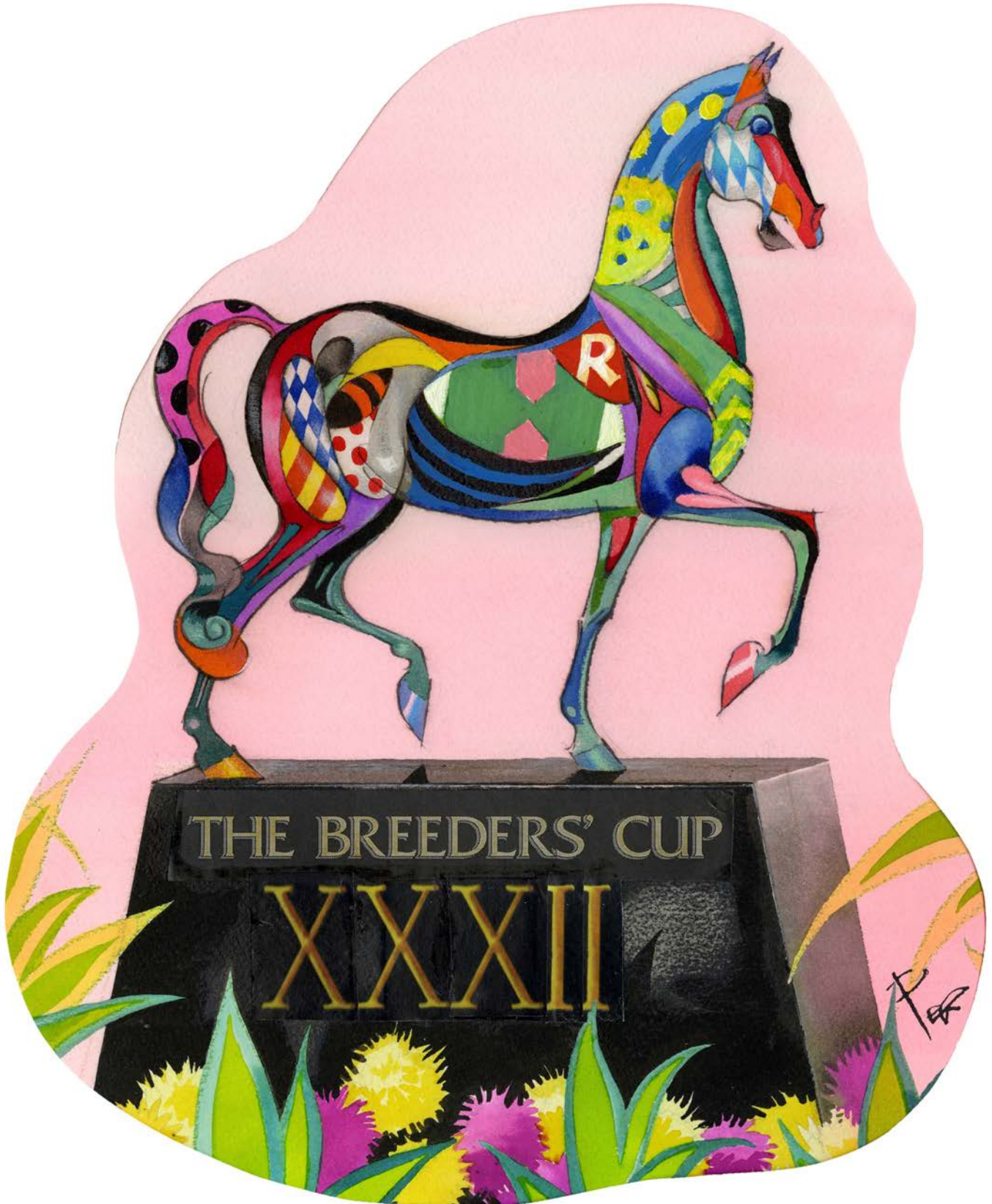

BREEDERS' CUP RETURNS TO KENTUCKY

After spending three years in California, the Breeders' Cup returns to the Bluegrass State for the first time since 2011 when it was hosted by Churchill Downs. This year, however, Keeneland gets its first shot at hosting the Championships. Four races highlight day one of the Breeders' Cup with a strong group of fillies and mares taking center stage in the \$2 million GI Breeders' Cup Distaff.

Godolphin's **"TDN Rising Star" Wedding Toast** (Street Sense) is the tepid morning-line favorite off a trio of strong victories at Belmont Park in the GII Ruffian S. May 9, GI Ogden Phipps S. June 6 and GI Beldame Invitational S. Sept. 26. With all of those wins coming around one turn, the test facing this miss will be duplicating that form going two turns in Lexington, but she does have a two-turn win on her resume in the 2013 GIII Comely S. A pair of Grade I-winning older mares, **Sheer Drama** (Burning Roma) and **Got Lucky** (A.P. Indy), will certainly pose a threat to that favorite, but so will a strong trio of sophomores headlined by ultra-consistent GI Cotillion S. heroine **I'm a Chatterbox** (Munnings), whose versatile running style could prove key in this test. Another **"TDN Rising Star"** tops the field of the GI Breeders' Cup Dirt Mile in Teresa Viola Racing Stables, West Point Thoroughbreds' and Lanes End Farm's **Liam's Map** (Unbridled's Song). Never off the board in seven starts, the impressive GI Woodward S. winner's biggest threat seems to come in the form of GI Woodbine Mile runner-up **Lea** (First Samurai), winner of the 2014 GI Donn H. It will be hard to follow in the hoofprints of last year's GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies Turf winner Lady Eli (Divine Park), who is still undefeated, but Larkin Armstrong's **Harmonize** (Scat Daddy) will look to put on a show of her own this year. Graduating at second asking in the P.G. Johnson S. Sept. 3, the bay showed a new dimension when winning this venue's GIII Jessamine S. Oct. 7. John Oxley's GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile Turf contender **Airoforce** (Colonel John) also boasts a win over this course in the GIII Bourbon S. With Europeans winning six of the last eight Juvenile Turfs, the undefeated gray looks to make it two in a row for America after Hootenanny (Quality Road)'s victory last term. BEHOLDER OUT OF BREEDERS' CUP

Multiple champion **Beholder** (Henny Hughes), who would have likely been second choice behind American Pharoah (Pioneerof the Nile) for Saturday's GI Breeders' Cup Classic, will miss the race after a scope Thursday morning revealed the presence of blood. Beholder had come down with a shipping fever earlier this week, but had reportedly bounced back and was doing well until Thursday's announcement by trainer Richard Mandella.

"After she galloped this morning we scoped her and found her to have bled," said

Mandella. "This was obviously due to the fever she had when she arrived. Knowing this, we feel it is too great a risk to start her in the Classic.

"There's obviously some irritated lung tissue there. She will be fine, but if I put her under the pressure of a race situation, it could cause some real damage."

Beholder, who won the 2013 GI Breeders' Cup Distaff in California en route to champion 3-year-old filly honors, was forced to miss last year's title defense after spiking a fever. **Cont. p5**

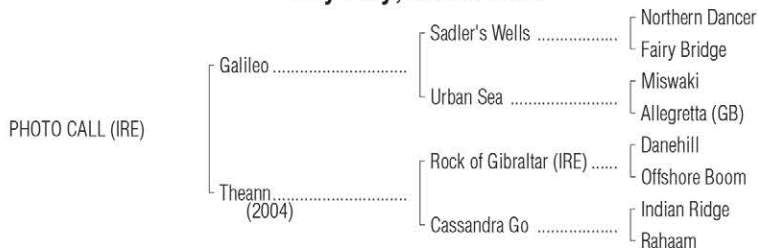

Kumin, along with longtime friend Jay Hanley, operate as Sheep Pond Partners (click [here](#) for TDN feature), who, of course, campaign the aforementioned sidelined superstar. Kumin also races under the separate entity of Head of Plains Partners.

"It's exciting," Kumin said before boarding a flight from Miami headed to the Bluegrass. "It just kind of all fell into place. I feel like we've got more than a couple that have a good chance, but you never know."

Within the past 12 months, Kumin has collected a remarkable five Grade/Group 1 trophies--two with Lady Eli (Breeders' Cup JFT & Belmont Oaks Invitational July 4); one with Slumber (Manhattan S. at Belmont Park June 6); one with Undrafted (Diamond Jubilee S. at Royal Ascot June 20); and one with Sharla Rae (Del Mar Oaks Aug. 15).

That's not all. He's also had his colors carried by this summer's GIII Monmouth Park S. heroine Delightful Joy (Tapit); GI Flower Bowl S. runner-up Danza Cavallo (Fr) (Sunday Break {Jpn}); Del Mar's Oceanside S. winner Soul Driver (Street Boss); and recent English Channel S. victor Offering Plan (Spring At Last). Kumin also has high hopes for 'TDN Rising Star' and last year's GIII Miss Grillo S. third Tammy the Torpedo (More Than Ready), who returned from the shelf with a smart allowance win at Belmont in mid-October.

"It's been pretty ridiculous," Kumin admitted. "First of all, we've been really lucky. Second of all: Chad Brown. Five of those [Breeders' Cup] horses are with him. Even a lot of times when I'll look at horses [to purchase privately] that I can't move to him, he's still helpful in giving me advice. He's my main guy and I love him. He's been incredible." **Cont. p7**

Although ranged against a field of remarkable depth, Embellish the Lace controlled the Alabama from start to finish. Turning back challenges from Curalina and Lovely Maria turning for home, she then comfortably held at bay I'm a Chatterbox to score by daylight. ***Embellish the Lace's time was the second fastest in the last decade, more than three seconds faster than last year's Alabama, and only 0.4 seconds slower than the time set by Keen Ice while defeating American Pharoah for the Travers Stakes (gr. I) over the same course and distance.***

That this was a truly stellar performance becomes clear when one reflects on the deeds of the horses that finished behind Embellish the Lace. Lovely Maria boasts victories in the Ashland Stakes (gr. I) and Kentucky Oaks (gr. I); Curalina had been victorious in the Acorn Stakes (gr. I) and Coaching Club American Oaks (gr. I); and I'm a Chatterbox, third in the Kentucky Oaks (gr. I), and second in the Coaching Club American Oaks (gr. I), would win

the Cotillion Stakes (gr. I) on her next start. This formidable was joined among the vanquished by Include Betty, a three and a quarter length winner of the Mother Goose Stakes (gr. I).

Embellish the Lace has a pedigree to match her performances. She is one of eight stakes winners from the first crop of her sire, Super Saver, now one of the nation's most exciting young sires. In addition to Embellish the Lace, Super Saver's first crop also includes grade one winning two-year-old, Competitive Edge; Runhappy, who has stamped himself as the fastest three-year-old colt of his generation with wins in the Phoenix Stakes (gr. II) and the King's Bishop Stakes (gr. I); and graded winner Super Majesty, very possibly the fastest three-year-old filly of her crop.

On the distaff side, Embellish the Lace comes from a family that is rapidly emerging as a major source of top-class runners. Embellish the Lace is herself half-sister to Afleet Express – winner of the Travers Stakes (gr. I) over a field that included Super Saver, Florida Derby (gr. I) winner and Kentucky Derby (gr. I) second Ice Box, and grade one winning millionaire First Dude – and to multiple stakes winning and graded placed Reporting for Duty.

Embellish the Lace's dam, the two-year-old stakes performer, Expanse, is half-sister to Eye of the Tiger, who won Washington Park Handicap (gr. II) and Affirmed Handicap (gr. III), and was multiple graded placed, including when third in the Carter Handicap (gr. I). Expanse is also half-sister to stakes winning and multiple graded stakes placed Wildwood Flower, the dam of My Miss Sophia, successful last year in the Gazelle Stakes (gr. II), and runner-up in the Kentucky Oaks (gr. I), and of Materiality, who ran the fastest Beyer speedfigure of 2015 by any three-year-old beyond a mile when capturing the Florida Derby (gr. I). Embellish the Lace's granddam, Dial a Trick, is half-sister to multiple graded stakes winner Fighting Fantasy; to group placed Snow Forest (dam of grade one winner Snow Ridge and stake winner Pavarotti); to stakes placed Filet (granddam of grade placed Quiet Kim, herself dam of multiple graded stakes winner and graded placed Fiftys shades of fay) and to Ice Beauty (dam of Illinois Derby (gr. II) victor Sweetnorthern saint). - Alan Porter

Kumin launched Folger Hill Asset Management, a hedge fund backed by \$1.2 billion in capital, earlier this year. The 40-year-old met the aforementioned Hanley, the principal of a construction and development company and longtime horse owner, when having renovations done to his Nantucket, Massachusetts estate about 10 years ago.

“Jay Hanley is the one that got me into this and he’s a great friend and we’ve had a blast doing this together,” Kumin said. “And I’ll be doing it with him for years to come. We’ve been very lucky to surround ourselves with a lot of good people.”

Some of those good people include, co-owners Michael Dubb, Pete Bradley, Wes Welker and Adam Wachtel.

“Look at the guys that I’ve partnered with,” Kumin explained. “Dubb is a terrific partner and he’s a lot of fun to go to the races with. We’ve got three Breeders’ Cup horses with Pete Bradley and we’ve been on a bunch of other ones with him, too—he’s an awesome partner. [Former NFL star Wes] Welker is a great buddy of mine and he’s coming down to the Breeders’ Cup with us to watch Undrafted.”

For Kumin, the approach is simple.

“You try to buy good horses, try to win big races, and whether I own a half, a third, or three quarters, I like having people that I can partner with. I know some people can be funny about it, but I think it’s a lot of fun.”

Now, back to those nine Breeders’ Cup horses.

Last Waltz, campaigned in partnership with Bradley Thoroughbreds and others, will be receiving first-time Lasix while making her U.S. bow for Chad Brown in the Juvenile Fillies Turf. She was a good third for conditioner David Wachman in

The up-and-coming Wavell Avenue makes her first start at the highest level after rallying to a strong second-place finish in the GII Gallant Bloom H. at Belmont Sept. 26. She will carry Dubb's yellow-and-pink silks in the F/M Sprint.

Chilean standout Dacita made quite the first impression by producing a sensational late rally to reel in Mile contender Tepin (Bernstein) in the

GII Ballston Spa S. at Saratoga Aug. 29. She will be joined in the F/M Turf by Sharla Rae, most recently a close fifth in the GI Rodeo Drive S. Sept. 26.

Stallwalkin' Dude led in the stretch and came within a neck of the ill-fated Rock Fall (Speightstown) when third for owner/trainer David Jacobson in the GI Vosburgh S. at Belmont Sept. 26.

The 7-year-old Slumber, second in the GI Joe Hirsch Turf Classic S. Sept. 26, continues to enjoy a career year since switching hands for \$200,000 at the 2014 KEENOV sale and moving to Brown's barn.

"We bought into Last Waltz before the prep race in Europe and she was a big third in there," Kumin said. "The only two that I've owned for a really short period of time are Wavell Avenue and Stallwalkin' Dude. Everything else I've had for a while."

He continued, "I think we have a really good process of evaluating horses. Last year, all three of our horses that ran in the Breeders' Cup [Lady Eli, Tammy the Torpedo and Offering Plan] were bought at the sales. This year, almost all of them were bought off the track."

The two-day Championships aren't the only thing that Kumin is looking forward to during his trip to Kentucky this weekend. One of the first items on the list? Visit Lady Eli at Dell Ridge Farm.

"We're taking it one day at a time," Kumin said of Lady Eli, who continues on her road to recovery from laminitis. "From where she was to where she is now, we're really happy with the progress. We don't want get overly excited, but I think she's moving in the right direction and I can't

wait to see her. I'm just so happy that she's doing well."

He concluded, "She's the one that really got us into this and she's been a part of our family. I'd trade all of these horses for a healthy Lady Eli right now."

OLCZYK LOOKS TO LIGHT LAMP WITH RAY'S THE BAR

Former professional hockey player turned television commentator Eddie Olczyk will be doing double duty at the Breeders' Cup Friday. Perhaps most visibly, he'll be part of the NBC Sports team covering the first day of championship

weekend from Keeneland. But he'll take a break from his commenting duties to watch **Ray's the Bar (GB)** (Exceed and Excel {Aus}), a colt he co-owns, go postward in the GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile Turf.

"It's a thrill to be here and to be part of this," Olczyk said Thursday. "I got in on Tuesday and each day I've

been getting less and less sleep. And the excitement keeps building as I get all these texts and phone calls from my family and friends. It's very exciting."

Olczyk traces his love of racing back to his childhood growing up in Chicago.

"I was only 14, but I guess I looked older because they let me make a few bets," he recalled.

Olczyk has been in and out of the ownership game over the years. He campaigned the filly Diana O (Cutlass), named after his wife, who won her first two starts at Hawthorne in 1991 before being injured in that year's Pocahontas S.

When the urge to once again own racehorses struck, Olczyk was put in touch with bloodstock agent Pete Bradley. On behalf of Olczyk, Bradley purchased a son of Big Drama ([hip 471](#)) for \$60,000 out of this year's Fasig-Tipton Midlantic 2-Year-Olds sale. Now named Who's Your Drama, the gelding is in training with Todd Pletcher.

Bradley called Olczyk again with the opportunity to be a partner on a recent maiden winner at Ascot in July.

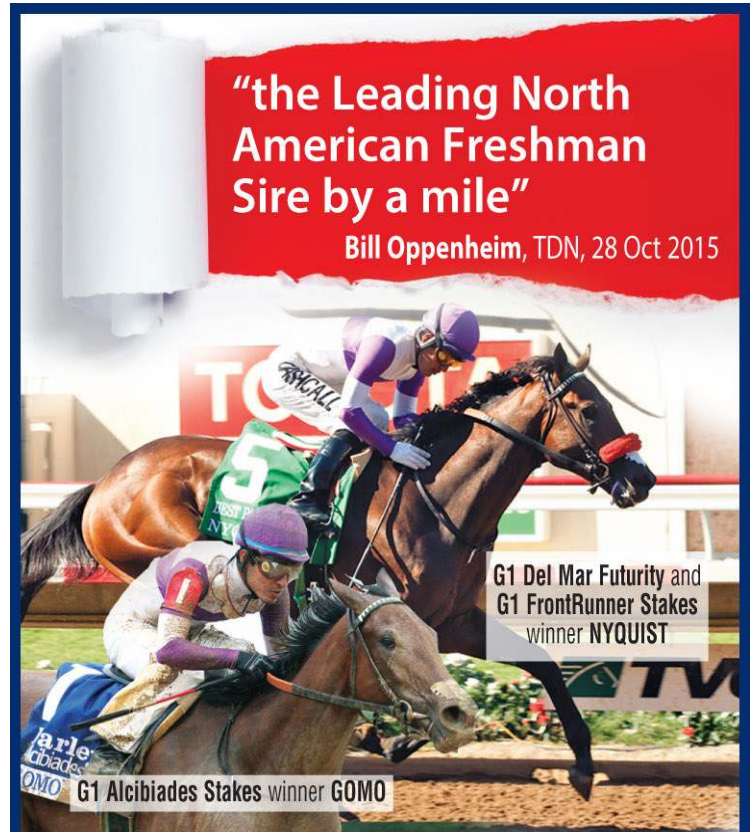
"Pete called me about this horse," Olczyk said. "I liked the pedigree and I watched the video of his race at Ascot and I liked that."

Ray's the Bar was transferred to the New York barn of trainer Chad Brown, who also conditions Bradley Thoroughbreds' imported stars Watsdachances (Ire) (Diamond Green {Fr}) and Dacita (Chi) (Scat Daddy). Brown had only had the colt just over a month when he was a strong-closing third behind fellow Breeders' Cup contenders Isotherm (Lonhro {Aus}) and Azar (Scat Daddy).

"I'm sure [the Breeders' Cup] was part of the plan when they bought him," Olczyk confirmed. "But the horse had to tell us he was ready and Chad had to tell us he was ready. He ran a great race in the Pilgrim and we think he will improve off that."

Olczyk's racing stable currently has two runners, but the commentator did not rule out adding more horses to the stable in the future.

"I like to pick my spots," he said. "So we'll see."

GLENEAGLES TESTS KEENELAND DIRT

Dual Guineas winner **Gleneagles (Ire)** (Galileo {Ire}) took to the Keeneland's main track for the first time Thursday in preparation for Saturday's GI Breeders' Cup Classic, which will be both the 3-year-old's dirt debut and career swan song.

The Classic will also be the first and only time Gleneagles races beyond a mile; he has been successful at that distance in this year's G1 Qipco 2000 Guineas, G1 Tattersalls Irish 2000 Guineas and G1 St James's Palace S., and he also won last year's Goffs Vincent O'Brien National S. over seven furlongs.

Joseph O'Brien, who partnered the bay in his exercise Thursday, said, "It's impossible to tell how he will handle the dirt, but what I would say is when he stretched his legs this morning, he was in very good form and moving well. The dirt is still a bit sloppy, but better than it was and they are saying there will not be much more in the way of rain."

O'Brien added, "My horse has a lot of pace; he's a good mover who travels and can quicken up and while it is a shot into the dark, he has a great constitution. I think we'll know after a couple of furlongs; if he's traveling and happy, he's in with a shout."

Gleneagles experienced an interrupted summer campaign, missing a handful of engagements due to soft ground, and was sixth off a four-month layoff in the G1 Queen Elizabeth II S. at Ascot Oct. 17.

PHAROAH MAKES FINE FIRST APPEARANCE

Two days after arriving and a day after walking the shedrow, Triple Crown hero **American Pharoah** (Pioneerof the Nile) made a much-anticipated first visit to the Keeneland frontside with a strong spin over the all-weather training track.

“We took him out to the training track because when we checked out the main track yesterday afternoon, it looked pretty wet still, and when it starts to dry out, it can get a little deep,” trainer Bob Baffert reasoned.

With his exercise rider Jorgie Alvarez in the irons, the Zayat homebred trained eagerly, pulling hard while appearing to be asking to do more. Baffert is confident that edge will have come

He didn't go very far. As long as he doesn't go very far like that, he's okay. He was a little fresh today because he didn't do anything yesterday. He won't be like that tomorrow. He'll be more relaxed.”

Unraced since a defeat at the hands of Classic aspirant Keen Ice (Curlin) in the GI Travers S. at Saratoga Aug. 29, American Pharoah has put on some weight in the two months since.

“The time off gave him the chance to get his strength back,” Baffert said of the colt, who weighs in at 1,195 pounds. “He's at his peak he's happy and he's doing really well. He's going to come out of there running.”

Thursday's defection of Beholder (Henny Hughes), who not only was supposed to be American Pharoah's chief market rival but was also expected to be the one to apply the pressure, theoretically should make life easier on the Baffert trainee. But nothing is being taken for granted.

“They still have to get the trip and we're hoping he gets a clean break, a clean trip and a good trip,” Baffert commented. “My job is to have him at peak performance. Then it's up to Victor Espinoza to play the break and decide what he's going to do with him. He has an idea because he's on the inside [post four], so there's not a lot of thinking going on there.

He continued, “The trip is going to be important...the pace, the trip. A lot of jockeys get excited and you don't know who is going to do what. I told Victor ‘Just ride your horse and don't worry about anyone else. Don't panic.’ I told him to keep him happy and stay in his groove. He can't worry about what's going on around him.”

S-'TEPIN' UP BIG TIME FOR MILE

The GI Breeders' Cup Mile has been won no fewer than eight times by females, albeit by just five horses that go by the names of Royal Heroine (Ire), Miesque, Ridgewood Pearl (Ire), Six Perfections (Fr) and legendary three-time winner Goldikova (Ire). Robert Masterson's **Tepin** (Bernstein) will need a herculean effort in order to join that elite group, but given her current form, it could be foolish to dismiss the possibility out of hand.

A \$140,000 Fasig-Tipton Saratoga yearling in 2012, Tepin was precocious enough to land the GIII Delta Princess S. on the main track at two, but has seen her career really take off since switching to the turf and particularly this season. The bay has

won four of her six trips to the post, and but for some truly horrible luck, could be undefeated. After dropping a nose decision to GI Filly/Mare Turf hopeful Hard Not to Like (Hard Spun) in the GI Diana S. at Saratoga July 25, she was beaten a head by the promising

F/M Turf-bound Dacita (Chi) (Scat Daddy) after looking home in the GII Ballston Spa S. Aug. 29.

Her last outing points her out as a potentially serious challenger in the Mile. Favored in the GI First Lady S. Oct. 3, Tepin overcame the 11 hole to sit a stalking trip and motored home in the lane to score by seven impressive lengths. **Cont. p12**

Trainer Mark Casse has been shut out with his 23 Breeders’ Cup starters to date and is trying not to put the horse before the cart, so to speak.

“I’d always thought that I need my horse to run the race of his or her life,” said the conditioner, who will saddle five horses over the course of the two days. “Now, from just doing my handicapping and going over everything, I just need them to run up to their ability. If they do, we’ll be right there. That’s a new one for me.”

Tepin is the first horse that longtime owner Robert Masterson has owned wholly by himself rather than in partnership, and she has been entered in the Fasig-Tipton November sale. Casse said that the indication from Masterson now is that as long as she remains healthy and happy she will remain in his barn and come back for her 5-year-old campaign.

WARD A TRIPLE THREAT IN TURF SPRINT

By any analysis, the 2014 Breeders’ Cup was a rousing success for trainer Wesley Ward.

After being bageled with his first 20 starters on championship weekend, the former jockey sent out six runners at Santa Anita and broke through on Breeders’ Cup Friday with Hootenanny (Quality Road)’s victory over stablemate Luck of the Kitten (Kitten’s Joy) in the GI Juvenile Turf. Judy the Beauty (Ghostzapper) doubled his total in the GI Filly & Mare Sprint and that number would have been three, but for an impossible mid-

track rally from Bobby’s Kitten (Kitten’s Joy) to tag the Ward-trained duo of No Nay Never (Scat Daddy) and **Undrafted** (Purim) in the GI Turf Sprint. The former now stands at Coolmore Stud in Ireland but Undrafted makes

a return trip for the shortest race of the Breeders’ Cup meeting Saturday. He will be joined in the gate by fellow Ward trainees **Green Mask** (Mizzen Mast) and **The Great War** (War Front), and the styles of each horse complements the others.

“I wish I had No Nay Never,” Ward quipped. “He was a turf monster, but these three are all doing well. I think they’ll be tiered off. Green Mask will be mid-pack, The Great War will be more forwardly placed and Undrafted will be flying from behind.” **Cont. p13**

Ward a Triple Threat in Turf Sprint cont.

Green Mask has just one win in his six tries on the grass, a victory in the Paradise Creek S. while under the care of Christophe Clement. He was runner-up in turf sprint stakes in his first two appearances for Ward over the winter before a bang-up third in the G1 Al Quoz Sprint at Meydan Mar. 28. In his one run since, the dark bay was fourth in a blanket finish in the Sept. 14 Kentucky Downs Turf Dash.

Undrafted also has overseas form, having sprung a 14-1 surprise over top Aussie sprinter Brazen Beau (Aus) (I Am Invincible {Aus}) in the G1 Diamond Jubilee S. June 20. He too has made one start since, a useful runner-up effort behind Tourist (Tiznow) in the one-mile Sept. 5 More Than Ready S. at the Tennessee-border venue.

The Great War, a \$1-million acquisition at the 2013 Keeneland September sale, was a respectable fourth to Texas Red (Afleet Alex) in last year's Juvenile, but has made his last two starts on the turf and was most recently a close third in the GII Nearctic S. at Woodbine Oct. 18.

'SOFT' SPOT FOR THIS DAN

Two-time Horse of the Year Wise Dan (Wiseman's Ferry) won't be too far away from Keeneland during this weekend's Breeders' Cup meeting, but there is another 'Dan'-imal among the entries--Argentina's **Ordak Dan (Arg)** (Hidden Truth).

Conditioned by one of the country's leading trainers Juan Carlos Etchechoury, the 7-year-old earned his spot in Saturday's GI Breeders' Cup Turf via a second victory in three years in the 'Win and You're In' G1 Gran Premio 25 de Mayo at San Isidro Racetrack in Buenos Aires ([video](#)). While that success came over firm turf, his 18-1 upset of the same race in 2013 was achieved over ground listed as heavy, with a final time of 2:29.34 for the 2400 meters ([video](#)).

Ordak Dan, who has trained well over the Keeneland main track, stretched his legs over the turf course Thursday morning beneath exercise rider Richard Castillo. Castillo is an assistant to trainer Ignacio Correas, who has been overseeing things ahead of Etchechoury's arrival in the States.

"He really, really liked the soft turf," Castillo commented. "He moved on it really, really smooth. From what the groom in Argentina tells me, he does really well on the soft turf. It should dry some, but from the rain we've had, it should stay a little bit soft. He's doing good, he's feeling good. As of right now, all systems go."

FRIVOLOUS, 'LONGSHOT' GO HAND IN HAND

When G. Watts Humphrey Jr.'s **Frivolous** (Empire Maker) defeated 2014 GI Breeders' Cup Distaff runner-up Don't Tell Sophia (Congaree), in last year's GII Falls City H. at Churchill Downs, she returned a handsome \$40.80 to those who kept the faith despite a six-race losing streak heading into that event. When the 5-year-old took down the colors of **Sheer Drama** (Burning Roma) in this year's GII Fleur de Lis H. in Louisville, she kicked back a win mutuel in excess of \$66. So, if you were worried that Frivolous is pegged at morning-line odds of 30-1 for Friday's Distaff, you may want to think again.

In the absence of Beholder (Henny Hughes), who was entered in the Distaff, but was always an intended runner in the Classic, a full field will face the starter for the first time since 2006 at Churchill Downs. Trainer Vicki Oliver, who will saddle just her second Breeders' Cup starter, believes Frivolous can adapt to any race shape.

"It does look like there's a lot of speed in the race," Oliver said. "Sometimes she breaks really good, and sometimes she doesn't. It depends on how she breaks on where she'll be sitting. She usually likes to be close, stalking, but she has won from off of the pace as well.

She added, "We're just going to have to see how it unfolds. If we get boxed in on the rail, that's when we have to work to get her out on the backside. She's such a big filly and definitely not [highly maneuverable]."

Runner-up to Sheer Drama after setting the pace in the GI Delaware H. going 10 furlongs July 18, Frivolous landed the Sept. 12 Locust Grove S. by eight lengths, but was a somewhat disappointing fourth behind **Got Lucky** (A.P. Indy) in the GI Juddmonte Spinster S. over the Distaff course and distance Oct. 4.

REGIS DISPERSAL COULD SHAKE THINGS UP AT KEENOV *by Brian DiDonato*

Nat Rea of Regis Farms has been a major player at the top end of the bloodstock market since 2012, but the founder of auto parts company Martinrea International announced last month that he was getting out of the horse business to pursue opportunities in oil. As a result, Regis will sell all of its stock--41 horses, including 15 broodmares, seven weanlings and 19 horses of racing age--at next week's Keeneland November Sale. All offerings, consigned by Three Chimneys Farm, will sell without a reserve.

"It's an outstanding group of horses with high-quality pedigrees, physicals to match, and current updates on the racetrack," Three Chimneys Chief Commercial Officer Case Clay said.

When asked how interest has been for the Regis offerings so far, Clay replied, "There has been a lot of interest. We have received many phone calls and we're seeing a lot of traffic to Keeneland's [microsite](#), which is mobile friendly and includes photos, walking videos, pedigrees, updates and past performances of the dispersal horses. With updates happening in real time, it's easy for people to watch a walking video of **Tapas** (Tapit) ([hip 217](#)), for example, who is the half-sister to

graded winner and dam of New Year's Day (Street Cry {Ire}), Justwhistledixie (Dixie Union), and see the update that Justwhistledixie's 2-year-old Tapit colt Mohaymen ran an 87 Beyer first time out for Shadwell."

Another daughter of Tapit is among the dispersal's biggest draws. **'TDN Rising Star' Shook Up**

(Tapit), consigned as [hip 184](#), was second in both the GI Kentucky Oaks and GII Fair Grounds Oaks this season. The daughter of GISW Sugar Shake

(Awesome Again) will be offered

strictly as a broodmare prospect, contrary to the catalogue.

"She is paddock sound now, but is continuing to heal from a leg wound she absorbed during the GI Acorn S. when another filly stepped on her from behind," Clay revealed. "[Trainer] Steve Asmussen said she was a tremendously talented filly, and being by Tapit out of a Grade I winner, she'll make a great broodmare for somebody." **Cont. p16**

Regis Dispersal Could Shake Things Up at KEENOV cont.

Another Regis broodmare who was already among the consignment’s most appealing lots got a very timely update earlier this month. **Sealy Hill** (Point Given)’s Belle Hill (Sky Mesa), a multiple stakes winner on the dirt at Emerald Downs, took to the turf and handled the step up in class to annex Santa Anita’s GIII Autumn Miss S. Oct. 17. Sealy Hill ([hip 176](#)), Horse of the Year, multiple champion and Triple Tiara winner in Rea’s native Canada, nearly blew up the tote when a narrow second at 48-1 in the 2008 GI Breeders’ Cup Filly and Mare Turf. Rea acquired the Eugene Melnyk colorbearer for \$590,000 at the 2013 Fasig-Tipton February sale. Sealy Hill, who is also responsible for Canada’s champion female sprinter and Grade II winner Hillaby (Distorted Humor), sells in foal to Medaglia d’Oro. Her Tiznow weanling filly will follow her into the ring as [hip 177](#).

“[Belle Hill’s Autumn Miss win] was good timing, but more importantly, it puts Sealy Hill in that elite broodmare category,”

said Clay. “From just four foals of racing age, two are already graded stakes winners, one being a champion in Canada. There are not many around who have foaled two graded stakes winners so early in their

production record. And Sealy Hill’s record as a commercial producer is impressive also--she’s had two \$500,000 progeny sales to date, and counting.”

Sealy Hill’s Distorted Humor daughter True Elegance brought \$500,000 from Dixiana Farms at last year’s Keeneland September sale, while Hillaby went for the same amount to Stonestreet Stables as part of the Melnyk Dispersal at the 2014 Fasig-Tipton July sale.

Among the Regis horses of racing age is another ‘**TDN Rising Star**’ in 3-year-old colt **Donworth** (Tiznow) ([hip 3324](#)), who was last seen taking Delaware’s rained-off Stanton S. by 11 lengths with a 95 Beyer Speed Figure June 20. The Graham Motion trainee was also second in Keeneland’s GIII Coolmore Lexington S. Apr. 11. **Seduire** (Elusive Quality), winner of the GII Santa Ynez S. for Jerry Hollendorfer in January sells as [hip 178](#), while MSW and GSP Zindaya (More Than Ready)--a half-sister to GISW Western Aristocrat (Mr. Greeley)--goes as [hip 239](#).

There are also some well-pedigreed individuals who have not yet raced. **Cont. p17**

“There are a few hidden gems in this group as well, including unraced 3-year-old **Bijou** (Street Sense), the half-sister to [GISW] Cry and Catch Me (Street Cry {Ire}) and European champion Certify (Elusive

Quality) who was a \$1.45-million [KEENOV] weanling and is coming off a minor layoff-- she is gorgeous. She is one to keep your eye out for since she is [hip 7](#),” Clay said.

“Additionally, there is the unraced, but ready to run 2-year-old **Royal Obsession** (Tapit) ([hip 762](#)), who was a \$1-million Saratoga yearling purchase--she has breezed five furlongs several times under the care of Steve Asmussen--he really thinks a lot of her.”

When Rea announced he was dispersing, he said that the staff of his Kentucky farm staff would remain employed as part of the deal. Clay offered more details on that part of the story.

“Three Chimneys did not purchase the farm, but it was purchased by a good friend of [Three Chimneys Chairman] Gonçalo Torrealba’s, who renamed it Bonne Chance Farm--they were active at the September sales,” Clay revealed.

“Gonçalo facilitated that purchase by putting those parties together, and as part of the deal, the entire team at Regis Farms was retained by Bonne Chance Farm with Kieran Lalor as General Manager. It was a win-win for both parties, because Mr. Rea was clear that he wanted to take care of his employees and Bonne Chance Farm got a ‘ready made’ farm, complete with a team in place. Three Chimneys is acting as agent for all of the remaining Regis bloodstock, and it’s as simple as that.”

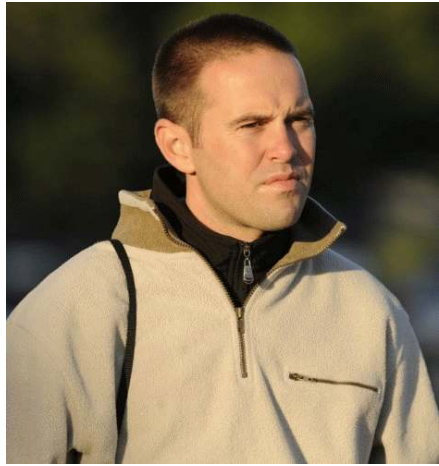

GRASS PROVES GREENER FOR BROWN

Chad Brown may be the most unusual trainer the sport has ever seen. Fair or not, his reputation is that he is a jack of one trade, but a very good one. He is widely considered the best turf trainer in America and his success on the grass is remarkable. He

pre-entered 13 horses in the Breeders' Cup, more than any other trainer, and 12 of them were meant for grass races. He's been so dominant in top level turf races this year that his stable has made \$15.9 million, second behind only Todd Pletcher's \$21.7 million.

It's been a successful formula. When European owners want to send their grass horses to race

on the east coast of the U.S. they almost always think of Brown first. When U.S. owners have a well-bred horse with a turf pedigree, Brown usually tops their list.

He'll come into the Breeders' Cup with 26 graded stakes wins on the year, 23 of them on the turf.

His turf runners have made \$12.3 million this year and no other trainer comes remotely close. By way of comparison, Pletcher's turf runners have made \$5.2 million.

"My clients send me horses meant to run on turf and we get the most out of them and we're proud of that, not disappointed in that in any regard," Brown said. "We have won lots of big races on turf, particularly this year, and that has put us second in the country in money earned with over \$15 million and the money you earn on turf versus dirt is no different."

He'll have two starters in the Juvenile Turf, two in the Juvenile Fillies Turf, one in the Filly & Mare Turf Sprint, three in the Filly & Mare Turf and three in the Turf. He's won five Breeders' Cup races, all of them on the turf.

Brown's only dirt starter this year is Wavell Avenue in the Filly & Mare Sprint.

He could easily come away with three or four wins, but even that would be a mixed blessing. Brown has developed a reputation as someone who excels on the grass and he can count on getting dozens of top grass horses to train each year, the type of horses that will put \$15 million or more in his stable's bank account. But he's also been typecast and owners are obviously reluctant to send him dirt horses. **Cont. p19**

Grass Proves Greener for Brown cont.

That's holding Brown back from ascending to the next level. When people think of the sport's top trainers they start with Todd Pletcher and Bob Baffert and Brown might come in fifth or sixth. That's because others win with dirt horses, particularly high-class 3-year-old males who travel the Triple Crown trail. Those are the horses that bring you the most acclaim, not winners of the Sheepshead Bay Handicap or the Ballston Spa.

It's also not fair to Brown.

There are likely owners out there who believe Brown can't win on the dirt, the only reason they would send him their good grass and send someone else their top dirt runners. Throughout his career, which only goes back to 2007, the former assistant to Bobby Frankel has won with 26% of his grass starters and 25% of his dirt runners. His in-the-money percentage on the dirt is 43%, actually a bit higher than the 41% rate he's achieved on turf.

"Thank you," Brown said, when those numbers were read back to him, a sign that he's appreciative at least one person realizes he's not incapable of winning with dirt horses.

"Not really," he said when asked if it bothered him that he didn't get more opportunities with dirt horses. "We know, my staff and I, what our abilities are with dirt horses. Like you pointed out, our win percentages and in-the-money percentages are almost identical on the two surfaces, so it's proof that it comes down to horses you are sent."

The problem is, most of his dirt horses, while winners, haven't broken through in top level stakes. He's had just one Kentucky Derby starter, Normandy Invasion, who finished fourth in 2013.

"We would like to participate in the Triple Crown every year; that's definitely a goal of ours," he said. "I think we have a really good group currently and I see some possible candidates for next year. Every year you hope your horses develop and you get there and I am very confident we will. Normandy Invasion gave us a pretty good run in the Derby, and for a moment it looked like he could win. Something like that drives you to get back there. Time will tell."

As well as Brown is doing he figures to do all that much better if he can ever shake the stereotype that he is a turf only trainer. Add seven or eight top dirt horses to his barn and his career will explode; he could easily eclipse Pletcher as the sport's top trainer. He's that talented.

That brings us back to Wavell Avenue, his starter in the Filly & Mare Sprint. She doesn't look that good on paper as she's never so much as won a stakes race. But a victory by her could be a watershed moment in the career of Chad Brown. She gives him an opportunity to make a statement, that he's a lot more than a one-trick pony.

In an effort to help lure young, talented journalists into the field of horse racing, American Pharoah's owner Ahmed Zayat has donated \$100,000 to the National Turf Writers and Broadcasters Association. Zayat said he believed having a large and active media contingent following the sport is vital to its

Zayat said he will let the turf writers decide how to put the money to the best use.

"It was a spur-of-the-moment thing so it has not been totally flushed out," he said. "I will leave it up to the turf writers to decide what is the best way to take on this

challenge. I will donate \$100,000. I envision it could be divided among five people at \$20,000 each. I want to help this endeavor and take it to a different level. It's part of giving back to a sport that I am proud to be a part of."

"I believe the press and the turf writers are an integral part of the industry," he said. "The sport is not just about horsemen, owners, horses. These are the people that tell the stories, and it's not just about you entering a horse somewhere or some horse running in some race or some horse being injured. It's not just simple reporting. There's more to it than that. There are important and interesting sub stories that need to be told.

"People have mentioned to me how special Joe Hirsch was and how he was a mentor to so many people. I never had the pleasure of knowing him or meeting him. I felt it was appropriate we support an effort where we can bring in the young talent and give them a chance to be mentored and brought into the sport, either under formal training or through scholarships. Maybe we are talking about internships or scholarships, or helping someone get a master's in journalism."

Zayat said he has not made any commitments beyond the initial pledge of \$100,000, but said if he believes his project is producing positive results he will consider making annual donations.

BRAZEN BEAU TO SHUTTLE TO BRITAIN

Australian sprint champion **Brazen Beau (Aus)** (I Am Invincible {Aus}), who is currently covering his first book at Darley's Kelvinside Stud in Australia, will be one of four new reverse-shuttlers to Darley's European studs for the 2016 breeding season. Brazen Beau was a two-time Group 1 winner Down Under, taking the G1 Coolmore Stud S. followed by the G1 Newmarket H. against elders before finishing a hard-luck second in the G1 Diamond Jubilee S. at Royal Ascot.

Fellow first-year sires **Hallowed Crown (Aus)** (Street Sense) and **Shooting To Win (Aus)** (Northern Meteor {Aus}) will reverse-shuttle to Darley's Kildangan Stud in Ireland. Hallowed Crown was a dual Group 1 winner at three, while Shooting To Win was a Group 1-winning miler.

Traveling to Haras du Logis in France will be first-year sire **Sidestep (Aus)** (Exceed and Excel {Aus}), a dual Group 2 winner who was also second in the G1 Golden Slipper, the world's richest 2-year-old race.

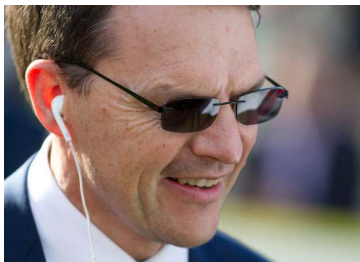


AMERICANS GAINING ON JUVENILE TURF FORM

From a European perspective, the more important races of the four that make up Breeders' Cup Friday are the GI Juvenile Turf and the GI Juvenile Fillies Turf.

It's not surprising that visitors have a great record in these two races, but the interesting angle is that the home defence is arguably getting better. We have seen at Royal Ascot how dominant Wesley Ward-trained runners can be, and the elevation of the two races featured here to Grade I status may have inspired one or two more talented youngsters to have their attention focused away from dirt.

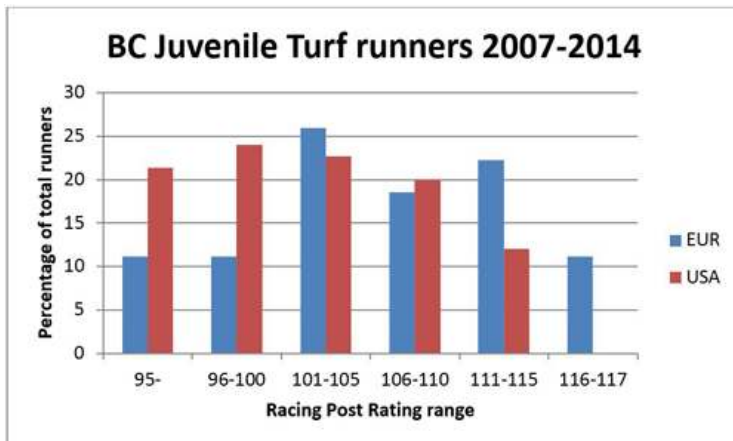
The colts' race became a Grade I in 2011. The first three renewals duly went to Europe via the Aidan O'Brien-trained pair Wrote (High Chaparral {Ire}) (2011) and George Vancouver

(Henrythenavigator) (2012) and Godolphin's Outstrip (GB) (Exceed And Excel {Aus}) (2013). That made it five wins in the seven years since the Juvenile Turf was born, first as an ungraded stake (2007-2008) then as an erstwhile Grade II (2009-2010).

The superior class of European runners can be seen from the chart underneath, which summarises the performance of 102 finishers in the Juvenile Turf (one runner slipped up) since its inception, conditioned by the location of the trainer. (For these purposes, the U.S. category includes Canada). The taller blue bars to the right of the chart (and taller red bars to the left) show that runners from Europe have tended to produce the higher Racing Post Ratings in this event:



There were, however, underlying signs of US improvement. In 2012 and 2013, for instance, three Chad Brown-trained colts reached the placings behind solid overseas winners, running Racing Post Ratings (RPR) in the 112-114 range, which is good enough to win a Group 2 in Europe.

Meanwhile, the domestic distaffers were already doing their bit. Before the Juvenile Fillies Turf made its Grade I debut in 2012, the prize had remained at home every year since inception in 2008. The best of this quartet was the Dale Romans-trained Tapitsfly (Tapit) (2009), who went on to win two Grade Is as a 5-year-old for owner-breeder Frank Jones.

Then, last year, both the Juvenile Turf and the Juvenile Fillies Turf fell to US-trained runners for the first time since their Grade I era began (US-trained runners also won both races at Grade II level in 2010). And no ordinary horses either: the still-unbeaten Lady Eli (Divine Park) ran away with the female version, looking a match for any of her sex on the planet. The colt Hootenanny (Quality Road), earlier a commanding victor of the Listed Windsor Castle S. at Royal Ascot for Ward, somehow stretched his speed to a mile. Moreover, he led a sweep of the placings for America, followed home by Luck Of The Kitten (Kitten's Joy) and Daddy D T (Scat Daddy).

The European horses who travel to Keeneland in the division this time will nevertheless take plenty of beating. The four challengers for the Juvenile Turf--**Hit It A Bomb** (War Front), **Cymric** (Kitten's Joy), **Shogun (Ire)** (Fastnet Rock {Aus}) and **Birchwood (Ire)** (Dark Angel {Ire})--make up a formidable team. And, while the Juvenile Fillies Turf includes only a trio of raiders, **Alice Springs (Ire)** (Galileo {Ire}), **Illuminate (Ire)** (Zoffany {Ire}) and **Nemoralia** (More Than Ready) also constitute a very solid offensive.

Hit It A Bomb will be a strong bet-against for some U.S. handicappers. Winner of only a maiden at The Curragh (grass) and a listed race at Dundalk (Polytrack), he is accompanied by much hype, which is often a warning sign. The way horses are most commonly rated in Europe, however, he scores heavily in terms of so-called collateral form and also looks the part.

That's not the case for Cymric, who earned an RPR only a length short of the par to win the Juvenile Turf when nipped in the GI Grand Criterium at Longchamp on Arc day. Fourth-placed Johannes Vermeer (Galileo {Ire}), a stablemate to both Hit It A Bomb and Shogun, has flattered the contest with a good second in the G1 Racing Post Trophy. **Cont. p26**

Furthermore, Cymric lost ground and should probably have won; he appears right where John Gosden wants him for this, in an attempt to provide his trainer with a third win--though first at Grade I level--after Donativum (Cadeaux Genereux {GB}) (2008) and Pounced (Rahy) (2009).

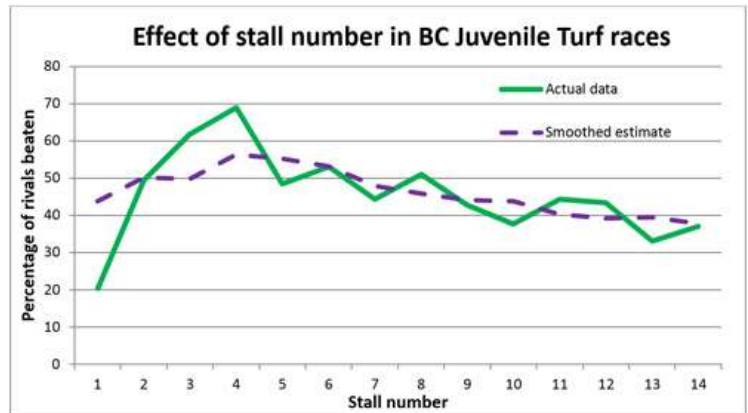
Cymric's owner, Godolphin, also sends Birchwood, trained in the North of England by Richard Fahey. A Group 2 winner in the summer, he has since had his limitations exposed, though he did run a sound race when third to wonder horse Air Force Blue (War Front) in the G1 Goffs Vincent O'Brien National S. at The Curragh.

O'Brien's Shogun was four places and a length and a half behind Cymric at Longchamp, but he was noted running on well and is better drawn here, breaking from stall four rather than his rival's 13. Note that Hit It A Bomb is even more poorly housed in 14, another reason to doubt the latter.

A summary of results in both juvenile events conditioned by the draw is expressed by the chart. The effective metric %RB is 'percentage of rivals beaten,' which uses much more information than merely tallying wins and places from each stall.

The effect is the same seen in many events round a turn in turf racing globally, irrespective of the location of the track. Horses breaking from inside stalls have to negotiate more traffic and a stall number very low can be as bad as the far outside.

But the realized effect of the draw depends to a large extent on the pace scenario.



On balance, Cymric looks the best proposition of the Euros in the Juvenile Turf, though the Gill Bourbon S. one-two **Airoforce** (Colonel John) and **Camelot Kitten** (Kitten's Joy) are on top of my ticket, with Cymric and Shogun underneath.

O'Brien sends Alice Springs for the Juvenile Fillies, but don't be deceived by her romp last time at Newmarket, which came against lesser rivals in a richly endowed contest for sales graduates. Illuminate, trained by Richard Hannon Jr, is the better filly on form, judged by her close second to my favorite juvenile Lumiere (Ire) (Shamardal) in the GI Cheveley Park S. **Cont. p27**

That was her first race for over two months and it figures not to be lost on her. If she can handle two more furlongs here, she deserves to be the top choice.

Nemoralia, who is a useful foil for the more credentialed European-trained challengers, has already run second to Nickname (Scat Daddy) in the GI Frizette S. and could go well for trainer Jeremy Noseda, who saddled Wilko (Awesome Again) to win the Juvenile on dirt at Lone Star Park in 2004.

It will be fascinating to see the intercontinental clash that the Juvenile Fillies serves up here. Home runners **Catch A Glimpse** (City Zip) and **Harmonize** (Scat Daddy) are definitely good fillies for trainers Mark Casse and Bill Mott, respectively.

PRICE RUNNER FAVORED IN DERBY

Trainer Mick Price is no stranger to big-race success, having handled the likes of Lankan Rupee (Aus) (Redoute’s Choice {Aus}) and Samaready (Aus) (More Than Ready) in recent years, and the Caulfield-based trainer looks to heavy favorite **Tarzino (NZ)** (Tavistock {NZ}) to become his latest star in the G1 AAMI Victoria Derby, the feature of the opening-day card of the Melbourne Cup Carnival. Tarzino--who, like last year’s Derby

winner Preferment (NZ) (Zabeel {NZ}) was bred in New Zealand and has Zabeel as his damsire--has shown more spark with each step-up in distance. He won a mile handicap at Caulfield Sept. 19 and was seventh, beaten four lengths, in the G1 Caulfield Guineas over that

trip Oct. 10 before finishing fast to be third in the 2040-meter G2 Moonee Valley Vase last weekend. Tarzino will exit from barrier 10, so he fared much better in the draw than last-out Geelong Classic winner **Extra Choice (NZ)** (Redoute’s Choice {Aus}), who will have to contend with gate 17. Godolphin’s **Shards (Aus)** (Medaglia d’Oro) finished one slot ahead of Tarzino in the Moonee Valley Vase and he will exit one gate to the outside of that rival Saturday. Shards opened his season with a score in the G3 Up And Coming S. Aug. 22 and appears to be looking for this extended trip.

Second choice in the betting at 8-1 is **Kia Ora Koutou (Aus)** (Blackfriars {Aus}), who looks to become the second Western Australian shipper to win this contest. The Adam Durrant charge is unbeaten in four outings and most recently won a 2200-meter benchmark race at Belmont Park Oct. 3, so takes a marked step up in class here. Also fancied is the locally trained **Get The Picture (Aus)** (Excellent Art {GB}). The Stuart Webb trainee has finished out of the top two just once, and that was when he was fourth in the G3 Caulfield Classic Oct. 17, but he has finished fast from well out of it in his last two starts and appears one that will like the distance.

Opie Bosson takes the ride with stable jockey James McDonald on **Contributer (Ire)** (High Chaparral {Ire}), who seeks his first win since the G1 Ranvet S. in March.

Also going to post are a pair of reliable geldings bred by Mill Park Stud in **Fawkner (Aus)** (Reset {Aus}) and **Happy Trails (Aus)** (Good Journey), the latter of which won this last year. The former recorded his third Group 1 score over this track in the one-mile G1 Makybe Diva S. Sept. 12 and just missed when second in the G1 Underwood S. two weeks later. He checked in a soundly beaten sixth in both the G1 Caulfield S. and G1 Cox Plate, and will have to navigate from a wide barrier here in 15. Happy Trails fared better at the draw, landing in gate six. The 8-year-old showed signs of youth when finishing second in the Caulfield S. Oct. 10 and settled for 10th in the Cox Plate before taking this contest.

Stratum Star (Aus) (Stratum {Aus}) is another who has shown consistency over the last year, having finished off the board just once in 16 outings. The 4-year-old entire won the G1 Sir Rupert Clarke S. over 1400 meters at Caulfield Sept. 26 and took the G3 David Jones Cup when stepped up to this trip in his most recent outing Oct. 17.

Magic Artist (Ire) (Iffraaj {GB}) makes his first start Down Under for last year's Melbourne Cup-winning trainer Andrea Wohler, and the 4-year-old finished fifth, while not disgraced either time, in Belmont's GI Manhattan H. June 6 and Munich's G1 Grosser Dallmayr-Preis Bayerisches July 26.

Farm Sept. 23 before finishing second to **Keen Array (Aus)** (Bel Esprit {Aus}) on stakes debut in the Listed Blue Sapphire S. Oct. 14. CLASSIC SHOT FOR GUINEAS WINNER

While no 3-year-old filly has ever won the G1 Myer Classic against older mares, few have tried, so the last-out G1 Thousand Guineas scorer **Stay With Me (Aus)** (Street Cry {Ire}) will attempt to write a new chapter in the history of the race Saturday. The daughter of the classy Miss Finland (Aus) (Redoute's Choice {Aus}) is three for four this season and was much the best in the Oct. 10 Thousand Guineas, so is sent here as the favorite and will carry up to 17 fewer pounds than her rivals. She will have a tall task, however, seeing off **Royal Descent (Aus)** (Redoute's Choice {Aus}), who rarely runs off the board but looks to bounce back from a last-place finish in the G1 Caulfield Cup Oct. 17. The 6-year-old has won just once at the highest level, in the 2013 Australian Oaks, but has been placed in Group 1 company eight times since. In her two outings prior to the Caulfield Cup, she was second in both the G1 George Main S. and G1 Turnbull S. **May's Dream (Aus)** (New Approach {Ire}) has not won since taking the G1 Australasian Oaks last April, but the 5-year-old appears to be rounding back into top form, having finished a narrowly beaten third in the G2 Let's Elope S. Sept. 12 and second to **Fenway (Aus)** (High Chaparral {Ire}) the G2 Stocks S. Oct. 2. One who appears to be rounding into her best form is 5-year-old **La Passe (Aus)** (Street Sense), who has won three from five this season. She earned her first black-type score in the G2 Blazer S. over this course Oct. 4, and added Caulfield's G2 Tristar S. two weeks later. The lightly raced 4-year-old **Azkadellia (NZ)** (Shinko King {Ire}) arrived on domestic shores a year ago after breaking her maiden in her native country and has since finished out of the top two just once in seven starts. She enters this off a second in the G3 G1x.com.au S. over a mile at Moonee Valley Oct. 24.

RTCA HONORS BASSETT

The Race Track Chaplaincy of America honored former Keeneland and Breeders' Cup president James 'Ted' Bassett, III with its Horace W. "Salty" Roberts Founder's Award during the 13th annual White Horse Awards Luncheon held Thursday at the Campbell House in Lexington.

WinStar CEO and President Elliott Walden presented the event's keynote speech, focusing on the call to provide much-needed emotional support to each other. He recognized the service of race track chaplains, who unwaveringly answer the call to provide much needed emotional and physical assistance to the backstretch community.

Quoting the Book of Isaiah and the prophet's response of "Send Me," to the call to serve, Walden explained, "That is what the chaplains do. Whatever it takes. However long it takes. They are selfless."

Walden also recognized Ahmed and Justin Zayat, presenting the owners of American Pharoah with a painting.

"They have been great ambassadors and have done a great job of sharing American Pharoah with everyone," Walden said before adding, "I'm just the dumb guy who didn't get him to stand at WinStar."

Accepting the founder's award, Bassett said, "I want to tell you how honored I am to be a part of the racetrack chaplaincy."

Bassett paid tribute to the 83-year-old Roberts, founder of the RTCA, who was forced to miss the ceremony.

"In all these years, I have never met anyone who was more committed and dedicated to the cause than Salty," he said. "And this award is Salty Roberts's award because it really should be awarded to the person who really took a stand for the Race Track Chaplaincy of America."

Bassett continued, "The chaplaincy through the years, and particularly in its early years, served as a bridge from the front side to the backside, creating a greater understanding about the need to provide service to the backbone of our industry."

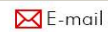
Also honored during Thursday's luncheon was equine artist Robert Clark, who received the organization's community service award, and Patsy Payne was honored posthumously with the Tribute to Excellence award.

Erick Najduch, an outrider at Los Alamitos, was given the 2015 White Horse Award to recognize his actions which saved the life of a 2-year-old quarter horse who broke loose and became trapped in the track's infield lake in 2014. Najduch dedicated the award to unsung outriders across the country.

"When you show up at work in the morning, you just pray for boring," Najduch said of an outrider's job. "You just hope that everything goes smoothly and no one gets hurt and there are no incidents. Unfortunately, it doesn't always work that way. This award is a testament to all those men and women out there

every day doing that job because they really are heroes every day. They are not recognized. So this award isn't about what happened that evening, it's about what these men and women show up every day to do. They are unsung. So to me this award is a testament to the outriders throughout the country. Because without them, we don't have racing."

Among the industry insiders in attendance at the Campbell House were Ben Walden, Brereton Jones, Craig Fravel, Walt Robertson, Corey Johnson and James Keogh.



NEGOTIATIONS ONGOING AS PENN

SHUTDOWN LOOMS by T.D. Thornton

As a Friday deadline loomed for the issuance of a "cease operations in 30 days" notice for the out-of-money Pennsylvania Horse Racing Commission, horsemen, racetrack operators and government officials continued to negotiate a budget workaround that would prevent the end of racing at the state's six Thoroughbred and Standardbred tracks.

On Oct. 22, Gov. Tom Wolf's administration threatened to pull the plug on the industry because the state is currently operating without a budget, and the accompanying legislative gridlock has prevented a transfer of money into the under-funded racing commission. The PHRC's administrative and drug-testing costs are about \$20 million annually and the current shortfall for this year is roughly \$6.5 million.

Salvatore DeBunda, president of the Pennsylvania Thoroughbred Horsemen's Association, said in-person meetings and phone conferences among stakeholders have been ongoing since Tuesday in an attempt to present a plan that would shift costs off the state and--at least partially--onto horsemen and the tracks.

"Proposals were made by the Department of Agriculture with the support of the legislature and the governor's office about how we might bundle some things that would get this resolved," DeBunda said.

He spoke to *TDN* just before entering into a late-day teleconference on Thursday that was supposed to shore up the plan that will be presented to state officials.

DeBunda said he could not cite a ballpark dollar amount that horsemen might have to commit to until the agreed-upon plan is more fully hashed out.

"There is no way to do that," DeBunda said. "What's being [proposed] is both a restructuring of the operation of the racing commission; having the horsemen consider paying some [future] expenses directly instead of out of the [gaming revenue] racing fund, and then how the question of how the deal would [address] the anticipated deficit this year. But until it's resolved, I don't think I could give you an idea of what those numbers would be." *cont. p2*

DeBunda outlined the three likeliest outcomes of this week's negotiations.

"One would be that they find this acceptable enough to withdraw the threat," he said. "Two, they might feel that some tweaking is necessary and decide to maybe extend for a week while we work that out. And three may be a total rejection. I'm not predicting which one, but those are the three possibilities as I see it."

DeBunda said he believed a key point in convincing the state not to shut down racing is an effort among stakeholders to not just come up with a band-aid fix.

"What we're proposing is a long-term solution. That's what we're discussing, so that we wouldn't have this problem every year," DeBunda said. "We're prepared to take steps for [a shutdown] if it happens, but we're not gearing up for it because we're hoping that we'll either resolve it or get more time to resolve it." -@thorntontd

TATTERSALLS AUTUMN WRAPS UP IN NEWMARKET

The Tattersalls Autumn Horses-in-Training sale wrapped up its four-day stand in Newmarket Thursday with statistics taking an overall dive. A total of 1,038 horses found new homes for an aggregate of 20,344,550gns, compared to 922 sold for 24,304,100gns last year. The buyback rate climbed slightly to 14.9%; the average dropped 26% to 19,600gns; and the median was down 23% to 13,000gns. The session's figures were also down compared to last year's fourth day: with nearly 100 more horses through the ring, but buyback rate was up seven points to 18.3%, the average was down 21% to 5,462gns and the median fell 11 points to 4,000gns.

"Year after year, the Tattersalls Autumn Horses in Training Sale attracts a cosmopolitan cast of buyers, and 2015 has proved to be no different, with representatives from more than 40

countries finding their way to Park Paddocks," said Tattersalls Chairman Edmond Mahony. "This year's sale featured a record number of lots offered and with the clearance rate of 85% holding up remarkably well, it has resulted in a record number of lots sold for this fixture. However, whilst demand from buyers from

Australia, Hong Kong, Dubai and Qatar remained high, it would be fair to say that the quality of horse on offer in the catalogue is below that of previous years. That said, demand at the top remained buoyant with two lots selling for 400,000 guineas or more, a number not bettered for a decade."

Thursday's top lot was **1637**, the 3-year-old **Dalamar (GB)** (Montjeu {Ire}), a half-sister to stakes winner Dalkova (GB) (Galileo {Ire}) and from the prolific Aga Khan family of Group 1 winners like Darshaan (GB) (Shirley Heights {GB}), Dar Re Mi (GB) (Singspiel {Ire}) and Rewilding (GB) (Tiger Hill {Ire}). The bay was consigned by trainer Rae Guest for owner Andrew Tinkler and was purchased by agent Tina Rau for 45,000gns for 14-year-old Moa Sundstrom. **cont. p10**

The average was down 7% to 3,711gns, while the median increased 9% to 2,500gns. The buyback rate was 42.6%, compared to 25.8% last year. A pair of lots sold for 10,000gns to top the table: [2113](#), an Equiano (Fr) colt picked up by Mick Appleby, and [2171](#), a Harbour Watch (Ire) filly bought by David Simcock.
