



# PINHOOKERS EMBOLDENED AT GOFFS FOAL SALE



The session-topping Zoffany colt bought by Jamie Railton | Goffs

Even before he had runners there was a sales-ring buzz about Zoffany (Ire), and those early hopes proved justified with the young son of Dansili (GB) holding an unassailable lead at the head of the European first-crop sires' table with 30 winners to his name. Two of his sons held top-five places at Goffs Thursday, including the session's leading foal (lot 824), the first produce of the High Chaparral (Ire) mare Far Away Eyes (Ire), offered by Seskin Stud.

Jamie Railton saw off allcomers at €150,000 for a pinhooking syndicate that will reoffer the February foal next autumn. He said, "It's a German family that I know very well and there's plenty going on in the family with Lucky Speed (Ger) and Magic Hurricane (Ire)." click here for an audio interview with Railton about his purchase and his views on the market.

The international appeal of the pedigree is highlighted by Magic Hurricane's win in the G1 Metropolitan H. in Australia since the catalogue was published, while G1 Deutsches Derby winner Lucky Speed recently finished fourth in the GI Northern Dancer Turf S. after winning the GIII American St Leger S.

A further €6,187,000 was added to the coffers from the fourth and penultimate session of foals at Goffs. The 172 foals sold represented a clearance rate of 80% for an average price of €35,971 and median of €27,500. Cont. p2

#### **SOVIET SONG DIES**

**Soviet Song (Ire)** (Marju {Ire}--Kalinka {Ire}, by Soviet Star), the winner of five Group 1 contests between the ages of two and five, was euthanized at age 15 at Oak Lodge Stud in Kentucky Monday after struggling with foot issues.

"She was put down on Monday, sadly," said Dan Downie of Elite Racing Club, which bred and campaigned Soviet Song. "She was special in lots of ways. She was homebred and our first ever Group 1 winner and she went on to win five."


"She had been struggling with her feet and it got progressively worse," Downie added. "I was over in Kentucky for the Breeders' Cup and went to see her. We agreed--me and Suzy [Fitzsimons] who runs Oak Lodge Stud where she was--that she couldn't carry on like that. She was an amazing horse, really."

Therafter, **QUALIFY** ran only in Group 1 events and at Epsom faced a top class field including **LEGATISSIMO** (1000 Guineas winner), **DIAMONDSANDRUBIES** (Group 1 Pretty Polly Stakes winner), and **TOGETHER FOREVER** (Group 1 Dubai Fillies Mile winner). Coming with a strong run Qualify collared the 1000 Guineas winner to take the prize with the Racing Post commenting that "She was going further clear after the line...... Very effective on fast ground."

#### Pinhookers Emboldened at Goffs cont.

The day's two most expensive fillies were both daughters of Kodiac (Ire). Taking top honors among the females at €140,000, just two lots from the close of play, was lot 988, the Killourney Mor Farm-consigned half-sister to treble winner Fonepferesh (Ire) (Holy Roman Emperor {Ire}) out of Vee Gita (Ire) (Vettori {Ire}), herself a half-sister to GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile winner Vale Of York (Ire) (Invincible Spirit {Ire}). The filly was bought by a pinhooking conglomerate that includes Michael Carty, whose wife Ciara did the bidding.

Earlier in the day the hammer had fallen at €137,000 for lot 904, another daughter of Kodiac, in favor of Ross Doyle. The

agent was acting on behalf of Colm McEvoy, who will reoffer the second foal of Na Zdorovie (GB) (Cockney Rebel {GB}) through his Osberstown Stud as a yearling.

"She's a very nice filly-probably the best filly physically in the sale," said Doyle. "She's coming from a good home and is going to a good home, and hopefully she'll be a Book 1 horse next year."

Juvenile winner Na

Zdorovie is a half-sister to Phil Cunningham's GII John Henry Turf Championship S. winner Slim Shadey (GB), who is by Cockney Rebel's sire Val Royal {Fr}), their dam Vino Veritas (Chief's Crown) having produced nine winners from her 10 runners.

Only five lots after the day's top price had been set, another son of Zoffany (<u>lot 829</u>) passed through the ring, this one being knocked down at €120,000 to Bobby O'Ryan. A son of the dual-winning Warning mare Flamenco Red (GB) with the

Juddmonte matriarch Bahamian (GB) (Mill Reef) as his third dam, the colt is yet another pinhook purchase, but O'Ryan was unable to divulge the identity of his client.

A rare purchase on the day by a racing outfit, rather than pinhookers, was made by Shadwell, who plumped for Altenbach Bloodstock's Harbour Watch colt (lot 794). Stephen Collins signed the docket at €120,000 for the strong first foal of Cape Joy (Ire) (Cape Cross {Ire}), a half-sister to the Ben Dunne Memorial Solonaway S. winner Hymn Of Love (Ire) (Barathea {Ire}).

The Ballymacoll Stud family, which has been responsible for the champion full-siblings Islington (Ire) (Sadler's Wells) and Greek Dance (Ire), as well as 2013 G1 Melbourne Cup winner Fiorente (Ire) (Monsun {Ger}), was again to the fore via one of its youngest members when <a href="Lot 933">Lot 933</a>, a Raven's Pass colt out of a Spinning World half-sister to Fiorente, brought a bid of €110,000 from Brendan Holland of Grove Stud.

"He's just a really good sort by a good proven sire," said Holland of the son of juvenile winner Roshanak, whose three foals to race are all winners.

Tally-Ho Stud's Society Rock (Ire) topped the freshman ranks on Thursday with lot 900, a colt out of Morinda (GB) from the family of Monsun (Ger) sold by Jockey Hall Stud to Yeomanstown Stud for €95,000. Youngest brother Robert O'Callaghan signed for the February-born colt in company with siblings David and Peter as well as his parents Gay and Annette and said, "This is the best foal we've seen by the sire. He's a good model by a speed sire and hopefully he'll be back next year."

Paddy Twomey was pushed to €90,000 for lot 873, Tullogher House Stud's Holy Roman Emperor (Ire) half-brother to Group 2-placed juvenile Layali Al Andalus (GB) (Halling), while Peter Doyle signed for the third-most expensive filly of the day in lot 879, a daughter of Acclamation who cost €85,000. Her dam, Littlepromisedland (Ire) (Titus Livius {Ire}), is a half-sister to top sprinter Lethal Force (Ire) (Dark Angel {Ire}) and from the further family of another speedy Group 1 winner, G Force (Ire)



(Tamayuz {GB}), as well as G1 Poule d'Essai des Pouliches winner Flotilla (Fr) (Mizzen Mast).

Tweenhills Stud's freshman sire Havana Gold (Ire) has enjoyed a good introduction to the sales market. Mags O'Toole, bidding on behalf of Lynn Lodge Stud's Eddie O'Leary, went to €80,000 for lot 798, a half-brother to the highly regarded Wajeez (Ire) (Lope De Vega {Ire}), who won on debut at Nottingham on Nov. 4 for John Gosden and Sheikh Hamdan Al Maktoum.

Ten lots later it was the turn of Paul and Dale Chapman of Silverdale Farm to add a Havana Gold colt to their list of purchases for the day when bidding €77,000 for lot 808 through advisor Jedd O'Keeffe. The Chapmans have horses in training with O'Keeffe close to their home in Yorkshire but have also become involved in the pinhooking market in recent years, consigning their yearlings through Mark Dwyer's Oaks Farm Stables, with recent successes including G3 Hackwood S. winner Strath Burn (GB) (Equiano {Fr}). The top of their four purchases of the day was the Havana Gold colt bred in partnership by Mount Coote Stud and consignor Knocktoran Stud. He is the first foal of Deux Saisons (GB) (Chineur {Ire}), a half-sister to G1 Poule d'Essai des Poulains winner and young sire Tin Horse (Ire) (Sakhee).

The final session of the Goffs November Foal Sale swings into action at 11 a.m. local time Friday.

#### 1013, c, Dawn Approach (Ire)--Aris (Ire), by Danroad (Aus)

Consigned by Baroda & Colbinstown Studs

This colt is a member of the first crop of Classic winner Dawn Approach, and he has Classic appeal on both sides of his pedigree, being out of a half-sister to G1 Irish 1000 Guineas winner Again (Ire) (Danehill Dancer {Ire}) and from the family of dual Classic winner Montjeu (Ire) (Sadler's Wells). The chestnut is the third foal out of Aris, and also counts this year's G1 King's Stand S. winner Goldream (GB) (Oasis Dream {GB}) and groupwinning juvenile Galileo Gold (GB) (Paco Boy {Ire}) as relatives under third dam Floripedes (Fr) (Top Ville {Fr}).

#### 1021, c, Dawn Approach (Ire)--Biz Bar (GB), by Tobougg (Ire)

Consigned by Rockton Stud

Another son of Dawn Approach with a Classic family follows, this one being a half-brother to G2 Derby Italiano winner Biz The Nurse (Ire) (Oratorio {Ire}), also the winner of the G1 Gran Premio di Milano. Biz Bar, a stakes winner herself, has also produced the Group 3 winner Misterious Boy (Ire) (Arcano {Ire}).

## 1023, c, Invincible Spirit (Ire) -- Boastful (Ire), by Clodovil (Ire) Consigned by Irish National Stud

This handsome bay is the first foal out of Boastful, a stakes-winning half-sister to Group 3 winner Lesson In Humility (Ire) (Mujadil), also the dam of stakes winner Coach House (Ire) (Oasis Dream {GB}). Each of Boastful's first three dams have produced stakes-winning daughters who have gone on to produce stakes winners.

#### 1027, f, Cape Cross (Ire)--Cannikin (Ire), by Lahib (GB)

Consigned by Piercetown Stud

This February-born bay is not only by accomplished sire Cape Cross--sire of this year's Cartier Horse of the Year Golden Horn (GB) and broodmare sire of last year's G1 Investec Derby winner Australia (GB) (Galileo {Ire})--but she is also a full-sister to two stakes horses: G2 Prix Pomone winner Star Lahib (Ire) and listed-placed Moone Cross (Ire).

### 1039, c, Camelot (GB)--Close Regards (Ire), by Danehill Consigned by Killourney Mor Farm

This bay, from the first crop of dual Derby winner and near Triple Crown hero Camelot (GB) (Montjeu {Ire}), is a half-brother to Australian Group 1 winner Magic Hurricane (Ire), who is by another high-performing son of Montjeu in Hurricane Run (Ire). Their dam, Close Regards, has produced five winners from five to race, and that group also includes the listed-placed Maybe Grace (Ire) (Hawk Wing).

### 1077, c, Oasis Dream (GB)--Harmonic Note (GB), by Nayef Consigned by The Castlebridge Consignment

This March-born bay is the first produce of the listed-placed Harmonic Note. Her third dam, Musianica (GB) (Music Boy {GB}), produced G1 Audemars Piguet QEII Cup winner Mensa (GB) as well as Group 3 winner Firebolt (Ire) (Flying Spur {Aus}), and the page also includes G2 Flying Childers S. winner Wunders Dream (Ire) (Averti {Ire}) and G3 Ridgewood Pearl S. winner Grecian Dancer (GB) (Dansili {GB}).

# 1084, f, Fastnet Rock (Aus)--Inchmahome (GB), by Galileo (Ire) Consigned by Jockey Hall Stud

With three European Group 1 winners to his credit this year, Australian champion sire Fastnet Rock has certainly earned his return ticket to Coolmore's Irish base for 2016. This bay, who is bred on the same cross as this year's G1 Investec Oak winner Qualify (Ire) and G1 Queensland Derby winner Magicool (Aus), is a half-sister to Group 3 winner Venus De Milo (Ire) (Duke of Marmalade {Ire}), who was also placed in four Group 1s. Inchmahome's Lope De Vega (Ire) filly made €300,000 at this sale last year.

#### 1095, c, Invincible Spirit (Ire)--La Grande Zoa (Ire), by Fantastic Light

Consigned by The Cottage Stud

This youngster, already from the family of multiple Group 1 winners Distant Relative and Ezzoud (Ire), saw his page receive a significant boost this year when his half-brother Trip To Paris (Ire) (Champs Elysees {GB}) took the G1 Gold Cup at Royal Ascot. That sibling finished fourth in the G1 Melbourne Cup earlier this month in an effort that makes him look capable of improving the page even further, and he heads to Japan for an assignment in the G1 Japan Cup next weekend.

#### 1129, c, Dubawi (Ire)--Nightime (Ire), by Galileo (Ire)

Consigned by The Castlebridge Consignment

The lone representative of his sire in this sale, this April-foaled bay is out of G1 Irish 1000 Guineas winner Nightime, whose three winners from four to race include stakes winner Zhukova (Ire) (Fastnet Rock {Aus}) and stakes-placed Sleeping Beauty (Ire) (Oasis Dream {GB}). Nightime's yearling filly by Raven's Pass made 450,000gns from John Ferguson at Tattersalls October this year, and her Shamardal colt fetched 400,000gns from John Warren at that sale last year. This colt is bred on the same cross as last year's G1 2000 Guineas winner Night Of Thunder (Ire).

#### 1165, f, New Approach (Ire)--Scribonia (Ire), by Danehill

Consigned by Redmondstown Stud

Scribonia's Galileo (Ire) colt, now named The Major General (Ire), topped last year's Goffs Orby sale at €1.5 million, and this filly is by that champion sire's Derby-winning son New Approach. Each of Scribonia's four winners to date have earned black-type, headed by Group 3 winners Cuis Ghaire (Ire) (Galileo {Ire}) and Scintillula (Ire) (Galileo {Ire}). Scribonia is a half-sister to G1 Moyglare Stud S. second Luminata (Ire) (Indian Ridge {GB}).

# 1182, c, Galileo (Ire)--Sogno Verde (Ire), by Green Desert Consigned by Swordlestown Little

One of just two colt foals by Galileo on the public auction market this year and the only representative of his champion sire in this catalogue, this colt offers a rare opportunity. He is also a half-brother to G2 Railway S. winner and young sire Lilbourne Lad (Ire) (Acclamation {GB}), as well as the stakes-placed Bobbyscot (Ire) (Alhaarth {Ire}). #### Soviet Song Dies cont. from p1

Trained by James Fanshawe and campaigned as a homebred by Elite Racing Club, Soviet Song capped an unbeaten 2-year-old campaign in 2002 with a win in the G1 Fillies' Mile over the following year's G1 Epsom Oaks winner Casual Look (Red Ransom). Soviet Song failed to find the winner's circle in four attempts at three, although she was not disgraced, her best effort being a second in Royal Ascot's G1 Coronation S. She returned with a vengeance at four, however, taking The Curragh's G2 Ridgewood Pearl S. and finishing second in the G1 Queen Anne S. before collecting three straight Group 1s in the Falmouth S., Sussex S. and Matron S., the Falmouth and the Matron over the dual Guineas winner Attraction (GB) (Efisio {GB}). She defended her Falmouth title the following year over international Group 1 winner Alexander Goldrun (Ire) (Gold Away {Ire}), and was second in that year's Sussex. In her final campaign, Soviet Song won Royal Ascot's G2 Windsor Forest S. and finished second in the Sussex and G1 Sun Chariot S. She retired with nine wins from 24 starts and earnings of £1,168,370.

"She was really good because she won a group race at two and raced on until she was six," said Fanshawe. "She was the best

filly I've trained. She won five Group 1s and as a 4-year-old she was the highest-rated filly in the world. When she won the Falmouth at the age of five that was special."

"The thing about Soviet was she wasn't just a brilliant filly and mare, she had tremendous

character," Fanshawe added. "She had a great personality. She had presence, that aura about her. Elite membership increased significantly when she was in training. She played up to that when Elite came round on their visits; she loved all that."

Johnny Murtagh, who rode Soviet Song to four of her five Group 1 wins, added, "it's very sad news. She was a terrific filly-top drawer. The day she won at Leopardstown [the Matron S.] beating Attraction was one of my favorite memories of her. She was up there with the best I've ridden."

Soviet Song did not have the same good fortune as a broodmare, producing just two live foals. One of those is a yearling filly by Speightstown who has joined Fanshawe.

"Her career as a mare didn't really happen, but hopefully this yearling will do us proud," said Downie. "She will be named shortly."

While Soviet Song has yet to produce a winner, Fanshawe has had luck with other members of the family for Elite Racing, most notably last year's G1 Prix Jean Romanet winner Ribbons (GB) (Manduro {Ger}), who is out of Soviet's Song's full-sister Sister Act (GB).

#### **NZ SALE WRAPS WITH RECORDS**

The New Zealand Bloodstock Ready To Run Sale wrapped up its two-day stand Thursday with record-breaking results. The NZ\$525,000 sale-topping son of O'Reilly (NZ) marked a new record price for the sale, and new marks were also set for average and aggregate. A total of 254 juveniles changed hands for NZ\$23,368,500--breaking the NZ\$20 million barrier for the first time--compared to the NZ\$19,297,500 raked in by 241 sold last year. The average was NZ\$92,002--up 14.9% on last year's record of NZ\$80,073--and the median remained unchanged from last year's record at NZ\$60,000. The buyback rate dropped almost eight points to 19.1%.

"The sale has been going from strength to strength recently and this year's results are phenomenal," said NZB Managing

Director Andrew
Seabrook. "To break
through the NZ\$20
million mark for
aggregate is a huge
accomplishment. To
see both the aggregate
and average increase is
extremely pleasing and
we did it with a very
strong clearance rate.

We also saw a record price today, which just adds to what has already been a great sale."

The sale saw strong participation by overseas buyers, particularly from the East, and it was the Hong Kong-based Jacky Chun Shing who paid the record sum for the gelded lot 362, who also posted the fastest breeze of the sale, going 200 meters in :9.91. The bay is by New Zealand's champion sire O'Reilly out of the stakes-placed Miraculous Miss (Aus) (Exceed and Excel {Aus}), also the dam of the stakes-winning Avisto (NZ) (Tavistock {NZ}) and Celtic Tiger (NZ) (O'Reilly {NZ}), a stakes winner since the catalogue was published. Chun Shing, on his first visit to New Zealand, remarked, "I wanted to come to Karaka to see the horses and I have found it very interesting. The money was a little higher than we expected but we still got what we wanted."

The leading buyer of the sale was Lang Lin's Inner Mongolia Rider Horse Group, the campaigner of this year's G1 Australian Derby and G1 Caulfield Cup winner Mongolian Khan (Aus) (Holy Roman Emperor {Ire}). Lin purchased 25 juveniles--destined for Australasia and China--for NZ\$1,837,000, including Thursday's second most expensive lot, 358, a colt by champion sire Fastnet Rock (Aus) for NZ\$425,000. Lin revealed he purchased the colt on behalf of An Jun, who joined Lin at the sale, and his brother in China. Cont. p6

"Mr. Yue Sheng Zhang from the Yulong Group, who is one of the biggest buyers from China, attended the sale and also Mr. An Jun, from Inner Mongolia," said Lin. "Both race horses in Australia and the Fastnet Rock colt purchased by Mr. An Jun is also going to Australia."

The colt is out of Memories Of You (Ire) (Galileo {Ire}), a half-sister to GI Ramona H. winner Matiara (Bering {GB}), G2 Richmond S. winner Pyrus (Mr. Prospector), and multiple French group winner Marathon (Diesis {GB}). The colt is bred on the same cross as G1 Queensland Derby winner Magicool (Aus) and this year G1 Investec Oaks winner Qualify (Ire).

The China Horse Club bought five for NZ\$587,500, the Macau Jockey Club spent NZ\$1,003,500 on 21 and Hong Kong was the leading buying nation with 43 bought for NZ\$6,783,000.

"There has been a large international buying bench here this week and this shows that the success of the sale is being recognized around the world," said Seabrook. "Particular mention has to go to our Hong Kong and Chinese buyers, who have been influential at this year's sale."

The next greatest outlay came from Australia, whose buyers bought 61 for NZ\$6,693,000. Local New Zealanders spent NZ\$3,950,000 on 61-head.

#### CHAUTAUQUA OUT OF HONG KONG SPRINT

Top Australian sprinter **Chautauqua (Aus)** (Encosta de Lago {Aus}), who was on Wednesday considered a 90% chance for the Dec. 13 G1 Hong Kong Sprint by the Hawkes training team, was removed from consideration for the race Thursday after suffering a minor joint injury in trackwork, according to *Racing.com*.

"It become apparent when he cooled down after trackwork

this morning that he had tweaked one of his joints in front,"
Michael Hawkes, who co-trains the 5-year-old gelding with brother Wayne and father John, told Racing.com. "The injury is not a major problem, it is more a

wear-and-tear type, but it means that he would not be 100% fit for Hong Kong."

"It is what it is; it is much better to have happened now rather than after you had arrived over there," Hawkes added.

Chautauqua, who scored his maiden Group 1 win in the G1 TJ Smith S. at The Championships in April, added the G1 Manikato S. Oct. 23 before finishing a short-head second in the G1 Darley Classic Nov. 7. Hawkes said a title defense of Chautauqua's most important win could be in the cards.

"He will have a nice break now and then come back into work for the autumn features," Hawkes said. "Obviously, we would love to target the TJ Smith S. with him again."









#### RACING AUS PROCEEDS WITH WHIP RULES

Changes to Australia's whip rules will go into effect Dec. 1 as previously planned despite suggestions by jockeys that their opinions were not considered before the rules were changed. In the rule amendment, the distinction between forehand and backhand strikes was removed, limiting jockeys to a total of five hits before the 100-meter mark. The amendment also stated harsher penalties for whip offences would be introduced,

especially for offences in stakes races.

Racing Australia Thursday published a letter from chairman John Messara that was sent to all jockeys that outlined the timeline of the rule changes and explained the organization's position.

"I believe that Racing

Australia has consulted adequately and fairly considered the submissions from the [Australian Jockeys Association]," said Messara in the letter. "I believe that the AJA mistakenly believes that we have not been consultative when, in fact, it is just that we have not been persuaded to the AJA's view on the matter."

"I do not believe that Racing Australia is being 'heavy-handed' on this or any other matter," he continued. "It is simply exerting leadership in protecting the racing industry from external attack and modernizing the rules to reflect society's expectations. We want racing to retain its independence and its position as a mainstream sport in what is now a very competitive environment."

The AJA responded in a statement, which read in part, "Racing Australia can say it consulted with the AJA as outlined in its letter, but the outcome of any consultation that has taken place with the AJA would indicate it took no notice of any part of our submissions and that they had already formed a view."

"Racing Australia appears to the AJA to have adopted a position of being supportive of rule amendments irrespective of any consultation with the AJA," the statement continued. "This concern is shared by other stakeholders. Our subsequent submissions and approaches have been rejected."



#### **VET FOUND GUILTY IN COBALT CASE**

Veterinarian Adam Matthews has been found guilty of all six charges against him in the cobalt case surrounding the Sam Kavanagh-trained Midsummer Sun (GB) (Monsun {Ger}), according to *Racing.com*. Matthews was charged for supplying two bottles of a vitamin complex containing high concentrations of cobalt to Dr. Tom Brennan, who in turn supplied them to Kavanagh. The penalty hearing has been set for Nov. 26.

Kavanagh was banned for nine years and three months, while Brennan was banned six years.

Meanwhile, Mark Kavanagh, the father of trainer Sam Kavanagh and based in Victoria, and fellow trainer Danny O'Brien are set to receive their prize money from the spring carnival that was frozen by the Racing Appeals and Disciplinary Board pending their hearings, according to *Racing.com*. The Victorian Civil and Administrative Tribunal deemed that if Kavanagh and O'Brien have been allowed to continue participating in racing, they should get the benefits. The hearings for Kavanagh and O'Brien begin Nov. 30 and the hearing from trainer Peter Moody will begin next month.



#### **BUFFERING LOOMS LARGE AT ASCOT**

Australian Group 1 action moves to Western Australia Saturday, and sprinters have their final shot for the year at a top-level score in the G1 Winterbottom S. The Winterbottom has been won by some of Australia's most prolific sprinters, including Ortensia (Aus) (Testa Rossa {Aus}), Miss Andretti (Aus) (Ihtiram {Ire}) and Takeover Target (Aus) (Celtic Swing {GB}). While he does not have the international acclaim of those past greats, **Buffering (Aus)** (Mossman {Aus}) is an accomplished

sprinter in his own right and goes for his sixth Group 1 win. The now 8-year-old gelding won this two years ago and proved he is still up to his best when taking the G1 Moir S. Oct. 2. He enters this off a fourth, beaten a half-length, in the G1 Darley Classic

Nov. 7. The David Hayes and Tom Dabernig-trained **Fast 'N' Rocking (Aus)** (Fastnet Rock {Aus}) is still searching for his first win at the highest level, and he comes here off an encouraging fourth behind sprint champion Chautauqua (Aus) (Encosta de Lago {Aus}) in the G1 Manikato S. Oct. 23. Fast 'N' Rocking is currently equal at 7-1 in the betting with **Waterman Bay (Aus)** (Eternity Range), who won the G3 Victoria H. at Caulfield in April but has been seen just once since, when second in the G3 Colonel Reeves S. over 1100 meters of this strip Nov. 3. Also prominent in the betting at 7.5-1 are defending winner **Magnifisio (Aus)** (Magnus {Aus}), second and third, respectively, in the G3 Prince of Wales S. and G2 Lee Steere S. Oct. 24 and Nov. 7 is his two starts this season; and **Lucky Street (Aus)** (Oratorio {Aus}), a lightly raced, stakes-winning 3-year-old who dominated a benchmark 78+ race over this track and trip Nov. 7.

#### MESSENE FACES LOCAL TALENT IN RAILWAY

Saturday's G1 Railway S.--the last opportunity for milers in Group 1 company in Australia this year--sees a pair of shippers pitted against some local talent in a contest that early betting suggests will be competitive. Team Hawkes Flemington shipper Messene (Aus) (Lonhro {Aus}) was an encouraging fourth behind eventual G1 Cox Plate winner Winx (Aus) (Street Cry {Ire}) in the G1 Epsom H. Oct. 3 before taking a 28-day break, but put up only a moderate performance when eighth in the G3 Guvera S.

He enjoys a weightbreak of 11 pounds from local favorite **Black Heart Bart (Aus)** (Blackfriars {Aus}), who enters this off back-to-back wins in the G3 Northerly S. and G2 Lee Steere S. going 1400 meters over this course. He has been tried over this distance just once, as a 3-year-old two years ago, and was third. Also looking to keep the trophy in Western Australia is **Delicacy (Aus)** (Al Maher {Aus}), who started the season with three trials off a 182-day break and subsequently finished third in the Lee Steere.

The 4-year-old mare will need some luck from barrier 15 but has proven class, with 10 wins from 15 career starts. Another making a comeback from a long holiday this season is **Real Love** (Aus) (Desert King {Ire}), who won the G2 Perth Cup Jan. 1 but was sidelined after finishing eighth in the G2 Peter Young S. Feb. 28 and was off for 245 days. He won the G3 Asian Beau S. over 1400 meters off a pair of trials Oct. 31 but like Delicacy, has a wide barrier to deal with.



after yesterday's race. "Winning the Arc is my greatest memory, along with the three Breeders' Cup races I won. I was the assistant to Mr. [Francois] Mathet so it was logical that I would set up in France. I was lucky to have great owners."

Pease, 63, recorded his greatest triumph with Bago in the 2004 G1 Prix de l'Arc Triomphe. His three Breeders' Cup wins came with Tikkanen in the 1994 Turf, Spinning World in the 1997 Mile and Karakontie in the 2014 Mile. He trained for two of the most prominent owners worldwide in George Strawbridge and the Niarchos family.

When announcing his retirement this summer, Pease said,
"After 37 enjoyable years as a trainer in France, I will be retiring
at the end of 2015. I would like to thank my excellent and loyal
staff, six of whom have worked with me for more than
25 years."

#### REMATCH IN THE JOCKEY CLUB CUP

The versatile **Blazing Speed (GB)** (Dylan Thomas {Ire}), a Group 1 winner at eight, 10 and 12 furlongs, and **Military Attack (Ire)** (Oratorio {Ire}) were separated by a head in last year's G2 Longines Jockey Club Cup and the two familiar foes are set to square off yet again 12 months later in the course-and-distance prep for the G1 Longines Hong Kong Cup 22 days down the road.

Winner of the 2014 G1 Champions Mile, the 6-year-old belied odds of 14-1 for an impressive two-length defeat of the Hong Kong Cup-bound Staphanos (Jpn) (Deep Impact {Jpn}) in the

G1 Audemars Piguet Queen Elizabeth II Cup last April. Fourth, but beaten just a neck by **Helene Super Star** (War Front), in defense of his title in the G1 Champions and Chater Cup over

the metric mile and a half the following month, Blazing Speed finished well to be sixth behind Contentment (Aus) (Hussonet) in the 1600meter Sha Tin Trophy H. Oct. 25.

Military Attack followed his runner-up effort in this last year with another

similar result behind Designs On Rome (Ire) (Holy Roman Emperor {Ire}) in the Hong Kong Vase, but was no better than seventh in the QE II Cup. Second to Dan Excel (Shamardal) in defense of his title in the G1 SIA Cup at Kranji in May, the bay gave an excellent account of himself in the Sha Tin Trophy, finishing third to Contentment and **Beauty Only (Ire)** (Holy Roman Emperor {Ire}).

The latter dropped a neck decision to the progressive Contentment in a Class 1 over a mile July 12, but overcame a tough trip with a nose success in a 1400-meter test Sept. 13. The former Italian runner got far back in the Sha Tin Trophy, but kicked in nicely in the final eighth of a mile to finish within 3/4 of a length for the win. Connections have elected to stretch out to this 2000-meter trip to sidestep a clash with Able Friend (Aus) (Shamardal) and company in the G2 Jockey Club Mile.

Trainer John Moore saddles nine of the 29 runners for Saturday's three feature races at Sha Tin and the barn will be represented by five of the nine starters in the G2 BOCHK Wealth Management Jockey Club Mile, a race in which it is difficult to foresee anything taking down the colors of reigning Hong Kong Horse of the Year Able Friend (Aus) (Shamardal).

In winning this event by 2 1/4 easy lengths last year, the hulking chestnut was commencing a six-race winning streak that included the G1 Longines Hong Kong Mile in his next start and concluded with the G1 Champions Mile in May. Following a well-documented flop in the G1 Queen Anne S. at Royal Ascot in

June, Able Friend was first-up in the Premier Bowl H. Oct. 25 over a 1200-meter trip well short of his best and despite being asked to give the best local sprinters a ton of weight. Accordingly sent off at 9-1, the 6-year-old had the

entire field to pass in the final 200 meters, but managed to pull the rabbit out of the hat to score by a half-length. Karis Teetan had the ride that day, but jockey Joao Moreira is back in the saddle Saturday, and Moore says it's all systems go.

"He's never been better," said the handler. "I think he's pretty close to peak. Judging by the way he returned from his gallop [Thursday] morning and the huge smile on Joao's face, this horse is not far off. I expect him to win, based on that work, and then on to the Hong Kong Mile."

Still, the connections of eight other horses will have a crack.

Contentment (Aus) (Hussonet) is one of the most progressive horses currently in training in Hong Kong, with eight wins from 11 career wins and four on the bounce. After taking care of Beauty Only in the aforementioned Class 1 over the mile July 12, the 5-year-old resumed with a half-length defeat of Giant

Treasure (Mizzen Mast) in the Celebration Cup H. going 1400 meters Oct. 1 and sat up on the pace in the Sha Tin Trophy before holding off the late bid of Beauty Only.

Designs On Rome (Ire) (Holy Roman Emperor {Ire}), last seen finishing fourth to Blazing Speed (GB) (Dylan Thomas {Ire}) in the QE II Cup in April, underwent surgery to remove chips from both front fetlocks in May. He goes first up here while prepping for a title defense in the Hong Kong Cup, and with Moreira taking the call atop the race favorite, Karis Teetan deputizes. John Moore has been pleased with the 5-year-old's work coming into this.

"Designs On Rome looked very well, I'm really pleased," said Moore after the five-year-old had stopped the watch at 1:22.4 (29.4, 28.6, 24.4) Thursday morning. "We all know, after arthroscopic work, you're never going to be 100%, but the thing that he's got in his favour is that he knows where the winning post is and he doesn't like being beaten. That's probably his greatest attribute. He just grinds."

Super Jockey (NZ) (Sandtrap) made the most of an invitation to the G1 Dubai Golden Shaheen and ran a bang-up second to Secret Circle (Eddington). Off six months thereafter, the Kiwibred was no better than a 60-1 shot in the National Day Cup H. Oct. 1 and ran exceptionally well to be two lengths' second to Not Listenin'tome (Aus) (Dylan Thomas {Ire}). He should thrive

over this added distance. The latter disappointed somewhat when only sixth to Able Friend in the Premier Bowl, but was caught off the track and gave way in the final 100 meters.

**Peniaphobia (Ire)** (Dandy Man {Ire}) announced his arrival really and truly with a half-length tally in this event last year and went on to be a good second in the Hong Kong Sprint. Later runner-up in the G1 Al Quoz Sprint in Dubai in March, he was seventh in the National Day Cup and exits a third in the Premier Bowl.

#### LOS AL TO DROP FUTURITY, STARLET IN

**2016** By T.D. Thornton

The elimination of Hollywood Park from the southern California racing circuit has resulted in the shifting of some noteworthy stakes races over the past two years, but the most important change for 2016 may imperil a pair of Grade I races for 2-year-olds that have been run for decades in late December.

Brad McKinzie, the general manager of Los Alamitos Race Course, put the industry on notice at Thursday's California Horse Racing Board meeting that his track does not intend to run the GI Los Alamitos Futurity or the GI Starlet S. next year.

The chief reason is financial, McKinzie said. He explained that

Los Alamitos ambitiously picked up the two year-end races for juveniles--arguably the two most prominent national races for 2-year-olds after the Breeders' Cup has been run--in 2014 with the intent of making them the centerpiece races of the three-week meet. But betting handle couldn't match the purse payouts, and with Los

Alamitos running even fewer dates in 2016, keeping those races on the schedule would be too much of a financial burden.

"The [2015] stakes schedule and our overnight purse schedule is based upon the handles that we generated last year, McKinzie said. "Those are real numbers. We were \$600,000 overpaid last year and we won't get a dime of it back. To say that we over-reached on our stakes schedule last winter would be putting it mildly."

McKinzie continued: "We're having to live within our means for this winter, which is a three-week meet. Next year we have two weeks...We informed the industry, the Thoroughbred Owners of California (TOC), right after the dates were awarded that there is just no way, with a two-week meet, that Los Alamitos can afford to conduct the Starlet and the Los Alamitos Futurity and do them justice and keep them Grade I events. Someone in this industry, I think, needs to pick up these two races, which are important national races, and hopefully do more with them than we're able to do right now." Cont. p3





#### Los Al to Cut Futurity, Starlet cont.

CHRB chairman Chuck Winner countered with a rhetorical question. "Someone? There are only two 'someones," Winner asked, referring to Santa Anita and Del Mar as the only other logical entities who might opt to run the pair of Grade I races.

"Whichever one does it, it's fine with me," McKinzie said.

The Futurity originated as the Hollywood Futurity in 1981 and was rebranded as the CashCall Futurity in 2007. Last year's version, the first at Los Alamitos, was a corker of a \$500,000 race: Dortmund (Big Brown) nipped Firing Line (Line of David) and Mr. Z (Malibu Moon) in a three-way photo finish. Half a year later, Firing Line and Dortmund ran second and third in the GI Kentucky Derby.

The 2014 edition of the \$350,000 Starlet was no slouch either: Take Charge Brandi (Giant's Causeway), the upset winner of the 2014 GI BC Juvenile Fillies, clinched the Eclipse Award as champion 2-year-old filly with a win at Los Alamitos.

The Futurity (\$350,000) and Starlet (\$300,000) remain on the Los Alamitos schedule this year after having their purses reduced from 2014.

McKinzie said the 2016 stakes schedule at Los Alamitos would be based around bringing back several California-bred stakes that were cut from the lineup this year, and that those races will be shored up by a version of the Bayakoa H., which used to be run for older fillies and mares at Hollywood in December.

Prior to McKinzie's announcement, commissioner Madeline Auerbach had voiced strong opinions about the erosion of southern California's overall graded stakes schedule.


"I understand that we played havoc with the circuit with dates." I get it," Auerbach said. "And I understand that when we do

that, we affect the purse accounts and we affect the ability of the racing associations to provide the stakes. My concern is for California... I am concerned about the graded stakes that we lose, that once we've lost them for two years they can't come back....I want to make sure everybody in the room understands that unless we find a way to present these stakes, we lose status, we lose ground, and there is no way to make it up again."

At the time, Auerbach's remarks had been directed at Santa Anita management, dovetailing into a question about what it intended to do with Hollywood's former GI American Oaks Invitational S. Santa Anita had run that race in the early summer in 2014 and 2015, but vice president of racing Rick Hammerle, said the track is proposing running it much deeper in the season in 2016. Cont. p4

"Since New York hit the jackpot, so to speak, with their slot machine money, they've been able to schedule many races that have influenced [competing] races across the country," Hammerle said. "This race was one of them. They have a million-dollar race on Fourth of July weekend, [the GI Belmont Oaks Invitational S.], for the same condition. Last year we tried to schedule the American Oaks as a semi-prep for that race, and when you're trying to schedule major races as preps for other races across the country, sometimes it doesn't work."

Hammerle said moving the American Oaks earlier on the calendar didn't make sense, because 3-year-old fillies aren't quite ready to run 1 ¼ miles early in the season. So after consulting with prominent trainers like Christophe Clement and Chad Brown, who are known for conditioning top female turfers, Santa Anita is now considering running its Oaks either on opening day or weekend of the 2016 December meet.

"That race is not going away. It has no intentions of going away. There's no chance we're going to give this race up," Hammerle said.

Auerbach said she appreciated the verbal commitment, but twice asked Santa Anita to put the plans for the American Oaks in writing.

Mike Pegram, representing the TOC, said, "We agree with Madeline, that we hate to give up any stakes races. But Rick made a very good case why they dropped the stakes they did; why they moved the American Oaks. I think running the numbers, Santa Anita is still going to be in an overpaid situation for the two meets combined. We approved. We signed off on the stakes schedule, with reluctance, but understanding their position with the way things sequenced this year, so we support the stakes schedule." @thorntontd

"I haven't been there for his workouts, but according to [trainer] Bob [Baffert], he's training very well," Shah commented. "We look forward to a good effort from him." A winner of his first six starts--including the GI Los Alamitos Futurity and GI Santa Anita Derby--Dortmund suffered his first career defeat when a respectable third behind stablemate American Pharoah (Pionnerof the Nile) after cutting out the early fractions in the GI Kentucky Derby. He was given plenty of time to get back on track following a well-beaten fourth in a very sloppy renewal of the GI Preakness S.

"We were hoping he would come back a whole lot sooner, but he had a couple of setbacks, and that's the reason why he started back so late," Shah revealed. "I was hoping that he'd be ready for the big 3-year-old races like the Haskell and Travers and so forth, but it wasn't meant to be for him."

Shah concluded, "[The Big Bear] was an easy race for him and the goal was for it to set him up for the Clark. So, hopefully he can move forward from that race and proves himself as a good 3-year-old through the end of the year." -@SteveSherackTDN

Brittlyn Stables is gearing up for a big weekend at Delta Downs with Above Fashion (Paddy O'Prado) in the GIII Delta Downs Princess S. and Forevamo (Uncle Mo) in the GIII Delta Downs Jackpot S. Evelyn Benoit and her husband Maurice, who are the owners of Brittlyn Stable, have about 25 horses in training, a broodmare band of around 30 and they stand Star Guitar (Quiet

American) at Clear Creek Stud in Folsom, Louisiana.

Brittlyn Farm is active in both buying and selling of bloodstock and are always looking for young horses who will have residual value after their racing careers are over. The couple recently purchased

multiple graded winner Clearly Now (Horse Greeley) who is entered in the Fair Grounds' Thanksgiving H. for trainer Ron Faucheux.

"We're hoping to have more stallions soon," Evelyn Benoit said. "I've been breeding mares for well over 35 years, but I never had stallions before Star Guitar.


She added, "We're hoping Clearly Now is one we can put in the stallion barn and Forevamo, you never know."

Benoit explained that Uncle Mo was a strong draw, especially since his lines would compliment many of Brittlyn Stable's mares. Brittlyn Stables purchased Forevamo for \$320,000 at the OBS April Sale this year. The 2-year-old colt was fourth in his Saratoga debut Aug. 22 and second at Churchill Sept. 26. He recently graduated in Delta's sloppy Jean Lafitte S. Oct. 24.

"We thought we should look for a 2-year-old because we have so many mares," Benoit said. "We wanted a horse who doesn't have the same bloodline as all the mares and fillies we're breeding. When I spoke to Al [Stall], he named several and said 'and Uncle Mo,' that was absolutely on my agenda. I had no idea he'd be so popular this year, it was just luck. We hope the horse will continue to do well, he's training well and broke his maiden in a stake race, which says a lot. If he runs well Saturday night at Delta, I think we'll have another stallion prospect on our hands."

Brittlyn Stables employs seven trainers in Stall, Faucheux, Tom Amoss, Joe Sharp, Victor Arceneaux and Eddie Johnson. Benoit said that after the stable's success with homebred Star Guitar, who was a multiple stakes winner, that she wanted to help some of the younger trainers get a head start.



"I love horse racing, and I'm trying to help develop another younger side of racing," she said. "When Star Guitar was doing so well and I knew I would be training him, I decided then that it was time to get younger trainers involved and give guy a chance who had told me they'd love to train for us. Basically, I went out and watched horses on the track or in the paddock who looked like they were well handled and well managed, and that's how we picked those trainers."

Brittlyn Stables sold their first yearling this year at the Keeneland September Sale, which is an area the operation may be expanding on in upcoming years.

"I do go to the sales and I buy and I sell," Benoit continued.
"This is the first year I've sold any of my babies in a sales ring and it was an unforgettable feeling. You hate to get rid of them, and yet when you see Calumet buying from a Southern girl, it was pretty gratifying that they'd buy a Star Guitar baby from a stallion who was unproven and a mare who is unproven. I was pretty excited about that, I had a very good feeling about that. I think right there, I made a giant step for Louisiana racing and for women everywhere in this business--it's a tough business."


Benoit noted that Forevamo's name has a special place in her heart. "We have five kids and they're all very close in age," the horsewoman explained.

"When they were younger and they were coming and going from practices and lessons, my husband would write me a note and he would always put 'love forever, Mo.' When I bought the Uncle Mo I knew I had to use Forevamo."



#### **KATHERINE VOSS:**

I would like to present a different opinion about the significance of Runhappy and Mongolian Saturday winning Breeders' Cup races without Lasix. Having trained horses for over 45 years (well before Lasix), I find the Breeders' Cup results confirm my belief that Lasix is not performance enhancing. Horses run faster when they don't bleed. We all know that not all horses bleed all of the time, but the reason for running everything on Lasix is preventative. I used to run all of my young horses without it until they showed signs of bleeding and one day it hit me. Why am I waiting for them to bleed? The damage from bleeding (scar tissue) is cumulative and the science (which all of us in the field already knew) has proven that Lasix reduces the occurrence and severity of bleeding. Cont. p7





What actually happens, I believe, is that a horse can go a little further with Lasix before bleeding starts and if that gets you to the wire before it starts, you have protected your horse. The "fact" that Lasix significantly lengthens the time it takes a horse to recover from a race is ridiculous. The body, mind and legs need a lot more time to be ready for the next race. If you manage your horse properly with electrolytes, it is not an issue. If you care about the welfare of the horse, it is far preferable to the alternative measures that have been suggested, like withholding feed and water for lengthy periods. Some of us actually remember the old days when, on a fairly regular basis, horses would come back to unsaddle with blood streaming out of their noses and splattered across their chests.

And please, stop using "eliminating Lasix" and "reducing breakdowns" in the same sentence. There is no connection.

People are free to run their horses without Lasix if they think their horse is better off, but every time they do, they are gambling (remember Rich Tapestry). On the other hand, a horse who has run without Lasix and never bled and who is fit and sound (like I hope all Breeders' Cup horses are) is at very little risk. The fact that those two horses could beat stellar fields without Lasix reaffirms my belief that Lasix is not a PED.





Tiago suffered his first major bout of colic in 2012 and did not service mares that year. "Tiago was a wonderful horse to be around and Frank [Stronach] would like to thank Jerry and Ann Moss for entrusting us with his care,"said Adena Springs General Manager Eoin Ryan. "That we're making this announcement in November of 2015 and not in 2012 is a testament to Bill Drury and the Adena Springs stallion team who have gone to extraordinary lengths to keep Tiago happy and strong the past three years." Among the runners sired by Tiago is the Mary Lou Whitney homebred Viva Majorca, winner of the 2015 Kelly's Landing S. at Churchill Downs and third in the GI Forego H. at Saratoga. Tiago will be buried in the Adena Springs Kentucky farm cemetery.

#### **Munnings Painting Tops Sporting Art Auction:**

A signed painting by Sir Alfred Munnings entitled Lord Astor's Broodmare and Foal fetched a final price of \$207,000, including buyer premium, to top the third annual Sporting Art Auction held Wednesday at Keeneland. Total sales for the auction, conducted in partnership by Keeneland and the Cross Creek Gallery of Lexington, totaled \$2,534,370. A total of 174 pieces of fine sporting art, American paintings and sculptures were featured of which 82% were reported as sold, with 37% of those selling at or above their listed high estimate value. The British-born Munnings is recognized as one of the two great masters of sporting art, along with George Stubbs. He painted the featured work, a 13½" x 16" oil on board, in the 1930s, when he was adding to his numerous commissions for William Waldorf, 2nd Viscount Astor. Two other pieces in the auction also fetched six-figure prices. Andre Pater's Early Summer, an oil on canvas depiction of cattle drinking from a watering hole, sold for \$161,000. The painting Longchamp Paddock, an acrylic on canvas by renowned American sporting artist LeRoy Neiman, sold for \$138,000.


