

HOPES BANNED FOR COBALT ADMINISTRATION



Shannon Hope has been banned for five years | Racing and Sports

Co-trainers Lee and Shannon Hope have been banned three and five years, respectively, by the Racing Appeals and Disciplinary Board after being found guilty of administering cobalt to three horses in their care. The case of the father-son training team is the first of four cases involving cobalt to be heard in the state of Victoria, with hearings for high-profile trainers Peter Moody, Mark Kavanagh and Danny O'Brien still to come.

The Hopes had said the cobalt positives occurred naturally through their feed, supplement and medical regime, but they changed their plea last month to guilty for administering, or causing to be administered, a prohibited substance. Shannon Hope received a harsher penalty because, since he was in charge of the feeding and medication program, he was determined to be "more culpable" of the two, according to *Racing.com*.

"I've been advised not to say anything," Lee Hope told Racing.com. "We'll have to wait and see [on an appeal]."

The Hopes trained the winners of seven group races this year, and won the G1 Vinery Stud S. and G2 Stocks S. with Fenway (Aus) (High Chaparral {Ire}).

The hearings for O'Brien and Kavanagh are to begin Nov. 30, and Moody's Dec. 14.

Goffs staged the second session of its November Foal Sale Tuesday, with a daughter of Showcasing (GB) leading the way with a final bid of €62.000.

Taking into consideration this year's extra day of selling—with the sale extended to five days due to recent strong trade and demand for spaces--trade was solid for the session. A total of 173 youngsters sold for €2,517,200 at an average of €14,550 and a median of



Showcasing Filly Stars At Goffs cont.

Topping trade Tuesday was <u>lot 288</u>, a filly by Showcasing (GB) consigned by Alexandra Whitehead's Altenbach Bloodstock and hammered down to Kilmoney Cottage Stud for €62,000.

The bay is the fourth foal out of the winning Corking (Ire) (Montjeu {Ire}), herself a half-sister to triple Hong Kong stakes winner Sobriety (Ire) (Namaqualand) and Violet (Ire) (Mukaddamah), the dam of GII San Clemente winner and GI La Brea S. second Starlarks (Ire) (Mujahid). All three of Corking's previous foals had gone through this ring, but the Showcasing filly proved the most expensive. Corking was covered this year by first-year Coolmore sire No Nay Never.

Tuesday's second most expensive foal was the first lot through the ring, a colt from the first crop of dual Group 1-winning sprinter Lethal Force (Ire) (Dark Angel {Ire}) who was consigned by Rathasker Stud and bought by Ballintober Stud for €60,000. Lot 228 is the fourth foal out of Western Eyes (Ire) (Rock Of

Gibraltar (Ire)), who has produced two winners from two to race.

First-year sires were responsible for the next two highest prices: lot 384, a son of G2 Derby Italiano winner Worthadd (Ire) (Dubawi {Ire}) out of Malayan Mist (Ire) (Dansili {GB}), fetched €56,000 from Pier House

Stud; while <u>lot 236</u>, a colt by Darley reverse-shuttler Epaulette (Aus) (Commands {Aus}) out of Zoumie (Ire) (Mark Of Esteem {GB}), made €54,000 to the bid of Peter and Ross Doyle.

The third session of the Goffs November Foal Sale begins Wednesday at 11 a.m.



NH YEARLINGS LEAD ARQANA TUESDAY

The Arqana Autumn sale wrapped up its first of two yearling sessions Tuesday with figures trending ahead of last year and National Hunt offerings dominating procedures. A total of 131 horses sold Tuesday--two more than this day a year ago--for €2,409,500, up from €2,011,500 last year. The average was up 17.9% to €18,393, while the median stayed the same at €11,000. The buyback rate was 29% Tuesday, up from 21.8% on this day last year.

Over the first two days, 298 lots have been sold for €7,369,500, compared to 296 sold for €6,470,000 at this stage last year. The cumulative average has jumped 12.9% to €24,730, while the median is up 9% to €12,000.

The Newmarket-based Highflyer Bloodstock purchased the two most expensive lots of the day, jumps prospects by Kapgarde (Fr) (lot 400) and Saint des Saints (Fr) (lot 376), for €115,000 and €105,000, respectively, for owners Dai Walters and James Potter.

Highflyer also purchased <u>lot 426</u>, a son of Poliglote, for €70,000, giving the agency three of the top four lots of the day. At the end of the day, Highflyer had signed for 13 yearlings for €534.000.

The Arqana Autumn sale concludes Wednesday with a final session of yearlings.



SOUMILLON CONTRACT EXTENDED

Jockey Christophe Soumillon's contract as first rider to the Aga Khan has been extended a further two years to 2017, according to *Racing Post*, which also reports Alexis Badel has signed on as backup to Soumillon.

Soumillon, who was previously retained rider to the Aga Khan before taking a four-year hiatus beginning in 2009, enjoyed a

successful year on the track for his boss, partnering the likes of triple Group 1 and Classic winner Ervedya (Fr) (Siyouni {Fr}); G1 Dubai Sheema Classic winner Dolniya (Fr) (Azamour {Ire}); and G1 Prix Royal-Oak winner Vazirabad (Fr) (Manduro {Ger}).

CAGNES RENOVATIONS COMPLETE

Renovations to the Polytrack at Cagnes-sur-Mer have been completed, according to *Racing Post*, which also reported the project cost €650,000, including an investment from the racecourse executive and France Galop. The decision was made to revamp the track in February after it was found the fibres and binding of the Polytrack had deteriorated. Cagnes's Polytrack is only used for racing in January and February, and its 2016 meeting will begin Jan. 16.

JAPAN TRIP LOOMS FOR GUN PIT

Gun Pit (Aus) (Dubawi {Ire}), the highest-rated dirt horse in Hong Kong, will prep for a possible start in the ¥196-million (US\$1.59 million) G1 Champions Cup (formerly Japan Cup Dirt) in a Class 1 handicap over the Sha Tin 'all-weather' surface Wednesday evening (Wednesday morning U.S. time).

Drawn gate three, the 5-year-old gelding, perfect in six starts on the dirt, will carry 132 pounds over the 1650-meter trip and will be partnered by Zac Purton for trainer Caspar Fownes. Though he is unraced since a Class 2 victory over the course and distance July 1, he has trialled nicely, including a 1200-meter hitout Nov. 10 in which he found the line strongly to finish a shorthead runner-up (video). Former Hong Kong Horse of the Year Designs on Rome (Ire) (Holy Roman Emperor {Ire}), who makes his first start of the season in Saturday's

G2 BOCHK Jockey Club Mile, was about three lengths further behind in fifth.

"Caspar's given him a good grounding," said Purton, who has ridden the gelding in three of his four barrier trials since late September. "He's only going to have this one run and obviously if he wins or runs very well it looks like he's going to Japan after this.

Purton continued, "Caspar had to make sure he had the miles in his legs and he's done that. He's drawn a nice gate; he's been jumping well in his trials, so he should be able to take advantage of that. I just hope they run along at a nice speed. With a big weight that he's got it's nice to just breeze into it instead of having to sit and sprint, so if everything falls into place for him, hopefully he'll get it done. I wouldn't say he's at his top, but he's getting there and this run should top him."

Gun Pit was quoted as the 1.8 (4-5) favorite overnight, with 1.0 (money back) in the place pools. Post time is 9:45 p.m local time (8:45 a.m. U.S. Eastern time). Click for the HKJC.com PPs.

GI Preakness S. at Pimlico May 16. He's currently enjoying some downtime at WinStar Farm in Kentucky, according to

owner Arnold Zetcher.

"He came out of the Preakness not as good as we would've hoped," Zetcher commented. "[Trainer] Simon [Callaghan] felt that we had to give him some time off after that and he's doing really well now. The plan is to bring him back to Simon [in California] in a month or so."

A pair of painful second-place finishes to 'TDN Rising Star' Dortmund (Big Brown) in both the GI Los Alamitos Futurity and GIII Robert B. Lewis S., Firing Line finally broke through with a 14 1/4-length romp while establishing a new track record in the GIII Sunland Derby Mar. 22 (video).

PAT VALENZUELA RARING TO GO

He's 53, hasn't ridden in 22 months and his career has been interrupted repeatedly by substance-abuse related suspensions, but Pat Valenzuela predicted he will be as good, if not better, than ever when he returns to riding this week in Louisiana.

Valenzuela, who has not ridden since January 2014, has been granted a jockey's license by the Louisiana Racing Commission. He is scheduled to ride two horses Thursday night at Delta Downs, but both are on the also-eligible list. If neither gets in, Valenzuela will make his comeback aboard Memories of Winter (Hard Spun) in Saturday's GIII Delta Jackpot. The horse is a legitimate contender in the race, meaning Valenzuela's first ride back could lead to a trip to the winner's circle in a \$1-million race. "He should be ready to run in probably late March or April, that's probably what we're looking at," Zetcher continued. "We're very excited about him and expecting him to come back even better. I think he was the second-best 3-year-old this year, and all of the signals are that he's looking even better. If that's the case, we'll be looking at all the big races for older horses in 2016."

Firing Line, bred in Kentucky by Clearsky Farms, was produced by 2003 GI Vanity H. runner-up Sister Girl Blues (Hold for Gold), a half-sister to GII Dwyer S. winner and GII Peter Pan S. runner-up Mint Lane (Maria's Mon). 





"He's at WinStar and has been galloping back for about a month," said Nick Sallusto, advisor and racing manager for Steven Marshall's Black Rock Thoroughbreds LLP. "We want to try and be ready for the spring races. We thought initially about trying to get ready for the [GI] Donn [H. at Gulfstream Park], and the more we thought about it, it made more sense to just give him a little more time and get ready for a spring/summer/fall campaign."

Far From Over, bred in Kentucky by Alexander Groves Matz LLC, was produced by a graded stakes placed daughter of GI Go For Wand H. heroine Aldiza (Storm Cat). The May 9 foal was also a game front-running winner in his two-turn debut at the Big A last December. It was announced in March that Sol Kumin's Head of Plains Partners and Jim Covello had purchased a 25% minority interest in Far From Over, who earned a 96 Beyer for his aforementioned score in the Withers. Marshall, the president of Western Energy Production company, also campaigned 2012 GI CashCall Futurity hero and current Hill 'n' Dale stallion Violence (Medaglia d'Oro).

"He's developed *really* well," Sallusto concluded. "He seems to have made a full recovery from the injury. We're optimistic and excited to see if we can finish what we started."



"I have been exercising horses since the summer and I feel really good and my weight is good," Valenzuela said. "I feel mentally, physically and spiritually strong and I think I can ride as well, if not better, than I have in the past. People tell me I look better than I have in years. I'm going to do the best I can and do my best for the horsemen and betting public."

Valenzuela's latest stint on the sidelines began in January 2014 after he failed to appear to ride his scheduled mounts on consecutive days at Santa Anita. Two months later he was suspended by the Santa Anita stewards who recommended he never again be given a license of any kind. Valenzuela said at the time that he would not ride again.

The California Horse Racing Board relented and granted Valenzuela an exercise rider's license in August and Valenzuela was told his situation would be reviewed Oct. 31. CHRB spokesman Mike Marten said that Valenzuela has not applied for a California jockey's license, but Valenzuela said he is under the impression California was not going to reinstate him.

Instead, he went to Louisiana and was granted a license. He

will start off at Delta Downs, but plans to move to the Fair Grounds a few days after the Jackpot.

"It feels awesome to be back," he said. "I am expecting to visit the winner's circle many times. That's the only thing I plan to do over the next few months and for the rest of my career. I am planning to go to Louisiana on Thursday and start riding for [trainer] Mr. Karl Broberg, who gave me a great opportunity to come back

and ride some of his horses. Trainers Morris Nicks and Merrill Scherer and a whole family of trainers there have embraced me and pledged to support me. Fair Grounds will be my main base." He has not ruled out returning to California.

"I want to make the commitment to Louisiana racing and stay there as long as I can and I have to just stick with that right now," Valenzuela said. "If the California Horse Racing Board decides to give me a license, I will let the Louisiana horsemen know in plenty of time if I make plans to return to California. My family is in California, my mother is there and the horsemen there have embraced me.

"I think I've done everything they've asked and deserve a California license, but that's up to the board. I have a Louisiana jockey's license and I will go there and try to win as many races as I can."


Some may be skeptical that Valenzuela can stay out of trouble, but he said he has been sober for quite some time.

Those who watched Eighth Wonder's romp Sunday in the restricted Donna Freyer S. at Parx will agree that the 2-year-old filly is, in fact, a wonder. In her three career starts--a special weight at Parx Sept. 19 (video), an allowance there Oct. 27 (video) and Sunday's restricted stake--the Gryphon Investments homebred has won by a combined 22 lengths. This line and Eighth Wonder's connections run deep. Gryphon Investments' Jeff Bowen bred and raced

Cheeksandpeanuts and conditioner Dee Curry trained the dam and a number of her offspring, including Key Lime Baby (Champali), who was third in the 2009

GII Cotilion S. Eighth Wonder is by WinStar stallion Pioneerof the Nile and out of Pioneering mare Cheeksandpeanuts, who was similarly brilliant in her first three career starts with an 11 3/4 length debut win as a sophomore and victories in the restricted Wonder Delight and Foxy J.G. S.

Cheeksandpeanuts was third in a

Delaware optional claimer and retired after that start.

Bowen has had a lifelong interest in racing, which began when his uncle would take him to the now-shuttered Liberty Bell Racetrack in Northeast Philadelphia. Bowen, who is now a small business owner, said about 16 years ago he, "claimed a horse for \$20,000 and she went on to win over \$200,000 and I got the bug from that." Bowen currently has three horses in training and a broodmare band of six, which he is looking to expand. Gryphon Investments breeds to race as well as sell. "I mainly breed to sell, but if there's a family I'm interested in, I like to keep the mares," Bowen said of his operation.

Bowen said his decision to send the mare to Pioneerof the Nile was an easy one, having admired the horse during his racing career.

"I was a big fan of Pioneerof the Nile as a 2-year-old," Bowen explained. "As a commercial breeder I recognize the importance of speed and precocity. I like the fact that he could carry his

speed two turns. "

Bowen was hopeful the breeding between Pioneerof the Nile and his already-established mare would produce something

"Everything that her dam has thrown has been a winner," he said. "I wasn't too surprised, but I was pleasantly surprised, with how well she's done. "

Curry is similarly pleased with the filly's performance and with how she exited the romp.

"She came out of the race perfect, she wasn't even tired," Curry explained. "It didn't take much out of her at all, she seemed to have bounced out of that race in the best possible way."

Curry, a native of Roswell, New Mexico, spent much of her youth in Europe where her great-uncle was a steeplechase rider. Curry worked her way up the backside ladder after returning to the States as a teenager and currently has 14 horses in her string at Parx. Bowen, who has three horses with Curry, was one of the

trainer's first owners.

"He's just been phenomenal to stick by me from day one," Curry said. "He's given me nothing but support and trusts all my decisions and we've done quite well together."

Curry noted that she knew Eighth Wonder would be special from her early training with Dean Keller's stable in Summerton, South Carolina.

"When this one came along, Dean had told me this one would be

special," Curry said. "Her [4-yearold] full-brother [Cu Chulainn] was pretty special--we've actually given him some time off and he'll come back in the spring--but Dean had said to me, 'I've got the filly and she's better than him and she's got a little bit of a better training mind, let's get her started early because she's special.' I couldn't wait. The breeding alone with Pioneerof the Nile, I was just so excited to

get her after American Pharoah--I couldn't wait, so I said, 'Let's bring her in early in case she is that special.' When she came in and did some galloping, you just knew she was the real deal. After Sunday's race, she really is everything I thought she was."

As for what's next for Eighth Wonder, she'll get 60 days of rest on the farm before revving up for her sophomore campaign.

"We're taking it one day at a time," Bowen said. "She looks like she's of the quality that can go on and run in some bigger races next year. We're going to rest her up for the short term and look at some of the bigger races in the spring." --by J.M. Severni
