SUPER MAJESTY EYES BREEDERS' CUP

LNJ Foxwoods's **Super Majesty** (Super Saver), "**TDN Rising Star**" and recent winner of the GIII Dogwood S. at Churchill Downs, is being pointed to a start in the GI Breeders' Cup Filly and Mare Sprint, according to bloodstock agent and Foxwoods business partner Alex Solis, II. The filly is currently stabled at Keeneland and is scheduled to work Tuesday morning at the Lexington oval.

Solis said that the original plan was to run Super Majesty in Saturday's GII Lexus Raven Run S., but the owners and trainer Jerry Hollendorfer opted to call an audible after she worked impressively over the local surface.

"My dad [regular rider Alex Solis] flew out to work her [at Keeneland] when Jerry was here last week and they both came home with raving reviews," Solis commented. "They wanted to give the Breeders' Cup a go, so we'll run her in the Filly and Mare Sprint [Oct. 31]."

Super Majesty annexed her first two starts and checked in a narrowly beaten second in an Aug. 23 allowance event at Del Mar. The bay ventured out of California for the first time in the Dogwood and was never threatened in a wire-to-wire 1 3/4-length score.

Super Majesty will join **Nickname** (Scat Daddy) to form a pair of 'Foxwoods' fillies competing in the world championships. The juvenile, who recently captured the GI Frizette S. at Belmont Oct. 4, registered her first workout since that authoritative triumph with a five-furlong breeze in 1:01.80 Monday at Keeneland. Solis said the Steve Asmussen trainee emerged from her race in good order and is on target for a start in the GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies Oct. 31.

"Steve seemed very happy with her," Solis said. "He said she worked really nicely [Monday morning], just a nice easy breeze to keep her fit. We'll tighten the screws a little more next week and get ready for the big dance."

One day after Nickname scored in the Frizette, LNJ Foxwoods and Asmussen found themselves in the Belmont winner's circle again with "**TDN Rising Star**" **Inheritance** (Tapit), who graduated by a dominant 16 lengths in her second career start. The gray set an all-time OBS sales record after being acquired for \$1.9 million by Solis & Litt Bloodstock at the April Sale, and Solis says the connections are taking a long-term approach with their promising prospect. **Cont. p3**


KEENELAND REVIEWS TRACK CONDITION

In the wake of three fatal breakdowns over its main track this meet, Keeneland on Monday released results of a racetrack review conducted by Dr. Mick Peterson. Peterson, a University of Maine professor and executive director of the Racing Surfaces Testing Laboratory, worked with track officials over this past weekend to review testing and daily measuring procedures to ensure the safety of the dirt track. The review found that Keeneland's dirt surface met all of the pre-meet test criteria and all maintenance had been performed in accordance with protocols developed for the track.

"Keeneland, along with a small group of industry leaders, has made a commitment to advancing knowledge and providing the most consistent surfaces in the industry," Peterson said in a Keeneland release. "By participating in the maintenance tracking system to measure and monitor the surface performance, Keeneland both defines the state of the art and is helping to advance our understanding of racing surfaces. When questions arise, these records allow us to review all of the maintenance and operating conditions as well as the daily surface inspections, that help to ensure that the most consistent possible surface is provided. Because the racing surface is a critical safety system, all of the maintenance must be performed in accordance with best practices in the industry."

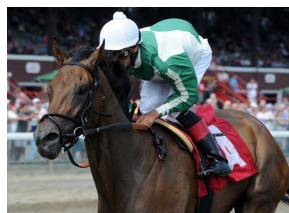

"She came out of the race really well and we're going to give her a little bit of time now," Solis said of Inheritance. "We're hoping she's a filly for the spring next year. We've got Nickname going to the Breeders' Cup and some other fillies running, so I think we'll give [Inheritance] a little time now and get her ready for next year."

Solis added that LNJ Foxwoods will be in graded stakes action on both coasts with another pair of fillies this weekend, including their third "TDN Rising Star," Constellation (Bellamy Road), who is scheduled to start in the GII Matron over six furlongs at Belmont this Sunday. In California, 3-year-old Dreamologist (Tapit) will make her first appearance since a wire-to-wire maiden score in Saturday's GIII Autumn Miss S. The gray is a daughter of 2006 champion 2-year-old filly Dreaming of Anna (Rahy).

Peterson reviews Keeneland’s turf and dirt tracks prior to the start of each meet. His findings this weekend match findings prior to the Oct. 2 start of the Fall Meet. Peterson also monitors daily measurements taken by Keeneland officials on both racing surfaces every race day.

“The safety of our horses and riders is priority number one, and we remain confident in the performance of our racetrack,” Keeneland Vice President of Racing W.B. Rogers Beasley said. “Our team works very hard every day to carefully maintain and monitor the racetrack.”

Keeneland President and CEO Bill Thomason added, “We have the best people in the industry on our track crew, led by Track Superintendent Javier Barajas, who are using state-of-the-art technology in consultation with the industry’s most knowledgeable experts. The data we retrieve is part of an ongoing dialogue among major North American racetracks about surface safety and maintenance.”

Thomason continued, “The status quo is unacceptable to Keeneland when it comes to safety and other issues critically important to the future of our industry. We want everything we do here to be shared with the industry in an effort to benefit racing as a whole.”

ARTEMIS AGROTERA POSSIBLE FOR CUP

Chester and Mary Broman's **Artemis Agrotera** (Roman Ruler), off since finishing seventh in last year's GI Breeders' Cup F/M Sprint, could return to the races in the Oct. 31 renewal of that seven-furlong event. The filly worked a best-of-31 five furlongs from the gate Monday at Belmont in :59.11.

"It is an ambitious leap but I think she deserves it," said trainer Mike Hushion.

"Talent-wise, she's one of the best in the country. From the moment she came back she's been working brilliantly, and had me scratching my head, wondering what I was going to do with her. Every time she's gone out, she's been better."

Artemis Agrotera won the 2013 GI Frizette S. in just her second outing. She returned to win last season's GI Ballerina S. and GI Gallant Bloom H.

Monday's work was the 4-year-old's sixth since returning to the worktab in September and her second straight bullet move. She went five furlongs over a dull training track last Monday in 1:00.50, fastest of 40 at the distance.

"I think I can have her fit enough to run seven furlongs," said Hushion. "As far as definite plans, we'll have to see how she is tomorrow morning, what's available transportation-wise, and so on. But she's very, very good."

SALAMA MOVES ON TO BREEDERS' CUP

Maria Santa Stable's **Salama** (Desert Party), who earned an automatic berth into the GI Longines Breeders' Cup Distaff with her win in the G3 Clasico Cesar del Rio, will continue on to the championship event after running second in her U.S. debut in a Keeneland optional claimer last Saturday.

"That was always the plan: to get a race in her rather than breeze up to a race of that caliber," trainer Charlie LoPresti said. "It is tough enough as it is."

Salama was making her first start outside of Peru and her first outing in 16 weeks when she came up 3/4-lengths short of Lavender Chrissie (Scat Daddy) in Saturday's nine-furlong race ([video](#)).

"The chart said she was getting to the winner," LoPresti said of Salama. "I wish she could have won by three-quarters of a length. She came out of the race well and was full of energy after the race."

Salama, who has won five of nine lifetime starts, has been with LoPresti's string since the end of July.

"She's a 3-year-old and she's done nothing wrong," LoPresti said. "The owners are realistic. She won a 'Win and You're In' race, so it is all paid for, so why not take a chance?"

The Clasico Cesar del Rio is Salama's only group victory to date and LoPresti acknowledged the Distaff will be a big step up for the filly, a \$13,000 Keeneland September yearling of 2013.

"I imagine we will be 20-1 in there," LoPresti said. "But without Beholder (Henny Hughes) in there, it could be anybody's race."

LEA TO CLAIBORNE IN '16; WAR FRONT FEE TO \$200k

Grade I winner **Lea** (First Samurai--Greenery, by Galileo {Ire}), a graded stakes winner on turf and dirt, will take up stud duties at Claiborne Farm in 2016. Bred and raced by Claiborne and Adele Dilschneider, the 6-year-old won the 2014 GI Donn H., as well as the 2012 GIII

Commonwealth Turf S. and 2015 GIII Hal's Hope S. He was third in this year's G1 Dubai World Cup and returned to the U.S. to miss by just a neck when second in the GI Stephen Foster H. He was most recently second in the GI Woodbine Mile and is expected to conclude his racing career in either the GI Breeders' Cup Dirt Mile or GI Breeders' Cup Mile.

"Lea has a great disposition, and he's one of the coolest horses we've ever had in the barn," said Hall-of-Fame trainer Bill Mott. "He's very effective on both surfaces. While Lea's stud fee will not be announced until after the Breeders' Cup, Claiborne Farm did release the 2016 stud fees of its others stallions Monday. War Front, who has been represented this term by leading European juvenile Air Force Blue, will stand for \$200,000 next season. The 13-year-old stallion stood for \$150,000 in 2015.

BAYERN STUD FEE ANNOUNCED

Multiple Grade I winner **Bayern** (Offlee Wild--Alittlebitearly, by Thunder Gulch) will begin his stud career next season at John Sikura's Hill 'n' Dale for a fee of \$15,000, the farm announced Monday evening. The 4-year-old, who won last year's GI Breeders' Cup Classic and GI Haskell Invitational, retired last month with six wins and earnings of \$4,454,930.

At \$15,000 live foal, we believe he represents extreme value for those breeding commercially, as well as those breeding to race."

On the lead from the start, Killin Me Smalls earned the first graded stakes victory of his career when he glided home a much-the-best winner of GIII British Columbia Premier H. Monday at Hastings Park. Killin Me Smalls was claimed from breeder Zayat Stables for \$17,500 out of a winning effort at Fair Grounds in February of 2014. He won three of four starts at Northlands Park for the new connections before being claimed again for \$25,000 by current owners Deltin Stable and Ed Welsh. Killin Me Smalls, who earned his first stakes victory at Northlands last August, opened 2015 with three straight wins at that Edmonton oval and he was coming off a five-length victory in the track's Sept. 7 Speed to Spare S. Away alertly, Killin Me Smalls charged out to the early lead and pulled his way clear while racing keenly through an opening quarter in :24.29. Challenged by Square Dancer into the stretch the second time, he reasserted control into the clubhouse turn, then shrugged off Senor Rojo and opened up again after a mile in 1:38.08. He carried a four-length advantage into the stretch the final time and sailed further clear down to the wire.

RAVEN'S PASS ON TOP AGAIN AT BOOK 2

Only one filly in the history of the October Sale's Book 2 has ever sold for more than 370,000gns, which was the price given for lot [593](#), Rathbarry Stud's daughter of Raven's Pass (Elusive Quality) out of the listed-placed Aneedah (Ire) (Invincible Spirit {Ire}). Tony Nerses held his nerve the longest to add the sturdy bay filly to the racing string of Saleh Al Homaizi and Imad Al Sagar, seeing off attempts by Ross Doyle and Liam Norris. In the

buyer's opinion, his latest acquisition wouldn't have looked out of place in last week's Book 1 sale. He said, "She's the most beautiful filly I've seen in a long time. She's special – very athletic and with a great page. It's nice to find a filly of this calibre in

Book 2." Nerses added, "I didn't really come here to buy today. I just had to come in for a meeting, but I saw her this morning and I loved her." The filly's breeder Paul Cashman of Rathbarry Stud said, "She's been very straightforward throughout. We bought the mare here [for 220,000gns in 2012] carrying to New Approach and we've put that filly into training." Aneedah, a sister to dual Group 2-winning sprinter Muthmir (Ire), is now in foal to Intello (Ger) (Galileo {Ire}) and has a colt foal by Rathbarry resident Acclamation (GB) (Royal Applause {GB}).

Darley's Breeders' Cup Classic winner Raven's Pass has enjoyed some notable sales-ring highlights in the last fortnight, led by his Orby Sale-topping daughter from Pat O'Kelly's Welsh Flame family, who was bought by Moyglare Stud for €2 million. His 12 lots sold through Book 1 returned an average of 164,667 with a top price of 450,000gns for the filly out of Irish 1,000 Guineas winner Nighttime (Ire) (Galileo {Ire}). A further five sold during the first session of Book 2 at an average price of 157,600gns. Rathbarry's filly led a solid opening session of the three-day Book 2 Sale, with 231 of the 277 yearlings offered bringing turnover to 14,585,000gns (down by 6%) for four more horses sold than in 2014. This time last year, the first day was the strongest of Book 2 and the average and median figures this time around each dropped by 8% to 63,141gns and 48,000gns. The clearance rate also fell to 83% (from 89%).

Sheikh Mohammed returns to lucky family

John Ferguson spent almost 8.5 million gns on Sheikh Mohammed's behalf during Book 1 and continued in busy fashion during the curtain-up for Book 2, adding a further ten yearlings to the books for 1,335,000gns. Heading the list was lot [626](#) a Cheveley Park Stud-bred colt by the farm's perennially commercial stallion Dutch Art (GB) (Medicean {GB}). The son of dual winner Bahia Emerald (Ire) (Bahamian Bounty {GB}), who was knocked down for 280,000gns, hails from a family with which the Sheikh has enjoyed much success and includes champion 2-year-old filly Embassy (GB). Fittingly, the daughter of Cadeaux Genereux (GB) won the G1 Cheveley Park S. back in 1997 in Sheikh Mohammed's maroon-and-white silks. A Power (Ire) filly out of Embassy's half-sister Tarfshi (GB) (Mtoto {GB}) sold for 180,000gns to the Mayfair Speculators in Book 1.

Classic breeder reaps more success

Anthony Oppenheimer's Hascombe & Valiant Stud is flying high as the breeder of this year's Derby and Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe hero Golden Horn (GB) (Cape Cross {Ire}) and while the four-time Group 1 winner was unsold at Tattersalls as a yearling, the same fate did not befall lot [590](#), the stud's colt by Elusive City (Elusive Quality) colt out of Ammo (Ire) (Sadler's Wells), a sister to the G3 Prix de Royaumont winner Sadler's Flag (Ire).

The May 6 colt's second and third dams are the group winners

Animatrice and Alexandrie, the latter being the dam of the Haras d'Etream sire Poliglote (GB) (Sadler's Wells). Charlie Gordon-Watson stepped up to the plate at 250,000gns and said, "He's a really good colt from fantastic breeders – I also bought Cannock Chase from them. He's

for an existing client and will be trained by Sir Michael Stoute." Cannock Chase (Lemon Drop Kid), who races in the Derby-winning colours of Saeed Suhail and is also trained by Stoute, won the listed Godolphin S. on his last start and is set to line up in Sunday's GI Pattison Canadian International.

Redgate's Zoffany colt to Hong Kong

The Hong Kong Jockey Club team made their first purchase of the week when selecting a colt, lot [712](#) by Europe's leading first-season sire Zoffany (Ire) for 240,000gns. The sale price was the highest yet for Damian Flynn and Emma Foley's Redgate Bloodstock, which consigned the first foal of the multiple-winning Iffraaj (Ire) mare Close To The Edge (Ire) on behalf of Charles Wentworth, who bred the colt in partnership with Foley.

“He was a lovely athletic colt and I went back to look at him two or three times,” said Mark Richardson of HKJC. “He’s exactly the type of model we’re looking for. The sire’s made a great start and he seems to put plenty of speed into his offspring. This colt walked like he really wanted to do it.” Wentworth, who also owns Group-winning sprinter Caspar Netscher (GB) (Dutch Art {GB}), initially bought Close To The Edge for £30,000 at the DBS Breeze-up Sale of 2010 and enjoyed four trips to the winner’s enclosure during her racing career. Redgate Bloodstock relocated to Langham Hall Stud near Bury St Edmunds last October and sealed their anniversary celebrations with a terrific result. “It’s a real buzz,” said Flynn. “It’s always quite nerve-racking to move horses but we’re delighted with how things are going at Langham Hall and this is a great advertisement for the stud and a lovely result for Charles and Emma with a first foal.”

Long-term prospect for Normandie Stud

The Watership Down Stud-consigned filly by Lawman (Fr) (Invincible Spirit {Ire}) out of the Group 3-placed Bufera (Ire) (King’s Best) will eventually find herself in the Normandie Stud paddocks after being bought by Nicholas Cooper through agent Anthony Stroud for 230,000gns. The filly, lot 662, owns an enticing pedigree and is closely related to G1 St James’ Palace S.

winner and young Coolmore sire Most Improved (Ire) (Lawman {Fr}), whose dam Tonnara (Ire) (Linamix {Fr}) is a half-sister to Bufera. Her 2-year-old full-sister Chartreuse (Ire), who is trained in France by Freddy Head for Highclere Thoroughbred Racing, has won since the publication of the catalogue and is entered for the Group 3 Prix des Reservoirs at Deauville next week. A member of the Racehorse Owners Association Council, Cooper and his wife Philippa own Normandie Stud in Sussex, which has enjoyed notable

homebred success on the racecourse via the likes of G1 Irish St Leger winner Duncan (GB) (Dalakhani {Ire}) and the Group 1-winning fillies Fallen For You (GB) (Dansili {GB}) and Sultanina (GB) (New Approach {Ire}).

Shadwell shows support again

During last year’s Book 2 sale, Shadwell’s Angus Gold was the leading buyer and signed for 36 yearlings for a little over 5 million gns. He appeared intent on making his presence felt again with 13 first-day purchases totalling 1,755,000gns. They included a quartet of 200,000gns yearlings, three of them colts by Dream Ahead (lot 569), Dark Angel (Ire) (lot 600) and Pivotal (GB) (lot 666). Darley’s shuttle stallion Sepoy (Aus)

(Elusive Quality) currently leads the freshman sires with representatives in Book 2, his ten first-day entrants selling for a total of 853,000gns. Shadwell acquired the most expensive of the day—a Castledillon Stud pinhooked filly (lot 665) who improved in price from an 82,000gns foal to a 200,000gns yearling and is the first foal of the listed Conqueror S. winner Burke’s Rock (GB) (Cape Cross {Ire}).

Former champion jockey Richard Hughes will train a Sepoy son of the G2 Oaks d’Italia winner Zanzibar (Ire) (In The Wings {Ire}) after purchasing him for 100,000gns from breeder Kevin Mercer of Usk Valley Stud. Zanzibar has already produced a talented runner in Spice Route (GB) (King’s Best), a dual winner and Group-placed in the UK before being exported to the US where he added three graded stakes victories to his record for Roger Attfield, including the GII Fifth Third Elkhorn S. at Keeneland. Book 2 continues today at 10am (local time).

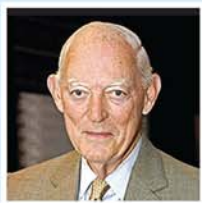

PEDIGREE INSIGHTS

FIRST VICTORY SHARP FOR TEOFILO

When it comes to dominating the championship-deciding G1 Dewhurst S., no stallion can hold a candle to the unique Northern Dancer. Thanks to Nijinsky, The Minstrel, Try My Best, Storm Bird, El Gran Senor and Ajdal, the Windfields patriarch had an unequalled record in the last 50 years.

Since then two branches of the Northern Dancer-male line have been busily extending his influence. For example, when Air Force Blue demolished the opposition in last week's race, he became the second winner in three years for Danzig's impressive son War Front. There have also been Dewhurst winners by Danzig, his sons Chief's Crown and Danehill and his grandson Oratorio.

Even so, the Danzig clan still has a little way to go before it matches the exploits of another of Northern Dancer's brilliant stallion sons--Sadler's Wells. This 14-time champion sire notched up three winners, thanks to the 1988 dead-heaters Prince of Dance and Scenic and the 1996 winner In Command. Since then there have been four winners by Sadler's Wells's stallion sons, with Galileo being responsible for the magnificent trio of Teofilo, New Approach and Frankel, who were collectively unbeaten in 14 juvenile starts. Teofilo then wasted no time in siring a Dewhurst winner, with his first-crop son Parish Hall landing the 2011 prize.

All three of Galileo's Dewhurst-winning champions were in the news last week--Frankel at the sales, where he had sons sold for 750,000gns, 670,000gns and 620,000gns, and New Approach and Teofilo on the track. New Approach had new stakes winners in the U.S. (the Grade III turf winner Messi) and Britain (the stamina-packed filly Glamorous Approach). **Cont. p11**

Teofilo did even better. He enjoyed Group 3 success with his daughters First Victory ([Oh So Sharp S.](#)) and Loritania (Premio Verziere) and it was his sons Massaat and Sanus Per Aquam who chased home Air Force Blue in the Dewhurst.

Here we have another example of success breeding further success, as First Victory, Massaat and Sanus Per Aquam are all members of Teofilo's 2013 crop, conceived months after Parish Hall won the Dewhurst. That victory made him one of four 2-year-old black-type winners from Teofilo's first crop. Teofilo's fee had been in freefall in his first four years, dropping from an initial €40,000 to €15,000 in his fourth, but fortunately the graph has gone very much in the opposite direction since his progeny had a chance to prove themselves. By 2013, in his sixth year, Teofilo was back up to €35,000 and then his fee climbed to a new high of €50,000 in each of the last two years.

This rise tells its own story, reflecting the fact that Teofilo now has 20 Northern Hemisphere group winners to his credit, from five crops. His record tends to confirm the importance of factoring in a stallion's fee when assessing his results. His first crop--at 116 foals--was a good bit smaller than his second and third, which respectively numbered 136 and 148 foals. However, as I mentioned earlier, the first crop was sired at €40,000, compared to €25,000 for his second crop and €20,000 for his third. This helps explain why that first crop has produced eight group winners, compared to five in the second and three in the third (now four years of age).

It isn't all about quantity, though. Teofilo's second crop possessed plenty of quality, with the Irish Derby winner Trading Leather heading a trio of Group 1 winners. And, although his cheapest crop, sired at €15,000, has so far produced just two group winners from 128 foals, one of them is that fine filly Pleascach. This Irish 1,000 Guineas winner has since run with considerable credit in the Yorkshire Oaks and Irish Champion S.

There is still plenty of time for this 2012 crop to notch up further group winners. Even though Teofilo was himself a precocious talent, he is a sizeable individual and many of his talented progeny have matured more slowly than he did. In fact no fewer than eight of his 20 group winners didn't achieve group-winner status until they were four and a ninth--the French-trained Fate--waited until she was five. Of course Teofilo has also sired a number of smart 2-year-olds.

Perhaps there is a lesson here for the many admirers of Frankel, who is bred to the same Galileo-Danehill cross as Teofilo. Despite his considerable prowess as a 2-year-old, Frankel achieved his record-setting Timeform rating as a 4-year-old and his brother Noble Mission was definitely at his best at four. So the possibility exists that Frankel's progeny may need some precocious speed in the bottom half of their pedigrees if they are to shine much before the autumn of their first season.

Teofilo's daughter First Victory is now unbeaten in two starts and there's every reason to think that she will develop into a very good middle-distance filly at three. Her dam Eastern Joy has already been represented by Ihtimal, an admirable performer who progressed from being a dual group winner at two to win the UAE 1,000 Guineas and Oaks. This daughter of Shamardal was also third in the G1 1,000 Guineas, but suffered a fatal accident earlier this year.

Their dam, the French nine-furlong winner Eastern Joy, is by Dubai Destination out of a Nureyev mare. There were only 13 foals bred this way, but they also included Fleche d'Or, dam of the outstanding 3-year-old Golden Horn, and Farraaj, a very smart performer at around a mile and a quarter. They are inbred 4x2 to the brilliant Nureyev.

Eastern Joy's dam was no ordinary Nureyev mare, if there was such a thing. Named Red Slippers, she won the G2 Sun Chariot S. and then became the dam of West Wind, winner of the Prix de Diane in 2007.

Red Slippers was a three-parts-sister to Storm Bird's outstanding daughter Balanchine, who followed up a narrow defeat in the 1,000 Guineas with victories in the Oaks and the Irish Derby. Red Slippers' brother Romanov was good enough to finish third in the Derby and Irish 2000 Guineas, while their dam Morning Devotion was third in the Fillies' Mile.

Morning Devotion was also bred along similar lines to another distinguished mare, It's In The Air. Both were by stallions from the Raise a Native line and It's In The Air's dam A Wind Is Rising was the second dam of Morning Devotion. It's In The Air's descendants include the Grade I winners Music Note, Musical Chimes and Storming Home, so this family has been doing sterling work for the Maktoum family for a long time now.

Potential early targets for 2016 could include a return trip to Dubai where this year he ran second to Solow (Fr) (Singspiel {Ire}) in the G1 Dubai Turf, picking up over £750,000 for his troubles.

The G1 Qipco British Champions Fillies & Mares S. on Saturday is shaping up to be a cracking contest with two Classic-winning 3-year-old fillies likely to head the market. **Simple Verse (Ire)** (Duke Of Marmalade {Ire}) has pleased Ralph Beckett since her controversial victory in the G1 St. Leger at Doncaster last month and the trainer is anticipating a bold show from the progressive filly. "She worked this morning and worked well. I'm very happy with her, so we run," said Beckett. "We've gone for this race rather than the Long Distance Cup as this is against her own sex. I know she's beaten the colts, but it's tougher taking on the older colts and geldings, so we've plumped for the fillies' race." The unexposed Simple Verse is likely to face stiff competition from Hugo Palmer's teak tough **Covert Love (Ire)** (Azamour {Ire}), reported fresh and well after her win in the G1 Prix de l'Opera at Longchamp Oct.4. "She's squealing, she's ate up all the way and we're working into running her on Saturday," said Palmer. "I've been bowled over how fresh she's been since she came back from France. She went over and had what looked to be a tough race but lost only eight kilos in the whole thing, so she's taken it incredibly well," added the Newmarket trainer.

Stephen Gray is excited about the task at hand and said, "We are lucky to have a horse like him to travel and take in these experiences, even though it is nerve-racking. The owners, Gordon and Ernest Yau have been kind enough and brave enough to have a crack. If it happens it would be a fairytale as Max has been an emotional horse for our family."

While Gray is confident of a good showing he is also realistic about his chances given his current 33-1 odds. "It is a different track and way of racing. The biggest negative is running in that straight line, but he has got the temperament to cope with it and he will like the cut in the ground." Gray is also keen to maintain the partnership with the horse's regular jockey as opposed to seeking a local rider with track experience. "Corey Brown will ride him as he does well on the horse and deserves his chance. He is a world-class jockey and for him it's a dream as well. Having him on board is important as he knows the horse and is part of the team," added Gray.

IT'S ALL IN THE BREEDING

By John Berry

The achievement of 1988 Breeders' Cup Distaff winner Personal Ensign (Private Account) in breeding a Breeders' Cup winner in My Flag (Easy Goer) who herself went on to breed a Breeders' Cup winner Storm Flag Flying (Storm Cat) is always going to be hard to beat. However, Miss Finland (Aus)

(Redoutes's Choice {Aus}) is shaping up very well. She was Australia's champion 3-year-old filly in 2006/'07 when she won the G1 Thousand Guineas at Caulfield in 2006 and now she has bred this year's G1

Thousand Guineas heroine **Stay With Me (Aus)** (Street Cry {Ire}). Like Personal Ensign, Miss Finland was an outstanding racehorse. Trained for Arrowfield Stud principal John Messara by David Hayes, she was dominant at ages two and three, and then very good at four. As a juvenile she was beaten by her stablemate Nadeem (Aus) (Redoute's Choice {Aus}) in Melbourne's principal 2-year-old race, the G1 Blue Diamond S. at Caulfield, before putting matters right in the biggest race for juveniles in the land, the G1 Golden Slipper at Rosehill in Sydney. As a 3-year-old she won the G1 Thousand Guineas and G1 Victoria Oaks in Melbourne in the spring before snaring two more Group One races in Sydney in the autumn; while at four she continued to excel, including when beating subsequent Royal Ascot winner Haradasun (Aus) (Fusaichi Pegasus) in the G2 Memsie S. at Caulfield.

Arrowfield patriarch Redoute's Choice (Aus) (Danehill) is now established as arguably the pre-eminent stallion in Australia, and Miss Finland (like the aforementioned Nadeem a member of his third crop) was one of the horses who cemented his reputation. Now she is cementing her own reputation by proving as distinguished a broodmare as she was a racehorse.

It was not, though, just from Redoute's Choice that Miss Finland got her merit. She comes from one of the best families in the stud book, descending from the great English broodmare Absurdity, a daughter of Melton who was born in 1903.

The fortune of the Joel brothers, Jack and Solly, came from diamond mines in South Africa, pioneered by their uncle Barney Barnato. The brothers developed their studs in England in the early years of the 20th century, and Jack Joel's mare Absurdity proved crucial to the family's success.

Absurdity's offspring included 1911 Middle Park S. winner Absurd (who went on to be a multiple champion sire in New Zealand), Jest (winner of the 1,000 Guineas and Oaks in 1913) and Black Jester, winner of the St Leger in 1914. Jest then bred Mr Joel's 1921 Derby winner Humorist.

During subsequent decades the winners kept coming from this family. Absurdity's great-granddaughter Picture Play won the 1,000 Guineas for Jack Joel in 1944, while the family yielded the Classic winners Royal Palace (winner of the Derby in 1967) and Fairy Footsteps (who took the G1 1,000 Guineas in 1981) for Mr Joel's son Jim. Another good winner for Jim Joel from the same family was the Mill Reef filly Lady Moon, a great-great-granddaughter of Picture Play. In his dotage, Jim Joel took the decision to disperse his stud. Consequently his stock went to Tattersalls' December Sale in 1986, where Sheikh Mohammed bought many of them. Lady Moon, in foal to Kris (GB) (Sharpen Up {GB}), was one of the Sheikh's purchases, and she repaid her price many times over, not least thanks to the unborn foal she was carrying at the time, Moon Cactus (GB). Moon Cactus' finest hour on the track came when she finished second in the G1 Prix de Diane in 1990, filling the quinella for daughters of Kris trained by Henry Cecil. She was beaten only by her stablemate and paternal half-sister Rafha (GB) who is now best known as dam of the top-class sires Invincible Spirit (Ire) (Green Desert) and Kodiak (GB) (Danehill). Even greater glory was to follow, though; Moon Cactus' first foal was Sheikh Mohammed's home-bred 1995 Oaks winner Moonshell (Ire) (Sadler's Wells). In 1999 Moonshell foaled a Woodman (Mr Prospector) filly called Forest Pearl who found her way to Australia under the ownership of Sheikh Mohammed's brother Sheikh Maktoum al Maktoum, whose Gainsborough Stud bred Miss Finland thanks to her mating in 2002 with Redoute's Choice.

Miss Finland's daughter Stay With Me is currently one of two high-class Australian 3-year-olds descending from Absurdity. The other is G3 San Domenico S. winner Japonisme (Aus) (Choiris {Aus}). In the Northern Hemisphere the family is doing equally well. Esoterique (Ire) (Danehill Dancer {Ire}) flew its flag by taking the G1 Sun Chariot S. at Newmarket earlier this month, while Kodi Bear (Ire) (Kodiak {GB}) should have a good chance of crediting it with yet another Group One success in the Queen Elizabeth II S. at Ascot next weekend.

The credit for Stay With Me's success should not, of course, go entirely to Miss Finland.

The filly's sire Street Cry is obviously a massive influence, and her merit is yet another reason to rue the passing of the Darley stalwart who died last year. Thanks to champions such as Zenyatta and Street Sense, Street Cry proved himself an outstanding stallion. His results Down Under have been similarly impressive, courtesy of the likes of Shocking (Aus), Whobegotyou (Aus) and 2013 G1 Caulfield Guineas winner Long John (Aus). Now Stay With Me has added her name to the long list of his top-class progeny.

Ken and Sarah Ramsey purchased the session's top lot, going to \$120,000 to obtain the mare **Alexandra's Grace** (Hard Spun), in foal to Bodemeister. Jerry Frankel purchased the sale's top-priced lot, spending \$370,000 to acquire Stardom Found (Tapit), a full-brother to champion Stardom Bound, during the Horses of Racing Age section of the auction.

SAM HOUSTON CEO DIES IN ACCIDENT

Shawn Hurwitz, CEO of Sam Houston Race Park, died Sunday after a boating accident on Lake Austin, according to the *Houston Chronicle*. Hurwitz was killed when his craft collided with an object and sunk. He died at the scene. A second victim later died at hospital.

Hurwitz, 50, was the son of Maxxam CEO Charles Hurwitz and he had led Maxxam's real estate subsidiary since 2002. He was named general director of the corporation in 2007. Hurwitz was also a principal financial backer for KIPP charter schools, a nationwide system of open-enrollment college prep schools in underprivileged neighborhoods, and he chaired the boards of Houston's eight KIPP facilities.

"Shawn Hurwitz's generous spirit and huge heart touched so many people over the years that this news will be devastating to people across the state and nation," family spokesperson J. Kent Friendman said in a statement. "We will share more information about the services and remembrance as appropriate and it becomes known to us."

The deadline to nominate weanlings of 2015 to the Breeders' Cup program for a one-time fee of \$400 is Oct. 15 at 11:59 p.m. ET. The \$400 nomination provides all those foals with lifetime eligibility to the Breeders' Cup World Championships and the Breeders' Cup Racing Programs. All foals sired by a fully nominated North American Breeders' Cup stallion are eligible for nomination to the Breeders' Cup program in their year of birth. In addition to the racing benefits, in 2015, Breeders' Cup foal nominators earn \$10,000 for every victory in a Breeders' Cup Challenge "Win and You're In" race and are also eligible to win nominator awards in every Breeders' Cup World Championships race if the nominated horse places first through fourth. The person nominating the foal receives these nominator awards even though the horse may change hands throughout its racing career.
