TROUBLES FAR AWAY FOR YESTERDAY

Defeat for **Six Perfections (Fr)** (Celtic Swing {GB}) was unthinkable according to the market, but **Yesterday**

(Ire) (Sadler's Wells) hadn't read the script, edging the 3-10 favourite by a short head in the G1 Entenmann's Irish 1000 Guineas at The Curragh Sunday as the 11-2 second choice. While the winner had a dream run, stalking **L'Ancrese (Ire)** (Darshaan {GB}) early before making a decisive move with 100 yards remaining, it was a case of further bad fortune for Six Perfections, who was trapped on the inner until finding day-

light too late. Yesterday battled bravely as the market leader came at her to earn the narrow decision. "Mick [Kinane] was perfection on her today," a delighted winning trainer Aidan O'Brien commented. "When she gets to the front she starts to pull herself up. Mick knew he was going to have it to leave it as late as possible." **More on the Irish 1000, p2**

CONGAREE'S RACE TO LOSE

Arguably the best horse in the country under nine furlongs, trainer Bob Baffert's **Congaree** (Arazi) will attempt to notch his second consecutive Grade I victory as he heads the field in this afternoon's G1 Metropolitan Mile H. at Belmont Park. He romped by 3 1/2 lengths in the G1 Carter H. over a muddy Aqueduct track on the G1 Wood Memorial S. undercard Apr. 12.

"He's really showing signs of greatness," said Baffert, who will not make the trip east for the race. "I don't like comparing my horses, but Congaree is right up there with Point Given. At a mile, he's the best horse I've ever trained." Inconsistent during much of his 2002 campaign, Congaree

looked a horse reborn when taking his season finale, the G1 Cigar Mile H., by 5 1/2 lengths at the Big A last November. Kicking off 2003 with a pair of Grade II wins at Santa Anita, the striking chestnut put forth a valiant effort when a head runner-up to Milwaukee Brew in the 1 1/4-mile G1 Santa Anita H. Mar. 1. He then showed his versatility, scaling back in distance and winning the seven-furlong Carter for fun. The second-place finisher in that event, Flaxman Stables' **Aldebaran** (Mr. Prospector), has done much in recent months to dispel the idea that he suffers from chronic seconditis. After completing the exacta in six of eight starts in 2002, including last year's renewal of this race, he scored his first Grade I triumph in his seasonal bow when annexing the San Carlos H. at Santa Anita Mar. 2. He followed the Carter with a sharp victory in the seven-panel GII Churchill Downs H. on Derby Day. "He always shows up," said trainer Bobby Frankel. "A lot of people think he's better as a five-year-old, but I think he's the same horse he was last year. He just had bad luck." Anyone who saw **Najran** (Runaway Groom) blaze the May 7 GIII Westchester H. in a record 1:32 1/5 had to be impressed. But the track was lightning fast that day and the gray earned a career-best Beyer figure of "only" 111, which likely wouldn't get it done here. Still, he and Congaree are the speed, and he could be tough if left alone on the lead. **Field, p5**

The Luck of the Irish...

Jockey Mick Kinane was humble in his post-race comments. "I was lucky," he said. "She got the cover that she needs and she did it nicely...fortunately, she held on." Yesterday had faded after racing prominently in the Newmarket equivalent on good-to-firm ground May 4, but relished the softer conditions in this Classic. Sixth to Six Perfections in the G1 Prix Marcel Boussac at Longchamp and third in the G2 Rockfel S. at Newmarket on livelier ground last season, she had shown her liking for an easy surface when winning the Listed Eyrefield S. at Leopardstown in November. The filly, who completed a Group 1 double for connections after the exploits of Black Sam Bellamy (Ire) in the Tattersalls Gold Cup an hour earlier, will head to the June 6 G1 Vodafone Oaks. There she will bid to emulate the stable's Imagine (Ire), who took both races in 2001, and improve on the runner-up finish of sister Quarter Moon (Ire) in 2002. "It was always the plan to go to Epsom," Aidan O'Brien said. "We've always thought she would be fine over a mile and a half and, although she's gone on fast before, this ground might inconvenience the others. She showed us she has plenty of stamina when she won over a mile and a furlong last season." Far from Perfect...

Jockey Thierry Thulliez was much maligned by the press for his ride on Six Perfections in the G1 1000 Guineas at Newmarket May 4 and subsequently lost the ride to Johnny Murtagh, but it was the same story at The Curragh. Held up in rear early, Six Perfections was hemmed in on the rail inside the final quarter before being switched wide for her challenge. Her powerful closing run took her to within a short head of the game winner, but she was out of real estate. "What can you say? Nothing," said a disconsolate Pascal Bary. "To lose two Guineas is a lot to take, but I knew very early on it was going to be difficult--she was on the rail and it wasn't a very good pace. She is a very, very good filly with great acceleration, but even she could not give five lengths to a good filly like Yesterday and catch her over a furlong." As expected, Six Perfections will miss Royal Ascot and have a break before being aimed at the G1 Prix Jacques le Marois at Deauville Aug. 17. Trainer Dermot Weld could aim third-place finisher **Dimitrova** (Swain {Ire}) at either the G2 Pretty Polly S. at The Curragh June 28 or the July 5 American Oaks.

Black Sam Bellamy scorched The Curragh turf with an electrifying performance that sees him finally step out of the shadow of his illustrious sibling Galileo (Ire). The subject of intense interest as a juvenile, Black Sam Bellamy ended his campaign winless, but did manage a third in the G1 Criterium de Saint-Cloud. He took time to find his feet at three, saving his best efforts for the fall, and performed better than his 10th placing suggests in the G1 Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe. The colt ended the year with a win in the G1 Gran Premio del Jockey Club in Milan in October, then returned to take the Listed Alleged S. at Leopardstown Mar. 29. Last time out, he was a disappointing last in the G1 Prix Ganay Apr. 27. Bouncing back from that tame effort, he chased the early pacesetter Narrative before quickening to the front with 2 1/2 furlongs remaining. Surging clear from there, he maintained the relentless gallop all the way to the line. "I don't know why he ran so badly in France last time," trainer Aidan O'Brien said. "He got into a real rhythm today. We're thinking about the G1 Coronation Cup [at Epsom June 6] if he gets ease in the ground. Looking at him, I imagine he will be an even better five-year-old." Osorio struck for Germany under Italian jockey Mario Esposito in a thrilling finale to this Classic. Always prominent, he was committed early in the straight and had to dig deep to repel the British-trained Private Charter, who had looked the winner when asserting at the quarter-mile marker. However he had reckoned without the tough chestnut, who rallied to regain the lead in the closing stages and win going away. Despite being trained by the Baden Baden-based Urs Suter, Osorio has so far only raced in Milan, running second in a maiden before taking a similar event at the track in October. Returning to place in a conditions race Apr. 12, he showed an impressive turn of acceleration to beat Mac Monarch (Ire) (Unfuwain) by two lengths in the Listed Premio Emanuele Filiberto May 4. Osorio is a member of the last crop of one of Germany's best sires, the deceased Surumu, and also marks his fourth Derby-winning son following Acatenango (Ger), Mondrian (Ger) and Temporal (Ger). The colt is also a triumph for British-based owners Newsells Park Stud, who bought into him during the winter, and he holds an entry in the G1 Deutsches Derby at Hamburg July 6. However, he may head to Royal Ascot for the G2 King Edward VII S. June 20 or wait for the G1 Pokal at Cologne in August. "I was always very confident," Suter commented. "I told the owners when he won in Milan last year we would be back to win the Derby Italiano. Ascot is an option and so is the Pokal as Hamburg may not suit him." Last year's Italian St Leger winner Maktub rattled off two conditions scores in Milan Mar. 23 and Apr. 5, respectively, before attempting to carry top weight in Italy's oldest handicap, the Corse dell'arno at Florence last time Apr. 25. His performance in finishing 11th behind Sunsu Desura (GB) (Rainbow Quest) over an inadequate trip was more creditable than it seemed, and he showed his aptitude for stakes level at his first try here. Settled off the fast early tempo by jockey Mirco Demuro, he ground out the victory, wearing down Desirao in the final strides as Rainer closed late to take third. Rainer, who had several lengths to make up at the top of the straight, will now head to the G1 Gran Premio di Milano June 22. Last year's G3 Prix d'Arenberg winner returned to burn off subsequent G2 Italian 1000 Guineas winner Golden Nepi (Ire) in two conditions events at this track in March, and she hardly broke sweat in disposing of Sopran Foldan in the Listed Premio Certosa in Milan May 1. It looked to be more of the same this time as she soon quickened clear under Dario Vargiu. Her early exertions may have begun to tell in the closing stages as jockey Frankie Dettori brought Dream Chief from the pack, but the winner had gone beyond recall. She may make a quick reappearance in Sunday's G2 Prix du Gros-Chene at Chantilly.

Private Chef had started just once before, closing late to break his maiden by 3 1/2 lengths going six furlongs on the Santa Anita main track Feb. 16. A Triple Crown nominee, he came back after better than three months on the shelf to make his stakes and turf debut. The bay was last after a half in :48.42, but set his sights on the front-running Banshee King as they raced down the lane and caught that one in the final strides. "I didn't know anything about this horse," winning jockey Victor Espinoza admitted. "The trainer wanted me just to sit back and make one strong run, just to finish well...then we wound up winning the race. Just in the last sixteenth of a mile did I know I was going to win the race." This wasn't the spot trainer John Shirreffs had originally picked to bring the three-year-old back. "We were trying to get him in a race going 6 1/2 [furlongs] because he hadn't run in a long time, but it didn't fill," he explained. "At that point we needed to run him somewhere and this was against three-year-olds, so we chose this even though we had to supplement him." Singletary, sent off the 2-5 favorite, pressed the pace, but weakened late to be third. "The turf course was really soft and that probably cost me more than anything because it was slipping out from underneath him," jockey Pat Valenzuela said. Moyglare Stud's Dress to Thrill was a multiple group-stakes winner in Ireland before running a non-threatening eighth against the boys in the GI Breeders' Cup Mile last October, but rebounded nicely to take the Dec. 1 GI Matriarch S. for trainer Dermot Weld. She makes her 2003 debut for new trainer Clement.

Empire Maker Takes to the Grass

On Saturday, trainer Bobby Frankel outlined Plans A and B for Kentucky Derby runner-up **Empire Maker** (Unbridled), saying he would either run in the Jersey Derby at Monmouth Park this afternoon or, if the track at Belmont Park dried, give his Belmont S. candidate a strong workout in the morning. Yesterday, Frankel went to Plan C. With the Belmont main track still listed as sloppy, the Brooklyn-born conditioner sent Empire Maker out to work on the turf. The Juddmonte Farms' colorbearer, working in company with his stablemate **Midas Eyes** (Touch Gold), breezed five furlongs in an easy 1:02.61 with regular rider Jerry Bailey in the saddle. "It was his first time on the turf and I didn't want him to goof off, so I put [Midas Eyes] in front of him," Frankel said. "Jerry said he felt unbelievable on the grass. He'd probably be a champion on the grass." He added, "I couldn't go into the Belmont off five weeks of no training. I think we'll be OK now. Hopefully the main track will be OK by next weekend." The Eclipse Award-winning horseman didn't come up with Plan C on his own. Frankel was in the Belmont Park racing office Saturday afternoon when trainer Christophe Clement came in to ask if he could work his Belmont hopeful, **Dynever** (Dynaformer), on the turf yesterday morning. "I hadn't thought of that," Frankel admitted. "The turf course was in good shape, especially at the brim where the water runs off. You're gambling if you work on the main track." Dynever, impressive winner of the GIII Lone Star Derby last time, also stretched his legs on the Belmont turf, going a half mile in :48.54 in company with stablemate **Mariensky** (Gulch). "It looked like a very good work," Clement said. "They started slow and finished fast. [Dynever] really leveled off and finished very well. He came back to the barn in good shape."

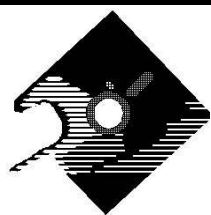
