

STEADY BOOK 3 CONCLUDES AT KEENOV

Keeneland concluded the two-day Book 3 section of its November Breeding Stock Sale Saturday in Lexington with figures largely in line with last year's statistics. Through the two Book 3 sessions, 474 horses sold for \$25,852,000 with an average of \$54,540. During last year's Book 3, 532 head sold for \$29,525,000. The average was \$55,498 and the median was \$45,000. Last year's top Book 3 price of \$230,000 was bettered five times, including by Saturday's top offering, the mare **Lovely Regina** (Deputy Minister),

who sold for \$370,000 to Chris Baccari. The 14-year-old mare, who was in foal to Flashback, was consigned by Hill 'n' Dale Sales Agency as [hip 1940](#). Nine offerings sold for \$200,000 or over in both 2014 and 2015.

"Both days of Book 3 were very comparable to last year," confirmed Keeneland's Director of Sales Geoffrey Russell. "There is still a very strong trade in the foal market. There was great interest in the freshman sires--they seem to be doing very well, especially today."

The top four weanlings during Saturday's session were all from the first crop of their sires, led by a colt by GI Haskell Invitational winner Paynter ([hip 1847](#)), who sold for \$145,000 to Orchard Lane Farm. Both GI Donn H. winner Graydar and GI Alfred G. Vanderbilt H. winner Justin Phillip had weanling colts bring \$110,000 and GI Preakness S. winner Oxbow rounded out the foursome with a filly selling for \$105,000.

Through six sessions of the November sale, 1,206 horses have sold for \$190,531,000, compared to 1,321 grossing \$180,429,500 in 2014. The average of \$157,986 is up 15.67% from 2014, while the median is up 6.67% to \$80,000. The cumulative buy-back rate is 27.65%, compared to 21.93% a year ago.

The Keeneland November sale continues through Friday with sessions beginning daily at 10 a.m.

Lovely Purchase for Baccari

Chris Baccari purchased a Tapit weanling out of **Lovely Regina** (Deputy Minister) for \$520,000 at last year's Keeneland November sale and resold the youngster for \$700,000 at this year's Keeneland September sale. The colt impressed him enough that he was committed to securing **Lovely Regina** herself when she went through the November sales ring Saturday as [hip 1940](#), acquiring the 14-year-old mare, in foal to Flashback (Tapit), for \$370,000.

"I really thought he was a million-dollar yearling, if not more than \$1 million," Baccari admitted of the Tapit colt.

"There were a lot of Tapits and the stockmarket was a little off, so I thought he could have brought a little more than that. And the people who have him are very happy with him and all the reports that I have about him are excellent. So I felt like this was a way for me to get in that family and I wouldn't have to compete with everybody bidding on the babies." **Cont. p3**

Out of Cara Rafaela, Lovely Regina is a half-sister to champion Bernardini, as well as to the dam of multiple Grade I winner Love and Pride (A.P. Indy), who sold for \$4.9 million at the 2013 Fasig-Tipton November sale. Consigned by Hill 'n' Dale Sales Agency, Lovely Regina is the dam of multiple graded stakes winner Thiskyhasnolimit (Sky Mesa).

Lovely Regina was the third mare purchased by Baccari at the November sale. He also acquired Aguilera (Unbridled's Song) ([hip 1294](#)) for \$240,000.

"I cut it down a few years ago," Baccari said of his broodmare band. "But I am just starting to replace mares now."

Minor Takes Control of Honey Chile Ryder

Joe Minor went to \$210,000 to acquire Honey Chile Ryder (Medaglia d'Oro), a 3-year-old filly his JSM Equine co-owned with John Greathouse's Greathouse Horse Properties, during Saturday's session of the Keeneland November sale. The dark bay has made four trips to the post and is coming off her best finish, a runner-up effort over the Kentucky Downs turf in September.

"I felt like she has a lot of running left in her, but I also think she is a beautiful broodmare prospect," Minor said. "She's a gorgeous filly and I think she'll be a lot better at four. I hope she'll have some success. She'll probably go back to Mr. [Todd] Pletcher and we'll look for some races for her." **Cont. p5**

Honey Chile Ryder was a \$250,000 Keeneland September yearling in 2013 and RNA'd for \$300,000 at last year's Keeneland April sale. She is a daughter of Grade I winner Honey Ryder (Lasting Approval), who raced for the Greathouse family's Glencrest Farm.

"She comes from a family that speaks for itself," Minor added. "John's had a lot of luck with her mother."

Through Four Star Sales, JSM Equine and Greathouse Horse Properties have sold seven head this week.

Don't forget about me (Malibu Moon) was the duo's top-priced offering when selling for \$675,000 to Claiborne Farm. Minor bid \$300,000 to acquire the partnership's **The party never ends** (Smart Strike).

Minor and Greathouse campaign multiple graded stakes winner Blofeld (Quality Road) in partnership and were also co-owners of the ill-fated multiple graded stakes winner Only for you (Malibu Moon).

"John and I have decided that we are going to have not as many together," Minor said. "But anytime you can be partners with someone with his knowledge, it's a good education. There are no hard feelings, but we are trying to trim our herd a little."

Minor, who has a broodmare band of some 15 head, was also busy shopping for weanlings this week at Keeneland.

"We've bought some babies," he confirmed. "The plan for the babies is to sell them as yearlings--but that was what the plan was last year, but not all of them went according to plan and some of them are now going to the 2-year-old sales."

Take Charge Brandi to Curlin in 2016

Champion **Take Charge Brandi** (Giant's Causeway--Charming, by Seeking the Gold), who topped the KEENOV sale when selling to John Sikura's Hill 'n' Dale Equine for \$6 million ([hip 450](#)) Tuesday in Lexington, will be bred to leading sire Curlin next season, Sikura announced Saturday.

Sikura and partners purchased a 20% share in Curlin earlier this year and the stallion has been relocated to Hill 'n' Dale for the 2016 breeding season.

"We believe Curlin is poised to become a great stallion," Sikura said. "As significant investors in the horse, we feel obligated to support him to the fullest with our best mares. Take Charge Brandi joins an elite group of mares that will visit Curlin replete with champions, dams of champions and Grade I winners."

Take Charge Brandi was named last year's champion 2-year-old filly after capturing the GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies. She is out of a daughter of broodmare of the year Take Charge Lady (Dehere), whose War Front weanling filly set a North American record when selling for \$3.2 million at Keeneland Tuesday. Take Charge Lady is also the dam of champion Will Take Charge (Unbridled's Song) and Grade I winner Take Charge Indy (A.P. Indy).

"I love the mating from every point of view: class, compatibility and commercial appeal," Sikura added.

Oct. 17. Goldy Espony kicked off her 4-year-old campaign with three straight scores, including the River Memories S. at Belmont July 5 and GIII Fasig-Tipton Waya S. at the Spa Aug. 8. I'll speak to Peter Bradley who heads the ownership group and figure out what we're going to do with her. She's had a great season."

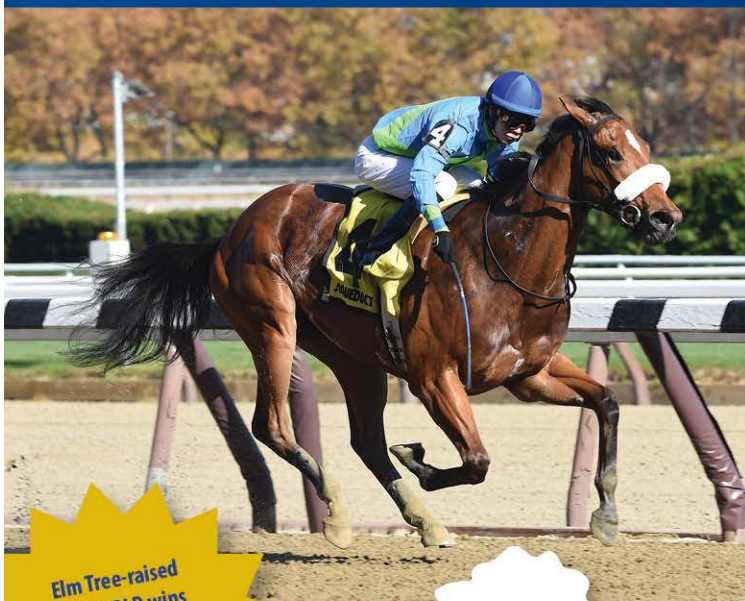

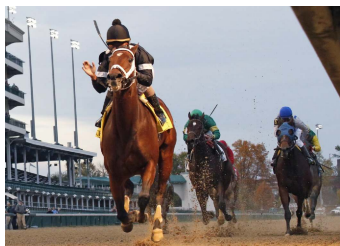



"Surgery was performed on Wednesday and he has taken this, and the early stages of the recovery process, as well as we could have hoped," the statement read. "With his life now stable, I wanted to pay tribute to Red

Cadeaux the racehorse. He won't be remembered for his win record, but every other aspect of his profile has been simply astonishing. Three continents, eight countries, five Melbourne Cups, three pixels from history in 2011, the highest-earning British-trained racehorse ever and only an agonizing whisker shy of becoming the first to break the £5 million barrier. We think he's covered roughly 175,000 miles by road, sea and air and he's barely turned in a poor performance over the last four years, the majority of which have been spent away from Newmarket."

"The Red Cadeaux story wasn't supposed to end like this. On his stage, in his race, in front of his people. But he is safe, stable and on the road to recovery. For that, and almost a decade of joyful brilliance, we must be eternally thankful."

Last time he found the pace scenario against him and got beaten by a good horse. I hope the pace will be strong."

Two of the three Italian Group 1 scorers--the defending champion **Priore Philip (Ity)** (Dane Friendly {GB}) and **Refuse To Bobbin (Ire)** (Refuse To Bend {Ire})--showed little this season but the other, **Dylan Mouth (Ire)** (Dylan Thomas {Ire}), snatched his second Group 1 in June when he trotted home in the Gran Premio Di Milano and was not disgraced when second to the German Lovelyn (Ger) (Tiger Hill {Ire}) in the G1 Gran Premio Del Jockey Club, over very heavy ground, Oct. 18. German raider **Guiliani (Ire)** (Tertullian) pinched his Group 1 in July, outkicking a moderate field in the Bayrisches Zuchtrennen. He failed to confirm that form in his subsequent two starts but the "fast" 2000 meters of Capannelle could play for him. The Brazilian **Energia Davos (Brz)** (Torrential) was a champion in his native country at three. He has shown in-and-out form since moving to Europe in 2012, but found some of old sparkle when landing the G3 Darley S. for new trainer Jane Chapple-Hyam Oct. 10.

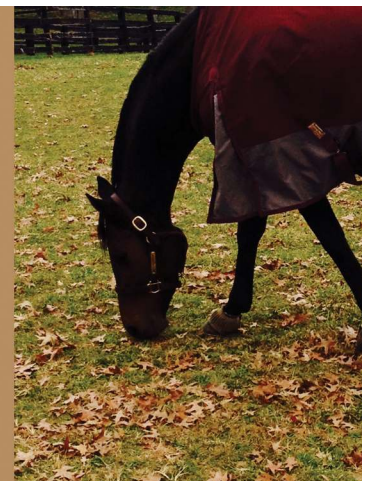

New Zealand-based conditioner Murray Baker is no stranger to Group 1 success in Australia, his success stories including Dundee (NZ) (High Chaparral {Ire}) and this year's G1 Australian Derby and G1 Caulfield Cup scorer Mongolian Khan (NZ) (Holy Roman Emperor {Ire}), and Baker was at it again Saturday at Flemington, scooping another big Aussie prize with last year's G1 NZ 2000 Guineas winner Turn Me Loose. The bay was off for nearly 10 months following that Classic score, and returned to the races with a sixth-place finish in the G1 Makfi Challenge S. Aug. 29. Crossing the Tasman thereafter, Turn Me Loose finished second in his Australian debut in Flemington's Listed Paris Lane S. Oct. 4, and won the Listed Darley Seymour Cup two weeks later over this trip. He backed up once again just a week after that to add the G2 Crystal Mile at Moonee Valley under regular rider Opie Bosson, and had Kerrin McEvoy in the saddle for the first time Saturday while Bosson sat out on suspension. One of the first out of the gates from his middle draw, Turn Me Loose quickly took up the lead and set the tempo under a hard hold from McEvoy. The first challenger to confront Turn Me Loose in the straight was Lucky Hussler and, after a brief battle, the game frontrunner put that rival away approaching the 100 meter mark before seeing off a handful of fast finishers including last Saturday's G1 Myer S. winner Politeness. "I rode him for the first time on Thursday and he's just a big, bold going Kiwi that likes to get out and running," McEvoy told *Breednet.com.au*. "He gave a great kick and was just too strong for them." Baker told that site, "He's a good, tough horse that can run fast sectionals, which makes it hard for those behind to run him down." Baker also said Turn Me Loose could travel to Hong Kong for the G1 Hong Kong Mile Dec. 13.

The odds for Saturday's G1 Darley Classic suggested the week's sprint feature was expected to be a walkover for last season's G1 T J Smith scorer Chautauqua, but longshot Delectation ran him down on the line to earn his first Group 1 and provide another for trainer Chris Waller. Second to stablemate Brazen Beau (Aus) (I Am Invincible {Aus}) in this carnival's G1 Coolmore Stud S. for 3-year-olds over the same trip last year, Delectation, like Chautauqua, was in action at The Championships in April. However, his win in the G2 Arrowfield 3yo Sprint--his first stakes score--took second fiddle to that festival's star-studded Group 1 action. Given six weeks' rest after that breakthrough score, Delectation finished third in Doomben's Listed Ascot H. over this trip and was ninth when trying Group 1 company again in the G1 Stradbroke H. two weeks later. Sixth on his 4-year-old debut in the G2 The Shorts S. Sept. 19, Delectation was a length

behind Chautauqua in the G2 Gilgai S. over this track and trip Oct. 4 and entered this off a week's rest, having finished fourth in the G2 Tab.com.au S. here last Saturday. Delectation settled on the fence, about four lengths off the lead, as sprint veteran Buffering (Aus) (Mossman {Aus}) set the early tempo here, with Chautauqua taking up his customary position near the back of the pack, to Delectation's outside and about 1 1/2 lengths behind. While Chautauqua moved to the middle of the track to make his bid on the outside, Delectation split runners in tandem. The top four finishers were separated by no more than a head approaching the 50 meter mark and just over a half-length separated them at the line.

"I'm thrilled the horse backed up and managed to overcome all those world-class sprinters," said trainer Chris Waller, who then suggested his newest star could be bound for England next June. "I want to get back to Ascot, we had an amazing trip there [with Brazen Beau]," he said.

"That's the beauty of horses," Waller added. "It can take you a long way, whether it be England, Hong Kong or wherever, but it's good to win at home just as much as anywhere."

Jockey James McDonald, who was winning his first Group 1 at the carnival on its final day, added, "It's great to ride a very good, straight horse like this, and of course get a massive Group 1 like today."

Chautauqua's jockey, Dwayne Dunn, blamed the short-priced favorite's defeat on the soft going, telling *Racing.com*, "He tried really hard but he probably didn't quite sprint as hard on that sort of going. He's probably better on top of the ground where he's got more of an electrifying sprint, but he still toughed it out right to the wire."

Delectation's dam, Grace and Power, was a listed winner in the U.S. and was second in the GI Hollywood Starlet S. She was purchased by agent Steven Brem for \$700,000 while in foal to Giant's Causeway at the 2009 Fasig-Tipton November sale. The Giant's Causeway filly she was carrying, later named Pocket Power (Aus), was born in Australia and was, like her younger brother, a winner over a mile. Delectation is Grace and Power's second foal. She has an unraced 3-year-old filly named Gracie's Lass (Aus)

(Redoute's Choice {Aus}); a yearling filly by Congrats and her colt foal by Exceed and Excel died this year. Delectation's fourth dam, Lady Winborne (Secretariat), is a half-sister to French champion and Classic winner Allez France, and it is also the family of GI Personal Ensign winner Icon Project (Empire Maker).

VALENTINA A HONG KONG POSSIBLE

Dual Group 1 winner **Lucia Valentina (NZ)** (Savabeel {Aus}), who lifted the G2 Matriarch S. at Flemington Saturday, is under consideration for the G1 Hong Kong Cup at Sha Tin Dec. 13, trainer Kris Lees told *Racing.com*. The 5-year-old mare was recording her first win since last October's G1 Turnbull S. Saturday.

"She's got a nomination in for Hong Kong; hopefully she gets an invite," Lees told *Racing.com*. "I think we would be [keen to travel], providing she pulls up well. I think that gap between runs would be ideal for her, but we'll see what happens."

Lucia Valentina had been ninth in the G1 Caulfield Cup Oct. 17, and the 10 furlong Matriarch marked a two furlong drop in distance.

"She's not a big mare, and to be really strict, she's been out of the winner's stall for over a year now," Lees told *Racing.com*. "We thought we needed to drop her back and hopefully get her a bit of confidence. She was really strong late--she didn't get any favors, she had to carry the big weight."

DAUGHTER OF LILACS AND LACE SCORES

L’Arc (Jpn) (Deep Impact {Jpn}), a 2-year-old daughter of 2011 GI Ashland S. winner Lilacs and Lace (Flower Alley), proved easily best in her career debut Saturday at Kyoto Racecourse, landing a 1600-meter turf test for newcomers by 3 1/2 decisive lengths as the 2-5 favorite.

Bred by Katsumi Yoshida’s Northern Farm, L’Arc was purchased by Bando Bokujo for ¥145 million (*about*

US\$1,421,569) and finished the fourth most expensive offering at the JRHA Select Yearling Sale last July. The bay filly was consigned to the auction by her breeder, whose consignment accounted for the four dearest youngsters, all by Deep Impact.

Raced by Kieffers Co. Ltd., L’Arc is the second foal for her dam, a \$35,000 buyback out of the 2009 Keeneland September sale. Lilacs and Lace was originally campaigned by her breeders, Judy Hicks and Kathryn Nikkel, winning her maiden at fourth asking before adding the California Oaks over the Golden Gate Tapeta track two starts later. A majority interest in the filly was acquired shortly thereafter by New York-based owner Jim Covello, and, following a fourth in the GIII Bourbonette Oaks over the Turfway Poly, the filly belied odds of 48-1 to wire the field in the Ashland ([video](#)). Lilacs and Lace was sold privately to Northern Farm following her unplaced effort in the 2011 GI Kentucky Oaks. The mare is also represented by her first foal, the 3-year-old filly Lilac Rose (Jpn) (Henrythenavigator), who is unplaced in three runs to date.

SHADES OF HOLLINGSWORTH AT FLEMINGTON

The Kiwis have been enjoying an excellent Spring Carnival in Melbourne. It got even better for the trans-Tasman team when last season's G1 NZ 2000 Guineas winner Turn Me Loose landed the final Group 1 race of the Carnival, the Emirates S. at Flemington. Trained by Murray Baker, Turn Me Loose represents the same stable as the Caulfield Cup winner Mongolian Khan (NZ) (Holy Roman Emperor {Ire}). The similarity does not end there, because the two horses (who were both Classic winners as 3-year-olds last season) came out of the same NZB

Ready-To-Run Sale at Karaka in November 2013. Mongolian Khan topped that sale at NZ\$220,000, but Turn Me Loose turned fewer heads there, fetching NZ\$52,500 to the bid of Todd Hartley. He soon proved to have been a wonderful bargain: within 12 months he had landed both the G2 Hawkes Bay Guineas at Hastings and the NZ 2000 Guineas at Riccarton. Now, thanks to his three big wins in Victoria this spring, his record is even better.

Turn Me Loose is a splendid example of the New Zealand Thoroughbred, and not merely because he is, in the words of winning jockey Kerrin McEvoy, "just a bold-going Kiwi--he likes to get out there and make every post a winner." Like so many of the great NZ-breds of the past, he comes from a wonderful staying family that has had its stamina spiced up by judicious use of high-class stallions.

As with so many of the good families in New Zealand, the roots of Turn Me Loose's clan lie in England. In his case, they lie at the late Dick Hollingsworth's Arches Hall Stud in Hertfordshire. Hollingsworth ranked as one of Britain's last great domestic owner/breeders, renowned for the stream of high-class Dick Hern-trained stayers who bore his "crimson, silver braid" silks with distinction through the '60s, '70s and '80s. A classic example was the Aureole horse Buoy (GB), who finished third in the Irish Derby and second in the St. Leger in 1973 before trouncing the great mare Dahlia in the following year's Coronation Cup. Buoy subsequently enjoyed a successful stud career in New Zealand.

Dick Hollingsworth's influence, incidentally, still exists in diminished form, with Buoy's relative Talent (GB) (New Approach {Ire}), part-owned and part-bred by his nephew Mark Dixon, having won the G1 Epsom Oaks in 2013.

One of the last good horses owned and bred by Dick Hollingsworth was Band (GB), a son of the 1969 Derby winner Blakeney (GB) who carried his breeder's colors to four victories as a 3-year-old in 1983 before being sold to join Khalid Abdullah's nascent racing operation. At the time of the sale, Band had just won the G3 Cumberland Lodge S. over 12 furlongs at Ascot, and he went on to end the year by finishing runner-up in Group 1 company in both the Irish St Leger and its French equivalent, the Prix Royal-Oak. Abdullah looked to have bought a potential Cup horse, and Band, still trained by Hern, lived up to expectations by taking the Yorkshire Cup the following season, beating the previous year's Derby runner-up Carlingford Castle (Ire). **Cont. p16**

Band's dam, the Vienna mare Zither (GB), had previously bred the high-class Ragusa horse Zimbalon (GB), winner of the King George V H. at Royal Ascot, the Rosebery Handicap at Kempton and the Ormonde S. at Chester. Her daughters, therefore, would clearly be attractive matrons, and her Shirley Heights filly Commanche Belle (GB) was interesting, notwithstanding that she failed to score when racing for Ivan Allan (who had bought her as a yearling for 80,000gns) from Luca Cumani's stable in 1986.

Commanche Belle headed off to stud in Ireland, where her pedigree saw her visit some of Coolmore's best stallions. To Fairy King she bred the Group 1-winning juvenile Fairy Heights (Ire). To the ill-fated Persian Heights (GB) she bred the Group 3-winning stayer Persian Brave (Ire). And to Sadler's Wells she bred the Aidan O'Brien-trained Puerto Rico (Ire), winner in 2006 of the G3 Gallinule S. over 10 furlongs at The Curragh.

Commanche Belle's previous visit to Sadler's Wells, though, had been less successful: the result of her mating with the great horse in 1999 was Kwan (Ire), who never ran for Mrs John Magnier during her brief time in training with Aidan O'Brien. Kwan, like so many blue-blooded non-achievers over the years, headed off to stud Down Under. In fact, one could say that she hot-footed it down there: stumps were drawn on her (non-)racing career very swiftly and she was dispatched as an autumn 2-year-old, when she was covered at Coolmore Australia by Danehill.

Again, the result of that mating proved to be a beautifully bred non-winner: Indomitable (NZ) ran twice without making the frame. Kwan's subsequent breeding career, though, was more fruitful because she has produced three winners including the Tiger Hill (Ire) colt Martial Art (NZ), a winner in New Zealand as a 3-year-old before finishing sixth in the 2010 G1 New Zealand Derby. He subsequently won several races in Singapore and finished third in the Singapore Gold Cup in 2011.

Like her dam and granddam before her, Indomitable has demonstrated that lack of racecourse form is often no barrier to success for a well-bred broodmare, with her third foal being the dual Group One-winning miler Turn Me Loose. To produce him, Indomitable visited the Zafonic stallion Iffraaj (GB) at Haunui Farm in 2010. Iffraaj, a strong, well-bred and very fast horse who has compiled an impressive record of siring good, tough sprinters and milers, has proved to have been an ideal mate for her, having done a great job in reinvigorating the latent class in her pedigree.

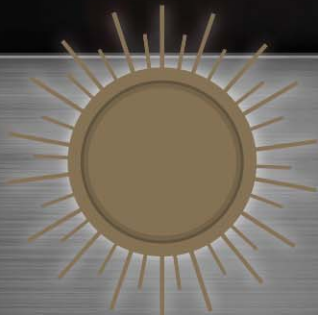
