



ROSSENARA'S SHAMARDAL SHOW-STOPPER

TOPS TATTS By Emma Berry

A banner day at the Tattersalls Foal Sale for John McEnery's Rossenara Stud saw two members of the farm's five-strong consignment bring two of the top three prices of the day within minutes of each other when a Shamardal colt was hammered down at 240,000gns, directly followed by a son of Dark Angel (Ire) at 160,000gns.

In each case the name on the buyers' sheet was the same--John Ferguson, on behalf of Darley, which stands Shamardal and this year bought a significant share in Dark Angel.

"They were healthy and well," said a delighted McEnery after the duo had passed through the ring. "They each had over 50 shows a day. We brought them over on Friday so they had plenty of time to rest as we knew they would be busy."

The session-topping Shamardal colt (<u>lot 824</u>) is the second foal of Sapporo (Ire) (Distorted Humor), an unraced half-sister to GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile Turf winner Outstrip (GB) (Exceed And Excel {Aus}), who was bred by Darley from the GI Spinster S. heroine Asi Siempre (El Prado {Ire}). Sapporo was sold by the operation as a 3-year-old for 13,000gns to Emerald Bloodstock in 2012.

The March-born Dark Angel colt (<u>lot 825</u>) is another second foal, this time of the winning juvenile Witnessed (GB) (Authorized {Ire}), a daughter of the GIII Royal Heroine S. winner Magic Mission (GB) (Machiavellian), bought for just €7,000 as a 3-year-old the same year that Sapporo passed through the ring. **Cont. p2**

Rossenara's five foals to sell on Thursday realised an average of 104,000gns to leave the Co Kilkenny stud at the top of the consignors' table.

Ferguson later returned to the chute to buy <u>lot 839</u>, Meadowlands Stud's son of Kodiac (Ire) out of a half-sister to listed Braveheart S. winner Ithoughtitwasover (Ire) (Hurricane Run {Ire}) at 130,000gns.

A marathon 12-hour session at Park Paddocks saw 296 foals go under the hammer, with 234 of them bought for a 7% reduction in clearance rate to 79%. Turnover was 8,576,000gns and the average improved by 5%, to 36,650gns. The median remained static at 26,000gns.

German-based first-crop sire Maxios (GB) (Monsun {Ger}) has had a select group of foals advertising his worth at the British and Irish foals sales and they did not go unnoticed, with one of his daughters, a filly from the Niarchos family of Aviance and Aldebaran, selling for 180,000gns to Anthony Stroud. The half-sister to dual Group 1 winner Saddex (GB) (Sadler's Wells) (<u>lot 930</u>) was offered through Newsells Park Stud, the sister operation to Gestut Fahrhof, where Maxios stands.

"This is a very, very nice foal and I like Maxios a lot. He was a very good racehorse who showed remarkable speed, " said Stroud, who added that he had purchased the filly for a partnership which plans to race her.

The 16-year-old mare Evangeline (GB) (Sadler's Wells) passed through Goffs' February Sale this year and was bought by Richard Brown of Blandford Bloodstock for €41,000. Six weeks later she foaled a colt by Kodiac (Ire), who just eight months later was sold for 150,000gns to Stephen Hillen on behalf of Jim McCartan and Mick Carty of MC Bloodstock. Unraced herself, Evangeline has already proved herself as a broodmare, with her 2006 foal by Exceed And Excel named Infamous Angel (GB) having won the G2 Lowther S.

Shadwell also featured high on the buyers' sheet after Angus Gold went to 130,000gns to secure <u>lot 790</u>, the Invincible Spirit (Ire) son of dual listed winner Selinka (GB) (Selkirk), who has produced two winners from her two runners to date.

"He's by a top sire from a stakes-winning mare and when you see one like him you have to have a go. The team loved him," explained Gold.

He was later joined on the Shadwell list by <u>lot 918</u>, an Acclamation grandson of G3 Ballyogan S. winner Miss Anabaa (GB) (Anabaa). The first foal of her winning daughter Miliika (GB) (Green Desert) was consigned by Trickledown Stud and sold for 115,000gns.

Breeders Chris and Lesley Mills, who keep their nine mares across Trickledown, Lanwades, Brook and Pantile studs, were delighted with the return for the latest member of a family they've nurtured for generations. **Cont. p3**

Rae's trained all the family and we've had plenty of fun with them along the way," said Chris Mills.

Mehmet Kurt, the Turkish owner of Lambourn-based Kingwood Stud, was active in the foal market on Thursday, signing for four lots including a brace of weanlings at 120,000gns apiece. The first, <u>lot 724</u>, was Norman Court Stud's first-crop daughter of treble Classic winner Camelot (GB) out of the listed runner-up Fanditha (Ire), whose first foal Cuppatee (Ire) (Canford Cliffs {Ire}) was a dual-winning juvenile this year.

Also on the list was the Courtleigh Stud-bred colt by Pivotal (GB), a full-brother to recent listed winner and Group 1 runner-up Princess Loulou (Ire), who was offered by David and Trish Brown's Furnace Mill Stud. Kurt is also now the owner of one of the few first-crop foals of the subfertile Al Kazeem (GB) (<u>lot 766</u>). Consigned by Keith Harte, the colt is out of Burlesque Star (Ire) (Thousand Words), a half-sister to Group winners Dominant (Ire) (Cacique {Ire}) and Es Que Love (Ire) (Clodovil {Ire}).

David and James Egan's Corduff Stud enjoyed some decent

results at the recent yearling sales and added a new recruit to next year's team in <u>lot 749</u>, a filly by Lope De Vega (Ire) whose half-sister Starbright (Ire) (Duke Of Marmalade {Ire}) was placed in the G3 EBF Park Express S. and is one of three winners for her dam Starry Messenger (GB) (Galileo {Ire}).

Bidding through Richard Brown, the Egans went to 115,000gns for the filly from Knockainey Stud, from which the same team also purchased a Kodiac colt for €260,000 last week at Goffs.

Nafferty Stud's Raven's Pass half-sister to GII Mac Diarmida H. winner Ramazutti (Honor Grades) (<u>lot 704</u>) will be on her way to the U.S. after being bought by agent Justin Casse for an undisclosed client.

Casse, a visitor to Newmarket for the December Sales for the last four years, said, "The page fits very well and, as she's a half-sister to a Grade II winner, the filly will head to the States now."

He added," I bought a foal here last year and have been coming over for the mares' sale with an increasing number of clients looking for horses each year."

A further 260 foals, including three daughters of leading sire Dubawi (Ire), will parade through the ring today during Friday's star session, which begins at 9.30 a.m.

Tattersalls December Foal Sale--Day Four

1115, f, Sea The Stars (Ire)--Palitana, by Giant's Causeway Consigned by Hascombe & Valiant Stud Palitana had her first foal, a Sepoy (Aus) colt, go through the ring at Tattersalls October this year and fetch 300,000gns from John and Jake Warren, and it is easy to see why the pedigree is so sought after. Palitana is a full-sister to G1 2000 Guineas winner Footstepsinthesand (GB) and a half-sister to G1 Keeneland Phoenix S. victor Pedro The Great (Henrythenavigator), as well as stakes winner Belle d'Or (Medaglia d'Oro) and Frappe (Ire), the dam of G1 Irish 2000 Guineas winner Power (GB) (Oasis Dream {GB}) and G2 Ribblesdale S. winners Thakafaat (Ire) and Curvy (GB), the latter of which also won this year's GI E.P. Taylor S.

<u>1150</u>, f, High Chaparral (Ire)--Ghurra, by War Chant Consigned by Castlefarm Stud

This youngster's half-brother by Invincible Spirit (Ire) made 100,000gns in this ring two years ago before being pinhooked for 170,000gns at Tattersalls October. Now named Shalaa (Ire), he stamped himself as one of the best of his generation this year when winning the G1 Juddmonte Middle Park S. and G1 Darley Prix Morny in addition to the G2 July S. and G2 Richmond S. This February-born bay is from the last crop of High Chaparral.

1152, c, Shamardal--Daneleta (Ire), by Danehill Consigned by Airlie Stud

Daneleta has proven capable of siring top-level winners, being the dam of the 2008 G1 Dewhurst S. winner Intense Focus (Giant's Causeway), and this colt is by Giant's Causeway's very useful sire-son Shamardal. Daneleta's last two progeny to see the sales ring made €210,000 and €300,000, respectively, at Goffs Orby in 2013 and this year.

1159, c, Invincible Spirit (Ire)--Silk Trail (GB), by Dubai Destination

Consigned by Norelands Stud

This bay is the third foal out of Silk Trail, a daughter of G3 Jersey S. winner Satin Flower (Shadeed) and therefore a halfsister to G1 Middle Park S. winner Lujain (Seeking The Gold). Silk Trail is also a half to Listed Oh So Sharp S. winner Lilium (GB) (Nashwan).

<u>1162</u>, **f**, **Dubawi (Ire)--Hit The Sky (Ire)**, **by Cozzene** Consigned by Knocktoran Stud

Unraced herself, Hit The Sky has become a proven source of stakes success, already the dam of G2 Prix Daniel Wildenstein victor Royal Bench (Ire) (Whipper); G3 Prix Allez France winner Mayhem (Ire) (Whipper); and G3 Ormonde S. scorer Memphis Tennessee (Ire) (Hurricane Run {Ire}). This filly's second dam is the G1 Prix Saint-Alary victress Cerulean Sky (Ire) (Darshaan {GB}), and the G1 Irish Oaks winner and good producer Moonstone (GB) appears further down the page. A full-sister to this youngster made €1.5 million at Arqana August two years ago.

<u>1172</u>, f, Dubawi (Ire)--La Collina (Ire), by Strategic Prince (GB) Consigned by Kenilworth House Stud

Two fillies in short succession by the highly sought after Dubawi are likely to create fireworks, and this filly has the page to back up her sirepower, being the first foal from the G1 Keeneland Phoenix S. and G1 Coolmore Fusaichi Pegasus Matron S. winner La Collina, who is in foal to Shamardal for next year.

1176, f, Shamardal--Fafinta (Ire), by Indian Ridge (GB)

Consigned by The Irish National Stud Fafinta's last two foals to see a sales ring both fetched sixfigure prices--a Raven's Pass filly at Goffs November for €160,000 in 2012 and a Teofilo filly for €130,000 at the same sale the following year. Fafinta, a half-sister to champion Falbrav (Ire) (Fairy King), is already the dam of three stakes horses, including listed winners Pretend (Ire) (Invincible Spirit {Ire}) and Fiulin (GB) (Galileo {Ire}).

Group 1 producer Brigid may be 24 years old, but her age hasn't stopped her progeny from being highly sought after in sales rings. Her last foal to see the ring was a Galileo filly that fetched 600,000gns at Tattersalls October in 2013, which came two years after her full-sister made 1.7 million guineas. Brigid is the dam of Group 1 winners Sequoyah (Ire) (Sadler's Wells)--the dam of Classic winner Henrythenavigator and Classic-placed Queen Cleopatra (Ire)--and Listen (Ire), the dam of Touching Speech (Jpn), Group 1-placed since the catalogue. She is also the second dam of Absolutelyfabulous (Ire), the dam of Classic and Breeders' Cup winner Magician (Ire) and this year's stakes winner and Grade I-placed Outstanding (Ire).

Doubtless Red Cadeaux felt much the same way about his trainer. After all, Dunlop had already supervised one stellar international career with Ouija Board (GB) (Cape Cross {Ire}). The hardiness that sustained Red Cadeaux, until he finally pushed himself beyond the limit in his fifth crack at the G1 Melbourne Cup, had been matched by the delicacy of his handling by Dunlop and his staff. It is achievement enough simply to get a horse to the gate 33 times in stakes company, never mind having to deal with issues of shipping and acclimatization in two-thirds of them.

As he comes to terms with the loss of his globetrotting 9-year-old, euthanized in Australia last week, Dunlop could do

worse than recall how Red Cadeaux was once just one among another nameless crop of yearlings entering his Newmarket stable. As a foal, in fact, he was led out unsold at 40,000gns at the equivalent sale to the one in progress at

Tattersalls; he then changed hands in the same ring the following autumn for 54,000gns. With that in mind, it seems fitting that all three of the young horses nominated by Dunlop for this short series, designed to keep *TDN* readers ahead of the curve in 2016, should all be owned--just like Red Cadeaux--by Ron Arculli. **Cont. p6**

Dunlop cont.

Asked to pick out a horse in his care that should be pardoned reverses in 2015, Dunlop suggested the 3-year-old **Dark Red** (Ire) (Dark Angel {Ire}). "He ran six times in the first half of the season, and was beaten six times," he said. "In the end I was getting rather annoyed, because he definitely has ability. He showed that when beaten a head at Beverley, finishing fast after getting stuck on the inside. Eventually we decided to have him gelded, turned him out and I'd be optimistic that next year he can come back and prove himself a well handicapped horse."

Browsing through those prospects that have just begun to show their hand, meanwhile, Dunlop is quick to offer encouragement for Red Cadeaux's half-brother. A 220,000gns foal purchase this time two years ago, **Amazing Red (GB)** (Teofilo {Ire}) seems to have shown rather more precocity than his illustrious sibling. "Unfortunately he had one or two little niggles, so we put him away," Dunlop said. "But he had worked very nicely before that."

One who is already up and running, however, is **Red Verdon** (Lemon Drop Kid). Though sent off at 50-1, he was only beaten a nose on his debut at Wolverhampton last weekend. "He came from the breeze-up sales here and spent three months turned out afterwards," Dunlop said. "But Joe Fanning, who rode him on Saturday, said that he liked him and that he could be a nice horse."

Even before the perennial need for fresh blood was so poignantly reiterated by the loss of his flagbearer, Dunlop had supported several young sires at the yearling sales this autumn.

"As usual some of the first-season stallions seemed to be more buyable," he said. "Sadly I couldn't get my hands on a Nathaniel, whose stock I thought looked really nice, but I have yearlings by Sir Prancealot, Mayson and Born To Sea. We were at sales all around the world, and nice horses were hard to buy everywhere: Doncaster was strong, all the boutique sales were strong, and I felt the 25-grand bonus at Tattersalls made a real difference. But we found some nice ones, I hope. Of course, we always love them all in November, so we'll just have to wait and see."

As a footnote, *TDN* is also asking trainers to nominate a horse from another stable--other than Air Force Blue (War Front)--to have shown enviable credentials for the 2016 Classics. "It's probably no more original than Air Force Blue," Dunlop apologized. "But two fillies from the same yard looked a cut above the rest in winning their Group 1s this autumn: **Minding (Ire)** (Galileo {Ire}) here at Newmarket, and **Ballydoyle (Ire)** (Galileo {Ire}) in France."

HOPPERTUNITY SHOOTS FOR RARE REPEAT

When American Pharoah (Pioneerof the Nile) won this year's Triple Crown, he was snapping a streak of 37 years of futility. A similar stretch of time has passed since Bob's Dusty (1977-1978) won back-to-back runnings of the GI Clark H., the centerpiece of the fall meeting at Churchill Downs, but **Hoppertunity** (Any Given Saturday) has a chance to make some history Friday afternoon.

Runner-up to subsequent dual Classic winner California Chrome (Lucky Pulpit) in last year's GI Santa Anita Derby, the bay colt missed the summer season, but made up for lost time in this event, racing handy to the pace and then holding off **Protonico** (Giant's Causeway) for a half-length victory. The \$300,000 Keeneland September graduate kicked off the new year with a popular success in the GII San Pasqual S. at Santa Anita, and though winless in his seven most trips to the post, seems to be rounding back into his best form. A distant runnerup to Smooth Roller (Hard Spun) in the GI Awesome Again S. at Santa Anita Sept. 26, Hoppertunity settled well off the pace in Keeneland's GII Fayette S. Oct. 30 and rallied nicely to complete the exacta, 3/4 of a length behind **Race Day** (Tapit).

The Todd Pletcher-trained duo of Protonico and Race Day have traversed similar paths this season. The former caught fire in the spring, popping a big-figure victory in the GIII Ben Ali S. at Keeneland ahead of a narrow defeat of next-out GI Stephen Foster H. hero Noble Bird (Birdstone) in this track's GII Alysheba S. May 1. He has since gone off form and exits a non-threatening fifth in the Fayette. Race Day earned this field's biggest Beyer in wiring the GII Oaklawn H. in April, but he was beaten over 30 lengths in his next two races combined prior to his defeat of Hoppertunity at Keeneland. **Cont. p3**

The form of the GI Breeders' Cup Classic is represented by runner-up Effinex (Mineshaft) and Keen Ice (Curlin), a wellbeaten fourth. Effinex defeated Tonalist (Tapit) by a head in the GII Suburban H. July 4, but was subsequently fourth in the GI Woodward S. Sept. 5 and third to Tonalist in the GI Jockey Club Gold Cup over a sloppy Belmont main track. When Beholder (Henny Hughes) and Smooth Roller came out of the Classic, Effinex was given a positive ride by Mike Smith and the tactics paid off, as the New York-bred finished second at 33-1. Trainer Jimmy Jerkens is not thrilled with the prospect of inclement weather.

"I'm not happy about that, even though he's got some decent races in the mud," Jerkens said. "If I was a horse I wouldn't want that mud coming back in my face. With quality horses in front of you throwing mud in your face, you never want that. He'll give us his all, but those aren't ideal conditions for us."

Keen Ice, second to the Horse of the Year-elect in the GI William Hill Haskell Invitational S. Aug. 2, managed to turn the tables in the GI Travers S. 27 days later. The bay faced a hopeless task in the Classic when last seen, and though he passed a couple of rivals late, was beaten better than a dozen lengths. Click for the TJCIS PPs.



Ahh Chocolate opened her account with a pair of victories before finishing third after an extremely wide journey in Pimlico's GII Black-Eyed Susan S. in May. Off the board in both the GII Indiana Oaks July 18 and grassy GIII Pucker Up S. at Arlington in August, she got a confidence-building victory in a local one-mile optional claimer Sept. 19. Eighth in Keeneland's GII Raven Run S. Oct. 17, she was looking to build on a secondplace finish in the GII Chilukki S. going a furlong shorter here Nov. 7.

Chasing the pace in second while wanting to do more, the Stoneway homebred took over as they turned for home and kept finding to maintain her advantage down to the line.

"She ran big," said winning rider Brian Hernandez, Jr. "We got a great spot around the backside and from there we were on the best horse. She had a couple of tough races going two turns. She wasn't the quickest filly going away from there and, like in the Black-Eyed Susan, we stuck down in behind horses and they went slow in front of us and instead of us being able to get in stride, we were stuck getting in a tug and war with her. Today, I was able to get outside and she turned off out there, but she got in a nice rhythm and finished it off for us. She always looked like she was going to get the two turns, but [trainer] Neil [Howard] did the right thing by going back to a one-turn mile last time. It sharpened her up for this race today."

Howard added, " She may have not won every time but she's always given us 100% and going off the premise of what Brian has been telling me all season long. We've always thought highly of her and are thinking that she's going to be a lot better with age... We'll target the Fair Grounds races in the winter, but we're going to give her a little bit of a break right now."

The winner's dam, who is a half to graded winners Rahystrada (Rahy) and Lone Star Sky (Conquistador Cielo), produced a Scat Daddy colt earlier this season and was bred back to Twirling Candy.

GISP Chide (Blame) broke down turning for home and was euthanized.

Dismissed at more than double the odds of the next-biggest longshot, hard-knocking Green Gratto ran away with this traditional Thanksgiving feature to earn a first career stakes victory. Second in the local GI Carter H. in April for David Smith,

the 5-year-old had last visited the winner's circle after a Belmont optional claiming score in June for Osvaldo Rojas. Transferred to co-owner Gaston Grant after a distant fourth behind Private Zone (Macho Uno) in the GIII Belmont Sprint Championship on July 4, he hadn't been

out of the superfecta in six subsequent tries. Fourth in the GIII Bold Ruler H. on Halloween, he was wheeling back on short rest off a nose second at the hooves of Fabulous Kid in a Nov. 18 track-and-trip optional claimer. Doling out splits of :22.29 and :44.71 without much resistance, the dark bay hit the top of the lane with a bit of a cushion and kept finding to hold off the cavalry charge.

"It's hard work and very emotional," said Grant, who was celebrating his first win of any kind as a trainer. "I had this horse since he was a yearling, bought him and he just kept trying. I knew all along he was the kind of horse to win a graded stakes race because he always showed it in the mornings. It was just a matter of putting it together in the afternoon. He's just one tough guy and there's no quit in him. I really can't say much about it other than to Thank God for this opportunity."

He continued, "I wasn't concerned with the week layoff because when he came back the next day it looked like he didn't lift a hoof. He was acting good and we put him on the track and he was training awesome. He came back from last time like he didn't even break a sweat, so we figured we'd give him a shot in here. We were trying to go to [Saturday's GI] Cigar Mile until we heard Private Zone was entered, but we knew at three-quarters this horse was really tough. We're going to give him a breather; he's been racing all year. He deserves it. He's the one that tells us where we're going with him."

Heart to Heart scored a pair of graded victories here last fall in the GIII Jefferson Cup S. in September and GIII Commonwealth S. in November, and finished off his sophomore season with a close-up fourth in Santa Anita's GII Mathis Brothers Mile Dec. 26. Second in Monmouth's GIII Red Bank S. in May, he was off the board when ridden tentatively in Belmont's GIII Poker S. June 13. The bay dominated on the front end in the Aug. 2 GIII Oceanport S. under Victor Espinoza, but hadn't been seen since fading to 10th behind stablemate Grand Arch (Arch) in the GI Shadwell Turf Mile Oct. 3. Back to his preferred spot on the engine this time, Heart to Heart proved not for catching.

"I knew that I was the only speed and he likes to run alone on the lead anyway so we broke well and got him to relax on the lead and he did," said Julien Leparoux, who rode Heart to Heart in both of last year's local wins. "I knew he'd run his race. I was just hoping he would keep his lead the whole way through and he did. He's the same horse he was last year. If you look at him he's very tiny, but he has a big heart. His name is perfect for him. As long as you don't fight with him and let him do his thing, he always runs his race."

Added trainer Bryan Lynch, "He's a tough little bugger when they leave him alone on the lead... The big question mark was could he get the mile-and-an-eighth and he did. We've been patient with him all year; he seems to like running fresh. He seems to like the track at Churchill, so we'll point to some of the races there in the summer. For the winter, we'll take him down to Palm Meadows and more or less target races like the [GI] Woodford Reserve [Turf Classic at Churchill in May]."


