DREAM RUN IN THE TEST

Showing her customary early speed, **Dream Rush** (Wild Rush) outspinted her GI Darley Test S. rivals through fractions of :22.26 and :44.59, and had plenty left for the stretch, reporting home two lengths clear over **Boca Grande** (A.P. Indy). "The first quarter might have been the whole key," trainer Rick Violette said. "She broke sharp and just dragged [Eibar Coa] there. She wasn't pressured the whole quarter. She accelerates on her own around the turn. She gets other horses off the bridle, and the sooner you get them off the bridle, you take them out of their game. She's just a very, very special horse." **cont. p2**

The field for the GI Haskell Invitational took a hit yesterday when it was announced that **Stormello** (Stormy Atlantic) developed colic Friday night. The 2006 GI Hollywood Futurity winner is on the road to recovery at Midlantic Equine Clinic in New Jersey. "He's past the worst of it, his eye is bright, and he's alert," owner-trainer Bill Currin said. "I'm hoping he can leave the hospital early next week and be vanned back to Monmouth." Currin added that his charge would start next in the GI King's Bishop S. at the Spa Aug. 25 if he recovers in time. Stormello was last seen finishing third in the GII Woody Stephens BC S. Yesterday's G1 Nassau S. had shaped up as one of the most competitive renewals of the Goodwood feature in years, but Johnny Murtagh's hardest task proved to be keeping hold of **Peeping Fawn** (Danehill) en route to a comfortable 1 1/2-length defeat of **Mandesha (Fr)** (Desert Style {Ire}). Already highly accomplished with successes in The Curragh's June 30 G1 Pretty Polly S. and July 15 G1 Irish Oaks, Michael Tabor and Susan Magnier's strapping bay cranked it up again after being allowed some rein approaching the three-furlong marker. "She's a great filly and a class act," commented Murtagh, who guided the 2-1 pick. "She's done it on fast ground and soft, over a mile and a quarter and a mile and a half and she's very special." **cont. p3**

Dream Rush went two-for-two in her juvenile season, then finished second in her sophomore debut at Gulfstream Jan. 20. The West Point colorbearer

bounced back with a smart victory in the GIII Old Hat S. Feb. 10 and made it two straight with a 9 1/4-length tally in the GII Nassau County Breeders' Cup S. May 5. Eight furlongs proved to be too much for Dream Rush in the GI Acorn S. June 9, as she tired late to place second. Cutting back to six furlongs for the GI Prioress S. July 7, she reported home a 2 1/4-length winner. Jockey Eibar Coa was aboard Dream Rush for the Nassau County and the Prioress. He was in the saddle again yesterday.

"It worked out perfectly," Coa said of the Test. "It wasn't my plan to take the lead that easily. I wanted to break and save. When we broke in front and nobody went, we took the lead easily. She gave me a good run around the turn and then opened up a little bit."

Boca Grande, last season's GII Demoiselle S. heroine, rallied from far back to complete the exacta at odds of 30-1. "I just sat behind, like the trainer told me," jockey Julien Leparoux offered. "She made a nice move to the finish. I didn't have too much trouble with traffic and stuff, so I had a good race. The winner is a very good filly, so she's difficult to catch." Boca Grande posted a victory in Aqueduct's GII Comely S. Apr. 14 before finishing fourth in the GI Acorn S. June 9 and third in the GI Mother Goose S. June 30.

Educated on the track since her debut on the first day of April, Peeping Fawn made her ninth outing here and her fifth consecutive run at this level, having broken her maiden at the fourth attempt at Naas May 16. Third in the G1 Irish 1000 Guineas at The Curragh, runner-up to Light Shift in the G1 Epsom Oaks and successful in the G1 Pretty Polly S. back in Kildare in barely over a month, she enjoyed a relative holiday before her domi-

neering display in the Irish Oaks and comprehensively confirmed placings with Light Shift in this decider. Kept to the inner stalking the solid early fractions, she was angled out for her challenge still tanking at the top of the stretch. Putting clear daylight between her and the remainder as Christophe Soumillon looked for racing room for Mandesha, she was always in control despite the steady late inroads the latter made into her advantage. "I didn't want to get boxed in, so I got to the front a furlong sooner than I should," her rider continued. "The Irish Oaks was so easy, it was unbelievable and that was every bit as good--when she hit the front she was a little idle, but she's a true professional." Trainer Aidan O'Brien, who was collecting his first edition, sees her earlier racing experiences as the key to her improvement. "We always thought she was very good, even though she got beat in her maidens and the lads came back always really happy," O'Brien explained. "We were never really worried because she was learning and that's why she has developed a lovely personality and learnt her trade. She has gears which make her very special and is progressing week to week, so if it keeps coming the sky's the limit." While no immediate targets were mentioned for the winner, Alain de Royer-Dupre is looking at the Oct. 7 G1 Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe for the runner-up. Placed in a stalking second as Dancing Edie showed the early way, the dark bay began to make her move on the turn for home and rallied in the stretch to run down the pacesetter.

Zanjero, a distant second behind Nobiz Like Shobiz in last year's GII Remsen S., completed the trifecta in his first three starts of his three-year-old season--the GIII Risen Star S. Feb. 10, the GII Louisiana Derby Mar. 10 and the GI Blue Grass S. Apr. 14. He came within a head of getting his picture taken in the Blue Grass, but could only manage a 12th-place finish in the GI Kentucky Derby May 5. He quickly put that effort behind him and bounced back with a second-place finish in the GIII Northern Dancer BC S. last time June 16. Backed as the second choice here, he stayed within striking distance, hooked up with Bwana Bull on the turn for home and narrowly prevailed following a long drive. Delightful Kiss (Kissin Kris), favored at 2-1 following victories in the GII Ohio Derby June 2 and the Iowa Derby June 29, was a well-beaten fifth.

THE BIG BOYS ARE BACK

Street Sense, **Curlin** (Smart Strike) and **Hard Spun** (Danzig) made it one heck of a Triple Crown this year and following the two-year-old champ's victory in last Sunday's GII Jim Dandy S., it looks like the Jersey Shore faithful will be in for a real treat here. Curlin, who annexed the GI Preakness S. by a head over the Derby hero, makes his first start since his second-place finish behind Rags to Riches in the GI Belmont S. June 9. Hard Spun also makes his first start since the Belmont. The Kentucky Derby runner-up followed his third-place finish in the Preakness with a fourth-place finish in the final jewel of the Triple Crown.

Any Given Sunday?...

Any Given Saturday (Distorted Humor) showed plenty of potential in his two-year-old season as well as the early portion of his three-year-old campaign, but really came of age in his most recent start, posting a four-length tally in the GII Dwyer S. July 4. Trainer Todd Pletcher took last year's Haskell with Bluegrass Cat. "We've given him plenty of time since the [Dwyer]," Pletcher said. "I think the way this horse has trained since then, I couldn't be more pleased. This is a very different horse than the one that ran in the Wood Memorial and the Kentucky Derby." Any Given Saturday was defeated by a nose to Street Sense in the GIII Tampa Bay Derby Mar. 17, then placed third in the GI Wood Memorial S. Apr. 7. He was freshened following an eighth-place finish in the Derby.

Last year's winner **Marchand d'Or** returns to the scene of his finest hour and faces a typically strong overseas challenge as he bids to become the first since Boitron (Fr) to record back-to-back successes. Looking back to his best after three subsequent off-the-board runs when taking the June 25 G3 Prix de la Porte Maillot at Longchamp, the gelding was a fine fourth in the G1 July Cup at Newmarket last time July 13. He has ground to make up with **Dutch Art** on that form, who was 1 1/2 lengths in front when runner-up to Sakhee's Secret (GB). The sophomore looks to have an ideal opportunity to add to his tally at the highest level, having conquered the G1 Prix Morny here last August before following up in the G1 Middle Park S. the following month. He underlined his versatility with a third in the May 5 G1 2000 Guineas at Newmarket and fourth in the G1 St James's Palace S. at Royal Ascot June 19 before reverting to sprinting at the July Festival. "Dutch Art seems in the form that he was in just before the July Cup," trainer Peter Chapple-Hyam said. "I am very happy with him." Dutch Art had been beaten first time up this season by **Major Cadeaux** by 3 1/2 lengths in the G3 Greenham S. at Newbury Apr. 21, but was only sixth in the 2000 Guineas before losing out by a head to **Silver Touch** when second in the G3 Criterion S. back at Newmarket last time June 30.

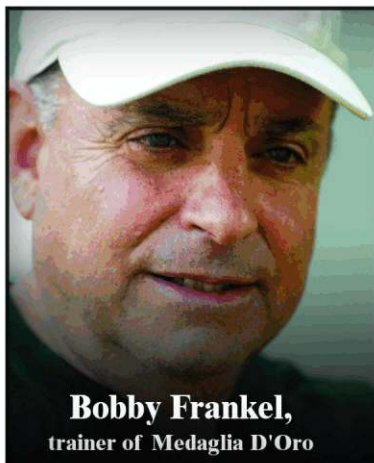

WRITERS UP

LET THE GAMES BEGIN

With last week's running of the GII Jim Dandy S. and today's GI Haskell Invitational S., racing's second season is officially in full flight. Jerry Brown, the owner and operator of the Thoro-Graph sheets, has been impressed with the division and shared his views with the TDN.

"Curlin, Street Sense and Any Given Saturday rank with anything we've seen in quite a while," Brown said. "Curlin and Any Given Saturday have each run negative 3s and Street Sense is slightly worse on his best, but has now run a negative 2 three separate times."

Brown says that, in recent years, Smarty Jones was consistently the fastest three-year-old he has ever seen, but he has been most impressed with the accomplishments thus far of GI Preakness S. winner Curlin.

"It's extremely unusual for a horse to do what he has done," Brown explained. "He basically debuted and ran the same race four times in a row [Brown said Curlin was given zeros for those starts] and then he managed to take a forward step in the Preakness. We were all sitting around just waiting for him to crack and it just didn't happen. And the fact that he made it through the Triple Crown and got a break means he's probably not through yet."

Still, Brown is not willing to call Curlin the winner of today's Haskell.

"Hard Spun is interesting, because he did a lot of running," Brown explained. "He's also gotten a break and I would not be surprised to see him run well and he could even win the race. Any Given Saturday has never ran a bad race. In the Wood and the Derby, he was extremely wide and got the best fig in the Wood, even though he didn't win. His last race [victory in the GII Dwyer S.] was a big step forward and the question is can he sustain."

Brown has praise for the horsemanship shown throughout the year.

"The way these horses have been managed, it looks like they'll all be around the second half of the year," he commented. "Street Sense did not run his best in the Jim Dandy and is likely to produce his best next time. Even Rags to Riches and the way they brought her along has been extremely impressive."

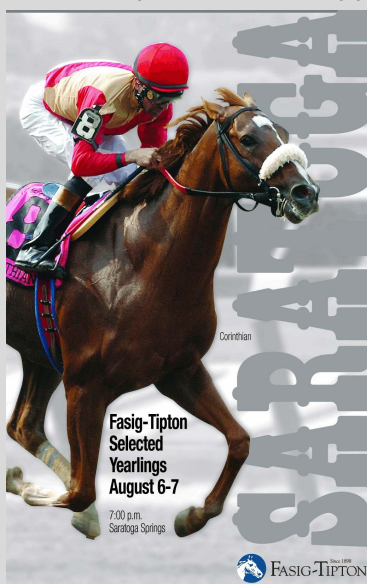

MORE TO LOVE AT F-T SARATOGA

Just two summers ago, buyers who attended the boutique Saratoga Selected Yearling Sale had their pick among just 153 young colts and fillies. When this year's auction gets underway tomorrow evening at the Humphrey S. Finney Pavilion in upstate New York,

A Tough Act to Follow...

Last year's Saratoga marketplace was anything but weak. While the cumulative average of \$323,731 was off by a fraction of a percentage point from the previous year, the middle market held up nicely, recording a gain of 8.8 percent over 2005 while posting a record median of \$245,000. With more horses on offer, gross receipts exceeded \$42 million, a better-than 20-percent improvement over the previous August. Throw in a steady market at the recently concluded July Yearling sale in Kentucky and officials at the auction house are hopeful of a vibrant sale this week. "I think people have confidence, the market has been strong here and there's some momentum," Browning added. "And there's more horses in the marketplace. People are absolutely confident to bring a nice horse here. There's still plenty of equity and capital in the marketplace and I don't think a small downturn in the market will have any impact on the sale."

What They're Saying At The Sales...

"I expect more of the same. The good ones and the ones that are perceived to be good enough, that pass the vet and jump through all the hoops will do real well. And the ones that aren't perceived to be good enough will have a tough time." **Craig Bendoroff, Denali Stud**

"I think it's going to go pretty well. At Saratoga, the numbers stay pretty steady and there is always a good demand in that market. The numbers are set where they are set, so I'm going in very optimistic and hoping for a good sale." **Bayne Welker, Mill Ridge Sales**

"My expectations are really good. I think although the market might be down, these select horses--if they're good--there's a lot of demand. I think it's going to be a strong sale, because it's a small group of horses that's very select. It's also a sale that's produced the highest percentage of stakes winners and graded-stakes winners anywhere in the world."

"I thought the July sale was a very strong sale. Fasig-Tipton does great job securing individuals and I think if people look at those horses and the mares they were produced by, I thought the market was extremely strong. There were people there to buy racehorses. I think it bodes very well for this sale. The South American import Riboletta (Brz) was a top-flight runner for Aaron and Marie Jones. Through a busy, outstanding season in 2000, the Brazilian-bred daughter of Roi Normand--Joy Valley (Brz), by Ghadeer (Fr), won seven of 11 starts, including a total of five Grade I victories, on her way to champion older mare

honors. Though she raced twice in New York that year, notching victories in Belmont's GI Ruffian H. and GI Beldame S., the West Coast-based mare never made it up to Saratoga Race Course to strut her stuff. Now, seven years later, connections of the 12-year-old Riboletta are hoping a strapping son of the champ can do what his mother never got a chance to do: wow the crowds at the Spa. Her yearling colt by Unbridled's Song will get his opportunity when he steps into the ring tomorrow evening as hip [86](#).

"Riboletta was a champion handi-

cap mare, so she could really run, and this guy is a big, two-turn, scopey, classy-looking horse," said Taylor Made's Public Sales Director Patrick Mahan. "Unbridled's Song tends to get grey horses, but this one's actually a chestnut colt. But in terms of body, he kind of has his father's build. He's got a nice long, clean neck, he's got a lot of leg under him. We're hoping to ring a big bell with him." The colt is the third foal produced by Riboletta, but the first to be offered at sale. The Joneses, who typically sell about 95 percent of their yearlings, retained her first two offspring, a four-year-old filly by Forestry named Eternity and a juvenile colt by Forest Camp, Fire Lookout. "They had some issues and we thought they wouldn't sell so well, so we kept them," explained Frank Taylor, an advisor and confidant to the Joneses. "But this horse is a very good individual. They thought this one could sell well and bring a lot of money. We're taking our chances." Riboletta did not produce a foal this year, but is currently in foal to leading sire Distorted Humor.

Scat Hoping Hip Two Can Do...

Jim Scatuorchio has tasted a fair amount of success in a relatively short time at the races, having been part of the team which raced Tale of the Cat prior to campaigning his breakthrough horse, More Than Ready. The New Jersey resident, also the owner of leading turf horse English Channel, is represented right off the bat during Monday night's session in the form of hip 2, a Taylor Made-consigned son of More Than Ready out of Garvin's Gal (Seattle Slew). Scatuorchio explains that he purchased the mare privately in More Than Ready's first year at stud, with the express purpose of breeding her to his new stallion. "She had already produced a stakes horse and she was in foal to Hennessy, an attractive sire, and I just wanted to spend a few bucks and give him a chance to get the best mares," he offered. Garvin's Gal is the dam of Agol Lack (Gulch), a dual Group 3 winner over French turf courses. So, why is now the right time to sell? "You just have to let some of them go," he commented. "We sold a filly out of this mare last year for \$300,000. The mare is by Seattle Slew and you don't find that too often and she's a little bit older, so we're selling out of her." Last year's produce, now named Move It, is in training with Michael Matz at the Fair Hill training center. Scatuorchio, who won the 1999 GI Sanford S. with More Than Ready, is hopeful that his son, Ready's Image, can become his sire's first North American Grade I winner when he takes his spot in the GI Hopeful S. at the end of the current meeting. "It's something I've been trying to do since he went to stud," Scatuorchio explained. "I've tried to support him by buying mares for him and by attending the sales to buy some of his best horses and it's worked out well. It would be a tremendous boost for him. Maybe his son can do something he wasn't able to." Scatuorchio has also had success with More Than Ready's daughters MGSW Ready's Gal and GSW Ready to Please.

Glencrest a Winner On Track and At the Sales...

By all accounts, it's been a banner couple of years at the races for the Greathouse family's Glencrest Farm, but their victories have come not only at the track, but also at the sales. Glencrest has a pair of colts set to go under the hammer at Saratoga, one for each session, and leads off tonight with hip [35](#). A chestnut son of champion sprinter Speightstown, the Mar. 20 foal is a son of La Comete (Holy Bull), herself a daughter of the top-runner La Gueriere and a half-sister to the good turf runner Lasting Approval. Glencrest went shopping and made out quite nicely at the 2002 Wimborne Farm dispersal, acquiring not only La Comete for \$70,000, but also Bendita, the dam of MGISW Better Talk Now; and a then-yearling filly named Honey Ryder. La Comete slipped her foal of 2003, but was bred the following spring to Distorted Humor. The mare was offered at that year's Keeneland November sale, but was bought back for \$140,000 after failing to meet her reserve. That proved a profitable decision when, at last year's Keeneland September sale, the Distorted Humor filly realized a final bid of \$350,000. Hip 35 was a \$150,000 buy-back from the 2006 Fasig-Tipton November sale. Tomorrow evening, Glencrest consigns hip [168](#) to the sale. A colt by Yes It's True, the dark bay is the latest offering out of Call Her (Caller I.D.), a mare purchased by Glencrest for \$82,000 ten years ago.

They have sold well from the mare, including \$325,000 KEESEP purchase GSW Battle Won (Honour and Glory) and his full brother Battle Too, a \$385,000 graduate of this sale two years ago. Both colts are consigned by Four Star Sales.

"We have two very nice colts, very nice individuals," commented David Greathouse. "I am very pleased with their physical well-being and the way that they shipped in. They both look like athletes and I couldn't be more pleased with them." Honey Ryder, who has amassed a bankroll of over \$2.3 million for Glencrest Farm, gets a chance to add to her coffers this coming weekend in the GI Beverly D. S. in Chicago. Panty Raid, winner of the grassy GI American Oaks in her most recent start, is likely to return to the main track for the GI Alabama S. at Saratoga Aug. 18. "She appears to like any surface and the further they go the better," Greathouse said of Panty Raid.

Derry Meeting Has a Rich History...

Bettina Jenney, widow of the late Marshall Jenney of Danzig fame, has a longstanding and profitable relationship with owner/breeder George Strawbridge Jr., having raised the likes of GI Breeders' Cup Turf winner Tikkanen and the outstanding sire Selkirk. "He's a great sportsman, and it's lovely to be associated with him in the horse world," Jenney said of her relationship with the Augustin impresario. "We've been selling horses for him for a long time, and it's great to do well for him, not only because he's a very good client, but also because he's a very special friend, as well." She continued, "My late husband Marshall Jenney started Derry Meeting, I think, in 1968, and we got married in 1973. And that's when I really started to learn about it. Marshall died in 2000, and I've been carrying on the farm with very good advice from two longtime friends and advisors. One is James Wigan, he is London Thoroughbred Services, who lives in England; and the other is Brian O'Rourke, who comes to farm to go over everything with me. He gives advice and helps out." Derry Meeting and Strawbridge are no strangers to big results at Saratoga. In 2001, they sold a colt by Kingmambo--Seattle Way for \$3 million and came back three years later with Coral Beach (A.P. Indy--Seebe), who was knocked down for \$1.5 million.

The two Pennsylvania-based operations team up again Monday evening at Saratoga with hip [30](#), a chestnut colt by leading sire Distorted Humor. The Feb. 6 produce is a granddaughter of MGSW & GISP Ratings (Caveat), the dam of SW & GSP Smart Growth; and GSW Recording. Bred in the Keystone State, hip 30 was produced on the exact same cross responsible for GISW Commentator. "He's an exceptional colt--very attractive, very athletic looking," Jenney commented. "He's been very well received and has gotten lots of attention."

The August Place to Be...

For many years, Saratoga reigned as the nation's premier marketplace for yearlings, with the likes of Man o' War changing hands here in 1918. Wartime restrictions led to a focus on Kentucky, and Saratoga began to share the limelight, especially with the Keeneland July Sale and, later, the emergence of Keeneland's mammoth September Sale. Though the July sale was discontinued after 2002's MRLS disaster, selling yearlings in Saratoga has retained its aura. It takes a special yearling to sell well in this storied ring. "There are some horses who are more favorably positioned at Saratoga," explained Gainesway's Michael Hernon. "We show these horses repeatedly, so it's vital that you bring a horse of quality, who's correct, into this environment, because there is significant repeat inspection of these horses. It is a marquee market, and certainly, pedigree is important, but the animal must be able to step up and undergo the very close scrutiny that is part of the sale scene at Saratoga."

Gainesway consigned the 2004 Saratoga topper, a \$1.85-million son of Giant's Causeway--Alaska Queen (Time for a Change). Racing as Fairbanks for Team Valor and trainer Todd Pletcher, he is a graded-stakes winner and Grade I-placed this season. In addition to that colt's half-brother by Smarty Jones, hip [148](#); Gainesway's draft includes the lone Mr. Greeley colt, hip [142](#); and some well-pedigreed fillies in hip [22](#), a Gone West granddaughter of champion Jewel Princess; hip [110](#), a filly from the first crop of Speightstown who is a half-sister to a pair of graded winners; and hip [173](#), a daughter of Dynaformer who is the first foal from MGSW Caught in the Rain (Petionville).

Hip 22 is the first foal from Home Court (Storm Cat), herself the third foal from champion Jewel Princess (Key to the Mint), who earned over \$1.9 million while collecting four Grade I trophies. She sold for \$4.9 million at Keeneland November in 2000 with Home Court in utero. That filly, a \$650,000 yearling, won two of her four starts and was Grade III-placed as a sophomore in 2004. Bred to Gone West in the spring of 2005, she sold at Keeneland November for \$1.4 million to Canadian A. Gordon Stollery's AGS Thoroughbreds. The resulting chestnut pushes all the right buttons. "She is a particularly nice filly," said Hernon. "She's attractive, well-made, good-moving filly. [She] brings a lot of residual value to the table as a broodmare herself down the road. She's got a great attitude--she hasn't turned a hair since she's been up here. She's showing extremely well, and I think she's going over very well--a pleasing filly to watch, and I think she's a good prospect." Home Court calls Gainesway home these days. "She's got a very good '07 colt by Unbridled's Song, and is in foal on an early cover to the very exciting Bernardini, so there's good production behind [the yearling]," Hernon added. "[The mare] is getting the excellent opportunity that she deserves."

Greeley in the Right Spot...

In his first season at stud, Mr. Greeley sire El Corredor, winner of the GI Cigar Mile at three in 2000. The son of Gone West has continued to throw major runners such as Finsceal Beo (Ire), the Cartier Award winner as Europe's top two-year-old filly in 2006 and a dual Classic heroine this year, and has become one of the most in-demand stallions in the nation while plying his trade at Gainesway. Last year, his chestnut colt out of G1SW Silvester Lady (GB) sold for \$5.7 million to John Ferguson. Of course, we are delighted with his continued success," said Michael Hernon "He's emerging as a truly international sire." Gainesway will consign Mr. Greeley's lone offering here, hip [142](#), a handsome chestnut out of Win My Heart (King of Kings {Ire}). "This colt is a particularly attractive horse with great quality and athleticism about him," said Hernon. "He's a real clone of Mr. Greeley, I think. He's got plenty of size and scope and a good leg. It's a successful cross--being bred back to Northern Dancer-line mares--and it's a really good family when you get back into it." The colt, the first foal from a half-sister to GSW Secret Liason, hails from the family of champion Sacahuista; her son, leading sire Hussonet; and MGISW Raging Fever. Hernon added, "He's a special colt and he's the only Mr. Greeley in the catalogue. He's certainly well worth the look and has great potential for the future."

Knock On Wood...

While Mr. Greeley has established himself, his studmate Tapit (Pulpit--Tap Your Heels, by Unbridled) has his first yearlings selling this year. The grey captured the GIII Laurel Futurity at two and added the GI Wood Memorial S. at three in 2004. His first foals were well received at auction in 2006, with 13 weanlings averaging \$108,962 off a \$15,000 stud fee. Hip [156](#), produced by the Dehere mare Bathsheba, was purchased for \$70,000 at Keeneland November. His dam is a half to GSW & G1SP Warm Heart as well as the listed-winning Miguel Cervantes and Royal Tigress. His third dam is Canadian champion sprinter Summer Mood. "He's a particularly good colt a lot of resemblance to his sire," said Hernon. "This colt is particularly appealing. He's very grey--almost white. He's a good mover, balanced and correct. We think he's a very good prospect and a very good representative of Tapit. We wanted to bring a Tapit up here to Saratoga to showcase him in this sale. We've high expectations for him."

Multiple Grade I winner **Lion Heart** (Tale of the Cat--Satin Sunrise, by Mr. Leader) got off to a fast start at the Fasig-Tipton July sale and has 10 lots catalogued at Saratoga. The Ashford stallion was represented by the top three lots and four of the top 10 sold during the July New Sire Showcase. He has had 15 yearlings sell for an average of \$148,666. Craig Bendoroff's Denali enjoyed success with a Lion Heart offspring when selling a yearling for \$175,000 at the July sale and the consignor will be looking to add to that result when [hip 136](#) goes through the ring during Tuesday's second session of the Saratoga sale. "We have a real nice Lion Heart colt," Bendoroff confirmed. "The couple Lion Hearts that I've had are both nice. He's not a big horse, but both of these have had some leg and some scope and obviously they liked what they saw in July." Hip 136 is out of Waviness (Copelan) and is a half brother to graded-stakes winner Recommended List (Roman Diplomat). Mill Ridge Sales will also be sending a son of Lion Heart through the Saratoga ring. [Hip 24](#) is out of I'm in Celebration (Copelan) and is a half brother to graded-stakes placed Nice to Know (Known Fact) and Cheers and Tears (Bold Ruckus). "I'm very encouraged by Lion Heart," Mill Ridge's Bayne Welker said. "Our Lion Heart colt is a very big, forward individual."

"I think he's everything someone would be looking for out of a Saratoga sale. I know that there are a lot of [Lion Hearts] out there, so I think it's really going to take one that kind of stands out in the crowd, but I think this colt really fits that bill." Lion Heart, who stood the 2007 season for \$25,000, won the 2003 GI Hollywood Futurity and the 2004 GI Haskell Invitational H. He was second in the GI Kentucky Derby and GI Toyota Blue Grass S.

It's no surprise that Kentucky-breds dominate the Saratoga catalogue, but the host state of New York is the second-most represented in the two-day auction with 17 scheduled to go through the ring. The 17 yearlings include two from the first crop of multiple Grade I winner Medaglia d'Oro. Other sires represented by New York-breds in the catalogue are Smart Strike, Fusaichi Pegasus, Unbridled's Song, Stormy Atlantic, Silver Deputy, Hennessy, Aldebaran and More Than Ready. Craig Bendoroff's Denali Stud consigns three yearlings from the Empire state. "I always like having New York-breds in the main sale," Bendoroff explained, adding he was impressed with all three of his New York-bred fillies. [Hip 204](#) is a chestnut filly by Not For Love. "She's a half sister to Time's Mistress, who runs in the [GI] Test S.," Bendoroff said of the yearling. "We're hoping for a nice update, but whether we get it or not, she's a really nice filly." Bendoroff also consigns [hip 68](#) and [hip 104](#). "They are both nice," he confirmed. "[Hip 68] is a Vindication--obviously he's off to a pretty promising start. And the other is a Successful Appeal. He's a stallion that I like a lot and he's had some success in New York." Among 2007 New York-bred stakes winners are graded winners Friendly Island, Oprah Winney and J'ray. Last season, the Empire state was represented by Grade I winners Behaving Badly and Fleet Indian.

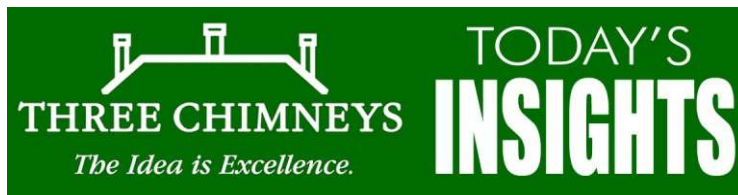

NO PANIC OVER FOOT AND MOUTH FINDINGS

Britain's ruling body, the British Horseracing Authority, yesterday issued a statement in response to the confirmed case of Foot and Mouth disease discovered in Surrey, which claimed that the news would have "no immediate impact" on racing. Following the announcement on Friday that cattle on a farm near the village of Wanborough in Surrey had tested positive for the viral disease, the BHA moved quickly to allay fears that the movement of horses could be restricted or halted. The Department for Environment, Food and Rural Affairs (DEFRA) have imposed a "protection zone" and "surveillance zone" around the infected farm and a nationwide ban on the movement of all sheep, cattle and pigs has been put in place. "The British Horseracing Authority is concerned to hear Foot and Mouth Disease has been confirmed in Wanborough, Surrey, and hopes that the impact on the farming community can be kept to a minimum," the statement read. "Horses are not affected by the farm animal movement restrictions, which have been imposed nationally by DEFRA, and we envisage no immediate impact on racing as no racecourse lies within the exclusion or surveillance zone--all race meetings go ahead as planned." The last outbreak of Foot and Mouth disease to hit Britain had a catastrophic impact on the farming community and had a knock-on effect within racing, with many abandonments including Cheltenham's high-profile national hunt festival in March 2001. There is already a ban on exports of British livestock into countries within the European Union and the BHA is awaiting the overseas reaction to the transporting of racehorses abroad. "We are in discussions with the Turf Club and France Galop and will update trainers, through Weatherbys, as soon as we know the position on horses based in Britain running in France and Ireland," the statement continued. "We are closely monitoring developments and keeping racing's stakeholders updated."

August 13, 1919...**Upset** scored a win against **Man o'War** in the Sanford Memorial S. at Saratoga. The defeat was Big Red's only loss in 21 career starts.

August 14, 1938...Trainer **Mary Hirsch** became the first woman to saddle the winner of the Travers S. at Saratoga, sending out Thanksgiving for owner Anne Corning.

August 14, 1939...The record payoff for a \$2 Daily Double, \$10,772.40, lit up the tote board at Washington Park. Joy Bet and Merry Caroline produced the record.
