Dutrow enjoyed his day in the sun, but quipped after the race, "[Trainer Bobby Frankel] told

me to have my fun now, because [Ghostzapper] would be back soon." The two hooked up once before, with Saint Liam running the eventual Horse of the Year to a neck decision at level weights in the Sept. 11 GI Woodward S. In his lone start since, the Saint captured the Nov. 26 GII Clark H. at Churchill Downs, and he had been working sharply for his return. **Donn H. cont. p2**

ECLIPSE WINNERS TOP TRIPLE CROWN NOMS

A total of 357 three-year-olds, headed by Eclipse champions **Sweet Catomine** (Storm Cat) and **Declan's Moon** (Malibu Moon), have been nominated to this year's Visa Triple Crown. The early nominations, which include 322 colts, 27 geldings, seven fillies and

one ridgling, closed Jan. 22, but late bloomers can be made eligible for the three jewels in the Crown at a fee of \$6,000, due by Mar. 26. It is the first time in the last five years that the nominations haven't broken the 400 mark, but Triple Crown officials were not surprised by the decrease. "The dip in this year's nominations to the 2005 Visa Triple Crown and \$5-million Visa Triple Crown

Challenge was not unexpected," said Triple Crown Productions Executive Vice President Edward Seigenfeld. "This is the year in which [Mare Reproductive Loss Syndrome] was expected to be significant and our early nomination total reflects a similar drop in numbers for Breeders' Cup nominations for this crop of three-year-olds." **Triple Crown Nominations cont. p8**

Shades of Things to Come...

Saint Liam showed flashes of brilliance at three, taking a Churchill Downs allowance test by 9 1/4 lengths in June. The bay was second in the Iowa Derby in July, then suffered through a short-lived turf career, finishing 10th in the GII National Museum of Racing Hall of Fame S. at Saratoga. Off the board once again in a main-track allowance at the Spa at the end of August, he was given a break before returning to win an Aqueduct allowance in December. He made good on that promise at four, winning an optional claimer at Gulfstream before splitting Peace Rules and Funny Cide when second by a head in the Feb. 29 GII New Orleans H. Third to Peace Rules in the Apr. 3 GII Oaklawn H., he was sidelined by foot problems until the Woodward, but has been on his game ever since. The only red flag has been the five-year-old's tendency to drift wide at the top of the lane, a habit that was clearly in evidence yesterday, but that did not cause Dutrow any anxious moments. "I don't know why he drifts out, but I knew if he got to play his game he'd be tough," the trainer said. As for the future, he added, "I really wouldn't mind going to [the G1 Dubai World Cup, Mar. 26], but I don't know if the owners want to do that."

He was sent off the 4-5 favorite, but Rock Hard Ten was all out to get this win. The ebony colt first gained attention when he ran second in last year's GI Santa Anita Derby. He was disqualified and placed third in that race, losing his chance to earn his way into the Kentucky Derby, but joined the Triple Crown fray with a distant runner-up finish in the Preakness. Fifth in the Belmont S., he bounced back to take the July 10 GII Swaps S. at Hollywood, but disappointed when sixth as the 9-10 chalk in the Aug. 8 GI Haskell Invitational H. Rock Hard Ten exited that race with a fever and didn't reappear until making his first start for Dick Mandella in the Dec. 26 GI Malibu S., where he closed from 10th to score by a half length. Odds-on to repeat with an extra quarter mile this time, he was far back early, but kicked it into gear as they approached the final bend. He looked like he had the race in hand, taking control as they wheeled into the stretch, but started to tire in the final furlong and had to pull out all stops to hold on. Mandella said the winner would be pointed for either the Mar. 5 GI Santa Anita H. or the Mar. 26 G1 Dubai World Cup. A half-length winner over Afleet Alex in the GI Champagne S. in October, Proud Accolade was off at 5-2 in the GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile, but failed to fire and finished sixth. Trainer Todd Pletcher decided to try blinkers in the Dec. 18 GI Hollywood Futurity, but after watching the colt fade to fifth that afternoon, he pulled off the hood and dropped his charge into this one-turn test. Odds-on to get back on track, Proud Accolade was tucked in behind horses on the far turn when he had to check sharply and lost all momentum. But, only momentarily deterred, the Florida-bred angled to the outside and rallied to the lead before drawing clear. His conditioner is hoping that the three-year-old will now be able to target the major two-turn events, but he is keeping his options open. "He's four-for-four and has a perfect record around one turn now--and you'd like to think that a mile and a sixteenth around two turns would be the same thing," Pletcher said. "You'd like to think he'd get a distance. I'm not sure what's next, but I wouldn't rule out either the Swale [Mar. 5, GII, seven furlongs] or the Fountain of Youth [Mar. 5, GII, nine furlongs] at this point." All eyes were on the previously unbeaten High Fly, but Closing Argument put his two-turn experience to use to upset the odds-on favorite. The winner of the NATC Futurity at Delaware Sept. 4, the bay ran third in the In Reality S. Oct. 23, second in the Jack Price Juvenile S. Nov. 13 and was most recently runner-up in the \$1-million Delta Jackpot S. Dec. 4. Here, the Florida-bred glided along in the second spot as Kansas City Boy set the pace. He moved through between horses to hit the front in midstretch, shook off High Fly's challenge and drove to his first graded victory. "At least this answers the question about getting the distance," said winning trainer Kiaran McLaughlin. "We've talked about going to the UAE Derby [G2, \$2-million, Mar. 26], but now that he's won this--we haven't really decided." As for the favorite, trainer Bill White said, "He just got a little tired late. We're certainly disappointed to lose, but I still think he ran a very good race. Sis City has climbed the ranks from maiden claimer to multiple graded-stakes winner and, the way she handled this Grade II field, it won't be long before she adds a Grade I to her resume. Trainer Rick Dutrow Jr. knew he had something special from her first start off the \$50,000 claim, a 16-length romp in the Sept. 12 Mongo Queen S. at Monmouth Park. "She just ran away from them, so we knew we had a good horse," Dutrow said. Inspired by that effort, the New York-based horseman next sent the filly to the Oct. 9 GI Frizette S. where she set the pace before tiring to be third. She was on the front end early once again in the Oct. 30 GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies and did herself proud, hanging on for fourth.

The Start of a Streak...

Undaunted by her Breeders' Cup experience, Sis City returned to the Big Apple and annexed the Nov. 27 GII Demoiselle S. in front-running fashion and was the even-money chalk to make it two in a row in her three-year-old bow. She broke sharply, was allowed to cruise along through a half in :47.85 and six furlongs in 1:12.56. Six in front when they hit the eighth pole, she was tapped once by jockey John Velazquez and was under a hand ride as she extended that margin to the wire. "Holy cow!" Velazquez said. "She really surprised me. I slapped her with the whip and she started running...she finished up pretty quick." As for what's next, Dutrow said, "If you look at her form, she needs her races spaced a good distance apart. I think we'll run her next in that race at Tampa [Florida Oaks, Mar. 19] and that should set her up just right for the Kentucky Oaks [GI, May 6]."

Yougottawanna beat Officer in the 2001 Cal Cup Juvenile, but ran just three times at three and lost all nine starts at four. Dropped into the claiming ranks last year, the gelding was haltered for \$50,000 after an eight-length victory at Golden Gate in February and again for \$80,000 after winning by six lengths at Bay Meadows in April. The chestnut made his first start for trainer Jerry Hollendorfer in the 2004 Seabiscuit, held last May, and prevailed by 3/4 of a length. He added a win in the Aug. 26 Governor's H. at Sacramento two starts later, but faltered badly and was eased in Oct. 16 Cal Cup Classic, finishing eighth. Returned to Northern California, Yougottawanna proved he still did with a win in the Nov. 26 Forty Niner H. at Golden Gate, then kicked off 2005 with a third-place finish in the Jan. 1 Lafayette H. Sent right to the front in quest of his second straight Seabiscuit score, the speedy Cal-bred went right to the lead, dashed off a half in :45.44 and six furlongs in 1:09.48 and held Jake Skate at bay.

Medallist resorted to his old habit of drifting in the stretch, but none of his rivals could take advantage,

allowing the handsome colt to take this race named for his grandsire. After posting brilliant wins in the GIII Withers S. and the GII Dwyer S. in May and July, respectively, the dark bay tired to fifth in the GII Jim Dandy S. Aug. 8. He was favored in the

GI King's Bishop S. Aug. 28 at Saratoga, but drifted out on the turn and wound up a distant seventh. Though he was given time off to recuperate from quarter crack woes, he ran fifth as the favorite in the GIII Fall Highweight H. at Aqueduct Nov. 28. Medallist rebounded with a straight-running win in Calder's Kenny Noe Jr. H. Dec. 18 and was the slight second choice here. Breaking alertly, he got away with a first quarter in :22.73 and cruised through the turn. He began to drift towards the outside rail in the stretch, but jockey Jose Santos got after him with a few right-handed taps, and Medallist came home safely in front. "He's done that once in a while," said winning trainer Allen Jerkens. "He gets quarter cracks. I hope he doesn't have another one." The Hall of Fame conditioner has big plans for his charge. "I'd like to win a big race--a Grade I--with him like the Met Mile [May 30]. Those Grade Is really increase their stud value."

Acquired for \$425,000 at last year's Fasig-Tipton Calder Sale, Maddalena made quick work of her career opener in romping by 5 3/4 lengths over a sloppy track at Churchill Downs Apr. 30 on the Kentucky Oaks undercard. But that proved to be her last appearance for a while, and it wasn't until Jan. 16 that the stocky chestnut returned to the races. She overwhelmed eight rivals in an entry-level allowance that day, earning a 102 Beyer Speed Figure for her 6 3/4-length victory, and was the prohibitive choice in her stakes bow. Prominently positioned from the start, Maddalena struck the front with a quick three-wide move on the turn and began to open up as John Velazquez went to work on her. Looking for their first Triple Crown race win, Godolphin led the owner nominations at 17 in 2001, 20 in 2002 and 19 in 2003, but did not have a single sophomore eligible in 2004. Overbrook Farm, which has won six Triple Crown races, leads the owners this year with nine. For the second straight year, Todd Pletcher leads all trainers with 34 Triple Crown prospects. As always, Kentucky has the most representatives on the list at 232, followed by Florida at 44 and California and Maryland at 12. There are also 11 Irish-bred nominees and nine from Canada. Extending his run at the top of the list to three years, A.P. Indy led all sires with 16, followed by second-crop sire Fusaichi Pegasus at 11.

Fabian Takes Over as TRPB President:

The Thoroughbred Racing Protective Bureau has hired Franklin J. Fabian, an assistant section chief in the Counter-Terrorism Division at the Federal Bureau of Investigations' Washington headquarters, to succeed retiring Paul Berube as the organization's president. Staying on for a month transition period, Berube will officially retire Apr. 1, with Fabian slated to take over Feb. 28. On the heels of a 20-year career with the FBI, Fabian was promoted to the counter-terrorism section following Sep. 11, 2001, and during his tenure, was involved with the investigation and dismantling of international terrorist groups and their funding mechanisms. Created as a multi-jurisdictional investigative and security organization to assure the highest standards of integrity in Thoroughbred racing, the TRPB serves to prevent and uncover the illegal use of drugs in race horses. Since 1999, the operation has placed much of its attention on the integrity of the pari-mutuel pools, having added a wagering analyst to its staff last year.

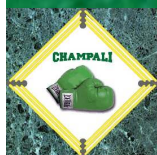
