ONWARD AND UPWARD AT OBS FEBRUARY?

The Ocala Breeders' Sales Company's Selected Two-Year-Olds in Training sale starts today at noon at the OBS Complex in Ocala, Florida, and consignors and sale officials are hoping that the first juvenile sale of the year picks up right where 2006 left off. The market for two-year-olds in training has grown by leaps and bounds over the past decade, and last year saw several records go by the wayside. The highlight of 2006, of course, was the sale of the world-record, \$16-million The Green Monkey at Fasig-Tipton Calder. But even without Coolmore's blockbuster buy, the two-year-old market was exceptionally strong.

At the end of the year, new marks for average, median and gross had been established. According to *The Blood-Horse's Market Watch*, North American juvenile sales saw 3,107 youngsters gross \$217,100,214 in 2006, for an average of \$69,875 and a median of \$24,000. Moreover, the average at the five major select sales was a record \$194,950. The strength of the market over the past few years means that buyers have had to dig deeper into their wallets to land their top prospects. OBS February, however, is still viewed by many as a sale where buyers can get plenty of bang for their buck. "Our average pinhook price is around \$70,000, not \$200,000, so we don't eliminate some of the buyers that don't have the budget to buy \$1 million horses," said OBS General Manager Tom Ventura. "They can come in here and buy a \$100,00 to \$200,000 horse horse. But the studies have shown that, over the last 10 years, this sale is producing around 11 or 12 percent stakes winners, and that's the most important thing. Brother to Ill-Fated Filly Sells Today...

Last year's OBS February sale was marred by a tragic accident that claimed the life of a Forest Camp filly from Don Graham's consignment that was expected to be one of the sale toppers. The filly, who had worked an eighth in :10 flat, flipped in the paddock just prior to entering the ring and was subsequently euthanized. A half-brother to that filly sells today. Catalogued as hip 49, the colt is by Siphon (Brz) and hails from the consignment of W.D. North Thoroughbreds, which purchased the colt for \$45,000 at the 2006 Fasig-Tipton Kentucky July sale. W.D. North said he didn't realize until after he acquired the colt that he was a half to the Forest Camp filly. While the story has a sentimental

streak to it, hip 49 has done plenty to recommend himself. Under very little encouragement, he worked a quarter in :21 2/5 at the Feb. 4 breeze show ([Video](#)) and galloped out well. There's plenty to like in terms of pedigree, too. The bay is a son of the In Reality mare Daggett, herself a three-parts sister to MSW I'll Get Along, dam of champion and GI Kentucky Derby winner Smarty Jones.

Remember That 'Dream'?

As if taking cues from the OBS marketing department, West Point Thoroughbreds' **Dream Rush** (Wild Rush) became the latest graded stakes winner to graduate from the February sale. On Saturday, the three-

year-old filly upset last year's GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies heroine Dreaming of Anna with an impressive 3 1/2-length tally in the GIII Old Hat S. at Gulfstream. Dream Rush was purchased by West Point at this sale a year ago. On behalf of Terry Finley's operation, agent Buzz Chace paid \$285,000 for Dream Rush, who had previously been a \$90,000 Keeneland September yearling. Nick de Meric consigned the filly for D & B Ventures. "That was fun, wasn't it?" de Meric said in response to Dream Rush's effort Saturday. "It was a wonderfully exciting result, and we're delighted for her connections. In their different ways, they've all been very supportive. I'm talking about West Point, but also Buzz Chace and Rick Violette Jr. [who trains the filly]." Dream Rush came into the 2006 February sale boasting a swift :10 1/5 breeze for the eighth ([Video](#)), and buyers, including Chace, took notice. "She was a very fast filly at home," de Meric said. "Then she worked well at the sale and sold accordingly." De Meric added that Dream Rush has the tools to make an impact in her division this year. "It takes more than speed to win a race like that, and she's got what else it takes, too," he said. "Hopefully, that's just the beginning." Violette is now targeting Dream Rush for a tilt in either the GII Fair Ground Oaks or GII Bonnie Miss S., both on Mar. 10, with the GI Kentucky Oaks being the ultimate goal.

Hip 60, c, Stormy Atlantic--Elise', by Distinctive Pro
Consigned by Nick de Meric, Agent II

A \$60,000 yearling purchase at last year's Fasig-Tipton Saratoga sale, this Jan. 19 foal is by last year's leading juvenile sire Stormy Atlantic. Produced by a winning half to Grade I heroine Without Feathers (Brave Shot {GB}), the colt, a New York-bred, breezed an eighth in :10 1/5 during the first breeze show Feb. 4 ([Video](#)). "He's a lovely animal," said consignor Nick de Meric. "He's a big, strong mature kind of horse. He's an economical mover; he doesn't waste any time in the air--it's all forward motion. What I liked best about his breeze is how well within himself he did it. The rider never even cocked his stick."

Hip 65, c, Lightnin N Thunder--Far Sighted Sal, by Distant View

Consigned by Hoby & Layna Kight, Agent I

From the first crop of Lightnin N Thunder, a MSP son of Storm Cat, Hip 65 earned the bullet at the first show when he sped through a quarter mile in :21 flat ([Video](#)). "He's a real racehorse," said consignor Hoby Kight. "We paid \$105,000 [at last year's OBS August sale], so that tells you right there how good-looking he is. But that's what it costs to buy a horse like that." The Florida-bred gray is from the family of graded stakes winner Deputy G.

Hip 71, f, Hook and Ladder--Gaye's Blossom, by Thirty Six Red

Consigned by Niall Brennan Stables, Agent VI

This miss gave a good account of herself, and her freshman sire, with a smart :10 1/5 work Feb. 4 ([Video](#)). A \$47,000 OBSAUG yearling, she is a daughter of Gaye's Blossom, a half to MSW Gallant Step (Go Step) and four other stakes horses. Hip 71 is a registered New York-bred. Hook and Ladder is graded-stakes-winning son of Dixieland Band.

Hip 73, f, Posse--Gilded Thunderbird, by Gilded Time
Consigned by Leprechaun Racing, agent

Hip 73 sold for \$30,000 as a KEENOV weanling before bringing \$130,000 as an OBSAUG yearling, and her connections hope she can turn another profit here. The Apr. 22 foal didn't work Sunday after posting a sharp :10 1/5 breeze at the first under-tack show ([Video](#)). "She looks like 'right now,'" said consignor Leprechaun Racing's Mike Mulligan. "People are looking at her and thinking that they can be there for Keeneland and the five-furlong stakes at Churchill. Which isn't to say she won't train on. She uses herself very well." Hip 73 is from the first crop of GII Riva Ridge Breeders' Cup S. winner Posse, a son of Rahy.

Hip 86, f, Yes It's True--I Died Laughing, by Montbrook
Consigned by Don Graham, agent

Hip 86 didn't get a chance to strut her stuff at the first breeze show, but put her best hoof forward Sunday with a :10 2/5 breeze ([Video](#)). The chestnut Florida-bred is the second foal out of a winning full-sister to SW & GSP Kings Command.

Hip 93, f, Pulpit--Joi's Flame, by Strawberry Road (Aus)
Consigned by Classic Bloodstock (Danzel Brendemuehl), Agent II

Hip 93's breeze in :10 3/5 at the Feb. 4 show wasn't the day's fastest, but the bay looked to be unextended as her jockey sat chilly through the work ([Video](#)). Named Fire n' Brimstone, she is out of the stakes-placed Joi's Flame, a half to multiple stakes winners Ulises and Farallones, and is from the extended family of GI Breeders' Cup Mile winner Singletary. Hip 93 is bred along the same lines (Seattle Slew over Strawberry Road {Aus}) as juvenile champion Vindication. She was a \$90,000 KEESEP yearling.

Hip 126, c, Dixie Union--Ocean Air, by Pleasant Colony
Consigned by Leprechaun Racing, agent

A Mar. 10 foal, hip 126 flashed his speed with a :10 1/5 drill during the Feb. 4 show ([Video](#)), but has a family steeped with stamina influences: his first three dams are by Pleasant Colony, Bates Motel and Stage Door Johnny, respectively. "He's made fast, but is out of a Pleasant Colony mare and he looks like he'll carry that on," said Leprechaun's Mike Mulligan. "He's been real well-received." Hip 126 was a \$180,000 FTKJUL yearling buy. In 2006, his sire Dixie Union's juveniles averaged \$178,941 for 17 sold.

Hip 155, c, Forest Wildcat--Rhiana, by Runaway Groom
Consigned by CloverLeaf Farms II & Brent Fernung, agent

This colt worked :10 3/5 at the Feb. 4 show ([Video](#)), then came back Sunday to shave a tick off that time. He is the first foal out of Rhiana, who banked over \$280,000 on the track and placed in the GI Santa Maria H. "He's a big, nice colt," said CloverLeaf's Brent Fernung. "He breezed well and had a real good gallop out. He's been well-accepted. I think he's one of the best-looking horses on the grounds." Hip 155 was knocked down for \$130,000 as a KEESEP yearling. Last year, four Forest Wildcat two-year-olds sold for an average of \$267,500.

Hip 167, c, Johannesburg--Star de Mint, by Star de Naskra
Consigned by True South LLC, agent

Hip 167, from the immediate family of GI Breeders' Cup Distaff winner Adoration, breezed the fastest eighth of the day at the second breeze show, stopping the clock in :10 flat ([Video](#)). He was produced by Star de Mint, a half-sister to Adoration and to GSP Mo Mon (Maria's Mon). A half-brother by Touch Gold sold for \$325,000 at last year's OBS April sale. This colt has not previously been offered at auction.

Hip 173, c, **Songandaprayer**--Sweet Cameron, by Devil's Bag

Consigned by Eddie Woods, Agent XXXIX

Songandaprayer has gotten off to a quick start at stud, and the son of Unbridled's Song saw his 2006 juveniles average a very strong \$227,474. Hip 173 stopped the clock in :10 1/5 at the Feb. 4 show (Video) and did not go back to the track Sunday. A \$37,000 yearling purchase, he was produced by a half-sister to MGSW Something Ventured (Cobra King). A full-sister to this colt sold for \$360,000 at last year's Fasig-Tipton Midlantic juvenile sale in May.

Hip 181, c, **Hold That Tiger**--True Tear Drops, by Is It True
Consigned by Murray Smith, agent

One of six juveniles on offer here by freshman sire Hold That Tiger, hip 181 worked an eighth in :10 2/5 during the first breeze show (Video). The dark bay, a Feb. 7 foal, is the first offspring of True Tear Drops, a stakes winner of \$134,034. "He's a nice, athletic colt, and the buyers seem to be looking," said consignor Murray Smith. Hip 181 sold for \$72,000 as a KEENOV weanling and \$50,000 as a FTKJUL yearling.

Consignor Dean DeRenzo:

"I'm excited about the sale. We had a lot of people here the week before the sale, more than even the March sale. We've had people from California--Samantha Siegel was here--people from Kentucky, people from New York. It's amazing that they were here a week in advance. From the first breeze show through Thursday, it was really busy. I think it's a lot of people that have business in Ocala; they're going to see horses they have in training or their mares, and they can look at those and at the same time look at horses for the sale."

Consignor Niall Brennan:

"From my perspective, I think we've had more people around than we would have normally at Miami. We've had plenty of people look at the horses through the week, and last Monday after the breeze show."

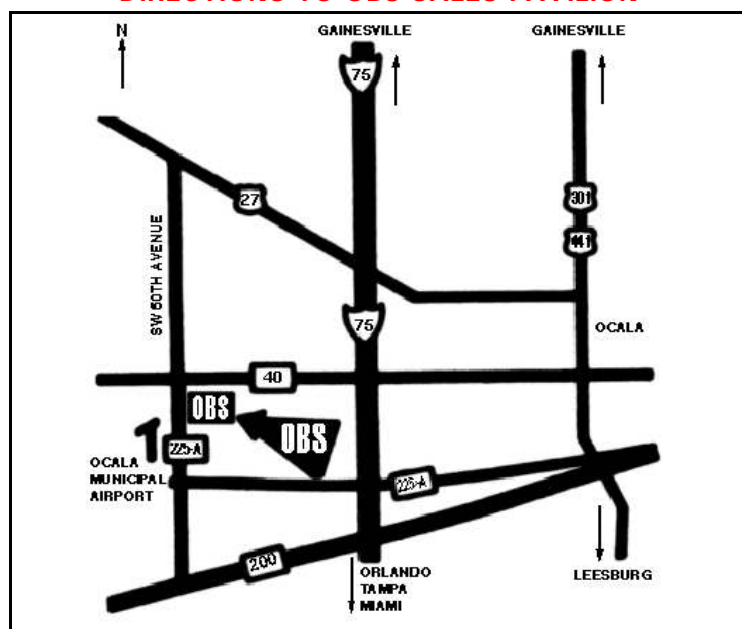
Consignor Mike Mulligan of Leprechaun on finding value:

"Everybody here has gotten so good at finding good horses, but the auction system isn't perfect and there's going to be value in every spot. You always hear about the horses that, as we all say, fell through the cracks. There are always going to be opportunities. Surely, the obvious horses are going to be expensive. But for those buyers that work hard and get down to that next echelon, there will always be opportunities. We bought Imperial Reign [by Indian Charlie] for \$67,000 at the Fasig-Tipton July sale and resold her last year for \$1 million [to Darley at the OBS March sale]. Certainly, there were a lot of sharp people there, but we were able to get lucky and buy here. If everyone thought she was that kind of filly, than she would have cost a lot more. If you go back through the two-year-old sales, you'll find a lot of graded stakes winners that cost under \$200,000."

Tom Ventura, OBS general manager, on the upcoming two-year-olds in training sales:

"I think the market has been excellent and should continue on. I think things within the industry are on the improve--we now have slot machines at Gulfstream, which is certainly going to impact the purses. Slot machines in New York have been inevitable for the last few years, and they're coming. They have slots in Pennsylvania. So the purse structure across the country is going up, and that will obviously trickle down to the sales."

Taking the title of North America's Leading Freshman Sire has historically been a pretty reliable stepping stone to even greater honors. In the 1960s, for example, the list was headed by Bold Ruler, Never Bend and Northern Dancer, while the next decade produced such as Tom Rolfe, Buckpasser, What A Pleasure, Raja Baba, Roberto and Mr. Prospector. The '80s maintained this impressive strike rate, with Foolish Pleasure, Seattle Slew, Alydar, Danzig, Fappiano and Crafty Prospector among the champions.

Since then, though, fewer of the top freshman sires have gone on to make a major impact, notable exceptions being Silver Deputy, Seeking the Gold, Red Ransom and Distorted Humor. In view of this trend--and the tendency for today's breeders to desert young stallions after their first or second seasons--it was fair to wonder whether Successful Appeal could maintain the type of results which brought him the 2004 title.

Of course Successful Appeal had done outstandingly well to take the title. Having never won at the Grade I level, this son of Valid Appeal had retired to Walmac South in Ocala at a fee of only \$5,000 in 2001. From a book of less than 80 mares, he ended up with 43 first-crop live foals.

By the end of 2004, no fewer than six of them had become stakes winners and the total now stands at nine--a very impressive 21 percent stakes winners. Three of the nine--Closing Argument, Lunarpal and Accountforthegold--have achieved the status of graded winners, which equates to seven percent. Unfortunately Successful Appeal's second crop, consisting of 35 named foals sired at a fee of \$5,000, has proved less effective and none of the 35 has so far become a stakes winner. However, that setback has proved to be only temporary. Successful Appeal's third crop has turned the spotlight back onto this exciting young sire, to the extent that his fee has been raised from the \$25,000 he commanded in 2005 and 2006 to \$40,000 this year.

His daughters Richwoman and Chagall fought out the finish of the GIII Debutante S. last July and two other stakes winners emerged in the shape of Appealing Zophie and Freetoleave. Appealing Zophie became her sire's first Grade I winner when she easily landed the Spinaway S. and further Grade I victories probably await her, judging by her decisive success in the GIII Silverbulletday S. *cont. p7*

With this third crop numbering 40 named foals, Successful Appeal has had only 118 representatives so far, but his 2007 crop of juveniles is his largest so far, with

more than 60 foals. Everyone needs to remember that this crop was also conceived at a fee of only \$6,000, but it achieved a yearling average of over \$65,000, with a top price of \$250,000. Needless to say, there was even more interest in the weanlings from his first Kentucky crop, sired at a fee of \$25,000. They averaged

more than four times that fee. The only shame is that this crop numbers only 50 foals, because Successful Appeal's 2005 season was brought to a premature end by a colic attack in late-April. Thirty of the 113 mares booked to him hadn't been covered by that stage, but he covered more than 100 mares last year.

When I last wrote about Successful Appeal in this column, his first runners still hadn't been tested at three. I commented that "for him to really take off at his new base, breeders will want to see him sire important winners around two turns."

I'm pleased to say that he has since shown himself capable of siring a wide variety of performers. Closing Argument, despite being out of a daughter of Mr. Greeley, stayed a mile and a quarter well enough to finish an excellent second to Giacomo in the Kentucky Derby; AccountfortheGold took the GIII Stuyvesant H. over a mile and an eighth; and Successful Affair collected a pair of stakes victories at around a mile and a half at the end of last year.

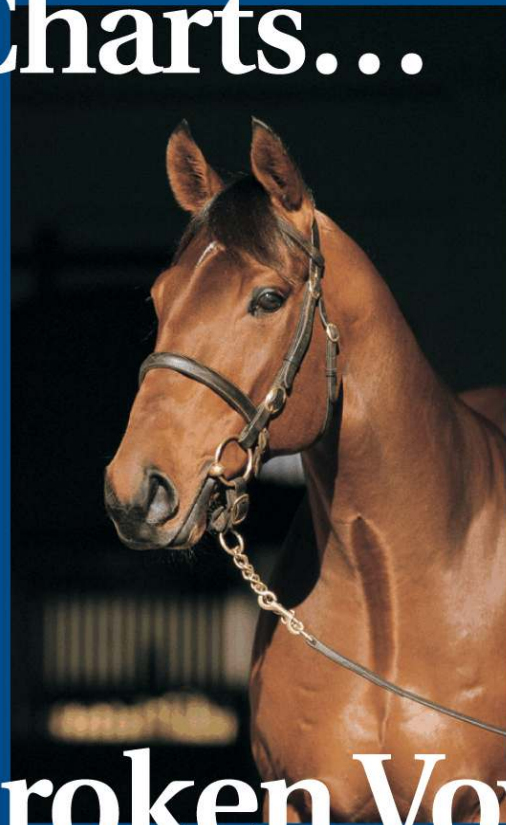
Although three of Successful Appeal's four Grade II victories were gained at around six furlongs at two, three and four, he stayed a mile well, as he showed with his victory in the GII Withers S., and he turned in a couple of respectable efforts over 1 1/16 miles.

Although speed at up to a mile is likely to be his progeny's main asset, there is every chance that he will continue to sire the occasional two-turn performer.

His sire, the accomplished Valid Appeal, won the GII Dwyer H. over 1 1/8 miles before siring several Grade I winners over the same distance. And his dam Successful Dancer has a pedigree which features inbreeding to two Kentucky Derby winners--3x3 to the 1965 winner Lucky Debonair and 4x3 to Northern Dancer. This inbreeding helps explain why this daughter of the speedy Fortunate Prospect gained five of her seven wins over dirt routes, and why her brother Suave Prospect stayed well enough to run Thunder Gulch to a nose in the Florida Derby.

If Appealing Zophie has overcome the headstrong tendencies she sometimes showed at two, she too must have good prospects of staying a mile and an eighth. She is out of a daughter of Hawkster, something she shares with 2005's champion three-year-old colt Afleet Alex. Hawkster is clearly doing much better as a broodmare sire than he did as a sire. A Grade I winner over a mile and a half on turf, Hawkster managed to sire only four stakes winners among his first 234 foals. His runners in Britain included Benatom, who ran creditably over two and a half miles on the flat, and Ocean Hawk, a smart steeplechaser who won at up to three and a quarter miles. Clearly Hawkster could provide Appealing Zophie with some staying power.

Appealing Zophie cost \$105,000 as a yearling and \$150,000 as a two-year-old. Her second dam, the Seattle Slew mare Sodeo Sodeo, never raced, but she was a three-parts-sister to the Florida Derby winner Croeso and she also had three grandparents in common with the Grade I winner Slewpy. Sodeo Sodeo is also the dam of Yankee Mon, a stakes winner over 1 1/16 miles.

While Appealing Zophie has a distinguished third dam in Melody Tree, she is still a good example of Successful Appeal's rare ability to upgrade his mares. His Average Earnings Index stood at 2.47 to the end of 2006, even though his mares had a Comparable Index of only 1.38, which surely bodes very well for his Kentucky crops.

OWNER/BREEDER MCCAFFERY DIES

Trudy McCaffery, who in partnership raced such popular California stars as Bien Bien, Bienamado, Came Home, Free House, and Pacific Squall, died Feb. 12 at her home near Rancho Santa Fe, California, after a lengthy battle with cancer. She was 62. McCaffery and her former racing partner, John Toffan, both born in Canada, made up one of the Golden State's top breeding and racing outfits for years. Homebred Free House, McCaffery's favorite horse, was California Horse of the Year in 1997-98. Free House won eight stakes, including the Pacific Classic S., Santa Anita H., and Santa Anita Derby, all Grade I. Free House took his act east in the spring of 1997. He distinguished himself by placing in all three Triple Crown events, topped by a rousing effort against Kentucky Derby winner Silver Charm in the Preakness S. Free House finished a head behind Silver Charm and was a head in front of Captain Bodgit. Six years earlier, McCaffery and Toffan had watched their Mane Minister finish third in all three classics. So special was Free House to McCaffery that she made arrangements for her ashes to be spread at Vessels Stallion Farm near Bonsall, California, where Free House stood prior to his death in 2004. McCaffery earlier sprinkled some of her father's ashes at Vessels. McCaffery's father, Fritz Hanson, is a member of the Canadian Football Hall of Fame. Bien Bien and his son, Bienamado, plus Came Home and Pacific Squall were also California Grade I winners raced by McCaffery and Toffan together and/or in partnership with others. Bien Bien and Bienamado (a homebred) were turf stars, with seven Grade I scores between them. Homebred Came Home was victorious in the GI Pacific Classic, GI Santa Anita Derby, and the GI Hopeful S. at Saratoga. Pacific Squall scored her top triumph in the 1992 GI Hollywood Oaks. McCaffery, who loved golf and was good at it, played a big part in racing outside the owner's box. She founded Kids for the Cup, which introduced youngsters to racing, and served on the board of directors of the Edwin J. Gregson Foundation. Named for the late Southern California trainer, the foundation raises money to help backstretch workers. **Cont. p2**

A winner of the GIII Bashford Manor S. at two, Miss Ra He Ra is a granddaughter of Prime Prospect, the granddam of Breeders' Cup Juvenile hero Macho Uno. The two-day sale concluded with gross expenditures down from \$7,772,700 in 2006--when 444 sold--to \$6,332,300 given for 371 head this year. McCaffery also served on the board of the California Thoroughbred Breeders Association, Oak Tree Racing Association, and Thoroughbred Owners of California. "Her biggest thrill in racing came when she was named to the Oak Tree board," said friend and trainer Jenine Sahadi, who is president of the Gregson Foundation. "It was her proudest moment, and she took it very seriously. She would come up here every weekend during the Oak Tree meeting, stay at my house, leave first thing in the morning, and then go down to the track. She would then get back to my place, get dressed, make-up just perfect, then go to her Oak Tree board meeting. Even though she was going through chemotherapy, she felt it was her duty to go and she'd present trophies and mingle. She brought people together and lived for that." McCaffery was represented as breeder by her first Breeders' Cup winner in 2006. Round Pond, a filly she co-bred with Toffan, won the GI Emirates Airline Breeders' Cup Distaff at Churchill Downs. McCaffery also bred and/or raced in partnership such other graded stakes winners as A. P. Assay, Areyoutalkintome, Bosque Redondo, Del Mar Dennis, Elaborate, Kumari Continent, Ninebanks, Odyle, Snorter, and Visible Gold. A native of Winnipeg, Manitoba, Canada, McCaffery is survived by her mother, Maxine, and three sisters. Her father died Feb. 14, 1994. In lieu of flowers, the family requested that donations be made to the Edwin J. Gregson Foundation, P.O. Box 660039, Arcadia, Calif., 91066-0039.

FIELDS FAVORED AT CLOSE OF FUTURE

POOL 1 At Sunday's conclusion of Pool 1 for the Kentucky Derby and Oaks Future Wager, the mutuel field was favored in both divisions. While the field closed as the narrow 3-1 favorite for the May 4 Kentucky Oaks, the biggest development in the betting proved to be **Rags to Riches** (A.P. Indy), who was listed at 20-1 on the morning line and promptly dropped to the 7-2 second choice following her impressive victory in Saturday's GI Las Virgenes S. Reigning two-year-old champion **Dreaming of Anna** (Rahy), who was the 4-1 second choice when the pool opened Thursday, drifted up to 7-1 by the pool's end, due to her third-place finish in the GIII Old Hat S. at Gulfstream Saturday. At the end of the four-day run for the opening pool of the Kentucky Oaks Future Wager, a total of \$66,206 was wagered on 22 betting interests. Also heading the Derby Future Wager, the field closed as the favorite at odds of 5-2. **Nobiz Like Showbiz** (Albert the Great), who was the second choice when betting began, remained steady at 8-1 when the period ended at 6:30 p.m. Sunday. Breeders' Cup Juvenile winner and reigning champion **Street Sense** (Street Cry {Ire}) dipped narrowly from morning line odds of 12-1 down to 10-1.

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TEMPERATURE BELIEVED TO HAVE IMPACT ON POLYTRACK

As officials and horsemen at Turfway Park work daily to find an optimum Polytrack surface for winter racing, there is growing sentiment the synthetic material is affected by temperature or swings in temperature. Recently, horsemen have expressed concern over the balling-up of Polytrack, which is a mixture of sand, rubber, carpet fibers, and wax. Though the surface itself is uniform, they said collection of the material in the hoof and shoe could lead horses' legs to hit the ground unevenly. From Jan. 1-Feb. 11, there were four catastrophic breakdowns at Turfway--two during racing and two during training hours--said Dr. Nancy Davis, state veterinarian for the Kentucky Horse Racing Authority. Last year in January and February, there were none on Polytrack, but in 2005 on the old dirt surface, there were 13 fatal breakdowns the first two months of the year. "There's no question trainers are concerned, and Turfway is communicating with us," said Marty Maline, executive director of the Kentucky Horse Racing Authority. "The cushion was balling up, and we're dealing with that problem. With that said, people recognize it's a much better surface compared to the old dirt track. They want Polytrack to work--even the guys with the strongest concern." During the winter of 2006, when there were no catastrophic injuries, there were rampant complaints about "kickback" of the material during races. That in part led management to change the surface in August by adding Spandex and cabling material. The surface got much quicker--perhaps too much so--and apparently didn't play well when unusually cold temperatures set in over Kentucky. "Without question, the horsemen felt the kickback and slower times were not that big an issue compared with what's going on with the balling-up in the feet," Maline said. "It seems to be temperature-controlled. Every day we're checking the temperature and what maintenance was done to the track. We're meeting on a daily basis." Woodbine, the Canadian racetrack that installed Polytrack in the summer of 2006, experienced problems when the temperature dropped. Conrad Cohen, president of the Ontario HBPA, indicated officials are looking for answers because "there's nothing in the material that's freezable." Horsemen at Woodbine requested to use toe grabs on the surface. "There are tremendous benefits to the new surface, such as soundness, consistency, drainage, and absorption of shock," Cohen said. "It's kind of like a new pair of running shoes. But we haven't had time to totally evaluate it in terms of temperature. A total evaluation of the surface cannot be made in such a short period of time because of inconsistency of climate. It did appear at different temperatures to have kickback, and some horsemen had concerns about track consistency." For more click [here](#).

If you could have dinner with an historical figure, who would it be?

I'd like to sit down with any one of the early settlers who traveled across the country in a covered wagon. When you fly over the country, you see what they had to endure. It's mind-boggling what they had to endure. They had to have such grit and toughness just to survive--I have a lot of respect for them. AUSTRALASIA



STREET SMART Darley Australia left its stamp on the Inglis Classic Yearling Sale in Sydney. Buyers clamoured for yearlings by impeccably bred Danehill freshman Untouchable (Aus), and G1 Dubai World Cup victor Street Cry (Ire) accounted for the session topper at yesterday's finale. Street Cry has had just three runners in Australia to date, but the fact that he produced G1 Breeders' Cup Juvenile winner Street Sense, as well as stakes winners Summer Doldrums, Street Sounds and Big Timer, has not gone unnoticed in Australia. The stallion had 21 sold in Australia last season, with a top price of A\$210,000, but that figure was eclipsed Monday when agent John Hutchinson, with a Hong Kong-based client on his cell phone, went to A\$350,000 for a leggy, dark brown colt by the son of Machiavellian. The good-looking yearling was offered by Jamie Middleton's Redbank Stud. He is out of winning Alzao mare Greendale Lass (Aus), herself a half-sister to G1SW Sheer Kingston (Aus). While he had the looks and presence to warrant inclusion in the sale company's showpiece Easter sale, his page was considered slightly lacking by some. But not by Hutchinson, who had trainer Gary Moore by his side as he outstayed trainer Les Bridge to post the winning bid. Hutchinson pointed out that the colt is bred on similar lines to Street Sense, whose dam Bedazzle is a Northern Dancer-line representative, and whose second dam Majestic Legend--a half-sister to Mr. Greeley--is from the Ribot line. Yesterday's session topper is also from a Northern Dancer-line mare via Alzao and Lyphard, and his second dam Fayette Country is by a grandson of Ribot. "He was a beautifully balanced horse and his X-rays were perfect," Hutchinson said. "He has an interesting pedigree and he is an international commodity, with four Group 1 horses on his page. He would have been a good horse at any sale in the world and, in the 2007 market, this is about his value." He added, "His future is probably in Hong Kong."

Rain No Deterrent...

Agent Kieran Moore was among those to persevere as heavy rain fell throughout most of the day, adding a A\$160,000 Danzero (Aus) colt from Floribunda (Aus) (Brief Truce) to bring his purchases to five overall for clients in three states. The colt, out of a winning half-sister to SW Stormy Regent (Aus), was offered as lot 404 by Peter Stewart and Bridget Woodford-Smith's Huntworth Stud in southern New South Wales. Huntworth was one of several boutique vendors who recorded sensational results at the Classic sale. Their Magic Albert (Aus) colt, sold as lot 447 for A\$150,000 to Rosehill trainer Lee Curtis, was another good result. "[The sale] definitely has exceeded our expectations," said Stewart. "But Magic Albert is doing quite well and this colt looks like he'll be a two-year-old." Yarraman Park-based Magic Albert (Zeditave {Aus}) is off to a great start, with the Gai Waterhouse-trained Lieserl (Aus) a fast-finishing second to Danehill Smile (Aus) (Danehill Dancer {Ire}) in the Inglis Classic Saturday. He was leading first-crop sire last term by winners, with 14 saluting the judge, and his yearlings have been warmly received, selling for up to A\$220,000.
