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A RECORD SETTING DAY AT KEENELAND

Seven-time Grade I winner **Ashado** (Saint Ballado) may have been standing calmly in the rear walkway beforehand, but a firestorm swirled around the champion filly when she entered the sale's ring yesterday at the opening session of the Keeneland November Breeding Stock Sale in Lexington.

The four-year-old was the subject of an intense bidding duel between John Ferguson, representing Sheikh Mohammed bin Rashid Al Maktoum, standing in his customary spot not far from the auctioneer stand in the back; and Demi O'Byrne and John Magnier, for Coolmore, bidding from inside the pavilion this time around.

The two teams reprised their battle at the September Yearling sale, where Ferguson outlasted Magnier for a colt by Storm Cat--Tranquility Lake, and the action was no less riveting yesterday. Both inside the pavilion and out, there was little noise from the throng gathered five-deep around the perimeter of the ring. In the blink of an eye, a succession of million-dollar bids took the tote to \$3 million before the tempo slowed to a near crawl as the interested parties refused to reveal their hands. The bidding resumed in earnest and the two parties engaged in hand-to-hand combat from about the \$6-million point forward, with Ferguson upping the ante from \$7.7 to \$8 million in an attempt to discourage the opposition. Coolmore came right back with a bid of \$8.7 million, but Ferguson proved to have deeper pockets, going to an even \$9 million. The final price easily eclipsed the previous world record for a broodmare--the \$7.1 million paid by John Magnier in 2003 for Cash Run. "We're developing a farm at Jonabell and Sheikh Mohammed is very keen to have the very best broodmares on that farm in order to give it the best chance at success," Ferguson commented. "Quite frankly, she is an absolutely outstanding broodmare prospect. In all the time we've been here, there's never been a mare that had quite such a race record and so much quality as well. We're very excited about it."

APTITUDE IS BY EMERGING SIRE OF SIRES A.P. INDY

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An Impeccable Race Record

From day one, Ashado was something special. A winner of four of her six starts at two, including the GI Spinaway S., the \$170,000 Keeneland September grad missed out on a championship when she finished runner-up to Halfbridled in the 2003 GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies. She earned year-end honors last season, however, winning the GI Kentucky Oaks and the GI Breeders' Cup Distaff. After losing her first two starts of 2005, some questioned whether she'd lost a step, but she went on to silence those critics with a Grade I treble in the Ogden Phipps H., the Go For Wand H. and the Beldame S. A second-place effort in the GI Breeders' Cup Distaff would have made her the all-time leading money winner for a distaffer, but she was headed late and settled for third. She retired with a record of 21-12-4-3 and earnings of \$3,931,440. It was John Ferguson's task to make sure he left with the goods. "As you know, Sheikh Mohammed is a man who loves to have the very, very best, whether they be the yearlings, racehorses or broodmares for the future. He decided some time ago that this was a very special offering and he was very keen to secure her for the paddocks here in America." Ferguson added that it will be some time before a decision is made on a possible mate for Ashado.

Pletcher Wins the Bet...

During an impromptu gathering with the press following the auction, the connections of Ashado--owners Jack and Laurie Wolf, Paul Saylor, Johns Martin and trainer Todd Pletcher--reflected on the events of the day. "She's been such a wonderful filly," commented a happy, but red-eyed Laurie Wolf. "She deserved every penny [of the final bid]." Prior to selling, Jack Wolf, also teary-eyed, and Pletcher entered into a gentleman's bet, each scribbling in their catalogs the projected final bid. Pletcher proudly opened his book to a page which bore nothing except--\$9,000,000. "I think he had inside information," quipped Wolf. For his part, Pletcher had mixed emotions. "Obviously, you're sad when a horse like this goes out of your barn, but as a trainer, you just want to do the best you can with each horse and send them out healthy and sound and come into the sale looking as well as she did," he said.

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Song + Poetry = Music to Adam's Ears

Courtlandt Farms' Don Adam came to the Keeneland November sale looking to add some pedigree and race performance to his broodmare band, and he got both when he secured the eight-year-old Storm Cat mare **Saudi Poetry** for \$2 million. Selling as hip [106](#) out of Taylor Made's consignment, Saudi Poetry is in foal to that farm's Unbridled's Song. "We're trying to upgrade our broodmare band--we race primarily," said Ernie Retamoza, Jr., an advisor to Adam. "We're just trying to look for a solid group of broodmares that can get us top-class runners, in addition to the ones we already have, and the Storm Cat mares seem to be producing." Retamoza added, "Saudi Poetry is a big, strong mare. She's good up front, especially for a Storm Cat. She looks like the kind of mare that will produce." Saudi Poetry, winner of the GII Louisville Breeders' Cup H., was originally a \$1.7-million yearling purchase by The Thoroughbred Corp., but sold for \$2.2 million at Keeneland November in 2003. Coincidentally, it was at that sale that Adam went deep for another Storm Cat mare, paying \$3.15 million for Santa Catarina's dam, Purrfectly. Retamoza said that Courtlandt currently has about 25 broodmares, but is selling a few at Keeneland to make room for new--and improved--blood. "We'll have fewer but better mares," he said. Adam, who breeds under the name TAC Holdings Inc., boards his mares at Lane's End, where the foals are weaned before being sent down to his farm in Ocala.

It's Been an Adventure for Courtlandt Farms

After buying Saudi Poetry earlier in the day for \$2 million, Courtlandt Farms representative Ernie Retamoza, Jr. continued the hunt for top-flight mares. Retamoza went to \$3.7 million for Grade I heroine **A.P. Adventure** (A.P. Indy--Nataliano, by Fappiano). Consigned by the Taylor Made Sales Agency, acting as agent for Bob and Beverly Lewis, A.P. Adventure was one of the best in her division last year in Southern California, winning the GIII Santa Ysabel S. and GI Las Virgenes S. for the Lewises. She first went through the ring at Keeneland September in 2002, where she sold for \$170,000. She realized \$425,000 as a Fasig-Tipton February juvenile a few months after that, and her subsequent exploits on the track boosted her value significantly. Retired this spring, she was cataloged here as hip [186](#), in foal to leading sire Storm Cat. Commenting on her appeal, Retamoza said, "She was a big, nice filly, and obviously a great racemare. I think she'll be a great addition to our racing program, and being in foal to Storm Cat was a plus." Asked how far Courtlandt Farms was willing to go for A.P. Adventure, Retamoza laughed and said, "Who knows? You can see how far we went."

Five Minutes, \$5.3 Million for Taylor Made

One often hears of a stallion being the backbone of a farm, or a mare as the foundation of a breeding operation. Overbrook's all-universe Storm Cat or Will Farish's and W.S. Kilroy's Lassie Dear come to mind. But lately, it's been a 'nick' that has been especially good to the folks at Taylor Made. The nursery's stallion Unbridled's Song appears to have developed a particular affinity for Storm Cat mares, and yesterday that cross was responsible for a top-priced mother-son duo, both of whom were consigned by Taylor Made. First came hip [176](#), an Unbridled's Song weanling colt out of **Zing** (Storm Cat). A full brother to the promising two-year-old Half Ours, the handsome gray was the focus of a spirited bidding duel, with Half Ours' co-owners Aaron and Marie Jones securing the colt on a \$1.7 million bid. Then Zing stepped into the ring as hip [177](#), and the Joneses, along with their bloodstock advisor Buzz Chace, who did the bidding, went right back to work. With the action concentrated in the front of the pavilion, Chace saw off all challengers and watched the hammer drop on his \$3.6-million purchase. In less than five minutes of action, the two Taylor Made consignees grossed \$5.3 million. The farm's Frank Taylor, who was all smiles in the back of the ring, commented on the Unbridled's Song/Storm Cat cross. "It's been absolutely magic," he said. "I've never seen a bad one bred like that. Those two just fit each other like a glove. We've known about it for a while, and we've been hammering that cross. Not only with Unbridled's Song and Storm Cat daughters, but with granddaughters as well. It just works great. Buddha [winner of the GI Wood Memorial in 2002], of course, started it off. That was the first one bred that way. But there are so many in the pipeline that are just awesome. It will be the greatest nick, I predict, that you'll see in the business." Hip 176 was the second-highest priced colt ever to sell at Keeneland November, following the Storm Cat--Spain colt that went for \$2.4 million in 2003.

Holding Court, Once Again

In what was becoming a recurring theme, Ernie Retamoza Jr., bidding on behalf of Don Adam's Courtlandt Farms, landed an impeccably bred filly with a plump seven-figure price tag. Seated beside trainer Graham Motion, Retamoza zeroed in on a handsome weanling daughter of Storm Cat and staved off the challenge of Coolmore's Demi O'Byrne to nab hip **279** for \$1.7 million. It was the second time during the session a weanling sold for that price. Hip 279 became the co-third-highest-priced weanling in Keeneland's history and the second-highest-priced filly, behind Seattle Slew's half sister Ghashtah (Nijinsky II), who was knocked down to Shadwell Estate for \$2.3 million in 1987. "She was an awesome filly, a very nice Storm Cat," said the congenial Retamoza of hip 279. "She's going to be a great addition to our racing program, and furthermore a great addition to our broodmare band. She was an outstanding individual. She was a very correct filly, great body, great balance and a beautiful presence about her." In all, Courtlandt Farm bought six horses, including Saudi Poetry, A.P. Adventure, and New Dice, for \$9,190,000, an average of \$1,531,667. Lane's End, agent, consigned hip 279, the sale of whom followed on the heels of another success for the company. Six lots prior, hip **273** was purchased by Coolmore chief John Magnier for \$3.1 million. An unraced three-year-old daughter of Kris S., hip 273 is out of French champion Coup de Genie (Mr. Prospector) and is thus a half to another French champ, Denebola, as well as Snake Mountain, Glia, Loving Kindness, and Moonlight's Box, the dam of Bago (Fr). Asked about the sale of the two horses, Lane's End's Will Farish commented, "Well, I think both of them were right in line with what we expected. The Storm Cat filly was an exceptional filly, and for a weanling, I think that was a very good price. You don't see many of them in the sale, that's the thing. But as Storm Cat weanlings go, she was as good as anything you could want. We were very happy."

Marriage Made in Heaven

Wife for Life (Dynaformer), the dam of Grade I stakes winner Hollywood Story (Wild Rush), had a new home yesterday after being knocked down to B. Wayne Hughes' Malibu Farms for \$2.2 million. Stakes-placed on the track, the 11-year-old mare (hip [169](#)) is in foal to leading sire A.P. Indy. "She was a gorgeous mare and a proven producer, and they're hard to come by," said Ned Toffey, general manager at the Hughes-owned Spendthrift Farm. Toffey said that Hughes came into the sale with a short list, at the top of which was Wife for Life. "It's been very, very competitive, and by the time you weed out the ones you don't like physically, you end up with a very select group," he said. "It's very competitive on those mares. We've gotten shut out on a few. But honestly, this was our pick of the sale. We're very pleased to have this one. We don't plan on buying a lot more." Toffey said a decision hadn't been made as to whom Wife For Life will be sent to next year.

Hit or Miss

Philip Steinberg traveled up from Florida to see his mare **Miss du Bois** sell yesterday as hip [51](#), but opted to buy her back when bidding stalled out at \$2.5 million. By Mr. Prospector, Miss du Bois is the dam of Film Maker (Dynaformer), the Grade-I winning millionaire who was recently third in the GI Breeders' Cup Filly and Mare Turf. Film Maker was runner-up in the 2004 renewal of the F/M Turf. Despite a flurry of bidding in the front of the pavilion for the 11-year-old Miss du Bois, Steinberg was hoping for more. "Yeah, I thought she'd bring more money, somewhere north of \$3 million," he admitted. Steinberg said he would "probably" sell the A.P. Indy foal Miss du Bois is carrying, but plans on racing a yearling Capote half sister to Film Maker. "We've also got a full brother by Dynaformer that maybe I'll sell next year as a yearling," he added. Steinberg purchased Miss du Bois, in foal to Phone Trick, for \$90,000 at this sale in 2000.

Unbridled Enthusiasm

A total of 20 mares sold in excess of \$1 million yesterday, compared to 15 in 2004 and the session average of \$545,117 sets a new standard for the November sale. The results came as no surprise to sales officials. "We anticipated going in that it was going to be a very strong session," said Geoffrey Russell, Keeneland director of sales. "One of the indicators I was most interested in was the median and having the median increase dramatically was very rewarding. The only disappointing fact was the not-sold rate was a little higher than we hoped, but that's the exuberance of the market as well." And as for today's session? "Looking through the makeup of the catalogue, I feel that Monday is stronger than [today], but I'd hope the enthusiasm would carry over and help lift it up," he commented.

Hip 333, Louju, 11, Silver Hawk--Secretarial Queen, by Secretariat
Consigned by Paramount Sales, Agent LXXII

Louju's son Castledale (Ire) became one of the rare horses to win a Grade I race on both turf and dirt, capturing the 2004 Santa Anita Derby and the grassy Shoe-maker Breeders' Cup Mile this term. Louju, selling in foal to Fusaichi Pegasus, is out of the GISP Secretarial Queen, a half to GISW Tisab and GSW Nicosia.

Hip 347, Miss Mirage (Ire), 5, Alhaarth (Ire)--Mahrah, by *Vaguely Noble
Consigned by Windfields Farm Limited, Agent IV

Sporting a sterling turf pedigree, Miss Mirage is a half to Fahim (GB) (Green Desert), who established a new course record at Laurel for 10 furlongs (1:58 3/5) winning a minor grass stakes and also ran second in the 1997 GI Sword Dancer Invitational H. More importantly, Miss Mirage's half Oratorio (Ire) (Danehill) became a major player in Europe last year, earning champion two-year-old honors in France after winning the G1 Prix Jean-Luc Lagardere-Grand Criterium. Oratorio was even better at three, taking the G1 Eclipse S. and G1 Irish Champion S., beating Motivator (GB) both times.

Hip 400, Scoop, 7, Gone West--Til Forbid, by Temperence Hill
Consigned by Mill Ridge Sales, agent

Out of graded-stakes winner and GI Kentucky Oaks third Til Forbid, Scoop earned \$337,170 and won the GIII Indiana Breeders' Cup Oaks. Her first foal, the Forest Wildcat filly Coolwind, is a two-year-old of 2005 and, just this past weekend, was a good third in the GIII Pocahontas S. at Churchill.

Unbridled Wind is a stakes-winning full sister to the very talented champion Banshee Breeze, who collected five Grade I events and won more than \$2.7 million. Unbridled Wind's 2002 A.P. Indy colt, Indy Storm, realized \$750,000 as a yearling, while her year-younger colt by Storm Cat made \$1 million as a yearling. Unbridled Wind sells in foal to Awesome Again, sire of Ghostzapper, Wilko and Round Pound.

It was a bit like that yesterday: step into the photo booth, raise your hand or wave your catalogue, and get your picture taken buying a million-dollar mare. There were 18 million-dollar mares or fillies yesterday, plus two seven-figure weanlings. Between Sunday at Fasig and Keeneland yesterday, there have already been 24 million-dollar fillies or mares. The highlights, of course, were new world record holder Ashado, at \$9-million (and didn't she look the part?), and Riskaverse Sunday night at Fasig, at \$5 million. But what looks very significant is that 15 of the 24 seven-figure fillies or mares made \$2-million-plus, whereas nine made between \$1 million and \$2-million. In other words, more made more than \$2 million than made less. It's significant because it tells us something about the cost of buying into the top of the mare market: whatever you thought you might be able to buy that for, you can near enough double it.

They say September previews November, and since September shattered, by \$60-million, the previous record for a horse sale, there was every reason to believe November would be good this year. But one thing that doesn't take into account--can't take into account--is the change in November catalogues from year to year. This is generally not the case at the yearling sales. Over a group of 7,000 commercial yearlings, the collective pedigrees should look roughly the same from year to year (allowing for about four-percent 'inflation' in black type each year). But it ain't necessarily so, as far as the available pedigrees at the mixed sales are concerned. Whereas with yearlings I feel we can confidently assess whether the market is up or down based on raw price data, because the pedigree component is stable, it can vary widely from November to November. So we're not necessarily comparing apples to apples.

But, boy, is it up. Combining Fasig's Sunday sale and Keeneland yesterday, 292 horses have sold so far, for \$130,304,000, and an average of \$446,247.

Last year, the corresponding two sessions saw 404 horses sell for a total of \$101,662,300 and an average of \$245,561. The corresponding totals show 29 percent fewer horses have sold for 30 percent more money, and an average increase of a whopping 82 percent.

That number is going to come down to earth a little today. Last year, Tuesday averaged virtually the same as Monday, whereas the catalogue suggests this year, today's numbers will fall well below yesterday's. Despite the Kentucky Derby victories of Genuine Risk and Winning Colors, and three winning females in the Breeders' Cup Sprint, a lot of soul searching is normally required before any modern-day American trainer will even consider tackling the males with a top-class filly. Perhaps the explanation is that prize money is so strong in America's filly and mare events that there isn't any need for them to step outside their own division. Only now and again do we see the likes of Azeri, Serena's Song and Lady's Secret attempt to confirm their superstar status by conquering the males.

Perhaps it is simply harder for females to conquer the stronger, heavier males on dirt than it is on turf, because European racing abounds with examples of the female of the species proving deadlier than the male. Some of these females, such as Miesque, Ridgewood Pearl, Six Perfections, Pebbles and Miss Alleged, have travelled to the U.S. to prove their point against the males on Breeders' Cup Day.

It has been a similar story in some of Australia's most competitive events, such as the Melbourne Cup over two miles and the W.S. Cox Plate over 1 ¼ miles. Both of these Group 1 races have been won by the magnificent Makylbe Diva, who was taking the Melbourne Cup for a third time when she successfully carried co-top weight of 128 pounds a week ago. The Cup has also been won by Ethereal, Jezabeel and Let's Elope in the last 15 years, while other recent female winners of the Cox Plate are the remarkable Sunline (1999 and 2000) and Dane Ripper.

Makylbe Diva's glorious swansong boosted her earnings to more than A\$14,000,000. With an Aussie dollar currently being worth about 0.73 of a U.S. dollar, her earnings convert to more than \$10,000,000, a figure which casts a huge shadow over the bankrolls achieved by America's finest distaffers, such as Azeri, Ashado and Spain.

Yet the British-bred Makybe Diva was led out unsold at 19,000gns when she was offered as a weanling at Tattersalls' December Sale of 1999, even though she was bred to a similar pattern to the 1994 Derby winner Erhaab. Both were sired by members of the Danzig male line from daughters of Riverman.

Makybe Diva is the first foal of Tugela, who was culled by Juddmonte for 21,000gns after showing little sign of ability in two juvenile starts in 1997. Tugela lacked size and substance, so it made good sense to send her to Desert King in her first season. While of only medium height, Desert King was described by Timeform as "a sturdy, good-quartered colt who generally took the eye" and he possessed the masculinity one expects to find in a son of Danehill.

Makybe Diva's family was introduced into the Juddmonte stud book with the purchase of her third dam Katsura, a talented Windfields-bred daughter of Northern Dancer. As Desert King is inbred 3x3 to the powerful and muscular Northern Dancer, Makybe Diva is inbred 4x4x4 to the world's most famous stallion.

Katsura, a Group-placed winner at up to 1 ½ miles, was mated to a variety of good-class stallions. Interestingly, none of her three foals by Riverman was much good, but a visit to the Derby winner Roberto resulted in Rambushka, Makybe Diva's very useful second dam. Rambushka won at Listed level at around a mile and a quarter, but she too lacked a bit of size and proved so disappointing as a broodmare that she was consigned to the sales as an 11-year-old, when she was sent to Japan.

Japan was also the destination for Desert King after he had stood four seasons in Ireland. He has enjoyed sporadic success with those Irish crops, notably siring Mr Dinos (G1 Ascot Gold Cup), Chelsea Rose (G1 Moyglare Stud S.), Darsalam (a Group 1 winner in Germany), Makybe Diva and a handful of Group 3 winners. Makybe Diva's efforts have earned him a return to Australia this year after a gap of two years, and he has two other Australian Group 1 winners to his credit in 2005, in the miler Desert War and the Queensland Derby winner Lachlan River.

All four of the Group 1 winners from his Irish crops have won over at least 1 ½ miles, with Mr Dinos stretching his stamina to 2 ½ miles. This suggests that the stamina elements in Desert King's pedigree have overwhelmed the speed associated with his sire Danehill, who reverted to sprinting after seeming to find a mile a little too far.

It isn't hard to see how this has happened. Although Desert King was fast enough to win the G1 National S. over seven furlongs at two and the G1 Irish 2000 Guineas over a mile at three, he didn't possess a quick change of gears. In fact, he seemed rather lazy and was normally running on strongly at the end of his races, including when he won the Irish Derby. Perhaps the most influential ancestor in his pedigree was his second dam Dish Dash. This winner of the G2 Ribblesdale S. over 1 ½ miles was by Bustino, a St Leger winner who numbered an Ascot Gold Cup winner among his best representatives.

Bearing in mind that the first five mares in Makybe Diva's bottom line are by Riverman, Roberto, Northern Dancer, Vaguely Noble and Amerigo (San Juan Capistrano H. over 1 ¾ miles), it isn't surprising that Makybe Diva has proved capable of winning Group 1 races from 1 ¼ miles to two miles. In true Australian fashion, she even dropped back to seven furlongs to win earlier this year. Let's hope that her broodmare career proves as richly rewarding as her time on the track.

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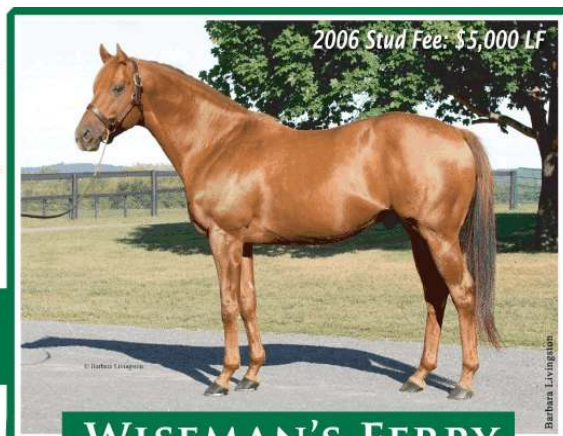

SKY CUDDLE RETIRED **Sky Cuddle (Aus)** (Snippets {Aus}--Suggestive {Aus}, by Al Hareb), winner of the 2004 G1 Emirates S., has been retired and was covered by Redoute's Choice (Aus) at Arrowfield Stud in the NSW Hunter Valley. Trainer Peter Moody opted to send the five-year-old mare to stud instead of starting her in the Emirates again on Saturday. "We gave her every chance, but didn't think she was on top of her game," Moody said. "We didn't want to run her for the sake of running her. She's done a good job." Owned by Queensland breeder Stuart Ramsey, Sky Cuddle won six of her 32 starts and earned A\$862,280. She finished fourth in the Oct. 22 G1 Cox Plate in her career finale.

MCEVOY OUT FOR THE SEASON Jockey Kerrin McEvoy will miss the ride on Warrsan (Ire) in the Nov. 27 G1 Japan Cup and is unlikely to compete again this year as he recovers from surgery for a deep laceration to his forehead sustained in a fall at Flemington Saturday. McEvoy was discharged from Epworth Hospital Monday and will recuperate with his family at Streaky Bay in South Australia. Victorian Jockeys' Association Chief Executive Des O'Keefe said McEvoy's face, struck by a hoof in the spill, was still badly swollen. "It looks like he's lost 14 out of 15 rounds in a boxing match," O'Keefe said. "He's having trouble speaking at the moment. He's in good spirits, but just feels a little uncomfortable." The incident prompted Racing Victoria Chief Steward Des Gleeson to advocate face masks for riders to give them greater protection. "I don't believe there is enough protection in that area and, in this day and age, I think we can design an appropriate helmet which can give better protection," Gleeson said, adding that such a helmet would have prevented McEvoy's injuries. "Full facial protection is certainly on the agenda," he remarked. "It's just a matter to see if we can get a design that suits." The Australian Jockeys' Association national review panel met a fortnight ago and is pushing forward with a redesigned helmet.
