

RECORD FOAL TURNOVER AT TATTERSALLS

Only twice in the history of Tattersalls have more foals been offered at the December Sale and this was reflected in a new record for Europe's leading weanling auction, at which 33,565,600gns changed hands for 803 foals.

Mutterings of over production have grown ever louder in Europe since the yearling sales season began and there were justifiable fears that the foal market would struggle with almost 400 more horses catalogued in Britain and Ireland than this time last year. What has become abundantly clear from the last two weeks of foal sales at Goffs and Tattersalls is that demand at the top end is still extraordinarily strong, while in the middle to lower tiers breeders are finding it harder to sell as pinhookers contemplate the level of yearling sale at which they are aiming next year.

For the sale as a whole, the median value--a key indicator-dropped by 20% to 20,000gns, though the average increased 1.4% to 41,800gns. Around a quarter of the foals offered were taken home by their breeders after the clearance rate fell by 5% to 73.74%, and the challenge of more foals being offered was addressed by Chairman Edmond Mahony in his end-of-sale statement.

"While there have been many positives to take from this week's sale, it would be wrong to overlook the impact of a significantly larger catalogue than last year," commented Mahony. cont. p2

PAC REJECTS COAL MINE PLAN FOR THIRD TIME


The Planning Assessment Commission recommended against the Drayton South open-cut mine proposal, located near Darley and Coolmore Studs in the Hunter Valley, for the third time *Racing and Sports* reported Friday. Originally, Anglo American wanted to construct the new mine less than a kilometer from the edge of the two stud farms. The Hunter Thoroughbred Breeders Association was pleased with the decision and were hopeful Rob Stokes, Minister of Planning, would formally refuse the Drayton South application.

"While we are relieved at today's [Friday's] decision we are saddened by the impact this will have on the affected mining families," HTBA president Cameron Collins told *Racing and Sports*. "Our community here in the Hunter Valley is a small and tight one. This issue has caused divisions that no one wanted." cont. p5

"The 800,000gns European top price for West Blagdon Stud's Dubawi filly out of High Heeled is the highest priced filly to sell at the Tattersalls December Foal Sale since 2002, and the fourth highest ever in Europe," added Mahony. "The Tattersalls December Foal Sale is primarily the domain of British and Irish pinhookers and they have worked tirelessly all week, joined, in increasing numbers, by international owners looking for quality foals to race. Buyers from America, China, Hong Kong, South Africa, Turkey and the United Arab Emirates have all purchased foals for 200,000gns or more and made a huge contribution to the 2015 December Foal Sale."

Saturday's final session brought another 3,653,900gns to the final tally, at an average price of 27,681gns (-14.53%) and median of 19,500gns (-7.14%) for 132 foals sold--a clearance rate of 71.74%.

One stallion whose offspring never fail to find viewers is Dark Angel (Ire) and his colt out of Welsh Angel (GB), by in-vogue broodmare sire Dubai Destination (lot <u>1407</u>), took his turn in the spotlight on the final day of trade, selling for a session-topping 170,000gns.

The March colt was bred by Kevin and Sue Mercer of the Welsh-based Usk Valley Stud and traces back to the family of the sale's overall second-top lot, the filly by Dubawi (Ire) out of Hit The Sky (Ire) (Cozzene), which made 720,000gns. His illustrious relatives include the Group 1 winners Moonstone (Ire) (Dalakhani {Ire}) and Cerulean Sky (Ire) (Darshaan {GB}).

The buyer was from the family which knows the sire better than any other--Robert O'Callaghan, whose father Gay stands Dark Angel at his Yeomanstown Stud.

"He's a big smashing colt, just like his daddy," said the younger O'Callaghan. "His sire has had another great year, with 14 stakes winners and 26 stakes performers. We are very lucky to have him. The colt was my choice and with a bit of luck he'll be back

here next October."

A first-crop son of Darley's champion juvenile and G1 2000 Guineas winner Dawn Approach (Ire) was next on the list at 150,000gns, sold to Timmy Hyde of Camas Park Stud.

The Bryanstown House Stud-consigned son of

Bernard Cooke's homebred dual winner Liscune (Ire) (King's Best) (lot 1338) is a half-brother to listed Buckhounds S. winner Ektihaam (Ire) (Invincible Spirit {Ire}), who raced for Sheikh Hamdan and was another decent sales return for his breeder when sold for 250,000gns at this sale six years ago.

"She has been a wonderful mare and has earned me over 2 million guineas through her foal sales," reported the delighted breeder. "She has visited Invincible Spirit a lot so I decided to mix it up a bit with the Dawn Approach covering. She is barren now, but will be going back to Invincible Spirit next spring."

A rare foray into the commercial sales market from the Aga Khan came through lot $\underline{1305}$, a filly by the late Azamour (Ire), who was offered by Simon Sweeting's Overbury Stud for Italian

breeders Riccardo Cantoni and Giovanni Benvenuto.

Cantoni confessed, "I am very keen on pedigrees but don't know so much about the physical horse side of things so we use Simon [Sweeting] for that."

He added, "I like to try to breed horses to race rather than to sell but unfortunately

I can't keep them all. I liked Azamour and sadly he died the day after covering this mare."

The value of Azamour fillies has no doubt been enhanced this year by the performance of dual Group 1 winner Covert Love (Ire) and this filly foal, out of the Italian listed winner She Is Great (Ire) (Dalakhani {Ire}), will now hopefully be seen in future in the red-and-green silks of the Aga Khan.

John Ferguson's dominant presence throughout Friday's session had already ensured him the leading purchaser title for the sale and he added a Raven's Pass colt to the final tally when going to 100,000gns for lot 1358. cont. p4

Continued Collins, "Today's decision also illustrates the importance of a diverse and resilient economy based on many strong industries providing long-term jobs and jobs choices for our community. This is the third PAC that has recognized the importance of Coolmore and Darley and the potential terminal decline of the Hunter Valley's entire premier Thoroughbred breeding industry if the studs were forced to relocate due to the impacts of one mine. While there are two more steps to this long process, the Minister for Planning could now accept the PAC recommendations and make a prompt decision. For the sake of all involved, we call on Minister Stokes to exercise his ministerial authority, accept the recommendation of this third PAC and formally refuse the Drayton South application."





A CLEMENT 1-2 IN THE CIGAR MILE

Up against it behind the lone speed of American Pharoah (Pioneerof the Nile) when fifth for the second straight year in the GI Breeders' Cup Classic Oct. 31, **Tonalist** (Tapit) did not look to be going especially well on the turn in Saturday's GI Cigar Mile H., but, guided to the middle of the track entering the stretch, the **'TDN Rising Star'** found another couple of gears late and outfinished stablemate **Red Vine** (Candy Ride {Arg}) to land the year's final Grade I on the East Coast. **Matrooh** (Distorted Humor) finished a close third.

"I got anxious a little bit when we passed the half-mile pole," explained winning jockey John Velazquez. "We were going so slow on the backstretch and I could see the horse on the lead keep trying to get back, throwing his head up, and Javier [Castellano, aboard Mshawish {Medaglia d'Oro}] seemed to be taking back. I was thinking that we were just walking with these horses here. I was close enough I didn't worry about it, but when we got to the turn, they started to move away from me. Now I wanted to do it little by little; I didn't want to shake him up too much and then not get him going, so I got him little by little, where he was comfortable. By the five-sixteenths pole, he started moving so I said, 'OK, now he's moving.' Another horse came to him by the quarter-pole, I don't know who that was, and he got into the bridle and started running. My job was trying to put him in the clear, run him in the clear. When I got him clear and hit him, he responded right away. The last sixteenth of a mile was really good, very exciting." Cigar Mile H. cont. p3

Accorded his Rising Star off a wide-trip maiden victory at second asking last January, Tonalist won the GII Peter Pan S. and followed up with a last-jump success in the GI Belmont S. Runner-up in the GII Jim Dandy S. and third in the GI Travers S., the bay overcame some trouble to overwhelm his rivals in the GI Jockey Club Gold Cup before his Breeders' Cup effort. Resuming at a mile for his first two starts of 2015, Tonalist earned a career-best 111 Beyer for a 3 3/4-length victory in the GIII Westchester S. before a no-disgrace runner-up effort behind fellow Rising Star Honor Code (A.P. Indy) in the GI Met Mile June 6. Given a suspect ride when second to recent GI Clark H. hero Effinex (Mineshaft) in the GII Suburban H. July 4, he was a fast-finishing third in Honor Code's GI Whitney H. Tally Aug. 8, then joined an elite group of horses to record multiple victories in the Gold Cup Oct. 3.

Tonalist was ridden forward given the apparent lack of speed in this year's Classic and the tactic backfired, as he tired to finish better than a dozen lengths behind American Pharoah.


It looked--on paper, at least--that Tonalist and the four other entrants in the Cigar had it all to do, with defending champion Private Zone (Macho Uno) owning a massive tactical advantage,

given his abundant early speed. The latter, who touched 4-5, but was off at 6-5, jumped best, but was immediately grabbed hold C7 of by his regular rider Martin Pedroza, and the same animal who clocked :22.18 for the opening guarter-mile in the 2014

running, was timed in :24.15 this time around, with horse and rider looking as if they were hitting potholes on the Belt Parkway. Red Vine, most recently runner-up in the GI Breeders' Cup Dirt Mile, pressed through up the fence to close the gap from second, with Matrooh widest out and Mshawish (Medaglia d'Oro) not far away from fourth. Tonalist, the 124-pound topweight, had only Full of Mine (Mineshaft) behind as they neared the end of the backstretch run. Cigar Mile cont. p4

Pedroza continued to nurse along Private Zone on the turn, attempting to save something for the stretch, and while the three runners immediately behind looked poised to pounce, the longer-winded Tonalist appeared more flat-footed as he was pulled out widest nearing the lane. Private Zone led grimly into


the final furlong and a half, but was confronted to his outside by Matrooh and Mshawish as Red Vine was strung up behind Private Zone. Mshawish seemed to be doing the best work, but Tonalist was finally finding his best

stride and closed powerfully to be up in the shadow of the post. Red Vine got through between Matrooh and Mshawish, but the lost momentum outside the eighth pole proved decisive. Tonalist was the 100th winner on the season for the Christophe Clement stable. Both the winner and runner-up are reportedly remaining in training in 2016.

"I'm always a little bit worried when I run him," Clement admitted. "The race was run in a funny way; they went so slow early on, which I didn't think was great for us. But that's what good horses do--they win and they overcome things. Great ride by Johnny [Velazquez]. I'm a very lucky man. They both ran very well. Joel [Rosario] came back and said he was very unlucky [on Red Vine]. The fun thing for me, as a trainer, was having the two best horses in the race. I'll have to talk with Mr. [Robert] Evans [about next year], but no matter what, they're both going to have a break."

Tonalist, who shares a second dam with the outstanding turf mare Riskaverse (Dynaformer), was bred by Rene and Lauren Woolcott's Woodslane Farm and that couple retains the mare's 3-year-old filly Settle N' Speight (Speightstown), who is a maiden winner in four starts this season for trainer Arnaud Delacour. The Woolcotts sold Settling Mist to owner Charles Fipke in a private transaction, and the mare's current 2-year-old Tale of Mist (Tale of Ekati) was third in a one-mile Aqueduct maiden Nov. 22. Settling Mist's yearling filly by Fipke's Jersey Town (Speightstown) was a \$500,000 purchase at this year's Fasig-Tipton Saratoga sale. Tha mare did not produce a foal in 2015 and was bred back to Tapit this season.



Go For Gin and Thunder Gulch parlayed victories in the Remsen S. in 1993 and 1994, respectively, into wins on the first Saturday in May the following spring, but no horse has completed the double since. Whether Mohaymen ultimately ascends to those sorts of heights will play out over the next six months, but to date, the \$2.2-million joint top-priced offering at the 2014 Keeneland September sale has not set a wrong foot forward and ran his record to a perfect three-from-three Saturday at the Big A.

The Shadwell runner debuted as the 9-5 favorite over six furlongs of the Belmont main track Sept. 19 and argued what proved to be fairly easy fractions, was overtaken by \$900,000

OBS April graduate Seymourdini (Bernardini) at the stretch call, but fought back determinedly for a half-length success. The colt took the next logical step in the GII Nashua S. over this track's oneturn mile, but, drawn to the outside in the field

of seven, was never able to gain any cover. Despite the ground loss, he kept on nicely to post a 1 3/4-length success from Flexibility, with Sail Ahoy (Bernardini) a late-on-the-scene third. Mohaymen was favored to annex this two-turn debut, but not overwhelmingly so, as impressive maiden winner Gift Box took his fair share of the pari-mutuel action and was bet in half from his morning line of 4-1.

Donegal Moon (Malibu Moon) took full advantage of his rail draw to head them off into the first turn, but it was not an easy lead, as Flexibility applied pressure from second while Mohaymen, in receipt of first-time Lasix, dropped into the box seat from third. Gift Box settled in the second flight of horses, as did Sail Ahoy, who wanted to overrace a bit nearer the tail. Donegal Moon took them into the final five-eighths of a mile after a half in a moderate :49.16, but Flexibility was the first to make a serious move and was more or less on even terms nearing the quarter pole. Mohaymen and Gift Box made their moves in tandem, but the former got the split between the weakening Donegal Moon and inside of Flexibility, while Gift Box was left no choice but to challenge four abreast. Flexibility led narrowly into the final furlong, but Mohaymen produced a solid turn of foot, and despite some wayward antics, proved best in the finish. Gift Box stayed on at one pace to be third.

"He's a very nice horse," offered trainer Kiaran McLaughlin, who sent out another gray son of Tapit--Frosted--to finish a close second in the Remsen 12 months back.

"Junior rode him great, he did everything right and it's a big win for the team. He did trickle [blood] a tiny bit last time, so we actually wait right up until they require Lasix to use it and today it worked out great."

Mohaymen is the second graded winner for his dam, who won the GII Bonnie Miss S. and GII Davona Dale S. in 2009 and would have been the chief competition for Rachel Alexandra (Medaglia d'Oro) in that year's GI Kentucky Oaks, but was scratched from the race. Entered, but ultimately withdrawn from the 2009 Fasig-Tipton November sale, she was sold privately to the late Eamon Cleary's Clearsky Farm. 2013 GI BC Juvenile winner New Year's Day was her first foal. pace and gave way only grudgingly to finish second, beaten a half-length by well-meant firster Wave of Glory (Midshipman). Sent off the 13-10 favorite for a sevenfurlong maiden up at Belmont Oct. 18, the bay was content to sit a stalking trip that day

from her wide draw, but never looked a loser that Sunday afternoon, as she bolted up by six lengths, defeating a couple next-out winners in the process.

Drawn two for this first voyage around two turns, Lewis Bay was able to clear this year's Tempted runner-up Flora Dora (First Dude) and had the rail entering the first turn before settling fourth on the back of the pacesetting Lost Raven through an opening quarter-mile in :24.57. Thrilled, Mo d'Amour (Uncle Mo) and Disco Rose stacked up to the pacesetter's outside, but Lewis Bay enjoyed the run of the race from within easy striking distance before being deftly maneuvered out around horses and into the five path for a clear shot leaving the three-eighths pole. Lost Raven was clinging to a slender advantage as the field turned for home, but Irad Ortiz Jr. had the chalk in gear and bearing down on them out in the middle of the track. She hit the front with a furlong to race and managed to grind out the victory from Thrilled, the GIII Miss Grillo S. runner-up who was trying the main track for the first time. Flora Dora, four wide the trip, managed to stay on gamely for third while covering 51 more feet (about six lengths) than Lewis Bay.

"Turning for home I sent her out and she really went fast," the winning jockey commented. "When she got the lead she was a little green; I think she was waiting for company. She went out a few paths because she changed leads a little early but I felt I had a lot of horse, so I felt comfortable taking her wide."

Summer Raven, who first sold for \$750,000 at Keeneland November in 2005, was purchased for \$1.7 million carrying a full sibling to Winslow Homer at that event in 2009. Summer Raven is the dam of a yearling colt by Distorted Humor, was blank the following year and was bred to Candy Ride (Arg) in 2015.

Miss Match was purchased for \$500,000 at Keeneland November in 2010 and was exported to Australia, where she has produced a 2-year-old Redoute's Choice (Aus) colt named Glitch (Aus) and a filly foal of this year by Redoute's Choice's successful sire son Snitzel (Aus). Miss Simpatia is represented by a yearling filly of this year by Warrior's Reward.

Some 15 years and three days ago, a gray colt called Monarchos (Maria's Mon) carried the gold-and-blue silks of John Oxley to a third-place effort in a maiden race on the penultimate day of the Churchill Downs fall meeting. Making his first start on the dirt in Saturday's GII Kentucky Jockey Club S., the owner's Airoforce closed out the graded stakes season in the Bluegrass with a perfect-trip success, amplifying the versatility he's displayed in four starts to date.

Despite a pedigree heavily titled towards the main track, the \$350,000 OBS April graduate had made each of his first three starts on the grass, winning his maiden at first asking over the

quirky six-furlong trip at Kentucky Downs Sept. 5 before overcoming the 13 hole to post a 2 1/2-length success in the GIII Bourbon S. over yielding Keeneland turf Oct. 4. That effort earned this particulare gray colt a quote of 27-10 favoritism

for the GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile Turf Oct. 30, and he sat a trip better than midfield and rallied stoutly, only to be touched off by the very impressive Hit It a Bomb (War Front).

Snagged back to mid-field by the in-form Julien Leparoux, Airoforce--blinkered for the first time--saved ground around the first turn and was allowed a two-path run up the backstretch as longshot Derby Express (Unbridled Express) set a strong pace from the rail-drawn Force It (More Than Ready). Airoforce worked his way into the first half of the field as they reached the second turn and Leparoux began threading his way from between horses while following the move of Gun Runner (Candy Ride (Arg)) leaving the three-eighths. Put to a stiff drive, Airoforce was steered to the outside, engaged Mor Spirit entering the final furlong and got the better of a final-furlong scrimmage to take it. Mo Tom made belated progress up the fence to snag third.

"He was always one of our better horses and we knew that he liked the dirt and it was just a matter of getting him on it when the time was right and tonight was the best time to do it," said Norman Casse, the chief assistant who manages his father Mark's Kentucky division. "I thought this was a tough race this year. I'm excited about the way he ran."

Airoforce was offered in utero at the 2012 Keeneland November sale, but his dam was led out unsold on a bid of \$35,000. Chocolate Pop is the dam of a yearling full-sister to Airoforce, produced a filly by First Samurai this season and was bred back to Sidney's Candy.

Forever Unbridled, a full sister to this term's GI Ballerina S. winner Unbridled Forever, earned her first graded stakes victory with a gritty score in Aqueduct's GIII Comely S. Sitting pretty in a two-wide third off early splits of :24.04 and :49.47, the bay was inched forward by Hall of Famer John Velazquez to take on favored Carrumba turning for home. Drawing even with that rival at the top of the stretch, the pair battled stride-for-stride to the wire with Forever Unbridled getting her nose in front just in the nick of the time.

"She has been a solid horse all year; ran second and third to I'm a Chatterbox a few times," said winning conditioner Dallas Stewart. "We gave her a break after the [GI Kentucky] Oaks and she'd been training great. She came up there ready to run. There are a lot of Grade I's next year and at Saratoga, and I think she's capable if we handle it right."

Forever Unbridled spent the winter chasing eventual



GI Cotillion S. heroine I'm a Chatterbox (Munnings) at the Fair Grounds, following her second-out graduation there Dec. 12 with a runner-up effort behind that rival in the Silverbulletday S. Jan. 17. Third to that versatile chestnut in both

Feb. 21 and the GII Fair Grounds Oaks Mar. 28, Forever Unbridled was a non-factor 11th in the GI Kentucky Oaks May 1 and was subsequently shelved. The bay returned with a fifth-place effort in the seven-furlong GII Raven Run S. at Keeneland last time Oct. 17, setting her up for a return to two turns here.

The winner's dam Lemons Forever, who was trained and owned by Stewart in partnership with Horton Stable, captured the 2006 GI Kentucky Oaks at odds of 47-1. Sold for \$2.5 million at the 2007 Keeneland November sale, the 12-year-old mare has since produced an unraced juvenile colt named Forever d'Oro (Medaglia d'Oro) and a weanling colt by Medaglia d'Oro. She was bred back to that sire. Forever Unbridled's year-older full sister and fellow Stewart trainee Unbridled Forever spent most of last year chasing champion Untapable (Tapit) and was successfully reinvented as a sprinter this year. She ran down last term's runaway GII Prioress S. winner Stonetastic (Mizzen Mast) to capture her seasonal bow in Saratoga's Shine Again S. and employed similar tactics under Velazquez to capture her first win at the highest level in the Ballerina there Aug. 29 before being forced to miss an intended start in the GI Breeders' Cup F/M Sprint due to a minor injury.

"TDN Rising Star" Dortmund continued his powerful comeback with an effortless romp in Del Mar's GIII Native Diver S. Saturday. Sitting pretty in a comfortable second as 29-1 shot Majestic City (City Zip) ticked off opening fractions of :23.75 and

:47.61, the heavy favorite continued to canter along into the backstretch run and readily responded when given the signal by Hall of Fame pilot Gary Stevens at the quarterpole. Taking control in one massive stride, the hulking chestnut showed the way into the stretch

and galloped home to win by daylight over Imperative in what was equivalent to a paid workout.

Originally scheduled to start in Churchill's GI Clark H. Friday, Dortmund missed his trip to Kentucky due to a quarter crack and was rerouted to this test instead after a patch was applied Saturday morning. He is currently being considered for Santa Anita's seven-furlong GI Malibu S. Dec. 26.

"He took me back in time today," said Stevens, who took over for regular rider Martin Garcia, who was riding for Baffert at Churchill this weekend. "I thought I was on Point Given again. I thought [Dortmund] was a one-paced horse, but I found out today that that's not so. He's got those gears. He kicked in at the five-sixteenths and really moved. He's got that high cruising speed, but he can accelerate, too. That's good. I know Bob is talking about shortening him up for the Malibu and he should be up for that. He's just got that big, long stride; that big engine. And he doesn't need the lead. He was just fine where he was today."

Opening his account with six straight victories including the GI Los Alamitos Futurity and GI Santa Anita Derby, Dortmund suffered his first defeat at the hooves of his stablemate American Pharoah (Pioneerof the Nile) after setting the pace in the GI Kentucky Derby May 2. Fourth behind the eventual Triple Crown winner in a sloppy renewal of the GI Preakness S. May 16, the sophomore was given some time off by his Hall of Fame conditioner and resurfaced with another easy score in Santa Anita's Big Bear S.

The homebred beat out the reopposing Ninety One Assault (Artie Schiller) by a nose last time over course and distance Nov. 8 with Smith in the irons.


