# FILLY MAKES IMPACT ON JAPAN CUP

The legendary Japanese Horse of the Year Deep Impact (Jpn) (Sunday Silence) has been eligible to be represented by runners in the G1 Japan Cup since his first crop turned three in 2011. It didn't take long for him to make his mark on the race in which he closed his career victoriously in 2006, as his second-crop daughter Gentildonna (Jpn) (ex Donna Blini {GB}) won the first of her two Japan Cups in 2012 before following up in 2013. Though Epiphaneia (Jpn) (Symboli Kris S) halted the streak last year--with Deep Impact's Spielberg (Jpn) third and Gentildonna fourth as the favorite--**Shonan Pandora (Jpn)** became her sire's third Japan Cup winner in the space of four years and the fifth female in the last seven to capture the fall feature at Fuchu Racecourse. **Last Impact (Jpn)** made it a one-two sweep for the stallion, just out-finishing race favorite **Lovely Day (Jpn)** (King Kamehameha {Jpn}) for second.

Winner of last year's G1 Shuka Sho, Shonan Pandora was eighth behind the subsequent G1 Sprinters' S. winner and G1 Longines Hong Kong Sprint-bound Straight Girl (Jpn) (Fuji Kiseki {Jpn}) in the G1 Victoria Mile in May, then filled the third spot underneath Lovely Day in the G1 Takarazuka Kinen going 11 furlongs June 28. She returned from a freshening to land the G2 Sankei Sho All Comers S. Sept. 27 and was exiting a solid fourth behind the in-form Lovely Day when backing up to 2000 meters in the G1 Tenno Sho (Autumn) over this course Nov. 1. **Cont. p7**

#### **THE FOAL MARKET**

This is a new wrinkle in our market analysis this year. We know that the yearling sales are a better barometer of the overall auction marketplace than the mixed sales, because the pedigrees of over nearly 10,000 yearlings sold (see the Weekly Sales Ticker from Nov. 15--click here) are more

stable, whereas the composition of mares, especially top mares, offered in the mixed sales can vary quite a bit from year to year. This year we have isolated the foals out of the mixed sale market, because 2,500 foals can also provide reliable market indicators. **Cont. p4**

# **HIP HAPPENINGS**



#### Tattersalls December Mare Sale--Monday

#### Lot 1603, New Orchid (m, 12, Quest For Fame--Musicante {Ire}, by Nijinsky)

#### Consigned by Juddmonte Farms

The winning GSP New Orchid is not only a half-sister to a Group 1 winner in Distant Music (Distant View), but also has the distinction of having produced a Group 1 winner in the form of 2008 G1 Sprint Cup winner African Rose (GB) (Observatory), who was also her first foal. New Orchid is also responsible for the stakes winner Helleborine (GB) along with one other winner. She foaled a colt by Intello (Ger) (Galileo {Ire}) in 2015 and will be sold carrying to Juddmonte stallion Bated Breath (GB) (Dansili), whose first runners will hit the racecourse in 2016.

#### Lot 1611, Arum Lily (m, 14, Woodman--Jolypha, by Lyphard) Consigned by Juddmonte

A dual winner in France, Arum Lily is out of Group 1 winner Jolypha, who is a full-sister to the champion Dancing Brave. Arum Lily has herself bred three winners, including the top level victor Redwood (GB) (High Chaparral {Ire}). The Charlie Hillstrained globetrotter won the GI Northern Dancer S. at Woodbine and also finished runner-up in both the G1 Hong Kong Vase and G1 Dubai Sheema Classic. She is offered in foal to Nathaniel (Ire), whose yearlings sold in Great Britain and Ireland this year averaged 117,040gns.

#### Lot 1693, Irish Question (m, 13, Giants's Causeway--Key To Coolcullen {Ire}, by Royal Academy) Consigned by Redmonstown Stud

Jim Bolger has never been afraid to bring his better broodmares to the marketplace and he has been rewarded in recent years with the likes of Banimpire (Ire) (Holy Roman Emperor {Ire}), who sold for €2.3 million of in 2011. Irish Question is the dam of the Bolger-trained juvenile Group 1 winner Loch Garman (Ire) (Teofilo) and comes from the family of other Bolger-trained stakes winners Rehn's Nest (Ire) (Authorized {Ire}) and Eva Luna (Ire) (Double Schwartz {Ire}). Completing the Bolger link, the mare is sold in foal to his former G1 Derby winner New Approach (Ire) (Galileo {Ire}). **Cont. p3**

#### Lot 1694, Night Visit, (m, 11, Sinndar {Ire}--Moonlight Sail, by Irish River {Fr})

#### Consigned by Redmonstown Stud

This is another from the Bolger draft and another proven Group 1 producer. Not often does the opportunity arise to purchase the dam of a Derby winner, but Night Visit offers this rare chance. Her ill-fated son Trading Leather (Ire) (Teofilo {Ire}) captured the G1 Irish Derby in 2013 and was a top class middle distance performer until his untimely demise in last year's G1 Japan Cup. Offered with a Dawn Approach cover will only add to her appeal given the favorable impression the stallion's first foals made in the last few weeks.

#### Lot 1724, Lady Heidi, (m, 4, High Chaparral {Ire}--Water Feature {GB}, by Dansili {GB})

#### Consigned by Kellsgrange Stud

A young mare offered in foal to world champion and highly regarded stallion Sea The Stars (Ire) will always command a premium. Add in the fact that Lady Heidi is herself a stakeswinning 2-year-old and from a family littered with top level performers such as Tenby (GB) (Caerleon) and Bristol Channel (GB) (Generous {Ire}) and one can easily see the appeal. Lady Heidi's as of yet unnamed 2-year-old half-brother by Intikhab (Red Ransom) sold for €85,000 to De Burgh Equine at Arqana's Breeze-Up sale in May.


#### **Oppenheim cont. from p1**

As this week's Sales Ticker shows, with Argana still to come, the foal market this year totals about \$150 million so far, or about 15% of the total as were sold at the yearling sales. From the addition of days at the front of the foal sales at both Goffs and Tattersalls, it's quite plausible to argue that the growth in numbers catalogued in the foal market (24% since 2013) are in the bottom tiers rather than at the top tier of the foal market. So the massive 16% drop in the clearance rate in two years at the Kentucky November (TDN 11-15-15), and the overall 9% drop in the three markets combined, is likely to be concentrated far more at the bottom of the market than at the top. Nonetheless, when we look at the numbers for the three markets combined, only 7% more foals (2492) were sold in 2015 than in 2013, while the number catalogued went up by 24%, the combined gross went up by 18%, and the combined average by 10%.


Just a short update on the European F2015 sires with first foals selling. Coolmore's Declaration of War, now resident at Ashford in Kentucky, is still the overall leader, with 12 averaging \$156,069; he has two foals catalogued next week at Arqana. Darley Kildangan's Dawn Approach has had 17 average \$116,000 (three at Arqana). **Cont. p4** 

# Weekly Sales Ticker by Bill Oppenheim

"Tattersalls' Foal Sale edged ahead of last year's figures, though with a 7% drop in the clearance rate. When you look at the three main foal markets combined (Kentucky [Fasig & Keeneland], Goffs, Tatts, with Arqana to come), Kentucky sold 880 foals, Ireland 809, Tatts 803, for a combined total of \$150-million (this year's yearling market was \$1-billion), and an average of \$60,000 (\$60,263 to be exact). Compared to 2013, the number catalogued is up 24%, number sold up 7%, clearance rate down 9%". — Bill Oppenheim

Coolmore's Camelot had 16 average \$114,364 (none at Arqana); Intello, who stood his first two seasons at Cheveley Park in England but is now at the Haras Du Quesnay, had a couple of six-figure sales on Friday to take his average, for eight sold, to \$100,589 (none at Arqana); and Gestut Fahrhof's Maxios, who continues to be the commercial surprise package among this European top five considering his €10,000 stud fee, has had eight foals average \$89,442. He has four more catalogued at Deauville.

Today of course kicks off the 'Mares Etc' Sale, but the real fireworks will be tomorrow, when five mares in foal to Dubawi

are scheduled to go through the ring. Three of these mares are rising 11 years old: <u>hip 1977</u>, Icon Project, a Grade I winner with a spectacular page, whose first foal to live is just a 2-year-old this year; <u>hip 1986</u>, Time Control, once a 1.2-million guineas yearling by Sadler's Wells and now the dam of


Cursory Glance, the best 2-year-old filly in Europe at seven furlongs plus in 2014; and <u>hip 2015</u>, Ever Rigg, carrying a full

brother or sister to this year's G1 'King George' winner Postponed. The two younger mares are: <u>hip 2011</u>, Hanky Panky, a stakes-placed half-sister, by Galileo, to Giant's Causeway and You'resothrilling (and therefore a 3/4-sister to Gleneagles, etc.); and <u>hip 2025</u>, Ambivalent, winner of the G1 Pretty Polly S. at the Curragh in 2013. Also scheduled for Tuesday: Group 1 winners Ribbons, Odeliz, and Tiggy Wiggy (the best 2-year-old filly in Europe in 2014 at six furlongs), and this year's G1 Epsom Oaks winner, Qualify. One interesting prospect later Monday night is the dual Group 1-winning South African mare In The Fast Lane, by the top South African sire, Jet Master.

#### **NORTH AMERICAN 2YO SIRES**

Sire lists are always informative, and this year's list of North American Sires of 2-Year-Olds (<u>click here</u>) seems especially so. It's always a good idea to be wary of freshman sires: only 40% of a foal crop starts as 2-year-olds, and time and time again we are misled by those impressive early returns by freshman sires, only to find out when they encounter the 100% of the crop which run as 3-year-olds that the bar has been raised, and sometimes jumping the junior bar doesn't mean they're going to clear it at senior level. So I and everybody else have been wrong before and expect to be wrong again--but maybe not in this case.

Ashford's **Uncle Mo** (Indian Charlie) is not only Leading Freshman Sire in North America, he has even surpassed barnmate **Scat Daddy** (Johannesburg) to hold a half-million

dollar lead as Leading North American Sire of 2-Year-Olds. From 64 starters through Saturday's racing, he has 24 winners, seven black-type winners, and 11 black-type horses, and the earners of over \$3.5-million. These include three graded stakes winners (six graded stakes horses), two of which are Grade I winners, including undefeated GI Breeders'

Cup Juvenile winner Nyquist, a certainty to be named champion 2-year-old male. And what makes us think this isn't another flash-in-the-pan freshman sire? It's somewhat instinct, I must admit; all those years of trying to read the runes. Indian Charlie, Uncle Mo's sire, ended up being a really good sire of 2-year-old dirt class at seven furlongs plus. Uncle Mo was the best he sired, and even though it does all read "2-year-olds" I have a feeling there could be a breakthrough horse here to introduce a third 'dirt' line (along with A.P. Indy and Fappiano) to North American racing.

Scat Daddy really has had a breakthrough year: he's had 77 juvenile runners and 30 winners, eight 2-year-old black-type winners, of which six are graded, and now has just at \$3 million in juvenile earnings. If it weren't for Uncle Mo, he'd be a runaway winner himself. Darley's **Bernardini** (A.P. Indy) has also had a big year with his 2-year-olds, and ranks third on the North American Juvenile Sire List; Saturday's GII Demoiselle winner, Lewis Bay, is his third graded stakes winning 2-year-old this year. The other two are New York Grade I winners Rachel's Valentina and Greenpointcrusader. Gainesway's **Tapit** (Pulpit), on his way to his second consecutive North American Sire Championship, ranks fourth on the 2-year-old sire list, including Saturday's unbeaten GII Remsen winner Mohaymen. Darley's **Medaglia d'Oro** (El Prado), a respectful second to Tapit on the General Sire List, is also one place behind him on the Juvenile Sire List, but does have arguably the continent's best 2-year-old of either sex in GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies winner Songbird.

Claiborne's **War Front** (Danzig) ranks sixth by juvenile sire earnings, and has two Group 1 winners for Coolmore: Europe's best 2-year-old Air Force Blue and GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile Turf winner Hit It A Bomb. That is one hot list of juvenile sires. Tapit, meanwhile, has a \$5 million lead over Medaglia d'Oro on the North American General Sire List (<u>click here</u>), and also leads the list in number of 2015 winners, as well as in all black-type categories.

#### **STABLE MUSINGS WITH WILLIAM HAGGAS**

The headline achievements of any season tend to be credited to specific horses in specific races. But trainers know better than

to measure the daily challenges of their vocation solely by champions as exceptional as Golden Horn (GB) (Cape Cross {Ire}) or American Pharoah (Pioneerof The Nile), and will duly recognize as one of the defining moments of 2015 a remarkable spree at York in August for Newmarket's proudest Yorkshire exile.

William Haggas saddled four group winners at the Ebor meeting, as well as Tasleet (GB) (Showcasing {GB}) in the

valuable DBS Premier Yearling S. The prizemoney won that week helped to consolidate the status of Somerville Lodge, for the second season running, as one of the five most productive stables in Britain. Yet Haggas had been convinced, back in the spring, that 2015 was going to prove a disaster.

It was not until the third week of May that Haggas sent out his 10th winner of the campaign, as measured from the start of the all-weather season the previous November. "We've had five already this time round, which shows how bad it was," he said. "They just weren't right. I don't know how I didn't go bonkers.

> We had ringworm, that kind of thing, but with the numbers we have now you would hope to able to cope better. As it was, we had two runners at the Craven meeting and three at the Guineas meeting, where you'd normally be hoping to have something for every race."

> By midsummer, thankfully, Haggas was back on a roll. In July, he had 24 winners at a strike rate of nearly one-in-three. "But the Ebor meeting was a case of everything just happening

to fall right," he said. "We felt from a long way out that we had the right horses for their races. In another year, for instance, a horse like Tasleet might have gone for the Gimcrack, but we already had Ajaya (GB) (Invincible Spirit {Ire}) for that. Things might not fall into place in quite the same way again, but at least it made us look like we knew what we were doing!" **Cont. p7**

#### Haggas cont.

As the latest trainer to take stock of his prospects for 2016, for this short *TDN* series, Haggas pronounces himself well satisfied with his autumn restock. Numbers are slightly up for two of his mainstays, Sheikh Hamdan and Cheveley Park Stud, while he is also grateful for the fidelity of regulars such as Lael Stable. But he sounds a note of caution, in reflecting on the overall state of the yearling market.

"I've felt for the last five years that the yearling sales have been absolutely crazy at the top end," he said. "For me, the Horses-in-Training Sale was a proper reality check. Decent horses were making five figures, rather than six, and I found myself thinking: 'Woah, these yearling sales are mad. The numbers don't make any sense.' But the fact remains that at the top end there are plenty of people around who want to buy the best, and can afford to do so. Hence the fees of the big horses at stud. They look higher than they should be, but they're still full, still popular, in some cases private."

Knowing his reputation for the astute placing of horses, *TDN* readers will doubtless take particular note of those Haggas nominates for the twin categories in this series; one whose fulfilment has been delayed, and one who is only just starting out.

"A handicapper I like, who I think should do very well in 2016, is **Afjaan (Ire)** (Henrythenavigator)," he said. "He fractured a pelvis in spring last year, so he only came to the party late. But he bolted up on the all-weather a couple of weeks ago, and I'm going to put him away now. Though he's already rated 89, after just four starts, I think he could be a strong horse at seven furlongs to a mile."

In much the same way, **Light Music (GB)** (Elusive Quality) may have more to offer than is obvious even though she, too, has made a very solid start to her career - registering a Listed success for the Queen on the last of her three juvenile starts, at Newbury in October. "I like her very much," Haggas said. "Every time she ran it was soft and I'm absolutely certain that's not her best ground. She looked flat out at the end, at Newbury, but the jockey agreed that he went too early on her. She's a big filly, and I think she's got exciting potential."

Three of his group winners at the Ebor meeting were juveniles, which augurs well for the strength of his 3-year-olds in 2016. But *TDN* has asked trainers in this series also to pick out a horse from another stable, with the exception of Air Force Blue (War Front), for next year's Classics. "I was impressed by a filly of Ralph Beckett's called **Andastra (Ger)** (Kamsin {Ger})," Haggas said. "She has only had one start, in a Nottingham maiden, but won really well and could prove a smart one over middle distances."

Drawn out in gate 15 and sent off the fourth betting favorite behind Lovely Day, Shonan Pandora managed to secure a midfield berth as Curren Mirotic (Jpn) (Heart's Cry {Jpn}) stole away to lead by six or seven lengths as they climbed to the top of the course on the backstretch. She had Lovely Day to track

from about sixth position, while Last Impact settled in the latter third and fan favorite Gold Ship (Jpn) (Stay Gold {Jpn}) was content to lay in the final four. Curren Mirotic still led clear on the turn, but the field was starting to bunch up behind and Shonan Pandora was winding up in tandem with Gold Ship. But while the latter could not sustain his run, his female foe did, as she was switched off the heels of Lovely Day, grabbed that one inside the final 50 meters and found

the wire narrowly best. The latter got first run as they hit the straight and looked on his way to victory, but was simply outkicked by the eventual winner and Last Impact. The mount of Ryan Moore, but touching 23-1 on the tote off a 12th in the Tenno Sho, Last Impact saved all the ground, got through at the fence in the lane and flew home to just miss.

"To sum it up, I am in seventh heaven," winning trainer Tomokazu Takano commented. "She made the turns nicely and looked good in the backstretch and I was relieved. To tell the truth, I wasn't really looking at any other horses, but I did notice Lovely Day make his move and I knew it would be close."

Of the four overseas raiders, the Niarchos family's Erupt (Ire) (Dubawi {Ire}) was easily best, finishing a close sixth after getting shuffled back at a crucial stage. Nightflower (Ire) (Dylan Thomas {Ire}) finished 11th, G1 Melbourne Cup fourth Trip to Paris (Ire) (Champs Elysees {GB}) 14th and G1 Grosser Preis von Bayern hero Ito (Ger) (Adlerflug {Ger}) last of all after being fractious at the gates. Erupt, Trip to Paris and Ito all hold entries for the G1 Longines Hong Kong Vase in two weeks' time, but South China *Morning Post* reports in its Monday edition that none of the trio is likely to press on to Sha Tin.

The winner's dam is a close relative of Stay Gold (Jpn), the sire of Gold Ship, who made a name for himself on the international stage with victories in the G1 Hong Kong Vase and the Dubai Sheema Classic, then a Group 2 event. Cutie Gold is represented by the 2-year-old colt Spear the Gold (Jpn) (Neo Universe {Jpn}), produced a filly by G1 Dubai World Cup hero Victoire Pisa (Jpn) in 2014 and a colt by Daiwa Major (Jpn) earlier this year.

#### **ALAMOSA STOCK ON THE RISE**

There are promising young stallions aplenty in Australia, but it can be harder for New Zealand studmasters to attract the next generation of star sires. The shoes of horses such as Zabeel (NZ) (Sir Tristram), O'Reilly (NZ) (Last Tycoon (Ire)) and Volksraad

(GB) (Green Desert (USA)) take some filling-as, indeed, do those of the one-time shuttler Montjeu (Ire) (Sadler's Wells) who was a massive boon to the NZ breeding scene during his time at Windsor Park Stud. Happily, though, there are some good young sires working their way up through the ranks. These include both Tavistock (NZ) and Alamosa (NZ), sons of Montjeu and O'Reilly respectively who have both had some good recent results.

Alamosa enjoyed a red-letter day on Saturday

when siring the winners of both stakes races at Ellerslie, Alamer (NZ) and Stolen Dance (NZ). For Tavistock, November was ushered in at Flemington by the G1 Victoria Derby victory of his son Tarzino (NZ). Now the month is ending with the success of Tavago (NZ) in the Wellington Stakes at Otaki.

The shape of Alamosa's racing career spoke volumes for the balance of power in Australasian racing. Initially he did about as

much as even the most exacting examiner could require in New Zealand at both two and three. In his first season he won one of the country's two Group 1 juvenile races and finished third in the other. At three he was beaten a head in the G1 NZ 2,000 Guineas before landing Group 1 victories against older rivals both in handicap company (in the Thorndon Mile) and at

> weight-for-age (in the Otaki-Maori WFA). However, Alamosa's connections felt that their horse, particularly with his stud career in mind, needed to win a Group 1 race in Australia, preferably in either Melbourne or Sydney, to be established at the highest levels. Consequently he left Peter Mackay's Matamata stable in advance of his 4-year-old campaign in the 2008/'09 season, joining Mick Price's team in Melbourne. When he won the G1 Toorak H. at Caulfield in the spring,

therefore, it was a case of mission accomplished.

With the oldest of his offspring now aged five, Alamosa is well on his way to becoming part of New Zealand's bloodstock establishment. He made a very smart start in the 2012/'13 season when he was New Zealand's leading first-season sire by every reckoning; progeny earnings, individual winners and races won. **Cont. p10**

His first-crop daughter Kirramosa (NZ) then consolidated this excellent start the following spring when her trainer John Sargent sent her to Melbourne, a venture which saw her land the time-honoured quick-fire double of the G2 Wakeful S. and the G1 Victoria Oaks at the VRC Carnival at Flemington. The good start to Alamosa's stud career is a joy to those who admire the on-going influence of great mares because he, like Tavistock, descends from a true blue hen. Tavistock, as his name implies, is part of arguably the biggest British breeding success story of the modern era. Mrs Moss (GB) (Reform) was not an obviously top-level prospect when Lady Tavistock started to breed from her at Bloomsbury Stud at Woburn Abbey in Bedfordshire, but she turned out to be a gold-mine. Mrs Moss bred 11 winners including the 1986 Japan Cup winner Jupiter Island (GB) (St Paddy) as well as the stakes-winning juveniles Pushy (GB) (Sharpen Up), Precocious (GB) (Mummy's Pet) and Krayyan (Tower Walk). Several of her daughters became very good producers too. The Bloomsbury Stud NZ-bred Tavistock, a Group 1 winner in 2010 of the Waikato Sprint, is a grandson of her non-winning daughter Pedestal (GB) (High Line).

Alamosa too descends from a very special mare. His fifth dam Chicquita (Aus) (Blank) will never be forgotten as long as films remain of the Melbourne Cup field racing past Chicquita Lodge along the far side of Flemington racecourse; she was so good that her trainer Tony Lopes named the stable after her. Like Kirramosa, Chicquita won both the Wakeful S. and the VRC Oaks, but she won 14 other races too including the VATC Thousand Guineas, and she finished second in both the G1 Caulfield and G1 Melbourne Cups at four. She did equally well at stud, breeding 1964 Golden Slipper winner Eskimo Prince (Aus) (Todman) and 1962 Melbourne Cup runner-up Comicquita (Aus), to whose sire Comic Court (Aus) (Powerscourt) she had finished second in the Melbourne Cup. Starguita, the result of her mating with five-time champion sire Star Kingdom (Ire) in 1958, was thus the best-bred horse in Australia of her day, and she ranks as Alamosa's fourth dam.

Alamer, one of Alamosa's recent stakes winners, also descends from a champion. Her Irish Group 3-winning dam Clerio (GB) (Soviet Star) came to New Zealand after breeding several winners in Europe, and that was a kind of homecoming for her. Her granddam La Mer (NZ) (Copenhagen (GB)) still ranks as one of the greatest fillies ever to race in New Zealand before spending her stud career at Airlie Stud in Ireland, becoming ancestress of several top-liners including Nahrain (GB) (Selkirk (GB)). These recent results have been particularly good news for Te Runga Stud of Pukekohe, whose draft of yearlings at January's NZB Select Yearling Sale at Karaka will include a colt by Tavistock out of Clerio.



#### **STORMY' SHOCKS THE MATRIARCH**

**Stormy Lucy** (Stormy Atlantic), a 65-1 longshot, upset the GI Matriarch at Del Mar Sunday in thrilling fashion, giving her trainer Ed Moger, Jr., the first Grade I win of his career. The 6-year-old bay mare was away well from the stalls, as MGISW Hard Not To Like (Hard Spun) stumbled badly and was essentially out of contention from the start. Stormy Lucy rated one off the inside in midpack in the strung out field of 14 around the clubhouse turn and down the backside as Curlin's Fox (Curlin) rattled off snappy fractions of :22.69 and :46.70. Stormy Lucy improved her position heading into the final turn and angled out two paths on the bend. Swung out another lane at the top of the stretch to split foes, she shifted into gear to begin her rally. Stormy Lucky continued her charge to collar Recepta (Speightstown) in deep stretch and got her nose down in the shadow of the wire and pull off the improbable upset.

"She was doing great and she's such a good horse," said trainer Ed Moger, Jr. "When you've got a good horse you've always got a chance. We've been trying to get a Grade I win for her all year. It's the first Grade I for me and I've been waiting for it for a long time. I've been training for 40 years. We wanted to run her in the Breeders' Cup and then go to the [Fasig-Tipton] sale. But then she didn't get in and we really wanted to win a Grade I, so that's why we're here."

Rider Kent Desormeaux said, "She ran huge. The trainer told me she doesn't switch leads, but she did today--she sure did. Terrific race for her." **Cont. p3**



Melmich, who was claimed for just \$20,000 last September, registered the most impressive performance of his career Sunday in the GIII Valedictory S. at Woodbine. allowance here Nov. 5. The favorite rated in midpack down the backstretch for the first time and throughout the first lap. He began to take closer account the second time down the backstretch from off the rail, and poked a head in front on the final turn. Melmich was undoubtably the winner at the top of the lane and could not be caught down the stretch as he loped home the decisive victor.

"He's amazing," said winning pilot Eurico Rosa da Silva. "I worked this horse coming into the race, he was feeling great. He was very, very sharp. He was ready to run. He was galloping all the way. I could have gone way faster. I didn't want to push him too hard."

Melmich is the only winner from dam Little Swoon, who has a yearling colt by Ghostzapper, who was purchased by Bradley Thoroughbreds for \$80,000 at this year's Keeneland September sale, and a weanling filly by Super Saver. She was bred back to Take Charge Indy.



him and said he kept slipping, because he would go and stop. It was kind of a funny race, we'll just draw a line through it."

The conditioner also said that the lightly-raced Godlophin homebred **Marking** (Bernardini), who was scratched from Saturday's GI Cigar Mile at Aqueduct, will aim for a start in the GI Malibu S. Dec. 26 at Santa Anita.

The two talented juveniles have Casse looking forward to next year.

"It's just an exciting time for us," Casse said. "We're excited to be a part of two good horses that are owned by two really good owners. Anytime you have any type of big 2-year-old--even if they haven't started--you hope that they would put you in a good position where you can at least map out a plan to get them to the GI Kentucky Derby. We know the reality and we're still a long way away and they still have to continue to get better, but all indications show that they're good horses and we have something to be excited about going into Palm Meadows."

Airoforce, a debut winner at Kentucky Downs in September, won the GIII Bourbon S. in his second start before missing by a neck when runner-up in the GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile Turf. He was making his first start on dirt in Saturday's Kentucky Jockey Club.

"He was a little further behind so by the time he came from our farm to the racetrack it was too late to think about Saratoga," Casse said of Airoforce. "That may have ended up being a blessing in disguise for him. He got to train here all summer. Churchill is a really good place to train during the summer. People take it for granted because all the Saratoga horses get all the hype. It's really easy to say looking back now but he was touting us all off."

Conquest Big E, who was getting a confidence booster in Saturday's allowance tally after finishing eighth behind Nyquist (Uncle Mo) in the GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile, and Airoforce lead the Casse barn's deep juvenile bench.

"We've got a lot of good 2-year olds," Casse said. "The thing is just sorting them out to see if they're dirt horses. **Conquest Daddyo** (Scat Daddy) is a good grass horse that ran a sneaky good race [fourth] in the Breeders' Cup Juvenile Turf. We have **Conquest Enforcer** (Into Mischief) that ran a real good race at Woodbine [he won the Oct. 11 Cup and Saucer], but he's another one that we don't know if he's a dirt horse or not, but he's a real talented 2-year-old. **Moonlight Sky** (Sky Mesa) broke her maiden here by 10 lengths [Nov. 19 <u>video</u>]. Her biggest challenge is going to be getting her to mature mentally. Her head isn't wrapped around too tight, but she's very talented. **Siding Spring** (Warrior's Reward) [third in the GIII Bourbon and 10th in the Breeders' Cup Juvenile] is another one that we're really high on."
