SUPER DAY FOR SOUMILLON

The sun was shining on Christophe Soumillon at Longchamp yesterday. The 21-year-old jockey rode four winners on the card, taking the G1 Gainsborough Poule d'Essai des Poulains with **Clodovil (Ire)** (Danehill) and the G1 Gainsborough Poule d'Essai des Pouliches with **Musical Chimes** (In Excess {Ire}) for trainer Andre Fabre, and the G1 Prix Lupin with the Aga Khan's **Dalakhani (Ire)** (Darshaan {GB}). "Today at Longchamp has been wonderful because it is one of the most important meetings at the track," Soumillon told *Racing Post*. "I landed five races at Saint-Cloud two years ago, but this is a much bigger occasion. When I started the day, I knew that some success was in the cards. I was fairly confident that Dalakhani and Clodovil had good chances. Musical Chimes became the icing on the cake."

Top Vil...

Clodovil got the full Soumillon treatment as he stylishly accounted for **Catcher In The Rye (Ire)** (Danehill) to win the French 2000 Guineas by a length. Giving Fabre his fourth win in the Classic, the unbeaten colt also provided the ultimate tribute to the memory of his late owner/breeder Jean-Luc Lagardere. Settled in a stalking fifth in the early stages, the grey received the necessary cover as **Dalcassian (Ire)** (Sadler's Wells) ensured a respectable tempo. Edged out to challenge while travelling strongly inside the final quarter, he seized the race with 1 1/2 furlongs remaining, quickening clear as Catcher In The Rye came with a determined run from the rear. Twice successful at Saint-Cloud as a juvenile, Clodovil was kept from the season's championship events by a series of setbacks, but he returned with an impressive conditions score at this track Apr. 6. He booked his place in the Classic line-up when taking the Apr. 20 G3 Prix de Fontainebleau. "It came as no surprise to see him win like that, as the way he quickened off a slow early pace last time marked him as exceptional," said Roland de Longevialle, racing manager to the Lagardere family. "Andre Fabre told Madame Lagardere before the race that if he won easily, he would go for the G1 St James's Palace S. [at Royal Ascot June 17]." Catcher in the Rye may head for the G1 Irish 2000 Guineas May 24. (*French 1000 Guineas, p2*)

SHINE AGAIN BRILLIANT IN GENUINE RISK

The ultra-consistent **Shine Again** (Wild Again) extended her winning streak to three with a convincing score in yesterday's GII Genuine Risk H. at Belmont Park. In the money in 10 of her most recent starts, including the seven-furlong GI Ballerina H. at Saratoga Aug. 25 and the GII First Flight H. at Aqueduct Oct. 26, the dark bay was a 3/4-length winner in her only prior 2003 appearance, a six-furlong allowance event at Aqueduct Apr. 19. Sent off the 2-1 second choice this time, the six-year-old settled last of four through quick early fractions, took over approaching the top of the stretch and cruised clear late to win unchallenged. According to winning trainer Allen Jerkens, the mare will make her next start in the GII Vagrancy H. at Belmont June 8. In an unfortunate turn of events, multiple stakes winner **A New Twist** (Storm Cat) flipped over in the paddock prior to her scheduled start and fractured her skull. She died instantly.

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Sign of the Chimes...

In a race packed with incident, man-of-the-moment Soumillon came out smelling of roses once again as he delivered Gainsborough's **Musical Chimes** with a perfectly timed run to edge out **Maiden Tower (GB)** (Groom Dancer) in the French 1000 Guineas. Completing a phenomenal Group 1 treble, the Belgian-born rider was content to distance the sponsors' homebred from the early pace, holding the vital inside pitch towards the rear. His sky-high confidence transmitted itself to his partner as he daringly picked his way through the field, avoiding the trouble that claimed the chance of favourite **Acago** (Royal Academy) inside the final quarter. As **Etoile Montante** (Miswaki) veered away from the long-time leader Maiden Tower in the closing stages, she opened the door for Musical Chimes, whose momentum took her past the ultra-game front runner in the final 100 yards. "She won like a nice filly," Soumillon said. "I know she only won a 'D' race last time, but she has a lot of quality and is a tribute to Andre Fabre. She quickened really impressively and I thought I had the race won a furlong down." He added, "It is a dream to be playing in the top league like this. I wouldn't trade my place for anything in the world."

On The Improve...

There was little in her performance when fourth behind Maiden Tower in the Listed Prix la Camargo at Saint-Cloud Mar. 25 to suggest that Musical Chimes would provide Andre Fabre with his second renewal of this Classic. However, her subsequent course and distance conditions score Apr. 20 had suggested she was improving at the right time. "She's a big filly who is just coming to herself," Fabre told *Racing Post*. "She is very athletic and has always shown a lot, but has obviously needed more time." Gainsborough Stud's Michael Goodbody added, "She's the sort of filly who could race well on the dirt in the States. Her granddam [It's in the Air] was a champion, and her sire In Excess was very good on the dirt, too." Storming Home (GB), who also has It's in the Air as his second dam, won the Jim Murray H. at the Hollywood turf yesterday.

Acago Stopped...

Favoured Acago, trained by Criquelette Head-Maarek, was bothered badly by a chain of events that began when Head-Maarek's other runner, Etoile Montante, veered left as they raced toward the finish. The resulting traffic jam caused **Londonnetdotcom (Ire)** (Night Shift) to put the squeeze on Acago, but the filly finished well once clear to be sixth.

Dalakhani, who provided conditioner Alain de Royer-Dupre with his win in the Lupin, settled on the rail behind early leader Balestrini (Ire) (Danehill) before quickening at the end of the false straight. The grey stole a decisive advantage over Alberto Giacometti when moved out to assume command with 400 yards remaining. Despite the efforts of Super Celebre, who threatened briefly late, Dalakhani settled the result in comfortable fashion. His Highness the Aga Khan's colt was taking his record to a perfect five-from-five, having won the G3 Prix des Chenes at this track in September and G1 Criterium International at Saint-Cloud in November, before returning to win the G2 Prix Greffulhe on his sophomore debut here last time Apr. 20. The half brother to Daylami (Ire) will now bid to emulate his sire's success in the 1984 G1 Prix du Jockey-Club (French Derby). "Once again he has confirmed what a good colt he is," said HH the Aga Khan. "Every time he wins, there is something left as he does the minimum. We can be very hopeful looking to the Jockey-Club [at Chantilly June 1]." He will face a rematch in that Classic with Super Celebre, whose trainer Elie Lellouche said, "I think he ran a great race, as this was a good test. Maybe he was too far off the pace and had too much to do, but the Jockey-Club is only three weeks away and [jockey] Dominique [Boeuf] did not want to kill him. He will stay a mile-and-a-half and we will definitely be there." Rakti returned to the happy hunting ground of his success in last year's G1 Derby Italiano to add this prestigious contest to his portfolio. In the process, the Gary Tanaka colorbearer provided conditioner Michael Jarvis with his third renewal after Bob Back first plundered the prize in 1985 and Polar Prince (Ire) followed up in 1998. Rakti, who was withdrawn before the start of the G1 Champion S. at Newmarket in October, was transferred to Jarvis' Newmarket base after his dismal showing when 10th behind Sunstrach (Ire) (Polar Falcon) in the G1 Premio Roma in November. Settled in mid-division by Philip Robinson throughout the early stages, he loomed upsides Sunstrach with 2 1/2 furlongs remaining before being asked to stretch his rivals. Grabbing the rail against which he fought off Ballingarry (Ire) in the Classic last May, he showed the same gritty determination to hold off the challenge of Tigertail and Thierry Gillet in the drive to the line. THE INDUSTRY AT WORK: LEGISLATION

The Senate Finance Committee has approved legislation to repeal a 30% tax on winning wagers placed by foreigners through U.S. pari-mutuel pools. The bill, an amendment to the President's tax-cut bill, now moves to the full Senate for a vote. An NTRA-commissioned study by National Economic Research Associates estimates that the repeal will produce \$32 million annually in the form of increased U.S. economic activity, income tax revenue and revenues to U.S. racing.

Her dam **Diasprina (Ger)** was a smart juvenile whose other progeny include the Group-winning sprinter **Desidera (Ire)**, one of Rottgen's most traditional dam lines. Alamshar came through this test despite the injury scares of the past week and confirmed himself as a major contender for the G1 **Epsom Derby** June 7 in the process. As he had in the G3 **Ballysax S.** at this track Apr. 13, he was made to work for his success by another **Ballydoyle** second string. Whereas on that occasion he gave **Balestrini (Ire)** too much rope and was beaten a half length in a tactical affair, **Johnny Murtagh** was intent on keeping **The Great Gatsby** in his sights this time. That proved a wise decision as the long-time leader powered clear at the top of the straight, appearing to slip the favourite. Not to be denied, **Alamshar** responded to pressure to get on top with 175 yards remaining before outbattling his game rival in the closing stages. **Brian Boru**, racing under a five-pound penalty on his return, stayed on in the slipstream of the winner to get the better of **Napper Tandy (Ire)** (**Spectrum {Ire}**) in the final strides. Winning trainer **John Oxx** said, "I came here half-expecting to get beaten, so I was happy enough with that. He's done it well, but idled in front and he'd have to improve on that to win an **Epsom Derby**, but he's very relaxed and it is highly likely he'll get the extra quarter of a mile there." **Aidan O'Brien** said of **Brian Boru**, "I don't think he ran a bad race at all, as he was fresh and keen and they went a bit slow. Cat Belling used her battle-hardened experience to edge out Flamelet in this trial for the G1 Irish 1000 Guineas at The Curragh May 25. That Classic is on the agenda for the game filly provided the rain that fell in time at Leopardstown yesterday is as plentiful at the Kildare venue in three weeks' time. Cat Belling, described by her trainer Kevin Prendergast as "a big old filly" who "looks like a chaser," is a regular at that track, where she showed her best juvenile form in finishing sixth in the G1 Moyglare Stud S. in September. She was a fair fourth behind Walayef in the G3 Athasi S. there last time Apr. 27, but enjoyed her own moment of glory as she ground out her first stakes success under Pat Shanahan here, denying the late thrust of Flamelet and Johnny Murtagh. "She has been working well and the ground was in her favour," her conditioner said. "We might as well go for the Irish Guineas with her, but she needs ease in the ground."

"He's not lame or 'off' or anything," said Baffert. "I could run him in the Preakness, but I don't want to do it..He'll heal himself up." Second in the GI Santa Anita Derby April 5, the colt won two of five starts for earnings of \$161,191. He is likely to make his next start in the GIII Affirmed H. at Hollywood Park June 22.

Kissin Saint and Alysweep Preakness Bound

Kissin Saint (Kissin Kris) and **Alysweep** (End Sweep) are both confirmed starters for Saturday's GI Preakness S. Third to Empire Maker and Funny Cide in the GI Wood Memorial Apr. 12, Kissin Saint was originally considered for the GII Peter Pan S. May 24, but trainer Lisa Lewis decided that the Peter Karche-owned colt was better suited to Pimlico's classic. "The Peter Pan is a one-turn race and I think two turns is a better fit for him," said Lewis, who sent the colt out for a five-furlong work at Belmont Park Sunday morning. "Richie [Migliore] said a horse couldn't work better," recalled Lewis. "All I could see with him was him galloping out and he looked pretty strong. He did it the right way." Also added to the list of contenders the Preakness is GIII Gotham S. winner Alysweep. The colt ran second last time in the May 3 GIII Withers S. at Belmont.

Frankel Duo Work at Belmont

Trainer Bobby Frankel sent out Kentucky Derby third-place finisher **Peace Rules** (Jules) and GIII Derby Trial S. winner **Midas Eyes** (Touch Gold) for an early morning work Sunday, but clockers were unable to record their respective moves because of thick fog covering the track. Peace Rules was scheduled to go a half-mile while Midas Eyes was listed for a six-furlong work. Frankel, who will send Peace Rules to the GI Preakness S. at Pimlico May 17 for a rematch with Funny Cide, commented yesterday, "From what I saw of his work, he looked good. He'll ship to Maryland on either Wednesday or Thursday." Stablemate Midas Eyes looks likely to make his next start in the GI Metropolitan H. at Belmont Park May 26.

SECOND PICTURE MAY CLEAR SANTOS Although it has so far received less attention than the Getty Images photograph that gave rise to the *Miami Herald* story that suggested jockey Jose Santos might have been carrying an illegal object in his right hand during the May 4 Kentucky Derby, a second photograph ran in several newspapers yesterday that clearly shows there is nothing in Santos' hand other than his whip. In a photo taken by the Associated Press at virtually the same time as the Getty Images' picture, but from a slightly different angle, the teal silks worn by Jerry Bailey on Empire Maker can clearly be seen through the gap in Santos' fingers. The picture leaves little doubt that he was not carrying a battery. The *Herald* seemed to be hedging a bit in a story that ran Sunday, careful pointing out that the black image that appears to be in Santos' hand in the Getty photo could be almost anything. "It is unclear whether the dark image in Santos' hand is a shadow, the green background of the silks worn by jockey Jerry Bailey aboard beaten favorite Empire Maker or something else," the story read. In a related development, the New York jockey colony released a statement yesterday in support of Santos. It was written by Richard Migliore. "We all wanted to come out to support Jose," the statement read. "We feel the charges that have come up are unfounded and unfair. It has tarnished a great ride by a great horse in a great race. All of us who have ridden with Jose and have known him for years know these charges couldn't be anything further from the truth. We feel terrible about the allegations. To have this put on America's race...is a shame. It was Jose's day and now it's been unfairly dragged through the mud."

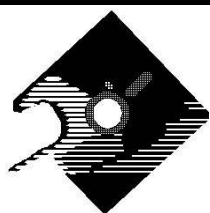
