FU-HO O REMAINS UNBEATEN

Heavily favored **Fusaichi Ho O (Jpn)** (Jungle Pocket {Jpn}) maintained his unbeaten record with a determined victory in Sunday's G3 Kyodo News Service Hai at Tokyo. After racing in midpack, the bay colt angled to the outside turning for home. He hit the front with 200 meters remaining, then held off **Direct Catch (Jpn)** (Special Week {Jpn}) in the final strides.

Pacesetter Flying Apple (Rahy) stayed on for third, while **New Beginning (Jpn)** (Agnes Tachyon {Jpn}), a 3/4-brother to champion Deep Impact (Jpn), settled for fourth. "[Fusaichi Ho O] is very game," said winning rider Katsumi Ando, who admitted to being relieved that the colt won. "I think a right-handed course should be more suitable for him." Fusaichi Ho O captured his career opener in October before defeating champion juvenile Dream Journey (Jpn) in the G3 Tokyo Sports Hai Nisai S. in November. He landed the G3 Radio NIKKEI Hai Nisai S. in December last out. Fusao Sekiguchi's three-year-old will make his next appearance in the G1-Jpn Satsuki Sho (Japanese 2000 Guineas) Apr. 15.

Yes, it was on Polytrack, but he had run big races prior to that. Throw out his well-beaten 3rd in the Breeders' Cup Juvenile, in which he came from 9th to reach contention turning for home. JAZIL RETURNS THURSDAY

GI Belmont S. winner **Jazil** (Seeking the Gold) will have his second start of the year Thursday at

Gulfstream Park. The Shadwell Stable colorbearer is one of eight entered for Thursday's seventh race. In his first start since winning the Belmont last June, Jazil was second in a Jan. 5 Aqueduct allowance. The nine-furlong two-older-than allowance also attracted **Corinthian** (Pulpit), disqualified from a first-place finish in last year's GII Fountain of Youth S. In his only start since the Fountain of Youth, Corinthian ran third in a

Saratoga allowance on July 29. Jockey Javier Castellano has the mount on Corinthian for trainer Jimmy Jerkens. Regular rider Fernando Jara will ride Jazil for trainer Kiaran McLaughlin.

STRONG CONTENDER RETIRED

John Oxley's multiple graded stakes winner **Strong Contender** (Maria's Mon--Kopenhagen, by Dynaformer) has been retired from racing after connections discovered the four-year-old colt had suffered a torn tendon, possibly in the

the 2005 Keeneland April juvenile sale, Strong Contender won his lone start at two, a six-furlong Arlington maiden. At three, he went on to take the GII Dwyer S. in July and the GII Super Derby in September. He also finished third in the GI Blue Grass S., GII Peter Pan S. and GI Haskell Invitational. Breeding plans were not announced.

No one would be too surprised if, year after year, A.P. Indy or Sadler's Wells were to come up with highly rated offspring on the World Thoroughbred Racehorse Rankings. But we are surely allowed to be a little taken aback that the much-travelled Candy Stripes, who never won a stakes race, has managed to do so.

In 2004 and 2005 his Brazilian son Lundy's Liability was rated 115, thanks to Grade II successes in Dubai and the U.S. Much higher up the list in 2005, with a figure of 124, was another of Candy Stripes's sons--that admirable miler Leroidesanimaux,



who was considered inferior only to Ghostzapper and Saint Liam among America's older horses. Then in 2006, a third son, Invasor, was officially rated the best horse in the world, with a rating of 129. For good measure, Candy Stripes ranked as the broodmare sire of Candy Ride, who, on the same mark of 127 as Mineshaft and Johar, shared the title of America's highest-ranked older horse in 2003.

How do we reconcile this list of important descendants with the fact that Candy Stripes had gone virtually unnoticed when he started his stallion career in the U.S. in 1987 and 1988? His first crop, conceived at the age of five, consisted of three live foals from seven mares bred, and his next crop numbered four foals from eight mares. I believe that three of his seven foals

raced, but only one was a winner. Clearly Candy Stripes would have quickly slipped into total obscurity had he stayed in Maryland, but a deal was done which took him to Argentina.

Breeders in the Southern Hemisphere have traditionally made very good use of stallion prospects which were considered not up to scratch by their northern counterparts. The main blot on Candy Stripes's CV

was his failure to win a stakes race, but he had been beaten less than two lengths in the French 2000 Guineas, to earn a Timeform rating of 115. **Cont. p4**

There was also plenty to like about his bloodlines. Candy Stripes's arrival in Argentina in 1989 coincided with some major successes for his sire, the highly effective Blushing Groom, in Europe, where Nashwan won the 2000 Guineas and Derby to initiate a Group 1 four-timer, and Snow Bride finished second in the Oaks (a race she was later awarded). Candy Stripes also had Classic connections on his dam's side, even though his second dam, Prodice, had cost the equivalent of only around £500 as a yearling in France. Prodice proved a bargain, winning the G1 Prix Saint-Alary on a disqualification prior to finishing second in the French Oaks. Timeform considered her a rather unlucky loser of the French Oaks, noting that "Prodice didn't have the run of the race, and Piggott, who rode her, claimed that she should have won. After being shut in, she produced an electrifying burst of speed over the last furlong which carried her into second place in the field of 21, just half a length behind Rescouste." As Rescouste went on to finish second in the Arc, Prodice clearly possessed a lot of ability.

Prodice passed on a large measure of this ability to her daughter Sangue, a triple Grade I winner in the U.S. Candy Stripes's dam is Sangue's winning sister Bubble Company, who, though not as talented on the race-track, proved the better broodmare. In addition to producing Candy Stripes (her first foal), Bubble Company became the dam of the Group 1 winners Intimiste (in France) and Bubble Gum Fellow (in Japan).

Argentina's breeders showed more faith in Candy Stripes and were quickly rewarded. His second crop contained four group winners, including Seaborg, who took the G1 Gran Premio Internacional Carlos Pellegrini, and Criollito. Both these colts were transferred to the U.S., where they were joined by Different, a champion filly from Candy Stripes's third crop. Criollito and Different adapted very well, becoming graded winners in 1996. Different's Grade I successes helped earn Candy Stripes a place at Taylor Made from the 1997 Northern Hemisphere season. Although his reputation received another boost when his imported daughter Victory Stripes became a Grade II winner in 1999, Candy Stripes American crops again generally proved much less effective than his excellent South American foals, presumably because his mares weren't of an equivalent standard.

Invasor's pedigree supports this theory. His dam, Quendom, is an unraced sister to Reina Victoriosa, a winner of the G1 Gran Premio Eliseo Ramirez over seven furlongs on turf as a two-year-old, and to Qualified, a Group 2 winner over 1 9/16 miles on dirt. Imported to the U.S. for her broodmare career, Reina Victoriosa has made a bright start, her first two foals being the stakes winners Ready Ruler and More Than Regal (both by More Than Ready).

Invasor's broodmare sire, Interprete, was the champion juvenile of his generation in Argentina, thanks to an unbeaten campaign of four victories. Three of those wins came at Group 1 level over six, seven and eight furlongs. Although he won only two of his five subsequent starts, he was good enough to win the Gran Premio de Potrillos in a record time of 1:33.20.

Invasor's fifth dam, Umbella, was imported from Britain to Argentina, her main attraction being that her female line traced to the legendary Pretty Polly, through Pretty Polly's very talented granddaughter Arabella. This branch of the Pretty Polly family is perhaps best known in recent decades for having produced the top European sprinters Marwell, Huntercombe, Sigy and Double Form.

With his record now standing at 10 wins from 11 starts following his Donn H. success, Invasor has already done enough to earn a place as a stallion. With his first four dams being daughters of Interprete, Cipayo, Crown Thy Good and Atlas, his pedigree is pretty much an outcross for most mares and he could have a very useful function to serve in the Maktoums' breeding operation.

POLISH NUMBERS FILLY TOPS F-T MIDLANTIC

Overdue Number, a five-year-old Polish Numbers mare, brought \$20,000 to top yesterday's Fasig-Tipton Midlantic Winter Mixed Sale at the Maryland State Fairgrounds in Timonium, Maryland. Heather Larson purchased the dark bay, catalogued as [hip 21](#), from the draft of Legacy Farm. Overdue Number was produced by the stakes-placed Overdue Ghost (Silver Ghost) and is a full-sister to Ghostly Numbers, a MSW of over \$280,000. Overdue Number sold in foal to GI Preakness S. winner Red Bullet. A scaled back catalogue in 2007 resulted in gains in both average and median. The averaged jumped 27.9 percent, from \$4,399 to \$5,627, while the median jumped 100 percent, from \$2,000 to \$4,000. The buy-back rate dipped from 32.4 percent to 26.2 percent. Emma-Jayne Wilson Injured at Fair Grounds:

Jockey Emma-Jayne Wilson was injured yesterday at New Orleans' Fair Grounds after being thrown from her mount in Monday's ninth race, a 5 1/2-furlong second-level allowance on the turf. Wilson was aboard Sweetening (Menifee) when the four-year-old colt, nearing the top of the lane, stumbled and fell. Wilson was taken to Tulane Medical Center in downtown New Orleans. According to on-track EMS staff, she was complaining of pain in her lower right leg and right ribcage. Wilson is riding at Fair Grounds for the first time this season. She won the 2005 Eclipse Award for champion apprentice jockey. There was no immediate word on the condition of Sweetening.
