DONWORTH THE STAR TURN AT KEENOV

When last seen up the hill over at the Keeneland main track, 'TDN Rising Star' Donworth (Tiznow), making just the second start of his career, was a gallant runner-up in the GI Coolmore Lexington S. carrying the colors of Nat Rea's Regis Farms. The handsome colt, offered by Three Chimneys as hip [3324](#) during Tuesday's ninth session of the Keeneland November Breeding Stock Sale, not surprisingly proved the dearest offering of the session, as Dennis O'Neill signed the winning ticket at \$550,000 on behalf of J. Paul Reddam.

Previously trained by Graham Motion, Donworth overcame a rough trip to graduate at first asking at Gulfstream Park Mar. 14 and gave an excellent account of himself in the Lexington, finishing three lengths in back of the more experienced Divining Rod (Tapit). Third in the Sir Barton S. on the GI Preakness S. undercard May 16, he was last seen running away with an off-turf renewal of the Stanton S. at Delaware Park June 20.

"You know, being a TDN Rising Star, a stakes winner by 11 lengths and graded-stakes placed, he was a horse that attracted a lot of interest," commented Three Chimneys' Case Clay. "There were a lot of people on him through the \$500,000 level and Dennis O'Neill was the winner. He is doing very well, been galloping on the farm. He's had a lot of scopes and I had him appraised in the \$300-600,000 range. You never know when you have a dispersal with horses selling without reserve exactly where they are going to fall. He is just a gorgeous individual, very good looking, he showed well and was very popular." ([ThoroStride video](#)) *Cont. p3*

BORELL SUES MCINGVALES OVER

RUNHAPPY DISPUTE *By T.D. Thornton*

Trainer Maria Borell is suing Gallery Racing Stables, LLC, and owners James and Linda McIngvale for breach of contract and defamation.

In a lawsuit filed Tuesday morning in Fayette County Circuit Court in Kentucky, Borell is seeking "at least" \$122,752, plus two lifetime breeding rights to GI Breeders' Cup Sprint winner Runhappy (Super Saver), who won five consecutive races after Borell was hired as the colt's trainer.

According to the complaint, Breeders' Cup Ltd. and Keeneland Association are named as third-party defendants because they are believed to be holding some of the funds to which Borell claims she is entitled. *Cont. p6*

For Reddam, the purchase comes 10 days following the victory of Nyquist (Uncle Mo) in the GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile.

"We are very, very excited to get him and we'll bring him right out to California and try to get him ready," said O'Neill, whose brother Doug will handle the training duties. "We watched his replays and he was very impressive. Graham Motion is a very conservative trainer, so for him to run that horse in the Lexington second time out was outstanding and gave us confidence. He's a horse that looks like he was getting better and better, he's got a beautiful pedigree and we hope he'll develop into a prominent older horse. We had him valued in the \$600,000 range, so we hope we made a wise purchase."

O'Neill estimates Donworth is 6-8 weeks away from a breeze, while races like the GI San Fernando S. and GI Santa Anita H. loom early-season targets if all goes well, he said.

"He may even make a grass horse down the line. The Tiznows can handle that and he's got a nice female family for it."

Out of the GISP Temple Street (Street Cry {Ire}), Donworth hails from the extended female family of GI Canadian International S. winner Marsh Side (Gone West).

Eclipse Finds Their Rhythm

By his own admission, Aron Wellman scours the results from racetracks the world over in search of racing prospects for his Eclipse Thoroughbred Partners. However, Wellman had never purchased a horse of racing age at public auction, a fact which changed in the blink of an eye Tuesday afternoon at Keeneland. Wellman was extended to \$335,000 for hip [3321](#), recent Keeneland maiden winner Cowboy Rhythm (Tapit) from the annual WinStar Racing draft.

"He is a lightly raced colt by Tapit who has shown considerable talent in each of his races and we believe there is a lot of upside," Wellman commented. "He has a stallion-making pedigree and is very good looking, so when you put the whole package together and the fact that he's got all his conditions ahead of him, he's very attractive addition to our stable." **Cont. p5**

Wellman confirmed that the athletic gray colt will be turned over to trainer Todd Pletcher, but for the time being, they will not be in any particular hurry, despite the iron being hot.

“One thing we’ve noticed with horses that look ready and ripe to go on, sometimes the stress of the sale will dull them a little bit and this colt--he was probably shown 100-150 times--so the one thing we don’t want to do is jam him up. It would appear on paper that he is ready to run, but we’ll probably try to show constraint and send him to Todd’s base at Palm Beach Downs and recharge him and map out a future. He has the perfect foundation to work with and last thing we want to do is get too far ahead of ourselves.”

Given the broad success his sire has had, Wellman was over the moon to take Cowboy Rhythm home.

“This is uncharted territory for us and it’s hard to understand where the market is, but we definitely believe there was value in the hammer price,” he explained “The fact that he was three turning four maybe took some of the shine off the apple and we see a lot of upside with this colt. If he was two turning three, maybe you add another zero to the price. Hopefully he will be postured to jump into graded stakes company soon. If he does, we could have a stallion on our hands.”

Walden Pleased With WinStar Draft

This year’s draft of horses of racing age from WinStar Farm had a tough act to follow, given the on-track performance of the 2014 graduates. Barbados (Speightstown), who topped last year’s consignment on a bid of \$340,000 from Paul Haniff’s Suzanne Stables, had a strong 2015 season, with victories in the Spectacular Bid S. in his first start under new ownership followed by the Gill Hutcheson S. Race Day (Tapit) fetched \$285,000 from owner Matt Schera, and the gray colt became a treble graded winner this term, with tallies in the Gill Razorback H., the Gill Oaklawn H. and, most recently, the Gill Fayette S. on Breeders’ Cup Friday.

The draft of WinStar horses Tuesday at Keeneland realized gross receipts of \$1,444,500 for 26 horses, and WinStar President and CEO Elliott Walden pronounced himself pleased with the results.

“I thought it went well, there was plenty of action, lots of vetting and I thought there was a lot of competitive bidding,” he explained. “Cowboy Rhythm was obviously our best and I thought he sold reasonably well and was a very good buy at that price.”

The WinStar draft has become a fixture of week two at the November sale, and Walden shed some light on the philosophy behind the undertaking.

“It gives us a chance to evaluate horses all year and this sale comes at a time when were turning over some horses and this

give us the opportunity to raise some capital to reinvest. We bought a bunch of mares and this sort of gives us a chance to keep us moving ahead.”

On the current state of the market, Walden added, “[The 2015] sales have been solid, numbers have been good, and on the heels of the Breeders’ Cup, it’s been really positive and healthy without being crazy.”

With three days remaining in the sale, the cumulative average stands at \$108,285, an improvement of 12.2% over last year. The median of \$45,000 remains unchanged. The November Sale continues Wednesday at 10 a.m. For full results, please vist www.keeneland.com.

The case will go before a judge at 1:00 p.m. Friday to determine whether the purse money allegedly held by Keeneland and the Breeders' Cup should be placed in escrow until the case is settled, said Richard A. Getty, the attorney representing Borell.

"We're fine with only sequestering the amount that she claims is due to her, even though we have defamation claims that probably result potentially in far more damages," Getty said.

The lawsuit is the latest salvo in a whirlwind week-and-a-half since Runhappy's track-record victory in the BC Sprint.

First Borell was fired 24 hours after winning the BC Sprint when she clashed with Laura Wohlers, who is the racing manager for Gallery and the twin sister of Linda McIngvale.

The argument centered on whether or not Runhappy had heat and filling in an ankle, with Borell insisting

that the colt remain in his stall. Wohlers disagreed and wanted to send Runhappy to the track to jog. She dismissed Borell and James McIngvale later confirmed the firing.

Borell's dismissal was not out of character for McIngvale. In the 15 years since he first began owning horses, the Texas retail furniture magnate has hired and fired at least 33 different conditioners, including such luminaries as Bob Baffert and the late Bobby Frankel.

Two days after her firing, on Nov. 3, Borell alleged that McIngvale never paid her the industry-standard 10% cut of Runhappy's victories. She hired Getty to draft a demand letter with the hope of avoiding taking the matter to court.

Getty said he initiated talks last week with McIngvale's attorney that went nowhere. He suspects that is because sometime since his last communication with that lawyer, McIngvale has fired him.

"We tried to be cooperative," Getty said. "I talked to his Houston attorney and made that proposal. But he never got back to me, which is what forced us to file the lawsuit. I was informed this morning that apparently the Houston lawyer I was dealing with has been replaced. They have a new lawyer. I haven't had time to speak with her, but I'll follow up with a call to see if we can reach an agreement on it."

McIngvale, reached by phone late Tuesday afternoon, did not want to discuss specifics about the case.

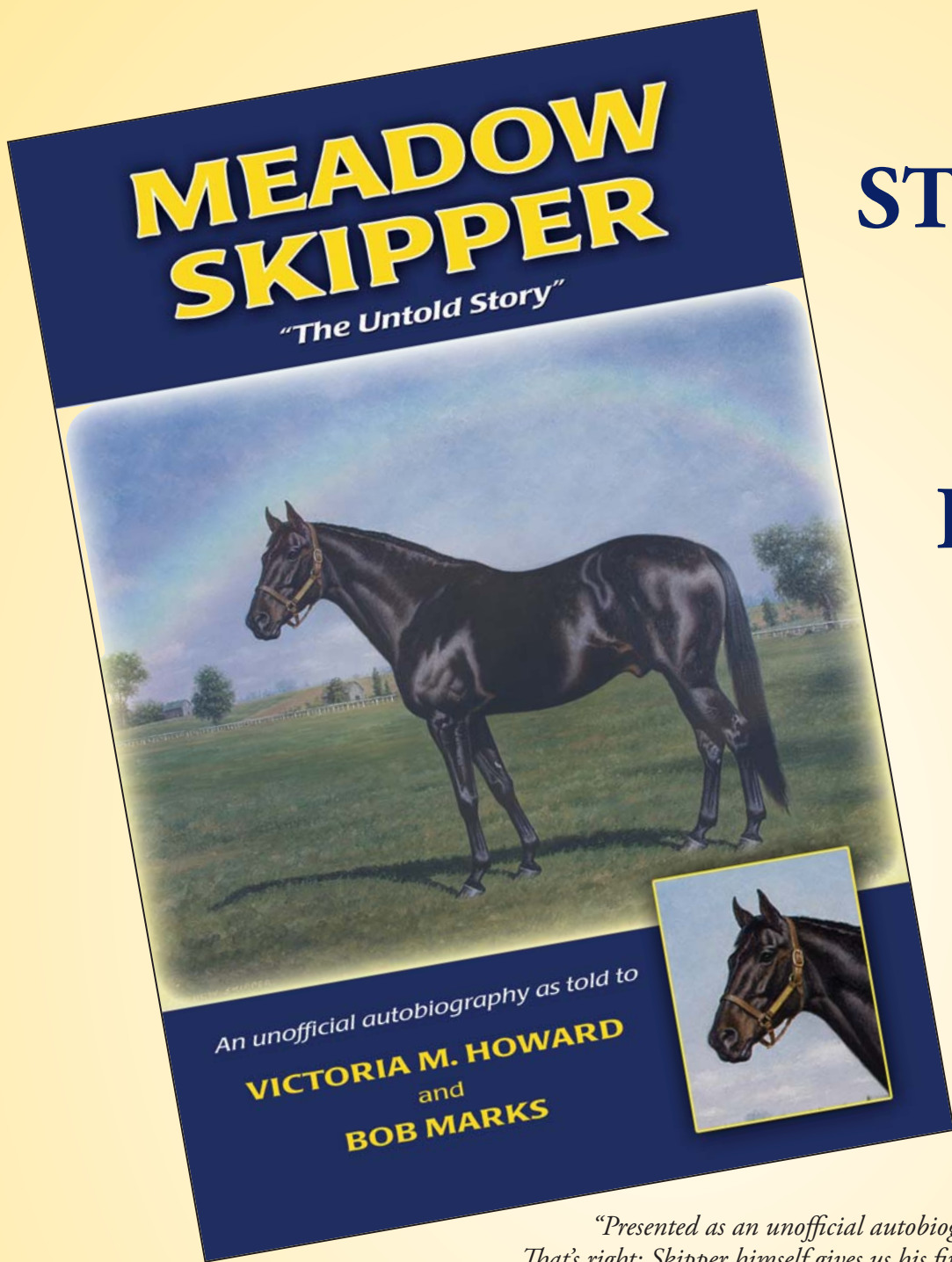

Borell Sues McIngvales Over Runhappy cont.

“We’ll let the courts work it out. The truth always comes out in the end. It is what it is. I’m too old to be surprised [by the threat of lawsuits] anymore. I’ve got lawyers working on it. That’s their job to do all that stuff. I just sell furniture,” McIngvale said.

In an interview with *TDN* last week, Wohlers characterized Borell as a “private trainer” who was paid \$1,000 weekly, plus expenses, “exactly according to our payment agreement with her.”

Borell’s civil complaint now states the opposite, that she was entitled to a portion of purses and breeding rights. Beyond Runhappy, the suit also includes a \$1,302 “trainer’s share” and a \$5,000 commission from another McIngvale horse, Triplehott (City Zip), who won and was claimed for \$50,000 at Arlington Park June 27.

(Note: A copy of the lawsuit is here. One curiosity is that Equibase lists Borell as the trainer of record from July 7 onward, but the tally of purse money allegedly due to her only includes four of Runhappy’s wins, from July 31 forward. It also acknowledges McIngvale made a partial payment of \$10,000 to cover winnings related to the GI King’s Bishop S.).

The defamation charges stem from “false statements” allegedly made by the McIngvales to the news media that “wrongfully and erroneously imputed dishonesty, incompetence, a lack of knowledge and concern for the

well-being of horses and a lack of knowledge and competence as a trainer to Ms. Borell, [whose] professional reputation has suffered and continues to suffer damage.”

Borell, 32, is a Syracuse, N.Y., native who has lifelong experience with horses, but limited opportunities as a licensed Thoroughbred trainer. Prior to taking over the training of Runhappy in July, she had never won a race from 22 lifetime starts.

Borell has declined repeated requests from *TDN* to speak about the case. When asked Tuesday to clarify what her next move professionally might be, she wrote in a text message “not at this time, sorry.” The verification page of the lawsuit that Borell signed was stamped by a notary public in Marion County, Florida, indicating that she is not currently residing in Kentucky.

Borell’s Twitter account began alerting visitors to a social media fundraising campaign Tuesday that has been launched “to help me get back on my feet.” The site www.gofundme.com is soliciting donations to help pay for “lawyers, relocating” costs. As of late Tuesday afternoon, \$1,245 of a \$10,000 goal has been raised.

McIngvale, 64, is the owner of Houston-based Gallery Furniture, which he sometimes promotes in television commercials while wearing a mattress costume as the character “Mattress Mack.” McIngvale had never won a Grade I until this year with Runhappy.

PLETCHER TRIO HEADLINES DISCOVERY

Aqueduct offers some rare Wednesday graded stakes action as seven sophomores, including a trio of Todd Pletcher trainees, seek to establish themselves as factors in next year’s handicap division in the GIII Discovery H. Cheyenne Stables LLC and Mac Nichol’s **Madefromlucky** (Lookin At Lucky) enters as Pletcher’s most accomplished runner, having captured the GII Peter Pan S. at Belmont May 9 and the GII West Virginia Derby Aug. 1--both at the Discovery’s nine-furlong distance. The chestnut was

recently a non-factor seventh in the wake of GISW Frosted (Tapit) in the GII Pennsylvania Derby at Parx Sept. 19, and meets a field that should be more to his liking in this return from a brief layoff. He will be joined in the gate by Paul Pompa Jr. and All American Horses LLC’s **Tommy Macho** (Macho Uno), who finished a

distant seventh behind his stablemate in the West Virginia Derby, but turned the tables when third at Parx in September. Pletcher has been working the pair together and they have posted a trio of bullet five-panel drills at Belmont. **First Spark** (Indian Charlie) figures to go off as the longest price of any Pletcher entrant, installed at morning line odds of 12-1. The Wertheimer and Frere homebred captured his debut over the inner track here in March and looks to build off a two-race win streak in allowance company at Monmouth and Parx. Stonestreet Stables’ **Ocean Knight** (Curlin), winner of the GIII Sam F. Davis S. in January, looms as the 2-1 morning line favorite. Sent to the sidelines following a seventh-place run in the GII Tampa Bay Derby in March, the bay closed to miss by less than length when second in a 6 1/2-furlong optional claimer at Saratoga Aug. 30 and recently earned a hard-fought score over a mile at Belmont Oct. 9. Returning to a two-turn trip, the Kieran McLaughlin trainee will attempt to navigate the longest distance of his career in the Discovery.

Anthony Oppenheimer's **Golden Horn (GB)** (Cape Cross {Ire}), the winner of four Group 1s this year including the Qatar Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe and Investec Derby, was crowned Cartier Horse of the Year and Cartier 3-Year-Old Colt Tuesday night at a ceremony at the Dorchester Hotel in London.

The winner of his lone juvenile outing last year, Golden Horn won six of eight starts this year and finished second on two occasions. After opening his sophomore campaign with a win in the Listed Feilden S. in April, Golden Horn was promoted to favoritism for the Derby following a win over stablemate Jack Hobbs (GB) (Halling) in the G2 Dante S. That pair filled the exacta in the blue riband three weeks later, and Golden Horn bested last year's dual Group 1 and Classic winner The Grey Gatsby (Ire) (Mastercraftsman {Ire}) by 3 1/2 lengths in the G1 Coral-Eclipse when next seen a month later. Golden Horn lost his unbeaten tag when second in the G1 Juddmonte International on softer ground Aug. 19, but rebounded to take the G1 Irish Champion S. in September followed three weeks later by the Arc. The John Gosden trainee wrapped up his career with a game half-length defeat when second to Found (Ire) (Galileo {Ire}) in the G1 Breeders' Cup Turf Oct. 31, and retires to Darley's Dalham Hall Stud in Newmarket.

CHAMPION JOCKEY PAT EDDERY DIES

Pat Eddery, 11-time champion jockey in Britain and the winner of four G1 Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe, has died at age 63. The winner of more than 4,600 races in the saddle was reported to be in ill health as of late. Eddery had some of his finest moment in the silks of Khalid Abdullah and that owner/breeder's Racing Manager Teddy Grimthorpe confirmed Eddery's death Tuesday, saying, "It is extremely sad news. Everyone at Juddmonte is very shocked and saddened by it."

Born in Newbridge, Co. Kildare, Ireland on Mar. 18, 1952, Eddery was the fifth of 12 children. His father, Jimmy, was a Group 1-winning jockey and his brother Paul was a successful jockey while his brother Robert was an accomplished trainer. Eddery began riding out for trainer Seamus McGrath at age eight and became an apprentice for that conditioner at 14.

Golden Horn is Cartier Horse of the Year cont.

Top miler **Solow (GB)** (Singspiel {Ire}) finished second to Golden Horn in the Cartier Horse of the Year standings, but gained compensation by taking home the Cartier Older Horse award for owner/breeders the Wertheimer brothers and trainer Freddy Head after a perfect six-for-six season. The 5-year-old gelding with the middle-distance pedigree had failed to thrive under those conditions early in his career but hit another level this season when campaigned mostly at a mile. After closing last

season with a career high in the G2 Prix Daniel Wildenstein over that distance in October, Solow took a Chantilly conditions event by four lengths Mar. 3 and was 4 1/4 lengths the best-- and one of the most eye-catching winners on the

Dubai World Cup card--over nine furlongs in the G1 Dubai Turf Mar. 28. He extended his streak when stepped up to 9 1/2 furlongs for the G1 Prix d'Ispahan May 24 and collected three more Group 1 wins over a mile during the remainder of the year: Royal Ascot's Queen Anne S., Glorious Goodwood's Sussex S. and Qipco British Champions Day's Queen Elizabeth II S. Solow beat out a trio of fillies in Treve (Fr) (Motivator {GB}), Esoterique (Ire) (Danehill Dancer {Ire}) and Amazing Maria (Ire) (Mastercraftsman {Ire}) for the Cartier honor.

Like Golden Horn and Solow, Sheikh Hamdan homebred **Muhaarar (GB)** (Oasis Dream {GB}) was dominant in his division this year, and earned the Cartier Sprinter award (he was also third in points for Horse of the Year). The winner of the G2 Gimcrack S. as a juvenile, Muhaarar was considered a

Guineas candidate earlier this year after winning the G3 Greenham S. over seven furlongs at Newbury in April, but flopped when eighth in France's Guineas, the G1 Poule d'Essai des Poulains, May. 10. The Charlie Hills trainee, however, would not lose again. Dropped back to six furlongs for the

inaugural G1 Commonwealth Cup at Royal Ascot, Muhaarar demolished fellow 3-year-olds by 3 3/4 lengths, and bested his elders in the following month's G1 Darley July Cup. He got the better of the classy mare Esoterique in the G1 Prix Maurice de Gheest Aug. 9, and wrapped up his career with a sound

two-length defeat of the previously unbeaten Twilight Son (GB) (Kyllachy {GB}) in the Qipco British Champions Sprint S. Oct. 17. Muhaarar will join the stallion ranks at Sheikh Hamdan's Shadwell Stud in Britain next year. Muhaarar beat out Goldream (GB) (Oasis Dream {GB}), Mecca's Angel (Ire) (Dark Angel {Ire}) and Twilight Son for the sprinter award.

Three Trophies For Coolmore...

Legatissimo (GB) (Danehill Dancer {Ire}) is one of three Cartier award winners for the Coolmore partners, and she earned the Cartier 3-Year-Old Filly award on the merits of three Group 1 wins. Running in the silks of Michael Tabor for trainer David Wachman, Legatissimo won the G1 1000 Guineas and was a short-head second to Qualify (Ire) (Fastnet Rock {Aus}) in the G1 Investec Oaks a month later. She was second by the same margin in the G1 Pretty Polly S. at The Curragh in late June before taking the G1 Nassau S. and G1 Matron S. in dominating

style. She was 1 1/4 lengths second to Stephanie's Kitten (Kitten's Joy) in the G1 Breeders' Cup Filly & Mare Turf Oct. 31.

The Coolmore partners repeated a feat they achieved last year when winning both Cartier

juvenile awards with Gleneagles (Ire) (Galileo {Ire}) and Found (Ire) (Galileo {Ire}), this year accomplishing it with **Air Force Blue** (War Front) and **Minding (Ire)** (Galileo {Ire}). Air Force Blue, a \$490,000 Keeneland September purchase, was beaten just once in five starts this year when second in Royal Ascot's G2 Coventry S. in his second outing, and he returned thereafter to annex the G1 Keeneland Phoenix S. and G1 Goffs Vincent O'Brien National S. in dominating fashion before bowing out for the season with a 3 1/4-length win in the G1 Dubai Dewhurst S. Minding, meanwhile, finished no worse than second in five starts this year and notched Group 1 wins in the G1 Moyglare Stud S. and G1 Dubai Fillies' Mile.

Simple Verse (Ire) (Duke Of Marmalade {Ire}) becomes just the second 3-year-old to win the Cartier Stayers Award in the 25-year history of the awards. The filly came out on top in a controversial running of the G1 Ladbrokes St Leger when, after being disqualified on raceday for interference with Bondi Beach (Ire) (Galileo {Ire}), she was reinstated following an appeal. Trained by Ralph Beckett for Qatar Racing, Simple Verse quickly proved that Classic win was no fluke with a score in the G1 Qipco British Champions Fillies & Mares S. Oct. 17, and she also won the G3 Lillie Langtry S. in July. **Cont. p3**

The Cartier/Daily Telegraph Award of Merit was this year awarded to Jack Berry who, in addition to roles as a trainer and jockey in his 78 years, has also been a tireless fundraiser and campaigner for injured jockeys. His fundraising this year allowed the Jack Berry House to be opened in Malton, Yorkshire. The £3 million facility offers injured jockeys top-quality rehabilitation and recovery programs.

"The Cartier Racing Awards are 25 years old--a tremendous landmark--and we could hardly have wished for a better season in European horse racing," said Harry Herbert, Cartier's racing consultant. "Golden Horn carried nearly all before him and is a worthy recipient of Cartier Horse of the Year, while Solow and Muhaarar were equally dominant in mile and sprint races, respectively."

"I think it would be hard to find a tougher filly anywhere in the world than Legatissimo, while the Coolmore-owned 2-year-olds Air Force Blue and Minding were both very impressive," Herbert added. "It is refreshing to see the Cartier Stayer Award go to a 3-year-old, Simple Verse, for the first time since 1994."

He concluded, "Jack Berry's whole life has been dedicated to racing and the opening of Jack Berry House in 2015 is a lasting testament to his tireless work on behalf of injured jockeys. We are delighted to announce him as the recipient Cartier/Daily Telegraph Award of Merit in 2015."

The Cartier awards are decided through a combination of points earned in pattern races in 2015 (30% of the weight); opinions of a panel of racing journalists (35%); and votes from readers of Racing Post and The Daily Telegraph and Channel 4 Racing viewers (35%).

Champion Jockey Pat Eddery Dies Cont. from p1

Eddery later moved across the Irish Sea and became champion apprentice in Britain in 1971 and in 1974 he earned his first of four consecutive champion jockey titles. He won his first of three Epsom Derbies in 1975 aboard Grundy before riding him to victory over Bustino in the G1 King George VI and Queen Elizabeth S. in what is considered one of the greatest races of all time. Eddery also won the blue riband aboard Golden Fleece in 1982 and Quest For Fame eight years later.

Eddery became the retained rider to Robert Sangster in 1981, and won many important contests on the likes of El Gran Senor, Caerleon, Sadler's Wells and Golden Fleece for trainer Vincent O'Brien. His first of a record-equaling four wins in the Arc came in the Sangster silks with Detroit in 1980. In 1986--the same year he picked up his next champion jockey title--Eddery rode Khalid Abdullah's Dancing Brave to a memorable victory in the Arc and King George, and the following year Eddery became retained rider to that owner, a post he held until 1994.

"He spanned the greatest era for jockeys ever," Grimthorpe said. "Lester Piggott, Steve Cauthen, Willie Carson--all were exceptional, yet Pat's ability was unquestioned."

Eddery's remaining championship titles came in 1988-91, 1993 and 1996, and he was also champion jockey in Ireland in 1982.

He rode at least 100 winners every year from 1973 to 2001 bar 1982, and his winningest season was in 1990, when he recorded 209 wins. On June 26, 1992, he rode seven winners in a day--three at Newmarket and four at Newcastle. Only Sir Gordon Richards rode

more winners and was champion more times than Eddery, who had 4,632 victories in the UK and 11 titles, the same as Lester Piggott.

Eddery also snatched a handful of big-race wins in the U.S., including the GI Breeders' Cup Turf with Pebbles in 1985; the GI Breeders' Cup Sprint in 1991 with Sheikh Albadou; and the 1983 GI Arlington Million with Tolomeo.

Eddery took out his training license after retiring from the saddle and his most important win came with Hearts Of Fire (GB) (Firebreak {GB}) in the G1 Gran Criterium in Italy in 2009.

Tributes to Eddery flowed in from many racing personalities Tuesday, and jockey-turned-trainer Richard Hughes said, "It's a great shame. I remember the epic battle he had with Steve Cauthen in the 80s very well, and he also rode winners for my dad [Dessie Hughes]. His greatest attribute was that I never once saw a horse pull with him on the way to the start--he had such great hands and was a perfect build."

"He was the same with everybody, It didn't matter who you were, a claimer or a champion," Hughes added, "It's a sad day as he was a good friend."

Eddery's former rival Steve Cauthen said, "The first time I remember Pat was in the spring of 1979. All the guys were so welcoming and Pat was one of the easiest-going guys you could meet. He was very strong but though his style was unusual, horses responded."

Ray Cochrane, a former jockey and now agent to Frankie Dettori, described Eddery as a "great fellow." **Cont. p4**

"He was great to be around and one of the best ever," Cochrane added. "I sat next to him for 27 years [in the weighing room] and never had a cross word with him. One of the best things you could say about him was that everyone wanted to beat him, and when you did you were thrilled. It didn't matter if it was a seller or a Classic, he wanted to win them all the same."

Bruce Raymond, another former weighing room colleague, said, "I can't imagine anyone being in his company and not enjoying it. I was with him abroad--Hong Kong, Italy, Germany, everywhere. He was good, fun guy and very generous. He was blooming tough to ride against and cool. He was ultra competitive. He would beat you in a photograph and laugh about it afterwards."

A colt by Galileo (Ire) out of German champion Walzerkoenigin (Kingmambo) has been added to Tattersalls' December Foal Sale as a wildcard entry and will be offered as [lot 1204A](#) Nov. 27 by the Castlebridge Consignment. Walzerkoenigin has produced six winners from six foals, four of which are group winners: G1 Deutsches Derby and G1 Rheinland-Pokal victor Wiener Walzer (Ger) (Dynaformer); this year's G2 Beresford S. winner Port Douglas (Ire) (Galileo {Ire}); G2 Prix Maurice de Nieuil winner Walzertakt (Ger) (Montjeu {Ire}); and G3 Bavarian Classic scorer Walzertraum (Rahy). The Galileo/Kingmambo cross has produced 2013 G1 Investec Derby winner Ruler Of The World (Ire), and Kingmambo is also the broodmare sire of Triple Classic winner Camelot (GB), who is by Galileo's paternal half-brother Montjeu (Ire).

TEN BREAKOUTS IN 2015

With the Turf season in Britain over, now is a good time to add up the numbers, construct the metrics and see who redefined themselves via their exploits in 2015. As expected, numerous candidates can be considered, but here are 10 favorites drawn from the ranks of stallions, trainers and jockeys who are worthy of particular note.

1. Silvestre De Sousa (Jockey)

Champion Jockey for the first time, the 34-year-old Brazilian took his profile to an even higher level. A long-time favorite of those who study jockey ratings, De Sousa put together an absolutely brilliant six-month domestic campaign between March and August, in which he partnered 123 winners from 590 rides at a better than 21% strike rate. His mounts continually outran their odds, posting a 120% Return On Investment for backers.

2. Dark Angel (Sire)

The Yeomanstown Stud stalwart had an even better campaign with precocious juveniles, producing Birchwood (Ire), Gutaifan (Ire), Log Out Island (Ire), Steady Pace (GB) and Easton Angel (Ire). In all, he has produced more than 120 winners. But his real breakout came in the sales ring where, after Sheikh Mohammed's Darley operation bought into him, prices raised by his stock rose sharply compared with 2014. His yearlings fetched an average of 95,000gns (up from 62,000gns) with a median of 60,000gns (up from 35,000gns). In Book 1 of the Tattersalls October Yearling Sale at Newmarket, a yearling sister to Mecca's Angel (Ire) was sold for 825,000gns.

3. Richard Fahey (Trainer)

Long established as one of the most prolific trainers in Britain, Richard Fahey took it all to another level in 2015, smashing his already impressive career marks for winners and prize money. At time of writing, he is on the 221-winner mark, already up 29 on his personal best. His runners have earned more than £3.7 million and included smart juvenile Birchwood, a first runner for the stable at the Breeders' Cup, in which he finished a close third in the GI Juvenile Turf. Fahey's breakout campaign was accompanied by one for stable rider Tony Hamilton, who is fast approaching a century of winners for the year, having never bettered 65.

4. Mark Johnston (Trainer)

In terms of winners, it was business pretty much as usual for the extraordinary Scotsman. A great exponent of the staying horse, his particular breakout came in the juvenile division, in which a new emphasis provoked by a greater influx of well-bred Maktoum family horses resulted in 68 wins, 28 more than last year.

Potentially brilliant filly Lumiere (Ire) (Shamardal) and the colt Buratino (Ire) (Exceed And Excel {Aus})

were the headline acts and both go into 2016 as candidates for their respective Guineas at Newmarket.

5. Leading apprentices (Jockey)

While 17-year-old Tom Marquand earned the official title of Champion Apprentice with 54 wins for the period May 2 to Oct. 17, several other bright young stars emerged in Britain. The other leaders among males were Jack Garritty (52 wins), Shane Grey (33), Cam Hardie (32), Eddie Greatrex (31) and Rob Hornby (24), while Sammy Jo Bell (24) and Rachel Richardson (23) were the leading females. Bell also starred at the Shergar Cup at Ascot in August, claiming the award for leading rider ahead of the some of the top names in the world.

6. Fastnet Rock (Sire)

Fascinating Rock (Ire), Qualify (Ire) and Diamondsandrubies (Ire) were the leading performers for a Coolmore stallion who had taken longer than expected to reproduce his superb Australian results in the Northern Hemisphere. With the exploits of these runners, the son of Danehill has now sired 22 different Group 1 winners around the world. His yearlings went for an average of 98,000gns at British and Irish sales--the best of four years in which they have been available here.

7. Hugo Palmer (Trainer)

Though not possessing the horsepower to run up a huge total of winners, Newmarket trainer Hugo Palmer nevertheless made a big impression in 2015. His talent sourcing must be exceptional, for of 47 different horses to represent him this year, no fewer than 11 (23%) gained a Racing Post Rating (RPR) of 100+. His best runner was G1 Irish Oaks and G1 Prix Vermeille winner Covert Love (Ire) (Azamour {Ire}), while Gifted Master (Ire) (Kodiac {GB}), Galileo Gold (GB) (Galileo {Ire}), New

Providence (GB) (Bahamian Bounty {GB}) and Hawksmoor (Ire) (Azamour {Ire}) developed well.

8. Pat Cosgrave (Jockey)

A link-up with Newmarket trainer William Haggas saw Pat Cosgrave return to the spotlight in 2015. Champion Irish apprentice as far back as 2003 and the winner of 82 races in 2008, the Northern Ireland native bounced back from a troubled 2014, in which he picked up a four-month riding ban in Dubai (which was not reciprocated in Britain), to break his best total and partner runners like G2 Great Voltigeur S. winner Storm The Stars (Sea The Stars {Ire}).

9. Zoffany (Sire)

The leading first-crop sire in Britain and Ireland with £750,000 in earnings, Zoffany has a chance to become more than an auctioneer's refrain for "the horse who got closest to Frankel." His runners Foundation (Ire), Illuminate (Ire), Washington DC (Ire) and Waterloo Bridge (Ire)--the last two for connections associated with his Coolmore base--were his leading performers by RPR.

10. Simon Crisford (Trainer)

Former Godolphin racing manager Simon Crisford sent out more than 20 winners in his first season as a trainer at the highest strike-rate of any stable with more than 75 runners. His 28% winning clip was boosted by four wins for G3 Solario S. winner First Selection (Spa) (Diktat {GB}), who is on course for the UAE 2000 Guineas at Meydan in 2016.

DESIGNS ON ROME GOES WELL IN TRIAL

Former Hong Kong Horse of the Year **Designs On Rome (Ire)** (Holy Roman Emperor {Ire}) pleased his trainer John Moore and jockey Joao Moreira when an unextended sixth in a Tuesday morning barrier trial over the Sha Tin dirt surface. The 5-year-old, who underwent surgery to remove chips in both fetlocks in the off-season, will return to action in the G2 BOCHK Jockey Club Mile Nov. 21, which will serve as a prep for a defense of his title in the 2000-meter G1 Longines Hong Kong Cup at Sha Tin Dec. 13.

Drawn outside in a field of 11 that also included Hong Kong's

top dirt horse Gun Pit (Aus) (Dubawi {Ire}), Designs On Rome lagged back in about ninth position down the back while ridden reasonably quietly by Moreira. Pulled out into the stretch, he

made up steady ground to finish three lengths in back of the winner and galloped out with good energy into the backstretch ([video](#)). Gun Pit, heading towards the G1 Champions Cup at Chukyo Dec. 6, finished well to be second.

"I'm delighted with Designs On Rome, that was a good trial," said Moore. "Joao came in with a big smile on his face saying that the race on the 21st will just top him off. Everything's going to plan. Going to the Hong Kong Cup one run in, that's not a problem.

Moore continued, "He'll run third or fourth in the Mile--he'll get home strong. He's looking very sound after surgery and, that being the case, we'll take him through to December and he should be as competitive as he has been in the past. He's not carrying condition, I know his bodyweight and he was kicking his brand off when he came back in, he was half ready to cow-kick. That's a really good sign."

The 2014 Hong Kong Derby winner, Designs On Rome was just up to best Military Attack (Ire) (Oratorio {Ire}) in a thrilling renewal of the Hong Kong Cup last December and took the G1 Hong Kong Gold Cup two starts later. A creditable fourth behind Dolniya (Fr) (Azamour {Ire}) in a paceless renewal of the G1 Dubai Sheema Classic Mar. 28, the Moyglare Stud-bred gelding was a below-par fourth when last seen in the G1 Audemars Piguet Queen Elizabeth II Cup at Sha Tin Apr. 26.

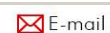
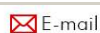
