## 'PHAROAH' DRILLS FAST SIX FURLONGS

Triple Crown winner **American Pharoah** (Pioneerof the Nile) breezed six furlongs in 1:10.80 (1/8) at Santa Anita Tuesday morning in preparation for his career finale in the GI Breeders' Cup Classic at Keeneland Oct. 31. ([Video](#))

"This was the last serious drill of his life," said conditioner Bob Baffert, who had American Pharoah galloping out seven furlongs on his watch in 1:23.20 and a mile in 1:37. "It's sort of sad in a way to think that's the last time we get to see him work like that. Just to watch him breeze, sometimes I get a bit excited, the way he does things so easily."

Baffert added, "He looked fantastic today and I really feel good about the way he's coming into this race."

With jockey Martin Garcia in the irons, the Zayat Stables colorbearer came on the track at 7:45 a.m. and jogged down the stretch from the quarter-mile chute accompanied by assistant trainer Jimmy Barnes aboard Baffert's popular pony Smokey. Breaking free from the pony at the clubhouse turn, the hulking bay galloped toward the middle of the track and angled down to the rail. **Cont. p3**

## SLIGHT FEVER KEEPS BEHOLDER OFF TRACK

Two-time champion **Beholder** (Henny Hughes) was forced to miss her first day of training at Keeneland Tuesday due to a slight fever believed to be the result of shipping from California to Kentucky Monday, according to Spendthrift's General Manager Ned Toffey.

"The blood work came back pretty good, basically right on the border of high normal," Toffey said when reached by phone Tuesday afternoon. "Her white blood count was very slightly elevated and it seemed to be more indicative of stress, presumably related to shipping, less so than infection. At the same time, we are very much on the front end of this." **Cont. p3**

### NOVEMBER WEANLING SIRES

According to calculations by *TDN's* Heather Anderson, a total of 197 different sires are represented by 1,791 weanlings catalogued in the upcoming Fasig-Tipton and Keeneland November sales. Forty-two sires have 15 or more catalogued, and you will not be surprised to hear that fully one-third of them (14) are sires whose first foals arrived this year. This is pretty much a youth culture: eight sires with 15+ weanlings catalogued just had their first yearlings sell; six have their first 2-year-olds racing; and sires with their first 3- through 6-year-olds comprise another 12 sires, meaning exactly two of the 42 sires with 15+ weanlings catalogued had their first foals in 2008 or earlier. Those two (both first foals 2003) are Exchange Rate (21) and City Zip (17). There are weanlings by other important and veteran sires--11 by Tapit and seven by War Front, for example--just not as many of them.

Nine sires have 30 or more weanlings catalogued, and as six of the nine are sires whose first foals these are, let's take a little bit closer look at these sires with first foals 2015 (F2015). The three non-F2015 sires with 30+ catalogued, by the way, are: F2014 (first yearlings 2015) The Factor (35); F2009 Scat Daddy (31); and the leading freshman sire, F2013 Uncle Mo (30). **Cont. p4**

"He's been galloping really good this week," said private clocker Gary Young. "His work today was terrific. It was a carbon copy of his last work. He had the same workmate, the same plan of attack and the same finish. I think he's a great horse and he seems really, really 'right' at this time. He's going to be a very tough horse to beat on Halloween day."

American Pharoah is expected to work in Arcadia once more Monday, Oct. 26 before flying to Lexington early the following day.

Toffey added, "It is something that just came up this morning and if there is going to be something more to this, sometimes these things take a little bit of time to play out. We also ultrasounded her lungs and as of this morning they were clear. They were normal. I would say in general terms it is very good news. We have to see how this plays out in the next day or so."

Beholder was forced to miss last year's GI Breeders' Cup Distaff and was scratched from the Fasig-Tipton November sale due to a fever, but she has not been ruled out of her expected start in the GI Breeders' Cup Classic Oct. 31.

"She has been treated with antibiotics and at last check her temperature was normal and her attitude was very good," Toffey remarked. "We are just taking it one day at a time. She is definitely not ruled out [of the Classic]. Sometimes when you treat a horse they respond initially then a few hours later you come back and you are back in the same boat. We just won't know for sure until we get to that point."

**FABRE THREE-PRONGED FOR BREEDERS' CUP**

Renowned French trainer Andre Fabre will be represented by three runners in two different races at the Breeders' Cup at Keeneland Oct. 30 and 31. **Esoterique (Ire)** (Danehill Dancer {Ire}) and **Make Believe (GB)** (Makfi {GB}) will go forward for the GI Breeders' Cup Mile, while last year's G1 1000 Guineas winner **Miss France (Ire)** (Dansili {GB}) will take in the GI Breeders' Cup Filly & Mare Turf.

"I think they [Esoterique and Make Believe] would both have a good chance," Fabre said. "Esoterique's form this season is very good indeed, but Make Believe has won two Group 1s also--I have two great chances."

Five-year-old mare Esoterique has finished first or second in her last four outings, all Group 1s, and has won the Prix Jacques le Marois Aug. 16 and the Sun Chariot S. Oct. 3 in her last two appearances. Make Believe faltered to finish last of five in Royal Ascot's G1 St James's Palace S. in June after winning the G1 Poule d'Essai des Poulains, but rebounded to win the G1 Qatar Prix de la Foret after a summer break Oct. 4. Miss France has had an abbreviated campaign this year, finishing second in a pair of outings, most recently the G2 Qatar Prix Daniel Wildenstein Oct. 3.

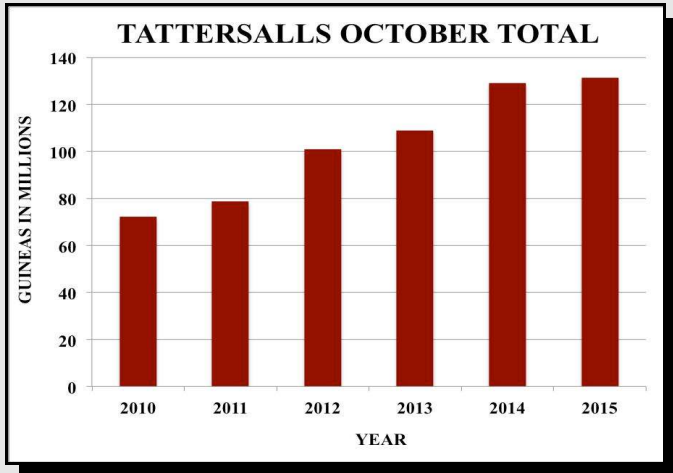

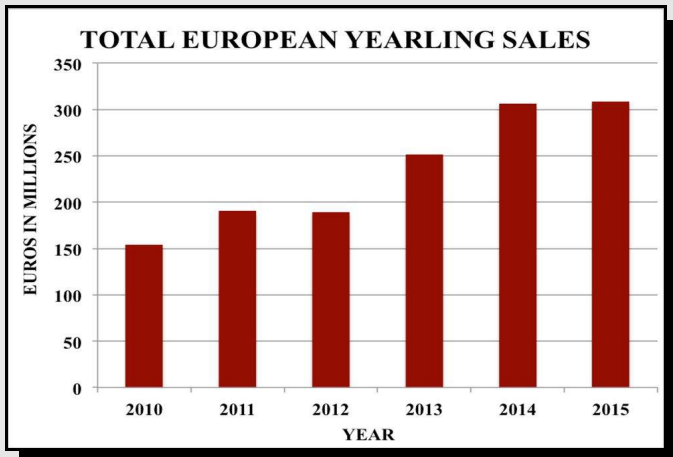

The leading sire by number of weanlings catalogued between the two sales is Hill 'n' Dale's **Violence**, a son of Medaglia d'Oro, who has been described by some astute judges as the

best-looking stallion in Kentucky. A \$600,000 yearling bred by Dell Ridge Farm and raced by Black Rock Stables, with Todd Pletcher as the trainer, Violence won all three of his starts at two, including the GII Nashua S. and GI Cashcall Futurity, but was injured and subsequently

retired after finishing second, by a half-length, to Orb in the 2013 GII Fountain of Youth S.

Claiborne's **Data Link**, from War Front's first crop, won the GI Maker's 46 Mile and Grade II turf races at 8 1/2 and 9 furlongs. As a \$7,500 stallion more of his foals are in the 'back books'--35 of his 38 are in Book 3 or later. Taylor Made's **Graydar**, a son of their late Unbridled's Song, won five of his six career starts for Twin Creek Racing, including a wire-to-wire three-length win in the 2013 GI Donn H. *Cont. p5*

He also won the GII New Orleans H. and GII Kelso in his other two starts as a 4-year-old. He has 37 foals catalogued, 14 of them in Fasig and the first two books at Keeneland.

Ashford's **Shanghai Bobby** was the unbeaten 2-year-old champion of 2012 and is by Harlan's Holiday, who seemingly can do no wrong at the moment and can claim successful sire sons Into Mischief and Majesticperfection since he died in Argentina in 2013. There are 35 foals from Shanghai Bobby's first crop catalogued. Also with more than 30 catalogued from their first crops are two WinStar stallions: **Overanalyze** (Dixie Union), winner of the GII Futurity (6 furlongs) and GII Remsen (9 furlongs) at two and the GI Arkansas Derby at three; and **Paynter**, by Awesome Again, winner of the GI Haskell and beaten a neck by Union Rags in the 2012 GI Belmont S. Overanalyze has 34 foals catalogued, 32 of them in Book 3 and later; Paynter has 31, of which 14 are at Fasig or in Keeneland's first two books.

Among this group, which covered their first crops in North America in 2014, three stallions averaged well above \$100,000 for the mares sold in foal to them in late 2014 and early 2015.

Claiborne's 2013 GI Kentucky Derby winner **Orb**, by Malibu Moon, topped the charts by covering sire average, with 23 in foal mares which averaged \$228,434; he has 25 foals catalogued, 21 of them between Fasig and Keeneland Books 1-2 and looks a good bet to top the charts again in these sales. People like him. Also with 25 catalogued is Pin Oak's **Alternation**, a dual Grade II and Grade III winner by Distorted Humor who, like Data Link and Overanalyze, figures mores prominently in the 'back books', as 22 of his 25 catalogued are in those.

Spendthrift debuts three first-crop sires: **Flat Out** (Flatter), who won three Grade I's, \$3.6-million, and ran Beyers of 107-116 10 different times (21 catalogued); **Jimmy Creed**, a good Grade I-winning sprinter by Distorted Humor about whom there's been a lot of positive chat (19 catalogued); and **Liaison**, a Grade I-winning 2-year-old by 'sleeper' sire of sires Indian Charlie, sire of current leading North American freshman sire Uncle Mo. Lane's End's **Morning Line**, by Tiznow, won the GI Carter H., the GII Pennsylvania Derby, and the GII Marvin LeRoy; he has 20 catalogued. WinStar also has **Take Charge Indy** (17 catalogued), winner of the GI Florida Derby at three and a six-length winner of the GII Alysheba at four running a Beyer 109. Finally, with 16 catalogued, Darley has **Animal Kingdom**, a mighty horse by Leroidesanimaux out of a mare by the top German sire Acatanenango, who was the King there before Monsun. Masterfully trained by Graham Motion, Animal Kingdom won the GI Kentucky Derby on dirt, the G1 Dubai Wold Cup on synthetic, and gave Wise Dan a big scare when running second to him in the 2012 GI Breeders' Cup Mile on turf in his first start in 8 1/2 months. Animal Kingdom's main base is Arrowfield in Australia, where he now has yearlings. Animal Kingdom himself seems to throw much more to Acataenango than to 'Leroi,' but either way it's a pedigree blend with immense international class and appeal. He was second on covering average among F2015 sires (25, averaged \$161,360); **Shanghai Bobby** (20, averaged \$133,700) was third.

**SPENDTHRIFT ACQUIRES BREEDING RIGHTS TO WICKED STRONG**

Spendthrift Farm has acquired the breeding rights to 2014 GI TwinSpires.com Wood Memorial S. hero **Wicked Strong** (Hard Spun--Moyne Abbey, by Charismatic), who is set to contest the GI Breeders' Cup Dirt Mile Oct. 30.

The 4-year-old will be retired at the end of this season to stand for \$10,000 at Spendthrift for 2016 as part of the farm's "Share the Upside" program. The program requires breeders to breed a mare in 2016 and 2017 and have two live foals on a stands-and- nurses basis to earn a lifetime breeding right to Wicked Strong from 2018 through the end of his stud career.

Commitments to Wicked Strong are being honored prior to the Breeders' Cup, but his stud fees are subject to change pending race results through the rest of the year.

"Wicked Strong is a Grade I winner by one of Danzig's best sons at stud, and you would be hard-pressed to find a better physical from the Danzig line," said Ned Toffey, Spendthrift general manager. "He's an exceptional-looking horse and full of class and quality. We believe he'll be extremely popular with breeders, especially through our 'Share The Upside' program, and we're excited about his chances in the Breeders' Cup."

Trained by Jimmy Jerkens on behalf of Centennial Farms, Wicked Strong came running late to take the Wood Memorial and followed that with respectable fourth-place finishes in both the GI Kentucky Derby and GI Belmont S., in which he dead-heated with dual Classic winner California Chrome (Lucky Pulpit). The bay followed that with a victory in Saratoga's GII Jim Dandy S. and was a very close second in the GI Travers S. after being caught late by stablemate V.E. Day (English Channel). Most recently second to Tonalist (Tapit) in Belmont's GI Jockey Club Gold Cup S. Oct. 3, he heads into the Breeders' Cup with a record of 18-3-4-3 and earnings of \$1,934,460.

**COMPETITIVE EDGE RETIRED TO ASHFORD**

"TDN Rising Star" and 2014 GI Hopeful S. winner **Competitive Edge** (Super Saver-- Magdalena's Chase, by Cape Town) has been retired to Coolmore's Ashford Stud for the 2016 breeding season.

"Competitive Edge was a push-button horse from day one and was exceptionally talented," said trainer Todd Pletcher. "He had early speed, a fantastic temperament and is a very good-looking individual--all the attributes to make an impact as a stallion, just like his sire."

Bred by WinStar Farm, the bay was purchased by bloodstock agents Alex Solis II and Jason Litt for \$750,000 on behalf of Nancy Favreau and Kathy Psoinos at last year's Fasig-Tipton Florida sale. Michael Tabor later bought into the colt following a dazzling 10 1/4-length debut victory at Saratoga last summer. **Cont. p7**

Competitive Edge followed that with a decisive score in the Spa’s GI Hopeful S., after which he was sidelined by a hairline fracture in his left foreleg. Returning six months later, the sophomore added victories in the Tamarac S. Mar. 27 and Gill Pat Day Mile S. May 2 to bring his record to 7-4-0-0 and earnings to \$519,280.

Ashford Stud’s Dermot Ryan added, “As a juvenile he won the Hopeful in the fastest time since 2001, and this year he broke the stakes record for a mile at Churchill Downs. He is a lovely horse and I think breeders will be very impressed when they see him. He’s at the farm and available for inspection.”

**UNEVEN MARKET CONTINUES AT FASIG**

It was a hit-or-miss day of selling during Tuesday’s second session of the Fasig-Tipton October Fall Yearling Sale. Though direct comparisons are difficult, with a three-day sale in 2014 compared to the four-session 2015 sale, numbers generally held steady from last year’s aggregate figures. In all, 222 horses sold Tuesday for \$8,144,700, an average of \$36,688. The median was \$16,000. Last year, the sale average was \$35,850, while the median was \$18,500. But many sellers said the stable numbers don’t tell the story of the market’s significant soft spots.

“It’s tough,” said Mill Ride Farm’s Headley Bell. “There’s probably an oversupply of horses here that people don’t need. There aren’t enough buyers to support them at the lower level. There are people here that buy [at the top end], but then it falls off very quickly. It’s a challenging market for buyers and sellers.”

A high buy-back rate continues to be a cause for concern, though Tuesday’s figure of 29.3% was an improvement on Monday’s opening-session rate of 35%.

Fasig-Tipton’s president and CEO, Boyd Browning Jr., said he saw improvements on Day 2 of the sale.

“The buyback rate moderated some, and overall the numbers were a little better than [Monday],” he said. “All in all, I felt that the session had a little more energy. On Monday, we probably didn’t start off very strong, just the way the catalogue fell, and it took a while to get some enthusiasm going. And it felt better today, and I think we’ll see a similar marketplace the next two days. The good news is that the buyers are all complaining it’s not easy to buy a horse. The bad news is that the sellers are saying it’s not easy to sell a horse.”

A pair of colts brought \$250,000 each to share top billing yesterday in Lexington. First up was [Hip 584](#), a West Virginia-bred colt by Candy Ride (Arg) who went to John Oxley for \$250,000. Trainer Mark Casse signed for the son of Mantekilla (Lemon Drop Kid), who sold from Bell’s Mill Ridge Sales consignment.

Later in the afternoon, Bo Hunt, acting for Team D, hit the same mark when he secured [Hip 662](#), a muscular son of Street Boss. Hunt said he was representing trainer Tony Dutrow. “He picked the horse out--I was just raising my hand,” said Hunt, who confirmed he would break and train the youngster for Team D. Hidden Brook consigned the colt, the first foal from the winning Moojha (Forest Wildcat), herself a daughter of the GSW Kiss the Devil (Kris S.) and a half to the GSW Kiss Moon (Malibu Moon). Another sibling to Moojha produced the recent G2 Lowther S. heroine Besharah (Kodiac {GB}).

Top price for the fairer sex went to two fillies who made \$160,000 each. [Hip 473](#), an Ontario-bred miss by Exchange Rate, sold to Conquest Stables, with Casse once again representing the winning bidder. The filly is out of the stakes-placed Kissin Party (Kissin Kris) and was consigned by Peter O’Callaghan’s Woods Edge Farm. Everest Bloodstock later secured [Hip 702](#), a filly by Into Mischief, for the same \$160,000. Another Ontario-bred, that filly is the first foal from Narrate (Medaglia d’Oro), a winning half to the Grade II winner Jill Robin L (Precocity) and to the recent Victorian Queen S. winner Caren (Society’s Chairman).

Considering the October Sale itself was on the chopping block just a few years ago, Browning said it’s worth keeping in mind the advances this sale has made. “It’s pretty remarkable,” he said. “It would be impossible to continue that slope upwards that we’ve seen in the last five years, and we’re seeing a maturation of this marketplace, but we’re seeing the sale is become a viable option for people to sell a horse, whether it’s a late-maturing horse or one that had a minor injury along the way. It’s a very legitimate marketplace, whether you have a horse that’s worth \$10,000, or one that’s worth in excess of \$200,000. I think we saw that once again today.”

**WV-Bred Candy Ride Colt Brings \$250k...**

Five years ago, Headley Bell's Mill Ridge Farm began working with Jim Miller, a Maryland-based breeder who wanted to take advantage of neighboring West Virginia's lucrative program. The partnership has yielded dividends. In addition to turning out state-bred champions in the last two years, Miller and Mill Ridge teamed to sell Tuesday's co-top-priced lot, a colt by Candy Ride (Arg) who was hammered down to John Oxley for \$250,000. Trainer Mark Casse signed the winning slip on Oxley's behalf.

Offered as [Hip 584](#), the colt was produced by Mantekilla (Lemon Drop Kid), a half to SW Mr. Pee Vee (Eltish) and the Grade I performer

Erinsouthernman (Eltish) from the family of Sultry Song and Mizdirection. He is a half to the multiple stakes winner Harlan's Destiny (Harlan's Holiday).


"He was actually a horse for Saratoga, but he got a little blip and we had to skip that sale," explained Bell. "But he stood out here, and proper horsemen have supported this market. Mark [Casse] has supported us and we really appreciate it. He's got great owners and does well."

Bell added of the final price, "I thought that was right on the button. The reserve wasn't half of that, so Mark wasn't competing with the reserve. The horse had 10 or 12 scopes and is a nice horse."

The transaction marked a nice score for Miller, who acquired the colt's dam for \$70,000 at the 2011 Keeneland November Sale. Miller sold the foal Mantekilla was carrying at the time, the winning Daylight's Promise (Stormy Atlantic), for \$50,000 at this sale in 2012, but opted to buy back the mare's next for \$60,000. That proved the right call when the filly, Harlan's Destiny, won four juvenile stakes at Charles Town in 2014. Harlan's Destiny went on to finish fourth in this season's GIII Bourbonette Oaks at Turfway.

Miller, who is involved in airport management, maintains a broodmare band of around eight mares. "He foals them out in West Virginia, and then we get them after a while," said Bell. "He's a smart guy and he's had some luck. He's had two 2-year-old champions in West Virginia in the last two years [including Harlan's Destiny]. He hasn't been in it for very long, but he's got it figured out pretty well."

Miller's best runner has been Aurelia's Belle (Lemon Drop Kid), a \$170,000 KEESEP auction buy who went on to win the 2014 editions of the Bourbonette and GIII Arlington Oaks. Aurelia's Belle has earned \$346,387 to date.

## Striking Colt Leaves 'Em Cry-ing...

When buyers visited the Allied Bloodstock consignment in the days leading up the sale, they would more often than not have omitted [Hip 626](#), a colt from the second crop of Victor's Cry, from their inspection lists. Allied's Clark Shepherd would encourage them to look at the horse, they'd shrug him off when they heard the sire's name, and he'd persist, "No, you've got to see this horse."

"And it was funny to sit back and watch their faces," said Shepherd. "The horse has as good a walk as I've ever seen. You should ingrain it in your mind--watch this horse walk, and judge every other horse on that standard. It is that good."

In the end, plenty of would-be buyers agreed, and the sleek dark bay sparked a bidding duel yesterday that ended with a \$200,000 salvo from agent Alistair Roden. From the Tale of the Cat mare Minstrel Show, the Kentucky-bred colt is a half-brother to SW Beliveau (Where's the Ring) and the MSP Super Colerosa (Bold Executive). The mare had a filly by Overanalyze this spring.

Allied was selling the Mar. 15-foaled colt for his breeders, the Canadian-based Windways Farm. "They did a great job getting him ready," said Shepherd. "We were asked to represent the horse, and the first time we saw him, the hair stood up on the back of my neck. I don't care who he's by or who he's out of, he is a serious horse."

Victor's Cry is a Grade I-winning son of Street Cry (Ire) who did his best work in California for trainer Eoin Harty. He has two winners from his first crop to race, including the Woodbine maiden special winner Keepplaffinleslie.

Despite selling one of the day's priciest lots, Shepherd admitted it's been tough sledding of late. "It's basically the same people chasing after the same horses," he said. "You can have a good horse that vets well, but if you're not 'that' horse that everyone's chasing, it's as if you don't exist. We're not even showing our vet sheets in the back ring hardly anymore. Back at the barn, you might have five, six scopes, but it's people all playing at the same level, and it doesn't mean you're going to get all the money. It's tricky. You better have a good horse. It doesn't matter which market level you're at--you better have a good one."

Shepherd was echoing sentiments shared by other sellers. "We felt it brewing in September," he said. "It was hard to explain to our clients, because we took good horses over there. There was just nobody there. I'm a very positive person, and I'm just stating facts. It seems like everyone's appetite for risk has shrunk. No one's just buying 'a horse' anymore. You've got to feel blessed if you have the one they all want, because they're few and far between."

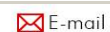

## OASIS DREAM COLT TOPS ARQANA OPENER

The combination of a world-class sire and a world-class breeding operation provided the top lot for the premier section of Arqana's October Sale when a Diane Wildenstein-bred Oasis Dream (GB) colt ([lot 161](#)) was the pick of the day for Ted Voute at €290,000.

Voute, who secured the colt and two other yearlings from Part 1 on behalf of HRH Prince Faisal bin Khaled, was delighted to be able to take home his first choice, saying, "From when I arrived on Sunday, I thought he was far and away the best colt in the sale but I didn't think I'd be able to buy him. He has been beautifully prepared

by the Coulonces Consignment and he's from a great breeder. He'll come back to my farm while we decide where he is to be trained. He'll be broken in by Malcolm Bastard and Prince Faisal has two trainers-

-Pascal Bary in France and John Gosden in England."

The colt is the third foal of Soudanaise (Ire) (Peintre Celebre), a sister to the G1 Gran Premio di Milano winner Sudan (Ire), who was trained in France by Ellie Lellouche before being sent to Bobby Frankel, for whom he won the GIII Golden Gate Fields S.

Voute was in action from early in the session on behalf of his Saudi Arabian client. His signings included [lot 27](#), a €130,000 colt from the penultimate crop of High Chaparral (Ire) named Brickfield (Fr) and consigned by Haras de la Reboursiere et de Montaigu.

"Ideally I'm looking for horses who will stay a mile and two furlongs, as ultimately they will be going to race in Saudi Arabia with the aim being the King's Cup," he explained.

Brickfield is the third foal of the listed-placed multiple winner Biased (GB) (Haafhd {GB}), a half-sister to G3 Prix Exbury winner Court Canibal (GB) (Montjeu {Ire}). Voute also went to €90,000 for [lot 4](#), Haras de Colleville's brother to the G3-placed Mount Kiara (Fr) (Kendargent {Fr}).

**Oasis Dream Colt Tops Arqana Opener cont.**

One more yearling was sold on Tuesday than in the corresponding session for 2014, with turnover falling by 5.5% to €8,394,000 for the 134 horses to have changed hands at a slightly improved buyback rate of 23.9%. The average price fell by 5.8% to €62,642, with a more marked drop in median, from €57,000 12 months ago to €46,000.

Of the buyers in play on Tuesday, Nicolas de Watrigant of Mandore International had the most clout, with seven yearlings bought for €980,000 on behalf of Al Shaqab Racing.

Members of the first Northern Hemisphere-bred crop of Redoute's Choice (Aus) created quite a stir when presented for sale at Arqana's yearling-sale opener in August, and another of his daughters (lot 22) brought the hammer down at €260,000 to head de Watrigant's purchases. The April-foaled filly is out of Benzolina (Ire) (Second Empire), whose offspring include the listed winners Baine (Fr) (Country Reel) and Bassamba (Fr) (American Post {Fr}). Both those fillies were trained by their breeder Francois Rohaut, as was Benzolina, whose yearling daughter was presented on Rohaut's behalf by Haras de Saint Pair.

"It's a really strong family and the fact that she's by Redoute's Choice is definitely a plus. It's been a really good family for Francois Rohaut so I think that gives quite a good indication of who will train her," said de Watrigant.

With Treve (Fr) now in retirement, there's arguably no more popular horse in training in France than the game veteran Cirrus Des Aigles (Fr) (Even Top {GB}), and his Alamo Bay half-sister Vie Des Aigles (Fr) provided a late highlight of the session when her Siyouni (Fr) filly (lot 187) was another to join the Al Shaqab team when bought by de Watrigant for €250,000. Named Vision Intense (Fr) and consigned by Haras de Grandcamp, she is to be trained in Chantilly by Francis Graffard.

The agent also went to €150,000 for a pair of colts. Lot 92, a La Motteraye-consigned son of Zoffany (Ire), is the first foal of the unraced La Jalouise (Fr) (Muhtathir {GB}), a half-sister to G1 Prix Saint-Alary runner-up and listed winner Believe Me (Ire) (In The Wings {Ire}). He was followed on the Al Shaqab list by lot 113, the sole More Than Ready yearling in the catalogue offered by Pierre Talvard's Haras du Cadran and another first foal, this time of the dual Grade 3 runner-up Miss Cato (GB) (Notnowcato {GB}).

The only yearling by Shamardal in the sale was, unsurprisingly, of interest to Darley, who bought lot 57, the half-brother to GII Del Mar Derby winner Fairly Ransom (Red Ransom) for €250,000 through Anthony Stroud.

The leading light from the Ecurie des Monceaux draft during the sale's opening session was lot 39, a statuesque filly by Holy Roman Emperor (Ire) out of the winning Street Cry (Ire) mare Celestina Agostino, a half-sister to the GI Flower Bowl Invitational H. winner Chelsey Flower (His Majesty). Marc-Antoine Berghracht was the agent in command and signed for the bay filly at €220,000 on behalf of a racing syndicate led by Anthony Forde.

Haras du Quesnay's Redoute's Choice colt out of the listed-placed Jakonda (Kingmambo) (lot 83) was initially bought back by his vendor at €200,000, but a private sale at €160,000 was later agreed with Meridian International for the great grandson of the great racemare and producer Weekend Surprise.

Gérard Larrieu of Chantilly Bloodstock, in company with owner Jean-Louis Bouchard, bid €160,000 for lot 99, an Invincible Spirit (Ire) daughter of the listed winner Lumiere Noire (Fr) (Dashing Blade {GB}) offered by her breeder Haras du Mezeray. **Cont. p12**

**Oasis Dream Colt Tops Arqana Opener cont.**

The filly will be trained by Pascal Bary, as will [lot 128](#), a Siyouni (Ire) half-sister to the jumps winner Hindou (Fr) (Califet {Fr}) who was added to Bouchard’s string at a cost of €150,000. Bouchard has certainly had his fair share of luck on the racetrack--though more notably with colts--and has won the Prix du Jockey-Club on four occasions with Blue Canari (Fr), Celtic Arms (Fr), Ragmar (Fr) and Dream Well (Fr), the latter in partnership with the Niarchos family. All four Classic winners were trained by Bary.

Laurent Benoit of the Broadhurst Agency was pushed to €145,000 in his pursuit of [lot 119](#), a Fastnet Rock (Aus) grandson of G1 Cheveley Park S. winner Pas De Reponse (Danzig) from Ecurie des Monceaux.

“He’s by a really good stallion from a young mare and is really well bred. There’s plenty of speed in the pedigree--it’s a good Wertheimer family,” said Benoit, who added that the colt was bought on behalf of a new British client.

Multiple Classic-winning trainer John Oxx was paying his first visit to Arqana’s October Sale and made his presence felt early with the purchase of [lot 26](#), a filly by Lawman (Ire) from the Ecurie des Monceaux draft at €110,000.

“She’s been bought on behalf of the Tsui family’s Sunderland Holdings. She’s from a very nice family and if she can do it on the track she’s a lovely long-term breeding prospect,” said Oxx. The second daughter of the winning King’s Best mare Best Intent (GB) was bred by Trevor and Libby Harris of Newmarket’s Lordship Stud, whose alumni include Oaks winner Love Divine (GB) (Diesis) and her St Leger-winning son Sixties Icon (GB) (Galileo {Ire}). Trevor Harris, who boards Best Intent at Monceaux, said, “I’m delighted she’s gone to such a good trainer. In fact it’s the second horse John Oxx has bought from us in a week as he also bought one of our yearlings at Tattersalls.”

The first session of the three-day Part 2 begins today at 3:30 p.m. with 124 lots catalogued for the abridged session after racing at Deauville.

## NEW SPONSOR POLICY FOR BRITISH BOOKIES

Bookmakers wishing to sponsor races at tracks owned by Arena Racing Company or the Jockey Club will be required to pay an agreed amount in Levy contributions or have a commercial funding agreement in place as of Dec. 31. Betting operators deemed to have a fair and mutually sustainable funding relationship with the sport will be designated as authorized betting operators, and those currently include 32Red, bet365 and Betfair. Betfred, Coral, Ladbrokes and William Hill have made voluntary contributions of £4.5 million to the industry over the last year, and future commitments will see them join the list. The authorized betting operators will also receive a package of benefits that could include racecourse data, wifi, preferential rates for digital streaming and perhaps the ability to reposition fixtures.

The policy has been put into place to stop British racing from losing an estimated £30 million a year to offshore firms.

"We are underfunded and loopholes in the Horserace Betting Levy system [allow] the majority of betting operators to make no contribution from profits made on British racing through their digital businesses," said British Horseracing Authority Chief Executive Nick Rust. "We welcome the leading stance being taken by ARC and Jockey Club Racecourses. Every stakeholder in the sport must understand and take on their responsibly for the creation of the right structure to support the funding of our sport."

This platform should help the government to complete its commitments to British racing to resolve the problems of the outdated Levy legislation with the introduction of a Racing Right to ensure a fair and equitable funding mechanism between the racing and betting industries."

"It is simply not an option to allow the status quo to continue," said ARC Chief Executive Martin Cruddace. "We understand that our own long-term growth and success can only be guaranteed if the whole of British racing grows and succeeds. This is a substantial undertaking involving significant short-term consequences, but it is a necessary one if we are to ensure the sport has a sound basis on which to move forward in the years ahead."

## Cee's Tizzy Euthanized:

The 28-year-old stallion **Cee's Tizzy** (Relaunch--Tizly, by Lyphard) was euthanized due to the infirmities of old age.

"Cee's Tizzy was buried in his favorite corner of his paddock which is covered with the morning sun," said Harris Farms farm manager David McGlothlin.

"Cee's Tizzy arrived at Harris Farms in 1994 and immediately became a farm and public favorite. A horse with the color and conformation of Relaunch and the class of his grandsire Lyphard, Cee's Tizzy was as personable as he was colorful."

Trained by John Russell and ridden by Eddie Delahoussaye, the Cecilia Straub-Rubens colorbearer scored a trio of victories in California in the summer of 1990 before heading to Louisiana for the GI Super Derby. He finished third in that event and was subsequently retired after incurring a carpal fracture during the race. The gray concluded his brief career with a record of 6-3-1-1 and earnings of \$173,150.

Cee's Tizzy is best known for siring Hall of Famer Tiznow, who is now a top sire in his own right. Tiznow won back-to-back renewals of the GI Breeders' Cup Classic in 2000 and 2001 and earned a trio of Eclipse awards, including Horse of the Year in 2000. He retired with eight wins, half of which were Grade Is, from 15 starts and over \$6.4 million in earnings.

Cee's Tizzy's top progeny also includes Tiznow's full brother and \$2.8 million earner Budroyale, a four-time graded stakes winner and runner-up to Cat Thief in the 1999 GI Breeders' Cup Classic. He is also responsible for 2001 Champion Older Mare Gourmet Girl, who was a three-time Grade I winner. In total, Cee's Tizzy sired three Grade I winners, 39 stakes winners and numerous California champions. He was named top sire in California multiple times and his progeny earnings are over \$37 million.

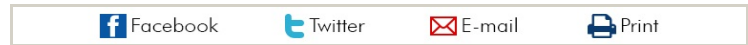

Generation Galop also presented a growth strategy for French racing centered around five main areas: improvement of the image of racing; revitalizing ownership and encouraging investment; strengthening attractiveness and competitiveness of French racing; developing betting to revive finances; and modernization of management.

Rimaud and de Villeneuve both spoke at the meeting. Rimaud discussed how ruling bodies must be aware of the importance of breeding, and stressed the need to create a viable environment for young breeders. De Villeneuve headed the betting section of the meeting, and discussed the need for racing to modernize and project a positive image in order to attract new bettors. He also laid out a six-point plan for increasing field sizes: adapting the race program to the number of horses in training; smoothing out opportunities to run throughout the year; creating mini-meetings; simplifying race conditions to make transitions easier; reinstating flagship races on weekends; putting in place racing secretary to optimize the number of runners in each race.

The third-highest priced lot, a More Than Ready filly ([lot 181](#)), fetched R1,700,000 (US\$127,917) from Rainbow Beach Trading. She was also a A\$70,000 purchase, from Inglis's Premier Sale.

A total of 160 juveniles were sold for an aggregate of R36,065,000, an average of R225,406 and a median of R110,000.
