LA VERDAD OUT OF BC, PALACE A MAYBE

Lady Sheila Stable's **La Verdad** (Yes It's True), who was pre-entered in both the GI Breeders' Cup Sprint and GI Breeders' Cup F/M Sprint, will skip the championships in favor of defending her title in Belmont's New York-bred Iroquois S. Saturday.

"It would be very unlikely that [La Verdad] would go [to the Breeders' Cup]," trainer Linda Rice told the *TDN* Friday afternoon. "She's not Breeders' Cup nominated so it would be a big investment. By the time you get done paying the planes and hotels, it's going to be \$150,000. Unfortunately, the Filly and Mare Sprint, which is the race she belongs in, is seven furlongs and that's not her best distance for Grade I company and its going to cost \$150,000 to go. So, with that said, I am more inclined to run here. We considered running against the colts [in the BC Sprint], but tactically there is a lot of speed signed on for that race with Private Zone and Runhappy. To run a filly against the boys...if it looked more attractive we may give it a try, but unfortunately I don't think it sets up well tactically for her."

La Verdad, who recently became a millionaire, boasts a perfect season with five straight black-type wins, most recently taking Belmont's GII Gallant Bloom H. The 5-year-old is likely to get her shot against the boys after the Iroquois.

"We may go on and try her in the [Frank J.] De Francis [Memorial Dash] in Maryland," Rice commented. "It is in November, it's against the colts for \$350,000, but it's six furlongs, or even possibly the [GIII] Fall Highweight against the colts at Aqueduct. Its six furlongs, a Grade III over Thanksgiving." **Cont. p3**

Doncaster's G1 Racing Post Trophy Saturday sees the unbeaten **Foundation (Ire)** (Zoffany {Ire}) bid to continue his streak and bring a perfect conclusion to his juvenile career with next year's Classics firmly in sight. After winning the Listed Ascendant S. on raw ability alone over this mile trip at Haydock Sept. 5, the Highclere Thoroughbred Racing colorbearer was more professional when readily

accounting for **Deauville (Ire)** (Galileo {Ire}) in Newmarket's G2 Royal Lodge S. three weeks later and he sets the standard. "I saw him work on Wednesday morning and John [Gosden] and the team are very happy with him," Highclere's managing

director Harry Herbert commented. "He seems to be in good form coming into the race and we've all been very impressed by what he's done so far. He's always shown plenty of ability at home. After he won his listed race at Haydock, I remember Frankie saying he didn't even know he was a racehorse and that can happen from time to time--sometimes it's just their talent getting them through. But then he went to Newmarket and had to knuckle down and have a real race to win his Group 2. Hopefully he's continuing to improve and if he is, hopefully he's the one to beat on Saturday." **Cont. p11**

Dual Grade I winner **Palace** (City Zip)'s BC Sprint status is still up in the air. It is possible that the Antonino Miuccio colorbearer will also run at Belmont Saturday instead of the Breeders' Cup.

"I am going to make that decision [Saturday] early," Rice said on whether or not she would run the 6-year-old in the Hudson H. against fellow native New Yorkers. "We have been working with him on a foot. We are scheduled to patch it up

tomorrow morning. It's been worked on with Ian McKinley and if I'm satisfied with how it looks I may elect to run him here. It's a little up in the air here with Palace, but La Verdad will run here [Saturday]."

If Palace does not run in the Hudson, Rice said she would definitely still consider the Breeders' Cup. However, if the bay does run tomorrow, the championships are "unlikely, but not impossible," according to the conditioner.

It was announced earlier this month that Palace would stand stud at Spendthrift Farm upon the conclusion of his racing career.

BC Quartet Tunes Up at Keeneland cont.

Richard Ravin and Patricia’s Hope’s recent Gill Iroquois S. hero **Cocked and Loaded** (Colonel John) was next up, breezing a half-mile in :49.20 (20/39). With Jose Valdivia Jr. in the irons, the bay got his opening quarter-mile in :24.40 and galloped out five furlongs in 1:02.60.

“We’re ready,” said trainer Larry Rivelli, who has never saddled a Breeders’ Cup starter. “Jose said when he was coming down the lane, he was talking to him all the way, ‘Whoa, whoa.’”

Cocked and Loaded was followed by GI Champagne S. victor **Greenpointcrusader** (Bernardini), who worked a best-of-39 four furlongs in :46.20 under jockey Joe Bravo. Working a day earlier than expected due to a rainy Saturday forecast, the Dominick Schettino trainee registered splits of :11.40 and :23.20 ([Video](#)).

“That was awesome,” Bravo said. “I threw him a little cross at the wire to ask the question about what he had left and he answered it and saved some for next week.”

Last, but not least from the Juvenile contingent was GI Claiborne Breeders’ Futurity fourth-place finisher **Sticksstatelydude** (First Dude), who completed four panels in :47.20 (3/39). With Lark Carroll aboard for trainer Greg Burchell, the bay was caught in splits of :11.80, :23.80, :47.20 and galloped out an extra furlong in 1:00.20.

“I’m happy with it,” said Burchell, who will school the colt in the gate next week. “The key thing with him is to get him to settle and make one run.”

NYQUIST BREEZES AT SANTA ANITA

Reddam Racing’s undefeated **Nyquist** (Uncle Mo) worked five furlongs in 1:02.09 (33/68) at Santa Anita Friday in preparation for the GI Breeders’ Cup Juvenile at Keeneland Oct. 31.

With regular rider Mario Gutierrez aboard, the bay sat behind

stablemate and fellow juvenile **Semper Fortis** (Distorted Humor) leaving the 5 1/2-furlong pole, took the lead three furlongs from home while clocking splits of :24.94 and :49.68 and galloped out six furlongs in 1:15.70.

“I just wanted a traffic-free fresh track and I do have to thank Santa Anita so much for offering that,” said trainer Doug O’Neill, who was granted permission to work 45 minutes in advance of Friday’s first race. “I was very happy, I got him coming home the last eighth in 12 and we actually two minute licked him for three furlongs going into the work....He looked like he did it easily.”

AGELESS OUT OF BC TURF SPRINT

Lael Stables’s **Ageless** (Successful Appeal) has officially been ruled out of a start in the GI Breeders’ Cup Turf Sprint, according to trainer Arnaud Delacour.

“We are not going to make it,” Delacour said of the mare, who sustained a deep cut below her left hock in winning the Buffalo Trace Franklin County Oct. 9. “I wish we had another two weeks, but you can’t go into a Grade I race half-ready. It is just bad timing, but that’s racing.”

Ageless, who finished a close fourth in last year’s Turf Sprint, will return to Fair Hill Training Center Sunday. No decision has been made on the future of her racing career.

“There is no rush to make a decision,” Delacour said. “Everything looks good now, and we expect she will make a full recovery. Then we will just take it one race at a time.”

‘HORN’ TO ARRIVE IN KY SATURDAY

Four-time Group 1 winner **Golden Horn (GB)** (Cape Cross {Ire}) is scheduled to fly to Kentucky Saturday for an engagement in the GI Breeders’ Cup Turf Oct. 31, according to *Racing Post*. Golden’s Horn campaign in Europe has been nothing short of remarkable, with the Anthony Oppenheimer homebred collecting wins in the G1 Investec Derby, G1 Coral-Eclipse, G1 Irish Champion S. and G1 Qatar Prix de l’Arc de Triomphe, and the sophomore stepped foot on the Newmarket heath for

the final time Friday. He retires to Darley’s Dalham Hall Stud after the Breeders’ Cup.

"Golden Horn worked on Wednesday and did two canters under Robert Havlin on Warren Hill [Friday]," trainer John Gosden told *Racing Post*. "He seems in

good form and will jet out of Stansted to Louisville in the morning. It's a direct flight but a little way in [the] van at the other end."

Discussing the track condition, Gosden added, "Firm suits us fine, we just don't want too much rain over there. It's a tight track over a distance of about a circuit and a half, but Golden Horn is pretty handy so should be fine around there. I haven't looked at the opposition yet, I'll worry about that when I get there on Wednesday."

Om Looks Loose in Twilight Derby cont.

Back to Om. The \$125,000 Barretts March breezer made a successful transition to grass with a front-running 2 1/4-length defeat of **Royal Albert Hall (GB)** (Royal Applause {GB}) at Santa Anita in May and made the running in the GIII La Jolla H. on the anniversary of his maiden win at Del Mar, only to be run down by the imposing Prospect Park (Tapit). With the latter the long odds-on favorite for the GII Del Mar Derby Sept. 6, Gary Stevens took over at the controls on Om and doled out a moderate pace before holding off Royal Albert Hall by 2 1/4 lengths.

Stevens was also in the irons when **Soul Driver** (Street Boss) powered his way to a 4 1/2-length victory in the June 20 Singletary S. at this track, but Mike Smith was aboard when the chestnut doubled up in the opening-day restricted Oceanside S. at Del Mar July 16. Soul Driver was narrowly the second choice in the Del Mar Derby behind Prospect Park, but he didn't do a great deal of running that afternoon, finishing eight lengths behind Om.

Daddy D T (Scat Daddy), winner of the Oak Tree Juvenile Turf at Del Mar and third in the GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile Turf last year, was just outfinished by Papacoolpapacool (Temple City) in a Feb. 22 allowance at this venue and is unraced since a sixth to that rival in the Mar. 21 Pasadena S. Supporters should demand (and should get value), as the Sadler barn does not shine with its first-up runners.

RIDE, VALLEY, RIDE

Often viewed as something of a consolation race for the GI Queen Elizabeth II Challenge Cup last Saturday, the GIII Pin Oak Valley View S. has drawn an extraordinarily contentious field of 14 sophomore turf fillies.

Dixiana Farms' **Tiger Ride** (Candy Ride {Arg}) is worth a look at a very tempting price relative to her chances. A maiden winner over this course and distance 364 days ago, the bay--bred on the same cross as champion Shared Belief--was fifth behind Lady Eli (Divine Park) in the GIII Appalachian S. Apr. 12 before switching from the barn of Kellyn Gorder to that of Graham Motion. Very impressive in annexing the rained-off Ta Wee S. at Indiana Grand July 17, the homebred weakened to be fourth in the GIII Monmouth Oaks Aug. 22, but returned to the grass for the Indiana Grand S. Sept. 9. Wide throughout, the homebred worked her way into contention under a hold and stayed on very well to record a four-length victory, covering her final quarter-mile in :23.36 according to DRF Formulator despite the ground loss.

America Mon Amie (All American {Aus}) was fourth, beaten just under three lengths, but hit the line equally well.

Runner-up when facing elders for the first time in the July 31 G3 Oak Tree S. at Goodwood, she exits an alibi-free fifth to Sentiero Italia (Medaglia d'Oro) at Belmont Sept. 12. She's an obvious bounceback candidate, but her starting price figures underlaid in this bulky field.

Stormy Regatta (Midshipman) has never finished worse than third in six turf outings and defeated subsequent Pebbles S. winner Partisan Politics (More Than Ready) by a nose in Saratoga's Riskaverse S. Aug. 27. She couldn't quite capitalize on a clean inside trip in the GIII Commonwealth Oaks at Laurel Sept. 26, finishing third behind the impressive Onus (Blame), who would be a handful in here. Joe Bravo, who rode the Clement trainee to a win in a division of Monmouth's Little Silver S. warms up for next weekend's Breeders' Cup meeting here.

John Gosden has warned that the participation of the likely odds-on favorite could be in doubt if heavy rain hits the Yorkshire circuit, but Herbert is expecting him to show. “Very extreme ground would be a concern, but I know we’d definitely rather have it soft than too quick. He’s shown he can handle good-to-soft ground. Strange things can happen when the ground gets very soft, but what will be will be.”

Standing in the way are a trio from Ballydoyle who seek to provide Aidan O’Brien with an eighth renewal, with Deauville the main focus as he looks to step up on his second in the Royal Lodge. That was his first run since accounting for Sanus Per Aquam (Ire) (Teofilo {Ire}) in the G3 Tyros S. over seven furlongs at Leopardstown July 23, so improvement is likely, while Michael Tabor’s silks are carried by two other pattern-race winners in **Johannes Vermeer (Ire)** (Galileo {Ire}) and **Port Douglas (Ire)** (Galileo {Ire}). The former took the G3 Golden Fleece S. at this distance at Leopardstown Sept. 12 before finishing fourth in the G1 Prix Jean-Luc Lagardere at Longchamp Oct. 4, while Port Douglas made all to win the G2 Beresford S. over this trip at The Curragh Sept. 27. Hugo Palmer puts forward Ibrahim Araci’s **Mengli Khan (Ire)** (Lope de Vega {Ire}), who booked his ticket with an authoritative win in an extended-mile maiden at Nottingham 17 days ago. Palmer said, “He is a very big horse, but he has a high cruising speed and travels very well in the soft ground. He is plenty strong enough and has got a remarkable engine. He is a high-class horse who will be much better as a 3-year-old.” Richard Hannon saddles Chelsea Thoroughbreds’ **Tony Curtis (GB)** (Rock of Gibraltar {Ire}), who comes into this on the back of success in the Listed Stonehenge S. at this trip at Salisbury Aug. 21, and the syndicate’s spokesman James Ramsden commented, “He’s like most Rock of Gibaltars; he’ll go on anything. He’s looked like he wants further and we think he will do next year, probably 10 furlongs, but we trust Richard Hannon to make the right decision regarding that. We were going to put him away for the season after Salisbury, but this race can cut up and he doesn’t have much to find on the official ratings.”

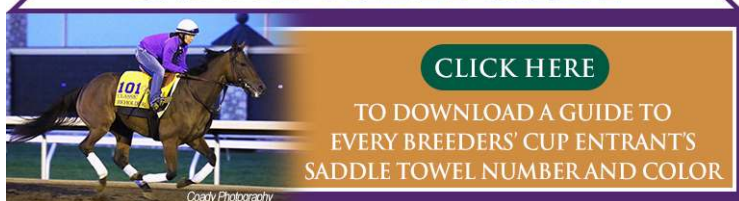

Chautauqua, who stamped himself among the leading sprinters in his country when taking last season's G1 T J Smith S. at The Championships Apr. 6, staked his claim as the top sprinter in the world with an eye-catching victory in Friday's Manikato S. Settling with Griante (Aus) (Good Journey) three lengths beyond the third-last horse, Rebel Dane, jockey Tommy Berry urged Chautauqua to come towards the outside of the field before the home turn. As Buffering started to show his customary fight and kick rounding the bend into the short Moonee Valley home straight, the runs started to come as the dual Group 1-winning mare Srikandi was the first to make her challenge, although it was short-lived as Chautauqua mowed her

down to hit the lead, pulling away for a dominant two length victory. It was a first Group 1 win in Melbourne for Tommy Berry, a leading rider in Sydney.

“It was a super effort,” co-trainer Wayne Hawkes told *Racing.com*. “He was certainly made to earn it

but that is what it is all about when you’re the ‘hot pot’. He’ll go to Flemington [next for the G1 VRC Sprint Nov. 7], then we’ll see how he pulls up. We’re taking it one race at a time. Then, you never know, we might go and meet the Queen. He’s the best sprinter I’ve ever touched, that’s for sure.”

Chautauqua could get his chance to prove himself on the global stage before a potential trip to Royal Ascot; connections mentioned the G1 Longines Hong Kong Sprint Dec. 13. as another possible target.

Prior to his T J Smith breakthrough, Chautauqua had been knocking on the door in Group 1 company in a contentious sprint division last season. He rounded out his campaign after the T J Smith with a respectable third when upped to 1400 meters in the G1 All Aged S. Apr. 18, and has been unbeaten thus far this season with clear-cut wins in the G2 McEwen S. Sept. 5 and the G2 Gilgai S. Oct. 4.

THE REAL DEAL?

Kyoto Racecourse plays host to Japan’s final Classic of the season Sunday, the G1 Kikuka Sho (Japanese St. Leger), and with G1 Satsuki Sho and G1 Tokyo Yushun winner Duramente (Jpn) (King Kamehameha {Jpn}) on the sidelines due to injury, the Triple Crown will stay safe for another year, with Orfevre (Jpn) (Stay Gold {Jpn}) being the most recent winner in 2011. Despite the absence of a Triple Crown contender, some exciting prospects remain. The 2-1 morning line favorite is **Real Steel (Jpn)** (Deep Impact {Jpn}), whose chased Duramente home when second in the Satsuki Sho and fourth in the Tokyo Yushun.

Real Steel resumed from a summer holiday with a second in the G2 Kobe Shimbun Hai Sept. 27, missing out to **Lia Fail (Jpn)** (Zenno Rob Roy {Jpn}), and assistant trainer Yasuhiro Shibuta said, “He’s a lot more relaxed these days compared to earlier this year, and has matured within himself. It was a slow pace in the Kobe Shimbun Hai, but he ran well, and we were relieved that he did so after his time off. He didn’t show any tiredness after that race, which is also pleasing.”

Real Steel is the third foal out of Loves Only Me (Storm Cat), an unraced granddaughter of Miesque (Nureyev) purchased by Katsumi Yoshida for \$900,000 at Keeneland November in 2009.

After making his first six starts on dirt, Lia Fail has been a revelation since switching to the lawn, winning two straight including the Kobe Shimbun Hai. Trainer Hidetaka Otonashi said, “In the Kobe Shimbun Hai, he ran the last 1,000 meters in :62.4 seconds. It wasn’t a great pace, and the second and third horses came from out of the middle of the pack. I think there’s still more to come, and because he’s made all the running to win his last two races, we’re not quite sure what his reaction might be when he gets into a real duel. I don’t think there’s a problem regarding his stamina.”

Satono Rasen (Jpn) (Deep Impact {Jpn}) has consistency on his side, having finished off-the-board just once in 11 tries, and he was second in the Tokyo Yushun. That lone off-the-board effort came last out when he was seventh in the G2 St. Lite Kinen Sept. 21, but trainer Yasutoshi Ikee was not disheartened, saying, “It was a slow pace in the St. Lite Kinen, but he managed things well considering. He’s improved since the spring, and while not the finished article, I think his last race was a good preparation for what’s coming next, and I can see him improving more. He had a recent half-mile workout and everything went satisfactorily. I’m looking forward to the race.”

PENN. BUDGET RIFT THREATENS RACING

Pennsylvania racing industry stakeholders and government officials began hastily convened negotiations Friday in an attempt to avert a shutdown of the six Thoroughbred and Standardbred tracks in the state, which could come as soon as Oct. 30.

The state has run out of money to fund the Pennsylvania Horse Racing Commission’s administrative and drug-testing costs, which run about \$20 million annually.

The fact that the State Racing Fund budget—which is funded by a tax on pari-mutuel wagers—is being bled dry is not new in Pennsylvania. Such shortfalls have routinely occurred in the past, but have been rectified by transfers from the general fund or slots revenue that is otherwise earmarked for the Pennsylvania Race Horse Development Fund.

The new wrinkle is that Pennsylvania is in the midst of a four-month state budget gridlock between the new Democratic governor and the Republican-led legislature, and the PHRC is one of many state agencies whose 2016 funding is in limbo. In the case of the racing industry, the budget impasse is also preventing transfers of funds to get the PHRC through this year.

Gov. Tom Wolf’s administration fired the first racing-specific salvo Thursday when it warned that the state may have to suspend horse racing in Pennsylvania over the fracas.

Salvatore M. DeBunda, president of the Pennsylvania Thoroughbred Horsemen’s Association, was asked by the *TDN* Friday if he thought the threat of closing down racing was being used as a bargaining chip in a much larger budget war.

“Yes, my feeling is that [racing is being used as] a pawn,” DeBunda said. “Because the impact of shutting down would not only affect the races themselves, but all the support things that happen with the races—the employees who work at the facilities, the people who take care of the horses, the vets, the people who sell the grain, the exercise riders, the people who do transportation of the horses. It would have a tremendous affect on the economy.”

But Wolf’s press secretary, Jeff Sheridan, wrote in an email published by the *Philadelphia Inquirer* that the racing industry had better be prepared to shoulder millions of dollars in drug testing costs if it wants to remain operational.

“It wasn’t an ultimatum—it was a hard truth,” Sheridan wrote. “If there is not a solution by [Oct. 30]...we will be forced to shut down horse racing.”

According to the *Inquirer* story, Wolf’s proposed budget for this fiscal year continued the stopgap practice of transferring money to buttress costs, but that the needed \$6.5 million to make up the 2015 shortfall is what’s frozen by the budget stalemate.

DeBunda, who was reached by phone late Friday afternoon, said he is currently in Florida and was not able to attend that day’s meeting, which he said included representatives from the PTHA, the state’s horse breeders, racetracks, and the Department of Agriculture.

“We recognize the fact that they’re having a shortfall,” DeBunda said. “But what we were surprised and disappointed by is that all of a sudden, we’re told that we have a week to resolve this. And if not, they’re going to give 30 days notice to shut down racing. I think it’s difficult to resolve it in a week. We’re going to try and resolve it in a week if we can, but if we can’t, I’m hoping that we’re far enough along [in coming up with a plan for the future] that they don’t take that step.”

Representatives from Parx and Penn National did not respond to requests for comment before deadline for this story. Nether did Walter Remmert, the acting executive secretary of the PHRC, nor anyone at Gov. Wolf’s office.

“The fact that we find ourselves here today should not come as a surprise to anyone,” agriculture secretary Russell Redding said in an emailed statement. “I have been sounding this alarm for months now. The system is broken, and it needs to be fixed.”

Redding continued, “This problem has persisted for years. There has been a 71% decline in wagers placed on live horse racing in the state since 2001. This means there has been less revenue for the oversight of the industry. There is a massive structural deficit in the State Racing Fund that has nothing to do with the current budget impasse. We can’t keep putting band aids on it in the form of one-time transfers from other funds, but this is a problem that is best addressed with surgery.”

Pennsylvania and Illinois are the only two states currently functioning without a budget.

Although it seems implausible that the Pennsylvania impasse could kill off the racing industry for good, there is precedent for it happening elsewhere.

In 2010, Rockingham Park called off its harness meet after New Hampshire failed to include funding for the racing commission in the state budget. The state essentially told Rockingham it had to pay the commission’s \$500,000 in operations costs if it wanted to run a three-month meet. The track declined, and hasn’t run live racing since.

“There’s 23,000 horse racing jobs in Pennsylvania,” said DeBunda. “A lot of those would disappear within that time frame. And the problem is that even if it gets [eventually] resolved, some of the horsemen are likely to leave and not come back, and some of those employees are likely to leave and not come back because they don’t want to be under the cloud of this happening again.”

“The celebrations to mark the 150th running of the Irish Derby went very well with over 25,000 people in attendance on Derby Day, an increase of 2,000 on last year’s figure,” Hensey added. “Longines Irish Champions Weekend has gone from strength-to-strength and although the weather was not kind to us, the racing was top-class.”

RESULTS CONSOLIDATED AT ARQANA OCTOBER

Arqana’s four-day October Yearling Sale drew to a close Friday with minor dips in cumulative average and median, but numbers for the sale remained largely on par with last year. A total of 435 horses were sold--exactly the same as last year--for a total of €15,683,500 (down €65,000) at a buyback rate of 21%, which was a 3% improvement from 12 months ago. The average was down a narrow 0.4% to €36,054, while the median dropped 3.8% to €25,000. The final day’s trade saw 81 youngsters sell for €1,098,500 at a buyback rate of 20.6%, which was down nearly 2% from last year’s corresponding session. The average dipped 6.1% to €13,562, while the median was unchanged at €12,000.

“After the solid gains posted in August, we are very pleased to see the October sale consolidate last year’s record figures,” said Arqana President Eric Hoyeau. “The market was strong throughout the week, with solid demand coming from French buyers, foreign trainers who are now based in France, European professionals who frequently race in this country as well as pinhookers. The good performance of the yearling middle-market relies on a broad and diversified client base, which reflects the appeal of French racing and must give us confidence in the future. We wish all our clients the very best of success with their purchases.”

Topping the final day’s trade was a Siyouni (Fr) colt ([lot 490](#)) picked up by Willie Slattery on behalf of Five Star Bloodstock Transport for €43,000 from the consignment of Haras de la Haie Neuve. The colt is expected to return to Deauville in the spring for the breeze-up sale. [Lot 585](#) neared that mark towards the end of the session when fetching €40,000 from the training partnership of Markus and Stephanie Nigge. That colt is a son of Orpen from Haras de l’Hotellerie.
