HAVEN SENT

Indian Haven (GB) (Indian Ridge {Ire}), sent off at odds of 8-1, relished the rain-softened ground as he outbattled **France (GB)** (Desert Prince {Ire}) to record a length score in yesterday's G1 Entenmann's Irish 2000

Guineas at The Curragh. After he was denied a clear run on two occasions in the hurly-burly of the G1 2000 Guineas at Newmarket May 3, his connections maintained that he was far better than his 14th placing in that Classic. They duly put their money where their mouths

were earlier in the week to stump up the €40,000 supplementary fee, giving the chestnut another chance of justifying their faith in his ability. "He definitely would have won the English Guineas, but I got knocked over four times and virtually pulled him up," jockey John Egan explained. Indian Haven was always travelling strongly in mid-division throughout the steady early exchanges at The Curragh, but more hard-luck stories looked on the cards as his jockey searched for racing room inside the final half mile. But he found a gap approaching the eighth pole and grabbed the lead before asserting in the drive to the line. "I honestly thought we would win today," Egan said, adding, "The only Classic I had won before was in India and it has always been a dream to win one here. I did not want to get there too soon, but when I asked him to quicken he picked up just as well as I knew he would." Ambitiously campaigned at two, Indian Haven finished sixth in the G2 Gimcrack S. in August and fifth in the G2 Champagne S. the following month before trailing **Tout Seul (Ire)** (Ali-Royal {Ire}) when 15th in the G1 Dewhurst S. in October. He suggested he could be a major force with the winter behind him when winning the Listed European Free H. Apr. 16 in impressive fashion prior to his luckless run last time. Trainer Paul D'Arcy, also enjoying his first Classic success, commented, "I've no doubt had the starting stalls been positioned in the centre of the track at Newmarket we would have finished in the first four. He will probably go for the G1 St James's Palace S. [at Royal Ascot June 17]." *Chart, p3*

MILADY IS A CHAMP

Reigning Horse of the Year **Azeri** (Jade Hunter) cruised to her ninth straight victory yesterday when defending her title in the G1 Milady Breeders' Cup H. at Hollywood Park. The chestnut had shown her mettle by running down a very game Take Charge Lady in the final strides to repeat in the G1 Apple Blossom H. Apr. 5. Sent off as the 1-5 chalk this time, Azeri raced in second early, but moved up to put a head in front entering the far turn. **Affluent** (Affirmed) was in striking position at that point before jockey Mike Smith pushed the button aboard Azeri. The big mare left Affluent toiling, then maintained a safe margin over the late-closing **Enjoy** (Roar). "She's amazing and she likes it when they come after her like that," Smith enthused. "She just grabs a hold of me, and whoosh." Trainer Laura de Seroux mentioned the G1 Vanity H. June 21 as the likely next start for her champion, but said that the G1 Hollywood Gold Cup July 13 was a possibility. "We're going to talk about it, and look at it," she said. "You're seeing one of the greatest mares of all time."

POISED FOR PERFECTION

Six Perfections (Fr) (Celtic Swing {GB}) had to stand in the runner-up spot at Newmarket after the G1 1000 Guineas May 4, but she should find her way to pole position in this afternoon's G1 Entenmann's Irish 1000 Guineas at The Curragh. Undone by the draw in hole one in that 19-runner Classic, she was badly hampered as she prepared to unleash her dramatic turn of acceleration. Nevertheless, her withering late run got her to within 1 ½ lengths of Russian Rhythm at the line, with **Yesterday (Ire)** (Sadler's Wells) and **L'Ancrese (Ire)** (Darshaan {GB}) languishing in eighth and 15th respectively. Runners-up in that Classic have a fine record in this equivalent, with Kooyonga (Ire), Marling (Ire) and Matiya (Ire) going one better in the last decade.

Yesterday should perform better on this more testing ground, but Six Perfections had no problem demolishing her rivals in the Listed Prix Roland de Chambure at Deauville in similar conditions in July. Chinks in her formidable armour are difficult to find and a reproduction of her fluent score in the G1 Prix Marcel Boussac at Longchamp on Arc day, where **Luminata (Ire)** (Indian Ridge {Ire}) was third and Yesterday sixth, would be enough to end the 20-year French drought in this Classic. **Walayef** (Danzig) poses the biggest threat to the favourite if she stays, but her inherent speed, displayed when taking the Listed Round Tower S. at this track in September, may not last this mile. She showed she can harness that pace over seven furlongs when winning the G3 EBF Athasi S. here Apr. 27 and her cause will be aided if she encounters a false pace here. Like Walayef's trainer Kevin Prendergast, Dermot Weld has won this twice and he saddles the unexposed **Dimitrova** (Swain {Ire}). She beat L'Ancrese by a head when winning the Listed Leopardstown 1000 Guineas Trial Apr. 13, but has to improve to figure in this league.

A New York-bred by Distorted Humor with a catchy name drew off to win the Peter Pan S. yesterday, but it wasn't Funny Cide, who has become the sport's glamour boy following victories in the Kentucky Derby and Preakness S. Instead, it was Go Rockin' Robin's day to shine with this impressive victory. After breaking his maiden Sept. 26, the dark bay colt had run third to Funny Cide and Spite the Devil (Devil His Due) in the Sleepy Hollow S. Oct. 19. He didn't win again until Jan. 2 in a state-bred allowance, then followed up with a third in the open-company Whirlaway S. Feb. 8. The hard-knocking sophomore next ran second to Kissin Saint in an open allowance Mar. 28 and most recently won a similar test at Aqueduct May 2. Never far from the front while racing on the outside, Go Rockin' Robin ranged up to collar Alysweep at the top of the stretch, but the race was quickly over as the 13-1 shot began to open up. "He was in the bridle the whole way," said winning rider Shaun Bridgmohan. "It looked like Jerry [Bailey, aboard Alysweep] was starting to ask his horse and I was still sitting on mine." There's a chance that Go Rockin' Robin could meet Funny Cide two weeks hence in New York. "The Belmont is a possibility, but he would have to be supplemented for \$100,000," said winning trainer Scott Schwartz. "If I had nominated him to the Triple Crown, he would probably run." Kiss The Devil put together a nice winning streak last summer, taking back-to-back allowance events at Arlington Park July 25 and Aug. 8 before defeating San Dare (Dare and Go) by a head in the Dade Turf Classic at Ellis Park Aug. 31. The dark bay made a return trip to Chicago on Breeders' Cup weekend, finishing third in the Aug. 25 Estrapade H., and closed the season with a fifth-place finish behind Quick Tip in this oval's GIII Cardinal H. Nov. 23. Second by a neck to the classy Love N' Kiss S. in Keeneland allowance company Apr. 23, she was the third-longest shot in this competitive field. A handy second tracking the steady early pace, Kiss The Devil kicked it into high gear on the far turn, struck the front in upper stretch and held off Quick Tip for her first graded-stakes score. Winning owner Carl Pollard is happy that he chose not to go with Plan A. "[Hermitage Farm manager] Bill [Landes] will tell you I wanted to breed her, but he talked me out of it," he said. "[Trainer] David [Vance] thought we could win a couple hundred thousand--and I'd rather race than breed, anyway. It was an easy call."

Chiming, second to subsequent GI Matriarch S. winner Dress To Thrill (Ire) while racing in Ireland last season, went winless in nine trips to the post at four. The bay made her U.S. debut after a 6 1/2-month layoff and finished second by a half length in an optional claimer at Hollywood May 2. Well backed trying American stakes company in her second stateside appearance, she tracked the pacesetters to the stretch, then changed lanes and rallied to take control inside the eighth pole. The Irish-bred easily held off the late bid of Noches de Rosa, who came from last to get second. Chiming stopped the clock in 1:45.41, just off the course record of 1:45.34. "I was really impressed," said winning rider Corey Nakatani. "I rode her with a lot of confidence and she really responded. If I knew we were that close to the course record I might have ridden her a little harder."

Miss Emma dealt a major blow for the sophomore sprinters by cutting down Captain Rio for an impressive score to justify the €7,500 supplementary fee paid by connections Tuesday. Stepping up to stakes company for the first time in the Listed Woodlands S. at Naas May 5, she showed toughness beyond her years in outbattling old stager One Won One by a head. With that in mind, jockey Tadhg O'Shea was content to stalk the early leader Captain Rio, under Fran Berry, before asking her to tackle that rival approaching the final eighth. Fighting qualities were not required, however, as she readily swept aside her elder before quickening clear for an emphatic score. Winning trainer Mick Halford commented, "She had been working well and we could possibly go for Royal Ascot now. She's a very good-actioned filly, so although she has done all her winning on soft ground I'd say she'd handle good ground."

Prevalent fast ground may explain his failure to land a blow when sixth behind subsequent G1 Dubai Duty Free winner Ipi Tombe (Zim) there and he has reportedly impressed in his homework in the lead-up to this race.

Empire Maker to Jersey Derby

Empire Maker (Unbridled), second as the 5-2 favorite in the May 3 Kentucky Derby, could make his next start in the \$100,000 Jersey Derby at Monmouth Park tomorrow afternoon. The three-year-old had been expected to head straight to the June 7 Belmont S., but trainer Bobby Frankel decided to enter his charge in the race because heavy rains in the New York area have disrupted the colt's preparations for the final jewel in the Triple Crown. "I definitely haven't been able to do what I've wanted with him," Frankel said. "I have to do something. This should get him where I need him." The Jersey Derby, originally scheduled for the grass, has been moved to the main track. But Frankel added that, if the track is fast at Belmont Park Monday morning, he may opt to scratch the colt from the Jersey Derby and instead just work him. "I can always change my mind," he said.

'Ats' Back on Track

B. Wayne Hughes and Biscuit Stables **Atswhatimtalknbout** (A.P. Indy) returned to the track yesterday, jogging a mile at Churchill Downs. The big colt, fourth in the Kentucky Derby, missed two days of training with a bruised foot. "The thing blew open," said trainer Ron Ellis, who added that the bruised area had been drained and treated. "I'm not too worried about keeping infection under control. We'll bandage him and he's on antibiotics." The three-year-old is still on schedule to breeze a mile Tuesday.

Alamshar on Track

Johnny Murtagh expressed himself satisfied after partnering **Alamshar (Ire)** (Key of Luck) in a gallop at The Curragh yesterday, describing the John Oxx-trained colt as "very well" ahead of his tilt at the June 7 G1 Vodafone Derby at Epsom. Having impressed when closing fast to finish a half-length runner-up to Balestrini (Ire) in the G3 Ballysax S. at Leopardstown Apr. 13, he came in for criticism when he beat The Great Gatsby (Ire) by just a head in the G2 Derrinstown Stud Derby Trial S. back at that track May 11. "A lot of people weren't impressed by his run at Leopardstown, but he has come on for the run and felt very good this morning," Murtagh said. "He was really bouncing and full of himself. I hope he'll stay the Derby trip, but it's into unknown territory." Oxx and Murtagh combined to win the Epsom Classic in 2000 with Sinndar (Ire), and the jockey was invited to make comparisons between the pair. "There are a few similarities--they are both very quiet, relaxed customers with good temperaments and never spectacular workers. This fellow has had a couple of races and he's starting to get a bit more tuned in--last time he stuck his head down and battled well and that was Sinndar's trait, as he always gave 100 percent. He's not proven as yet and we won't know until the Derby, but he's going very well."

CHRB Investigating Mullins Maiden Winner:

The California Horse Racing Board announced Friday that it will be reviewing some races with "significant form reversals," including a race last Wednesday at Hollywood Park in which a filly trained by Jeff Mullins stepped up in class and won at relatively low odds. **Flyindownbaylaurel** (Alphabet Soup) had been up the track in four main-track sprints for trainer Jerry Dutton, and was claimed by Richard Englander for \$32,000 out of an Apr. 10 effort that saw her run eighth at Santa Anita. With blinkers added and trying the turf for the first time in Wednesday's race, the chestnut defeated state-breds at odds of 7-2. "The CHRB is continually working to insure that the racing industry in California benefits from the highest degree of regulatory scrutiny," said CHRB Chairman Roger Licht. "The public and those involved in the sport must be confident their respective interests are protected to the maximum extent of the law." Mullins has been asked to appear before the Hollywood Park stewards May 29. "Let me first say that I have the utmost respect for Jerry Dutton, but I put a lot of work into the filly," Mullins told *The Blood-Horse*. "I took my time with her. First of all, she's bred to run on grass [Flyindownbaylaurel is out of a Dynaformer half sister to turf champion Mac Diarmida]. Second of all, she's bred to route. Plus I put blinkers on her and not to take anything away from her or the other horses, but it was a terrible race."
