



# RARE JEWELS ON OFFER AT TATTERSALLS DECEMBER



Oaks winner Qualify will be offered at Tattersalls | Racing Post

Tattersalls holds its last round of sales for 2015 Nov. 23 to Dec. 4 when it stages its four-day December Breeding Stock Sale, five-day December Foal Sale and single-session December Yearling Sale at Park Paddocks in Newmarket.

The Tattersalls December Breeding Stock Sale has been shaping the Thoroughbred breed since it was inaugurated in the late 1800s, and a mark of its legacy is the 54 Group 1 races won by the progeny of its graduates this year alone. As such, the breeding stock sale always boasts a catalogue of the highest quality; however, this year's sale will see some rare jewels, by anyone's standards, go under the hammer.

One of the main attractions will be this year's G1 Investec Oaks winner Qualify (Ire) (Fastnet Rock {Aus}) (lot 1987), who becomes the first Oaks winner to be offered at auction in Europe in the year of her Classic win in at least the last 50 years. Campaigned by Chantal Regalado-Gonzalez and trained by Aidan O'Brien, Qualify won last year's G3 Park S. and bested Cartier champion 3-year-old filly Legatissimo (Ire) (Danehill Dancer {Ire}) in the Oaks. Qualify has the pedigree to match, too, with Classic winners Workforce (GB) (King's Best), Brian Boru (GB) (Sadler's Wells) and Flute (Seattle Slew) appearing under the third dam. She is also a full-sister to this year's G2 Futurity S. third Shogun (Ire). cont p2

"It looks to be an outstanding December mares catalogue, and to have this year's Oaks winner, Qualify, in the sale is icing on the cake," said Tattersalls' Marketing Director Jimmy George. "It's very rare to have a Classic-winning filly offered at public auction in the year of their Classic win. She's an outstanding race filly and very well-bred as well."

Qualify is, however, far from the lone attraction. There are more than 130 group and listed winners or producers catalogued, including five Classic or Group 1 winners. Other star offerings with recent top form include last year's Cartier champion 2-

year-old filly **Tiggy Wiggy (Ire)** (Kodiac {GB}) (<u>lot 2019</u>); the last two winners of the G1 Prix Jean Romanet, **Ribbons (GB)** (Manduro {Ger}) (<u>lot 1985</u>) and **Odeliz (Ire)** (Falco) (<u>lot 2017</u>) and dual South African Classic winner **In The Fast Lane (SAf)** (Jet Master {SAf}) (lot 1774).

The sale also includes 149 mares in foal to the current top 20

active British and Irish sires, including six mares in foal to current number one Dubawi (Ire) and one--Group 2 winner **L'Amour De Ma Vie** (Dansili {GB}) <u>lot 1990</u>--carrying to multiple champion sire Galileo (Ire). The six mares in foal to Dubawi include two dams of Group 1 winners--**Ever Rigg (GB)** (Dubai Destination) (<u>lot 2015</u>), the dam of this year's G1 King George VI and Queen Elizabeth S. winner Postponed (GB) (Dubawi {Ire}), and therefore carrying a full-sibling to that standout; and **Time Control (GB)** (Sadler's Wells) (<u>lot 1986</u>), the dam of last year's G1 Moyglare Stud S. winner Cursory Glance (Distorted Humor).

Also set to be offered in foal to Dubawi are Grade/Group 1 winners Icon Project (Empire Maker) (lot 1977) and Ambivalent (Ire) (Authorized {Ire}), but the star turn could very well come from Hanky Panky (Ire) (Galileo {Ire}) (lot 2011), who boasts one of the very best pages in the stud book from a global perspective. The 5-year-old is out of Mariah's Storm (Rahy) and is therefore a half-sister to champion racehorse and sire Giant's Causeway (Storm Cat) and You'resothrilling (Storm Cat), whose first three foals are Classic winners Marvellous (Ire) Galileo {Ire}) and Gleneagles (Ire) (Galileo {Ire}) and this year's G3 Park S. winner Coolmore (Ire) (Galileo {Ire}). Another of Hanky Panky's half-sisters, Love Me Only (Ire) (Sadler's Wells), produced this year's G2 Great Voltigeur S. winner and dual Derby-placed Storm The Stars (Sea The Stars {Ire}). cont. p3

"There are always highlights in the December catalogue but I think we have some rare jewels this year, including six very good mares in foal to Dubawi," George said. "Hanky Panky boasts probably one of the better pedigrees in the global stud book."

Other highlights of the catalogue include **New Orchid** (Quest For Game {GB}) (lot 1603), the dam of Group 1 winner African Rose (GB) (Observatory) and **Arum Lily** (Woodman) (lot 1611), who has produced Grade I winner Redwood (GB) (High Chaparral {Ire}), from the ever-popular Juddmonte draft; a pair

of Group 1 producers from Jim
Bolger's Redmondstown Stud in
Irish Question (Ire) (Giant's
Causeway) (lot 1693) and Night Visit
(GB) (Sinndar {Ire}) (lot 1694);
Sinnamary (Ire) (Galileo {Ire}) (lot
1898), a 4-year-old half-sister to G1
Irish Oaks winner Chicquita (Ire)
(Montjeu {Ire}); Lady Hawkfield (Ire)
(Hawk Wing) (lot 1944), the dam of
Group 3 winner Master Apprentice
(Ire) (Mastercraftsman {Ire}) who is
also a half-sister to dual Group 1
winner Lillie Langtry (Ire) (Danehill

Dancer {Ire})--the dam of this year's Cartier champion 2-year-old filly Minding (Ire) (Galileo {Ire}); Ana Luna (GB) (Dream Well {Fr}) (lot 1997), the dam of GI Garden City S. winner Alterite (Fr) (Literato {Fr}); and Group 3 winner and dual Classic-placed Xcellence (Fr) (Champs Elysees {GB}) (lot 1999) in foal to Frankel (GB). The stakes-winning Seta (GB) (Pivotal {GB}) (lot 1965) heads a small but select six-horse dispersal of the stock of the late Sarah Leigh.

#### A Global Impact...

Since 2013, the progeny of mares purchased at Tattersalls December have won Group 1 races in 15 countries. In the last six weeks alone, December mares have produced the winners of the G1 Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe, G1 Qipco Champion S., GI Breeders' Cup Turf, G1 Shuka Sho in Japan and G1 Metropolitan in Australia. What's more is that many of these producers have been purchased for less than exorbitant prices; Fleche d'Or (GB) (Dubai Destination), the dam of this year's G1 Investec Derby and Arc winner Golden Horn (GB) (Cape Cross {Ire}), hammered for 62,000gns in 2012, while Miss Polaris (GB) (Polar Falcon), who produced this year's Champion S. victor Fascinating Rock (Ire) (Fastnet Rock {Aus}), was a 50,000gns purchase in 2006. Demerger (Distant View), the dam of sprint standout Sole Power (GB) (Kyllachy {GB}), was a 4,000gns bargain buy from the Juddmonte draft at this sale in 2000.

"The crucial element to this sale is it's not an exclusive sale; there are fillies and mares to suit every budget in every part of the world," George explained. "An indication of that is that the sale has produced the dams of Group 1 winners on every single continent this year, from as little as 4,000gns. It's not an exclusive sale, and that's why it attracts such a diverse group of buyers. Every year there will be stories like that."

This success builds on the solid foundation laid by the Tattersalls December sale since it was first staged in 1886. Some of the breed-changing broodmares to be

offered at the December sale throughout the years include Lady Angela--the second dam of Northern Dancer--a 10,500gns buy in 1952; Allegretta, the dam of Arc winner and legendary producer Urban Sea, a 24,000gns buy in 1981; and La Troienne, who was purchased for 1,025gns in 1930 by Colonel E.R. Bradley and sent to Kentucky the following year.

"The legacy the sale has left throughout the world, and in particular North America, is extraordinary, whether it's a mare like La Troienne back in the pre-second World War years or Lady Angela, or even if you go down the stallion route, Vaguely Noble was sold at the December Sale in 1967," said George. "The sale is an extraordinary force of outstanding breeding stock. Never does a year go by without the sale having a huge impact on the global breeding scene."

The participation of the regular cast of American buyers at the sale will surely be boosted this year by the strength of the dollar. As of Nov. 13 the dollar had climbed to \$1.52 to the British pound, and that figure has steadily risen in recent months.

"The December Sale has always been a very popular sale for American breeders, and I think the strength of the dollar against the pound at the moment is another big plus," George said. "There's been a significant swing since last year and that just makes the quality even more affordable. We've had a lot of interest from American buyers and buyers from throughout the world."

"A strong dollar is definitely an added attraction for buyers targeting the sale," he continued. "Value is a key part of everybody's buying plans, and when a currency significantly swings in your favor that just makes it even more attractive. You combine that with a catalogue of real quality and diversity and it's an added incentive for people to climb on the airplane and make the trip to Newmarket and Tattersalls." *cont. p4*

#### Something For Everyone At Foal Sale...

The Tatteralls December Foal sale annually draws a colorful cast of pinhookers and 'end users' to Park Paddocks, and 2015 provided a poignant advertisement for shopping for both purposes. In the pinhooking realm, the Tattersalls October Yearling Sale saw some outstanding results for 'flipped' foal purchases, including an Oasis Dream (GB) colt that cost 160,000gns as a foal selling for 750,000gns, and an Invincible Spirit filly bought for 90,000 as a foal selling for 700,000gns.

On the racetrack this year, Shalaa (Ire) (Invincible Spirit {Ire})—a 100,000gns foal turned 170,000gns yearling—proved one of the best of the juvenile generation with wins in the G1 Prix Morny and G1 Middle Park S., while another pinhook, Trip To Paris (Ire) (Champs Elysees {GB}), took the G1 Gold Cup at Royal Ascot and was a smart fourth in the G1 Melbourne Cup. This year's racetrack stars purchased by end users as foals from Tattersalls December included G1 Poule d'Essai des Poulains and G1 Prix de la Foret victor Make Believe (GB) (Makfi {GB}) and G1 Dubai World Cup winner Prince Bishop (Ire) (Dubawi {Ire}).

"Foal sales of this quality provide fantastic opportunities for the pinhookers, but equally this year the likes of Make Believe was bought by Prince Faisal to race and has gone on to win a Classic," said George. "There are very much two sides to every foal sale; it's the meat and drink for the pinhookers, but also a place where the top owners are out there scouting for racing prospects as well."

An increase in demand for spaces in this year's Tattersalls December Foal Sale means the sale has been increased to five days this year, and 1,276 lots will be offered between Nov. 24 and 28. The late addition of a Galileo (Ire) colt out of group

winner and producer Walzerkoenigin (Kingmambo) (<a href="later-to-start">Iot 1204A</a>) last week means Europe's two leading sires are both represented, with Dubawi responsible for a trio of well-bred youngsters: <a href="later-to-start">Iot 1162</a>, a half-sister to group winners Royal Bench (Ire) (Whipper), Mayhem (Ire) (Whipper) and Memphis Tennessee (Ire) (Hurricane Run {Ire}); <a href="later-to-start">Iot 1172</a>, the first foal out of dual Group 1 winner La Collina (Ire) (Strategic Prince {GB}); and <a href="later-to-start">Iot 1225</a>, a filly out of Group 3 winner High Heeled (Ire), a half-sister to the dam of Classic winner Just The Judge (Ire) (Lawman {Fr}). Other highlights on paper include a Sepoy (Aus) half-sister to this year's G1 Irish Derby winner Jack Hobbs (GB) (Halling) (<a href="later-to-start">Iot 1216</a>), and a High Chaparral (Ire) half-sister to Shalaa (Ire) (Invincible Spirit {Ire}) (<a href="later-to-start">Iot 1204</a>)

"The foal catalogue is a very good book, but then you'd expect it to be; it annually attracts the cream of the British and Irish foal crop and this year is no exception," said George. "I think the key thing is if you look at the current top 10 active British and Irish sires, there are 128 foals by the current top 10, and 260 by the top 20; that's a huge indication of the quality. To have a beautifully bred son of Galileo as well as the three Dubawis and so many foals by the top stallions in Europe, there is plenty to keep the pinhookers and the end-users happy."

The sale series kicks off Nov. 23 with the one-day Tattersalls December Yearling Sale, which is the final yearling sale on the calendar in Europe and therefore offers shoppers one last chance for the year to fill their orders. The catalogue includes 67 siblings to stakes winners, including siblings to Group 1 winners Madame Chiang (GB) (Archipenko) and Sans Frontieres (Ire) (Galileo {Ire}).

"The December Yearling Sale is a cracking little sale every year," George noted. "It's the final yearling sale of the European calendar every year and has a loyal following. It always attracts people who may not have filled all the orders they had at the other sales and it looks to be a catalogue of genuine quality. Nine of the top 10 British and Irish sires have yearlings catalogued this year, including the two stars Galileo and Dubawi."

A key attraction for shoppers at the yearling sale will be the fact that the majority of the youngsters catalogued are eligible for a prize money scheme, including the £25,000 Tattersalls October Book 1 Bonus; the Tattersalls October Auction Stakes; the Tattersalls Ireland Super Auction Sales Stakes; French owners' and breeders' premiums; and the Plus 10 scheme.

"There is a lot buyers can latch onto at this sale, and well over half the catalogue has the added attraction of a significant incentive for the buyers," George said.

#### **LEIGH STOCK TO BE DISPERSED AT TATTS**

A significant storyline to this year's Tattersalls December Sale is the dispersal of the final bloodstock holdings of the Leigh family. Sarah Leigh, who had continued breeding Thoroughbreds after the death in 2002 of her father, Gerald Leigh, passed away in September at just 53 years of age, and her last remaining horses will be sold in a dispersal handled by the Cumani family's Fittocks Stud, with whom the Leighs had a storied and successful relationship since the late 1980s.

The Leigh dispersal won't make much noise in the grand scheme of the sale--it is, after all, made up of just six horses--but those six, which all descend from Gerald Leigh's foundation

mare, Brocade, are the product of generations of selective breeding by the Leigh family, and so it would be no surprise to see them continue to reproduce success on the racecourses and as producers for years to come.

"It's small but select," said

Tattersalls Marketing Director Jimmy George of the Leigh dispersal. "We all remember Gerald Leigh and his daughter Sarah, and the huge impact the Leigh family had on breeding in this country in the last 30-odd years. The list of Group 1 and Classic winners bred by the Leigh family is amazing considering the number of broodmares they had, so it'll be tinged with sadness, as all dispersals are, but a great tribute to a hugely successful operation."

Brocade, the winner of the G1 Prix de la Foret, produced G1 2000 Guineas and GI Breeders' Cup Mile victor Barathea (Ire) (Sadler's Wells) for Gerald Leigh, as well as the G1 Fillies' Mile and G1 1000 Guineas winner Gossamer (GB) (Sadler's Wells), herself a Group 1 producer and also the second dam of a Group 2 winner. Brocade produced two other group winners and six of her daughters have produced stakes winners or stakes-placed horses, with many of them also the second dams of stakes winners. Brocade is the second or third dam of all six horses in the dispersal.

The star of the sextet is likely to be Seta (GB) (Pivotal {GB}) (lot 1965), an 8-year-old stakes-winning mare out of Bombazine (Ire) (Generous {Ire}), a stakes-placed daughter of Brocade and the dam of five total stakes winners. Seta's first foal, the winning juvenile Seastrom (GB) (Oasis Dream {GB}), was a 425,000gns Tattersalls October purchase by John Ferguson, while that one's full-brother went the way of Blandford Bloodstock for 420,000gns at the same sale this year.

Seta's Exceed and Excel (Aus) weanling colt (<u>lot 1247</u>) is also part of the dispersal, and Seta is offered empty after being covered again by Oasis Dream this year.

Fittocks's Sara Cumani described Seta as a "a very attractive, young mare."

"Seta would be the star of the show I would think," Cumani said. "Her third foal, which is the one in the sale, is a very nice Exceed and Excel, so she herself is a multiple listed winner and

Group 2-placed from a fantastic family, and she's done everything right so far with her offspring, so she should be very popular. She's lovely looking-she's blonde and beautiful, so she's very appealing."

Also on offer is Seta's unraced half-sister Rivara (GB) (Red Ransom) (lot 1893) and

three of her progeny: the unraced 3-year-old filly Delaine (GB) (Beat Hollow {GB}) (lot 2245) and 2-year-old filly Farandine (GB) (Rock Of Gibraltar {Ire}) (lot 2247), who is currently in training with Luca Cumani and won Oct. 21 in Newmarket, and a Pivotal (GB) yearling colt (lot 147).

Sara Cumani said of Farandine, "She's a very exciting 2-year-old who won at Newmarket on her third start and has everything possible to look forward to next year. We'd very much like to keep her and continue the line. It's sad it's all come to an end; Sarah was very keen, very interested, and was learning and enjoying it and her life was cut short, very sadly."

The connection between the Leigh and Cumani families dates back to 1986, when Gerald Leigh sent Luca Cumani a filly named Infamy (GB) (Shirley Heights {GB}) to train, who would go on to win the GI EP Taylor S. Other Grade/Group 1 winners trained by Cumani for Leigh include Markofdistinction (GB) (Known Fact) and Gossamer, and Cumani also trained Barathea, who was bred by Leigh and raced by Sheikh Mohammed, and Seta, who raced as a homebred for Sarah Leigh. Gerald Leigh also bred the G1 1000 Guineas winner Bosra Sham (Woodman), who he sold for 530,000gns as a yearling.

"We went on through the years and trained lots of horses for him," said Sara Cumani. "He and Luca had a very special relationship. He was very influential in Luca's life and his attitude was very much influential on Luca."

Cumani also recalled Gerald Leigh's attention to detail when he was setting up his Eydon Hall Farm.

"He left nothing to chance and explored every angle and was pretty intent on finding out everything there was to know about developing a stud and breeding and buying the right animals, and he did pretty well at it," she noted. "His influence is there to be seen. Unfortunately, when he died, a lot of what he spent his life building up was sold, but Sarah retained a portion of his stock, and those are the ones now going to the sales." *cont. p6*

The Leigh family accomplished what they did with a broodmare band that never numbered much more than 20, and was even smaller when Sarah took over the reins shortly after the turn of the century.

"They never had big numbers, but they had huge success," Cumani reflected. "The one thing I remember quite clearly about Gerald is that we might have said to him on occasion, 'you're so lucky,' and he'd look at us and say, 'it has nothing to do with luck, it's hard work.""

"Gerald was Luca's mentor and a friend and is much missed," she added. "These studs take years and years to build up so it's sad it isn't able to carry on through fate."

With rain falling across the country, her ability to handle a variety of surfaces to will serve her well. **Nuovo Record (Jpn)** (Heart's Cry {Jpn}) finished second to Lachesis here last year in the same season she won the G1 Yushun Himba. She returned from a three-month layoff to be a respectable second in the G2 Sankei Sho All Comers over this trip Sept. 27. "In the All Comers, the winner came down the outside with a late surge to deny us," said trainer Makoto Saito. "It wasn't a smooth race for her, and as a filly she seemed to take in some stress from the race, but still managed to finish second, which just goes to show what power she has. Her tiredness has gone, and she's been running comfortably over longer distances."

The 3-year-olds, who receive a four-pound weight break, have a good record in this contest, and three sophomores are in with a chance Sunday. **Rouge Buck (Jpn)** (Manhattan Cafe {Jpn}), a daughter of U.S. champion mare Ginger Punch (Awesome Again), finished second as the favorite in the G1 Yushun Himba when last seen May 24, while **Queens Ring (Jpn)** (Manhattan Cafe {Jpn}) was a smart second in the G1 Shuka Sho Oct. 18 and could be a later developer.

#### **BREEDERS' CUP KEY TO SUCCESS AT KEENOV**

Officials at Keeneland were cautiously optimistic that the momentum created by hosting the first-ever Breeders' Cup in the history of the track would carry over into its November Breeding Stock Sale. Upon conclusion of a 12-day run Friday in Lexington, sales executives, consignors and buyers alike reported that it was very much 'mission accomplished' and a job well done.

"I thought the sale started off very well. The whole goal was for the Breeders' Cup to enhance the sale and the excitement of the Breeders' Cup did roll over into [the two Book 1 sessions] Monday and Tuesday," commented Geoffrey Russell, Keeneland's director of sales. "The quality of the offerings our consignors brought was spectacular, including Take Charge Brandi, of course. We also said that we anticipated that some of those foals would be a unique opportunity for people to buy, and the market definitely reflected that in the end."

Highlighted by a diverse buying bench, no fewer than 22 horses achieved seven-figure pricetags, including the \$6 million sales-topper **Take Charge Brandi** (Giant's Causeway--Charming, by Seeking the Gold), compared to 18 in 2014. John Sikura's Hill 'n' Dale Sales Agency consigned the 2014 Eclipse Award-winning juvenile filly on behalf of her owner Willis Horton, and Sikura saw fit to add the filly to his burgeoning and high-class broodmare band. #### Keeneland November Wrap cont. from p1

The final price tag was the highest for a mare at the November sale since the Hill 'n' Dale-consigned Playful Act (Ire) was sold for \$10.5 million at the 2007 November sale.

In addition to the 16 racing or broodmare prospects to attract bids in excess of \$1 million, an unprecedented half-dozen weanlings commanded similar pricetags. Take Charge Brandi's





multiple Grade I-winning granddam Take Charge Lady (Dehere) supplied the foal topper, as her filly by Claiborne's outstanding young sire War Front was hammered down to Mandy Pope's Whisper Hill Farm LLC for \$3.2 million. The Mar. 19 foal, a halfsister to champion and MGISW Will Take Charge (Unbridled's Song) and to GISW and new sire Take Charge Indy (A.P. Indy) in addition to the dam of Take Charge

Brandi, was bred in Kentucky by Eaton and was consigned to the November sale by Reiley McDonald's operation. The \$3.2-million hammer price established a new North American record for a weanling of either sex, eclipsing the previous mark of \$3 million established just last year for a daughter of Tapit. The latter's dam, Serena's Cat (Storm Cat), was also responsible for this year's second highest-priced weanling, a Hill 'n' Daleconsigned son of War Front, who fetched \$2.6 million from M. V. Magnier. The value of the colt's page was further enhanced when his half-brother, 'TDN Rising Star' Honor Code (A.P. Indy), ran on gamely to be third behind Triple Crown winner and certain Horse of the Year American Pharoah (Pioneerof the Nile) in the GI Breeders' Cup Classic up the hill at the racetrack Oct. 31.

"When we promoted this catalogue, we did tell people that there were weanlings in there that normally aren't offered," Russell explained. "That they were one-of-a-kind and likely never to be re-offered again. The market obviously reacted very favorably to them, they were very well received. Breaking the North American record for a filly two years in a row is very rewarding."



The November Sale also included complete dispersals from Nat Rea's Regis Farms and from the late Jerre Paxton's Northwest Farms. Rea, who is breaking away from Thoroughbreds to focus on other business interests, realized gross receipts of \$10,602,000 for 37 horses sold, the best of which was GI Kentucky Oaks runner-up Shook Up. The daughter of Tapit was hammered down to Three Chimneys for \$1.65 million. One of the best runners to race in Paxton's silks in recent years was Stopshoppingdebbie (Curlin), who closed her career with nine wins from her 10 trips to the post. Offered in foal to top sire Medaglia d'Oro, the 5-year-old mare was purchased for \$410,000 by Town & Country Farms and Pollock Farms. The Northwest dispersal grossed just under \$4.3 million.

The always-popular WinStar Racing draft Nov. 10 grossed better than \$1.4 million, with recent Keeneland maiden winner Cowboy Rhythm (Tapit) (hip 3321) selling to Eclipse Thoroughbred Partners for \$335,000.

In all, Keeneland reported a total of 2,575 horses sold for gross receipts of \$218,959,400, some 6.3% higher than last year when the sale was conducted over just 11 sessions. Total sales represent the highest gross since the November Sale record of \$340,877,200 set in 2007. The cumulative average of \$85,033 improved by 3.7% over the corresponding figure from last year, while, in a market that proved at least somewhat polarized, the median price declined by 14.3% from \$35,000 to \$30,000.

Continuing a trend across all sales in 2015, the cumulative buyback rate drifted up this year to 25.2% from the 21.8% in 2014. Russell believes that is just the nature of the beast.

"I think the fact is that buyers are very critical and have a very tight criteria," he said. "If the mare meets the criteria, they're happy to take good money for them and if it doesn't, they're not interested. The criteria are getting tighter and tighter every vear."

The 22 horses that brought \$1 million or more were purchased by 18 unique entities, both domestically and foreign-based. Only Sikura/Hill 'n' Dale (see below), Crupi's New Castle Farm (see below), Barbara Banke's Stonestreet Thoroughbred Holdings were repeat customers at the uppermost level, while other domestic participants included Tom Ryan's DATTT Farm, Willis Horton, Jon Clay's Alpha Delta Stable (through agent Reynolds Bell Jr.), Willis Horton, Richard Santulli's Colts Neck Stable and the Heider Family (via agent Cecil Seaman). Familiar foreign buyers included Sheikh Hamdan's Shadwell Estate Company, M.V. Magnier and Moyglare Stud, while Katsumi Yoshida paid \$1.2 million for GISW and GI Breeders' Cup Distaff runner-up Don't Tell Sophia (Congaree), despite an unfavorable current yen-to-dollar exchange.

"I see that as extremely positive," Russell opined, reflecting on the diversity at the top of the market. "Nobody bought more than two million-dollar horses. It's good to see a good range of buyers playing at that level and I think it's very healthy for our industry. I think our industry is in a very good position with plenty of new investment coming in and continuing to invest, particularly at the top end of the market. I think that bodes very well for us."

#### 'Hill' Tops Among Consignors, Buyers

In 1985, the Hill 'n' Dale Sales Agency ended the November sale as leading consignor, with 13 horses sold for a shade under \$8.9 million. For the first time since, John Sikura's operation ended the auction atop the ledger, its two top sellers accounting for \$8.6 million alone. Overall, Hill 'n' Dale sold 97 horses for

\$28,392,700, easily outdistancing perennial leading consignor Taylor Made, who finished clearly second. No consignor had topped the sale with fewer horses since Walmac International sold 75 horses for a sale-best \$14.5 million back in 1988. It was truly a remarkable sale for the boutique consignment, which offered eight of the 22 horses that were ultimately knocked down for \$1 million or more, including half of the top six weanlings. Hill 'n' Dale also

bred the \$2.6-million War Front--Serena's Cat colt in partnership with Dell Ridge Farm. Hill 'n' Dale closed the sale as third-leading buyer, as they paid \$1.8 million to add MGSW Aurelia's Belle (Lemon Drop Kid) to the broodmare band.

"The sale went very well for us; it was very gratifying," Sikura said. "We brought a special group of horses and we were rewarded in the ring. It wasn't completely surprising to us because we thought we had a very good group. You never know until it happens. We're very happy with the way it turned out."

Though he tasted broad success, Sikura expressed a commonly held belief that the market can be very fickle at times.

"With the obvious flaws or negatives--like very late cover dates or spotty produce records or middle-aged mares that haven't produced yet--you're severely punished," he opined. "The barren mares no longer in foal are tough to sell because people want to get an immediate return.

He continued, "The underpinnings and stabilizing force of the business is the breeding industry, because we supply the product that people buy to be racehorses. That's too simplistic, but without that supply of horses you don't have the business. The foundation of the business starts with the breeders, and they express confidence in the marketplace by buying new stock and they find out if that confidence was well placed depending on the future yearling sales. People make a prediction based on what they've experienced the previous September--and November is right around the corner--so you get a pretty immediate reaction from the Keeneland September Yearling Sale and whether people want to move forward or not."

Geoff Russell also paid homage to Sikura's accomplishments.

"John understands this market very well," Russell commented. "He doesn't have huge consignments, but he has very high-quality consignments. He came into the sale with both guns blazing. He had planned on bringing his best quality here and we were happy with the way the market reacted."

#### **Crupi Makes Splash Among Buyers**

Jimmy Crupi's New Castle Farm is perhaps best-known as a yearling-to-juvenile pinhooking operation, but is not a name one would predict to appear at the top of the sales sheets. But the Florida-based horseman came loaded for bear for the November sale and indeed proved the leading purchaser by gross receipts.

"It's a wonderful feeling," he said in his typically booming voice, referring to the results of the sale. "It makes you feel great when you can go to a sale and basically buy whatever you like. Many years ago when I first started, we had a limited bankroll and you had to settle. But when you're buying for all

these very wealthy owners, it makes your job easy, it really does. But money does not make these horses win. That has nothing to do with it."

Under the New Castle Farm banner, Crupi signed for a total of 26 horses as agent and accounted for turnover of \$10,059,000. The most expensive of his

purchases was the \$3 million he gave for GI Rodeo Drive S. winner Photo Call (Ire) (Galileo {Ire}), and while Crupi declined to identify the buyer by name, he did indicate the 4-year-old would remain in training, at least for the time being, and be pointed towards the GI Matriarch S. at Del Mar at the end of the month. In that event, she could match up with Hard Not to Like (Hard Spun), who was purchased by DATTT Farm for \$2.2 million on the opening day of the November sale. Cont. p9

Crupi believes that the results of the November sale, as well as the year's previous auctions, contributes to a generally positive marketplace and looks forward to the coming months.

"I do think it's a fair market and I think people need horses," he opined. "I think it's going to be a good year next year selling horses, there's a great feeling right now and I feel right now that the industry is at a peak--buying, selling, whatever. If you have a quality horse and a good horse, it doesn't matter where they are, people manage to find them. If you can't make money now, I don't believe you ever will. I have people calling me every day for horses.

He added, "I think the 2-year-old in training sales will be fabulous. I think the top 15 or 20% will sell through the roof. And there will be good money for the others. I just think it's going to be a heck of a year. Everybody is looking for horses."

#### That's a Wrap

Friday's 12th and final session of the November sale was topped by hip 4350, the 6-year-old mare Prime the Pump (Unbridled's Song). Consigned by Paramount Sales, agent, the gray mare is a daughter of the stakes-winning Cintarosa (Grand Slam), herself a half-sister to SW Gotta Rush (Wild Rush). Prime the Pump, offered in foal to Dialed In (Mineshaft), was purchased by Machmer Hall and Haymarket for a session-topping \$53,000.

#### Borell/McIngvale Suit cont. from p1

The suit also contends that Borell is owed two lifetime breeding right to Runhappy, one for each of his Grade I wins. The McIngvales have countered that Borell was a private trainer and that it was agreed that she'd be paid \$1,000 per week, plus bonuses for big wins, including \$10,000 for Runhappy's King's Bishop win that was paid to Borell.

At a hearing in Lexington on Friday, Judge James Ishmael told lawyers representing Borell, the McIngvales and Keeneland that Kentucky law dictated that the winnings be distributed to the McIngvales, despite a personal leaning that the money be held.

Runhappy earned \$820,000 winning the Sprint at Keeneland Oct. 31 with Borell as trainer. The 32-year-old was fired the next day after a disagreement with Gallery's racing manager Laura Wohlers over whether Runhappy should be sent to the track. Borell's lawyer, Richard Getty, asked the court to hold \$117,752 of Runhappy's Sprint winnings. That number included \$82,000, or 10% of the Runhappy's Breeders's Cup earnings, that Getty says Borell is due, plus unpaid compensation from Runhappy's previous wins.

Representatives of Keeneland said all other purse monies from the Sprint had been paid out, and were seeking direction from the court as to what to do with Runhappy's earnings.

In related news, text exchanges between Borell and Wohlers were released Friday. Getty said the exchanges supported Borell's claim that she had never agreed to a situation in which she wouldn't be paid a 10% commission.

"Laura, can we talk some about his next race?" Borell texted prior to the King's Bishop. "Will I get 10% if [Runhappy] wins? I know I have the horses in the stalls etc, but my parents are about to lose everything and move into an [sic] basement apartment because my sisters are screw ups. I just want to give them the money. Even 5%, anything. Sorry to ask via text, but I am balling crying."

Wohlers responded, "Sorry about that happening. We have never paid a commission to our private trainers. Mack...said he'd give you a 10k bonus if we won and I could ask him about more if we won but can't promise you anything. The barn costs us sooooo much more to pay for everything ourselves than a day rate. I'll ask him though if we win but I don't think now is the time."

Borell's legal team also collected affidavits from three trainers-Charles Simon, Ken McPeek and Steven Moyer. All three said it was industry standard for trainers to be paid 10-12% of purse winnings for horses running first, second or third, whether or not they were considered public or private trainers. Additionally, Simon and Moyer both trained for the McIngvales, and both commented on Wohlers, James McIngvale's sister-in-law and Linda's twin sister. Cont. p10

"To put it bluntly, dealing with Ms. Wohlers was extremely difficult," said Simon. "She tried to micromanage training from Houston and disregarded my advice or directions regarding the risks involved in over-training horses. I was relieved that I could ultimately extricate myself from the situation. I disagreed often with her usual training theories. To say that dealing with her was difficult is an understatement."

Moyer, currently an assistant for Jimmy Jerkens, privately trained for the McIngvales from August 1997 through April 1998. Moyer said he was paid \$700 per week, plus a 6.5% commission on all purse winnings. That, said Getty, undermines the claim the the McIngvales have never paid a commission to trainers.

"I ended my relationship with the McIngvales in approximately April 1998 principally because of the involvement of...Wohlers," said Moyer. "Ms. Wohlers was very confrontational and, to say the least, was extremely difficult to deal with. It finally reached the point where I severed my relationship with the McIngvales."

4-1 morning line favorite Partisan Politics (More Than Ready)-was third in the GIII Miss Grillo S. at Big Sandy a month later behind barnmate and budding superstar Lady Eli (Divine Park).

She didn't find any luck against several of these when seventh in the GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies Turf behind that luminary on Halloween 2014. Given plenty of time off thereafter, the Long Lake Stable and Beacon Hill Thoroughbreds representative made her 2015 bow a winning one, when effective over this distance in a Belmont allowance Oct. 18.

Partisan Politics, fourth in the Miss Grillo and one better than Tammy the Torpedo in the GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies Turf with GSW Rainha Da Bateria (Broken Vow) ninth and Isabella Sings (Eskendereya) 12th, dropped a nose decision in the Wild Applause S. to the upwardly mobile **Celestine** (Scat Daddy) over firm turf at Belmont June 14 and was left with too much ground to make up when fourth in the GII Lake George S. upstate July 24, one behind also eligible Cara Marie (Unbridled's Song) with Robillard (Distorted Humor) eighth. She lost the Riskaverse S. by a nostril at the Spa Aug. 27, but enters the Mrs. Revere on the back of a win in Belmont's Oct. 12 Pebbles S. with Devine Aida (Unbridled's Song) the bridesmaid and Isabella Sings fourth. "Both fillies have been training excellent," said trainer Chad Brown. "This looks like it's the last race on the calendar year for straight 3-year-old fillies on the grass so the timing works out well for them both. She [Tammy the Torpedo] wasn't injured; we just felt that she could have used some time off."

The aforementioned Celestine, who hails from the barn of Hall of Fame trainer Bill Mott, is in the midst of a four-race winning streak including back-to-back Belmont contests in the Wait a While S. May 16 and the Wild Applause S. June 14. The Phaedrus Flights LLC colorbearer will have to overcome the almost five-month layoff and breezed a half-mile beneath the Twin Spires in :48 flat (5/29) Nov. 9.

Prado's Sweet Ride (Fort Prado), one of the few signed on with a graded-stakes victory with Return to Grace (English Channel) third in the GIII Regret S. going 1 1/8 miles over the Matt Winn Turf Course June 13, returned with a third with that foe one better in the GIII Pucker Up S. at Arlington Park Aug. 15. Fourth in the off-turf GIII Valley View S. over the Keeneland main Oct. 24, the Chris Block charge could face ground that is less than ideal Saturday. "It was deep ground last time out at Keeneland, but to me it doesn't matter what else is in the race," said Block. "She's right where she is supposed to be and she's never thrown a bad race. One concern that I have is the potential softness of the turf. I'm not sure that she's run on a real soft turf, but I think that with a good trip in Saturday's race, she should make me proud."

Stuart Janney's GIII Commonwealth Oaks heroine Onus (Blame) has won her last three starts by a combined 23 lengths, annexing a Laurel grass maiden special weight July 11, before adding an allowance Aug. 14 and the Oaks last out Sept. 26 for Shug McGaughey.



#### PENNSYLVANIA "DEFERS" THREAT TO HALT

Citing progress in negotiations with horsemen and an expected vote next week on a bill to use gaming revenue to correct a long-standing structural deficit in the fund that allows the Pennsylvania Horse Racing Commission to operate, government officials have "deferred" the ongoing threat to shut down racing in the state.

The State Racing Fund, which is the primary funding mechanism for the PHRC, has a \$20 million annual budget and is currently \$6.2 million in the red. The fund is primarily funded through a cut of pari-mutuel wagers, but it almost annually runs dry because of declining handle. In the past, Pennsylvania has shifted money from other funds to make up the shortfall, but an ongoing five-month state budget impasse has prevented that from happening this year.

On Oct. 22, Gov. Tom Wolf vowed to issue a "cease within 30 days" notice to the racing industry unless horsemen's group representatives, the state's six Thoroughbred and Standardbred tracks, and government officials came up with a plan to shift the responsibility for funding the State Racing Fund onto the sport's stakeholders.

A Friday afternoon press release from the Department of Agriculture, which oversees the PHRC, said that the Wolf administration "has decided to defer any decision on the suspension of live racing in Pennsylvania."

"This week's talks continued to produce positive steps forward," said agriculture secretary Russell C. Redding. "We continue to build on the framework agreement reached last week on [Senate Bill 352]. No one is getting everything they want in this bill, but it will give us the long-term financial fix we need to maintain the integrity of this industry and the tools we need to modernize it for the first time in decades. We'll keep working with the General Assembly in the coming days to put the finishing touches on the bill so a long-term solution can be enacted in the very near future."

According to a summary of SB 352 posted on <a href="https://www.legiscan.com">www.legiscan.com</a>, the bill, which passed the Pennsylvania Senate in June, 25 to 24, would include broad changes "to racing oversight...pari-mutuel wagering licensing and for advance deposit wagering...medication rules and enforcement provisions...and providing for the cessation of the State Horse Racing Commission and the State Harness Racing Commission."

To specifically address the current funding problems, SB 352 will also allow the State Racing Fund to tap into the Race Horse Development Fund to cover racing commission and drug testing costs. The RHDF was created in 2004, primarily to pay for purses in the state, but it has been routinely tapped for other purposes.

In 2014, the RHDF generated \$242 million from Pennsylvania gaming revenue.

Reached via phone late Friday afternoon, Salvatore DeBunda, president of the Pennsylvania Thoroughbred Horsemen's Association, said he was not immediately aware that the threat to halt racing had been deferred.

"We as an industry are pleased to hear that," DeBunda said. He declined to comment on SB 352 until he had a clearer understanding of what would come up for a vote. "I know what's been discussed. I just don't know what's going to end up in the final version."

He does have a May 17 birthday so we thought we would be a little kinder to him considering he [technically] had been running as a 2-year-old still."

The sophomore, who was last seen finishing sixth as the favorite in Turfway's GIII Spiral S. Mar. 21, has been transferred from California-based conditioner Jeff Bonde to the Marylandbased Michael Dickinson.

"We are excited that Michael Dickinson is back in training so we have given him the horse," Metanovic said. "The horse was already in Kentucky and it made a lot of sense for us to run on the East Coast. I think there are more opportunities for grass races in that area right now."

As for when Metaboss is expected to return to the races, Metanovic said, "We are probably looking at February. It depends on the horse and what Michael thinks and where the horse is at physically. WinStar did a phenomenal job with him [during his recovery] and I'm sure Michael will as well."




