The Goffs November Sale drew to a close on Sunday after seven days of trade, the last two devoted to mares.

A strong lead session Saturday was followed by a quieter conclusion, with $\leq 1,199,900$ accrued from the sale of 117 mares at an average of $\leq 10,256$ and median of $\leq 6,000$. But the day held up well enough to deliver improved figures across the board for the mares' section of the sale. Across both days, 314 of the 402 lots offered brought a clearance rate of 77% and a 26% rise in turnover to $\leq 9,826,400$. Average and median were $\leq 31,294$ (+20%) and $\leq 15,000$ (+11%).

Goffs' Chief Executive Henry Beeby described the opening day of the mares' sale as a "truly stunning day of breeding stock," before reflecting on the final session.

He said, "[Sunday], although at a lower level, continued in the same kind of vein allowing us to record significant growth in turnover, average and median over the two days."

Beeby continued, "We have welcomed a really international audience of buyers following a number of targeted visits across the globe by the Goffs team and our colleagues at Irish Thoroughbred Marketing. They have flocked to Goffs to take advantage of our unique service and diverse catalogue which, although perhaps lacking a headline-grabbing star like Chicquita or Banimpire, represented the sort of sound commercial investments that have proved so lucrative for our buyers over the years. It seems that the 2015 offering appealed more than ever as our increases clearly illustrate." Cont. p2

TATTERSALLS DECEMBER SALES COMMENCE

The Tattersalls December sale series kicks off Monday with the one-day Yearling Sale, the final yearling sale on the calendar in Europe and an event which therefore offers shoppers one last chance for the year to fill their orders. The catalogue includes 67 siblings to stakes winners, including siblings to Group 1 winners Madame Chiang (GB) (Archipenko) and Sans Frontieres (Ire) (Galileo {Ire}).

"The December Yearling Sale is a cracking little sale every year," said Tattersalls Marketing Director Jimmy George. "It's the final yearling sale of the European calendar every year and has a loyal following. It always attracts people who may not have filled all the orders they had at the other sales and it looks to be a catalogue of genuine quality. 



Turnover for the November Sale as a whole was up by 1% on last year's tally, with the extended seven-day feature bringing €35,678,900, with 1,124 mares and foals sold from the 1,464 taken through the ring--again a clearance rate of 77%. Overall, the average contracted by 6% to €31,743 and the median by 15% to €17,000.

Leading the way on the final day was 7-year-old Whipper mare **Malagenia (Ire)**, a Group 3 winner in Italy and half-sister to another Italian black-type winner in Kaspersky (Ire) (Footstepsinthesand {GB}), victor of the G2 Premio Carlo Vittadini. Lot 1604 was sold in foal to Irish National Stud resident Worthadd (Ire) and knocked down for €70,000 to Sally Ann Grassick, representing her sister Cathy of Brian Grassick Bloodstock. The session-topper was bought on behalf of KK Eishindo, who also claimed another two mares on the opening day, including Tobann (Ire) (Teofilo {Ire}) for €180,000. All three will be exported to Japan.

Another Aga Khan-bred filly featured near the top on Sunday when the 3-year-old Shahzeena (Ire) (Rock Of Gibraltar {Ire}) fetched €46,000 to a bid from Pat McCarthy. A winner this year for Dermot Weld, Shahzeena, catalogued as <u>lot 1543</u> is a daughter of Sharleez (Ire), a Marju (Ire) half-sister to the Group 3 winners Sharestan (Ire) (Shamardal) and Shareen (Ire) (Bahri).

A key attraction for shoppers at the yearling sale will be the fact that the majority of the youngsters catalogued are eligible for a prize money scheme, including the £25,000 Tattersalls October Book 1 Bonus; the Tattersalls October Auction Stakes; the Tattersalls Ireland Super Auction Sales Stakes; French owners' and breeders' premiums; and the Plus 10 scheme. "There is a lot buyers can latch onto at this sale, and well over half the catalogue has the added attraction of a significant incentive for the buyers," George said.

STALLION NOMS AUCTION AT ARQANA

For the third consecutive year, Arqana will host an exceptional auction of popular European stallion nominations, Friday Dec. 4 at 5:30 p.m. in the sales ring. The sale will be followed by cocktails.

The sale will benefit the association Sauvegarde des Terres d'Elevage, which has successfully coordinated the defense of some of Normandy's most renowned breeding grounds, around the Haras du Pin in the Orne region just south of Deauville, where a waste landfill has been built among several breeding farms by Guy Dauphin Environnement, a subsidiary of the waste giant Ecore. Over the course of the last four years, a series of arduous legal and political battles have taken place with protestors.

"This year, some very important developments unfolded, and a positive outcome is expected in 2016, as the French Minister of Environment is now actively involved on the subject," said Eric Puerari, president of the Sauvegarde des Terres d'Elevage. "None of this would have been possible without the continued support of generous donators of stallion nominations, as well of course of the buyers of nominations. This whole process underlines the fantastic solidarity that the European racing and breeding industry has shown towards this just cause."

The nominations will be announced on an ongoing basis as the donations come in.

PROJECT PEDIGREE COMES FULL CIRCLE

Sydney's dominant trainer Chris Waller continues to go from strength-to-strength, his success notable for both its quality and its quantity. Even by his usual standards, though, sending **Good Project (Aus)** (Not A Single Doubt {Aus}) on the marathon journey across the continent from Sydney to Perth to land the Group 1 Railway S. at Ascot was a special achievement.

It is a leap of faith to send a horse to race 3,000 miles from home. It is also a leap of faith to run a horse in a Group 1 race when he has no stakes form whatsoever to his name. To combine the two, therefore, is a very bold venture indeed.

company: earlier this spring in Sydney he had won a Benchmark 85 handicap at Rosehill and a Benchmark 92 handicap at Randwick before being sent down to Melbourne to contest one of the supporting races on the undercard at Flemington on Melbourne Cup Day (in which he finished second). Thus, the abrupt rise in class to Group 1 company was remarkable.

Once again, though, Waller's judgment was vindicated and he duly saddled another Group 1 winner for Mr. C. C. Lai, whose colors have also been carried this year by G1 Sydney Cup winner Grand Marshal (GB) (Dansili {GB}) and G1 Darley Classic hero Delectation (Aus) (Shamardal).

Good Project, a A\$300,000 purchase at the 2013 Inglis Melbourne Premier Yearling Sale, was one of two stakes winners on the card at Ascot for Arrowfield sire Not A Single Doubt, whose profile has seemingly been on an ever-upward trajectory since retiring to the Hunter Valley property 10 years ago.

Not A Single Doubt is something of a rarity nowadays, being a horse who retired to one of the major studs without having won a group race. The best two of his four wins (in the Canonbury S. over 1000 meters at Randwick as a 2-year-old and in the Zeditave S. over 1200 meters at Caulfield at three) both came in listed company, while his only notable group race form came when fourth in the Group 2 Todman Slipper Trial as a juvenile and second in a Group 3 sprint in Melbourne as a 3-year-old.

However, he was a fast horse and, more to the point, one with 'Arrowfield' written all over his pedigree: he is one of several

sons of the multiple champion sire Redoute's Choice (Aus) (Danehill) to have joined their father on the Arrowfield roster and comes from the immediate family of the outstanding Snippets (Aus) (Lunchtime {GB}). The latter was a hugely charismatic champion racehorse in the '80s who then did extremely well in his stud career, which began at Trans Media Park near Cootamundra and ended at Arrowfield, where he is buried and where his excellent grandson Snitzel (Aus)

(Redoute's Choice {Aus}) now stands at a fee of A\$80,000.

Although bred and trained in New South Wales, Good Project is an appropriate winner of one of Western Australia's best races because he comes from a family that

has been throwing out winners in WA for generations. Good Project's fourth dam Lucky Wish (Aus) was a daughter of the 1971 Melbourne Cup winner Silver Knight (NZ) (Alcimedes {GB}), who spent his entire stud career in Western Australia and who sired the WA-bred and -owned 1984 Melbourne Cup winner Black Knight (Aus). Lucky Wish won three provincial races in her home state and was placed in town. She then bred several winners by the hugely successful WA-based sire Haulpak (Aus) (Dignitas). Two of these winners--I'm In Luck (Aus) and Wishing Free (Aus)--were stakes-placed in Perth, while another was Good Project's third dam Free Wish (Aus).

Mated with the 1986 Sydney Cup winner Marooned (GB) (Mill Reef), Free Wish produced Good Project's second dam Free Now (Aus). Free Now, five times a metropolitan winner in Perth, proved to be a good broodmare after her racing days were over. Good Project's dam Euchre, a daughter of the very fast Star Kingdom-line horse Final Card (Aus) (Elounda Bay {NZ}), was one of her winners. Euchre has now enjoyed a useful stud career on the east side of the country.

The now-deceased, former Victorian-based (but US-conceived and NZ-foaled) Miswaki stallion Umatilla was arguably an appropriate mate for Euchre bearing in mind that although trained by Tommy Hughes in Melbourne, he had registered his biggest victory in Perth when taking WA's top 2-year-old race, the Karrakatta Plate, which carried Group 1 status at the time. Euchre bred two good horses by Umatilla: World Airlines (Aus) and Alacarte (Aus), who both showed stakes form in Singapore, and now Good Project, her eighth foal, has shown himself to be her best yet. That he has done so by winning a Group 1 race in Perth seems very appropriate.

CATALOGUES ONLINE FOR NZB SALES

Catalogues for New Zealand Bloodstock's National Yearling Sales Series are now online at <u>www.nzb.co.nz</u>.

The three sales, the <u>Premier</u>, <u>Select</u> and <u>Festival</u> sales have attracted a combined 1378 youngsters that will be offered over the course of six days beginning Jan. 25, 2016, at NZB's Karaka complex.

The National Yearling Sales series continues to be a source of top horses, as the series was represented by no fewer than 21 individual Group 1 winners last season. The Premier catalogue offers the cream of the crop of yearlings and will feature siblings to 32 top-level winners such as G1 Melbourne Cup winner Prince of Penzance (NZ) (lot 45); New Zealand Horse of the Year and champion 3-year-old Mongolian Khan (Aus) (lot 223); four-time G1 winner Shamexpress (NZ) (lot 133); and G1 Victoria Derby winner Monaco Consul (NZ) (lot 177).

Other successful graduates of the sales include Kermadec (NZ), Preferment (NZ) and G1 New Zealand 2000 hero Xtravagant (NZ).

At Karaka 2016, all yearlings offered at the National Yearling Sales Series are eligible for the Karaka Million Series which now includes two \$1 million races. This crop of yearlings will be racing for the \$1 million Karaka Million in 2017, the new \$1-million Karaka Million 3YO Classic in 2018, plus the \$100,000 Karaka Stayers Cup from 2018 and each year thereafter.





'MAUR' OF THE SAME AT KYOTO

Maurice (Jpn) (Screen Hero {Jpn}) took his seasonal record to a perfect five-for-five, adding Sunday's G1 Mile Championship S. at Kyoto to his earlier success in the G1 Yasuda Kinen when last spotted at the races June 7. The effort in all likelihood locked up divisional honors for the paternal grandson of Grass Wonder, who holds entries for both the G1 Longines Hong Kong Cup (2000m) and Mile at Sha Tin in three weeks' time and could be a horse for the G1 Dubai Duty Free S. (1800m) in March 2016. Ryan Moore, in Japan on a short-term contract, had the winning ride. "He showed a really good turn of foot in the final 400 meters," the jockey commented. "I knew that he was probably going to be the best miler in the race, and it was just a question of getting a clean trip, and hopefully if we kept things straightforward, he would be able to show he was the best horse. And he did."

Drawn awkwardly in gate 16 of the 18 runners, Maurice was off alertly and though unable to get closer to the rail than about four off for the journey up the backstretch, raced with cover from a position slightly worse than midfield as Tosen Stardom

(Jpn) (Deep Impact {Jpn}) set a solid pace over the sound surface. Left no choice but to travel deep on the sweeping turn, Maurice began to work his way into the race and launched his bid entering the final two furlongs. Pulled out into the clear by Moore in



upper stretch, Maurice accelerated visibly, wrested command about 200 meters from the wire and was home for a cozy success. Fiero, the second choice in a race that attracted nearly US\$121 million in wagers, raced to the inside of the eventual winner for most of the race and drove between rivals late to match his runner-up effort from 2014. Favored Isla Bonita hopped in the air at the break, made steady progress up the inside through the middle stages and ran on well late to just miss second. Maurice became the 10th horse to win the country's two mile features and the sixth to do it in the same season (Daiwa Major {Jpn}, 2007).

STACKED DECK DOMINATES KENNEDY ROAD

Bruce Lunsford homebred **Stacked Deck** (First Samurai) kicked clear of the field effortlessly down the stretch of the GII Kennedy Road S. at Woodbine Sunday. The dark bay, who wrapped up his 3-year-old season with a sixth in the 2014 Kennedy Road S., tallied three wins in eight starts this year, including the GIII Bold Venture S. Sept. 13. Most recently, Stacked Deck was third in the rained-off GIII Woodford S. at Keeneland Oct. 3, and never factored when 10th in the GI Breeders' Cup Turf Sprint Oct. 31. The Barb Minshall trainee was positioned just off dueling leaders down the backstretch of this one and moved into contention on the turn. Swung four wide at the top of the lane, Stacked Deck began his rally, taking control in upper stretch and pulling away for the decisive victory.

"When I saw him in the paddock, I knew he was on his game," said Minshall. "He's gained weight every race this year. I think he's got stronger every race. He's had a lot of races in the last couple months, but it hasn't taken anything out of him. I told [jockey Luis Contreras] he didn't need the lead, but just don't take him back. Let him get comfortable and see how it sets up. If somebody wanted to go, just let them go. I told him, turning for home, that's when you want to set him down. If he gets in front, he'll be hard to go by." **Cont. p3**

We worked him behind dirt the other day, behind two horses. He took a lot of dirt but did not react at all. We did it just in case; you have to do it at some point. At least we don't have to worry about him if he has to sit fourth in the race."


Either way, the Clark or the Falls City will be the last start Frivolous' career. The 5-year-old will join Humphrey's broodmare band in Kentucky following the race.


