WOODBINE TO EXPERIMENT WITH CLOCKWISE GRASS RACES IN 2016

In an effort to get as much use out of its turf course as possible and to create new wrinkles it hopes its customers will find exciting, Woodbine will run approximately 25 grass races next year that will go in a clockwise direction.

The idea was developed by Woodbine Entertainment Group's President and Chief Executive Officer Jim Lawson, who understands that turf races ordinarily produce more handle than races run on dirt or synthetic surfaces and that tracks can maximize handle by running as many races as they can on the grass.

"We have this magnificent turf course that is renowned across the world and we've been very successful attracting horses here to run over it and attracting horse for our stakes races," Lawson said. "I continued to scratch my head to see if there are ways we can use it more than we do. Sometimes you're limited to how much you can use a turf course because it tends to get chewed up, particularly on the turns. We only use the clubhouse turn when we run mile-and-a-quarter or mile-and-a-half races, which we don't do that often. So the clubhouse turn doesn't get chewed up much at all. When you examine ways you can use the course more, you think about putting that turn to use and the way to do that is to run clockwise. That's what led us to do this." **Cont. p3**

Lawson said that not only do turf races attract larger fields than main track races but even in races where the fields are not particularly big, customers have shown that they would rather bet on the grass than dirt or synthetic. *(Woodbine has had a Polytrack surface since 2006. It will be replaced for the 2016 meet with a Tapeta surface).*

“From a business standpoint, we, like every other racetrack, have to find ways of attracting more horses and getting bigger fields and there’s no question that turf races attract larger fields,” he said. “We get approximately 1.2 more horses per race on turf than on our synthetic track so there’s a direct correlation to higher handle with grass racing. Our statistics also clearly show that, apples to apples, people like wagering on turf more than or dirt or synthetic.”

The Woodbine team is also hoping the clockwise races will focus attention on Woodbine racing and add a bit of spice to some of the cards.

“The other aspect is this industry has to do some things that are new and exciting,” Lawson said.

“We’re certainly cognizant of the fact we need to build more interest in our product. Just the fact that people are talking about this is a good thing. It’s already giving exposure to us and the industry.”

Many people in racing, whether they are horsemen or bettors, generally have a hard time with change, but at least one Woodbine trainer is all for the idea.

“You know what, why not?” said Woodbine’s leading trainer Mark Casse. “I think we have to explore new avenues and new things in this sport to get people’s attention, so, again, why not? With all assets there are liabilities. Maybe in the beginning it may hurt some betting-wise. Any time you introduce something, new bettors shy away from it, but it may also draw so much attention that a lot of people will be watching and betting on Woodbine that wouldn’t have been otherwise.”

Lawson said most of the clockwise races will be sprints, many at 5 1/2 furlongs. He said the estimate of having 25 clockwise races is based on having one a week, but said there will be more if the

experiment is successful.

He said none of Woodbine's major turf stakes will be run clockwise but added that it's possible an overnight stakes could be created, likely one that would be added to one of the big fall racing days at Woodbine that feature several rich races and tend to attract many European horses. He also said the finish line will not be moved for the clockwise races in 2016, but Woodbine will definitely look at adding a second finish line in 2017, which could create the possibility of far more clockwise races and at additional distances.

In its on-going efforts to run as many grass races as possible, Woodbine is also looking to convert the existing harness track to a seven-furlong turf course, and end harness racing at Woodbine and move all standardbred racing to Mohawk Raceway. Lawson said that reports that that would happen in 2017 were premature and several hurdles must still be cleared before the harness track can be converted.

OAKLAWN TO CONTINUE LASIX-FREE BONUSES *By T.D. Thornton*

Even though a 10% purse bonus for winning races while not running on Lasix failed to yield an increase in the actual number of Lasix-free winners at last year's meet, Oaklawn Park will continue the program in 2016, the track's director of racing,

David Longinotti, confirmed Wednesday.

"We are bringing it back," Longinotti said. "We're going to do it the same way as last year. I think it deserves another year of studying it."

Participation in the bonus program is completely voluntary.

According to a TDN tally of Equibase charts, in 2014, when no bonus program was in effect, Oaklawn ran 473 races. Five races were won by Lasix-free Thoroughbreds (four horses total, with one repeat winner).

In 2015, with the 10% winning bonus, Oaklawn ran 477 races. Five races were won by Lasix-free Thoroughbreds (four horses total, with one repeat winner)—exactly the same as the previous year. The track paid out \$12,803 in bonus money.

Longinotti said that even though the addition of the bonus program did not change the number of Lasix-free winners, Oaklawn did see a doubling of the overall number of horses that started without being administered Lasix.

“The previous couple of years, I think we had 2% of our starters overall run without Lasix,” Longinotti said. “[In 2015] we jumped that number from 2% to 4%.”

Lasix (also branded Salix) is furosemide, a once-unsanctioned, but now nearly universally prescribed legal diuretic in American racing. It gained widespread use in the 1970s for its ability to reduce exercise-induced pulmonary hemorrhage in equine athletes. But in the decades since its legalization, there has been endless debate over the role of Lasix as a performance-enhancer and in fostering a culture of over-medication.

Well into the 1980s, long after Lasix became commonplace at tracks nationwide, Oaklawn had resisted its acceptance.

According to Longinotti, Oaklawn was one of the last tracks in the country to permit its regulated use.

One notable shift within the industry in recent years has been for owners of 2-year-olds not to race their young horses on Lasix. But because of the time of the year that Oaklawn runs its meet [Jan. 15--Apr. 16 in 2016] it does not schedule any 2-year-old races. Having access to this group of horses, would, in theory, boost the track’s number of Lasix-free runners.

“That’s just the way we fall on the racing calendar,” Longinotti said. “January through April, there aren’t a lot of 2-year-old races being run anywhere.”

Longinotti noted that the Oaklawn stable area has been open since Nov. 16 and that 300 horses are currently on the grounds in preparation for the 2016 meet.

Two stakes races for 3-year-olds have been endowed with a considerable bump in purses: The GIII Southwest S. [Feb. 15] has been upped from \$300,000 to \$500,000, while the GII Rebel S. has been boosted from \$750,000 to \$900,000.

“We think we’re the best place to come to prep a horse for the Triple Crown, and American Pharoah (Pioneer of the Nile) makes a good argument for that,” Longinotti said, referring to the champ’s 3-year-old season debut, which was a win in last year’s Rebel.

The New Orleans-based conditioner also speaks about a trio of Airdrie Stud runners who have not been seen in a while: GI Kentucky Oaks winner **Lovely Maria** (Majesticperfection), 2014 GIII Pegasus S. winner **Albano** (Istan) and **“TDN Rising Star” Chief Istan** (Istan).

CD: What is the plan for I’m a Chatterbox? Is she getting time off?

LJ: “She is getting time off. She is in Lexington and will probably be off for a big part of this month and then come back some time close to the holidays and get back to us in New Orleans.”

CD: Do you have any races in mind for her for next year yet?

LJ: “No, not really. We will just kind of let her take us along and see how things are going. There is nothing that we are going to be pointing to right away.”

CD: How do you feel about her run in the Distaff?

LJ: “Well, I mean it was not what we wanted. We wanted to win the thing. But, you know she drew the one-hole and didn’t have the speed to go to the front. We were somewhat in a predicament there of needing some room to race and just weren’t getting it when we wanted it.

Everyone seemed to be having a good finish, but she wasn’t able to close in. We needed to be kind of making a middle move in the race that we weren’t able to do, but that’s horse racing. That’s what happens and I can understand it. Those are big races. Nobody is going to give anybody anything.”

CD: While we are on the topic of 3-year-old fillies, how is Lovely Maria?

LJ: “I assume well. You will have to call Gov. [Brereton] Jones [of Airdrie Stud] and find out about that. [laughing] I sent her to Airdrie Stud.”

CD: She didn’t seem quite the same after the Oaks, finishing off the board in the GIII Delaware Oaks July 11, the GI Alabama S. Aug. 22 and the GI Juddmonte Spinster S. Oct. 4. Was she injured?

LJ: “She actually got a little sick after the Kentucky Oaks when we had her at Delaware. We felt like maybe we ran her back a little quick in the Delaware Oaks off the sickness. I think the distances are just getting far for her. You know, she is bred to be a sprinter, but thank goodness she was able to get the mile and an eighth in the Kentucky Oaks and mile and a sixteenth in the [GI] Ashland. She did things even then that she wasn’t supposed to be doing. But, as far as injury, no and I don’t know what the plans are for her.”

CD: We haven't seen Albano since the Gill Philip H. Iselin S. in August. Is he also turned out at Airdrie?

L J: "Albano is still at Airdrie Stud as well. We are waiting on Albano and another little horse by the name of Chief Istan that has only raced twice, but he won them both by big margins [breaking his maiden by 7 1/2 lengths at Delaware in September 2014 and winning a Keeneland allowance by 8 3/4 lengths Apr. 17]. We are waiting to get them both back."

CD: Chief Istan is one our Rising Stars, so we have been looking for him ourselves. Was he injured after his last race?

L J: "Chief Istan, he always ends up getting hurt every time he runs. The ones that are that fast always seem to come out of [their races] with issues. It's nothing major. It's been very time consuming, but nothing that needed surgery, nothing that needed fixing other than some healing. Albano I think the same thing. I think his biggest problem, that they finally found, was just bone bruising. Both horses are expected to come back and still be at full potential to come back and be at their best. Nothing was major, just needed time."

CD: Coup de Grace is another horse you have on the comeback trail. I saw he had his first published work since the Gill Salvator Mile July 5 Sunday at Fair Grounds (covering three furlongs in :37). How did you feel about the work and how has been doing since you got him back?

L J: "We are just trying to get him loosened back up and started back. He did very well. He came out of [the Salvator Mile] not well. We sent him to the clinic and they couldn't find anything. With me galloping, I never felt like he got back to galloping the way that he used to be, but finally after the Salvator Mile, we were able to find that he had some bone bruising, but he is training well now. We are just getting him started back, but we are hoping and expecting a big year out him when he comes back." Cont. p8

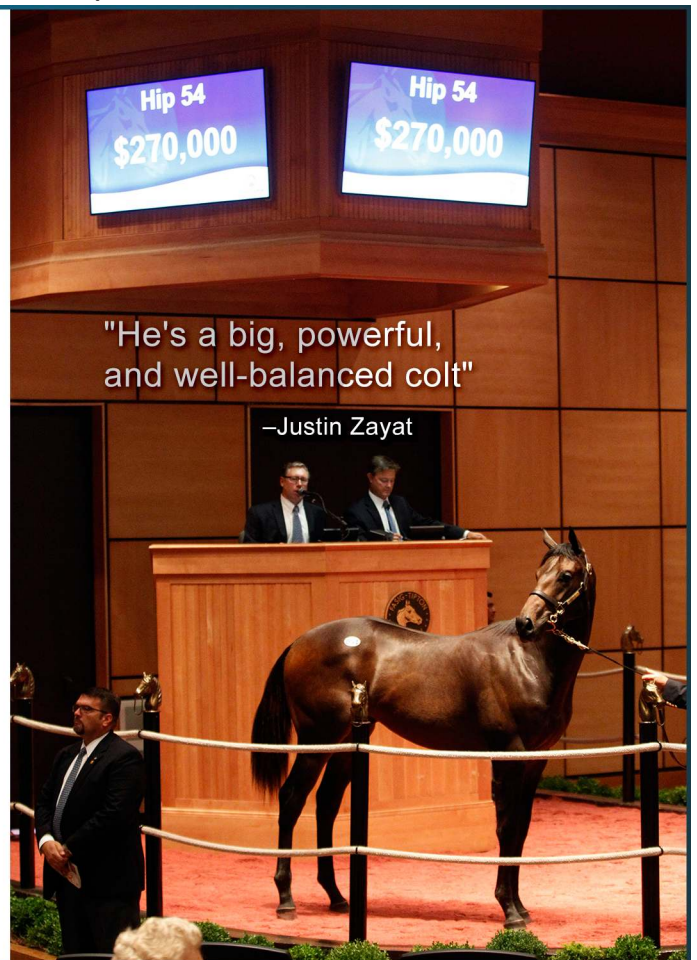

CD: Cassatt had several wins over the winter and made her first start back from a layoff at Keeneland last month (finishing fifth in an optional claimer Oct. 18). How is she doing and where will she go next?

L J: "She actually breezed [Tuesday] morning and had a very nice breeze [firing a five-panel bullet in :59.80 at Fair Grounds]. Our goal is to head back for the Houston Ladies Classic in January, but we are going to get a race in her before that. They have the Tiffany Lass here, which she won last year. They also have a race in Remington that we are thinking about, the She's All In S. So we are going to get a race in her in the next two or three weeks."

CD: Thirteen Arrows won an allowance at Keeneland in October and had a win in the Zia Park Distaff (video) last week. What are the future plans for her?

L J: "The sprint division for fillies is kind of tough in the area that we are. We do have another little stake here in New Orleans to kind of keep her in the motions of running towards the end of this month. As far as anything picked out for next year, nothing is set in stone by any means as far as whether we take her to Gulfstream for some racing or not, we will see. Maybe we will go up to Oaklawn. We will just kind of sit and watch. We are in no huge hurry. She is almost 5 years old. No need to get in a hurry now."

CD: "TDN Rising Star" Southern Girl is entered for main track only Sunday at Fair Grounds. How do you feel about her going into this race off a third at Keeneland last time?

L J: "She's doing good. We blew her out [Tuesday] morning [five furlongs in 1:02.40 at Fair Grounds] for the race and all is good. Hopefully, we get the condition where we can get in and get her to run. They have room in the condition book, that ought to be going by the end of this month. Once again, no need to start getting in a big hurry now. We want her starting to go, but if we can get a race by the end of this month, we will be set for where we are wanting to go after the first of the year." CD: The other Fox Hill 2-year-old Scarecrow is also entered in a one-mile and 70-yard maiden special Friday at Fair Grounds after finishing eighth on debut sprinting at Keeneland. Do you think the added distance will make the difference this time around or have you done something different with him?

Larry Jones Q & A cont.

L J: "Well, you have to look at the breeding. He is a Summer Bird and Summer Bird won the Belmont going a mile and half. Summer Bird himself didn't start racing until the spring of his 3-year-old year and that was going long. Cont. p9

He comes out of Jostle, who won the mile and a quarter [GI] Alabama and she won the [GI] Coaching Club [American] Oaks, which [was a mile and a half] the year she won it. So, you don't expect those horses to run six furlongs and be real successful. They kind of have to be a freak if they are. But, we think going long is going to be what he is designed to do and this will give him an opportunity to show it. The distance is going to be the thing that will make him turn around. If we get him turned around, it is going to be the distance doing it."

CD: While I have you on the phone, do you have any other promising 2-year-olds we haven't seen or that you are excited about?

LJ: "I think you have seen everything that we have. We are just kind of slow on 2-year-olds. We have that filly Midnight on Oconee, that Midnight Lute filly. We have raced her three times and she has two wins and a second. We think she is going to be somebody some day. She seems to be a pretty nice filly. That's one reason we might take Cassatt to Remington because we are pretty sure we are taking her to Remington for the Trapeze [S. Dec. 13]. See if we can get her started out on the same route that Lovely Maria took and just try to follow in the footsteps of her."

KHOZAN TO STAND AT JOURNEYMAN STUD

Al Shaqab Racing's TDN Rising Star **Khozan** (Distorted Humor--Delta Princess, by A.P. Indy), a half-brother to multiple champion Royal Delta (Empire Maker) who was unbeaten and untouched in two trips to the post during the winter months of 2015, has been retired and will enter stud at Brent and Crystal

Fernung's Journeyman Stud in Ocala, Florida. A stud fee will be announced at a later date.

Bred in Kentucky by Adena Springs, the dark bay colt was snapped up by Hartley/DeRenzo Thoroughbreds for \$350,000 at the 2013

Fasig-Tipton Saratoga Sale, then was purchased by Sheikh Joannal Thani's team for an even \$1 million after breezing an eighth of a mile in a very swift :9 4/5 at the Fasig-Tipton Florida Sale the following March ([click here for sales coverage](#)).

Saddled with the widest gate in a field of 14 for his seven-furlong unveiling at Gulfstream last Jan. 24, Khozan was trapped out three wide, but nevertheless wrested command at the head of the stretch and kicked on to take it by 3 3/4 lengths, good for a 102 Beyer Speed Figure ([video](#)). By comparison, Upstart (Flatter) was given a 105 Beyer for his victory in the Gil Holy Bull S. later on the program. Khozan made his next appearance in a Feb. 22 allowance going a one-turn mile and that result was never in doubt, as he took command a quarter-mile from home and went on to dust his rivals by nearly 13 lengths at a nickel on the dollar ([video](#)). Khozan would have been one of the favorites for the GI Florida Derby another five weeks later, but was injured in his final pre-race workout.

"It's a shame we never got to see Khozan on the big stage because he was a very fast horse who could carry his speed," commented trainer Todd Pletcher. "With his talent, looks and pedigree, he has a real shot to be a successful stallion."

Added Brett Fernung, "Khozan is reminiscent of Danzig and Malibu Moon- immensely talented horses with abbreviated racing careers. The upside on Khozan is unlimited. I can't express how grateful we are to Al Shaqab Racing for allowing us to be involved with this wonderful horse."

Florida's breeders will have their first opportunity to inspect Khozan at Journeyman's open house on Saturday, Dec. 5.

LEIGH FAMILY TAKES THE SPOILS AT TATTS *by Emma Berry*

Seta (GB) (Pivotal {GB}) was one of the stars of the headline day of the Tattersalls December Mares' Sale and her relation **Farandine (GB)** (Rock Of Gibraltar {Ire}) ([lot 2247](#)) had her own moment in the spotlight Wednesday, when sharing top billing at 190,000gns with **Toujours L'Amour (GB)** (Authorized {Ire}).

Farandine, another member of the Sarah Leigh dispersal, was offered on behalf of the executors of the late owner-breeder by Fittocks Stud, which is where she will return after being bought by Luca and Sara Cumani.

There's not too much sentimentality in the hard-nosed world of commercial bloodstock, but the trainer admitted that the winning juvenile, who has never been out of the first three in three starts to date, was "something of a memento" of a family with which he has enjoyed a close association for several generations. Leading lights to have emanated from Cumani's Bedford House Stables include Gerald Leigh's GI Breeders' Cup Mile winner Barathea (Ire) (Sadler's Wells) and G1 Irish 1000 Guineas winner Gossamer (GB) (Sadler's Wells). As well as Seta selling for 1.1 million gns Tuesday, Farandine's dam Rivara (GB) (Red Ransom) went through the ring for 75,000gns.

Listed winner Toujours L'Amour ([lot 2134](#)), offered early in the day by Chris Wright's Stratford Place Stud, will join the paddocks which produced G1 Derby winner Motivator (GB) (Montjeu {Ire}) after being bought by Deerfield Farm through agent Dick O'Gorman. Bred at Stratford Place from the Group 2-placed High Heel Sneakers (GB) (Dansili {GB}), Toujours L'Amour raced in partnership for Wright and Trevor and Libby Harris of Lordship Stud.

Just two lots earlier, another of the Stratford Place Stud draft reached 185,000gns when Mehmet Kurt's Kingwood Stud stepped in to buy [lot 2132](#)

Comeback Queen (GB) (Nayef), a listed-placed half-sister to GII La Jolla H. winner Worldly (GB) (Selkirk) and Breeders' Cup Juvenile Turf winner Donativum (GB) (Cadeaux Genereux {GB}).

With a lift in clearance rate to 81%, 16 more horses were sold than in the corresponding session of 2014, but this wasn't enough to halt a 2% shortfall in turnover down to 6,632,000gns. The median improved by 1.25% to 20,250gns, but the average price was down by 10% at 33,495gns. [cont. p2](#)

Rabbah Filling ‘Thunder’s Book...

Saeed Manana of the Rabbah team has been active in the mare market this week, attempting to find well-credentialed mates to send to his G1 QIPCO 2000 Guineas winner Night Of Thunder (Ire) (Dubawi {Ire}), who will embark on his stud career at Darley’s Kildangan Stud for €30,000 in 2016. Among those selected Thursday for the sum of 170,000gns was [lot 2288](#),

Saltanat (Ire) (Duke Of Marmalade {Ire}), whose half-sister, the G1 Investec Oaks winner Qualify (Ire) (Fastnet Rock {Aus}), was bought in the same ring 24 hours earlier for 1.6 million gns.

The 5-year-old Saltanat, who won three races in the Czech Republic for owner Ardak Amikulov, was sold carrying her first foal by Sidney’s Candy and was the sole consignee for the Seitz family’s Brookdale Farm. Brookdale later featured as buyer of one of the Juddmonte draft, **Sandy Cay** (Mizzen Mast) ([lot 2308](#)), at 62,000gns.

Manana’s shopping list also stretched to several Juddmonte-breds, including the statuesque filly **Coral Garden (GB)** (Halling) ([lot 2295](#)), who was added to the haul at 160,000gns. “She has a fantastic pedigree and her sister has a War Front and a Kitten’s Joy so there’s plenty to come,” said Brown of the 3-year-old daughter of G1 Prix de la Foret winner Etoile Montante (Miswaki), whose half-sister Starformer (Dynaformer) won Belmont’s GII New York S.

He added, “She’s also a very nice individual--we always try to buy the best physical we possibly can--and when you buy into a Juddmonte family there’s always plenty of chances for good updates.”

In 2013, owner-breeder Colin Murfitt bought the Galileo (Ire) mare Galicuix (GB) from the December Sale for just 8,000gns. The Paco Boy (Ire) colt she had on the ground at that time became this season’s G2 Qatar Vintage S. winner Galileo Gold (GB), while the Paco Boy filly she was carrying followed that up a month later by topping the DBS Premier Sale at a record-equaling £280,000. Murfitt returned to Tattersalls Thursday to select [lot 2310](#), Juddmonte’s Oasis Dream (GB) filly **Sugar Mill (GB)** for his Soham-based Pantile Stud at 120,000gns. Though undistinguished on the racecourse herself, the 3-year-old’s dam is listed winner Honest Quality (Elusive Quality) and her second dam is the even better credentialed Grade 1 winner and producer Honest Lady (Seattle Slew).

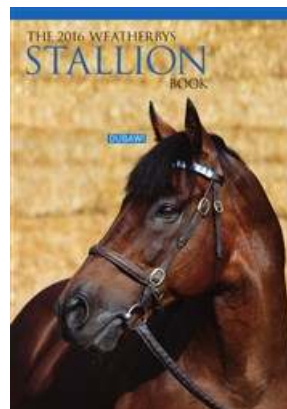

STABLE MUSINGS WITH JAMES FANSHAWE

Blessed with a breadth of interest by no means common in his profession, James Fanshawe did not need to be in Paris on the night of the recent massacre to have the frivolous obsessions of the Turf placed in due perspective. As it was, he was at least able to make his own contribution, however trivial, to a communal determination that the show must go on. Though the listed race he had targeted at Saint-Cloud was postponed, and Gale Force (GB) (Shirocco {Ger}) duly returned to Newmarket, he sent the filly straight back over the Channel to win the rescheduled race just six days later. In the process he extended a superb run of form through the closing weeks of the domestic campaign. [cont. p6](#)

Stable Musings with James Fanshawe cont.

"At the end of August, we were still only on 21 winners," said Fanshawe. "In the next two months, we had 27. We hadn't turned anything up earlier in the season; we did all the usual bloods and scopes, and they all came back fine. But I just hadn't been happy with the way they looked. When they look well, you can train them with more confidence. And that was the difference in the autumn. They still look well, even now, those that are still on the go."

It is one of Fanshawe's defining virtues as a trainer, of course, that he refrains from rushing a horse at a fragile stage of its development. He understands that more haste, in many horses, really does mean less speed; that pushing them too hard, when deficient in health or maturity, might prevent the kind of fulfilment they collectively achieved this autumn.

Fanshawe is grateful that owner-breeders, in particular, recognize the value of this patience--and has duly excelled in 2015, once again, with such home-breds as Ribbons (GB) (Manduro {Ger}) and Gale Force (sold at Tattersalls Tuesday for 270,000gns) herself.

"The owner-breeders are worth their weight in gold," he stressed. "A lot of them are being squeezed out in these commercial times, so it's great when you can still train horses from families you know so well. Orders at the yearling sales probably left us just a fraction shorter, numerically, but I did feel we

bought some nice horses--and there's still time to catch up, though, at the breeze-ups."

It is not as though Fanshawe has ever been limited in the type of horse he can train. Indeed, one of his Fred Archer syndicates--named for the tragic genius of Victorian racing, said to haunt Pegasus Stables--saw an 80,000-guinea yearling, The Tin Man (GB) (Equiano {Fr}), accelerate in just six starts from a debut in May to fourth of 20 behind Muhaarar (GB) (Oasis Dream {GB}) in the G1 QIPCO British Champions Sprint in October.

At the same time, the first of the two horses nominated by Fanshawe for this *TDN* series--collating prospects for 2016--certainly bears a familiar trademark.

"**Star Storm (Ire)** (Sea The Stars {Ire}) is a home-bred grandson of Sayyedati (GB) (Shadeed)," he explained. "He always showed me glimpses of ability, as a lovely-looking horse with lots of scope. But he took forever to get it together. When he did, he went from a maiden on 3 September to completing a hat-trick in the Cumberland Lodge S. on 3 October. He stays in training at four and, with that scope and physique and pedigree in his favor, you would hope that he could keep progressing--especially as we now know a bit more about him."

Among those just starting out, Fanshawe counts **Replenish (Fr)** (Le Havre {Ire}) among those to have laid solid foundations.

"He's a horse I've always liked, who came from Con Marnane at the breeze-ups," he said. "He ran in three maidens, finishing second twice, before winning a nursery over seven furlongs at Kempton in October. He only scraped home in the end, but I think it was quite a competitive race and I hope he's the type who will keep progressing at a mile plus next year."

The final task set to contributors to this series is to identify a horse from another yard, other than Air Force Blue (War Front), to monitor for the Classics. Though no less comfortable with the challenge than the rest, Fanshawe could not help but admire two Group 1 winners this autumn; **Minding (Ire)** (Galileo {Ire}) in the Dubai Fillies' Mile at Newmarket, and **Marcel (Ire)** (Lawman {Fr}) in the Racing Post Trophy at Doncaster.

"Obviously the filly has a lovely pedigree, but I also thought she looked tough--the sort that will get on and do it in the spring," he said. "And I just have a feeling that Marcel, in the hands of a trainer who's bloody good with these Classic horses, will go on and prove that Doncaster was no fluke."

O'BRIEN'S HK HOPES REST WITH 'HIGHLAND'

The Longines Hong Kong International meeting is one of the few major international racing events where Aidan O'Brien has not tasted success, but he will be hoping to fill that CV omission in 10 days time when he sends out **Highland Reel (Ire)** (Galileo {Ire}) in the G1 Hong Kong Vase. The 3-year-old has chalked up a lot of air miles this year winning the G1 Secretariat S. at Arlington Park in August en route to a fine run in Australia when third in the G1 William Hill Cox Plate at Moonee Valley Oct. 24. In between he posted a solid effort when fifth beaten less than four lengths behind Golden Horn (GB) (Cape Cross {Ire}) in the Sept. 12 G1 QIPCO Irish Champion S. at Leopardstown.

"Highland Reel was a little unlucky not to be second in the Cox Plate but we were very happy with his run and he's been in good form since," said O'Brien. "To be honest, I think he is equally effective over a mile and a quarter and a mile and a half. He is a very uncomplicated and tactically versatile horse, which makes the jockey's life a lot easier. I think both the likely ground and the track at Sha Tin should suit him well. From day one, we have always thought a huge amount of him and nothing has happened in the meantime to alter that view."

MOSES BAN REINSTATED

The New South Wales Racing Appeals Tribunal reinstated a 12-month ban against trainer Kevin Moses for a cobalt infraction, after one of his horses tested positive, reported *Racenet.com* Wednesday. Moses trainee Felix Bay (Aus) (Song of Tara {Ire}) tested positive for cobalt in both a pre- and post-race sample at Hawkesbury in April. Originally disqualified for 12 months by Racing NSW stewards, Moses appealed to the Racing NSW Appeals Panel, which instead handed out a A\$20,000 fine and suspended sentence in October. The Racing NSW stewards counter-appealed and Moses will begin his disqualification next Wednesday. Moses is in the process of relocating the horses in his stable to new trainers.
