UNTAPABLE TO MISS BREEDERS' CUP

Winchell Thoroughbred's defending GI Breeders' Cup Distaff heroine and Eclipse Champion **Untapable** (Tapit) will not defend her title Friday, according to her connections. The Steve Asmussen trainee breezed a half-mile in 50 1/5 Monday at Keeneland, and connections were not pleased with how she exited the breeze, which led their decision to scratch the filly.

"After she worked yesterday, she was scoped and they found a little bit of mucus," David Fiske, Winchell's racing manager, said Tuesday. "Everyone had a panicked reaction, but then we thought that maybe we could fix it and she would eat up well. Her blood-work from Monday morning came back good, but she didn't eat up last night and this morning and this morning she had a low-grade temperature. At that point, it's game-over and start treating her with antibiotics.

The connections are still unsure whether the 4-year-old will continue racing next season.

"[Racing in 2016] hasn't been decided," Fiske continued. "We've had some brief discussions, but nothing serious. I think everyone is leaning toward running her next year. She's been unusually sound and healthy for the better part of three seasons and this is the first time I can remember her being sick. Given that, there's a lot of support to run her next year, but you never know. The landscape changes from day to day. Hopefully this is not anything serious. At the moment, no decision has been made." **Breeders' Cup Bulletin cont. p3**

THE NAME YOU KNOW: UNCLE MO

As we were discussing last week, Ashford's **Uncle Mo**, the [2015 Leading North American Freshman Sire](#) by a mile heading into the Breeders' Cup,

is one of nine sires with 30 or more weanlings catalogued in the upcoming November sales. But he is also the only sire with more than 40 mares catalogued in foal in the sales, in fact there are 60 mares in foal to Uncle Mo catalogued



Uncle Mo is North America's leading freshman sire and tops the lists at Fasig-Tipton and Keeneland November as well

in the two sales. This is a huge number considering the sire with the second highest number catalogued, also an Ashford stallion, is **Shanghai Bobby**, with 37. Uncle Mo covered 221 mares in 2015, so 60 is not even 30% of his book. Seven mares in foal to Uncle Mo are catalogued in Keeneland Book 1, but 45 mares are catalogued in foal to him in Keeneland Books 2 and 3.

FOR PLETCHER, MILE BEST FOR LIAM'S MAP

It has been a decision widely criticized across social media, but trainer Todd Pletcher Tuesday explained that a number of factors were considered when deciding on a start in the GI

Breeders' Cup Dirt Mile for the wildly talented **Liam's Map** (Unbridled's Song) over a potentially more valuable date in the GI Breeders' Cup Classic 24 hours later.

"It was a difficult decision, because he's a gifted horse," said Pletcher, whose most

recent of his seven Breeders' Cup titles came courtesy of Shanghai Bobby (Harlan's Holiday) in 2012.

"He's probably capable of running in multiple different races, but we know he's a brilliant miler. By the nature of his campaign, he never had the opportunity to run at a mile and a quarter. We felt that a race as prestigious as the Breeders' Cup Dirt Mile, as brilliant as he's been, is the right fit for him."

Five-for-seven in his career, the \$800,000 Keeneland September purchase won a June 19 optional claimer over Belmont's one-turn mile, then ran too good to lose the GI Whitney S. Aug. 8, going down by a neck to GI Breeders' Cup Classic aspirant Honor Code (A.P. Indy). Despite the taxing effort, the gray was back on four weeks' rest for the GI Woodward S. and proved not for catching with a 4 3/4-length defeat of stablemate Coach Inge (Big Brown) and **Wicked Strong** (Hard Spun) in third.

"He's a very fast horse," Pletcher continued. "He has the ability to carry it over a distance of ground. That's what separates the good ones from the really good ones. There aren't many horses you see capable of ripping off 23, 36, 1:09 [fractions] and still have something left."

At even-money, Liam's May is the second-strongest favorite of any of the Breeders' Cup races. Golden Horn (GB) (Cape Cross {Ire}) is the 4-5 favorite in the GI Longines Turf.

“This is Tepin weather. She loves it. I’ll take the cold and rainy any day for Tepin,” said seven-time Sovereign Award-winning trainer Mark Casse, who finished in a three-way tie for leading trainer honors at Keeneland’s recently concluded fall meet.

Remarkably consistent this term, the bay is unlucky not to have posted a record better than her four wins and a pair of seconds from six starts. Wire-to-wire winner of the GII Distaff Turf Mile May 2, she settled off the pace and pounced late for a half-length success in the GI Just a Game S. on the Belmont S. undercard June 6. She dropped a pair of narrow decision behind GI Filly/Mare Turf chances Hard Not to Like (Hard Spun) and Dacita (Chi) (Scat Daddy) in the GI Diana S. and GII Ballston Spa S., respectively, but atoned for those defeats in a big way, winning the GI First Lady S. over the course and distance by a whopping seven lengths.

“She really likes this course,” said Casse. “Some horses don’t take to it because it’s just a little different. It’s just the make-up of it. It’s got a lot of sand, I guess. There are definitely horses that won’t run on this turf course. But we know she will.”

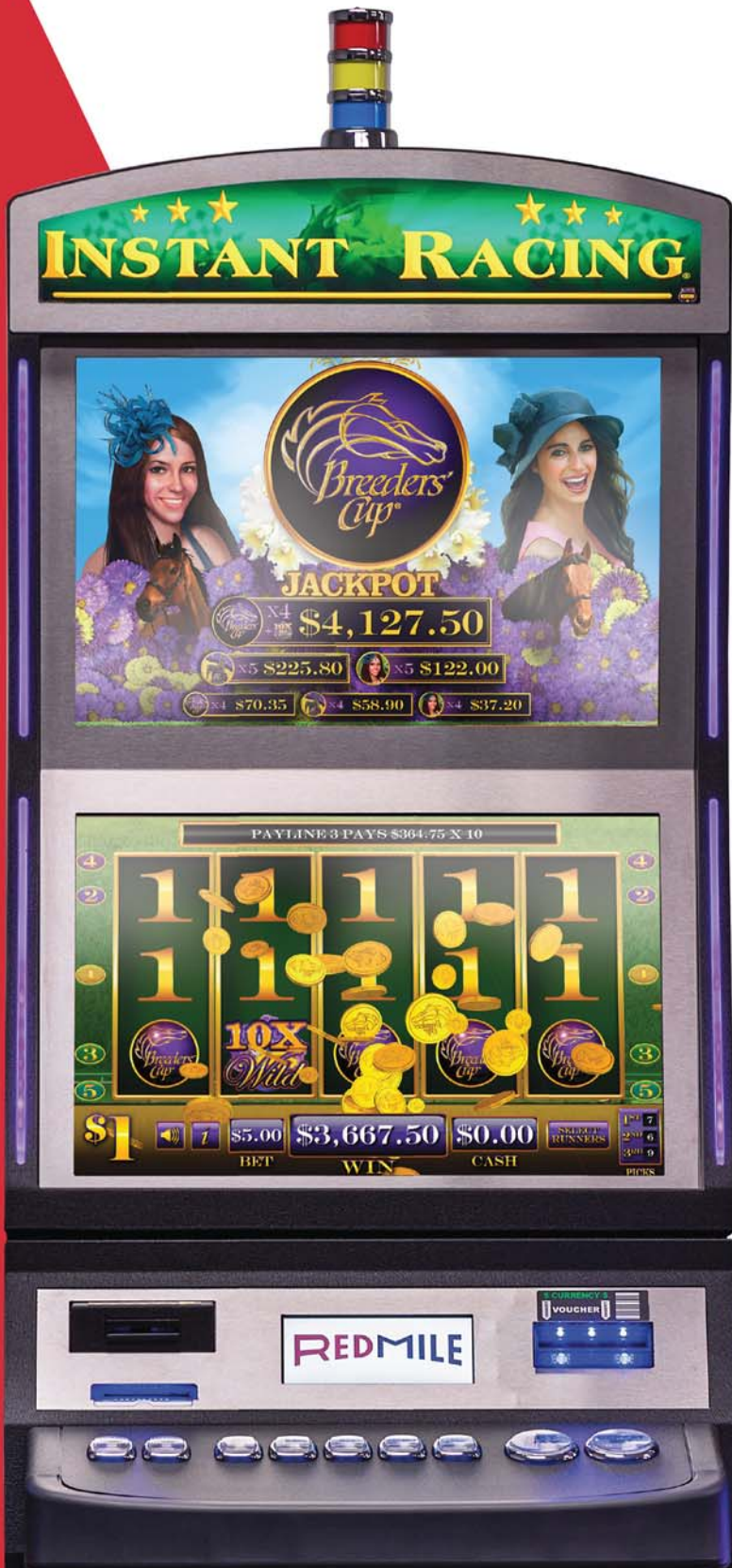

ANOTHER BUSY WEEKEND FOR BROWN

New York-based conditioner Chad Brown has won five Breeders' Cup races—all on the turf—since breaking through in 2008, including the trio of Lady Eli (Divine Park), Dayatthespa (City Zip) and **Bobby's Kitten** (Kitten's Joy) last year at Santa Anita.

"When you win one Breeders' Cup race you have to be very thankful. They are so hard to win," Brown said Tuesday morning from Keeneland. "To win three in a year last year was just remarkable. A lot of luck involved. Great horses at the right time, the right trips and it all came together."

After saddling a leading 10 and 11 runners in each of the last two seasons, respectively, the former Bobby Frankel protégé is set to tighten the girth around a dozen horses this time around.

"We have a good group here," said Brown. "It's going to be tough. Most of my races are on the turf and it seems like the Europeans brought some of their best horses this year. So it's going to be a tall order, but my horses are really doing well. It's a good group, a good solid group. I don't know that I have a real standout in the race that I think is unbeatable, like a Lady Eli, but I see horses in here that can win if they get the trip, they take to the Keeneland turf and you get that much-needed racing luck."

The Brown stable is three strong for Saturday's GI Filly & Mare Turf, including **Stephanie's Kitten** (Kitten's Joy).

Runner-up to her stablemate Dayatthespa at Santa Anita last season, she makes the final start of her career before going under the hammer at Fasig-Tipton Sunday. Brown will also send out GI Beverly D. S. upsetter **Watsdachances (Ire)** (Diamond Green {Fr}) and wild-card **Dacita (Chi)** (Scat Daddy).

Retires to Coolmore for 2016 following the Breeders' Cup

ALL EUROS ACCOUNTED FOR

With the Monday evening arrival of the seven horses that will represent Ballydoyle at this weekend's Breeders' Cup meeting, all European representatives are now on the grounds at Keeneland.

The Ballydoyle contingent, led by GI Breeders' Cup Classic hopeful **Gleneagles (Ire)** (Galileo {Ire}) arrived in Lexington at approximately 9:45 p.m. and were bedded down in the quarantine barn. Other passengers on the flight over included **Alice Springs (Ire)** (Galileo {Ire}), Juvenile Fillies Turf); **Found (Ire)** (Galileo {Ire}, Longines Turf); **Hit It a Bomb** (War Front, Juvenile Turf); **Shogun (Ire)** (Fastnet Rock {Aus}, Juvenile Turf); **War Envoy** (War Front, Las Vegas Dirt Mile); and **Waterloo Bridge (Ire)** (Zoffany {Ire}, Sentient Jet Juvenile). The David Wachman-trained **Legatissimo (Ire)** (Daneshill Dancer {Ire}), who is expected to go favored in the Filly & Mare Turf, was also on board, and all horses are expected to clear quarantine late Wednesday, with a first visit to the track planned for Thursday.

Golden Horn (GB) (Cape Cross {Ire}), who will try to become the first to complete the G1 Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe/GI Breeders' Cup Turf double, and his John Gosden stablemate, GI Juvenile Turf hopeful **Cymric** (Kitten's Joy), got a feel for Keeneland for the first time Tuesday morning, as the duo was out for a gentle canter over the Keeneland all-weather training track. Barry O'Dowd is overseeing the work of the pair ahead of Gosden's arrival

Wednesday evening, and reported that they had traveled well from England.

"The trip over was uneventful," O'Dowd reported. "They have both settled in well. They just had light exercise today and will do much the same tomorrow.

The trainer will decide if they do more later in the week, when he gets here."

Frankie Dettori, looking to add to his 11 Breeders' Cup victories, has been in Lexington since Monday evening and is looking forward to the weekend.

"I have come out earlier than usual to get a feel of Breeders' Cup week," the Italian commented. "I have got a nice book of rides, so we'll see what happens. Obviously Golden Horn is the big one, but I ride a lot with chanced, and to win any Breeders' Cup race is huge."

Dettori, who will partner defending champion **Judy the Beauty** (Ghostzapper) in the Filly & Mare Sprint and G1 Diamond Jubilee S. winner **Undrafted** (Purim) in the GI Turf Sprint, was aboard Hootenanny (Quality Road) for trainer Wesley Ward in last year's GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile Turf.

Trainer Joe Sharp has been out on his own for a little more than a year now, and the young conditioner will be represented by his very first Breeders' Cup starter in the form of Ken & Sarah Ramsey's **Sapphire Kitten** (Kitten's Joy).

Sharp, who previously served as assistant to Mike Maker, has had a successful 2015 season, having saddled 75 winners from 416 runners (18%), with stable earnings of over \$2.7 million. The barn suffered an unfortunate loss when Shore Runner (More Than Ready), claimed for \$62,500 earlier this year before winning a pair of turf sprint stakes at Saratoga, suffered a catastrophic injury in the rained-off GIII Woodford S. Oct. 3.

"It's great and a dream come true for me," Sharp said. "We exceeded our expectations this year and even though it's bittersweet because we lost Shore Runner earlier this meet and thought he could win the Turf Sprint, hopefully [Sapphire Kitten] will get it done for us."

The Chad Brown-trained BC Turf duo of **Big Blue Kitten** (Kitten's Joy) and **Slumber (GB)** (Cacique {Ire}) also made a nice impression during their morning preparations.

Salama (Desert Party), winner of Peru's 'Win and You're In' G3 Clasico Cesar del Rio Suito for the Distaff, has quickly adjusted to American-style training since joining the Charlie Lopresti barn this summer. Her former connections in South America reportedly began training her *with* a saddle well before her second-place finish in her U.S. bow at Keeneland earlier this month.

A good portion of the loaded European contingent, meanwhile, headed by the Arc winner and Turf 4-5 morning-line favorite **Golden Horn (GB)** (Cape Cross {Ire}), opted for the nearby all-weather training track just before 8 a.m. Defending Mile hero **Karakontie (Jpn)** (Bernstein) was also part of that group out for light exercise.

BELLA JOLIE A TIMELY INVESTMENT

Gray Lyster admits he had modest goals when he and his family claimed **Bella Jolie** (Broken Vow) for \$5,000 at Delaware Park in 2010, but the claim could pay major dividends for the family, which owns Ashview Farm in Versailles, next week. The mare is slated to sell at the Keeneland November Breeding Stock Sale Tuesday, just days after her first foal, Runhappy (Super Saver), starts as one of the favorites in the GI TwinSpires Breeders' Cup Sprint.

"I saw her running and I had seen her as a yearling and, physically, I knew she was a nice-looking mare. And I followed her pedigree," Lyster recalled of his decision to claim the then 3-year-

old filly. "That was when things were pretty bad, right after the crash in 2008. There were a lot of opportunities value-wise for broodmare prospects at sales and claiming races. We picked her up for \$5,000 kind of thinking she was worth \$35,000.

Although, at the time you didn't know what anything was worth it was such a scary market."

The initial plan was for a short-term investment.

"The idea was to claim her and maybe to get her in foal and sell her or sell her as a maiden," Lyster explained. "We got her back to the farm and just sort of fell in love with her physically and we liked the pedigree, so we decided we would keep her."

The Lysters decided on GI Kentucky Derby winner Super Saver for Bella Jolie's first mating.

"It was my brother Bryan's idea to send her to Super Saver," Lyster admitted. "We went and looked at Super Saver--we're neighbors with WinStar and we do a lot of business with them--and we thought she was a nice match. It definitely turned out to be."

The mare's first foal turned out to be Runhappy and, while he wouldn't have guaranteed the colt would become a Grade I winner, Lyster said he was impressed with the youngster from the start.

"When they start off physically like he did, you know you have an opportunity to have a really nice racehorse," Lyster said. "He was just always a very forward, attractive, athletic, strong horse, very racy. There are a lot of attractive, strong, racy horses that are really slow, so you never know. But we knew we probably had a good sales prospect. And that he--the quote they all use at the sales--ticked all the boxes physically."

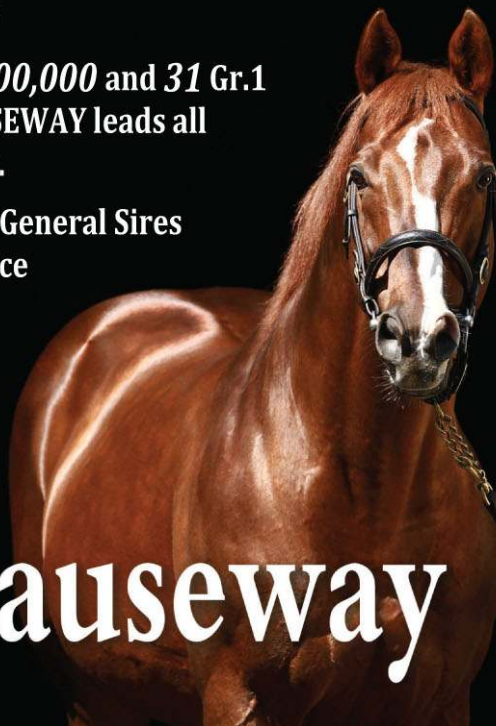

“Mentally, he was always the kind of colt that you like,” Lyster continued. “Which is playful and strong without being mean—the kind of colt that would get up on his hind legs as a yearling from time to time and throw his front feet around, not because he is trying to be a jerk, but just because he is playful and he is trying to be forward and be the boss. He was really nice to work with.”

Runhappy was well-received at the sales, selling for \$200,000 to Jim McIngvale at the 2013 Keeneland September sale.

Runhappy, who broke his maiden with a dramatic 8 1/4-length debut victory at Turfway Park last December, officially arrived on the big stage with an 11-1 upset victory in the Aug. 29 GI King’s Bishop S. He solidified his status as a leading contender for the Breeders’ Cup with a front-running

tally over the Keeneland oval in the Oct. 2 GIII Phoenix S.

In between those two graded victories, Bella Jolie’s Lookin at Lucky colt sold for \$255,000 at Keeneland September.

The early success has convinced the Lysters to offer Bella Jolie, in foal to Cairo Prince, as [hip 250](#) during Tuesday’s second session of the November sale.

“We know how fortunate we are to have an 8-year-old Grade I producing mare,” Lyster said. “It doesn’t happen very often and we are really excited about her. We offer her at the Keeneland sale just because we feel like she might be pretty valuable. And our business plan, as far as Bryan, Wayne and I, is not to own mares at her value level. Selling her helps pay a lot of expenses on the farm. It’s not that we don’t love her. We obviously love her. But that’s the reason for offering instead of keeping her for the long-term.”

Of the decision to breed Bella Jolie to first-season sire and GI Holy Bull S. winner Cairo Prince (Pioneerof the Nile), Lyster explained, “We picked Cairo Prince before Runhappy had ever run. We had spent a lot of money on the first few years on stud fees for Bella Jolie and, without one ever starting a race, we decided to take a cut back in our price point just a touch. At the same time, I loved Pioneerof the Nile and I love the ability that Cairo Prince showed and the things that Kieran McLaughlin had to say about him.”

Lyster added with a rueful chuckle, “In hindsight, do I wish she was in foal to Super Saver—carrying a full-sibling to Runhappy? Absolutely. But if I had hindsight in this business I probably wouldn’t have to work as hard as I do.”

Bella Jolie will be followed into the Keeneland sales ring by her Exchange Rate colt. **Cont. p14**

“The Exchange Rate colt is really doing well,” Lyster said. “Normally we wouldn’t offer a colt like that. We do sell some weanlings, but we wouldn’t usually offer a nice colt or a younger colt like he is, but just being that we have the mare in the sale and this is a good representative, we’re going to have him there, too.”

Lyster acknowledged it was a difficult decision to sell, but the timing of the auction couldn’t be better.

“It’s a great opportunity to sell two days after the Breeders’ Cup,” he commented. “It’s a seller’s dream. We really like them both. We don’t have to sell them, but it’s one of those scenarios where they may be too valuable for us to own any more. We have to protect our herd and pay for the rest of them and for the ones that we lost quite a bit of money on.”

The Keeneland November sale gets underway Monday, with sessions Monday and Tuesday beginning at 11 a.m. The sale continues through Nov. 13 with sessions beginning at 10 a.m.

Six of the nine sires with 30+ weanlings catalogued, [as we said last week](#), are first-crop weanling sires, meaning their first foals were born this year, in 2015. The three non-F2015 sires with 30+ weanlings are F2013 (first 2-year-olds) Uncle Mo, F2014 (first yearlings) **The Factor**, and **Scat Daddy**, whose first foals were born in 2009 (oldest now 6-year-olds) but who has exploded commercially this year. Scat Daddy has 33 mares in foal catalogued at the November sales, 15 of which are in Fasig or Keeneland Book 1.

A total of 10 sires have 30 or more mares catalogued in the sales; perhaps surprisingly, none of the 10 are sires which stood their first seasons this year-- although eight sires which did stand their first seasons this year have 20-29 mares in foal in the books. However, besides Scat Daddy, the other nine of the 10 sires with 30+ catalogued have their first yearlings, 2-year-olds, or 3-year-olds.

Four of the 10 sires with 30+ mares catalogued in foal stand at Ashford: Uncle Mo (60), Shanghai Bobby (37), Scat Daddy (33), and **Declaration of War** (30). Shanghai Bobby and Declaration of

War (who stood his first season at Coolmore in Ireland, and incidentally we hear rave reviews of his foals from other sources than the farm which stands him) are two of the four sires with their first foals this year, along with WinStar’s GI Haskell

winner **Paynter** (33) and Claiborne’s 2013 GI Kentucky Derby winner **Orb** (31). **Cont. p15**

Of sires with their first yearlings, WinStar's **Bodemeister**, the [leading first-year North American sire of yearlings by average](#), has 36 mares catalogued in foal, and Darby Dan's **Shackleford** has 31. Besides Uncle Mo, Lane's End's **Twirling Candy**, currently #3 on the North American Freshman Sire List, has 35 mares catalogued in foal representing sires with their first 2-year-olds. Another Lane's End sire, **Quality Road**, with 30 catalogued, leads sires with their first 3-year-olds in number of mares catalogued in foal.

Ashford also supplies the leading first-year covering sire, GI Wood Memorial and GI Haskell (Beyer 116) winner **Verrazano** (More Than Ready), who has 29 mares catalogued in foal. Spendthrift's GI Whitney winner **Cross Traffic** (Unbridled's Song) and dual GI Breeders' Cup Dirt Mile winner **Goldencents** (Into Mischief) have 24 each catalogued, while Lane's End's **Noble Mission** (a/k/a Frankel's "little brother", by Galileo) and Adena Springs' GI Breeders' Cup Classic winner and \$5.6-million earner **Mucho Macho Man** (Macho Uno) have 23 each. Three Chimneys' **Will Take Charge** (Unbridled's Song) was beaten a nose that day by Mucho Macho Man but won the GI Travers and GI Clark H. (against 'orders') before and after that close call, and was named 3-year-old Male Eclipse champion in 2013. He has 21 catalogued. Another Three Chimneys stallion, 2013 GI Hopeful winner **Strong Mandate** (Tiznow) has 20 mares catalogued in foal, as does Hill 'n' Dale's classy miler by Medaglia D'Oro, **Atreides**.

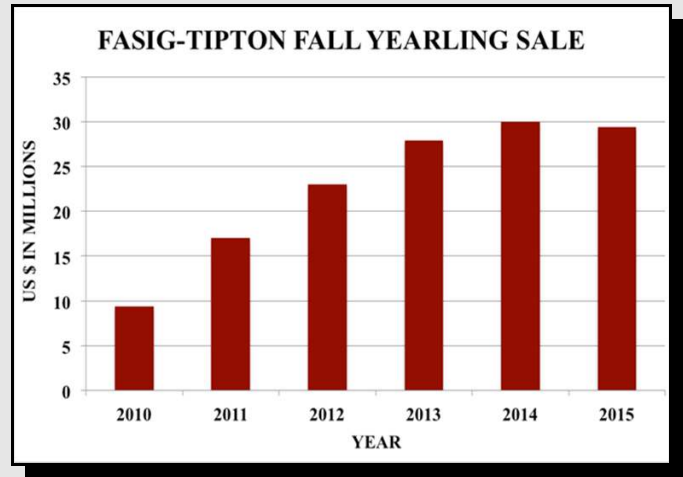
DUNLOP HAPPY WITH CUP PAIR

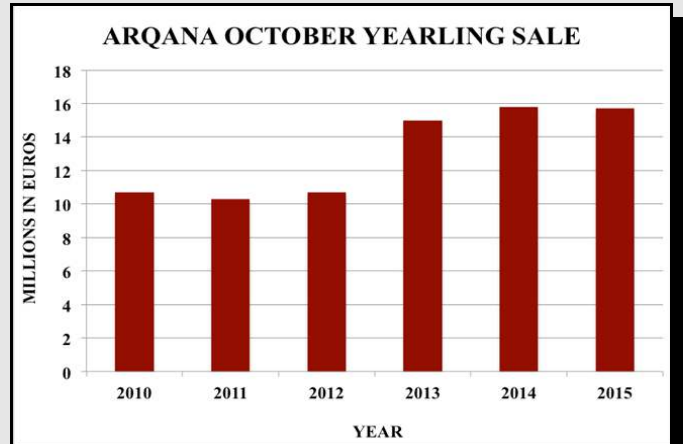
Weekly Sales Ticker

"The Fasig-Tipton and Arqana October yearling sales continued the theme of a stable (if not static) yearling marketplace, with one important difference: Fasig catalogued 20% more yearlings this year, but only sold 2% more, due to a very high 31% not-sold rate. Since the massive recoveries in 2012 (Europe) and 2013 (North America) the markets have not really grown, suggesting perhaps a market 'ceiling' was reached in one big jump, rather than gradually, which is usually the case."

FRENCH COLT STARS ON DAY TWO

By Chris McGrath

Australian investors stepped up to the plate during Tuesday's session of the Tattersalls Horses-in-Training Sale and paid heady prices for two with clear potential to reward their confidence in their homeland this time next year. The unpredictable nature of horses-in-training sales saw all the year-on-year indices trend downwards, with the aggregate turnover of 5,552,300 guineas down 26% from 2014. The average posted a similar decline, down 25% to 22,479gns, while the median was down 16% to 13,500 gns. Some 247 lots sold out of 281, representing a clearance rate of 88%. There were 19 six-figure lots on the corresponding day last year, and only seven this time round.

The Ballydoyle colt who had topped the opening session at 240,000gns will now be followed by the wildcard [lot 669A](#), secured by a bid of 230,000gns by Louis Le Metayer. A 3-year-old colt by Oasis Dream (GB) (Green Desert), **Pilote D'Essai (GB)** had won three of his six starts for Andre Fabre and attracted strong interest from Jassim Ghazali before Matt Coleman drove Le Metayer to the highest bid of the day. "He has

been bought for a syndicate based in Melbourne, but we haven't decided yet who will train him," the French émigré explained. "He was definitely one of the nicest horses in the sale, very much the right type for Australia.

We'd followed this horse for a while, and know the family very well. We went to look at him in trackwork with Mr Fabre and really liked him. He's a horse with plenty more to give, and also has a great physique - he vetted extremely well - and an outstanding pedigree." The colt is a half-brother to Planteur (Ire) (Danehill Dancer {Ire}), the G1 Prix Ganay winner standing at Sheikh Joaan's Haras du Bouquetot in Normandy. Le Metayer himself moved to Australia 11 years ago after initially testing the water in America. "I worked there for a year," he said. "But when I went to Australia I felt it was a growing industry with a lot of things that needed to be done." **Cont. p17**

His success will no doubt have abbreviated his flight later that evening back to his adopted country for the G1 Melbourne Cup - a race in which Chris Waller, seeking his first success, could saddle four runners. Waller won the G1 Cox Plate last weekend and morale will be further boosted by the news that [lot 661](#) **McCreery (GB)** (Big Bad Bob {Ire}) is on his way to his stable. Guy Mulcaster, Waller's scout here, was a man palpably on a mission, giving auctioneer Ollie Fowlston an immediate nod when forced to 200,000gns by the luckless Jassim Ghazali for the gelding. The

3-year-old, home-bred by the Rothschilds, had shown progressive form in a light career with Roger Charlton, most recently when second in a Haydock handicap off a rating of 96. "He was a horse we really wanted to have a go at," Mulcaster confirmed. "He's a beautiful horse who looks as

though he will keep on improving, and should have lots of options in Australia. He looked real good when he won at Sandown in September, and when he was beaten last time I think that was a lot to do with where he was on the track; I think he'd have been pretty competitive if he'd come from where the winner was."

Two horses culled by Qatar Racing on the opening day had been retained by their current trainers and it was a similar story when David Simcock spent 110,000gns to keep [lot 724](#) in his stable just round the corner on Birdcage Walk. **Captain Morley (GB)** (Hernando {Fr}) had impressed when winning a Doncaster handicap by four lengths on his latest start, and Simcock is delighted to have found a new owner for the gelding. "He's a lovely horse and, knowing him well, I feel there's a bit left in the tank," he explained. "His last performance was his best one, and it was the first time trip and ground were both perfect." He was followed immediately into the ring by another gelding discarded by Qatar Racing. **Fog Of War (GB)** (Azamour {Ire}) had made into a useful handicapper for Ger Lyons and, as [lot 725](#), had the right profile for Anthony Stroud at 125,000gns. It would be no surprise to see him resurface at the Dubai Carnival, but plans remain fluid for **Sacrificial (Ire)** (Showcasing {GB}), another gelding hitherto trained for Qatar Racing by Lyons, who fetched 130,000gns from Jeremy Brummitt as [lot 771](#). Sacrificial had featured on a shortlist of two for Brummitt after finishing third in the Britannia Handicap. "We were underbidder yesterday for Flaming Spear (Ire) (Lope De Vega {Ire}), from the same draft," he said. "We thought that they had bought two clean horses to the sale, with the scope to make very nice four-year-olds, and we're delighted to have bought one of them after they've put so much into racing."

Master Of Irony, another surplus to Qatar Racing's requirements despite proving upwardly mobile in just four starts for Ralph Beckett, was secured for the same price after Harold Kirk, standing by the top window, and Eddie O'Leary, down on the rope, were each goaded by the auctioneer's warning that "you're going to have to look at him every Saturday." It was Kirk who prevailed for [lot 652](#) on behalf of Willie Mullins, though Ireland's

champion jumps trainer could well deploy his latest recruit to enhance an increasing profile on the Flat. "He's a good-looking, progressive horse out of a Sadler's Wells mare and, with Makfis tending to go on soft ground, he can make up into a very useful

dual-purpose horse," Kirk reasoned. "He'll certainly stay a mile and a quarter on the Flat and those types will tend to get two over jumps, so I hope he can be a very good hurdles horse - but we'd hope he wouldn't be finished on the Flat either."

Of all the Qatar Racing draft, **Pallasator (GB)** (Motivator {GB}) was the one thought most likely to be bookmarked by the top jump racing agents. Sir Mark Prescott regards the protection of his horses' residual value as a key service to his patrons, and the Heath House string as always provided a splendid spectacle as they were ridden through the town after nightfall by riders in high-visibility jackets. But the Doncaster Cup winner was unable to muster the expected interest as [lot 745](#) and was bought in for 150,000 guineas. But the return to Richard Hannon's stable of the Classic-placed **Shifting Power (GB)** (Compton Place {GB}) was secured on behalf of a new owner. Ross Doyle signed a 72,000gns docket for [lot 458](#), runner-up in the Irish 2,000 Guineas last year. "He'll be a Saturday horse, suited by the Group Twos and Threes," Doyle said. "I thought he was good value." It was a fairly trying session for Jassim Ghazali, who missed out on both its top lots and was also unable to match Ted Voute's offer of 120,000gns for [lot 738](#). Winner of his sole start at two, **Peterhof (GB)** (Dansili {GB}) had made the podium in four consecutive handicaps for Sir Michael Stoute this season and struck Voute as a good fit for a brief from Prince Faisal bin Khalid. "He has been bought for the King's Cup in Saudi Arabia," Voute explained. "Horses have to be rated over 80 and he has also shown form on faster ground. He'll be shipping straight off, and will be in Saudi in 21 days."

HRONIS HOLDING POCKET 'ACES'

While enjoying a day at the races in their weekend box at Santa Anita back in 2010, Kosta Hronis turned to his younger brother Pete and told him that he wanted to buy a racehorse.

His reply?

"You're crazy."

Probably not the response that he was looking for, but Kosta Hronis meant business.

Enter John Sadler. After being introduced to the perennial leading trainer by their long-time usher the following weekend at the Great Race Place, Hronis Racing was quickly on its way.

"We had one horse, then we had two...three," Kosta Hronis commented. "When we ended up with five, I said, 'Oh my god, I've got five horses. This is crazy!'

And it just kind of snowballed from there. Now, we've won the California horse owner award for three years straight, and for what we've accomplished in such a short amount of time is a tribute to John Sadler and the people that he's surrounded us with."

Within just two years of launching, Hronis's green-and-white silks were carried to a pair of Grade I victories by Lady of Shamrock (Scat Daddy) in the American Oaks and Del Mar Oaks. She later brought \$2 million at the 2013 Keeneland November Sale. The late Vagabond Shoes (Ire) (Beat Hollow {GB}) and Sweet Swap (Candy Ride {Arg}) followed suit with graded stakes victories of their own. *lotapa* (Afleet Alex), claimed by Hronis and Sadler for \$50,000 out of a successful debut, won twice at the highest level before switching hands for \$2.8 million at last year's Keeneland November Sale.

The momentum has carried into 2015, too. After a pair of in-the-money finishes at the 2014 Breeders' Cup courtesy of *lotapa*'s close third in the Distaff and Daddy D T (Scat Daddy)'s rallying third at 17-1 in the Juvenile Turf, the Hronis family heads to Lexington with a trio of runners--**Hard Aces** (Hard Spun) (Classic), **Stellar Wind** (Curlin) (Distaff) and **Elektrum (Ire)** (High Chaparral {Ire}) (F/M Turf)--entered for this weekend's World Championships.

"To place in a pair of Breeders' Cup races last year, that was really great," Hronis said. "We're pretty new at this. This is only our fifth year, so we're really spoiled to even be competing in the Breeders' Cup. I really want to be part of John Sadler and his team winning their first one."

He continued, "As a fan of the sport, I always loved to watch the Breeders' Cup. To me, it has always been the Super Bowl because you get to see the world's greatest in all of these different types of races."

Family Affair...

Hronis Inc., a family-run business based in California's San Joaquin Valley, has been raising table grapes since 1945. Kosta and Pete, along with the former's son Demetri, head the operation.

"We grow table grapes and citrus," Kosta Hronis said. "The grapes are all table grapes, so no wine. When you go to the market and see grapes on the store shelf, they're probably from us or one of our neighbors. We're full-time farmers."

So how exactly did horse racing enter the equation? "My mom was born and raised in Pasadena," Hronis explained. "We'd visit our grandparents, who lived about two hours away, and our family outing was to go to the racetrack. We'd pick a horse and get to bet \$1 a race. My brother and I just fell in love with it when we were kids."

Hronis, now 56, has passed on that passion for racing to his wife Stephanie and their three adult children. "Brother Pete doesn't frequent the track that often, but he supports me and covers for me when I'm gone from work," he said with a laugh. "I've got three kids [aged 32, 29, 23] and my wife comes to all the races. Without her support, this would be impossible. She loves it and really enjoys going to the barns in the morning, too. I'm very lucky. Before this, all I did was work. My kids are thrilled that I have something away from the ranch. It's actually made me younger."

Private Acquisitions Paying Off...

All three of Hronis Racing’s Breeders’ Cup horses were acquired via private purchase.

Stellar Wind, an eye-catching 8 3/4-length maiden winner for owner Barbara Houck and trainer Donald Barr at Laurel last December ([video](#)), has done very little wrong since joining the Sadler barn. The chestnut has won four of five starts under her current management,

including a career high in the GI Santa Anita Oaks Apr. 4 ([video](#)). Her lone blemish? A troubled fourth as the 3-1 favorite after racing far back early in the GI Kentucky Oaks May 1.

“She really hasn’t disappointed since we bought her,” Hronis said of

the Virginia-bred. “She’s been a brilliant little filly and she’s done a great job.”

Stellar Wind--a \$40,000 FTSAUG ([catalogue page](#)) and \$86,000 EASSEP graduate--faces her elders for the first time in the Distaff following wins in the GII Summertime Oaks at Santa Anita June 20 and GIII Torrey Pines S. at Del Mar Aug. 30 ([video](#)), respectively. She was produced by a half-sister to the dam of GISW Great Hunter (Aptitude).

“We certainly appreciate Beholder not being in the race,” Hronis said with a chuckle.

Hard Aces punched his ticket to the Classic with a 7-1 upset in the ‘Win and You’re In’ GI Gold Cup at Santa Anita S. June 27

([video](#)). He has since disappointed, however, with a pair of sixth-place finishes in the GI Pacific Classic Aug. 22 and GI Awesome Again S. Sept. 26. Hard Aces concluded his campaign for trainer Larry Jones and owner/breeder Dreamchaser Thoroughbreds with a win in the

Louisiana H. at Fair Grounds in January ([video](#)).

“We’re hoping he goes back to form,” Hronis admitted. “We got the ‘Win and You’re In.’ We’ve got the ticket, so we’re going to take advantage of it and run him. If we get in the gate, we’ve got a shot.”

Elektrum, heroine of the GII John C. Mabee S. at Del Mar Aug. 8 ([video](#)), has endured her share of bad racing luck since relocating to these shores. The bay, previously campaigned in Europe by Giuseppe Botti on behalf of Scuderia Magenta,

prepped for the Filly & Mare Turf by completing the exacta in the GI Rodeo Drive S. at Santa Anita Sept. 26 ([video](#)). She was stakes-placed in France for her former connections in 2014. Currently stuck on the F/M Turf also-eligible list, Elektrum will need a scratch to draw into the body of the field.

“If you look at the far right column of her pp’s--wide, blocked, etc.--she’s had some real trip issues,” Hronis acknowledged. “Talented filly--I think if things go right and she finds a place to run, she’s really dangerous.”

What led to the three private acquisitions?

“With Hard Aces, we were probably looking for an older handicap horse for the West Coast for about a year,” he replied. “Stellar Wind looked so good in her maiden win and she was by Curlin. Elektrum looked like she’d be a good replacement for Lady of Shamrock.”

The ill-fated **Talco (Fr)** (Pivotal {GB}) earned his way into the GI Breeders’ Cup Mile via a smart win in the GI Shoemaker Mile S. at Santa Anita in June, but unfortunately succumbed due to complications from a recent arthroscopic surgery.

Hronis Racing currently campaigns around 40 horses on the West Coast with Sadler. The outfit’s first winner Caitie’s Secret (Benchmark) remains the lone broodmare at this stage. The California-bred is boarded at Legacy Ranch in the Golden State.

“We’re really diversified,” Hronis said. “We claim, buy at the yearling and 2-year-old sales, purchase privately, and we’ve also been involved with the Arc Sale across the pond, too. So, we’re always evolving as a barn and always looking. We keep our eyes open.”

Hronis concluded, “I can’t afford to buy the Los Angeles Lakers, so this was my way of owning a fancy sports franchise.”

The post season for Hronis’s team begins in the Bluegrass Friday afternoon.

BREEDERS' CUP DISTAFF

This year's GI Breeders' Cup Distaff has attracted one of the largest fields in recent years and with 2013 winner Beholder (Henny Hughes) opting for the GI Breeders' Cup Classic, the tiara is up for grabs with several talented females set to line up in Lexington Oct. 30. Godolphin Racing's **Wedding Toast** (Street Sense) comes into the championships off a trio of strong victories and is likely to be one of the betting public's top choices. A decisive winner of Belmont's GII Ruffian S. May 9, the

"TDN Rising Star" ran away with that venue's GI Ogden Phipps S. with a front running victory over champion Untapable (Tapit) June 6. Given the rest of the summer off, the Kiaran McLaughlin pupil returned to her home track to post another dominating success in the 1 1/8-mile GI Beldame

Invitational S. Sept. 26. All of those victories came going one-turn at Belmont, so the question facing this 5-year-old miss is if she can repeat those efforts going two turns over the Keeneland oval.

Wedding Toast does have a two-turn victory on her resume, however, in Aqueduct's nine-furlong GIII Comely S., which she captured in 2013.

Harold Queen's **Sheer Drama** (Burning Roma) has truly blossomed during this season for trainer David Fawkes. Bursting onto the scene with a 6 1/2-length victory in Gulfstream's GII Royal Delta S. Mar. 21, the 5-year-old half-sister to 2010 GI Breeders' Cup Sprint hero Big Drama turned in a pair of runner-up efforts at Churchill in the GI La Troienne S. S. May 1 and GII Fleur de Lis H. June 13, the latter race at the hands of **Frivolous** (Empire Maker). The chestnut returned to her winning ways with strong victories in both the GI Delaware H. July 18--defeating Frivolous--and the GI Personal Ensign S. last time.

Hill 'n' Dale Equine Holdings and Philip Steinberg's **Got Lucky** (A.P. Indy) is another one who has really come into her own this season. Todd Pletcher sent the 4-year-old to Monmouth Park this summer, where she finished a close second in the Monmouth Beach S. May 24 before scoring a dominating victory in the GIII Molly Pitcher S. July 3. Capturing the Lady's Secret S. Aug. 2, the dark bay was a good second in the Personal Ensign before charging late to earn a career high in the Spinster last time, which was won by the similarly late-running Don't Tell Sophia (Congaree) last year prior to a runner-up effort in the Distaff.

Fletcher and Carolyn Gray's **I'm a Chatterbox** (Munnings) headlines a trio of Grade I-winning sophomores looking to get the better of their older rivals. The chestnut has never been off the board since transferring from Ken McPeck to conditioner Larry Jones, starting with a trio of victories in the Fair Grounds's Silverbulletday S. Jan. 17, GIII Rachel Alexandra S. Feb. 21 and GII Fair Grounds Oaks Mar. 28. She came running late after a wide trip to finish a valiant third behind stablemate Lovely Maria (Majesticperfection) in the GI Kentucky Oaks May 1. Given a brief freshening, the homebred crossed the wire a nose ahead of **Curalina** (Curlin) after setting the pace in Saratoga's GI CCA Oaks July 26, but was disqualified and placed second for interference. I'm a Chatterbox was the only one attempting to run down loose on the lead Embellish the Lace (Super Saver) when second in that venue's GI Alabama S. Aug. 22 and earned her much-deserved first Grade I victory last time in the Cotillion S. at Parx Sept. 19. The elegant chestnut has won setting the pace, stalking and coming from well out of it, and her versatility could prove key in this test.

Eclipse Thoroughbred Partners' Curalina is the second of three representatives from the Pletcher barn. A dominant allowance winner at Churchill May 1, she came running four-wide to get up just in time in Belmont's GI Acorn S. June 6 and returned to get the CCA Oaks victory via DQ. Third in the Alabama, the chestnut finished second to Wedding Toast when facing older rivals for the first time in the Beldame.

Qatar Racing's **Peace and War** (War Front) drew into the Distaff off the also-eligible list after a fever necessitated the scratch of defending champion Untapable Tuesday morning. The sophomore pulled off a 23-1 shocker in the GI Darley Alcibiades S. here last autumn and her late-running style suggests she will relish the chance to compete at nine furlongs, the longest distance test of her career.

Last, but certainly not least, is Hronis Racing's **Stellar Wind** (Curlin), who has only lost once since being privately purchased by these connections and transferred to trainer John Sadler. Making light work of the West Coast sophomore fillies with impressive victories in the GII Santa Ysabel S. Feb. 28 and the GI Santa Anita Oaks Apr. 4, she sustained a wide, late rally to finish fourth as the favorite in the Oaks. Returning to her winning ways in Arcadia's GII Summertime Oaks June 20, the blaze-faced chestnut ran away with the GIII Torrey Pines S. last time Aug. 30.

There is no question Stellar Wind is a force to be reckoned with on the West Coast, but the challenge facing her is whether or not she can duplicate that form in Lexington after failing to do so on her last trip to Kentucky for a trainer with notoriously poor stats with his shippers.

BREEDERS' CUP JUVENILE FILLIES TURF

Hall of Famer Bill Mott's juvenile turfers came out running at this year's Saratoga meet, but Larkin Armstrong's **Harmonize** (Scat Daddy) finished a nose short to **Thrilled** (Uncle Mo) after setting the pace at the Spa Aug. 29. Content to defer to a headstrong rival down the backside during the Sept. 3 P.G. Johnson S., Harmonize earned her diploma by four lengths while exacting revenge on the aforementioned Thrilled. Showing a completely different dimension--and an affinity for this course--the bay dropped far back early in the Oct. 7 GIII Jessamine S., but inhaled her competition while extremely wide on the home bend to best **Sapphire Kitten** (Kitten's Joy) by a neck. According to Trakus data, she covered more ground than anyone else in the field, but still managed to get her final 5/16 of a mile in :29.78. Mott also saddles **Gliding By** (Artie Schiller), an impressive last-to-first debut winner at Woodbine Sept. 25 for Josie Carroll and Greenwood Lodge Farm. Adam Wachtel and Nils Brous subsequently bought into the dark bay.

Thrilled, meanwhile, went on to endure a tough beat of her own, losing by a nose to Tin Type Gal (Tapit)--who was announced as a scratch from the Breeders' Cup Tuesday-- in Belmont's GIII Miss Grillo S. Sept. 27.

Catch a Glimpse (City Zip) figures to be among the early pacesetters, having taken Woodbine's GII Natalma S. by five front-running lengths Sept. 12. Fading to fifth after her sprint debut at Saratoga was rained onto the slop July 30, she looked like a completely different horse when first testing the green in a seven-furlong Etobicoke allowance Aug. 22 that was carded as a prep for the Natalma.

European invaders have only annexed two of the seven previous runnings of this event, but they always merit a long look. The Coolmore contingent's **Alice Springs (Ire)** (Galileo {Ire}) was third behind G1 English 1000 Guineas ante-post favorite Minding (Ire) (Galileo {Ire}) in the seven-furlong G1 Moyglare Stud S. at The Curragh Sept. 12, and a close fourth in the G1 Cheveley Park S. over six panels at Newmarket two weeks after that. She got a confidence-building four-length victory back out to seven in Newmarket's Tattersalls Millions Trophy Oct. 3.

Illuminate (Ire) (Zoffany {Ire}) makes her first start beyond six panels, but likely has the best European form of all. She was three-for-three to kick off her career, with victories in Royal Ascot's G3 Albany S. June 19 and Newmarket's G2 Duchess of Cambridge S. July 10.

While GIII Pilgrim S. winner **Isotherm** (Lonhro {Aus}) will return to dirt in the GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile Saturday, the three colts who ran directly behind him in that Sept. 26 Belmont contest all show up here.
