



GOFFS FOAL SALE BEGINS MONDAY

The Goffs November Foal Sale kicks off its expanded run in Ireland Monday with the first 227 lots slated to go under the hammer in Co. Kildare. An increased Irish foal crop and a resurgence in the sale itself in recent years has seen the sale expanded to 1203 hips over five days from Nov. 16-20 for the first time since 2007. The sale consisted of three days just four years ago, but year-on-year growth since that time has seen an increased demand for spots for quality youngsters in the Goffs catalogue. Indeed, last year's foal sale saw an increased average of 41% (€37,068) and a median that was up 29.4% (€22,000), despite 54 more horses being sold, and the buyback rate was a very healthy 15%. Last year's sale also saw a record price for an Irish foal: the €1.8 million paid by agent Dermot Farrington for a filly from the first crop of Frankel (GB) out of Classic winner Finsceal Beo (Ire) (Mr. Greeley).

"The Goffs November Foal Sale has been enormously successful, and has grown year-on-year for five years," said Goffs Chief Executive Henry Beeby. "Goffs' foal sale accounts for 82% of the Irish foals that are sold, so it's a market leader in that sense. We've sold the four highest-priced foals in Europe the last 10 years, headed by last year's €1.8 million for the Frankel filly."

The success of Goffs foal graduates was highlighted Oct. 24 by the victory of Marcel (Ire) (Lawman {Fr}) in the G1 Racing Post Trophy. cont. p2

ARQANA AUTUMN SALE STARTS NOV. 16

The three-day Arqana Autumn sale gets underway at 11 a.m. Monday in Deauville, with buyers, consignors and sales officials alike resolved to carry on with the sale despite the terror attacks in Paris Friday night. The sale offers 646 lots in the main catalogue--255 horses in training, 36 2-year-old store horses and 385 flat and National Hunt yearlings. There have been 11 wild-card entries added to the horses-in-training section, whose credentials may be seen here and their catalogue pages here.

Two last-minute entries turned out to be the sales toppers in 2014: Silverwave (Fr) (Silver Frost {Ire}), who was bought for €420,000 by Alain Couetil and The Saint James (Fr) (Saint des Saints {Fr}) who was bought for €320,000 by Jonjo O'Neill from Ecurie Sagara. cont. p2



The Aga Khan Studs offer a contingent of 12 horses in training, including Cherek (Fr) (Paco Boy {Ire}), lot 194, trained by Jean-Claude Rouget, who finished fourth in the G1 Criterium International and third in the G3 Prix des Chenes at two; and Zourkhan (Ire) (Shamardal), lot 192, trained by Alain de Royer Dupre. This 3-year-old half-brother to Zarkava (Ire) (Zamindar {Ire}), Zarshana (Ire) (Sea the Stars {Ire}) and Zarkandar (Ire) (Azamour {Ire}) was second first time out at Maisons-Laffitte, and won last out over 2,800 meters at Saint-Cloud Oct. 14.

The Aga Khan also offers **Shensi (Fr)** (Invincible Spirit {Ire}), <u>lot</u> <u>196</u>, trained by Alain de Royer Dupre. The son of Group 3 winner Shemiyla (Fr) (Dalakhani {Ire}) was recently third in the Prix Belebat run over 2,100 meters at Saint-Cloud. Other horses of interest include the talented **Red Tornado (Fr)** (Dr. Fong), <u>lot</u> <u>190</u>, trained by Harry Dunlop.

Tuesday and Wednesday, 385 yearlings will go through the ring starting at 1 p.m. The Autumn Sale is the last sale of the year dedicated to yearlings bred to run on the flat. This contingent is also rich in the offspring of proven stallions such as American Post (GB), Elusive City, Falco, Footstepsinthesand (GB), Manduro (Ger), Motivator (GB), Mhutathir (GB), Myboycharlie (Ire), Slickly (Fr), Soldier of Fortune (Ire), Stormy River (Fr), Vision d'Etat (Fr), and young stallions such as Fuisse (Fr), Paco Boy (Ire) and Poet's Voice (GB).




HESMONDS STUD BUYER OF SIYOUNI STAKE

Hesmonds Stud, owned by Nurlan Bizakov, was the successful buyer of a 1/50 of a stake in **Siyouni (Fr)** (Pivotal {GB}) for €355,000, the *Racing Post* reported. Arqana hosted the auction, with a total of 31 bids being accepted for the young sire. Siyouni, winner of the G1 Prix Jean-Luc Lagardere-Grand Criterium and second in the G1 Prix Jean Prat on the racecourse, has already sired MG1SW and Classic winner Ervedya (Fr) and two other group stakes winners.

"Siyouni looks like he's going to be outstanding," Hesmonds Stud manager Tony Fry told the *Racing Post*. "He has certainly started off the right way and he's siring beautiful-looking horses. This is the first share we've had in a stallion, and our first breeding interest in France. The boss [Bizakov] bought the farm five years ago and he's always looking to upgrade the horses--and this opportunity came along."

Siyouni will stand at his breeder His Highness the Aga Khan's Haras de Bonneval in France for €30,000 for 2016.





MARIALITE CROWNED IN QE II CUP

Despite a fairly consistent record of in-the-money finishes, Marialite (Jpn) (Deep Impact {Jpn}) had remained under the radar until a second-place display in the G3 Mermaid S. at Hanshin June 14. The Carrot Farm-owned 4-year-old leveraged that form into a narrow neck victory over favored Nuovo Record (Jpn) (Heart's Cry {Jpn}) in her first attempt at the highest level in the G1 Queen Elizabeth II Cup at Kyoto, Japan, Sunday. The win marked the 24th Group 1 for pilot Masayoshi Ebina and the first group race tally for trainer Takashi Kubota in six years and sixth overall.

"I'm so delighted with her achievement because I've been training her towards this goal all along and she's built up into a great filly," a jubilant Kubota said. "I left all the tactics to Ebina and she ran such a smooth race, I was really excited watching her charging down the homestretch. She held on so well."

"The track condition worked to her advantage," added Ebina. "She's easy to ride and was in great shape today. She's been allowed to mature without much pressure up to now for which I'm grateful and now that she's won today, I'm looking forward to much more improvement, which she is capable of."

Finding plenty of cover, Ebina positioned Marialite in ninth, three off the rail, going into the first turn as **Win Liberty (Jpn)** (King Kamehameha {Jpn}) cut out steady fractions of :23.7, :48.5 and 1:00.7 for the first 1000 meters, five lengths to the good of **Lilavati (Jpn)** (Zenno Rob Roy {Jpn}), a similar margin ahead of the bulk of the field. Let out a notch by Ebina, Marialite

began to pick off horses still fairly wide and was much closer in sixth through 1600 meters in 1:38.6. Leaving the final bend, Marialite unleashed a wide rally up the middle of the course, hitting the front inside

the final furlong, before fending off the late rush of Nuovo Record, who was also runner-up in the 2014 edition won by Lachesis (Jpn) (Deep Impact {Jpn). The 3-year-old filly Touching Speed (Jpn) also made late headway to take third a half-length farther back, while Lachesis (Jpn), with Ryan Moore aboard, didn't have the cleanest of trips and was blocked in the home straight, finishing 10th.

Untroubled in the past by ground that is less than firm, Marialite took third in a Tokyo affair on Valentine's Day and returned to the winner's circle going 2500 meters at Nakayama Mar. 8. She added Tokyo's Ryokufu S. May 9, before flashing real talent, when second in the G3 Mermaid S. at Hanshin June 14, her first foray into group company. Materialite was only fifth going this distance in Nakayama's Sankei Sho All Comers resurfacing after a three-month freshening Sept. 27.

Marialite is out of the winning Chrysoprase (Jpn) (El Condor Pasa), who is a full to Japan Cup Dirt hero and GSP Alondite (Jpn). She is the second group winner for Chrysoprase. Her year-younger half-brother Lia Fail (Jpn) (Zenno Rob Roy {Jpn}) captured the G2 Kobe Shimbun Hai this year and was Classic-placed in the G1 Kikua Sho (Japanese St. Leger).

Much of the discussion heading into Sunday's Longines Singapore Gold Cup, the richest event on the domestic calendar, surrounded Stepitup (Aus) (Hussonet) and his attempt to complete the Older Horse Triple Crown. But the diminutive gelding failed to see out this 11-furlong trip under a big weight and Cooptado proved the main beneficiary.

The winner of the 2013 G1 Gran Premio Nacional (Argentine Derby) and champion 3-year-old of that season in his native land, Cooptado was sold to Russian owners Valentin Bukhtoyarov and Evgeny Kappushev to continue his career in

Dubai under the care of Doug Watson. A Listed winner last December, he was transferred to this jurisdiction, and though he hadn't managed to crash the winner's circle in his first six runs, he had shown signs of improvement and was exiting a running-on fourth, beaten 2 1/2 lengths, when

prepping for the Gold Cup in the El Dorado Classic over this track and trip Oct. 25.

With leading apprentice Rizuan Shafig having his first ride for two-time Gold Cup-winning conditioner Patrick Shaw, Cooptado, the best-drawn of the trainer's quartet, drifted back through the field and had three or four behind into the backstretch as Order of the Sun (Aus) (Encosta de Lago (Aus)) crossed to the lead and put open lengths on the rest of the field. The advantage had evaporated as the field hit the half-mile marker, with 61-1 Twickenham (Aus) (Artie Schiller) and Fastnet Dragon the first to make their moves. Cooptado remained well back in the field, but his superior stamina began to kick in and he had the leaders within his grasp entering the final furlong. Fastnet Dragon, runner-up to Stepitup in the 1800-meter Raffles Cup Oct. 25, stuck on gamely enough, but he began to tire, and Cooptado grabbed him close home for the victory. Perfect P made it a onethree for the stable, while defending champion Quechua (Arg) (Pure Prize) and Emperor's Banquet (Aus) (Holy Roman Emperor {Ire}) also finished in the top six for Shaw.

"He's a real stayer, and I wasn't worried he was far back early, as 2200 meters is very long, but at the 1000-meter mark I thought he couldn't win when he dropped the bit," said Shafiq, who recently outrode his claim with his 151st winner. "But when I woke him up and kept riding him, he started to respond very well. He just kept improving and he hit the line very strong. I have to thank Mr. Shaw and the owners for putting me on this horse. It's a moment I will never forget."

The winner is bred on the reverse Ride the Rails/Candy Stripes cross responsible for Candy Ride, who, like Cooptado, was bred by Haras Abolengo. Click for the Singapore Turf Club chart. VIDEO.









TERRAVISTA TO SPELL, HK OFF TABLE

Terravista (Aus) (Captain Rio {GB}), who captured the G1 Darley Classic at Flemington in 2014 and exited this year's edition with a third-place effort Nov. 7, will be sent for a spell, instead of competing in the G1 Hong Kong International Sprint Dec. 13, reported *racenet.com.au*. Trainer Joe Pride will give Terravista a break, with the long-term target the G1 Black Caviar Lightning S. at Flemington in February.

"When he came back from Melbourne, I just thought it would have been a bit of a stretch to give him another run," Pride told racenet.com.au. "It's a great race and hopefully he can go over there next year. I've had one there before and it was a fantastic trip, but it was just not the right time for him this preparation. There's a good chance he'll resume in the Lightning, he loves the straight, so I'm very keen to get him back down there."



FLYING SPUR'S MAHUTA SHINES IN SANDOWN GUINEAS

Over the past fortnight, many of the major European studs have released their fees for the 2016 breeding season. One eye-catching aspect of the rosters is the proliferation of reverse-shuttling stallions.

Shuttling sires from the Northern Hemisphere to the south has been commonplace now for nearly 30 years, but it took longer for the reverse process to be accepted. However, with at least a dozen Australasian horses listed on the major rosters in the British Isles for the forthcoming stud season, it is clear that the reverse-shuttle regime is now firmly established.

It was not until Choisir (Aus) (Danehill Dancer {Ire}) had altered European perceptions of the merits of Australian horses by winning twice at Royal Ascot in 2003, that the reverse-shuttle route started to become a viable one. Those who had tried it previously had found their efforts unappreciated, and several good sires came and went without much in the way of either fanfare or thanks. One of 'the ones who got away' was the one-time Irish National Stud visitor Flying Spur (Aus) (Danehill), and the

impressive victory of his son **Mahuta (Aus)** in the G2 Sandown Guineas, has provided us with yet another reminder of what he had to offer.

Any overview of the history of dual-hemisphere sires has to revolve around Danehill (Danzig) ,who was one of the best sprinting colts in Europe in 1989 prior to becoming the only sire

in history to top the General Sires' Table both in Great Britain/Ireland and in Australia.

Flying Spur was one of the Australian horses who helped to establish Danehill's merit. One of Danehill's most notable achievements was to sire a G1 Golden Slipper winner with each of his first three Australian crops. The first two were colts--Danzero (Aus) and Flying Spur--while the third was the filly Merlene (Aus). Both colts retired to Arrowfield, and both took the reverse-shuttle route at some point. Flying Spur was the first one with whom this bold venture was tried: after his first season at Arrowfield in 1996, he headed up to the Irish National Stud for the 1997 breeding season before repeating the exercise in the next two years.

It is safe to conclude that Flying Spur, rather than Danzero, was chosen first to tread this path because, while Danzero hailed from an Australian family, Flying Spur was a son of the U.S.-bred Mr. Prospector mare Rolls, a granddaughter of the top-class racemare and broodmare Fanfreluche (Northern Dancer).

Sadly, Flying Spur's three terms at the Irish National Stud saw him poorly patronized, even at the low fee of IR£5,000. This was before Danehill had gained the exalted reputation in Europe which he ultimately established; before Choisir had opened European eyes to the merit of Australian sprinters; and before the internet had enabled breeders to know what was going on in other parts of the world. The experiment was consequently discontinued after the 1999 season--and it was only after Flying Spur had gone that it became clear how effectively he had been upgrading his mares there.

The terrific sprinters whom Flying Spur left behind from his Irish National Stud days included the group winners Osterhase (Ire), Steenburg (Ire) and Volata (Ire). The last-named, incidentally, is probably best known by the name which he

adopted in Hong Kong, where he won the G1 Centenary Sprint Cup at Sha Tin as Firebolt (Ire).

Flying Spur went on to prove himself one of the best sires in Australia, most notably topping the General Sires' Table in 2006/'07 when his stars included G1 Golden Slipper winner Forensics (Aus), G1 Blue Diamond S. winner Sleek Chassis (Aus) and G1 Randwick Guineas winner Mentality (Aus). Although now aged 23 and retired from active duty, Flying Spur is still coming up with good

horses. The progressive Mahuta is the latest.

Although bred in Australia from a New Zealand-bred mare, Mahuta comes from a family which, until his American-bred granddam Sharpatan (Diesis {GB}) was exported from the United States to New Zealand, had been resident in the States for nearly a century. cont. p7

Mahuta's fourth dam Miss Toshiba (Sir Ivor) was a star both on the racecourse and at stud. Owned by Robert Sangster, she scored in Group 2 company in Ireland (in the Pretty Polly S. in 1975) and at Grade I level in California (in the Vanity H. in 1976).

Miss Toshiba came from the immediate family of 1944 GI Belmont S. winner Bounding Home (Espino) and was a half-sister to Mistinguette (Boldnesian), dam of the top-class Irish-trained sprinter Committed (Hagley). Hence it was unsurprising that she did well at stud, where her best daughters were the stakes-winning Northern Dancer filly Northeastern and the Group 1-placed Kris (GB) filly Guilty Secret (Ire). Both became decent broodmares, while another of Miss Toshiba's daughters, the winning Sadler's Wells filly Ikebana (Ire), bred the 1998 G1 Derby runner-up City Honours (Darshaan {GB}).

Another of Miss Toshiba's grandchildren was Mahuta's second dam, the stakes-placed Diesis (GB) filly Sharpatan. She spent her stud career in New Zealand, where she produced five winners headed by her Sir Tristram filly Isolda (NZ), a Group 1 winner as a 2-year-old in Australia in the 1994/'95 season before finishing third in the G1 AJC Oaks during the following campaign. Isolda bred the Group 3-winning Redoute's Choice (Aus) horse Bid Spotter (Aus), while other stakes-winners descending from Sharpatan include Jolie Blonde (Aus) (Testa Rossa {Aus}) and Listen Son (Aus) (Big Jesse {Aus}).

Mahuta now ranks as the latest stakes winner to descend from Sharpatan, and he is bred on very similar lines to Bid Spotter: his unraced dam Vahine (NZ) is a three-parts sister to Isolda (being by Sir Tristram's son Zabeel {NZ}) while his sire Flying Spur and Bid Spotter's sire Redoute's Choice (Aus) are both sons of Danehill.

Stefano Botti Begins Four-Month Suspension:


Top Italian trainer Stefano Botti began serving his four-month suspension last Friday, according to the *Racing Post*. One of the horses under Botti's care, Cherry Collect (Ire) (Oratorio {Ire}), tested positive for a banned steroid idrossi stanozolol after winning a listed race at Capannelle in September of 2011 and his appeal was rejected by the regional administrative court. Botti, as well as every racecourse in Italy received notification of the disqualification, according to published reports.



KEEN ICE POSSIBLE FOR CLARK

GI Travers S. winner **Keen Ice** (Curlin) will likely conclude his sophomore campaign with a start in the Nov. 27 GI Clark H. at Churchill Downs. The Donegal Racing colorbearer worked a halfmile at Churchill Sunday in :48.20 under exercise rider Tammy Fox. He began the workout at the three-eighths pole over a "fast" track and recorded splits of :11.60, :23.60 and :35.60 before galloping out five furlongs in 1:02.40.

"Right now, I'm training him like he's going in the Clark," Romans said after the work. "He's a big strong and heavy horse that needs a lot of work and he enjoys his work, so it's not hurting him. He's showing no signs of souring, so we'll train like we're running him."

Keen Ice is coming off a fourth-place effort in the Oct. 31 GI Breeders' Cup Classic. "I think he could've had a better performance in the Breeders' Cup," Romans admitted. "I just don't think that things set up for him, from track conditions to everything else. What I think you'll see at this time next year is a horse that will be talked about as Horse of the Year or champion older male. He's doing that well and moves forward so much every time he runs that at the end of his 4-year-old year, you'll see an even better Keen Ice and a special horse that goes down in history. He's one of the few horses that I've had that the more he does, the better he gets. A lot of horses I can maintain, but you see very few improve the way he has."

Trainer Todd Pletcher is expected to send **Protonico** (Giant's Causeway) and **Race Day** (Tapit) to the Clark, which is also the target for the D. Wayne Lukas-trained **Mr. Z** (Malibu Moon).









MISS MISCHIEF TAKES BESSARABIAN

Diane Manning's **Miss Mischief** (Into Mischief) stormed to the lead in upper stretch and strode home a confident 2 1/4-length winner of Sunday's GII Bessarabian S. at Woodbine. Longshot **Paddle Board** (Harlan's Holiday), who contested the pace, held on for second, 3/4 lengths ahead of previously unbeaten **Elusive Collection** (Elusive Quality) in third.

"[Trainer] Dale [Capuano] said to just try and give her a clear trip outside," commented winning rider Eurico Rosa da Silva. "She was keen and following the race pretty good, just waiting for me to turn her loose."





When Susan Chu got into horse racing just three years ago, she had almost instantaneous success. The first horse to don the colors of her Tanma Corporation was Super Ninety Nine (Pulpit), winner of the 2013 GIII Southwest S. and third in that year's GI

Santa Anita Derby. That success was quickly followed the next year by Chitu (Henny Hughes), who won the GIII Sunland Derby before finishing ninth in the GI Kentucky Derby.

The family looks to have another star in the making after Drefong's 'TDN

Rising Star' performance at Del Mar Saturday, but this colt runs in the name of Chu's husband Charlie's Baoma Corporation.

"When Charlie started to watch our horses racing, watching Super Ninety Nine and Chitu, he was so impressed," Susan Chu explained Sunday. "He decided to get involved. He very much enjoys the horses--Drefong is his first horse."

In addition to Drefong, Charlie Chu's three-horse racing stable also includes the unraced Valiant Minister (Candy Ride {Arg}), who topped the OBS June sale at \$680,000, and Swift Lady (Awesome of Course), a \$170,000 OBS June purchase who finished second on debut at Del Mar Sept. 7.

The Chus, with the help of bloodstock agent Donato Lanni and trainer Bob Baffert, purchased Drefong for \$450,000 at last year's Keeneland September sale.

"We were very confident about him," Chu, whose Tanma Corp. specializes in investing in Olympic-level show jumpers, said. "Donato Lanni and Bob Baffert helped me pick out this horse. We love him--especially my husband Charlie."

Charlie Chu is based mainly in Asia, where he has a company which manufactures GPS navigation systems and his love of Drefong has led him to log plenty of frequent flyer miles recently. Cont. p10

"You wouldn't believe how many times he flies from Hong Kong, especially to see this horse. He flies more than 20 hours from Hong Kong just to go look at him," Susan Chu said of her husband. "He was so happy to enjoy the baby and watch him

grow up and then to have it work out so nicely. He flies so many hours, but he so enjoys it."

The family missed Drefong's maiden win Saturday, but are already planning for the colt's next start.

China, but he called me to tell me he was going to the next race for sure," said Chu, who also missed the race. "I watched it on tv," she said. "And then everyone called in and we felt so great." As for where Drefong will start next, Chu added, "We'll just let

Bob make the decision."

As happy as Chu is for her husband's early success in racing, she admitted with a chuckle, "We have a little competition."

To date, it's Tanma Corp: two graded stakes winners, Baoma Corp: none, but Charlie Chu told his wife to expect company.

"He told me [his graded win] will come very soon," she laughed. -Jessica Martini


