

ALL EYES ON THE CHAMP

Off since his brilliant 10-length triumph in the GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile Nov. 4, reigning two-year-old champion **Street Sense** (Street Cry {Ire}) makes his sophomore debut in today's GIII Tampa Bay Derby. The James Tafel homebred has posted six published workouts at Palm Meadows since mid-February, including a half-mile breeze in :47 Mar. 4 and a five-furlong move in 1:01 Mar. 8. Street Sense will have to be on top of his game to

take this one though, facing off against Sam F. Davis victor **Any Given Saturday** (Distorted Humor). "We're catching one of the best three year olds in the country right now in Any Given Saturday," trainer Carl Nafzger told *Daily Racing Form*. "One who also has the advantage of having a race under his belt over the track. Our horse has done everything right up to this point and I expect him to run big." Any Given Saturday, a \$1.1-million KEESEP graduate, hails from the very dangerous barn of trainer Todd Pletcher. "We're very pleased with the way our horse is training and pleased with his first race back over the track, and hopefully having a race under his belt will be to our advantage against Street Sense," Pletcher told *DRF*.

MAIDEN WINNERS CAN PUNCH THEIR TICKET

Flying First Class (Perfect Mandate) and **Curlin** (Smart Strike), two of the most impressive three-year-old maiden winners this season, clash in today's GIII Rebel S. at Oaklawn Park. The former kicked off his career with a second-place finish going one mile at Turfway last September, but looked like a different animal in his sophomore debut, airing by eight lengths over this course Feb. 19 ([video](#)). The bay earned a Beyer Speed Figure of 107 in that six-furlong heat, which is the highest of any three-year-old on the year. "It's scary how good this horse is," trainer D. Wayne Lukas said. "And it's particularly scary to imagine how good he'll be at two-turns. He is professional beyond belief, and I'm certain he will excel at two turns. He's fast, but very ratable. He won't need the lead." Curlin made quite a first impression in his Gulfstream debut, winning by 12 3/4 lengths Feb. 3 ([video](#)). The chestnut, who stopped the clock at 1:22 1/5 in that seven-furlong contest, was purchased privately following his unveiling and has been transferred to trainer Steve Asmussen. **Teuflesberg** (Johannesburg) and **Officer Rocket (GB)** (Officer), the first and second-place finishers in the Feb. 19 Southwest S. at Oaklawn, square off again here.

Merv Griffin's Kentucky Derby hopes were dashed last year when his 2005 champion juvenile, Stevie Wonderboy, was injured early in his three-year-old season. But another grandson of A.P. Indy might make amends this time around for the show business legend. **Cobalt Blue** won at first asking in a five-furlong maiden at Hollywood last June before finishing seventh in the GII Best Pal S. at Del Mar Aug. 13, but emerged from that effort with a hock injury. The handsome chestnut resumed his career on Valentine's Day with a stylish victory in a six-furlong allowance ([video](#)), and--being out of an El Prado (Ire) mare--should appreciate longer distances. "Time off did the trick," trainer Doug O'Neill told *Daily Racing Form*. "He's shown talent from day one. He's a good-feeling horse. Mentally, I just hope he'll relax going to the first turn and finish." One colt with plenty of experience going two turns at Santa Anita is **Air Commander**, who missed by a head going a mile in his second start over this surface Jan. 12. The big bay earned his diploma Feb. 4 at this distance and came back to take an allowance going nine panels Mar. 4 ([video](#)). Jockey Garrett Gomez previously piloted both Cobalt Blue and Air Commander, and opted for the latter. **cont. p3**

"He's got a little more seasoning than some of the other colts," Gomez reasoned. "He's run two turns three times now and that gives him an advantage, in my mind. He's a very talented colt, as are the others. He's got some quirks which we're trying to resolve, but he seems like he's getting better. Not taking anything away from Cobalt Blue, but I think right now he might be a little behind some of these colts. I mean, he could win, but my agent and I had to make a decision. You never want to be in that situation, but it happened that both horses are running in the same race, and the bridge had to be crossed." From the ever-prominent Todd Pletcher barn comes **Grapelli**, who adds blinkers after finishing third in the GII San Rafael S. Jan. 13.

NADER APPOINTED HKJC EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR

Bill Nader, senior vice president and chief operating officer of the New York Racing Association, has been appointed as executive director of the Hong Kong Jockey Club, according to a press release. Nader, 49, will assume his new duties Apr. 23. "The Hong Kong Jockey Club is one of the best racing organizations in the world and the best not-for-profit business model," Nader said. "I am proud to have the opportunity to work with the Jockey Club and its team of world-class professionals. One of my main goals will be to revitalize the racing product and to continue improving the quality of horse racing. There are many challenges ahead and I look forward to working with a strong team that shares a commitment to excellence." A graduate of the University of New Hampshire, Nader has over 20 years of experience in racing management, first at Liberty Bell and then at Rockingham Park before joining NYRA in the fall of 1994. He has been recognized with the Sam McCracken Memorial Award for Lifetime Contributions to Racing as well as the Good Guy Award by the New England Turf Writers Association and the New York Turf Writers Association in 1994 and 2000, respectively. Nader is currently a member of the Board of Directors at the Thoroughbred Racing Associations, a member of the Program Advisory Council at the University of Arizona Race Track Industry and a member of the Board of Equibase. "The Jockey Club is committed to engaging top notch racing professionals to serve our business in Hong Kong and after a worldwide search, I am delighted to welcome Bill on board to take up the challenge as he has a strong experience with racing business perspective," said Winfried Engelbrecht-Bresges, chief executive officer of the Hong Kong Jockey Club.

"He will become a key member of our team to help us achieve our vision in providing world-class racing and sporting entertainment and to contribute to revitalizing racing and racing business turnover." Nader's departure will leave a void at NYRA, which is currently endeavoring to retain its control of racing in New York. "It's always a disappointment when a company loses one of its key executives; however, we wish Bill every success in his new position, and we congratulate the Hong Kong Jockey Club on an excellent choice for its new executive director of racing," said NYRA Chairman, C. Steven Duncker. "Thoroughbred racing is a global industry, and it is no surprise that when the HKJC searched the globe for top racing talent, their search led them to NYRA. NYRA's record of integrity and expertise in racing is simply unmatched. Thankfully, NYRA's preeminence in the sport of thoroughbred racing affords us a deep bench of racing talent, and our ability to deliver

our signature world-class racing product will not be impacted by Bill's departure."

NEW CAREER FOR ALUMNI HALL MGSW Alumni Hall (A.P. Indy--Private Status, by Alydar) will embark on a new career as a steeplechaser this season. The

winner of the Gill Ben Ali S. and Gill Fayette S. in 2005, the eight-year-old was retired to stud after compiling a record of 28-9-5-2 and bankrolling \$747,756 for owner Will Farish and trainer Neil Howard. But the chestnut refused to cover his mares and found himself at trainer Jonathan Sheppard's barn in Pennsylvania, schooling over logs in preparation for his first start over fences. "They said there was no physical reason why he wasn't fertile--he just wasn't interested," Sheppard said. "I asked if I could geld him, but they said no, so he might go back and be a stallion someday." As for his future as a jumper, the Hall of Fame conditioner added, "It's hard to argue with it, because he could be quite good. It's a bit of a longshot in my mind, real early, but he's a fine-looking horse--a big, scopey type." Alumni Hall could make his steeplechase bow against maidens in late spring or early summer.

BRIGHT CANDLES EUTHANIZED Bright Candles (El Gran Senor--Christmas Bonus, by Key to the Mint), the dam of multiple Grade I winner and leading sire Grand Slam, was euthanized Mar. 13 due to complications from a ruptured uterine artery, according to *The Blood-Horse*. The 20-year-old mare had foaled a Mr. Greeley colt, who was saved. Campaigned by Overbrook Farm and trainer D. Wayne Lukas, the \$675,000 KEEJUL yearling purchase captured the Santa Ysabel S. at three in 1990, when she also placed second in the GI Santa Anita Oaks and third in both the GI Kentucky Oaks and GI Las Virgenes S. The chestnut compiled a record of 34-5-6-8 and bankrolled \$405,091. From the family of Alydar, Bright Candles made an excellent start in the breeding shed, producing the stakes-placed Capote filly Dodie Mae as her first foal, immediately followed by multiple stakes winner Leestown (Seattle Slew) and Grand Slam (Gone West). The latter captured the GI Champagne S. and GI Futurity S. at two before sustaining an injury in the 1997 GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile. He rebounded at three to take the GI Peter Pan S. and closed out his career with a second in the GI Breeders' Cup Sprint before becoming a successful sire at Ashford Stud. Bright Candles later produced the stakes-placed Gold Market (Seeking the Gold) and has a yearling full brother to Grand Slam.

"He makes mistakes, but never looks like falling and he's just exceptional," enthused winning trainer Paul Nicholls. Nicholls added, "For all the races he's won this season--the [G1] Tingle Creek, the [G1] King George--you name it and he can do it. It has been a great team effort, and today was the day we wanted him at his best. He travelled, he jumped and he is just a very very good horse."

CHAMPION RIDER BREAKS ARM IN FALL

Champion jockey Ryan Moore will miss the start of Britain's turf season after breaking his arm in a fall at Lingfield yesterday. Moore parted company with **Vlasta Weiner (GB)** (Magic Ring {Ire}) during the early stages of the opening handicap on the Polytrack and was taken to the nearby East Surrey hospital for X-rays. "Ryan has rung me from hospital and told me he has broken his arm," Moore's agent Tony Hind told *Racing Post*. "We don't yet know the exact extent of the injury, but I would expect he will be out of action for a month at least. It is very disappointing for Ryan, but I want punters to know that as far as this year's jockeys' championship is concerned, it is still all systems go, and I am determined we will make up the lost ground and he will win the title again."
