French sales company Arqana will still hold its Autumn Sale from Nov. 16-18 beginning at 11 a.m. local time, despite the terrorist attacks in Paris the night of Nov. 13. The sales company released the following statement Saturday morning which reads:

“As a consequence of the terribly sad events that took place in Paris last night, security measures have been enforced in the capital city, including the cancellation of racing at Saint-Cloud and Auteuil, however all other areas of France remain unaffected.

Racing is taking place today in Compiègne, North of Paris, and public transports both into and within France are operating as normal. Official statements as well as eye-witness reports from Roissy Charles de Gaulle, Orly and Beauvais airports confirm that flights are arriving on time. Eurotunnel and national rail services are also running on schedule. Road traffic across the Belgian, German and Swiss borders has been reported as perfectly smooth. However, border control has been reinforced and security checks may take a little longer than usual.

Arqana is implementing a hotline service on +33 231 81 81 10 to answer any questions regarding traveling to Deauville.

TOEWS ON ICE CAPTURES BOB HOPE S.

Mike Pegram, Karl Watson and Paul Weitman's **Toews On Ice** (Archarcharch) became the first graded stakes winner for his freshman sire (by Arch) with a gritty score in the GIII Bob Hope S. at Del Mar Saturday night. Avoiding early trouble caused by **Jury** (Tale of the Cat) who took a hard left out of the two-hole and impeded **Dr. Dorr** (Lookin at Lucky), the 4-5 chalk seized the early advantage and exchanged blows with the headstrong **Mac Daddy Mac** (Put It Back) through sharp opening fractions of :22.84 and :45.85. Toews on Ice showed the way into the lane with that rival still glued to his side and the pair continued their battle into the final furlong, where the favorite finally shook free of his pursuer and edged clear to score.

"You're always worried when a horse gets headed like he did," said assistant trainer Jimmy Barnes. "But it looked like Martin [Garcia] was just cruising and he responded when he had to. He'd been doing this thing where he would switch leads if you hit him aggressively, so Martin had to ride him with a little more finesse and the horse changed on his own. Martin did a good job. You want to see a horse come back like he did. It was gratifying."

Third on debut in the slop here July 18, Toews on Ice completed the trifecta again behind a "TDN Rising Star" performance from Young Brian (Hard Spun) over this course Aug. 8. Earning his diploma with a dominant 7 1/4-length victory in the restricted Barretts Juvenile S. at Los Alamitos Sept. 20, the dark bay scored another decisive victory next out over the reopposing **Street Vision** (Street Sense) in Santa Anita's six-furlong Speakeasy S. There weren't too many people from out of town who came for the Breeders' Cup and stayed for the whole three-week Kentucky experience, finishing with Keeneland Book 6 Friday. Keeneland CEO Bill Thomason and his team of hundreds no doubt hope to sleep in this morning after pulling off the unprecedented logistical challenge of hosting the Breeders' Cup, followed by the 12-day Keeneland November Sale, with Fasig-Tipton's one-day sale, which still grossed \$43-million in spite of being down from last year, on the Sunday in between, two weeks ago today.

One of the attractions of holding the Breeders' Cup at Keeneland was no travel day between the Breeders' Cup and the November sales. **Cont. p4**

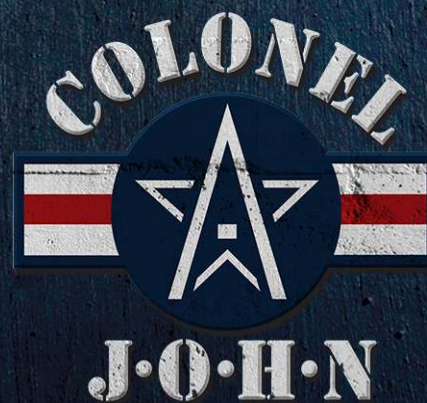

To prepare for the sale literally while the Breeders' Cup was taking place up the hill presented unique challenges, but the Keeneland team's preparation was such that the transition was as seamless as it could have been. The Breeders' Cup in Lexington was an even bigger success than anyone had dared to hope, and the preparation of both the Breeders' Cup and

Keeneland teams will be a template for the future. The whole thing was a world-class experience.

Then we got down to the business of the sales. Fasig was hit with some high-profile withdrawals, and when you have a small

catalogue--just 4% of the horses catalogued in Kentucky November's 13 days of selling--a few not turning up can make a big difference. With one more catalogued than in 2014, Fasig sold 16 fewer horses, dropped \$20-million in gross, and 20% in average from their 2014 renewal. Just 92, or 46.2% of the 199 catalogued were listed as sold, down from 54.5% the previous year.

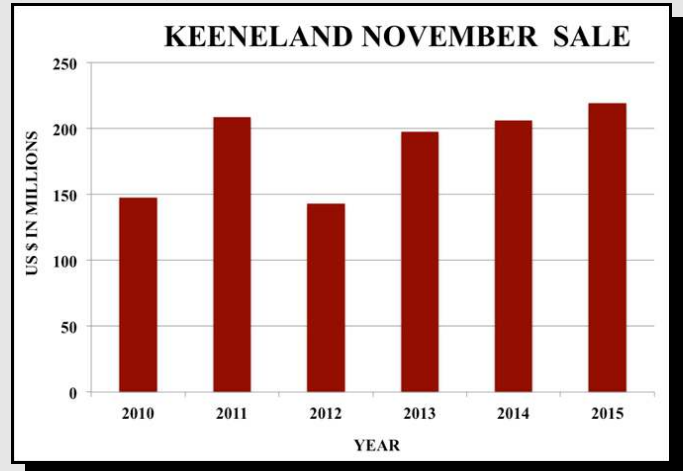
Though Fasig's one-day sale for the most part constitutes a part of the top of the market, the 4,476 catalogued and 2,575 sold (57.5% of those catalogued) at Keeneland November obviously constitute the vast majority of Kentucky's November sale market. Keeneland grossed \$218,959,400, a gain of 6% over last year's sale, and averaged \$85,033, a rise of 4%, though the 57.5% clearance rate from the catalogue was down about 5% from last year. So Keeneland was up \$11-million, but with Fasig being down by \$20-million, when we combine the two to describe the entire Kentucky November market, the number sold was up by 2%, the combined gross was down by 3% (about \$7-million), and the average dropped by 4%, from \$102,892 last year to \$98,472. Nonetheless, the description of the major 2015 Thoroughbred markets as somewhere between stable and static continues to look about right.

I think all of us analysts have just about drilled it into everybody's head now that you have to be careful with mixed sales results, as the composition of the catalogues--the mares and fillies available--can change quite significantly from year to year. **Cont. p5**

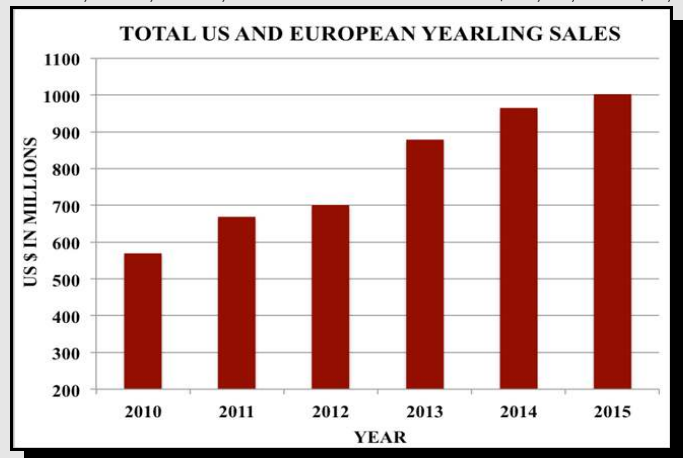

"Keeneland November was up 6% in gross and 4% in average from last year, though as 11% more were catalogued and 3% more sold, the clearance rate from the catalogues dropped 5%. Still, the sale edged up above the \$200-million region achieved in 2011 (Evans Dispersal), and 2013-14. The yearling market jumped 25% from 2012 (\$700m) to 2013 (\$878m) and now has cracked the \$1-billion barrier, even as the number sold and average still edge up. This is a good result."

The yearling sales provide a more stable population to analyze (see the Weekly Sales Ticker), but we thought we'd take a look at the weanling market in Kentucky to see what we learn from that. Brianne Stanley compiled the attached small table from the sales company websites plus *TDN*. They do tell a couple of stories, with conflicting pointers.

The good news is that, since 2013, the gross for Kentucky November foals (of which 95% sell at Keeneland) is up by 23%, to \$69.7-million this year, and the average is up 25%, to \$79,202. The bad news is that the number catalogued has also risen by 23%, but the number sold has actually dropped by 2%. Between withdrawals and not-solds, the clearance rate from the catalogues has dropped from 62% two years ago to 46% this year; not good. Foals are either bought by pinhookers or end-users, and the fact that the number sold has not grown at all suggests there are no more pinhookers or no more end users than there were two years ago—but there are 23% more foals on the market. It's further evidence that growth in the North American Thoroughbred market, at least, has stalled. Historically when the horse market has recovered from a deep plunge it has shown sustained growth, for example for 10 consecutive years from 1997-2006. But from this last recession it appears the pool of buyers shrunk nearly as fast as the foal crop, so there was a good recovery to a certain point, but now it's stalled. The pool of money spent has increased, but the number of players, apparently, has not.

Sires' weanling averages, at the North American mixed sales anyway, tend to reflect smaller numbers, usually single-digit numbers. A look at the *TDN* Intstatistics list of leading North American sires by weanling average (click [here](#)) confirms this: **War Front** averaged \$2,081,250, but for just four weanlings. **Tapit** averaged \$595,000 for eight; **Medaglia D'Oro** averaged \$480,000 for two. Only three star sires among the 15 which averaged \$150,000 or more had more than 10 weanlings sell: **Pioneerof The Nile** (14, avg \$212,142); **Scat Daddy** (17, avg \$185,294); and **Curlin** (11, avg \$160,909). *Cont. p6*

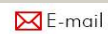

I should say ‘among the 16’, because Ashford’s **Declaration of War**, who stood at Coolmore in Ireland in 2014, then moved to Ashford in 2015, is actually the leading first-crop sire now standing in North America by weanling average, as four foals from his Irish-sired crop averaged \$295,000 at Keeneland, including an \$800,000 filly out of Hanky Panky, a Group-placed Galileo half-sister to Giant’s Causeway and You’re so thrilling. Because he had one foal registered in December 2014, The Jockey Club Information Systems’ file does not show him as an F2015 sire, so we’re in the process of getting that manually corrected. The F2015 sires which stood in North America in 2014 and didn’t have 2014 foals registered were led by Claiborne’s **Orb** (16, avg \$120,312), Darley’s **Animal Kingdom** (9, avg \$110,777), and WinStar’s **Paynter** (11, avg \$101,556), followed by Taylor Made’s **Graydar** (15, avg \$90,066) and Calumet’s **Oxbow** (5, avg \$89,000)(click [here](#)--North American Freshman Sires of Weanlings).

Leading first-year covering sire was Airdrie’s **Cairo Prince**, who had the good fortune to be bred this year to Runhappy’s dam, the Broken Vow mare Bella Jolie. She went through the ring at Keeneland for \$1.6-million, and contributed about 85% of the revenue for all eight mares in foal to Cairo Prince, who thus averaged \$231,437. Three Chimneys’ **Will Take Charge** had nine mares in foal average \$143,888, followed by Lane’s End’s **Noble**

Mission (17, avg \$93,470) and Coolmore Ashford’s **Verrazano** (13, avg \$93,307), in pretty much a dead-heat for third.

The European foal sales kick off tomorrow at Goffs; over the next three weeks there are 16 more foals by Declaration of War (War Front) catalogued in the three major European Foal or Mixed sales, which finish the second week in December. According to a table published in Friday’s Racing Post Breeding Stock Sales supplement, there are also 33 foals from the first crop by Coolmore’s **Camelot** (Montjeu); 34 by Darley’s **Dawn Approach** (New Approach); and 10 by then-Cheveley Park’s (now Haras du Quesnay’s) **Intello** (Galileo), who were the three European stallions besides Declaration of War to debut for 25,000 or more in 2014. The market will also be asked to judge and absorb 69 foals by Darley Kildangan’s **Epaulette** (Commands); 59 by Tweenhills’ **Havana Gold** (Teofilo); 52 each by Cheveley Park’s **Lethal Force** (Dark Angel) and Tally-Ho’s **Society Rock** (Rock of Gibraltar); and 51 by Ballyhane’s **Red Jazz** (Johannesburg). We’ll let you know how all that went when this column returns, which will be Tuesday, Nov. 24. Isabella Sings pulled up a huge upset with a front running victory in Churchill's GII Mrs. Revere S. Saturday evening. Dismissed at 27-1 from her 8-1 morning-line quote, the chestnut broke sharply and took up her preferred position at the head of affairs, where she clocked early fractions of :23.50 and :48.07. Maintaining a clear advantage into the lane, the 3-year-old had

several late pursuers, but she skipped home to score her first graded stakes victory under Paco Lopez. Fellow longshot Rainha Da Bateria, who went off at 44-1 from a 15-1 morning line, closed strongly to be second.

"She can be kind of a headstrong filly and Paco was able to kind of coax her along a bit and get her to settle," winning trainer Todd Pletcher said. "The first quarter was solid, but then they were able to talk her out of it and get a kind second quarter. It looked like it was game on from there. I was hoping she could continue on."

Lightly raced as a juvenile, Isabella Sings followed a debut win at Belmont last summer with a near miss in Woodbine's GII Natalma S. in September before finishing a non-factor 12th in the GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies Turf. Opening her sophomore account with an optional claimer win at Gulfstream Feb. 26, the chestnut finished second to the reopposing Celestine (Scat Daddy) in that venue's Sanibel Island S. Mar. 29 and was fourth behind that rival in Belmont's Wait a While S. May 16. A well-beaten seventh in an Elmont optional claimer June 12, she captured a division of Monmouth's Little Silver S. July 26 and missed by just a nose in that venue's GIII Boiling Springs S. Sept. 5. The sophomore was last seen finishing fourth behind Partisan Politics (More Than Ready), who was fifth as the 3-1 second-choice in this test, and Devine Aida in Belmont's Pebbles S. Oct. 12.

The winner is a half to fellow Siena Farms homebred and Todd Pletcher trainee Alaura Michele (Arch), who captured a pair of listed stakes and was also graded stakes placed. Their dam produced an unraced juvenile colt named Sport (Hard Spun), a yearling colt by that sire, and weanling colt by Animal Kingdom. She was bred back to Quality Road. Siena Farms also made news in the sales ring recently when their homebred Grade I winner Angela Renee (Bernardini), a full sister to To Honor and Serve, topped the Fasig-Tipton November sale after being hammered down to Don Alberto Corporation for \$3 million.

Mr Maybe handled this step up in class with aplomb, charging from last to first to win the GIII Red Smith H. by daylight in his second start for these connections. Bet down to 2-1 favoritism

in this black-type bow, the gray caboosed the field as MGSW War Dancer (War Front) crawled along the fence through glacial early splits of :26.07, :51.31 and 1:16.94 while closely shadowed by GI Belmont Derby winner Mr Speaker (Pulpit). Creeping up two wide as they approached the far turn, the gelding unleashed a

furious late turn of foot in the lane to instantly inhale his rivals and powered home a decisive winner while completing his final quarter in :23.26.

"We knew he was sitting on a really good race, but how easily he won surprised me," winning trainer Chad Brown remarked. "He's a horse that has a lot of talent. We thought there was some room for improvement and he's taken to our program nicely. My staff has really enjoyed working with this horse--he's a big teddy bear--and he's only getting better."

Mr Maybe has changed hands several times in his 13-race career, making his debut at Monmouth for Tony Dutrow and CJZ Racing Stable in the summer of 2013 after which he was sidelined for a year. Returning at Delaware the following summer under the care of trainer Tim Ritchey and bearing the silks of Cash is King LLC, he broke his maiden in a \$50,000 claimer first out for that barn and was only off the board once in four subsequent starts for those connections. Transferred to trainer Butch Reid. in the fall of 2014, the gray was fourth in his initial two starts for that conditioner in a grassy optional claimer at the Big A last November and a main track allowance at Parx Dec. 1. Returning from a lengthy layoff in a turf test at Saratoga July 26, the 4-year-old finished fourth yet again and improved to be third by just a head next out over that course Aug. 16. He earned just his second lifetime win next out at Parx Aug. 31, and was privately purchased by Michael Dubb, Head of Plains Partners and Highclere American and transferred to the hot-handed Brown.

"Brad Weisbord deserves a lot of credit here because he was adamant about buying this horse," Brown said. "It wasn't an easy deal to complete. It fell apart at one point and he went back and got the horse purchased for us. On this one, he had the most confidence on our team of anyone. Thanks to his efforts he's in our barn."

Mr Maybe won his debut for these connections in 1 3/8-mile optional claimer over the lawn at Belmont Oct. 15 prior to this effort. Brown said the gray would be freshened for a big campaign next year with the end goal being competing at the Grade I level.

Trouble Kid appeared to have secured his fifth straight victory here since being claimed for \$15,000, but the tote board soon flashed and, after a lengthy deliberation by the stewards, the one-two finish was reversed. Sent to the lead from his outside post, Trouble Kid appeared to make things tight on the rivals inside of him, with Gentlemen's Bet taking the worst of it and checking sharply. Gentlemen's Bet quickly recovered to chase the pacesetter, but could never get to him despite giving his all. Third in the 2013 GI Breeders' Cup Sprint, Gentlemen's Bet missed all of 2014, but annexed Oaklawn's Hot Springs S. second off the lengthy lay-off in March. The 6-year-old was withdrawn from consideration for the Breeders' Cup after being installed as an also-eligible. "This was his Breeders' Cup, because he didn't get in this year," offered winning conditioner Ron Moquett. "This by no means was a letdown. This race is so historic. It's something I've always wanted to win. It's been on my bucket list. It's a race I watched growing up with huge interest, and it's an honor to win it. I'm over the moon." Joshua Navarro, who rode Trouble Kid, said, "It's tough to take, but it's part of the business. I don't know what to say. I was still on the best horse."
