WAR EMBLEM SET FOR DEPARTURE

War Emblem (Our Emblem), winner of the Kentucky Derby and Preakness S. before an eighth-place finish last time in the Belmont S., is scheduled to depart Sunday for trainer Bob Baffert's Santa Anita base in Southern California, according to *The Blood-Horse*. "He looks good," Baffert told *The Blood-Horse* from Churchill Downs yesterday. "He seemed a little tired when we got here yesterday with all the heat and humidity, but he was happy today, which is very encouraging." Baffert indicated that he would probably give the colt at least a week off before sending him back to the track.

EMIRATES RACING UNVEILS DUBAI CARNIVAL

The Emirates Racing Association yesterday announced that, beginning in 2003, there will be a seven-week series of top-class racing leading up to the Dubai World Cup. Dubbed the Dubai Racing Carnival, the event, which will feature one program a week starting with the second round of the Maktoum Challenge Feb. 13 and culminating with the Dubai World Cup card Mar. 29, will be conducted jointly by the Dubai Racing Club and the Dubai World Cup. Each of the seven Carnival cards will include a stakes race, while the Mar. 8 program, to be called Super Saturday, will offer seven stakes. The 2003 season in Dubai will also include the introduction of the Dubai Triple Crown. The first leg of the Triple Crown is the Feb. 13 G3 UAE 2000 Guineas at 1600 meters, the second is the Mar. 8 Al Bastikiya at 1800 meters and the third is the Mar. 29 G2 UAE Derby. "For seven weeks, the very best horses will be on show and we hope to attract as much international competition as we can to Nad Al Sheba," said Dubai Racing Club Chairman Al Khamis Al Jafleh. Added Emirates Racing Association Chief Executive Les Benton, "The programming has only been changed marginally--for example, all of the races on Super Saturday were held within six days of each other in 2002. We decided to put them all together to make a complete lead-up to the Dubai World Cup. That way, any trainer or owner wishing to secure experience or a lead-up run for the horse prior to the Dubai World Cup can do so in a race over the same distance and under the same conditions." A total of \$18 million in purses will be offered during the Carnival.

Chaparral As High As Galileo:

High Chaparral (Ire) (Sadler's Wells) achieved the same official rating in winning Saturday's Epsom Derby as Galileo (Ire) last year, according to Nigel Gray, senior handicapper at the British Horseracing Board (BHB). In beating stable companion **Hawk Wing** (Woodman) by two lengths, High Chaparral reached a mark of 126

pounds, with the runner-up on 123 pounds. "High Chaparral is where Galileo was at this stage of his career," said Gray. Trainer Aidan O'Brien's colts were 12 lengths clear of **Moon Ballad (Ire)** (Singspiel {Ire}) and **Jelani (Ire)** (Darshaan {GB}), who had previously finished first and fifth, respectively, in the G2 Dante S. at York May 15. However, Gray sounded a note of caution, "I think the feature of the Epsom meeting were the wide margins between horses on easy ground, so it's difficult to be dogmatic and quantify how good High Chaparral is. You either take the view that Jelani has improved to within a pound of Moon Ballad or you believe that he has the superior staying power. It was slightly bemusing how a few horses ran below form and expectations. I prefer to take a slightly cautious approach early in the season."

Gray is hoping that a clash with **Sulamani (Ire)** (Hernando {Fr}) is in the cards for High Chaparral in the G1 Irish Derby at The Curragh June 30. Pascal Bary's colt was, according to Gray, "particularly impressive" in winning the G1 Prix du Jockey Club (French Derby) at Chantilly June 2 by 1 1/2 lengths from **Act One (GB)** (In The Wings {GB}). **Kazzia (Ger)** (Zinaad {Ger}), meanwhile, put up the best performance since that of Lady Carla (GB) in 1996 in winning Friday's G1 Epsom Oaks. In beating **Quarter Moon (Ire)** (Sadler's Wells) by a half-length, she achieved a rating of 120 pounds, with Gray commenting, "In a good year in the King George she would have to run in excess of 120 pounds, but that performance does put her in with a shout in the St Leger."

PEDIGREE INSIGHTS

PREMIUM BLEND

I hate to say "I told you so" (not really), but last week's European classics reminded me of a piece I wrote for *TDN* early last September, after Quarter Moon had won the G1 Moyglare Stud S.

"When I tell you that Sadler's Wells' latest collection of juveniles contains 13 youngsters out of Shirley Heights mares and another eight out of mares by Shirley Heights' son Darshaan," I pointed out, "you will appreciate that crossing the perennial champion sire with mares from the Mill Reef line has become one of the most popular 'nicks' in European breeding."

The enormous potential of this cross was underlined several more times during the rest of the 2001 season. Milan--out of a Darshaan mare--won the G1 St Leger and finished second in the Breeders' Cup Turf; Moon Queen--out of a Shirley Heights mare--won the G2 Prix de Royallieu; and High Chaparral--out of a Darshaan mare--won the G1 Racing Post Trophy.

Then, in the space of three days last week, Quarter Moon failed by only half-length to catch Kazzia in the Oaks, the pair 14 lengths clear of the rest; High Chaparral used his undoubted stamina to repel Hawk Wing's challenge in the Derby; and Dance Routine, a Sadler's Wells filly out of a Shirley Heights mare, ran on strongly to take second place in the French Oaks. For good measure, Beat Hollow, a Sadler's Wells horse whose second dam is a Mill Reef mare, strengthened his claims to being the best turf horse in the U.S. with an admirable win in the GI Manhattan H.

It's a worthwhile exercise to remind you of Sadler's Wells' statistics with mares by Mill Reef, his son Shirley Heights and Darshaan. The 38 foals, aged three and above, out of daughters of Mill Reef include eight stakes winners (21 percent), but only one of the 38 has won a Group race, so this has to be considered the weakest link in this very strong chain.

Shirley Heights mares have 49 representatives by Sadler's Wells and among them are 11 stakes winners (22 percent). As many as eight of the 11, including In The Wings, Moon Queen, Dance Routine, Hunting Hawk and St Expedit, are Group winners, representing a whacking 16 percent, and there can't be many crosses as dependable as this. Incidentally, this total of Group winners may rise higher still, because the 49 also include Starbourne, this year's Irish 1000 Guineas third who ran fourth in Friday's Oaks.

Not even Shirley Heights, though, can match the exceptional record being built up by Sadler's Wells' partnership with daughters of Darshaan. The first 24 animals bred this way include 10 stakes winners (42 percent), with seven of them (29 percent) winning at Group level, including Islington, the filly who was favorite for the Oaks until the ground turned against her. No fewer than five of the Group winners (21 percent) have won a Group 1. Those five include Edadiyla (Irish Oaks and French St Leger), High Chaparral (Derby) and Milan (St Leger), as well as the Oaks second Quarter Moon, so this is truly a classic partnership.

Be warned, there are roughly another 20 youngsters among Saddler's Wells' juvenile crop out of mares by Mill Reef, Shirley Heights and Darshaan, with sisters to Quarter Moon and Islington among the Darshaan band.

Nothing has happened in the last nine months to make me change my mind about why this particular blend is proving so effective. I remain unconvinced that it is because it produces two lines to that outstanding broodmare Lalun, through her sons Never Bend and Bold Reason. If this were the explanation, Sadler's Wells' results with Mill Reef mares would surely be superior to those achieved with mares by his son and grandson, but that definitely isn't so.

The truth is that mares by Mill Reef, Shirley Heights and Darshaan have done very well with several stallions from the Northern Dancer line. Because Mill Reef, Shirley Heights and Darshaan are strong influences for stamina--they all won the Derby in England or France--their daughters appreciate the element of speed possessed by so many members of the Northern Dancer male line.

It could be argued that many of the good winners sired by Sadler's Wells from Mill Reef line mares are no better than they should be--they are by an exceptional sire out of mares which were themselves very good performers. However, that argument doesn't hold good for Quarter Moon and High Chaparral, who so nearly pulled off the Derby and Oaks double. Quarter Moon's dam, Jude, failed to reach the first three in four starts, while High Chaparral's dam, Kasora, never raced before being sold by her breeder, the Aga Khan, for 270,000 guineas as a three-year-old.

Bearing in mind that Kasora's price made her the third highest-priced filly at Tattersalls' 1996 December Sales, she clearly has a first-rate pedigree. Her family came into the Aga Khan's studs via her second dam, the 1969 French 1000 Guineas winner Koblenza, who was one of the mares purchased from Madame Francois Dupre 25 years ago. These Dupre mares have supplied the Aga Khan with many good winners and Koblenza played her part. Her son Karkour had been sold by the time he won the G1 Prix du Cadran over 2 ½ miles, but her Kris filly Kozana carried the Aga's colors with great distinction.

Kozana showed great versatility with a win in the G2 Prix de Malleret over 1 ¼ miles. Dropped back to a mile for the G1 Prix du Moulin, she found only Rousillon too good for her and then, stepped up to 1 ½ miles for the Arc a month later where she finished third, beaten only around two lengths by Sagace and Rainbow Quest.

Kozana appeared to have nearly everything one hopes for in a potential broodmare, including an outcross pedigree. Surprisingly, she has failed to produce a Group winner, but her daughters Khanata (by Riverman) and Kotama (by Shahrastani) both became Listed winners by taking trials for the Irish 1000 Guineas. Two of Kozana's sons also earned black type, with Khoraz (by The Minstrel) being Group 1 placed in Ireland, Italy and the United States, and Kasora's brother Korasoun (by Darshaan) showing decent form at around 1 ¼ miles in Ireland.

Considering that the Aga Khan has won the Derby with four times since 1980, he was no doubt far from heart-broken that the latest winner is out of a mare he sold. The Aga Khan--together with all the other large-scale owner-breeders--faces a constant battle to keep the size of his broodmare band in check and to balance the books. He has to keep selling and Kasora's achievement can only stimulate demand for any future mares and fillies from his studs.

He has received six-figure sums for three of Kozana's daughters, Kotama, Kasora and Koniya. The Aga's only remaining daughters of Kozana are Khanata and the four-year-old Kozmina, an unraced daughter of none other than Sadler's Wells. The Aga also has a couple of Kozana's grand daughters, one of which has a juvenile filly by Darshaan.

Coincidentally, Michael Tabor and Sue Magnier had to pay only 270,000 guineas to acquire High Chaparral at the Houghton Sales, where they also splashed out 3,400,000 guineas for Diaghilev, a Sadler's Wells colt out of another mare culled from the Aga Khan's studs. Although Diaghilev ran respectably in the French Derby, the cheaper colt now has much the bigger price tag.

Pletcher Duo Work at Belmont:

Invisible Ink (Thunder Gulch) and **Graeme Hall** (Dehere) were both out at Belmont Park Sunday for trainer Todd Pletcher, preparing for their upcoming weekend starts. Invisible Ink, runner up to Monarchs in last year's Kentucky Derby, drilled five panels in 1:01 4/5 in what should be his final major work for this Saturday's \$750,000 GI Stephen Foster H. at Churchill Downs. The four-year-old, who won a Churchill optional claimer last time, will be making only his third start of 2002 in the Foster. Multiple graded stakes winner Graeme Hall, sixth last time in the GI Oaklawn H. Apr. 6, proved a whisker faster than his stable mate, reeling off five furlongs in 1:01 2/5 while aiming for his upcoming start in Saturday's GII Brooklyn H. at Belmont.
