A STAR SHINES THROUGH

Showing a brilliant turn of foot leaving the far turn, **Aldebaran** (Mr. Prospector) swept past the heavily favored **Congaree** (Arazi) and staved off a late challenge from **Saarland** (Unbridled) to win yesterday's GI Metropolitan H. under gray skies at Belmont Park. In the process, he finally put to rest the notion that he could do no better than second against the country's elite. Trained by Bobby Frankel, Aldebaran notched his second Grade I victory and firmly established himself as one of the country's top horses. "I had a real good feeling about him all day today," said Frankel. "He's been acting so good all week. With his pedigree, this is a huge win. FRANKEL TAKES TWO

Trainer Bobby Frankel, who several hours earlier won the Met Mile with Aldebaran, took his second big win on the afternoon when his **Tates Creek** (Rahy) bounded clear through the stretch to earn her first Grade I success while capturing the Gamely Breeders' Cup H. at Hollywood Park. **Tates Creek** became the second Grade I winner for her dam Viviana, joining sister Sightseek, who won the GI Humana Distaff H. on Kentucky Derby day. A tracking third behind her pacesetting stablemate **Miss Terrible** (Arg) (Numerous), **Tates Creek** moved powerfully to the front at the top of the stretch, opened a clear lead through the lane and was in no danger of the rallying favorite, **Dublino** (Lear Fan), in the dying strides. "She ran terrific," said winning rider Patrick Valenzuela. "She relaxed behind the two leaders. Entering the stretch...she took off. Really fast." The beautifully built chestnut hadn't raced since extending her skein of graded victories to three in the GII San Gorgonio H. Jan. 11.

Talent Always There...

Aldebaran, the Bobby Frankel trainee who started his career in Great Britain, began his frustrating run of chance early in 2002, when he had the misfortune of consistently running against horses that were putting up freakish performances. He finished second to Swept Overboard in last year's Met Mile, to eventual sprint champion Orientate in the GI Forego H., and to Bonapaw in the GI Vosburgh. After his chances were compromised when Landseer broke down in front of him in the GI Breeders' Cup Mile, he finished second to Congaree in the GI Cigar Mile H. last November. The second-place skein was officially snapped when he dominated by five lengths the GI San Carlos H. at Santa Anita Mar. 2, but a second-place finish to Congaree in the seven-furlong GI Carter H. left doubts whether he could beat the top older horses. After a fast-closing victory in the seven-panel GII Churchill Downs H. May 3, Aldebaran was out to prove he was among the division's best. Yesterday, Congaree was gunned from post seven and hooked up with **Najran** (Runaway Groom) through swift opening fractions. Aldebaran, meanwhile, under jockey Jerry Bailey, was bumped at the start and found himself well off the leaders. Moving into contention with an assertive move rounding the turn, he caught the tiring pacesetters turning for home and looked like he would run away with the victory. A hard-charging Saarland made him work, however, but Aldebaran wouldn't be denied despite drifting out slightly in deep stretch.

Congaree Disappoints...

Stonerside Stables Congaree, sent to post as the well-supported 4-5 chalk, couldn't overcome the quick early fractions he helped set and faded to sixth. "He was basically all out at the quarter pole," said jockey Gary Stevens. "I'm baffled. I would be surprised if he bled; when we pulled up, he wasn't making any noise. I squeezed him at the three-eighths pole. He was running as well as he could. He just didn't have it."

Another Mr. Prospector...

The impeccably bred Aldebaran, who counts amongst his siblings GISW Good Journey and GSW Sea of Showers, becomes the fourth Mr. Prospector to win the Metropolitan H. He joins some impressive company: Fappiano in 1981, Conquistador Cielo a year later, and Gulch, who won the race in both 1987 and 1988.

The eight-year-old Redattore ripped off his third straight as he overpowered the pacesetting Special Ring for the victory. The bay, victorious in the 2001 renewal of the GI Eddie Read H., won the GII San Antonio H. over Santa Anita's main track in February of 2002 and was an honest third in that year's version of the Eddie Read. Off for 6 1/2 months after that effort, he started 2003 the right way, wiring a tough allowance field by 5 1/2 lengths Feb. 8, and proved a length too much for Good Journey in the GII Frank Kilroe Mile H. Mar. 1. Sent off as the 2-1 choice to remain perfect on the year, the Brazilian-bred shadowed front-running Special Ring through solid fractions. He inched closer as they came down the stretch, finally collaring the game pacesetter in the final sixteenth to prevail. "This horse just keeps improving and improving," winning jockey Alex Solis said. "He got sick and had to take some time off and, for [trainer Richard Mandella] to bring him back to run this good is very impressive." Added Mandella, "He was as good as he could be--he was as good as anybody could be. He's just been phenomenal this year." Special Ring, making his first start since taking the Wickerr H. at Del Mar last August, was easily second best. "He's going to do better next time," trainer Julio Canani said. "He looked a little bit too keen today. Blazonry, relatively new to U.S. shores, won his first test against winners with style as he circled the field and powered past longshot Fly to the Wire for the victory. The bay colt need four attempts to break his maiden over the grass in Great Britain last July for trainer Jeremy Nosedá. He was subsequently sent to the States following a sixth-place effort in the Listed Ripon Champion Two-Year-Old Trophy S. in late August. Reappearing eight months later with a new conditioner in Kathy Walsh, he ran a very good neck third in an entry-level allowance test on the dirt at Santa Anita Apr. 2. Stepped up to graded stakes company, Blazonry was away slowly from the gate and was no better than seventh after a half mile. Sent six wide turning for home under jockey Mike Smith, the homebred was full of run through the stretch to account for fellow closer Fly to the Wire. "He had some foot problems and I lost some time with him after the race at Santa Anita," said Walsh. "I got to looking around and I didn't want to run him in an allowance race. It's very important to get him some graded wins." Added the victorious Smith, "I thought I'd be closer out of the gate, but he stumbled a little bit leaving, so I just let him settle back there. As soon as he got over on his left foot running around the turn, he actually caught them quicker than I wanted him to." 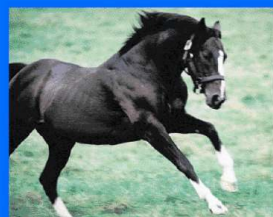

Not since Dayjur burned up this furious five in 1990 has the Sandown crowd been blessed with as mighty a performance as Airwave produced yesterday at Sandown. Missing the break, she was left several lengths adrift of Repertory, but quickened into contention passing halfway, took a pull approaching the eighth pole and surged clear for a brilliant score. "I was a little bit concerned, but [co-owner] Mr. Candy said she can dwell a little bit and the main thing is not to rush her into it," commented jockey Dane O'Neill. "She's got an awful lot of natural speed, so I just thought we'll take our time and see how we go. Coming to the two-furlong marker I was actually getting there too soon, as when she gets to the front she has a little look. I wanted to make it as easy for her as possible as it's only the start today...and we were coming here under the penalty. But you don't get a penalty without a reason and we were confident and hopeful." Airwave was providing Candy with back-to-back renewals of this contest after the success of her old sparring partner Kyllachy (GB) 12 months ago. She did so under a seven-pound penalty for beating subsequent G1 1000 Guineas winner Russian Rhythm by 1 1/2 lengths in the G1 Cheveley Park S. at Newmarket in October. "Four lengths was a lot to give away against the old professionals, but I wasn't as nervous as I should have been because I have seen her do the most amazing things," commented Candy. Mr Dinos gave weight and a comprehensive beating to his rivals to book his place in the G1 Ascot Gold Cup at the Royal meeting June 19. A bruised foot had interrupted the colt's training for the race, but that evidently caused no problems. He stalked the pace, pounced with 500 yards remaining and powered clear. Mr Dinos, who ended his sophomore campaign with a game success in the G1 Prix Royal-Oak at Longchamp in October, was beaten a half-length by Mamool (Ire) in the G3 Queen's Vase at the Royal meeting last June. He will meet that rival again in the marathon showpiece and his jockey, Frankie Dettori, sees the Godolphin runner as a major threat. "He's very much an improving horse," he said. "They went a true gallop and, from the minute I pulled out, there was nobody that was going to get by me because he was flying. He'll get 2 1/4 miles no problem and he'll be very hard to beat in the Gold Cup, that's for sure." Cuvee overcame an awkward start to trounce this field in earning his first stakes victory. Produced by a half sister to Winchell millionaire Olympio, the homebred opened his career with dominating 6 1/4-length victory going 4 1/2 furlongs on the Kentucky Oaks undercard and was sent off as the prohibitive favorite in his stakes debut. Despite hopping at the start, the chestnut recovered quickly and went up to force the pace with First Money and Exploit Lad before taking charge through a half in :46.01. Cuvee pulled away under a mild hand ride from Lonnie Meche, crossing the line well clear of his early companions. "He's a very nice horse and he's extremely talented," said assistant trainer Scott Blasi. "He warrants us mapping out a schedule that fits according to his ability. We're not going to get too aggressive now. The [July 6, GIII] Bashford Manor [at Churchill] seems like the next step if he comes back well." This race might have lost some of its luster when seven entrants scratched due to the surface change, but it lost none of its excitement as Garnered battled from the outset with the very game Speightstown and outlasted that foe to register his first stakes success. Trainer Allen Jerkens opted to bench the colt for the rest of the year, bringing him back seven months later to confidently take an Aqueduct allowance test by 3 3/4 lengths Apr. 27. Garnered freaked in his next, blowing away Belmont foes by 7 1/4 lengths when stepped up in class May 15, earning a Beyer figure of 110 in the process. He proved that was no fluke here, getting away from the gate in good order and quickly matching strides with the two-wide Speightstown. Those two moved in tandem through blazing fractions of :21 3/5, :43 4/5 and 1:09 1/5. Garnered's jockey, Victor Carrero, lost his whip leaving the eight pole, at which point his mount shook loose of Speightstown and asserted for the win. "He's a beautiful horse," said Jerkens. "He's nominated to the [June 7, GI] True North Breeders' Cup H., but we might wait. I ran him back close today." One of the undoubted fascinations of Thoroughbred breeding is that, just as we are in danger of thinking that we know all the rules, along comes a horse that effectively rewrites the rulebook. A good example is the 18-year-old Indian Ridge. This Irish National Stud resident came up with his second winner of the Breeders' Cup Mile last October, when Domedriver defeated Rock of Gibraltar, and he has now been represented by his second Irish classic winner in Indian Haven.

Indian Ridge's current fee of €75,000 makes him one of the highest-priced stallions in Ireland, yet he is the product of a season which cost IR£2,750, the equivalent of little more than \$3,100 at the time. His sire Ahonoora had cost only 7,600 guineas as a yearling, whereas his dam Hillbrow, a granddaughter of Delta Judge, had sold for only 3,300 guineas at the end of her racing career.

Of course we are all used to seeing plenty of inexpensively produced horses do very well on the track, but we don't usually expect them to carry on the good work as stallions. Their run-of-the-mill bloodlines are often enough to deter breeders from trusting their best mares to them, and it is a very unusual stallion indeed who can overcome such a handicap. Indian Ridge, though, has done so.

He started his stallion career in England--the scene of his successes in the G3 Jersey S., G3 Duke of York S. and G2 King's Stand S.--but didn't find the going easy and his fee had to be reduced to £3,000 from its initial 5,000 guineas in his third and fourth seasons. None of his first three crops numbered as many as 40 foals, yet this didn't stop him making an immediate impact. What was particularly impressive was his ability to sire stakes winners from what seemed to be distinctly limited opportunities.

In a report I compiled for a client in the summer of 1996, I pointed out that "nearly all of the dams of Indian Ridge's good winners were only moderate on the racecourse." Many of these early winners achieved Timeform ratings 20, 30 or even 40 pounds higher than those of their dams, which seemed a sure indication that Indian Ridge was upgrading his mares.

Needless to say, plenty of other people also noticed Indian Ridge's achievements and he was switched to the Irish National Stud--the scene of his conception--after the 1993 breeding season. He has proved a worthy heir to his remarkable sire Ahonoora (currently in the spotlight as the broodmare sire of Azeri) and his tally of Group winners in the Northern Hemisphere now stands at 23, from his first 10 crops of racing age.

So why has Indian Ridge bucked the trend when so many others have failed? Perhaps the answer is simply that he has inherited the ability that allowed Ahonoora to make the same rags-to-riches journey. We shouldn't forget, though, that the bottom half of Indian Ridge's pedigree is packed with speed or that he is inbred 3x3 to a distinguished mare called Discipliner. This daughter of champion sire Court Martial produced Martial, winner of the 2000 Guineas; Skymaster, a very tough and fast sprinter; and El Gallo, another very good sprinter. These three colts earned Timeform ratings of 131, 126 and 122, so Discipliner was a remarkable producer.

Indian Ridge also has four lines to the champion sire Fair Trial in the sixth generation of his pedigree, two of them through Court Martial. It is no coincidence that Indian Ridge has done very well with mares from the Fair Trial male line, notably the 2000 Guineas winner Tap On Wood (broodmare sire of five stakes winners from 15 foals) and Tap On Wood's sire Sallust.

I could have listed the absence of Northern Dancer from Indian Ridge's pedigree as one of the reasons why he has done so well in Europe, where outcrosses to the Windfields Farm champion are much sought after. However, I'm not so sure that this has been a particular help to him. Certainly he has sired Namid (G1), Cassandra Go (G2), High Pitched (G3) and Campsie Fells (G3) from mares by sons of Northern Dancer, but these four come from a sample of well over 100 foals.

Coincidentally, Indian Haven is a half-brother to the dam of High Pitched, and his dam is by Legend of France, a grandson of Northern Dancer. Significantly, Legend of France was inbred 3x4 to Court Martial and Indian Haven's female line traces to Fair Angela, a successful broodmare daughter of Fair Trial, so the Fair Trial link has surely played its part.

Indian Haven is the second consecutive Group 1 winner produced by Cliveden Stud's Madame Dubois, following her Zafonic colt Count Dubois (Gran Criterium). The mare has clearly benefited from being sent to stallions which shone at up to a mile, to balance the stamina she showed. Madame Dubois numbered the G2 Park Hill S. over 14.6 furlongs and the G2 Prix de Royallieu over 1 9/16 miles among her successes, while her dam, Shadywood, stayed very well for a daughter of Habitat, once finishing second in the G3 Lancashire Oaks over 1 1/2 miles. Indian Haven's third dam, Milly Moss, also stayed well, winning the Chester Oaks and finishing fourth in the Oaks, while Milly Moss' sister Mil's Bomb won the Lancashire Oaks, Nassau S. and Park Hill S.

With there being so much stamina in this family, it is possible that Indian Havens will stay beyond a mile, especially as his close relative High Pitched won at up to 13.3 furlongs. However, his trainer has made the sensible decision to stick to a mile for the time being and it will be interesting to see whether he can boost his reputation once more at Royal Ascot, the scene of two of Indian Ridge's finest performances.

Derby Field to Grow

Connections of **Dutch Gold** (Lahib) and **Norse Dancer (Ire)** (Halling) are likely to supplement their colts for the G1 Vodafone Derby at Epsom June 7. Conditioner Clive Brittain has confirmed that Dutch Gold, who took the G3 Chester Vase at Chester May 6, will be added to the Classic at Monday's stage at a cost of £90,000. "Dutch Gold is a definite for Epsom and he goes to Yarmouth for a racecourse gallop during racing on Wednesday," Brittain told *PA Sport*. "He's come on since Chester and the Yarmouth gallop is just to give him a change of scenery. We don't need to run him again to find out how good he is--we've seen that." Owner Jeff Smith also suggested that Norse Dancer, not seen since finishing third in the G1 2000 Guineas at Newmarket May 3, will be supplemented. "He is still in the French Derby, but even though it will only cost us about another £200 to run him there, it is hard not to be tempted to pay the £90,000 and let him go to Epsom," he told *PA Sport*. "We will have a look at the French entries when they are released this week and then make our minds up. Epsom looks so open this year and I tell you--he really is a very good horse. Some of the work he has done has been pretty amazing. He works with Group horses and he has beaten them with his head in his chest, giving them a stone. The jury is still out, but he is possibly the best horse I have ever owned." The Sir Michael Stoute-trained **Kris Kin** (Kris S), winner of the Listed Dee S. at Chester May 8, is another that may be added to the Classic field. Joe Mercer, racing manager to owner Saeed Suhail, told *PA Sport*, "He's in the French Derby and the forfeits for that are on Wednesday. I spoke to Michael this morning and we are going to discuss it again tomorrow."

Storm Flag Flying Braves the Elements

Last year's champion two-year-old filly **Storm Flag Flying** (Storm Cat) worked five panels around the dogs in 1:01 3/5 yesterday at Belmont Park for trainer Shug McGaughey. The dark bay worked in company with stablemate Alluring over a surface labeled as sloppy. "She worked fine and came back fine," said McGaughey. "I work her on and off in company. With the track off today, I wanted her to be on the bridle, so I worked her in company. It wasn't an ideal surface to work over, but she handled it well."
