

## MONDIALISTE CONTINUES WORLD TRAVELS

Geoff and Sandra Turnbull's **Mondialiste (Ire)** (Galileo {Ire}) has done his part to make the 2015 season a most memorable one for North Yorkshire-based trained David O'Meara and will look to complete a fairy tale season of his own against a class group in Sunday's G1 Longines Hong Kong Mile.

O'Meara, 38, was a jumps rider for 13 years before taking out his trainer's license in 2010. He registered an impressive 138 winners in just his third full year of training in 2013, and earned his maiden Group 1 as a trainer courtesy of G Force (Ire) (Tamayuz {GB}) in the Sprint Cup at Haydock and orchestrated a 25-1 upset of the G1 Prix de l'Abbaye with one-time handicapper Move In Time (GB) (Monsieur Bond {Ire}).

But O'Meara has seen his fortunes really take flight in 2015. In addition to winning the G1 Woodbine Mile with Mondialiste, Amazing Maria (Ire) (Mastercraftsman {Ire}) added Group 1 tallies in the G1 Falmouth S. at Newmarket in July and in the G1 Prix Rothschild, defeating G1 Poule d'Essai des Pouliches winner Ervedya (Fr) (Siyouni {Fr}). Mondialiste is exiting a runner-up effort to Tepin (Bernstein) in the G1 Breeders' Cup Mile Oct. 31, in which he was blocked in upper stretch, but closed the final eighth of a mile in :11.48 per Trakus data, nearly a half-second faster than any of his rivals. Mondialiste was not asked to do much Friday morning and covered the final 400 meters of his gallop in :33.1. **Cont. p5**

## RECORD ANNUAL TURNOVER FOR ARQANA

Arqana wrapped up its sale season with its December Breeding Stock Sale last week, and the company posted new records for turnover, average and top price for its combined sales in 2015. Total turnover for the company was up 3.2% to €123.7 million, while the overall average was up 6% to €47,417. The top lot of the company's flagship sale, the August Yearling Sale--the €2.6 million son of Dubawi--also marked a new record for Arqana.

"2015 was an exceptional year for Arqana and it is very rewarding to end the year with a record annual turnover of €123.7 million, a figure which is up by 3.2% compared to 2014," said Arqana Chairman Eric Hoyeau. Hoyeau continued, “These results also show the strength of the Arqana model, which relies on two essential factors: the international influence of the Deauville sales, in particular the

August, December and Arc sales, and the strength in depth of our domestic market.”

Arqana's four yearling sales posted turnover of €65,011,500 (including private sales), with the August sale posting the greatest increase of those four at 8%, and also posting a record average (€163,292) and median (€95,000). The flat-bred breeze-up market also showed strength, with the Arqana Breeze-Up sale

saw a record €8,203,000 turnover (up 21%). The horses-in-training market returned results that showed demand for high-potential lots but more uneven demand for lesser offerings. Arqana also enjoyed success this year with its new online

platform, which was launched in the second half of the year.

“Though there were signs of a more selective demand this year, which should incite us to take even better care of our selection work, we approach 2016 with confidence,” Hoyeau continued. “The forthcoming season will see more innovations, including organizing the Breeze-Up sale in Deauville for the first time during the prestigious French Guineas weekend, and organizing the Arc Sale in Chantilly. 2016 will also see the 10th anniversary of the creation of Arqana. Since 2006 an incredible journey has been accomplished; nonetheless, this anniversary will only be a stepping stone, as we are more than ever driven by the desire to continue to develop our sales for the next 10 years.”

## DETTORI AWARDED 'BEST JOCKEY' HONOR

Frankie Dettori was awarded the 2015 Longines World's Best Jockey award in a ceremony at the gala dinner of the Longines Hong Kong International Races at the Hong Kong Convention & Exhibition Centre Friday.

The award is decided by points earned in the 100 highest-rated Grade/Group 1 races in the world in the year, with 12 points given for a win, six for a second and four for a third. Dettori won with 100 points with Ryan Moore and Victor

de Triomphe and G1 Investec Derby. The other was the G1 Diamond Jubilee at Royal Ascot aboard Undrafted (Purim). Other Group 1 wins by Dettori this year include the Prix de Diane Longines, the Darley Prix Morny and the Juddmonte Middle Park S.

"Frankie Dettori is one of the stars of the racing world," said IFHA Chairman Louis Romanet, who presented the award with Longines Vice President and Head of International Marketing Juan-Carlos Capelli. "His ride in the Qatar Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe on Golden Horn was an absolute masterpiece. Furthermore, his consistency during the course of the year was remarkable. He is a deserving winner."

"He's just following the same pattern as Canada and Keeneland," O'Meara reported. "These races around the bend seem to suit him and we've gotten to know the horse a bit better. At the moment he's been running well over a mile but there is every chance we will step him up in trip in due course. He's bred to stay further. Depending on how this goes, he could go to the [G1] Dubai Turf [on World Cup Night]. He can run well fresh. We'll take it one step at a time."



**'IRON HORSE' CRITERION READY FOR CUP**

Each of the 29 horses in town for the Longines Hong Kong International Races Sunday at Sha Tin Racecourse is outstanding in their own rights. They have earned their chance at this big stage, they are all a combination of attractive, athletic, elegant--take your pick. You would be able to excuse any of this weekend's competitors if they lacked pizzazz and energy. It is the end of a long season for most, after all, and everyone has a bad day now and again. Except, apparently, **Criterion (NZ)** (Sebring {Aus}). A beautifully conformed chestnut, the 5-year-old has been around the world and back again for trainer David Hayes and Sir Owen Glenn, but you'd never be able to tell.

"Look, he's got an iron constitution," said the effervescent Hayes at trackwork Wednesday morning, as Criterion was returning from a spin around the Sha Tin dirt track. "He's been in work for 18 months and as you can see, he's really thriving and he's really good."

Originally trained by David Payne, the homebred was a 2-year-old of some significance, winning the G2 Todman S.--a top course-and-distance prep for the G1 Golden Slipper S. at



Rosehill--before finishing sixth, beaten 4 1/2 lengths, by the Gai Waterhouse-trained Overreach (Aus) (Exceed and Excel {Aus}) in the big race. He snapped an eight-

race losing streak

in the 2014 G1 Rosehill Guineas and, having his fourth run in the space of 43 days, added the G1 Australian Derby. Runner-up in the 2014 G1 Caulfield S. and a close seventh in that year's G1 Cox Plate, he was only fifth as the favorite in the G1 Mackinnon S. and reached a crossroads of sorts. Glenn wanted to press on to an overseas target like the Hong Kong Cup, but Payne apparently did not. Who better to transfer the horse to than Hayes, who won no fewer than 458 races in nine years training in the jurisdiction.

Sent off at 38-1 in last year's Cup in his first run for the new outfit, Criterion chased the pace from second and looked a real chance after hitting the lead 200 meters from home before settling for an outstanding third behind odds-on Designs on Rome (Ire) (Holy Roman Emperor {Ire}) and Military Attack (Ire) (Oratorio {Ire}) ([video](#)). It was the second such result in the Cup for Hayes, who saddled the outstanding filly Elegant Fashion (Aus) (Danewin {Aus}) in 2003.

Having made seven starts in 113 days--four in Sydney, two in Melbourne and the one here in Hong Kong--Criterion took the next three months off, or, at a minimum, didn't race. Classy enough to run a place in the G1 Canterbury S. (1300m) and in the G1 George Ryder S. (1500m), Criterion relished the cut in the ground and rattled home to thrash Red Cadeaux (GB) (Cadeaux Genereux {GB}) in the 2000-meter G1 Queen Elizabeth S. at The Championships back at Randwick this past April. But still there was no rest for the weary. Third to Blazing Speed (GB) (Dylan Thomas {Ire}) and Staphanos (Jpn) (Deep Impact {Jpn}) in this venue's G1 QE II S. 15 days later, he was unplaced when gamely spotted against Free Eagle (Ire) (High Chaparral {Ire}) in the G1 Prince of Wales's S. at Royal Ascot and behind Arabian Queen (Ire) (Dubawi {Ire}) and Cartier Horse of the Year Golden Horn (GB) (Cape Cross {Ire}) in the G1 Juddmonte International S. at York. He returned home to annex this year's Caulfield S. in

early October, returned on two weeks' rest to finish closest to the runaway Winx (Aus) (Street Cry {Ire}) in the Cox Plate ([video](#)) and exits a brave third in the G1 Melbourne Cup ([video](#)), his first attempt over two miles, and may even have gone closer but for a shortage of racing room at a critical stage.

An amazing streak--and he ain't done yet.

"He's got an incredible Group 1 profile," Hayes commented, as much a fan of Criterion as anyone. "He's been competitive at the shortest distance and the maximum. Since we've had him, he's averaged A\$460,000 a start, so that makes him a very amazing horse."

Having had the success he did in Hong Kong, Hayes relishes the opportunity to 'come home.'

"It's very exciting to when you have a horse in a HK\$25-million race in my old hometown," he said. "I'd love to come back and win this race, it's their premier international race. It would sure be nice. I've been placed in it a few times, but I'd sure love to win it."

Speaking of one of those placings, it is with obvious fondness that Hayes recollects the effort of Elegant Fashion a dozen years back. The chestnut mare led into the final furlong, but had the great misfortune of running into two of Europe's best that year and finished third behind Falbrav (Ire) and Rakti (GB) ([video](#)).

"She ran really well, she was the Derby winner," he commented, before matter-of-factly adding, "She was entered and wasn't good enough. Falbrav and Rakti were just a bit too big and a bit too strong on the day. But what a terrific mare she was."

Having earned nearly A\$6.5 million, Criterion is sure to be a sought-after prospect at stud, perhaps as early as next August. With that in mind, race selection this weekend became a fairly easy decision.

"We elected to go for the 2000 [-meter race] rather than the mile and a half, because it's probably a little more appealing to breeders in Australia," Hayes explained.

Horses like Dunaden (Fr) and Red Cadeaux have had success at this meeting cutting back to the 2400 meters of the Vase from the two miles of the Melbourne Cup. Is Hayes concerned about dropping back all the way to 10 panels?

"The one breeze that I gave him at the Valley [Moonee Valley] ([video](#)), he showed a really good turn of foot, so I think he's still got the spring in his legs," Hayes offered. "He's a Group 1 performer at 1200 meters, so I think he'll be fast enough at the 2000."

Given the competition he's facing Sunday, he'll need to be just that. But he has proved equal to the task so many times before that it could prove foolish to think Criterion and his world-class trainer can't pull the rabbit out of the hat one more time.

## NUOVO RECORD A LIVE CHANCE IN CUP

Members of the fairer sex have had their fair share of success in the G1 Longines Hong Kong Cup, with Alexander Goldrun (Ire), Pride (Fr) and Snow Fairy (Ire) striking within the space of seven years between 2004 and 2010. The latter was ridden by

Ryan Moore to victory in that year's G1 Queen Elizabeth II Cup in addition to the Hong Kong feature, and last year's 'World's Best Jockey' has picked up the call on **Nuovo Record (Jpn)** (Heart's Cry {Jpn}). Winner of five of her 14 career outings, the chestnut filly annexed the 2014 G1 Yushun Himba before finishing second to recent G1 Japan Cup victrix Shonan Pandora (Jpn) (Deep Impact) in the G1 Shuka Sho and narrowly missing in last year's QE II Cup at Kyoto. Though she has but one win in five starts this term, she ran on nicely to fill the runner-up spot behind Shonan Pandora in the G2 Sankei Sho All Comers S. Sept. 27 and fell just short again in the QEII, going down by a neck in that 2200-meter affair Nov. 15. Nuovo Record schooled at the stalls Friday morning and will leave from the three hole Sunday afternoon.

"She is in fantastic form at this moment," confirmed trainer Makoto Saito. "She is a very smart filly and copes with new things, so when she schooled the gate, she did not focus on the stall handlers at all. She will start from an inside draw, so she can travel on the green strip on the rail. She will be suited by this turf, which is similar Bermuda-type turf in our country. The owner has been very positive to send her horse to international races overseas, so my horse will have more options than before."

## DELZANGLES SHOTS FOR MORE 'VASE' TIME

No 3-year-old male has been able to defeat elder stayers in the G1 Longines Hong Kong Vase, but Qatar Racing & Wildenstein Stables Limited's progressive **Ming Dynasty (Fr)** (King's Best) will try to right that wrong in Sunday's 2400-meter opening race of the International quartet.

Just once-beaten in five career tries, the bay--who has raced exclusively at this 12-furlong distance--ascended through the ranks to post a first black-type score in the Listed Grand Prix de Clairefontaine Aug. 25, a success that earned him a trip to Arc trials day Sept. 13. Though he failed to handle the likes of subsequent G1 Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe third New Bay (GB)

(Dubawi {Ire}) when sixth of seven in the G2 Prix Niel at Longchamp Sept. 13, he bounced back with a career-best effort in the G2 Prix du Conseil de Paris at Chantilly Oct. 18, earning his spot in this field. The sometimes-cantankerous sophomore stretched his legs over the Sha Tin dirt track Friday morning before paying a visit to the parade ring. His trainer, who won the 2011 Vase with Dunaden (Fr) (Nicobar {GB}), is impressed by the colt's relatively tranquil behavior in Hong Kong.

"He is just so relaxed here which is amazing as he can be a bit crazy at times...and hopefully that's a good sign," commented Mikel Delzangles. "He's settled well in the stables and he's coped with the noise and all the people around at track work which I'm sure is good for his education.

He continued, "Today was just for entertainment. He's relaxed, he looks well, he's moving well. He did some more schooling in the parade ring. He was in the stall two days ago. Today we just lapped him around a couple times. Post three is very good for us. We can do anything from there. It would be perfect to race in a first four positions in a regular-pace race, I don't know if it will be, but it should be okay."

## JAPAN LOOKING FOR MILE 'HAT TRICK'

Eishin Preston (Green Dancer) provided Japan with its first victory in the G1 Longines Hong Kong Mile in 2001, one of a remarkable three winners at the meeting (Agnes Digital, Cup; Stay Gold, Vase). Four years later, Hat Trick (Jpn) (Sunday Silence) parlayed a victory in the G1 Mile Championship into success on International day, but no foreign horse has managed to succeed in the race since. Exiting success in the Mile

Championship, **Maurice (Jpn)** (Screen Hero {Jpn}) is likely to be best-backed to snap the streak and give Japan its third trophy in the race this coming weekend.

The first plate was already on the table when we sat down. So was a menu. I didn't look at this menu. Next, a soup. A consomme. A *pheasant* consomme with mierpoix (fancy way of saying chopped veggies, though I just found that out) and what I would call small dumplings. After consuming this, I was in a fowl mood. Hold your applause. Please.

Chapter 4. Entree. A few weeks ago, the very capable Meon Yu, the HKJC media liaison, emailed us the selections and they were interesting, to put it mildly. The fish option was salmon with vintage caviar (whatever that is), I went for the beef option. Wagyu beef. Beef *cheek* to be specific. Everyone together....ewwww. Actually, it was very good, fork-tender served on potato mash with organic vegetables and a delicious mango brunoise, apparently a culinary knife cut. Where's Bobby Flay when I need him?

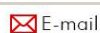
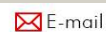

a debut loss, Major Emblem lost for the first time after winning her first two. Trainer Yasuhito Tamura revealed Major Emblem's running style will be altered for the Hanshin. "In her second race, she was

able to overcome the slow pace and win," he noted. "It was a shame that she got robbed of a win in the Artemis S. Since then, we have changed her training pattern by giving her a horse to follow, and keeping her back and being patient with her. This makes her more controllable, and it's clear she's able to run like this with patience. Jockey Christophe Lemaire also believes this has helped in her training.

She's used to going between the farm and the training center, so hopefully there'll be no problems while she's in transit [to Hanshin]."

Also re-opposing here are the first- and third-place finishers of the G3 Fantasy S. Nov. 7. **Candy Barows (Jpn)** (Deep Impact {Jpn}) made it two wins from three starts when taking that event by a head, with **Blanc Bonheur (Jpn)** (Deep Impact {Jpn}) just a further neck back in third while suffering her first loss. Blanc Bonheur had previously won the G3 Nisai S. July 26.

## FINAL SUBMISSIONS IN COBALT HEARING

Sheales argued the trainers were not aware the vitamin drips provided by Brennan contained cobalt. Sheales pointed out that Kavanagh had taken Magicool (Aus) (Fastnet Rock {Aus}) off the drip prior to his win in the G1 Victoria Derby--a sign he was not trying to enhance the horse's performance--and he also attacked the stewards' processes, saying their pre-screening tests in November 2014 of two of O'Brien's horses would have shown the cobalt spikes.

"You'd think a trainer would be replicating exactly what had caused Magicool to perform so well just a few weeks earlier," Sheales said, according to *Racing.com*. "Can anyone offer any sensible explanation as to why he pulled the drips?"

Jeff Gleeson, representing the stewards, accused O'Brien and Kavanagh of lying. Gleeson said O'Brien of lied at least seven times during his evidence and he accused Kavanagh of lying about a drip trial he had undertaken with Dr. Brennan, according to *Racing.com*.

"The motivation is as obvious as it is old," Gleeson said. "They wanted to win, they thought the substance could help and they thought they could get away with it."

The board will announce their decisions in the cases next week.

## INGLIS SALE SEASON CLOSSES

Inglis conducted its final sale of 2015 Friday when it held its December Thoroughbred Sale in Melbourne. A strong clearance rate of 90% highlighted statistics of the mixed sale. The average dropped 6.7% to A\$9,829, with a A\$75,000 top lot compared to last year's A\$260,000; the median, however, rose 37.5% to A\$5,500. In total, 159 horses sold for A\$1,562,750. One fewer sold last year when the gross was A\$1,663,800.

The top lot came from the Darley draft, which sold all 17 of its offerings for a gross of A\$307,500. The topper was [lot 80](#), the Group 3-placed 3-year-old gelding **Chamarel (Aus)** (Exceed and Excel {Aus}). He was picked up by Yu Long Investments for A\$75,000 and will eventually race in China along with two of Yu Long's other purchases from the sale.

"Our final sale of the year returned some outstanding results and was an ideal way to conclude a successful year of trading," said Inglis's Victorian Manager Simon Vivian. "I would like to thank our vendors at today's sale for presenting a quality draft

This will be her first two-turn attempt, and first try against open company, but she's done nothing wrong yet and was flattered when Patriotic Diamond (Hat Trick {Jpn})--third in her stakes win--came back to take an optional claimer by daylight Nov. 26.

Bob Baffert has two chances at a fourth Starlet score, including one with a full-sister to a previous Starlet winner. Hill 'n' Dale Equine Holdings and Edward McGehee's **Treasuring** (Smart Strike) is a full to Streaming, who won the Starlet two years ago when it was still contested at Hollywood Park. She is out of Teeming (Storm Cat), a daughter of blue hen Better Than Honour. Treasuring broke her maiden third out on the cut back here Sept. 19. She was most recently second in Del Mar's seven-panel Desi Arnaz S. Nov. 15, finishing a nose in front of **Street Fancy** (Street Sense) and further ahead of **Surfside Tiara** (Scat Daddy) and **Pretty N Cool** (Scat Daddy).

Pretty N Cool, fifth of five as the 3-5 chalk in that affair, is also trained by Baffert. A sharp debut victress in the Del Mar slop in July, she added that venue's Gil Sorrento S. a month later before finishing a distant second to champion elect Songbird (Medaglia d'Oro) in the GI Del Mar Debutante in September. **Cont. p3**

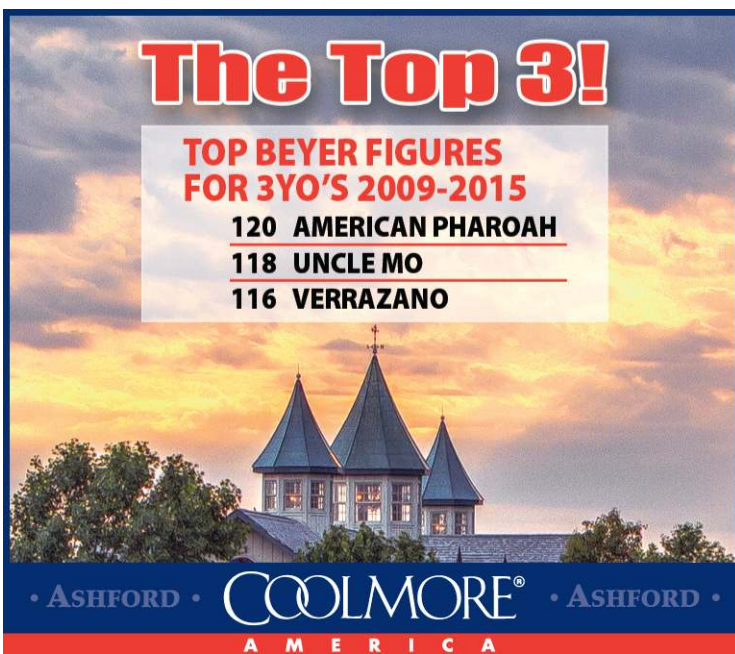

She switched to the sod successfully for Santa Anita's Oct. 10 Surfer Girl S., besting a group that included Lucky Folie (Distorted Humor), who took the aforementioned Desi Arnaz over four Starlet entrants. The other Hollendorfer trainee, Surfside Tiara, took Santa Anita's Anoakia S. sprinting two back Nov. 15.

"He needed some extra time and they did a great job with him. Since then he hasn't missed a day and he's improved every day."

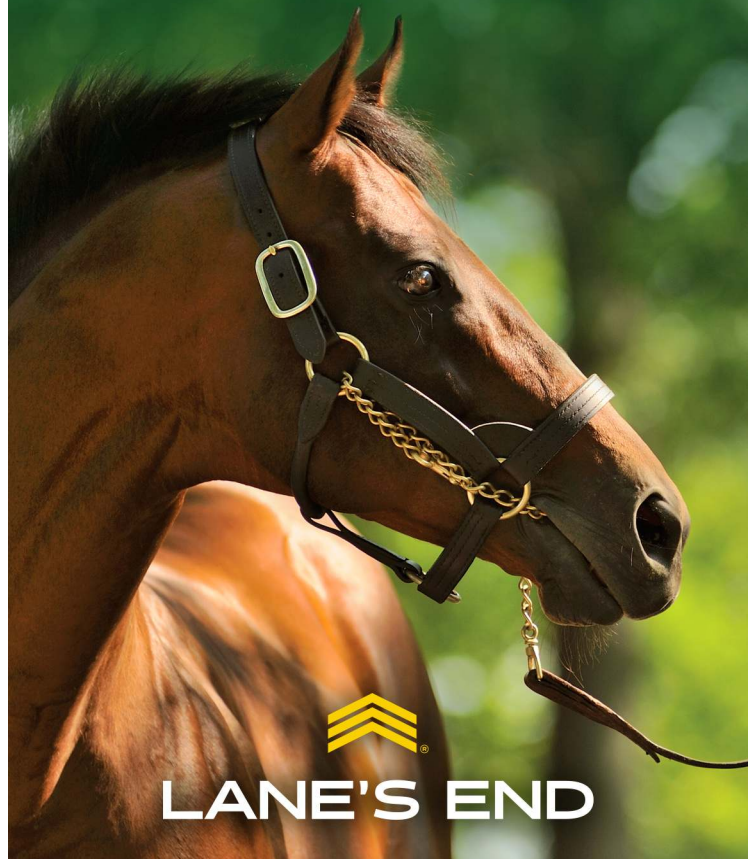

I was very intrigued when I read the title of the Op/Ed written by Bill Finley about the effect of Lasix on the racing performance of Effinex in the Dec. 2 issue of the *TDN* ([click here](#)). Mr. Finley chronicles the story of a horse who broke his maiden in state-bred company after a relatively lackluster debut. Effinex then won his next race, at long odds, in an entry level restricted allowance race, only to then be badly beaten in his very next start, the GI Wood Memorial. Effinex did beat his odds, running third to last, despite being the longest shot on the board. The relatively inexperienced Effinex found himself pitted against some of the best horses in the country in his fourth start and still outran his odds. **Cont. p6**

Many a good horse has been intimidated to the point of no return under similar circumstances, however then trainer David Smith and owner Tri-Bone Stables had many reasons to be proud of their horse.

After his next start, another New York-bred allowance race, Effinex ran third, again surpassing his odds, beaten 6 1/4 lengths. It is at this point that Dr. Cohen, out of frustration, put his talented colt on Lasix, despite his deep-seated conviction, not shared by most horsemen, that Lasix is not good for horses. In the horse's next start, on Lasix, he finishes 7th, beaten 12 3/4 lengths in the Easy Goer, again, running now with Lasix. The next race was a New York restricted allowance race, where Effinex finished sixth by 12 lengths, still on Lasix. As I now closely examine the past performances of Effinex, I begin to wonder "how many races on Lasix are required?" before one sees the proclaimed performance enhancing effect that Lasix is said to have in this article.

As I see it, former trainer David Smith did a nice job with the horse. Effinex outran his odds in most of his starts under Smith's care. However, the true change of course for Effinex came with a shift to conditioner Jimmy Jerkens after a two month layup.

The question then becomes whether the improvement in performance was related to the freshening or the factors that attended the trainer change. Dr. Cohen himself stated that horsemanship, along with the later maturing pedigree we find in Effinex as well as the infrastructure that accompanied the move, certainly helped take Effinex to the next level.

I found this Op-Ed seemed to reflect only a portion of the story revolving around Effinex and Dr. Cohen's claims against Lasix. Certainly we know there are those with an anti-Lasix agenda who want to show support for their position. However, those of us who see Lasix as a therapeutic medication could be misled if only reading the surface of this article as it relates to the past performances of Effinex. My hope would be to have articles written that support either side of the Lasix issue, not be written in such a way that cause either supportive group to be intentionally or non-intentionally misled. I believe there is ample scientific research readily available that shows unequivocally that the majority of horses bleed from the lungs during exercise, and that Lasix is the only scientifically proven treatment for this condition. On the other hand, there is a paucity of evidence to support an opinion that Lasix is performance enhancing beyond this anti-bleeding effect.

As I have found in others, I find this Op-Ed is missing the key ingredient we all must demand for medication debates within horse racing: proven facts, not anecdotal evidence. Every article, including Letters To the Editor and Op-Eds, should be accurately researched and thus conveyed fairly before being released to main stream media. **Cont. p7**

**A BRUSH WITH GREATNESS**

by Robert Clark (Artist) and Edward L. Bowen (Author)

Perhaps not surprisingly, the majority of books celebrating Thoroughbred legends invariably invite the reader to "rank" equine athletes gracing the pages across the timeline of racing history. It is only natural to dream up scenarios in which the all-time greats meet each other in a hypothetical race, as we have seen in the past six months with speculation as to how American Pharoah stacks up against Triple Crown heroes of the past.

Yet there is something to be said for cultivating an appreciation of each Thoroughbred within its own context, resisting the urge to make comparisons and instead focusing on what made each racehorse exceptional. This is precisely what A Brush with Greatness achieves: it is an ode to the greatest equines to grace the racetrack since 2000, brought to life through the paintings of noted artist Robert Clark, the essays of Eclipse Award-winning writer/historian Edward L. Bowen and,

perhaps most extraordinarily, reminiscences from owners, trainers, and jockeys that Clark has connected with over the years. Clark and Bowen mean to recognize not only Thoroughbreds who left a long-lasting legacy after a successful or "great" career, but also those who achieved "a brush with greatness" on a single day, simultaneously reminding devotees why they love the game and capturing the imagination of prospective new fans.

"Each of these horses achieved a pinnacle in the sport; some for a brief moment, while others carved out their own timeless legend," Clark and Bowen propose. "Instead of dwelling on what could have been, we prefer to remember these horses with a proper sense of deserved reverence."

At its heart, A Brush with Greatness is a book of memories, meticulously gathered and shared in an appealing format. The double-page spreads would look very different--and would be far less compelling--if each horse was represented by a photo and a mere recitation of facts and statistics. 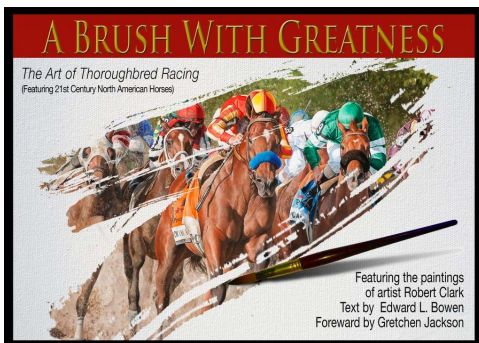
Not long after opening this 176-page hardcover, readers encounter the most recent and likely most-celebrated addition to the pantheon of Thoroughbred greats: 2015 Triple Crown victor American Pharoah. But three page-turns later, readers can recall or familiarize themselves with the career of the gritty gelding Awesome Gem--particularly his pinnacle victory as a 7-year-old in the 2010 GI Hollywood Gold Cup. While Awesome Gem began his career months after others from his crop already completed the Triple Crown events, the venerable competitor went on to make 52 starts, racing until the age of nine. Undoubtedly, his brush with greatness was just one moment in the long-lasting artistry of his career and life story.

"Longevity surrounded Awesome Gem's career," writes Bowen. "At the racetrack, he authored his own form of longevity, competing from the age of three through nine, winning six graded races and earning \$2,881,370. As impressive as this escutcheon is, however, it pales in comparison to the longevity which produced him. Awesome Gem was a product of Runnymede Farm, a Paris, KY, nursery which the Daughters of the American Revolution recognized as the oldest continuously active Thoroughbred farm in the state."

In a similar fashion, Clark depicts Awesome Gem in full flight to the wire in the Gold Cup, motoring to the greatest triumph of his career with David Flores in the irons, donning the familiar silks of West Point Thoroughbreds. Indeed, all of Clark's paintings are meticulously rendered; a glancing eye may believe that they are in fact

photographs. But upon a closer look, it becomes apparent that Clark is well-acquainted, not only with the physical conformation of the equine in motion, but also with the colorful nuances of the racetrack environment--from exacta pools on the toteboard to shadows cast by a shrubby row in the infield. The physical articulation of each horse is augmented by Bowen's finely tuned colloquial recollections, remarkably repeated with the same attention to detail for each of the book's 79 entries.

Text-box reminiscences from owners, trainers, and jockeys further distinguish A Brush with Greatness from other offerings in its genre.

Alternately factual, amusing, and deeply moving, these anecdotes contribute to a better understanding of what made each horse's career--or a particular moment in that career--special. The reflections of Gretchen Jackson--who also penned a foreword for the book--on the career and tragic ending of her colt Barbaro are particularly poignant, allowing readers to view the beloved Derby winner from the perspective of an adoring owner.

In his introduction, Clark aptly asserts that "the timing of this book could not be more perfect," in a year when racegoers and industry stalwarts alike witnessed a remarkable piece of history created by American Pharoah. At a moment in time when the urge to create a hierarchy of the greatest Thoroughbreds is running high, A Brush with Greatness proffers a refreshing, utterly beguiling alternative history, one that conveys deep admiration and respect for both the breed and the individual horses who create memories that will not soon be forgotten.
