It is my intention to dedicate this column to the memory of Peter Willett who died this week aged 96. I will never forget being invited to tea at his house in Rotherwick, Hampshire, following a spot-on critique he penned of one of my columns on handicapping in the *Racing Post* in 2007.

Peter will always be a hero in this household and his books adorn our shelves, most notably his masterpiece, *The Classic Racehorse*. In a 1984 review of this astounding work, which would be a foundation of any academic study of racing along with *Breeding The Racehorse* by Tesio and a few others, Jake Spidle of the University of New Mexico wrote the following:

"Peter Willett's book...belongs on the shelves of serious students of modern sport and those of good undergraduate libraries. It is without peer in its field, both in its conceptual approach and in the authority and insight of its author. It is simply amazing how much Willett knows about the history of the breed."

Peter was an architect of the European Pattern. To say he was interested in the structure of racing and handicapping is a bit like saying Newton was fascinated by forces or that Rutherford was obsessed with atoms.

When I visited him, he urged me to have confidence that a lifetime studying the weight-for-age scale or sectional times, or any of other of the academic esoterica related to the sport, would be its own reward. Lulled into a false sense of security, I asked

him how he could be so sure. "I am not sure," he said, "but it isn't given to many to even have the curiosity." **cont. p2**

NEW SIRES IN VOGUE AT TATTERSALLS

It's no new phenomenon, but the polarization of the market towards the offspring of first-season sires was more apparent than ever Wednesday when six of the top 10 lots sold were by freshmen, headed by a 110,000gns son of Cheveley Park Stud's Lethal Force (Ire).

Mick Flanagan placed the final bid for the son of Ha'penny Beacon (GB) (Erhaab) ([lot 507](#)) from the family of Lady Bamford's Oaks winner Sariska (GB) (Pivotal {GB}), having seen off an attempt by underbidder Amanda Skiffington. He said of the Battlefield Stud-consigned colt, who will be re-offered as a yearling, "A few of us from Britain and Ireland have pooled resources on him. We knew he'd go well. He jumped out at us when did our lists last night." **Cont. p3**

I can relate this quote with confidence because I wrote it in pencil on the inside-back cover of his book, *The Story of Tattersalls*. And it is with his words in mind and after his great example that I get to the originally intended start of this article, before hearing the sad news.

Peter cared deeply about the structure of Thoroughbred competition, and so do I. That's why, if I ever had the chance, I would change the handicapping scale on the Flat, because it is patently unfair.

Consider the data in Table 1 concerning Flat handicaps in Britain since 2006. To channel George Orwell, all horses are created equal in handicaps--or so the story goes--but some are more equal than others. See the linear trend in Strike-Rate, Impact Value and Distance To Winner according to a horse's position in the weights (its Official Rating Rank)? Higher Strike-Rates and Impact Values are associated with top weights, while there is an almost perfect correlation between the distance a horse is beaten and its rank in the weights.

The system is inherently unfair because the exchange-rate between pounds and lengths is wrong. Higher-weighted horses should be conceding more weight to their inferiors, which would equalise the strike-rates and Impact Values in the table. (Impact Value takes into account field-sizes and is scaled where 1.0 is an average Strike-Rate and 2.0, for example, is twice that expected by chance.)

It isn't just the data that points to this but the physics. In Bioenergetics and Racehorse Ratings, engineer Bob Wilkins uses calculus to derive a fundamental scale of weight-for-distance beaten as follows shown in Table 2. This scale is much wider than that employed by handicappers who compile British Horseracing Authority (BHA) ratings, and it prewarns of the effects that using a narrower scale would likely have: higher-weighted horses in handicaps win more often than they should.

At fault is the scale of 0-140 on which racehorses are rated on the Flat. It is only convention that dictates that jumps horses are rated on a wider scale, which leaves the top National Hunt horses on 175+. Presumably, the root was in the pound-value of handicap weights allotted back in the day: 10st on the Flat is 140lb and 12st 7lb over jumps is 175lb.

Either way, there is no good reason for this evident from statistical analysis. Harmonising the scales would not only remove the egregious effect that is the subject of this article, but also facilitate cross-code comparison.

If racing fans were interested in whether a horse were better over hurdles or on the Flat, the numbers would tell them without the bizarre conversion of adding 40 or 45 to Flat-race ratings to determine whether a horse switching from the Flat to hurdles is well handicapped. It would also resonate with fans to compare and contrast Golden Horn with Sprinter Sacre (BHA 173 over fences), with Golden Horn (BHA 130) more readily than at present.

But, leaving any cascading benefit to one side, the more important reason to expand the Flat scale by 25% is to enable a correction in the exchange-rate between pounds and lengths by the same proportion; in other words, to move the handicapper's calculations more into line with physical reality. This could make a profound difference to the sport, for it would help to tilt handicap wins more across the continuum of power from the powerful stables to those lower down the money tree.

How on earth can anyone justify a system that is predicated on giving all horses an equal chance, when the data proves it does nothing of the sort?

If I could have this discussion with Peter, he might well disagree with me; either way, he might tell me there isn't a chance of the Flat scale expanding to the same as the jumps because of vested interest by powerful connections who have the loudest voices.

But, I have never cared about that last bit. The argument is driven by analysis, by considering two sources of evidence which point the same way. Most of all, however, it is driven by simple "curiosity" in the system. For that and everything else, thank you Peter Willett.

Lethal Force ended the second session as leading sire by average of those with more than one foal sold, his seven

weanlings having returned an average price of 33,286gns from his first-season covering fee of £12,500.

A total of 179 foals sold Wednesday for an aggregate of 2,592,600gns. The average was 14,484gns and the median 9,500gns.

Darley's dual Group 1 winner Farhh (GB) was the next of the new boys to strike via [lot 582](#), his son out of the Cadeaux Genereux (GB) mare Stoneacre

Sarah (GB), who was selected by Ciaran 'Flash' Conroy at 85,000gns.

After signing for the Silfield Bloodstock offering--a grandson of the good sprinting mare Tropical (GB) (Green Desert)--Conroy commented, “He's a really nice horse and the stallion was a very good racehorse. I'm very happy to have him and he should be a nice Book 2 horse for next year.”

Another young Darley sire made the top three when a son of Epaulette (Aus) ([lot 489](#)) was sold from Gilly McCalmont's Yeomanstown Lodge Stud to Mark Dwyer's Oaks Farm Stables at 70,000gns.

“He looks a strong and straightforward type. You always hope that you'll be able to buy these sort of foals a bit cheaper but you have to pay for a good foal,” said Dwyer, who confirmed that the colt is another coming back to the sales next year.

Epaulette joined his half-brother Helmet (Aus) on the Darley roster and Helmet, whose first runners will take to the track in 2016, was also responsible for one of the

higher-priced lots on Wednesday with his colt out of Musical Key (GB) ([lot 603](#)), a half-brother to the listed-placed Harmonic Note (GB) (Nayef), fetching a bid of 67,000gns from the O'Callaghan brothers of Yeomanstown Stud.

Breaking the stranglehold of unproven sires was Bumble Mitchell's colt by Sir Percy (GB) ([lot 585](#)), whose winning

half-brother Durand (GB) (Motivator {GB}) was sold for 260,000gns as a 3-year-old to continue his racing career in Qatar. The weanling prompted pinhooker Brendan Holland of Grove Stud to go to 70,000gns.

Swiss Spirit (GB) topped Monday's short session and had another two sought-after foals on the second day. Peter and Michelle Morgan of Carmel Stud plumped for Whitsbury Manor Stud's colt out of Skiing (GB) (Sakhee's Secret {GB}) ([lot 388](#)), an unraced half-sister to multiple group-winning sprinter The Trader (Ire) (Selkirk), at 68,000gns.

"We think that he's an outstanding individual and he will be coming back to Book 2. He should be a real trainer's horse and is by what will be a speed sire," offered Peter Morgan.

The buyer for [lot 534](#), the Swiss Spirit colt out of the Oasis Dream (GB) mare Littlemisssunshine (Ire) who made 42,000gns, was a little closer to home as he was the selection of brothers Tom and Ben Harris, who operate as One Agency and whose parents Trevor and Libby Harris of Lordship Stud bred Swiss Spirit. Littlemisssunshine, who is owned by former Newmarket trainer Toby Coles, has made a good start to her stud career, with both her runners being winners and current juvenile Soapy Aitken (GB) (Pastoral Pursuits {GB}) having earned black-type when third in the Listed Racing UK Dragon S.

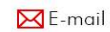
Swiss Spirit's 18 foals to have sold so far this week have returned an average of 17,089gns from his debut stud fee of £4,500. Other freshman sires with foals selling far in excess of the day's average included Havana Gold (Ire), Maxios (GB) and Cityscape (GB).

David Redvers stands Havana Gold for Qatar Bloodstock at his Tweenhills Stud and gave a vote of confidence to [lot 457](#), a filly from the Pocock family's Stringston Farm and out of an Excellent Art (GB) half-sister to G2 Goldene Peitsche winner Electric Beat (GB) (Shinko Forest {Ire}), who was knocked down at 32,000gns.

Monsun's son Maxios stood his first season at Gestut Fahrhof at a fee of €10,000 and has had a handful of his first crop selling in Ireland and Britain over the last fortnight. Mick Flanagan stepped in to buy [lot 485](#), a Maxios great-grandson of Richard Henry's late, great broodmare Jude (GB) (Darshaan {GB}), who was offered by Ballinroone Stud and sold for 31,000gns.

The first weanlings of Bated Breath (GB) were well received last year and it's now the turn of his Group 1-winning half-brother Cityscape (GB) to be judged by the foal buyers. Top of the tree to date is a filly out of Firebelly (GB) (Nicolotte {GB}), the dam of Group 3-placed Firebeam (GB) (Cadeaux Genereux {GB}), who sold for 30,000gns early in the session to Liam Norris. The scopey January foal was bred in partnership by Simon Sweeting of Overbury Stud, where Cityscape stands, and Charlie Wyatt of Dukes Stud, and will be re-offered as a yearling by Norris and his wife Jenny.

The third session of foals begins Thursday at 9:30 a.m. local time.

STELLAR FIELDS FOR LONGINES HKIR

With some HK\$83 million (US\$10.7 million) up for grabs, one would expect the best horses from all corners of the world to descend on Sha Tin Racecourse for the Longines Hong Kong International Races. That proved very much to be the case when the fields for the so-called 'World Turf Championships' were announced Wednesday morning, as no fewer than 33 Group 1/Grade I winners from seven jurisdictions are among the 56 horses invited to the event, to be staged Sunday, Dec. 13.



"The Longines Hong Kong International Races is well-established in the elite echelon of the sport's most prestigious occasions: it offers outstanding prize money, it delivers a fantastic atmosphere, and most importantly it showcases exceptional talent from across the world," said Bill Nader, executive director of racing for the Hong Kong Jockey Club. "In keeping with that tradition, we are pleased to see, once again, such a depth of quality to this year's selected runners, with 33 individual winners of 64 G1 races.

Nader continued, "Here in Hong Kong we have a strong contingent of talented, international-calibre horses, notably the outstanding Able Friend, but at this year's HKIR our home team will face perhaps its toughest test of recent times. Looking at the 33 talented overseas challengers. we have some of the most exciting horses in the world heading for Sha Tin on the second Sunday in December. This is international racing at the highest level and everyone is in for a real treat."

This Cup Runneth Over...

Three of the four defending champions from the 2014 renewal are back—only the sidelined Aerovelocity (NZ) (Pins {Aus}) will be absent—to try to follow up on their success, but in contrast to years past, each of the events has a wide-open feel to it. **Designs On Rome (Ire)** (Holy Roman Emperor {Ire}) will have ‘Magic Man’ Joao Moreira back in the irons as he tries to make it back-to-back wins in the G1 Longines Hong Kong Cup, which at

HK\$25 million (US\$3.2 million) is the day’s richest and final event. Though locally based gallopers have annexed the last four runnings, eight raiders will try to snap the streak, chief among them being Moyglare Stud’s **Free**

Eagle (Ire) (High Chaparral {Ire}). The 4-year-old, who will have his final start before retiring to the Irish National Stud, took a salty renewal of the G1 Prince of Wales’s S. at Royal Ascot first off an October hiatus this past June and was hampered badly by Golden Horn (GB) (Cape Cross {Ire}) when third in the G1 Irish Champion S. in September. His sixth to Golden Horn in the G1 Prix de l’Arc de Triomphe was not without merit and the 2000-meter trip should be right up his alley. Ironically, Moyglare Stud also bred Designs On Rome. Agnes Digital (Crafty Prospector) is the last Japanese horse to succeed in the Cup, but **Staphanos (Jpn)** (Deep Impact {Jpn}) should garner a fair bit of support to halt that skid. One of a record 10 horses from Japan scheduled to make the trip, the 4-year-old was runner-up to **Blazing Speed (GB)** (Dylan Thomas {Ire}) and ahead of **Criterion (NZ)** (Sebring {Aus}) in the G1 Queen Elizabeth II Cup over the course and trip in April. He exits an excellent second in the G1 Tenno Sho at Tokyo Nov. 1.

Moore/Moreira Vs. Moore in Mile...

One of the afternoon’s more-anticipated clashes comes in the HK\$23 million (US\$2.97 million) G1 Longines Hong Kong Mile, in which the world’s top-rated miler **Able Friend (Aus)** (Shamardal) will look for a second straight win, but will have to deal with the

talented G1 Yasuda Kinen and G1 Mile Championship winner **Maurice (Jpn)** (Screen Hero {Jpn}), the mount of Ryan Moore. The hulking Able Friend, trained by John Moore and scheduled to be ridden by Joao Moreira, suffered a rare defeat on home turf

at the hands of the opportunistic **Beauty Flame (Ire)** (Footstepsinthesand {GB}) in the G2 Jockey Club Mile Nov. 21, but the dynamics of that race worked against him and he is probably best forgiven for the effort. Form of the G1 Breeders’ Cup Mile is represented by the David O’Meara-trained G1 Woodbine Mile hero **Mondialiste (Ire)** (Galileo {Ire}), who flashed home to be an outstanding runner-up behind Tepin (Bernstein). “He travelled to and from the Breeders’ Cup really well and has come out of the race in great form,” said O’Meara. “The configuration of Sha Tin is probably more like Woodbine rather than Keeneland in the fact that you only have one turn. At Keeneland, you have two turns for the mile. The track at Sha Tin should be fine,” he added. **Esoterique (Ire)** (Daneshill Dancer {Ire}) will try to become the first member of the fairer sex to beat the boys in the Mile since Sunline (NZ) defeated Fairy King Prawn (Aus) (Daneshill) in a renewal for the ages in 2000. Winner of the G1 Prix Maurice de Gheest in August and G1 Prix Jacques le Marois a week apart in August, she added the G1 Sun Chariot S. at Newmarket Oct. 3, but may have struggled with the ground in the Breeders’ Cup, finishing seventh.

A Power-Packed Renewal of the Vase...

Typically the 'black sheep' of the HKIR family, this year's HK\$16.5-million (US\$2.1 million) G1 Longines Hong Kong Vase may lack horses of the quality of a Golden Horn or Found (Ire) (Galileo {Ire}), but should be the best edition of the race in some time. No fewer than 11 of the 14 selected runners have succeeded at the highest level, including **Flintshire (GB)** (Dansili {GB}), who proved a popular winner of the Vase in 2014, but has horses much better than Willie Cazals (Ire) (Aussie Rules) and

Khaya (NZ) (Librettist) to deal with this time around. Trainer Chris Waller, so successful across Australia, will be represented by his first runner at the meeting in the form of **Preferment (NZ)** (Zabeel {NZ}). The 2014 G1 Victoria Derby

hero going 2500 meters, the 4-year-old was back to his best when proving narrowly best in the G1 Turnbull S. at Flemington Oct. 4. Well down the field in the G1 Cox Plate and G1 Melbourne Cup, he returns to arguably his best trip for this. Ed Dunlop, who sent out the late Red Cadeaux (GB) (Cadeaux Genereux {GB}) to win the 2012 Vase, is set to be represented by **Trip to Paris (Ire)** (Champs Elysees {GB}), second in the G1 Caulfield Cup Oct. 17 ahead of an excellent fourth in the Melbourne Cup. His participation in the Vase could hinge on his performance in this Sunday's G1 Japan Cup, as could that of G1 Grand Prix de Paris winner and Arc fifth **Erupt (Ire)** (Dubawi {Ire}) as well as Germany's G1 Grosser Preis von Baden hero **Ito (Ger)** (Adlerflug {Ger}). **Highland Reel (Ire)** (Galileo {Ire}), the G1 Secretariat S. victor and G1 Cox Plate third, and G1 Canadian International S. scorer **Cannock Chase** (Lemon Drop Kid) add further depth to an outstanding field. And no mention of the Vase or, indeed of the HKIR, would be complete without **Cirrus des Aigles (Fr)** (Even Top {Ire}), who makes a remarkable seventh trip to Hong Kong at the age of nine.

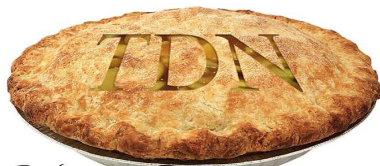

LA VERDAD SEEKS CAREER 'HIGH'

Lady Sheila Stable's **La Verdad** (Yes It's True) looks to go out with a bang by becoming the first female to win Aqueduct's GIII Fall Highweight H. since 1986 in what is rumored to be her career finale Thursday. The 5-year-old miss has only faced males on one other occasion, when finishing seventh behind the reopposing **Salutos Amigos** (Salute the Sarge) in last year's renewal of this test. This time, however, La Verdad comes into the Fall Highweight off what is without a doubt her best season yet, having started 2015 with five straight wins in the GII Distaff H. Apr. 18, GIII Vagrancy H. May 16, state-bred Dancin Renee S. June 18, GII Honorable Miss H. July 29 and GII Gallant Bloom H. Sept. 26. With Breeders' Cup rumors flying, trainer Linda Rice decided to send her stable star to the state-bred Iroquois S. at Belmont just one week before the Championships Oct. 24 and changed tactics, asking the mare to come from a bit off the pace rather than going straight to the lead. La Verdad showed her conditioner exactly what she wanted to see with a 3 3/4-length victory and it was on to Keeneland, where she finished a game second after setting the pace in the GI Breeders' Cup Filly and Mare Sprint Oct. 31. Owner Sheila Rosenblum decided she could not part with the bay after that and scratched her from the Fasig-Tipton November sale with this race in mind before transitioning her to a new career as a broodmare.

"Cutting back to six furlongs is obviously a good thing for her," said Rice. "Against the colts, it's questionable. Last year didn't go well for us, but I think that she's in much better form right now." La Verdad boasts a record of seven wins from nine starts at Aqueduct and 11 wins from 14 starts at six furlongs. **Cont. p3**

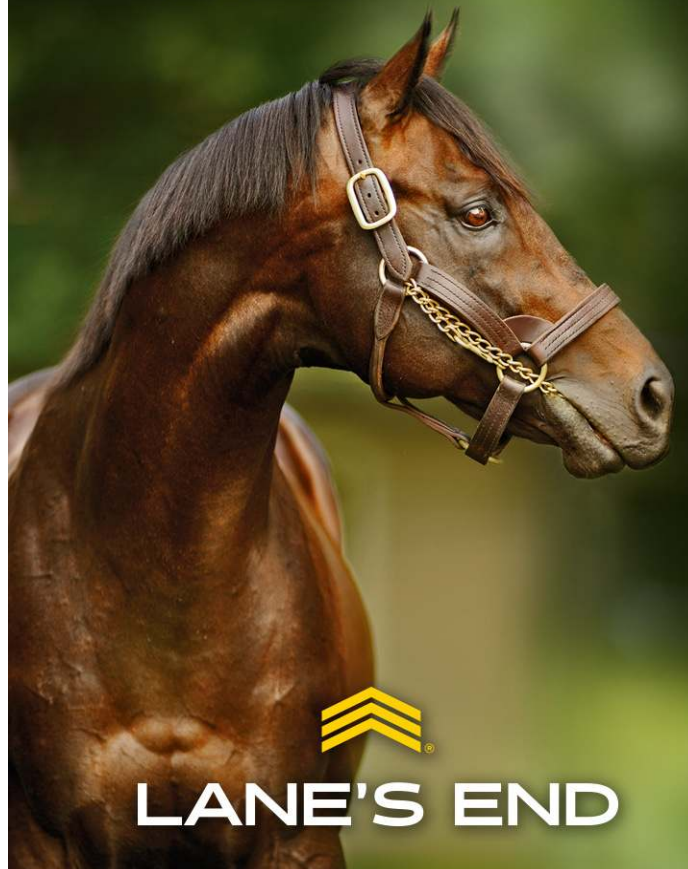

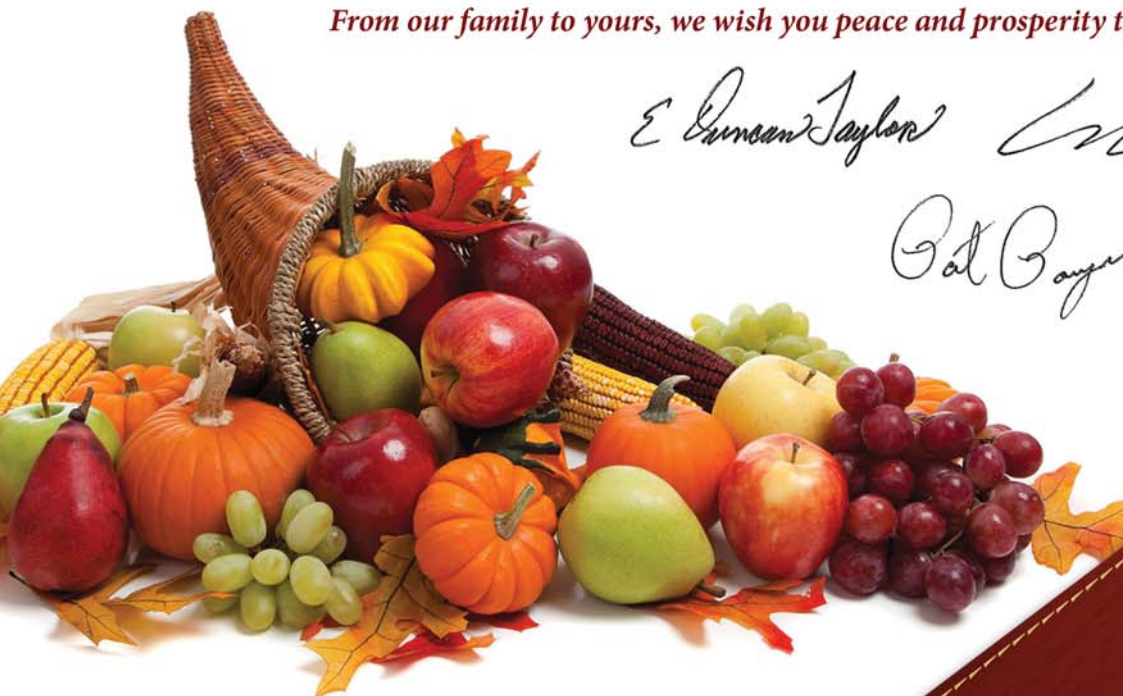

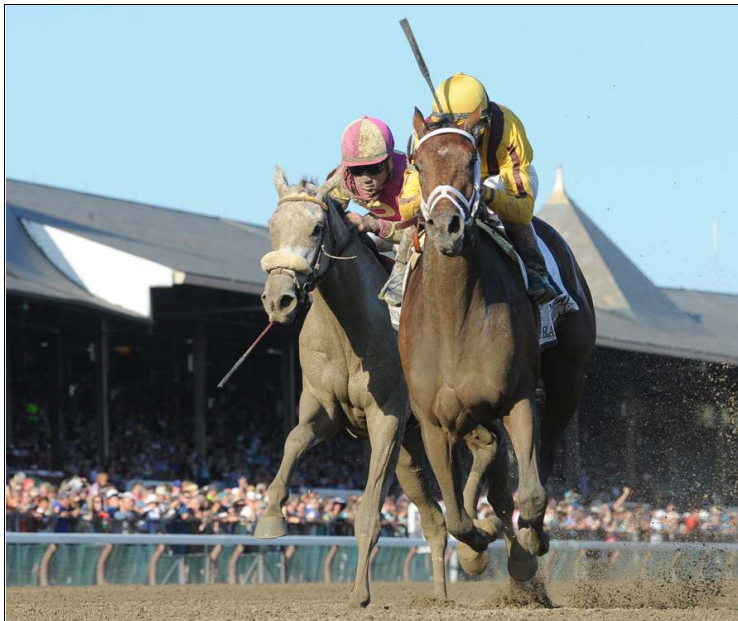
