, but also by number of black-type winners (12) and number of black-type horses (17). He also numbers the Grade I winner I'm A Chatterbox among his three graded winners.

As Munnings never won a Grade I, it seems fair to think that anything he can do, Rock Fall should do at least as well. Rock Fall's prospects surely will be enhanced by having a stakes-winning daughter of Medaglia d'Oro as his dam. Indeed this daughter, Renda, had the distinction of becoming Medaglia d'Oro's first winner when she scored at Calder on May 31, 2008, and then became his first stakes winner. In fact, she won a couple of stakes races at around a mile as a 2-year-old and was Grade II-placed over seven furlongs at three. She has been entered for Fasig-Tipton's November Sale.

Renda received 106 on the Experimental Free Handicap, after winning half of her six starts.

She was obviously much more precocious than Medaglia d'Oro, who was second in his only juvenile start, and it isn't hard to see why. Her grandsires are El Prado (Ire), a winner of four of his six juvenile starts, including the G1 National S, and Capote, who numbered the Breeders' Cup Juvenile among his three wins from four starts in his first season.

Needless to say, Renda isn't the only female member of Medaglia d'Oro's first crop to make her mark as a broodmare. Rachel Alexandra's first two foals have made quite an impact, notably her Grade I-winning Bernardini 2-year-old Rachel's Valentina.

Medaglia d'Oro was also in the news over the weekend. He had a handful of stakes winners headed by his impressive 2-year-old daughter Songbird. This filly's record now stands at a perfect three for three, including Grade I wins in the Del Mar Debutante and the Chandelier S. Coincidentally, this potential champion is out of Ivanavinalot, whose wins included one in the Brave Raj S.--a race won a few years later by Renda.

More importantly, Ivanavinalot was sired by West Acre, a son of Forty Niner. Of course it was Roar, another son of Forty Niner, who sired the dam of Rachel Alexandra. For the record, West Acre never raced, but earned his chance as a stallion in Florida on the strength of his bloodlines. With a son of Mr Prospector as his sire and Narrate as his dam, he was a three-parts-brother to two notable Mr Prospector mares in Preach, dam of Pulpit, and her sister Yarn, dam of Tale Of The Cat.

Incidentally, in addition to being the sire of a 2015 2-year-old Grade I winner and broodmare sire of another, Medaglia d'Oro had a major 2-year-old winner during the 2014-15 Australian season in the form of G1 Golden Slipper winner Vancouver. In the past we have also seen Medaglia d'Oro enjoy graded stakes juvenile success with such as Rachel Alexandra, Violence, Passion For Gold and C. S. Silk. It seems he is being helped in this area by the fact that both his parents were relatively precocious stakes winners at two--his dam Cappucino Bay gained her stakes success in the August of her first season.

Just days after it was announced (click [here](#) for the full story) that Taylor Made Stallions had joined an ownership group to acquire an interest in the 2-year-old Standardbred Travel Playlist (Art Major), the pacer started to make the purchase look like a wise one. Travel Playlist overcame the dreaded seven post Saturday night at Yonkers to win a \$225,000 New York sire stakes race for the new owners, a group that also includes Blue Chip Farms and Fred W. Hertrich. The win upped Travel Playlist's career record to 5 for 5.

"We're looking to hit the lottery and have a stallion like the father," said Blue Chip Farm's Tom Grossman, who raced and stands the popular stallion Art Major at his stud farm in New York. "We are certainly interested in all of his offspring and watch them very closely. This is, by far, the most interesting 2-year-old by this horse in many, many years."

**GOFFS ORBY GETS UNDERWAY IN IRELAND**

Ireland is enjoying something of an Indian summer this week, ensuring a positive mood among prospective buyers and vendors alike as just short of 500 yearlings for the Goffs Orby sale have been scrutinized in the sun over the last few days.

As highlighted by Bill Oppenheim in yesterday's *TDN*, the Orby Sale aggregate has risen by 41% in the last two years, with the Goffs team working hard to attract an international buying bench. Its positioning a week ahead of the Tattersalls October Sale, with the Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe an enticing filling in the sandwich, offers overseas buyers a worthwhile whistlestop tour of Europe's elite sales and best day's racing and, judging from the various faces to be seen in Kill, plenty have again made the trip.

Among those viewing yearlings on Monday were plenty of Americans, including Claiborne's Walker Hancock and Bernie Sams, Gatewood Bell, Shaun Dugan, Jason Litt and Jak Knelman. Last year's leading buyer Sheikh Hamdan Al Maktoum--who took home eight yearlings for €3.4 million--has long been a staunch supporter of Goffs and he was again patrolling the sales grounds with his team from Shadwell.

The Orby Sale has had a particularly good run with Classic-winning fillies of late, with notable graduates such as Dancing Rain (Ire), Just The Judge (Ire) and Sky Lantern (Ire). This year's G1 Irish Oaks winner

Covert Love (Ire) failed to find a buyer when paraded here two years ago, but her success this year for Hugo Palmer and the FOMO Syndicate will ensure that the sole offering by her late sire Azamour (Ire) is not overlooked. The Airlie Stud-consigned filly is [lot 229](#) and is out of the Kingmambo mare Kincob, making her a half-sister to the listed winner and Group 3-placed Gemstone (Ire) (Galileo {Ire}). The family also includes G1 Irish 2000 Guineas winner Bachelor Duke.

Almost €39 million changed hands at last year's sale for 356 yearlings sold from a slightly smaller catalogue than for this year's renewal. **cont. p9**

Top honors went to Jim Bolger's Redmonstown Stud, which sold a Galileo (Ire) colt--a brother to G1 1000 Guineas runner-up Cuis Ghaire (Ire) now named The Major General (Ire) and owned by Sue Magnier--for €1.5 million.

The County Wexford-based farm has no Galileo yearlings in its draft this year, but instead offers six yearlings by his sons New Approach (Ire) and Teofilo (Ire)--the latter one of two Darley stallions to have been born and raised at Redmonstown. The other is New Approach's son, Dawn Approach (Ire), whose full-sister appears as [lot 201](#). It's a family that continues to throw

up high-class winners for Bolger. Another full-brother, Herald The Dawn (Ire), won the G2 Futurity S. in August before finishing runner-up to Air Force Blue (Ire) in the G1 National S. on Irish Champions weekend, while half-sister Fainne (Ire) is responsible for last

weekend's G3 Somerville Tattersall S. victor Sanus Per Aquam (Ire) (Teofilo {Ire}).

Referring to the late May foal out of prized mare Hymn Of The Dawn, Redmonstown Stud manager Ken Bolger said, "She's the image of the mare. She's taken it all very well because she's been very busy over the last few days." He added, "We've been delighted with the results this season--the colt [Sanus Per Aquam] winning in England at the weekend was fantastic. We've become a bit more commercially-minded and instead of racing everything we've been bringing youngstock to the sales. The last few years have been a dream come true with Teofilo and New Approach. Jim was behind Galileo from day one. He had great belief in him from the start."

Of course the offspring of another son of Galileo, Frankel (GB), will garner plenty of interest over the coming fortnight, with six set to go under the hammer in the next 48 hours at Goffs.

Noel O'Callaghan's Mountarmstrong Stud has just one yearling on offer this week but she's a fine one, being by Frankel out of the champion racemare Alexander Goldrun (Ire) (Gold Away {Ire}), whose own achievements on the track take up plenty of space on the catalogue page. The mare has visited Galileo twice since retiring to stud and her third foal, a March-born bay filly, should provide an early highlight for the sale when she passes through the ring as [lot 23](#). She has been the subject of plenty of praise this week.

Another Irish farm to have enjoyed cheering home a stakes-winning graduate in recent weeks is the Fagan family's Deerpark Stud, whose Kodiak (Ire) filly Shaden (Ire) won the G3 Firth Of Clyde S. for Lady Cecil on Sept. 19.

Shaden's dam, Lady Avenger (Ire) (Namid {GB}), has no yearling this year, but Shaden's full-sister heads to the December Foal Sale at Tattersalls. Meanwhile, Deerpark offers two pinhooked fillies on the second day of Orby, daughters of Pour Moi (Ire) ([lot 442](#)) and Excelebration (Ire) ([lot 471](#)), the latter being the first foal of the unraced Tragic Moment, a sister to dual listed winner Il Warrd (Ire) (Pivotal {GB}).

Already a half-sister to three stakes winners at the time the catalogue was printed, this filly has enjoyed a significant boost in the interim, with her half-brother Order Of St George (Ire) (Galileo {Ire}) collecting the G3 Irish St Leger Trial S. and the main event, the G1 Irish St Leger. The verdict was out early on Order Of St George, and Another Storm's full-brother to him made 875,000gns when bought by the China Horse Club last year. Their second dam is the Eclipse champion 2-year-old filly Storm Song.

Joe Foley, owner of Ballyhane Stud, said, "She's very nice, it's a great family and Invincible Spirit is a wonderful sire of fillies."

Gosden reiterated that Oppenheimer plans to retire Golden Horn at the end of the year, telling *At The Races*, "I had a good go at Mr. Oppenheimer with Frankie [Dettori] in the plane on the way back from [the Irish Champion S.], but he would not move. That was our one big chance and we didn't even land a TKO, never mind a knockout."

(Nayef) is already Down Under, and could take in the Oct. 17 G1 Caulfield Cup as a prep for the Melbourne Cup.

"Snow Sky apparently traveled over very well and is in good shape so far, but we will wait and see how things go over the next few days," said Teddy Grimthorpe, racing manager to Khalid Abdullah. "The Melbourne Cup is something that we have looked at for a while and it seems sensible to take on the Caulfield Cup if he has a good run into it with no hiccups. If he is not tip-top for that then he will have a straight run in the Melbourne Cup, but the intention is to take in the Caulfield Cup first."



**SINGAPORE ENDS INTERNATIONAL RACES**

The Singapore Turf Club will no longer stage its G1 Singapore International Airlines Cup and G1 KrisFlyer Sprint, the club announced Monday. The SIA Cup was inaugurated in 2000 and was interrupted only in 2003 due to the SARS outbreak, while the KrisFlyer Sprint was first run in 2001 and was discontinued between 2003 and 2008.

The Singapore Turf Club issued a statement that read, "The Singapore Airlines International Cup (SIA Cup) and KrisFlyer International Sprint (KFIS) were introduced in 2000 and 2001, respectively, to achieve several objectives.

These objectives [included] branding Singapore races internationally and uplifting the quality of Singapore horses and Singapore racing. Both international races, together with Singapore racing, have grown in stature and prestige over the years. As the objectives set out for the two races have been achieved, the Singapore Turf Club wishes to announce that the SIA Cup and KFIS will be discontinued."
