each of her first three starts, the Chester and Mary Broman homebred failed to overcome a poor start and settled for sixth in Belmont's GI Acorn S. June 6. A dull fourth in the GIII Delaware Oaks July 11, the dark bay was cut back in distance by

trainer John Kimmel to run a bang-up second at 15-1 behind the aforementioned Cavorting in Saratoga's GI Test S. Aug. 8. She again found only that rival too good when rallying from further back in the GII Prioress S. Sept. 6, and appears to have been working well since shipping back down to Belmont. **Paid Up Subscriber** (Candy Ride {Arg}) and **Irish Jasper** (First Defence) were fourth and sixth, respectively, in the Prioress. **Miss Ella** (Exchange Rate) sports a local win, having taken the GII Beaumont S. over the "about" seven-furlong Beard Course in April. **Cont. p3**

With Golden Horn (GB) (Cape Cross {Ire}) on temporary rest from public duty, **Jack Hobbs** (GB) (Halling) has been handed the baton to run for the honor of the all-conquering John Gosden stable in Saturday's G1 Qipco Champion S. at Ascot. Godolphin's acquisition was perhaps less of the finished article than his esteemed barnmate when

comprehensively beaten into second in the G2 Dante S. at York May 14 and in the June 6 G1 Epsom Derby, but a five-length success in the G1 Irish Derby at The Curragh three weeks after the blue riband demonstrated how much class he possesses in his own right. Following his summer break, the still lightly-raced bay bounded back into action when winning Kempton's G3 September S. over a mile and a half Sept. 5 before stepping aside for Golden Horn in the Arc. "We deliberately freshened him up after the Irish Derby. He's a big, rangy colt that didn't want a lot of hard racing through the summer," Gosden explained. **Cont. p9**

Seventh in the Acorn, she was fourth behind Irish Jasper and **Kathballu** (Bluegrass Cat) in Belmont's GIII Victory Ride S. The Graham Motion pupil was second behind the brilliant Lady Shipman (Midshipman) when trying the turf in the Spa's Coronation Cup S. Aug. 3, and returned to winning ways down state in the Sept. 11 rained-off Christecat S. The late-running **Chide** (Blame), a fellow AI Stall, Jr. trainee along with Paid Up Subscriber, filled out the trifecta in Belmont's GI Mother Goose S. June 27. Fifth in the GI Coaching Club American Oaks July 26, she shortened up to be second behind 'TDN Rising Star' Super Majesty (Super Saver) in Churchill's seven-furlong GIII Dogwood S. Sept. 19. **Forever Unbridled** (Unbridled's Song) could be an intriguing player at a price if she follows the lead of year-old full-sister Unbridled Forever. The latter hit the board in a number of tough route spots last year at three, but did her best running in two seven-panel tries this season, closing impressively to take the GI Ballerina S. in August. Fellow Dallas Stewart-trained, Chuck Fipke-owned and bred Forever Unbridled was third to I'm a Chatterbox (Munnings) in both the GIII Rachel Alexandra S. and GII Fair Grounds Oaks earlier this year, but could only manage 11th in the GI Kentucky Oaks May 1. Off since then, she's been working up a storm recently, and fired a five-furlong bullet in 1:00.20 (1/33) at Churchill Sunday.

**FUTURITY FIELD SHORT, BUT COMPETITIVE**

Just six juveniles line up in Saturday's GII Futurity S. at Belmont, but one could make a case for just about any of them. Favored on the morning line at 2-1 is Lets Go Stable's **Ready**

**Dancer** (More Than Ready). The dark bay went from third to second to first in his first three starts, breaking through by daylight in the faster of two GI Travers S. day maidens for 2-year-old males at the Spa Aug. 29. Bumped

at the start of the one-mile GI Champagne S. here Oct. 3, he was hung wide early before fading to a distant last after never seeming to get a hold of the sloppy track. Brought back here by Todd Pletcher just two weeks after that debacle, it seems likely that Ready Dancer's last effort can be forgiven. **Full Salute** (Speightstown) has been no worse than second from five prior tries. Second in both the grassy Tyro S. and one-mile Sapling S. at Monmouth Aug. 9 and Sept. 6, respectively, the Morris Bailey colorbearer earned a first stakes win in Parx's 6 1/2-furlong Hall of Fame S. Sept. 29. **King Kranz** (Munnings) has yet to earn his diploma, but owns the best last-out Beyer Speed Figure in the field and is tied with Ready Dancer for best career figure with an 85. The Zayat representative ran in spots before checking in fifth in his Saratoga debut Aug. 22, and found himself too far back over track and trip Sept. 19, rallying well to be a close third. The top two finishers in that race were one-two throughout, and were well-meant firsters who cost a combined \$3.1 million at auction. Godolphin's **Annual Report** (Harlan's Holiday) brought \$600,000 at this year's Fasig-Tipton Florida sale after a :10 2/5 breeze. Sent to Parx for his debut Sept. 20, the bay attended the pace and drew off to a 5 1/4-length score.

**HAWTHORNE DERBY IS ANYONE'S RACE**

The GIII Hawthorne Derby always seems to attract a full and evenly matched field, and Saturday's renewal--the first since 2013--is no exception. **Saham** (Lemon Drop Kid) gets the tepid

4-1 morning-line nod off the strength of his win in Churchill's GIII Jefferson Cup Sept. 26. Seventeen days before that, the Brendan Walsh trainee was a close fourth in Indiana's Centaur S. 'TDN Rising Star' **Granny's Kitten** (Kitten's Joy) was second,

and **Net Gain** (Include) was seventh. The third and fifth-place finishers from that heat also returned to score. Flaxman homebred **Nucifera** (More Than Ready), Group 3-placed against strong competition last season in France for Jonathan Pease, makes his second Stateside start for Graham Motion. He rallied from last to third in a slow-paced running of the Better Talk Now S. at Saratoga Aug. 31. **Lucky Lindy** (Harlan's Holiday) invades from Woodbine and has a major chance to contend. Beaten a nose when trying turf for the first time July 5, he settled for second again three weeks later after being blocked when attempting to rally in the Toronto Cup at a similar distance. A somewhat dull and distant third in the historic Breeders S. over 12 furlongs Aug. 16, the George Strawbridge homebred shortened up to nine furlongs and switched to the main track to post a decisive tally in the GIII Ontario Derby Sept. 20.

“Any horse that goes on a Classic programme, they’re really on the go from Feb. 1, so he’d done enough by the time he got to the end of June. I was pleased with his comeback at Kempton. It was a nice race and a nice day out for him. He has a lot of tactical speed and his father was best at a mile and a quarter.”

For William Buick, the race represents a key moment in his new partnership with Godolphin, and he added, “This is a massive race and Champions Day is one of the biggest days in our calendar. It’s been a fantastic year winning the Irish Derby and Dubai World Cup, and the Champions S. is the last big race of

the season. It is a race that is very competitive and I’ve got respect for a number of other horses in the race, but they certainly have him to beat. He is a horse that has come forward in every run this season and is now at his peak. The drop back to a mile and a quarter won’t be a problem, as

he is a quick horse and has a great turn of foot. He is much wiser and stronger than he was in the Dante.”

In a renewal short on the kind of showcase horses it was revamped to attract, **‘TDN Rising Star’ Found (Ire)** (Galileo {Ire}) is one who could capitalize after a troubled trip when ninth in the G1 Prix de l’Arc de Triomphe at Longchamp 13 days ago. Second to Golden Horn in the G1 Irish Champion S. at Leopardstown previously Sept. 12, Michael Tabor’s highly regarded filly is not far from the very top, and Aidan O’Brien is happy to pitch her in against the colts again. “She ran a very good race the last day and just didn’t get much luck in the race,” he said. “She seems to handle most types of ground.” Also from Ireland is Newtown Anner Stud Farm’s **Fascinating Rock (Ire)** (Fastnet Rock {Aus}), who would have been a bit-player only had he not looked a reformed character when winning the 12-furlong G3 KPMG Enterprise S. by six lengths at Leopardstown last time Sept. 12, while France has the Andre Fabre representative **Vadamos (Fr)** (Monsun {Ger}). While the Haras de Saint-Pair colorbearer has much to find on the form of his sole black-type win in Baden-Baden’s G2 Oettingen-Rennen over a mile Sept. 3, it is undeniable that his trainer has had him

earmarked for an occasion of this status for some time.

“Vadamos has been in good form since his Baden-Baden win,” Fabre said. “He has been working well, that is why we have let him take his chance on Saturday. This is a big step up in class, but he goes well enough at home to suggest that he should be competitive. He has only run twice for me, so I still have no idea what his favored ground might be. His breeding suggests that this step-up to a mile and a quarter will be no problem, and he won over a mile and half in 2014.”

Bidding to emulate the success of his full-brother Farhh (GB) two years ago is Godolphin’s other runner **Racing History (GB)** (Pivotal {GB}), who beat a clutch of rivals--including Fascinating Rock--who have since advertised the form in the G3 Winter Hill S. over this trip at Windsor last time Aug. 29. That was only his fourth start and first in black-type company, so he is open to large amounts of improvement. “Racing History is working well, is in good form and is ready to go,” Saeed bin Suroor commented. “He’s taking on better horses--top horses--on Saturday, but we give him a real chance. He has won three consecutive races and won very well last time in the Winter Hill S., but the key for him is that we are looking for rain--the softer the better for him. Farhh was a 5-year-old when he won it, so was older and stronger. Racing History is only three, but is improving all the time and will stay in training next season.”

David Simcock has no fears about stepping Fitri Hay’s **The Corsican (Ire)** (Galileo {Ire}) back up in class after his latest win in the G3 Arc Trial over 11 furlongs at Newbury last time Sept. 19 and said, “The fact that we’re improving and the fact he does handle ground on the soft side--we’re just quietly confident in the horse. We like the horse a lot, I think he’s getting quicker and he’s improving all the time. I think Jack Hobbs is the stand-out horse and I think he’s a fair way above the majority of the field.”

## GOING SOLO?

After being denied the dance with **Gleneagles (Ire)** (Galileo {Ire}) at Glorious Goodwood, the Wertheimers' **Solow (GB)** (Singspiel {Ire}) may still be joined on one of the most prestigious floors of them all if the ground is deemed suitable in Saturday's G1 Queen Elizabeth II S. at Ascot. Able to saunter through his fourth consecutive top-level success in the absence of Ballydoyle's dual Classic hero in the July 29 G1 Sussex S., the 5-year-old has not been seen since, with Freddy Head keen to bring him here at another peak. "He's a real champion--he has

everything," he said of the inimitable homebred, who has also annexed the Mar. 28 G1 Dubai Turf, May 24 G1 Prix d'Ispahan and June 16 G1 Queen Anne S. this year. "It will be his last start for the year.

After the race he will go to the Wertheimers'

stud for a few weeks before we think about Dubai again. It appears he's a real miler, which is very strange for his pedigree. He's a versatile, beautiful mover and is very easy to train."

Gleneagles, who due to the vagaries of the European climate has been forced to sidestep several big-league encounters since his win in the G1 St James's Palace S. at the Royal meeting here June 16, may be out of this one too with Aidan O'Brien on tenterhooks in the final hours. "The ground's borderline. Parts of it are good and parts of it are on the soft side of good," the Ballydoyle conditioner said yesterday. "We're going to take him racing and see how it rides for the first few races. The ground is not far away from where it needs to be for him to run. You would hope it might tighten up a bit before his race tomorrow. A millimetre of rain though would be too much. After Ryan [Moore] has ridden on it tomorrow, he will know what it is like--he will know straight away. The times will tell us a lot as well. From the three-furlong pole to the furlong pole is where it is quicker." O'Brien added, "The horse has always come first and we want to be fair to him. If it doesn't rain, there is no heavy dew and when the lads have ridden on it and say it is good ground or better, especially Ryan, then we might take our chance. It's a close call--if the ground starts shifting and breaking off the top, we are going to be in trouble."

Due to his absence all summer, the fact remains that Gleneagles is in the unusual position of being a dominant 3-year-old miler who is yet to be tested by the older brigade, and he meets Solow on much less favorable weight-for-age terms at this time of year than he would have had the rain not come to

Goodwood. His easy defeat of the subsequent G1 Prix Jean Prat winner **Territories (Ire)** (Invincible Spirit {Ire}) in the G1 2000 Guineas at Newmarket May 2 sets the standard among his generation at this trip, but he is sure to be compromised by the softened ground conditions as he was when workmanlike in the G1 Irish 2000 Guineas at The Curragh May 23. Godolphin's Territories is another who needs it livelier to show his best form, and it was largely the testing ground that undid him in Deauville's G1 Prix Jacques le Marois last time Aug. 16.

"I am very happy with Territories--his work has been good. He would prefer good ground, but the straight course should not be as soft as the round course," trainer Andre Fabre commented. "He has not run since August, but he is quite a light horse who does not need much work. Comparing the progress he and

Gleneagles have made since they finished second and first in the 2000 Guineas is difficult, because neither has run for a long time. What I would say is that Territories is quite a late foal--he was born almost four months after Gleneagles--so that might allow him to have made greater progress since the spring."

Fourth behind Territories in the Prix Jean Prat at Chantilly July 12 was **Kodi Bear (Ire)** (Kodiac {GB}), who has since proved a revelation from the front when slamming his rivals in the G3 Sovereign S. at Salisbury Aug. 13 and G2 Celebration Mile at Goodwood 16 days later. "He's a horse we've always held in high regard. I'm just delighted with the way he's progressed every step of the way," trainer Clive Cox said. "He's been very convincing, albeit this is another step up and we're all respectful of the opposition, but we're going there with a happy feel."

Another sophomore who is worthy of respect is Qatar Racing's **Elm Park (GB)** (Phoenix Reach {Ire}), who captured the G1 Racing Post Trophy at Doncaster 12 months ago and is at least fresh after appearing just three times in 2015, with his latest outing being a win in the Listed Fortune S. at Sandown Sept. 16. "He is unbeaten in four career starts over a mile," trainer Andrew Balding commented. "I have been very happy with him since his recent Sandown win and he appears to be in top form at home, although his home-work had always been good."

**CONTINUING LOVE STORY**

Tough and durable so far, **Covert Love (Ire)** (Azamour {Ire}) bids to prove that Saturday's G1 Qipco British Champions Fillies & Mares S. at Ascot is not a step too far after exceeding expectations throughout a stellar 3-year-old campaign. Denying the pick of the Irish when justifying a supplementary entry into the G1 Irish Oaks over this trip at The Curragh July 18, the bay was second in the G1 Yorkshire Oaks Aug. 20 before rebounding to annex the 10-furlong G1 Prix de l'Opera at Longchamp just 13 days ago. "She won the Irish Oaks going away from the field, so I have no problem going back to a mile and a half," trainer Hugo Palmer said. "I hope it doesn't rain to put a spanner in the works. We didn't make all in the Irish Oaks and we're quite happy to take a lead and see what happens in the race."

Dropping back even more markedly in distance having won, lost, then regained the G1 St Leger at Doncaster Sept. 12 is Qatar Racing's **Simple Verse (Ire)** (Duke of Marmalade {Ire}), but trainer Ralph Beckett is unconcerned about this greater emphasis on speed. "I don't think a mile and a half will hold any fears," he commented. "She has improved as the year's gone on and she's battle-hardened these days. She doesn't seem very ground-dependent."

After inflicting the sole defeat on Golden Horn (GB) (Cape Cross {Ire}) in the G1 Juddmonte International at York Aug. 19, Jeff Smith's **Arabian Queen (Ire)** (Dubawi {Ire}) was only sixth behind Treve (Fr) (Motivator {Fr}) in the G1 Prix Vermeille over this trip at Longchamp last time Sept. 13, but her owner-breeder was offering excuses for that tame effort. "We've put a line through France. It was heavy ground and she didn't travel well; she wasn't drinking as much as she should have," Smith explained. "Some say York was a fluke, but I look at it the other way--Golden Horn has upheld the form in Ireland and in the Arc. Good-to-soft ground will be fine, the ground in France would have been called heavy here. We're going there full of hope."

His Highness The Aga Khan's **Candarliya (Fr)** (Dalakhani {Ire}) was second in the Vermeille either side of wins in Deauville's G3

Prix Minerve Aug. 16 and the G2 Prix de Royallieu at Longchamp Oct. 3 over a half-furlong further, while another overseas threat is Susan Magnier's 2014 G1 Yorkshire Oaks heroine **Tapestry (Ire)** (Galileo {Ire}). Only 16th in the G1 Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe at Longchamp 13 days ago, the 'TDN Rising Star' had previously run a highly respectable second on her first start in 11 months in the G2 Blandford S. over 10 furlongs at The Curragh Sept. 13. George Strawbridge's **Journey (GB)** (Dubawi {Ire}) is a 3-year-old rapidly on the up, with her most recent outing resulting in an eight-length score in the Listed Princess Royal S. at this distance at Newmarket Sept. 25. She is out of the G1 Prix Royal-Oak heroine Montare (Ire) (Montjeu {Ire}) and a switch to more positive tactics has unlocked the potential that was previously hidden under a bushel.

## TEST OF A CHAMPION

Despite a unique and demanding treble of victories in the G1 Commonwealth Cup, G1 July Cup and G1 Prix Maurice de Gheest, there is a feeling that **Muhaarar (GB)** (Oasis Dream {GB}) must win Saturday's G1 Qipco British Champions Sprint S. at Ascot to truly reign in his category. Unbeaten this term bar a failed attempt at a mile when eighth in the G1 Poule d'Essai des Poulains at Longchamp May 10, Sheikh Hamdan bin Rashid Al Maktoum's homebred has a rival with a perfect record to overcome in **Twilight Son (GB)** (Kyllachy {GB}) if he is to clinch honors. With the classy **Limato (Ire)** (Tagula {Ire}) behind in the Commonwealth Cup June 19 and subsequent dual Group 1 winner **Esoterique (Ire)** (Danehill Dancer {Ire}) in arrears in the Maurice de Gheest at Deauville last time Aug. 9, the bay has already done a great deal to ensure he will be in demand when sent to stud after this race. "I definitely think physically he has done well for the break. His weight is a lot higher than when he last ran," trainer Charlie Hills commented. "He's got a huge amount of talent as well and we know he likes Ascot. I'm looking forward to running him over a stiff six again."

Henry Candy has opted to send Godfrey Wilson and Cheveley Park Stud's Sept. 5 G1 Haydock Sprint Cup winner **Twilight Son** into battle again after his short-head defeat of Muhaarar's stable companion **Strath Burn (GB)** (Equiano {Fr}) there. "We still don't know how good he is, with him being unbeaten," Cheveley Park's Chris Richardson said of the sophomore, whose previous form was in handicaps. "Henry has been very happy with him since Haydock and all we can hope is that he gets there in similar form. It's obviously a very competitive race, but so was Haydock. He has a huge amount of ability and we hope he shows it once more."

Strath Burn was 33-1 for the Sprint Cup, despite his prior win in the G3 Hackwood S. over this trip at Newbury July 18, and

Charlie Hills is not discounting another major effort from Qatar Racing's colorbearer. "He is a horse that's going to get better with age, but he could run a really big race on Saturday," he said. "He's improving. They never work together at all, so I don't know how they compare. With Strath Burn, whatever he does this year is going to be a huge bonus."

Also in the mix is last year's winner **Gordon Lord Byron (Ire)** (Byron {GB}), who was a below-par sixth in the G1 Prix de la Foret over seven furlongs at Longchamp 13 days ago having been a close-up third in the Maurice de Gheest, and the supplemented **The Tin Man (GB)** (Equiano {Fr}). So impressive when winning a competitive course-and-distance handicap 15 days ago, the half-brother to the 2011 winner of this, **Deacon Blues (GB)** (Compton Place {GB}), has to improve, but James Fanshawe is a master of bringing his type of sprinter on. "We thought long and hard about what to do, but the horse is in great form and the ground looks like it is going to be drying out a bit, which should suit him," he said. "You can never gauge things too much at home, because he is so laid-back. I won this race four years ago with his half-brother, Deacon Blues, and the pair are similar in the way that they travel through their races and quicken up. The Tin Man has a bit to find to achieve what Deacon Blues did, but he's improving all the time."

Sept. 24. Qatar Racing's quirky character **Pallasator (GB)** (Motivator {GB}), who was third in this in 2014, also arrives on the back of a confidence-boosting success in the Sept. 11 G2 Doncaster Cup over an extra quarter mile. "He's been so horrible for so long, but everyone likes him. He had his great day at Doncaster and his work has been as good as ever of late," conditioner Sir Mark Prescott, who also saddles the supplemented 3-year-old **Amour de Nuit (Ire)** (Azamour {Ire}), said. "If he's on his best behavior, he's got a great chance."

Let’s Go Donki (Jpn) and King Kamehameha (Jpn), once again do battle. Mizuki Noda’s Mikki Queen rates atop her generation, having never finished worse than second in six career outings. She took the G1 Yushun Himba (Japanese Oaks) in her fourth start in May, but has something to prove again after being beaten by Touching Speed (Jpn) (Deep Impact {Jpn}) on seasonal return in the G2 Sho Rose S. Sept. 20. Trainer Yasutoshi Ikee chalked that defeat down to the drop back in distance--1800 meters from the 2400-meter Yushun Himba--and indeed Mikki Queen propelled herself from last on the turn to just miss victory on the line.

Touching Queen is one that has improved dramatically as the calendar pages have turned. Off the board in stakes and allowance company at Hanshin in the spring, she returned from a summer holiday to take a Sapporo allowance over this trip Aug. 8 before her career-best win in the Sho Rose.

Let’s Go Donki has won two of eight career outings, and one of those victories came in the G1 Oka Sho (Japanese 1000 Guineas), when she obliterated the opposition by four lengths. **RECORD OCTOBER AGGREGATE DESPITE LOW-KEY BOOK 3**

By Emma Berry

There was a low-key finale to the first three books of Tattersalls' blockbuster October Yearling Sale in Newmarket Friday, with a session-topping Bahamian Bounty (GB) filly heading the way of Simon Crisford at 35,000gns.

Turnover for the day stood at 1,795,200gns at an average price of 8,253gns (-17%) and median of 5,500gns (-21%), and the lowest clearance rate of the sale at 74%. The two final days of trade brought a sharp fall in figures for Book 3 as a whole, with the aggregate down by 12% at 6,335,900gns, despite 47 more horses changing hands, at an average price of 13,118gns (-20%), with median of 9,000gns (-22%). The clearance rate dropped by 7% to 79%.

The tally, however, brought a new record October Sale aggregate of 131,494,400gns traded for 1,536 yearlings over a long fortnight--104 more than in 2014. A larger catalogue, which saw 219 more horses indexed for the three books, meant that the turnover rose by 2% but other sectors felt the pinch owing to that increase. The average for all three books dropped by 5% to 85,608gns and the median by 11% to 40,000gns with a clearance rate of 81%.

Chairman Edmond Mahony commented, "While Book 3 of the 2015 Tattersalls October Yearling Sale has not been able to match last year's record levels, there have been plenty of highlights over the course of the past two weeks encompassing Books 1 to 3. The upper end of the market has been extremely

robust from start to finish. Book 1 produced the highest-priced auction yearling in the world for the fourth consecutive year and a record 152 lots selling for 200,000 guineas or more. Similarly, there was a new wide-margin record price of 725,000 guineas in Book 2 and a record 121 yearlings selling for 100,000 guineas or more."

He added, "Demand for quality, commercial yearlings has also carried on through Book 3, which produced a record top-price of 115,000 guineas. The total turnover for Books 1 to 3 has exceeded 130 million guineas for the first time, and the combined clearance rate over eight days of yearling sales has been more than 80%."

"At the end of Book 2 we reflected on some of the challenges resulting from the larger numbers in all three books," Mahony continued. "In total we catalogued 219 more yearlings than last

year, which is the second-largest number ever, and without doubt this has led to a more selective market at the lower levels than last year. Nevertheless, we have sold an unprecedented number of yearlings, which yet again demonstrates the enduring global demand for quality British and Irish bloodstock and is tribute to

the outstanding professionalism of our vendors."

The final day's session-topper ([lot 1858](#)), who was consigned by Maurice Burns's Rathasker Stud, is out of a winning half-sister to Group 3 winner Ela Athena (GB) (Ezzoud {Ire}), the dam of today's G2 QIPCO British Champions Long Distance Cup runner Pallasator (GB) (Motivator {GB}). Chasing her home was a first-crop son of Foxwedge (Aus) ([lot 2084](#)) from the Mickley Stud draft and bought by John Kilbride of Kilbride Equine for 33,000gns. The sharp-looking colt out of three-time winner Suzie Quw (GB) (Bahamian Bounty {GB}) could be seen back at Tattersalls for next year's breeze-up sale.

The Heart of the South Racing syndicate added a Poet's Voice colt ([lot 1850](#)) to the team of runners for 2016, going to 32,000gns to secure the Jamie Railton-consigned half-brother to six winners. Also among the day's leaders were two yearlings by Sir Percy (GB), with Marcus Tregoning signing for [lot 1952](#), a brother to his 86-rated winning 3-year-old Perceus (GB), at 32,000gns, and Bill Gredley going to the same price for [lot 1964](#), Southcourt Stud's half-sister to multiple Hong Kong winner Happy Crusader (Ire).

There is one final part of the October Yearling Sale to come--the 63-lot Book 4. This takes place during the afternoon of Thursday, Oct. 29, following the Horses-in-Training Sale that starts Monday, Oct. 26.

Chief among his rivals is Aidan O'Brien's once-raced trainee **Successor (Ire) (Galileo {Ire})**, who hails from the family of MG1SW European Champions Daylami (Ire) (Doyoun {Ire}) and Dalakhani (Ire) (Darshaan {GB}).
