

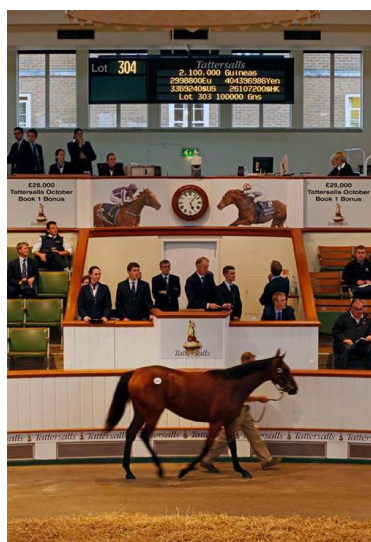


## DUBAWI FILLY THE DARLING AT TATTS

They say love is all you need and for Richard Henry, the opportunity to buy a stunning daughter of a mare by that very name from a family he knows better than anyone proved too strong a desire to resist as Book 1 of the Tattersalls October Sale continued Wednesday.

Being by Dubawi (Ire), the filly naturally drew the attention of Darley buyer John Ferguson, with Saleh Al Homaizi also engaged in the early skirmishes, but, after bidding 2 million guineas, Ferguson left the ring to allow MV Magnier to have the final say on behalf of Henry at 2.1 million guineas for [lot 304](#), the new sale topper and the most expensive yearling in the world sold at public auction thus far in 2015.

While the average and median for the session were slightly down on last year's day two--the average was down 2% to 229,524 and the median down 13% to 130,000--the truer figures, due to the catalogue's alphabetical nature, are the cumulative ones, which shows the sale to be on-par with last year's renewal. The clearance rate of 81% through the first two sessions is identical to last year's cumulative figure, and the median, 150,000gns, is also the same. The average is down by 574gns to 235,361gns.

Coolmore advertising guru Richard Henry and his wife, Roisin, bred the filly's dam, Loveisallyouneed (Ire) (Sadler's Wells), from their stellar producer Jude (GB)--herself a daughter of Lanwades' foundation mare Alruccaba (GB)--and later sold the unraced full-sister to Group 1 winners Yesterday (Ire) and Quarter Moon (Ire) privately to Newsells Park Stud.

Sporting a Ruler Of The World baseball cap, Henry could certainly lay claim to being king of the ring on Wednesday with his sale-topping purchase. He said, "We sold Loveisallyouneed in 2010 shortly before Jude passed away, but obviously it's a family we have been very lucky with. There are 12 group winners on the page, seven at Group 1 level, and we were fortunate enough to race three of them." **Cont. p3**

## HARMONIZE UP LATE IN JESSAMINE

Larkin Armstrong's **Harmonize** (Scat Daddy) raced well off the early pace in Wednesday's GIII Jessamine S., but came thundering down the center of the Keeneland course to get up in the final jumps for a narrow victory in the "Win and You're In" event for the GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies Turf. The even-money favorite was allowed to settle near the rear of the field as 139-1 outsider **Carleigh Belle** (Broken Vow) was loose on the lead through fractions of :22.44 and :47.02. The pacesetter was swallowed up by a host of challengers after three-quarters in 1:13.51 and Harmonize was forced to float out seven wide with some 10 lengths to make up turning into the stretch. Gobbling up ground in the center of the course, Harmonize surged past a determined **Sapphire Kitten** (Kitten's Joy) late to score by a neck.

Reporting on other members of the family he has retained, he added, “Yesterday is in foal to red-hot first season sire Zoffany (Ire), and Quarter Moon has produced two high-class fillies by Fastnet Rock (Aus) in Group 1 winner Diamondsandrubies (Ire) and Classic prospect for next season, How High The Moon (Ire). Hopefully this filly might be as good as them.”

The transaction was the highlight of a banner day for Andreas Jacobs’s Newsells Park Stud.

Newsells’ other sales of the day included a Dubawi colt for 725,000gns; a colt by its resident first-season sire Nathaniel (Ire) for 525,000gns; a Frankel (GB) filly for 450,000gns; and an Oasis Dream (GB) colt for 400,000gns.

“We’re thrilled with the results,” the Stud’s Julian Dollar said. “From last year they were without a doubt the nicest crop of foals we’ve ever had, and they came here in good shape--we always knew we had a nice bunch of horses and the nice ones sold really well. I was thrilled with [the Dubawi filly] and thrilled with the sale of the Nathaniel and the Dubawi colt as well. We’ve had a special day.”

Dollar was quick to deflect credit to the Newsells team for preparing the second-most expensive yearling ever sold by the operation.

“She was always a beautiful foal, everything had gone like clockwork,” he offered.

“Touch wood, she’d never had any problems, and she sort of prepped herself, but [yearling manager Gerry Meehan] and his team have done a wonderful job with the yearlings, getting them here in such good condition, and they deserve all the credit.”

Dollar revealed that the Oasis Dream filly that would have been Loveisallyouneed’s 2-year-old died as a foal, but noted she has more exciting produce to come.

“She’s a lovely mare, but she hasn’t had a lot of luck,” Dollar said. “She had the most beautiful Oasis Dream foal that died as a foal, which was very unfortunate, but she has a Dansili colt at foot that is very nice, and she’s back in foal to Dubawi.”

Discussing the circumstances that saw Newsells secure Loveisallyouneed privately for its broodmare band, Dollar said, “We were lucky enough to get into the family through Richard Henry a few years ago, having been underbidder on [her full-sister] Song [for 1.7 million guineas at Tattersalls December in 2009], and the following spring Richard rang us up and said this filly may be available.” **Cont. p4**

“We bought her privately out of training, and fillies like that don’t come along very often,” Dollar continued. “In many ways, I’d have loved to race [the Dubawi filly], but 2.1 million pays some bills and keeps everyone happy and going for another year.”

Dubawi ended day two as the sale’s leading sire by average at 658,500gns for 10 sold. Galileo sits second with 14 sold for an average of 589,643gns.

**Banner Day For Newsells...**

Newsells Park sent another expensive Dubawi through the ring earlier in the day in the form of a colt out of the Grade I-placed Flawly (GB) (Old Vic {GB}) ([lot 203](#)), who fetched 725,000 from Armando Duarte of A&E Bloodstock. The late February foal is a half-brother to German Group 3 winner February Sun (GB) (Monsun {Ger}); French Group 3 winner Best Name (GB) (King’s Best); and Irish listed winner Heirloom (GB) (Dansili {GB}), the latter a 480,000gns purchase by Demi O’Byrne in this ring in 2011. Flawly is a half-sister to stakes winner Ombre Legere (Ire) (Double Bed {Fr}) as well as the stakes-placed Date With Destiny (Ire) (George Washington {Ire}), whose Galileo filly Beautiful Morning (GB) made 650,000gns here last year when sent through the ring by Newsells. Duarte had to see off a slew of underbidders including Form Bloodstock’s Jehan Malherbe and John Ferguson for the colt, and said, “He’s for a client of Roger Varian. He’s a very nice horse, very good looking, and ticks all the boxes.”

Newsells' third-highest price of the session came courtesy of its resident first-season sire Nathaniel, whose colt out of Kinnaird (Ire) (Dr Devious {Ire}) ([lot 267](#)) made 525,000gns from agent Charlie Gordon-Watson on behalf of Al Shaqab Racing. The bay is a half-brother to G2 Royal Lodge S. victor Berkshire (Ire) (Mount Nelson {GB}) as well as the dam of last year's G2 July S. and G2 Richmond S. winner Ivawood (Ire) (Zebedee {GB}), third in both the G1 2000 Guineas and G1 Irish 2000 Guineas this year. It has

been a strong sale so far for Nathaniel, who also had a colt fetch 675,000gns from MV Magnier on opening day, and his average through the first two days stands at 222,857gns. Nathaniel sits at number 10 on the

leading sires' list through the first two sessions and second only to Frankel among first-season sires; Frankel's average through the first two days is 438,571gns, and he sits number five overall.

Newsells was making noise right from the start of the session yesterday, beginning when [lot 174](#), the third horse through the ring of the day, made 450,000gns to the bid of Charlie Gordon-Watson for Al Shaqab. That filly is a member of the first crop of Frankel (GB) and the third foal out of the dual Grade I winner Dynaforce (Dynaformer).

"She's out of a very good mare and Newsells Park Stud are excellent breeders," said Gordon-Watson. "The 2-year-old in France [Dynadin, by Giant's Causeway and placed in France] is very highly rated and this is the sort of filly they should be buying."

**Forces Join For Galileo Colt...**

Breeder Triermore Stud and consignor New England Stud, who enjoyed such a good day during the opening session Tuesday when selling the day's top lot, a Galileo filly out of A Z Warrior (Bernardini), experienced another homerun Wednesday when the partnership of the China Horse Club and David Redvers outlasted Coolmore at 1.2 million gns for [lot 255](#), a Galileo colt out of the G1 Irish 1000 Guineas second Jacqueline Quest (Ire) (Rock Of Gibraltar {Ire}).

It was the second time in the space of 10 months the China Horse Club and Qatar Racing have teamed up on a high-profile lot at Tattersalls; in December, the pair joined forces for Sheikh Fahad's Just The Judge (Ire) (Lawman {Fr}), who topped the sale at 4.5 million guineas. **Cont. p6**

Michael Wallace, who conducted the bidding concealed on the stairs alongside Redvers and Sheikh Fahad, revealed that partnership currently has one horse in training together: a placed 2-year-old with trainer Francis Graffard named Jack Fish (Fr) (Exceed and Excel {Aus}).

“We have a horse in France called Jack Fish who is just a 2-year-old that we think has a lot of ability, and then there’s Just The Judge, so we have a great relationship with Sheikh Fahad and his team and David—it was a meeting of the minds,” Wallace said. “We all thought this colt was exceptional, so we decided to form a partnership.”

Wallace confirmed the chestnut would remain in Europe.

“He’s a European horse,” he said. “We have no trainer decided, but we’ll sit down and have a cup of tea and figure that out.”

The China Horse Club has also partnered with Mayfair Speculators thus far this week, and Wallace explained, “the China Horse Club has partners all around the world, and Qatar Racing are an important part of that. This was a horse David and I discussed and had similar views on; 1.2 million is a hell of a lot of money, so there’s a large element of risk that comes with that. Ultimately, we’re trying to secure a stallion for the future, and you don’t necessarily need to have full control to reap the benefits of that. Share the risk and share the enjoyment.”

The Galileo colt is the second foal out of Jacqueline Quest; her first, a filly by that same champion sire, was bought by MV Magnier for 625,000gns at this sale last year. Now named Hibiscus (Ire), she is in training with Aidan O’Brien but is unraced. Jacqueline Quest has only been bred to Galileo since going to stud; she also has a colt foal by him and was bred back this year. The Galileo/Rock Of Gibraltar cross is the same cross as Photo Call (Ire), winner of the GI Rodeo Drive S. two weeks ago.

China Horse Club added a 670,000gns filly by Frankel out of Model Queen (Kingmambo) ([lot 339](#))--a half-sister to Group 1 winner Regal Parade (GB) (Pivotal {GB}) and Group 3 winner Entifaadha (GB) (Dansili {GB}) from Highclere Stud.

Galileo got a second millionaire to his name on the day late in the afternoon when John Magnier went to 1 million guineas for [lot 293](#), a March-foaled filly out of Like A Dame (GB) (Danehill) from Clare Castle Stud, and therefore a half-sister to G3 Atalanta S. victress Ladys First (GB) (Dutch Art {GB}). Hugo Lascelles, who purchased Ladys First for 1.8 million guineas at last year's Tattersalls December Mare Sale, was the underbidder. Like A Dame's now 2-year-old by Galileo cost Charlie Gordon-Watson 400,000gns in this ring last year, and the mare had a colt foal by the champion sire this year before being bred back to him again.

A few lots later Magnier shelled out 700,000gns for [lot 297](#), an Invincible Spirit (Ire) full-sister to Listed Buckhounds S. winner Ektihaam (Ire) from Camas Park Stud, who purchased her for 90,000gns at last year's Tattersalls December Foal Sale.

### Stallion Master's 'Dream'...

The Galileo colt out of Jacqueline Quest was the second star during a frenzied few moments at Park Paddocks, as the lot directly ahead of him, [lot 254](#), became the first millionaire of the session when fetching 1.1 million guineas from John Ferguson, with Charlie Gordon-Watson the underbidder on the colt described by auctioneer Ollie Fowlston as a "stallion master's dream." The colt is by Oasis Dream (GB) and is the first foal from the regally bred Izzi Top (GB) (Pivotal {GB}), herself the winner of the G1 Pretty Polly S. and G1 Prix Jean Romanet. The bay's second dam is the G1 Prix de l'Opera scorer Zee Zee Top (GB) (Zafonic), who is also responsible for this year's G2 Prix de la Nonette winner Jazz Top (GB) (Danehill Dancer {Ire}), who nearly emulated her dam last weekend when second in the Prix de l'Opera. “It’s very unusual that you have a yearling who is the first foal of a Group 1 winner, who is out of a Group 1 winner, who is out of a Group 1 winner,” said Ferguson, who bought Zee Zee Top’s Oasis Dream colt, now named Dance Rock and in training with Charlie Appleby, at this sale last year. “At the end of the day, a pedigree like that gives you an outstanding chance to have a serious racehorse, but if you do strike it lucky, he’ll be very valuable as a stallion.”

“It’s a family we all know because it’s such a famous Meon Valley family,” Ferguson added. “But I can’t remember the last time I saw a first foal out of a Group 1 winner, who is out of a Group 1 winner. And then out of a Group 3 winner [fourth dam Reprocolor].”

The colt’s delighted breeder Mark Weinfeld, whose late father Egon established Meon Valley Stud back in 1980, said, “You never know of course how a sale will go, but this is a fantastic result and he’s a smashing horse. It’s a cross that has worked well for us in the past--Green Desert works very well with the family.”

Meon Valley began with a clutch of well-selected mares, including Reprocolor--a 25,000gns Tattersalls December purchase--and now has 32 mares in its Hampshire paddocks, where Izzi Top has a Dansili (GB) colt foal on the ground. She is in foal to Dubawi.

### Angel Rises Again...

Yeomanstown Stud purchased the 85-rated Folga (GB) (Atraf {GB}) from the 2007 Horses-in-Training Sale for 33,000gns, and she has certainly proved to be a shrewd buy. The first sales return for one of her offspring was the relatively lowly sum of 16,000gns paid by trainer Michael Dods for Folga’s first foal, but that daughter of Dark Angel (Ire) turned out to be Group 1-winning sprinter Mecca’s Angel (Ire). Her full-brother Markaz (Ire) brought £200,000 as a yearling from Shadwell, and he

pre-empted Mecca’s Angel’s Nunthorpe S. victory with a group win of his own in the G3 Criterion S. in June.

Needless to say, Folga’s current yearling--yet another full-sister ([lot 204](#))--prompted plenty of interest and provided one of the early

highlights of the day when selling for 825,000gns to Fawzi Nass. Oliver St Lawrence did the bidding for Nass, who owns Aislabie Stud just outside Newmarket, where he has recently installed young trainer George Peckham, who will take charge of the Dark Angel filly. St Lawrence commented, “She is a really nice filly and looks exactly as it says on the can--a proper sprinting type.”

St Lawrence added, "We were standing in exactly this spot when we bought Krypton Factor, so let's hope it is lucky."

The sharp-looking filly attracted a spectrum of bidders, including Angus Gold, representing Markaz's owner Sheikh Hamdan; Shawn Dugan, and eventual underbidder Teddy Grimthorpe of Juddmonte.

David O'Callaghan, who bred and consigned the filly through his family's Yeomanstown Stud, expressed his appreciation for their support, saying, "Thanks to everybody who stepped up to bid--and there was certainly a whole lot of them. We knew she had been well received, but I can't say we were expecting anything near this price."

Adding that the mare has another filly foal by the same stallion back at home in Ireland, he said, "I'd guess she'll be in a monogamous relationship with Dark Angel for the rest of her life."

Harmonize set the pace before falling a nose short of Thrilled (Uncle Mo) when second in her Aug. 9 debut over the Saratoga turf. She returned to soundly best that foe by four lengths after pressing the pace in the Sept. 3 P.G. Johnson S. last time out. Thrilled was subsequently a nosed-out second in the Sept. 27 GIII Miss Grillo S. at Belmont Park.

Jockey Junior Alvarado admitted it wasn't the plan to be so far back in Wednesday's Jessamine.

"She wasn't getting hold of the track the first part of the race," Alvarado explained. "I didn't want to get after her too early; I wanted to let her get comfortable and let her pick up ground. By the end, she was much the best."

Trainer Bill Mott was pleased with his filly's ability to come from off the pace.

"It's nice to see that she's versatile enough to come from back in the pack like she did," Mott said. "She struggled with ground early and once she got down the backside, she got a little better, a little better. When [Alvarado] turned for home, she turned on the after-burners and was good enough to run them down. I thought we could be laying third or fourth in the race. There looked like there were two obvious speed horses. I thought we would be laying right behind them. It didn't work out that way, but I'm glad the filly took care of it."

Mott said Harmonize would likely take her spot in the Breeders' Cup starting gate, where she could also face Jessamine runner-up Sapphire Kitten.

"We were really pleased with the race," trainer Joe Sharp said of Sapphire Kitten's effort. "It was her first time around two turns and the winner had already been around two turns. We were impressed with the way our filly was passed at the eighth pole and battled back inside. Hopefully, that was enough to get us in the Breeders' Cup because I think we have a legitimate contender. She definitely moved forward today."

Larkin Armstrong, who is breeder Jack Swain's primary bloodstock agent, signed the ticket at \$15,000 to acquire Harmonize's dam Mesa Fresca (Sky Mesa), in foal to Badge of Silver, at the 2011 Keeneland November sale. Armstrong purchased Harmonize for \$80,000 at the 2014 Keeneland September sale. The 8-year-old Mesa Fresca is a half-sister to Maya (Capote), the dam of Mott-trained multiple graded stakes winner Al Khali (Medaglia d'Oro) and to stakes winner and graded stakes placed Japan (Medaglia d'Oro). She produced a colt by Hat Trick (Jpn) in 2014, a colt by Animal Kingdom in 2015 and was bred back to Scat Daddy this spring.

homebred Kitten's Point has been stripped of the \$90,000 she earned for first place in the contest, and runner-up Cay Dancer (GB) (Danehill Dancer {Ire}) has inherited the victory.

Robaxin is considered a controlled therapeutic substance, with a limit of 1.0 nanograms per milliliter in the state of Kentucky and a recommended 48-hour withdrawal time. Kitten's Point's sample showed 2.9 ng/ml of plasma despite Motion's insistence that her final dose of Robaxin came a full week before the Bewitch.

"While I always realized the possibility of a violation despite the highest degree of diligence and understand the need for penalties, in these circumstances I am convinced that my staff and I followed all the required protocols and I plan to appeal the decision for a variety of reasons, all of which were presented at the stewards' hearing," Motion said in a [statement](#) on his website.

When reached Wednesday by the *Thoroughbred Daily News*, Motion added, "I strongly feel that the system, the way it is now, is not working. My biggest concerns are that testing has become so sensitive, and that the racing jurisdictions and commissions aren't being held to the same standard that we are as trainers... A nanogram is a billionth of a gram. My point about what's going on at Keeneland is that the room that handles our samples doubles as the outriders' tack room [until approximately two days before the beginning of the Keeneland meet]. To me, that doesn't make sense. If we're measuring nanograms, I don't think they should be held in that kind of environment."

Motion also called into question the accuracy and research behind suggested medication withdrawal times on which trainers rely.

"We have to, as trainers, have guidelines," Motion said. "If we can't follow the guidelines that are issued--if there's no science behind the guidelines--then I'm not quite sure how we're supposed to operate." **Cont. p14**

“Clearly there is no science behind a normal racetrack dose of Robaxin,” Motion continued. “No one’s bothered to do the science behind it. We don’t really know. Forty-eight hours is clearly not enough to withdraw from this medication--I withdrew seven days out and it still wasn’t enough. It makes it very hard to operate under those conditions.”

In response to Carrie Brogden’s [Oct. 6 letter to the editor](#):

### JOHN HAMILTON, DARBY DAN FARM:

Having read the recent letters this week in TDN regarding owners' frustration about getting fingerprinted repeatedly, I can shed some light on this.

First off, the complaining and whining in the media will probably not help. It merely causes the culprits to burrow further into the sand.

No one would like to see a uniform acceptance of the initial set of fingerprints by all the state racing jurisdictions more than me.

I deal with owners all the time in my job. I have been in the Thoroughbred business for 33 years and during my seven years in the 1980s-90s as Executive Director of the TOBA, I served on the RCI's codification of rules committee. It is there that I was able to look under the tent flap and fully understand the problem.

Simply put, here is the problem, and it is not going to change anytime soon. Each state racing commission has as its core responsibility with respect to licensing...verification that each person applying for an owners license has no felonies on his or her record. Pure and simple. THAT is the issue. They do not want to allow the public to bet on horses owned by felons. And that is a fair concern.

Under the current arrangement, the only way a state racing commission can be sure of that is to clear that applicant through the FBI with a new recent criminal records check. The only way they can do that is with a new, recent set of fingerprints sent to the FBI. Sadly, they cannot just call or email and "check out" this person, or plug into the FBI computer bank themselves. That would make too much sense. It lies safely protected as a right to privacy issue.

When I was with the TOBA, this issue was top of mind among our members, just as it is today. The solution I sought back then was for the FBI to allow each state to check out an applicant

instantaneously--the computer technology to do this was in place even 25 years ago--it is even more available and high-tech today in the same way police and other officials key in a driver's license and have immediate on-line access (in their cars!) to that person's complete police record. It seemed to me back then that seeing if a person is a felon by each state racing office having access to the FBI computer bank, was a slam-dunk solution to the problem (the agony of owners from repeated fingerprinting). Alas, the FBI will not allow this. A new set of fingerprints are required and each state racing commission must keep getting them. In the FBI's view, it remains a privacy issue even though the applying body is in itself ALSO a government agency. Aaaahhhhhhhh!!

Further, for other license applicants besides owners (grooms, out-riders, trainers, jockeys, patrol judges, etc.) there is no state-to-state reciprocity or agreement as to what levels of criminal activity are allowed for these type applicants to get licensed. That's right. Each state has its own opinion and they cannot agree among themselves--so there is no accepted uniform code on allowed or not allowed criminal activity. States vary in their level of tolerance on this issue (Remember telling your teenage daughter, "I don't care what all the other parents are allowing, these are our rules young lady.")

If you're not howling in despair by now at the ridiculousness of it all, understand that there are plenty of "rules" in various state racing commissions that are routinely overlooked. Such as: in most states the owners of racetracks cannot race their own horses at the track they own. Why? Because the public bets on these races and thus the perception that the owner somehow has an "advantage" for his horse through his ownership of the premises. We know this is not true, and is a silly rule... yet, it is in place in many states and we know it is routinely ignored. As it should be!

How many felons are actually turned up from this maddening policy? Less than 1%. This reminds me of when my father and I were arguing over nothing, back when I was a child and my mother had had enough and grabbed the silverware drawer, started shaking it, and yelled out "STOP!" I still remember all those spoons and forks jumping up and down. The madness of it all.

So, where are we on the fingerprinting malaise? Nowhere. It would take a groundswell political movement through all industry strata, which would include all vocational groups within the industry and all the alphabet soup of organizations--including the state racing commissions--all working together to seek influence over time to convince the FBI to allow access from each state with only one set of fingerprints AND then get reciprocity from each state racing commission so they will accept the initial fingerprints taken in another state.

Ever tried herding cats?

**KIRK ROBISON, OWNER AND BREEDER:**

We race about 40 horses and last year had to process owner licenses in 13 states. Sometimes we only have one starter in a state the entire year. How about one license for all jurisdictions? Bureaucracies do what bureaucracies do: perpetuate the status quo. It is not in their interest to change. And how about this idea right out of the 1940's that Jockey Club papers follow the horse. How about online papers and electronic verification? It is easier to ship a horse than to get the papers sent from one track to another. Licenses should be multi-year and multi-state unless there is a change in material information. The barriers to financial success in racing are expected; but why is it so hard to just navigate the rules?

The chestnut led wire-to-wire in a 1 1/16-mile Belmont allowance test May 15, but could do no better than eighth after a wide run in Saratoga's GII Lake George S. July 24. Recently a punchless eighth again in an optional claimer over the Spa turf course, Robillard posted a trio of swift workouts in the interim at Sheikh Mohammed's Greentree Training Center and returned to Lexington looking to get back on track. Bet down to odds of 7-2 from her 6-1 morning-line price, the homebred assumed command soon after the start and cruised through a half-mile in :47.93 with favored Aljalela (Unbridled's Song) closely in tow. Asked for more on the final bend, she turned back a challenge from the aforementioned rival and widened to notch a decisive 5 1/4-length tally. Candy Crush (Candy Ride {Arg}) came on late to tag Aljalela by a nose for place honors. The winner hails from a female family that also produced Casual Smile (GB) (Red Ransom), winner of the GIII WinStar Matchmaker S. earlier this term. Lifetime Record: 6-3-0-0, \$120,360. ### Emerald Down Meeting Shows Gains:

Emerald Downs concluded its 2015 meeting Sept. 27 with a 10.7% increase in daily average handle, according to figures released by the Washington track Wednesday. Average total daily handle was \$1,262,956, with a high of \$2,421,017 for Longacres Mile Day Aug. 16. With the on-track horse population over the 1,000 mark for the first time in three years, average field size at the 70-day meeting increased from 6.27 horses in 2014 to 6.86 horses in 2015. "The success we experienced this season would not have been possible without the support of our track founder Ron Crockett who continues to play an integral role at Emerald Downs, and the Muckleshoot Tribe who own our company and have invested over \$13 million in purses since 2004," said track president Phil Ziegler.

Last winter Emerald Downs announced a 20% increase for lower-level claiming races. The track also lured several first-time Emerald Downs' trainers to the facility with incentives designed to lower costs for horsemen.

### Horse Farm Workers' Educational Fund Awards Scholarships:

The Horse Farm Workers' Educational Assistance Fund has awarded 26 children of full-time horse farm workers scholarships as they pursue higher education. To date, the fund has awarded 574 scholarships totally \$1,173,845.

Scholarships are awarded for education or skill training after high school and are based upon financial need, merit, biographical essays and personal interviews. Scholarships are also available for full-time horse farm workers in central Kentucky who wish to take equine-related training or courses to help them be more knowledgeable and effective while working with Thoroughbred horses.

Three students were named Pollard Scholars: Tara Wolfenbarger and Olivia Carter at UK and Michael Greathouse at Centre College. In addition, Jeffrey Hamilton has been awarded the Jeffrey Thornbury, Jr. Memorial Scholarship.

The fund was founded in 1996 by Rob Whiteley, Tom Evans and Fred Seitz.

"These kids and parents are an industry treasure," Whiteley said. "Farm workers are the backbone of the breeding industry which is the foundation of the entire Thoroughbred industry."

"The parents of these scholars have instilled an incredible work ethic in their children," Whiteley continued. "Year after year, these outstanding young people impress the board with their ability, motivation, energy, enthusiasm, and accomplishments. In many instances, our scholars are the first in their families to pursue secondary education; and in some cases, they could not attend without our financial assistance."

Evans added, "I would like to thank all of the contributors who have so generously supported and valued this remarkable group of young scholars. Over the years, we have received significant contributions from the Carl Pollard Foundation, Thoroughbred Charities of America, Race for Education, Clay Hancock, William Marquard, W.T. Young, Darley, Hill 'n' Dale Farm, Fasig-Tipton, Keeneland, Kentucky Thoroughbred Farm Managers Club, Kentucky Owners and Breeders, KTA, the Crafty Prospector syndicate, and many other individual donors."
