

SPANNING THE GLOBE

They've come literally from all over the planet for a shot at their piece of the pie during Saturday's \$15 million Dubai World Cup program under the lights at Nad al Sheba. They're here from the U.S. and Japan, from Hong Kong and Singapore, Australia and South Africa, France and Germany. But some of the stiffest competition comes from the host country, mainly in the form of G1 Arc de Triomphe winner and G1 Breeders' Cup Classic runner-up **Sakhee** (Bahri), who figures an odds-on choice in the \$6 million G1 World Cup. "He is doing really good, he came back fine and I am happy with him," trainer Saeed bin Suroor told *PA Sport* yesterday following a five-furlong work for his stable star. "He is in great form, he has come out of his last race well and he will improve. He's 100 percent and he's ready to run." He'll need to be just that to fend off the in-form Japanese invader **Agnes Digital** (Crafty Prospector), who enters off back-to-back Group 1 wins overseas. An impressive winner of the G1 Hong Kong Cup in December on the turf, the five-year-old transferred his form to the dirt with a win in the G1 February S. at Tokyo Feb. 17. Godolphin will send three other representatives postward, including **Street Cry (Ire)** (Machiavellian), the 4-1 second choice according to British bookmakers Victor Chandler. The four-year-old will be ridden by jockey Jerry Bailey, looking for his fourth win in the big race. "Jerry is one of the best riders in the world and has ridden for us in the past," bin Suroor told *Gulf News*. "He was an obvious choice for Saturday's big race day. He's ridden over 5,000 winners and it's great that he has accepted to ride for us in the World Cup." The Boys in Blue will also be represented by **Best of the Bests (Ire)** (Machiavellian), available at 16-1, and **State Shinto** (Pleasant Colony), an outsider at 50-1. For the first time in the seven-year history of the event, the United States will not have an official entrant in the race, with the sale of **Western Pride** (Way West {Fr}) earlier this week to Saudi Arabian interests. A treble Derby winner in the U.S. a year ago, the dark bay went over the \$1 million mark in career earnings with a gritty second-place finish in the G1 Santa Anita H. at the World Cup distance Mar. 2 and is a threat to lead from gate to wire. A Stellar Undercard

With its \$6 million purse, the World Cup garners much of the attention, but the five races leading up to the main event are by no means void of interest. Following his thrilling victory in the Duty Free a year ago, globetrotting **Jim and Tonic (Fr)** (Double Bed {Fr}) is back for another crack, but will be asked to deal with formidable competition, including G1 Breeders' Cup Mile hero **Val Royal (Fr)** (Royal Academy), GIII Fort Lauderdale H. winner **Del Mar Show** (Theatrical {Ire}) and top European miler **Noverre** (Rahy). The G1 Dubai Golden Shaheen represents America's best chance for victory, with a quintet of capable sprinters. The remarkable **Xtra**

Heat (Dixieland Heat), second to Squirtle Squirt in the G1 Breeders' Cup Sprint and third in the G1 DeFrancis Dash, has returned to win her two starts this year, totting 128 pounds en route to a 2 3/4-length win in the GII Barbara Fritchie H. Feb. 16. The diminutive bay filly, 11 for 13 at six furlongs, will have to deal with defending champion **Caller**

One (Phone Trick), **Men's Exclusive** (Exclusive Ribot), second last year, and New Orleans-based speedball **Bonapaw** (Sabona). Sheikh Hamdan al Maktoum's **Nayef** (Gulch), winner last season of the G1 Dubai Champion S., will take his place in the G1 Dubai Sheema Classic, passing on an opportunity to contest the World Cup. The four-year-old could go off a narrow favorite over **Tobougg (Ire)** (Barathea {Ire}), runner-up to Agnes Digital in the G1 Hong Kong Cup and **Ekraar** (Red Ransom), second by a head in the G1 Hong Kong Vase. **Festival of Light** (A.P. Indy), upset winner of the 2001 Godolphin Mile, is also back to defend his title and is joined in the field by stablemates **Curule** (Go For Gin) second a year ago, and fourth-placed **China Visit** (Red Ransom). The G2 UAE Derby features GII Norfolk S. hero **Essence of Dubai** (Pulpit) and the up-and-coming **State City** (Carson City).

And Now....The Weather**

Despite earlier forecasts of dry and sunny weather during the second half of the week, another rainstorm could hit Dubai today. Officials at Nad al Sheba are preparing for the eventuality, with Emirates Racing Association Racing Secretary Kevin Greely telling *Gulf News online*, "The track remained sealed during the rainstorm both on Monday evening, Monday night and early Tuesday morning. It's normal procedure with a dirt track--you keep it sealed if you have impending inclement weather. But we opened up the outside half of the racetrack yesterday morning for the horses to train and the reports we received from some of the riders was that the track was in perfect condition. It was beautiful this morning. Regarding the turf track the rains will certainly help improve the condition provide it's not too much."

Burn Baby Burn

Second in the GI Florida Derby last Saturday, Kinsman Stable's **Blue Burner** (French Deputy) may point for the GI Wood Memorial at Aqueduct Apr. 13, according to Kinsman farm manager Mike Boyd. "The Steinbrenners were all pleased with Blue Burner's performance," Boyd said. "It appears that he came back okay--we watched him jog back after the race--and he didn't miss an oat Saturday night. He seems to be moving on and showing improvement. Naturally, the owners will be keeping one eye open to see where everybody else is going, but if all goes well with the colt, the Wood Memorial might possibly be a good spot for him." Blue Burner captured both of his starts last summer at Monmouth in stretch-running fashion and added a Gulfstream allowance victory in similar style Jan. 3. The homebred chestnut finished third to Booklet and Harlan's Holiday in his stakes debut, the GI Fountain of Youth S. Feb. 16.

A P VALENTINE RETIRED FROM STUD From its base in Ireland, Coolmore Stud yesterday announced that **A P Valentine** (A.P. Indy--Twenty Eight Carat, by Alydar) has been officially retired from stud duties due to fertility problems. A short statement released by the farm confirmed that "A P Valentine's fertility has not improved. Those mares first thought in foal early days have in fact proved to be not in foal. The horse has failed to impregnate any mares to date and has been retired from stud duties." Shortly after winning the GI Champagne S. in 2000, Coolmore purchased the breeding rights to the stallion for a reported \$16 million, but the bay was sidelined following his last-of-14 finish in that year's Breeders' Cup Juvenile. Despite winning just one of nine starts last season, the Nick Zito trainee posted consecutive runner-up finishes to Point Given in the GI Preakness S. and GI Belmont S., but ended his career with a sixth-place finish in the GI Jockey Club Gold Cup last October. He was to enter stud at Ashford Stud in Kentucky for a first-year fee of \$15,000.

AMERICANS POSSIBLE FOR GUINEAS While **Johannesburg** (Hennessy) and **Hawk Wing** (Woodman) head the 93 entries remaining in the £300,000 G1 Sagitta 2000 Guineas at Newmarket May 4, it was the presence of two American-trained colts that caused a stir yesterday. Maryland-based trainer Michael Dickinson is considering sending over **Mr O'Brien (Ire)** (Mukaddamah) for the Newmarket Classic. "He'll have to win his next race [at Keeneland in early April] if he's to justify a crack at the Guineas," the conditioner said yesterday of the chestnut, who has won his two starts over the Fair Grounds turf by a combined 10 1/2 lengths. Also entered is **Minerveeni** (Afternoon Deelites) from David Vivian's Gulfstream Park stable. With seven entries from France and 15 from the Godolphin stable, the list has a considerable international feel. Newmarket's Clerk of the Course, Michael Prosser, said yesterday, "It's a great entry, nicely up on the 86 put in the race last year and with the added interest of two American entries as well as seven from France. It would be quite a story if, while Aidan O'Brien is trying to secure Europe's first ever GI Kentucky Derby [May 4] victory with Johannesburg, Mr O'Brien was endeavoring to land a first ever 2000 Guineas for the USA!"

TOP BROODMARES LOST Two of the top broodmares owned by Stonerside Stables died earlier this month shortly after producing foals. The 17-year-old mare **Banker's Lady** (Nijinsky II--Impetuous Gal, by Briartic) was euthanized after foaling a chestnut filly by Coronado's Quest Mar. 4. The foal has been placed on a nurse mare and is doing fine. Racing in the colors of Edward A. Cox, Jr., Banker's Lady captured eight of her 10 career starts, including the GI Ladies H., the GI Top Flight H. and the GI Shuvee H., and earned \$594,297. As a broodmare, the chestnut produced Banker's Gold (Forty Niner), a multiple graded-stakes winner of \$461,420 and a freshman sire of 2002. Her most recent foal to reach the races is the three-year-old filly Sweet Charity (A.P. Indy), who broke her maiden by 5 1/4 lengths at Aqueduct Feb. 24. Banker's Lady was purchased by Stonerside at the Cox Dispersal at the Keeneland November sale in 1998 for \$1.15 million in foal to A.P. Indy. **Halory** (Halo--Cold Reply, by Northern Dancer) died Mar. 14 of a ruptured uterine artery the day after foaling a colt from the final crop of Kentucky Derby winner Unbridled. The foal has been placed with a nurse mare and is also doing well. The 18-year-old mare was represented by no fewer than four graded-stakes winners, including Halory Hunter (Jade Hunter), winner of the GII Toyota Blue Grass S, GIII Delaware Oaks heroine Brushed Halory (Broad Brush), Prory (Procida) and Key Lory (Key to the Mint). Her Storm Cat colt of 2000 was purchased by Demi O'Byrne at last year's Keeneland September sale for \$6.4 million, the highest-priced yearling of 2001. The colt, recently named Van Nistelrooy, is in training with Aidan O'Brien in Ireland. Stonerside has since repurchased a minor interest in the chestnut and has also retained the mare's 2001, a filly by Deputy Minister. Both mares were buried in their entirety, next to the graves of Rhythmical, Treizieme and Single Flower.

The 2000 Preakness hero, **Red Bullet** (Unbridled) lived up to his name Tuesday morning, drilling five furlongs in a bullet 1:00 3/5 at Gulfstream. "It was an excellent work," said trainer Joe Orseno. "I couldn't be happier. Jerry Bailey will be back aboard him." The five-year-old chestnut crossed the line second last out in the GI Donn H. Feb. 9, but was disqualified to fourth for interference on the far turn. "There was no doubt in my mind that he was the best horse in the Donn," Orseno added. "To overcome the bad start he had, then he had that trouble on the backstretch and he still almost won the race." Donn winner **Mongoose** (Broad Brush) went three-quarters in 1:16 at Payson Park Monday, while defending champ **Sir Bear** (Sir Leon) coasted through a five-furlong breeze in 1:05 1/5 at Calder yesterday morning.

6th-GPX, \$34,000, Alw, 4yo/up, 9fT, 1:52 3/5, fm. SPEED OF LIGHT (IRE) (c, 4, Spectrum {Ire}--Phylella {Ire} {MSP}, by Persian Bold {Ire}), a half to Reunion (Ire) (Be My Guest), GSW-Eng, last raced in England at Wolverhampton in early December, breaking his maiden by two lengths after nine winless efforts. After shipping to the States and adding Lasix for his American bow in this one, the bay made it an international two in a row, scoring as an 18-1 longshot. The gelding was bumped at the start and shuffled to the back of the pack, but gradually moved into contention with a wide bid after the half, then got up in the last sixteenth to prevail by a length.
