

MOYGLARE HKIR INTEREST RUNS DEEP

The late Walter Haefner would love this.

The founding father of Moyglare Stud, whose daughter Eva now runs the show, would enjoy seeing the stud's homebred 'TDN Rising Star' **Free Eagle (Ire)** (High Chaparral {Ire}) take his place in the G1 Longines Hong Kong Cup. Perhaps even more than that, he would relish the opportunity of seeing Free Eagle run against a horse like **Designs on Rome (Ire)** (Holy Roman Emperor {Ire}), the defending Cup winner, bred by the Haefner family, sold on the cheap and exported to Hong Kong where he has achieved super-stardom. Additionally, the stud bred **Rich Tapestry (Ire)** (Holy Roman Emperor {Ire}), the American Grade I winner who is set to contest the G1 Longines Hong Kong Sprint.

Free Eagle is the latest in a long list of horses owned, bred or raced by Moyglare to take their show overseas. Eva Haefner is happy to perpetuate the tradition begun by her late father, who raced the likes of 1990 GI Belmont S. upsetter **Go and Go (Ire)** and **Media Puzzle (Theatrical {Ire})**, victorious in the 2002 G1 Melbourne Cup. Moyglare Stud is also part of the fabric of the Hong Kong International Races, as their homebred **Additional Risk (Ire)** (Ahonoora {GB}) was trained by Dermot Weld to win the inaugural running of the 1400-meter Hong Kong International Bowl--the precursor of the Hong Kong Mile--in 1991. **Cont. p2**

US VERSUS THEM IN HONG KONG

Try as they might, some classy horses have come to Sha Tin Racecourse over the past several years to tackle the locals in the Longines Hong Kong International Races, but have found the sledding to be increasingly tough. Over the last 10 years, Hong Kong-based runners have won more than half of the races and that percentage looks even better if filtering out the results of the G1 Longines Hong Kong Vase, which has gone to European representatives in nine of the last 10 years, including **Flintshire (GB)** (Dansili {GB}) last December. **Designs on Rome (Ire)** (Holy Roman Emperor {GB}) made it five straight for the home team in the G1 Longines Hong Kong Cup with a stirring, last-jump victory over **Military Attack (Ire)** (Oratorio {Ire}), while Hong Kong has not lost the G1 Longines Hong Kong Mile since Hat Trick (Jpn) (Sunday Silence) won it for Japan in 2005. **Cont. p3**

“It’s great to be in Hong Kong, this is really what it’s for,” commented Moyglare’s Fiona Craig. “I’m very sorry Eva is not here, but she was tied up with business.”

Eva Haefner is very much cut from the same cloth as her father, Craig explained.

“They were very close and she’s following on from him,” she explained. “[Eva’s] father was a real internationalist. He was one of the first ones. He sent mares to America long before most people did, and a lot of people don’t know that. He sent mares over to go to Sea-Bird and Ribot at the end of the 1960s and he loved international racing. That was the reason for horses running in places like Australia and America and even Hong Kong.”

The current flagship horse for Moyglare, Free Eagle will take plenty of beating. So impressive in winning the G1 Prince of Wales’s S. at Royal Ascot in June first off an eight-month layoff ([video](#)), he squared off next with Golden Horn (GB) (Cape Cross {Ire}) in a highly controversial running of the G1 Irish Champion S. around Leopardstown. Nearly knocked over by the G1 Investec Derby winner 150 yards from the line ([video](#)), Free Eagle was third, leaving connections to lament what may have been.

“I’m not sure what anybody could say about that. It was very unfortunate,” Craig recounted. “We’ll never know win, lose or draw. One thing we know about that horse is he wouldn’t have gone down without a fight. If you were going to be beat, it would have been lovely to be beat a short head or a neck. The moment I saw it, I started screaming at the TV monitor, ‘Be second, be second.’

But it totally stopped him in his stride and I think talking to [jockey Pat Smullen] afterwards, he said it could have been much worse, because they almost clipped heels. It felt for us that we were rather dismissed

afterwards, but that’s how it goes. Frustrating.”

It was another quite luckless run for Free Eagle when sixth behind his Irish Champion conqueror in the G1 Prix de l’Arc de Triomphe Oct. 4 ([video](#)) and when the decision was taken to make the trip to Hong Kong, it was always going to be the Cup and not the 2400-meter Vase. **Cont. p3**

“It’s impossible to judge anything off the Arc, because it was such an oddly run race,” submitted Craig. “We had another barging match. I’m not quite convinced he stays a mile and a half and, in against true mile-and-a-half horses, that trip out here could be tough. It really came down to ‘do we experiment again or not or do we go with something where we’re fairly confident?’ Eva is very much involved in [these decisions] and that was very much her feeling. She was more confident about the horse at a mile and a quarter, which I think we all are.”

While Free Eagle will carry the Moyglare black-and-white in the Cup, the team will have a rooting interest in defending Cup hero Designs on Rome.

“He was a big, tall, leggy yearling and we put him through the Goffs sale, nobody bid on him in the ring,” Craig said. “Two parties came along afterwards, one of which was Pat Flynn, and we got €10,500 for him and off he went. I think probably if we’d kept him, I’m not sure he would have been a 2-year-old and besides, the mare kept throwing these big, backwards

horses. It shows you that you just don’t know. I don’t think Pat ever bought him thinking that he’d turn into something and the rest is history. Hats off to the team out here. John Moore has done a fantastic job and Joao Moreira rides him like a dream. When this horse starts coming, he starts coming. He’s going to be no slouch in this race.”

Craig and the Moyglare braintrust are taking very little for granted Sunday afternoon.

“The horse hasn’t run since October, he’s come a long, long way across the world,” she offered. “Not to mention all the other horses like Military Attack (Ire) (Oratorio {Ire}). I think it’s a very competitive race. Sure, we’re up there on ratings, but I don’t know if horses actually know what their ratings are. He’s in good order, but he’s going to have to run the race of his life. If he runs the race of his life, he has the ability to win it. Are we confident? I wouldn’t say we’re confident, no. I’d say we’re hopeful.”

Free Eagle retires to the Irish National Stud for 2016, and Craig believes he’s got a big chance to be a success.

“He’s a lovely horse. He’s always had great quality,” Craig opined. “He has a very nicely balanced pedigree, he’s got a lot of American speed on the bottom line, because this traces back to Talking Picture, who Mr. Haefner bought 30 years ago.

She continued, “It’s an interesting side to bring into the Irish breeding. He’s a beautiful horse to look at, he’s an absolute gentleman. He’s also got a very good turn of foot. That first day at Leopardstown [a 5 1/2-length victory Aug. 15, 2013], he really amazed us all. We went in that day fairly confident he’d win, but I’m not sure any of us actually realized he was going to win like a star. So many people have come up after and said, ‘I want to breed to that horse, he’s got a bit of brilliance.’ We’ve got a wonderful syndicate, he’ll get very good mares and we’ll do what we can to make him a stallion. Because he deserves to be.”

But first things first, as Free Eagle will look to go out on top Sunday afternoon. And perhaps Designs on Rome second?

“A winner in our colors would be fantastic. That would be the main aim, but it would be wonderful to see a Moyglare breeding exacta,” Craig admitted. “To be honest, Mr. Haefner would get the biggest kick out of that. He was, in his heart, a breeder. He enjoyed racing, but his main focus was producing a racehorse. Eva is also like that, but she loves the racing. So to be honest, she’s doing both levels of that. God willing, both horses at the front of the field nearing the end, that’s all we can hope for.”

Able Friend (Aus) (Shamardal) looks to make it 10 in a row Sunday. Three of the five most recent runnings of the G1 Longines Hong Kong Sprint have been annexed by foreign raiders, but the trophy has remained in Hong Kong seven of the last 10 years overall. A total of 53 horses--24 locals and potentially 29 from America, Australia, England, France, Germany and Japan--will load the stalls this afternoon for four races that should offer the best betting opportunities seen at the meeting in some time.

LONGINES HONG KONG CUP

THE PICK: Japanese-based horses annexed the Cup on two occasions when it was run over 1800 meters from 1988-1998, Fujiyama Kenzan (Jpn) at odds of 37-1 in 1995 and Midnight Bet at 42-1 in 1998. Agnes Digital (Crafty Prospector) was one of a

remarkable three Japanese winners at the 2001 International meeting, taking the cup at just under 3-1 and a trio of runners from that country will attempt to add to that total Sunday. **Staphanos (Jpn)** (Deep Impact {Jpn}) has touted himself this week at

Longines Hong Kong Cup: The Pick cont.

The mount of leading rider Keita Tosaki, the attractive bay colt kicked off his 4-year-old season with a good third behind **Nuovo Record (Jpn)** (Heart's Cry {Jpn}) in the G2 Nakayama Kinen, then came to Hong Kong for the G1 Audemars Piguet Queen Elizabeth II Cup, finishing runner-up to **Blazing Speed (GB)** (Dylan Thomas {Jpn}) and just ahead of **Criterion (NZ)** (Sebring {Aus}). He ran on late to be seventh to A Shin Hikari (Jpn) (Deep Impact {Jpn}) in the G2 Mainichi Okan Oct. 11 and exits a runner-up effort in the G1 Tenno Sho (Autumn), in which he covered ground, but hit the line hard to miss by a half-length. The form of that race has held up, as Shonan Pandora (Jpn) (Deep Impact {Jpn}), fourth on that occasion, returned to win the G1 Japan Cup with Tenno Sho victor Lovely Day (Jpn) (King Kamehameha {Jpn}) third.

THE CONTENDERS: Free Eagle (Ire) (High Chaparral {Ire})

arguably has a class advantage on this group as he prepares to face the starter one final time. The G1 Prince of Wales's S. hero first off an eight-month break in June, he will turn back to his preferred trip for the Cup, having finished a troubled sixth to

Golden Horn (GB) (Cape Cross {Ire}) in the G1 Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe Oct. 4. Perhaps no horse has looked as good on track this week as Criterion. Despite a long and long-winded campaign, the chestnut, third in this last year, appears very well within himself and, save for being over

the top, looks a top-three chance. If there is a question mark, it is how he will handle the cutback from the 3200 meters of the G1 Melbourne Cup, in which he was third, to the 10 furlongs of this test. Craig Williams has the call. Blazing Speed was forced to give Military Attack five pounds under the conditions of the G2 Jockey Club Cup 22 days ago and led late before the former Hong Kong Horse of the Year worked over the top of him. He can easily turn the tables at set weights.

CAVEAT EMPTOR: Designs on Rome will look to join California Memory (Highest Honor {Fr}) as repeat winners of the Cup, but he is having just his second run off an injury-enforced absence, is drawn wide and is likely to be short of his best.

LOOKING FOR A ROUGHIE?: Nuovo Record will try to join the likes of Alexander Goldrun (Ire), Pride (Fr) and Snow Fairy (Ire), who beat the boys in the Cup. She has form through the Japan Cup winner, having finished second to her in the G2 Sankei Sho All Comers S. two back and exits a near miss in the G1 QE II Cup at Kyoto last start. She's drawn well and Ryan Moore hops in the saddle.

LONGINES HONG KONG MILE

THE PICK: Though he took something of a shock defeat at the hands of **Beauty Flame (Ire)** (Footstepsinthesand {GB}) in the G2 Jockey Club Mile over this course and distance Nov. 22, **Able Friend (Aus)** (Shamardal) gives every indication that was a one-off result as he shoots to defend his title in the event he absolutely dominated 12 months ago. Simply brilliant from November 2014 through May of this year, the big chestnut came undone on the undulations at Royal Ascot, but returned to action with an impossible defeat of Gold-Fun (Ire) (Le Vie Dei Colori {GB}) under top weight of 133 pounds in the 1200-meter Premier Bowl H. Oct. 25. While hinting at first that he was a victim of circumstance in the JC Mile last time, trainer John Moore and jockey Joao Moreira came around to the argument that the first-up run had left Able Friend flat--a bounce, if you will. But his work down the riverside Thursday and surrounding gallops have Moore whipping out the 'cherry ripe' analysis and it's all systems go Sunday afternoon.

THE CONTENDERS: While it is true that Able Friend is a deserving favorite, it is also factual to suggest that the group that has assembled to take him on is much deeper than what he faced last year. **Maurice (Jpn)** (Screen Hero {Jpn})—pronounced ‘Morris’—carries a five-length winning skein into this event. The neck winner of the G1 Yasuda Kinen June 7, Kazumi Yoshida’s representative was forced to endure a wide trip in the G1 Mile Championship Nov. 22, but nevertheless came with a run in the stretch and went on to defeat **Fiero (Jpn)** (Deep Impact {Jpn}) by a cozy 1 1/4 lengths. Ryan Moore only adds to the intrigue.

Esoterique (Ire) (Danehill Dancer {Ire}), trained by the legendary Andre Fabre, looks to return to the form which saw her finish a length second to Solow (Ire) (Singspiel {Ire}) in the G1 Queen Anne S. prior to victories in the G1 Jacques le Marois and G1 Sun Chariot S. The ground was likely against her last time when only seventh at 4-1 in the GI Breeders’ Cup Mile, but she’ll get much sounder conditions underfoot here. **Mondialiste (Ire)** (Galileo {Ire}) can certainly run a place here at monster odds if his long campaign hasn’t exacted its toll. The GI Woodbine Mile hero was behind a wall of horses last time at Keeneland, but exploded onto the scene late to finish a clear second.

LOOKING FOR A ROUGHIE?: No 3-year-old has been able to shake up the Mile since Moyglare Stud’s Additional Risk (Ire) took the inaugural incantation—the International Bowl—in 1991, but many on-scene observers are very much drawn to Japan’s **Danon Platina (Jpn)** (Deep Impact {Jpn}). Last year’s champion 2-year-old colt, he was a fish out of water when 11th to Duramente (Jpn) (King Kamehameha {Jpn}) in the 2000-meter G1 Satsuki Sho, but rattled home to best HK Cup aspirant Satono Aladdin (Jpn) (Deep Impact {Jpn}) by a neck in the G2 Fuji S. Oct. 24. He missed the Mile Championship with a stone bruise, but he’s got a turn of foot that can see him shoot past many of his rivals late.

LONGINES HONG KONG SPRINT

THE PICK: After finishing a bang-up second to the currently sidelined Aerovelocitv (NZ) (Pins {Aus}) as just a 3-year-old in 2014, **Peniaphobia (Ire)** (Dandy Man {Ire}) is set to really and truly announce his presence on the worldwide stage as a sprinter of importance. Narrowly second to **Sole Power (GB)** (Kyllachy {GB}) and just ahead of **Green Mask (Mizzen Mast)** in the G1 Al Quoz Sprint up Meydan’s 1000-meter straight last March, Peniaphobia was likely in need of the effort when an even seventh behind **Not Listenin’tome (Aus)** (Dylan Thomas {Ire}) under top weight in the National Day Cup H. Oct. 1, but improved for that effort and a stretchout to

1200 meters to be third to Able Friend in the Premier Bowl Oct. 25. Drawn wide last time in the G2 Jockey Club Sprint Nov. 22, he was roused along to lead on a fast pace, but was out of fuel in the final 100 meters and was overhauled by **Gold-Fun (Ire)** (Le Vie Dei Colori {GB}). Race tactics will prove key here from the outside draw. With speed underneath him in the form of GI Breeders’ Cup Turf Sprint hero **Mongolian Saturday** (Any Given Saturday) and from Japan’s **Mikki Isle (Jpn)** (Deep Impact {Jpn}), there is the argument to be made that he could be best served by taking back and coming with a run. Conversely, if Mongolian Saturday burns away from the stalls and Mikki Isle is left, he could sit a soft trip outside a front-runner who is likely to come back to the field.

Longines Hong Kong Sprint cont.

THE CONTENDERS: The job that trainer Richard Gibson has done with Gold-Fun has been remarkable, as he has rebranded him as one of the best short-trackers locally after finishing runner-up in the last two renewals of the Hong Kong Mile. Victimized by the stunning performance from old foe Able Friend in the Premier Bowl, the chestnut took advantage of the hot pace in the JC Sprint and charged home to best Peniaphobia as the even-money choice. Not Listenin'tome is drawn well and, if he can deliver one of his 'A' efforts, would not be a total surprise. He won the National Day Cup down the straight, but was a wide-trip sixth in the Premier Bowl. He attended that quick tempo last time in the JC Sprint before hanging on for third and could get the box seat this time around. **Straight Girl (Jpn)** (Fuji Kiseki {Jpn}) bids farewell to the races as she tries to improve off her third last year at 54-1. The race should be run to suit her off-pace style.

CAVEAT EMPTOR: There is much buzz about **Strathmore (Aus)** (Fastnet Rock {Aus}), as he struck some trouble in the Jockey Club Sprint, then rattled home to finish sixth, just over two lengths behind Gold-Fun. He could be the one in 2016, but at potentially single digits, he's under the odds.

LOOKING FOR A ROUGHIE: At the time of this writing, Green Mask was better than 80-1. There are enough red flags, to be sure: the right-handed bend, the foot bruise, a question about his class. He did go very close to Sole Power and Peniaphobia in the AI Quoz and may have been second with a better trip in the Breeders' Cup. He may flounder around there Sunday, but he seems useable, especially on the bottom of gimmicks.

LONGINES HONG KONG VASE

THE PICK: Similar to the Mile, **Flintshire (GB)** (Dansili {GB}) will have to deal with a field that is deeper and more talented than the one that he had to deal with last year. Remarkably, the homebred was winning his first Group 1 when defeating the now-retired Willie Cazals (Ire) (Aussie Rules) last season, but he has since added to the total, as Vincent Cheminaud partnered

with him to win the GI Sword Dancer Invitational S. in handy fashion at Saratoga Aug. 29. Runner-up to Golden Horn (GB) (Cape Cross {Ire}) in the Arc, connections decided a run in the GI Breeders' Cup Turf was risky owing to the ground and were

originally pointing for the G1 Japan Cup. He later was withdrawn from consideration for the Tokyo feature and should be the one they have to beat, albeit at perhaps fatter odds than 12 months back.

THE CONTENDERS: **Cannock Chase** (Lemon Drop Kid) was seventh behind Free Eagle (Ire) (High Chaparral {Ire}) in the G1 Prince of Wales's S. at Royal Ascot, but was runner-up in the G3 Winter Hill S. Aug. 29 prior to an impressive victory in the Listed Godolphin S. Sept. 25. Sent off the 15-4 favorite in the GI Canadian International S. Oct. 25, he weaved his way between rivals to score by 1 1/2 lengths, and a repeat of that effort would make him competitive. On the negative side, Ryan

the G3 Gordon S. over this distance before cutting back to a mile and a quarter and making all the running in a driving rainstorm in the GI Secretariat S. Aug. 15. Fifth to Golden Horn in the Irish Champion S., he was a decent third in G1 Cox Plate Oct. 24.

Preferment (NZ) (Zabeel {NZ}) becomes the first Hong Kong runner for Sydney's leading trainer Chris Waller. The 4-year-old, winner of last year's G1 Victoria Derby, came from well back to win the G1 Turnbull S. over 2000 meters Oct. 4. **Cont. p7**

Longines Hong Kong Vase: The Contenders cont.

He’s been well beaten in the Cox Plate and in the Melbourne Cup in his last two runs, but rates a look on the cutback to the metric mile and a half. **Helene Happy Star (Ire)** (Zamindar), the former Barley Mow, is the ride of Joao Moreira and merits a chance off his form over the distance. Winner of the Queen Mother Memorial Cup May 9, he charged home but just failed to catch loose-on-the-lead **Helene Super Star** (War Front) in the G1 Champions and Chater Cup three weeks later. The bay was most recently fourth as the somewhat surprising favorite in the Jockey Club Cup, and the added real estate works in his favor here.

LOOKING FOR A ROUGHIE?: Hard to believe that a former winner of this could be the right longshot, but **Dominant (Ire)** (Cacique {Ire}) has that look. A horse that improves with his racing, the 7-year-old was down the field at any price in his first two runs this preparation over 1400 and 1600 meters, respectively, but he perked up in the Jockey Club Cup going the 2000 meters, covering his final half-mile in :45.17. Zac Purton, who was in the saddle two years ago, returns at the controls here.

OLDIES, BUT GOODIES

Together, they are a combined 25 years old, have made 169 starts for 48 wins, 15 at Group 1 level. They have earned nearly \$20 million between them and, assuming they all make their respective races this weekend, will have made 16 appearances at the Longines Hong Kong International Races--17 if you’re willing to forgive a scratch at the 11th hour of one of the horses.

The grizzled vets in question are the 9-year-old **Cirrus des Aigles (Fr)** (Even Top {Ire}), back to where it all started in 2009 in the G1 Longines Hong Kong Vase; and the 8-year-old G1 Longines Hong Kong Sprint duo of **Sole Power (GB)** (Kyllachy {GB}) and **Lucky Nine (Ire)** (Dubawi {Ire}). And, like the Eveready bunny, they just keep on keeping on.

As a relatively unexposed sophomore back in 2009, trainer Corine Barande-Barbe put Cirrus des Aigles on the plane to Hong

Kong for the first time to run in the Vase. He was fifth that day, not beaten all that far, behind His Highness the Aga Khan’s Daryakana (Fr) (Selkirk). Some 54 starts and seven top-level successes later, the spritely bay will contest the Vase, after four straight appearances

in the Cup, including a close fourth behind Designs on Rome at the ripe old age of eight in 2014. Among those he’ll square off with? Daryakana’s 3-year-old son Dariyan (Fr) (Shamardal). Now, at the even-riper age of nine, there is no apparent end in sight for Cirrus des Aigles, who has looked very much at home this week.

“It’s very nice to be back, I feel no pressure,” Barande-Barbe said shortly after her arrival into Hong Kong. “He’s just like a dream. With Cirrus, everything looks like a dream. He seems very happy to be here, so as long as he’s happy, we come, and I think it will be good to run at this longer distance on such ground.”

A seven-time Group 1 winner at five, six, eight and, courtesy of a successful defense of his Prix Ganay title, at nine, Cirrus des Aigles has seen this campaign disrupted by injury and exits a respectable fourth in the G1 Prix Royal-Oak over 3100 meters Oct. 25.

“He couldn’t go as he wanted in his last two or three races. In Ireland [for the G1 Irish Champion S.], it was the best field of the year and he was coming back from a stop, so that was a bit too hard. But he’s going up and up now, so I’m optimistic,” Barande-Barbe commented. **Cont. p8**

So much so that a 10-year-old campaign is not out of the question.

“If he’s well, he’ll go to Dubai and my dream would be to win in Dubai and stop there,” Barande-Barbe said. “But at the same time, I would like him to tell me when to stop, because it’s very hard to retire a horse when he’s 10 and when people look after him all the day long. Sometimes they get depressed, so it’s better and much easier. And at the moment, there’s no need to stop. I’m used to having horses until 10 or so. Sometimes when you put them in the country they get depressed and you have to bring them back. But I am very happy to be here.”

For trainer Eddie Lynam and those around him, Sole Power holds an equally special place.

“He’ll be nine next month, it’s his fourth Hong Kong Sprint, but he thinks he’s two or three, he’s fairly fresh and full of beans,” the conditioner commented, adding that the

8-year-old, who defeated Peniaphobia (Ire) (Dandy Man {Ire}) at his fifth try in the G1 Al Quoz Sprint this past March, is here on his merits.

“It’s no secret that he’s a better horse at 1000 than he is at 1200,” said Lynam. “But we’re hanging onto the basis that he was second in it before [behind Lord Kanaloa in 2013], he put in a good run in the [G1] July Cup [fourth, beaten under two lengths by Muhaarar], we love coming here, the owners love it, it’s a great trip and if you’re invited, why not turn up?”

Lynam thinks these older geldings are good for the game.

“He’s has a huge following, he’s a very popular horse,” he confirmed. “The first time it really struck me was when he was at Newmarket a few years ago. He was running in the [G3] Palace House S., which is a 1000-meter sprint on Guineas day. He walked into the parade ring and the fans went nuts for him. He was voted Horse of the Year in Ireland last year. I think because this is such a big business, most fillies and colts are retired to stud prematurely for financial gain.

Lynam added, “When old soldiers like him and horses like [Cirrus des Aigles and Lucky Nine] are still running around, people get attached to them, a bit like national hunt racing, and they hold on to them. For people like us, he’s like part of the family. He’s brought us all over the world. He’s been to Dubai for the Al Quoz Sprint five times, he’s here for the fourth time. Throw in a few Royal Ascots—he’s really been all over the place.”

Many horses don’t make it to a 6-year-old season. Lucky Nine is making an appearance in the Hong Kong Sprint for the sixth consecutive season.

Victorious in his second attempt in the race in 2011, Lucky Nine is a two-time winner of the now-defunct G1 KrisFlyer International Sprint in Singapore, went this close to winning the G1 Manikato S. in Melbourne in 2013, has placed in the G1 Dubai Golden Shaheen and turned in some luckless efforts in some of Japan’s top sprints.

Of the trio, he seems closest to the end of the road, but he has shown improvement in his two most recent starts, including a fourth in the G2 Jockey Club Sprint, where he closed to within 1 1/4 lengths of Gold-Fun (Ire) (Le Vie Dei Colori {GB}) at the wire.

None of the trio is a likely winner Sunday afternoon. But regardless of the outcome, these cagey veterans have done the sport proud down the years.

FROM THE VET’S DESK

Green Mask (Mizzen Mast), who has been under something of an injury cloud since bruising a foot during fast work this past Monday, was given a gentle gallop by visiting jockey Florent Geroux after schooling in the Sha Tin paddock Saturday morning. The 4-year-old, most recently third to Mongolian Saturday (Any Given Saturday) in the G1 Breeders’ Cup Turf Sprint Oct. 31, was found to be lame in his left front the following morning and spent the next couple of days in the international stables. He returned to trackwork Thursday, and after being observed by HKJC vets Saturday morning, has been green-lighted to run in the G1 Longines Hong Kong Sprint. The news was less positive for **Gailo Chop (Fr)** (Deportivo {GB}), who made an appearance over the dirt track Saturday morning, but was later off in his right hind leg. He will be examined again Sunday morning, with a determination on race fitness to be delivered at that stage. Winner of the G2 La Coupe Sept. 18, Gailo Chop was eighth in the G1 Cox Plate ahead of a narrow success in the G1 Mackinnon S. Nov. 1.

Argentine standout **Hi Happy (Arg)** (Pure Prize), kept his unbeaten record intact and clearly stamped himself as South America's leading 3-year-old colt and Argentina's Horse of the Year as he closed out the season with a bang in winning the continent's most prestigious race, the Gran Premio Carlos Pellegrini on Saturday at San Isidro.

Confidently ridden and allowed to settled in midpack through the final turn by regular pilot Altair Domingos, the Pure Prize colt blew by the inherit leader **Es Despues (Arg)** and burst away in midstretch to a commanding lead to score by 1 1/2 lengths. The win represented the fourth Group 1 victory of the season for the Haras La Providencia

With the win in South America's richest race, the undefeated South American champ earned also an exclusive berth to possibly participate in the famous G1 King George VI & Queen Elizabeth S. at Ascot next season. The 1 1/2-mile turf race is a Breeders' Cup qualifying race for the 2016 G1 Longines Breeders' Cup Turf.

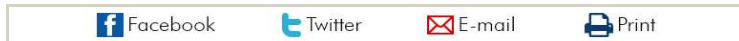

STARS LINE UP FOR D'AMATO BARN

Street Fancy (Street Sense)--a late-running third in the seven-furlong Desi Arnaz S. at Del Mar last out Nov. 15--unleashed a powerful rally in deep stretch beneath Hall of Fame jockey Mike Smith to defeat **Stays in Vegas** (City Zip) by a length at odds of 6-1 in the GI Starlet S. at Los Alamitos. It was another three lengths back to longshot **Sutton's Smile** (Paddy O'Prado) in third.

Steadied shortly after the break from her inside draw, Street Fancy was settled nicely while saving ground in sixth as stablemates **Pretty N Cool** (Scat Daddy) and **Treasuring** (Smart Strike) showed the way through fractions of :22.84 and :46.73. The bay still had her work cut out for her as Pretty N Cool seized command turning for home. That rival appeared to be going well in midstretch, but quickly faltered and opened the door for a powerful rail run from Street Fancy, who won impressively going away. Slightly favored **Pacific Heat** (Unusual Heat) tired to finish a disappointing eighth after sitting a stalking trip.

"She showed a lot of tenacity and fight and [jockey] Mike [Smith] says we still haven't gotten to the bottom of her yet," said trainer Phil D'Amato, the former assistant to the late Mike Mitchell, who saddled the first- and third-place finishers. "She can be a little temperamental at times and we've been working a lot with her to get her to relax and slowly but surely she's been coming along. It's been three different distances at three different tracks and today we got the big one. She's a big, giant scopey filly. She looks twice the size of anybody else in this field.

"I knew she wanted to go two turns. I was just hoping today was the day she showed she wanted it and she did."

Street Fancy, a narrow debut winner going 5 1/2 furlongs at Santa Anita Oct. 18, RNA'd on four separate occasions, most recently earlier this year for \$400,000 at the Barretts Select 2-year old sale. Her second dam is a half-sister to GI Kentucky Derby hero Fusaichi Pegasus (Mr.

Prospector). Her stakes-winning dam Bold Angel (Cat Thief) had a Blame filly in 2014. The Agave Racing Stable colorbearer was bred in Kentucky by Hunter Valley Farm. **Cont. p3**

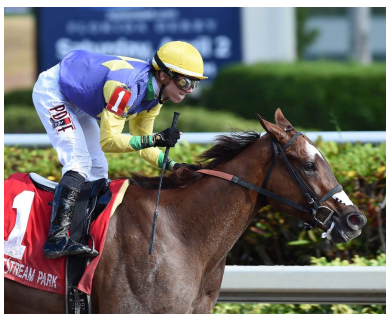

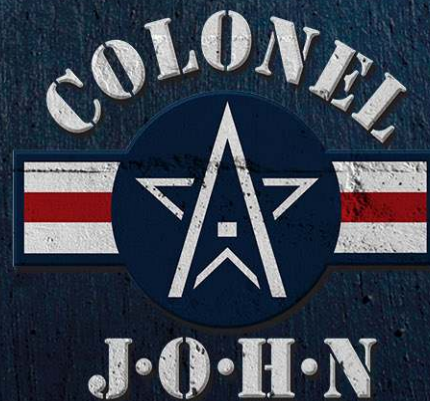

"He rode him with confidence. He felt he was on the best horse and rode him accordingly. Mario's ridden well at this track.
