BOREL STRIKES AGAIN IN 'BAMA

Question: Of all the riders in the deep Saratoga jockey colony, who has the most Grade I victories at the current meet? The answer might surprise--it's Calvin Borel. Just a week after piloting Grand Couturier (GB) to an upset win in the GI Sword Dancer Invitational, the veteran reinsman was front and center again yesterday, guiding Bentley Smith's **Lady Joanne** (Orientate) to a narrow success over **Lear's Princess** (Lear Fan) in the GI Alabama S. at Saratoga. And the Travers is yet to come. "This is unbelievable," Borel said. "It's like a roller coaster ride." HIGH DEMAND FOR DANSILI AT DEAUVILLE

Dansili (GB) sired the top-priced filly during Friday's opening session of Arqana's Deauville Yearling Sale, and he followed suit once again with yesterday's session-topping filly. Juddmonte's youngblood received another rubber stamping on the track in the afternoon when the homebred Proviso (GB) captured the G3 Prix du Calvados, and the momentum shows no sign of halting after bloodstock agent Peter Doyle capped a busy evening when paying €600,000 for hip 213. Consigned by Marc de Chambure's Haras d'Etreham, who enjoyed a highly successful second day, the bay is a daughter of the smart Begueule (Fr) (Bering {GB}). The listed-placed mare has already produced the useful Pivotal Answer (Ire), currently in training with Jeremy Nosedá. "She is a lovely filly, really lovely," said Doyle, who signed the ticket on behalf of Plantation Stud. "I know the Dansilis are hot at this time and I was prepared to pay more, but I also have to admit that we were getting close to our limit. It is not decided yet who will train her, but we look forward to her racing career." **Deauville August cont. p14-16**

Lady Joanne Answers the Call....

While Borel is well-noted for his ability to work out ground-saving trips, he was forced to play something of a different hand yesterday, stalking the pace three wide as GII Hollywood Breeders' Cup Oaks winner **Tough Tiz's Sis** (Tiznow) scrimmaged on the front end with **Folk** (Quiet American) through moderate splits. That trio was followed by Octave, trying to add to her wins in the GI Mother Goose S. and GI CCA Oaks. Further back in the field were post-time favorite **Panty Raid** (Include), who raced near the back alongside Lear's Princess; and GII Delaware Oaks heroine **Moon Catcher** (Malibu Moon), who could see 'em all up the backstretch. Lady Joanne advanced under a confident Borel as the field raced on the far turn and took a short lead at the quarter pole, but Lear's Princess was just finding her best stride and threatened to make it a dogfight to the finish. Lady Joanne was under a right-handed stick from Borel--a dangerous move, given that Octave, forced to steady behind the tiring Tough Tiz's Sis at the head of the lane, dove to the inside and tried to threaten the top two from the rail. While Octave's rally fizzled out, Lear's Princess kept plugging away, but Lady Joanne had just enough in reserve and held on for a narrow victory. Stewards took a look at the final furlong, but allowed the result to stand. "Calvin [Borel] just rode an unbelievable race," said winning trainer Carl Nafzger. "Last time he ran against Octave, she had us inside. This time, we had her inside. I'm sorry about the inquiry, but when you look at it, John [Velazquez on Octave] never did quit riding." The winner is likely to make her next start in the GI Juddmonte Spinster S. Oct. 7 en route to the Oct. 27 GI Breeders' Cup Distaff. Steady Progress from Two to Three...

A maiden winner at second asking, Lady Joanne was third to Change Up in the GIII Pocahontas S. Oct. 29, but, stretched to two turns for the first time, took the GII Golden Rod S. in convincing fashion Nov. 25. Meticulously brought along by trainer Carl Nafzger, the imposing bay took a six-furlong allowance at Churchill Downs May 1 and tacked on a one-length success in that track's GIII Dogwood S. June 2. She attended a fast pace in the GI Mother Goose S. at Belmont Park June 30, but was overhauled late by Octave. The homebred got the ideal prep for the Alabama, besting older fillies and mares in the restricted nine-furlong Banshee Breeze S. at Saratoga July 30.

All in the Family...

Lady Joanne is one of just a handful of horses trained by Nafzger for his longtime client Smith, the son-in-law of Frances Genter. The winner's dam Oatsee was part of the Smith dispersal at the Keeneland January Sale in 2006, where she sold for \$135,000 to Belvedere Farm, agent. She has a yearling full sister to Lady Joanne, a weanling filly by Afleet Alex and is currently in foal to Forestry.

Perfect in two starts as a juvenile, Rutherfordienne kicked off 2007 with a fourth in Keeneland's Appalachian S. Apr. 22, her lone career blemish. Winner of the May 12 Sugar Plum Time S. at Belmont Park, she came flying late to share the spoils with Bit of Whimsy in the Gill Sands Point S. at the New York oval June 2. She crossed the line a neck second in the Gill Boiling Springs S. at Monmouth Park June 30, but was put up to the victory after being bumped in late stretch. In her most recent appearance, the homebred lagged behind in the July 27 Gill Lake George S. at Saratoga, but found a wedge at the hedge and closed with a rush to take it by a neck. Rutherfordienne was taken in hand by Corey Nakatani and was content to lay ninth, ahead of only Valbenny, who also does her best running late. She began to pick off horses in earnest approaching the far turn and was steered about five wide for the drive. Valbenny, the GI American Oaks runner-up, followed the eventual winner's run into the stretch, but Rutherfordienne's closing kick proved too much for the favorite and she won it with authority. "I rode this filly with a lot of confidence," the winning jockey commented. "I knew what I had, and I had a lot of horse. I spoke to Christophe [trainer Clement] this morning and I've watched several of her races. She has a terrific turn of foot--and you saw that today. I had to time her run just right; not too late, not too soon. That's my job. What a special feeling to win a race like this--a Grade I. She's a special filly."

He beat Lawyer Ron in the June 23 GIII Salvator Mile S. over this track, but the Monmouth faithful overlooked Gottcha Gold yesterday. It was a mistake they'd live to regret. Sent right to the lead by Chuck Lopez, the bay got away with an opening half in :46.05. He had a head in front after six panels in 1:09.93 and drew away down the lane. "No respect...not even the hometown crowd had respect for us," Lopez sighed. "I was quite surprised." The rider was not surprised by the outcome, however. First or second in six of seven prior starts on the Jersey Shore, Gottcha Gold opened the meet in the May 28 Frisk Me Now S. He went right to the lead, flew through a half in :44 and tired in the final 70 yards, finishing second. Off at 10-1 in the Salvator Mile, he once again set the pace, but eased through the first four furlongs in :45.43 and had just enough left in the tank to beat 1-10 favorite Lawyer Ron by a neck. He will get another chance to prove himself a hometown hero. "We'll definitely look at the [\$1 million] Breeders' Cup Dirt Mile [Oct. 26], no doubt about that," trainer Eddie Plesa Jr. said. **Click for the [brisnet.com chart](#). Those who backed Pleasant Hill must have lamented the fact that her winning mutuel of \$9.60 came nowhere close to approximating her morning-line quote of 20-1. Nevertheless, it beats tearing them up and this four-year-old homebred filly continued her upward trend. A three-length maiden winner at Saratoga last summer, the dark bay was second in a Turfway entry-level allowance Sept. 20, but went missing nine months after that one. She returned to action with a 5 1/2-length victory at Churchill June 10 and was most recently runner-up going two turns for the first time beneath the Twin Spires June 30. Dropping back to this track's unique one-mile configuration, Pleasant Hill sped to the lead beneath Larry Melancon and set a good pace early on. Brownie Points and Leah's Secret (Tiger Ridge) made runs at the leader approaching the quarter pole, but she repulsed those bids and it was only the late rail flourish from favored High Heels that caused the winner any real concern.

Runner-up to Marquise (Cape Town) in a nine-furlong maiden over the Gulfstream main track Jan. 15, Marietta was steadied early in the running of a similar test over a good track Feb. 16 and got a brief freshening. That seemed to do her some good, as the homebred charged home a 4 3/4-length winner over Keeneland's Polytrack Apr. 22. She followed that effort with a distant third-place effort to the classy Bear Now in the GIII Selene S. at Woodbine May 20, and she was coming into this off a 1 3/4-length success in the GIII Iowa Oaks June 29. Three wide into the clubhouse turn beneath Mark Guidry, Marietta was allowed to settle into stride as Marquise threw down the anchor in the opening half-mile. Angled out for the drive, she closed with menacing strides and finished full of run despite having endured a wide run. Humble Janet, coming off a good fourth to Octave in the GI CCA Oaks, rallied belatedly for the runner-up spot.

Noted as a ☆ **"TDN Rising Star"** ☆ when plundering a newcomers' event for fillies by four lengths over course and distance July 11, Proviso jumped to the head of bookmakers' ante-post lists for next term's G1 1000 Guineas with another stylish performance here. Chasing the front rank in sixth behind the fast early fractions, she came under pressure soon after halfway and responded to mild urging to swoop wide for the lead with 300 meters remaining. The bay homebred hooked up with Laureldean Gale soon after, but held plenty in reserve inside the closing panel to turn down that rival's ominous challenge as the front pair drew clear of outclassed rivals. "We've always held high hopes for this really nice filly," said Teddy Grimthorpe, Juddmonte's racing manager. "They went fast from the outset, and she quickened very nicely to win well. In principle, she will run in the G1 Prix Marcel Boussac [at Longchamp Oct. 7]." Proviso has a yearling half-brother by Peintre Celebre, as well as a suckling half-sister by Beat Hollow (GB).

Shuffled back to the rear after the opening exchanges here, Literato--owned by France's Defence Minister Herve Morin--was clear of any danger as Quest for Honor (GB) (Highest Honor {Fr}) unseated Christophe Soumillon in early stretch. The grey made continued headway into second at the eighth pole and closed with a flourish to deny long-time pacesetter Spirit One in the dying strides. "At one stage during the race I was worried he'd lost his chance, as he was so far off the pace and especially as I had not been too hard on him after the Jockey Club," admitted trainer Jean-Claude Rouget. "He is such a gutsy horse that I am thrilled with the outcome." Rouget added, "I wouldn't want to run him over 12 furlongs, so his next race will more than likely be the G1 Champion S. at Newmarket [Oct. 20]." Jockey Christophe Soumillon escaped injury when hampered by Champéry (Bahri) and being unseated from Quest for Honor in the straight. The stewards ordered an immediate enquiry, but allowed the result to stand.

The five-year-old came from out of the clouds to be second by a nose in the June 2 GII Californian S. and rallied from last to first to take the July 21 GII San Diego H. at this track. He will be tough if he can get the trip. But, win or lose, he will get a vacation after this race. "I've been hard on him," trainer Mike Mitchell told *DRF*.

Big Booster (Accelerator), haltered for \$62,500, got up for third in the Hollywood Gold Cup, where he was beaten less than a length, and three-year-old **Tiago** (Pleasant Tap) closed from the middle of the pack to take the Swaps, his first all-weather attempt. **Hello Sunday (Fr)** (Poliglote {GB}), off the board on turf in his first three U.S. outings, showed he could handle the Del Mar surface with a rallying allowance score July 19. The bay could be a late threat as well. "He sure seems to like that Polytrack...we didn't do anything other than switch surfaces," trainer Bobby Frankel told *DRF*.

"She has a lot of speed, but relaxes in her races, has a good physique and temperament, is not excitable and has a big heart--all the things you need to be champion filly."

Peter Chapple-Hyam, who secured this prize with Dutch Art (GB) 12 months ago, is back with **Winker Watson**. Like Dutch Art, he is a winner of the G2 Norfolk S. at Royal Ascot June 21. He defied a subsequent penalty and the classy River Proud in the G2 July S. at Newmarket July 12, and defends an unbeaten record here. "Winker Watson is in really good form," Chapple-Hyam said. "He had a last blow-out before Deauville on Tuesday and he went really nicely. If it was too soft, it would be a little concern, but I believe some of his family went on it, so I'm hopeful that he would handle it." Andre Fabre relies on **Alexandros**. He followed a fluent success in the Listed Prix Roland de Chambure at Longchamp on Bastille Day with another comfortable score in the course-and-distance G3 Prix de Cabourg July 29. **Myboycharlie**, who was purchased by Susan Magnier following his emphatic seven-length success in the G3 Anglesey S. at The Curragh July 15, represents the Tommy Stack stable. Stack's son and assistant Fozzy told *PA Sport*, "Everything's been fine with him since The Curragh race last time. He's won on pretty soft ground the last twice, but I think he'd be fine on good ground as he's a good-actioned horse. Six furlongs is fine for him now, but I wouldn't think he'd have any difficulty in getting seven furlongs soon."

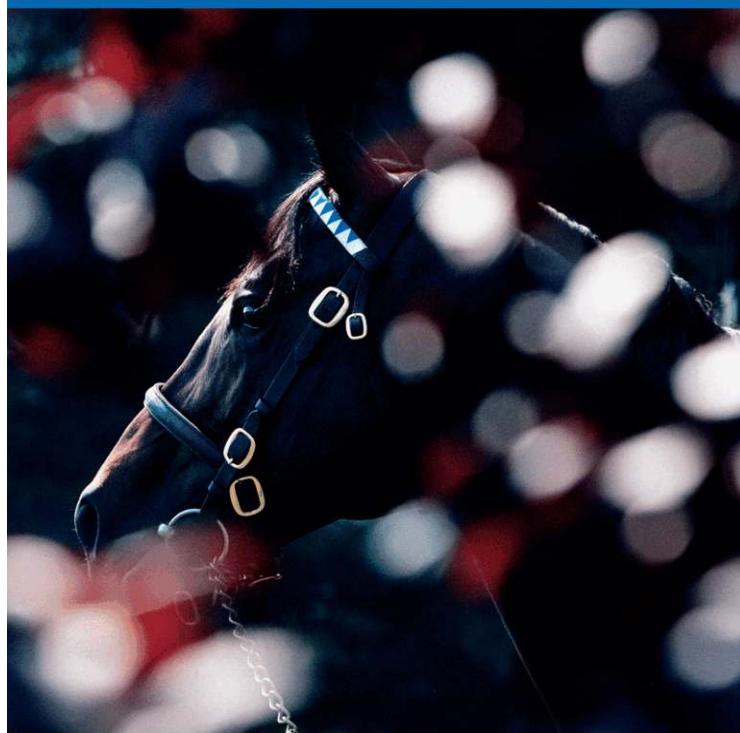

The winner of the GII Swaps BC S. as a sophomore, five-year-old **Surf Cat** has now found his niche as a sprinter. The dark bay, sixth in the GI Pacific Classic two years ago, took a two-turn allowance at Santa Anita in October of 2005, then opened 2006 with a victory in the seven-panel GII San Carlos H. in February. He made it three in a row in the GII Potrero Grande BC S. before stretching out once again to take the May 13 GII Mervyn Leroy H. The Bruce Headley trainee disappeared after that score, returning after nearly 14 months on the shelf as the favorite in the July 7 GI Triple Bend BC H., where he closed willingly to be second, beaten just a head. Surf Cat has worked well since that effort and is the one to beat here. **Bordonaro** has been raced sparingly since running fourth in last year's GI Breeders' Cup Sprint. He kicked off the year with a third in the Jan. 27 Sunshine Millions Sprint and followed up with a front-running score in the Apr. 13 Count Fleet Sprint H. at Oaklawn. Seventh in the June 9 GII True North BC S. at Belmont, he dueled for the lead early in his latest, the July 29 GI Bing Crosby BC S. over this track, but weakened late to be third behind In Summation and **Greg's Gold**. Six-year-old gelding Greg's Gold missed more than 18 months after taking the 2005 edition of the Bing Crosby, finally coming back to capture a Santa Anita allowance in February. Second in the Apr. 7 Potrero Grande, he proved an affinity for all-weather with a victory in the Tiznow S. 22 days later. The gray shipped to Churchill for the June 2 GIII Aristides S., finishing fourth, before another solid Polytrack performance in this year's Crosby.

After splitting Mandesha (Fr) and Alexandrova (Ire) when runner-up in the G1 Prix de l'Opera de Longchamp on Arc day, she was not disgraced in finishing fifth in the GI Breeders' Cup F/M Turf at Churchill Downs the following month and sixth in Sha Tin's G1 Hong Kong Cup in December. Failing by a length to give Macleya (Ger) nine pounds when second in the G3 Prix Allez France at Chantilly on her return May 2, she filled the same spot behind Nannina (GB) in the G2 Windsor Forest S. over a mile at Royal Ascot June 20. "She's had a long time to recover since Ascot and has done well," trainer Jean de Roualle told *Racing Post*. "Her preparation has been very correct, but the [Oct. 7] l'Opera is her real target. Still, all the lights are green, and she will be much better with cut in the ground." Andre Fabre's runners are always to be respected, and **Dynaforce** is probably a lot better than her latest July 17 Vichy conditions success. Sir Michael Stoute ships in **Heaven Sent**, a sister to Megahertz (GB). She was runner-up in both the May 26 G3 Ridgewood Pearl S. at The Curragh and Royal Ascot's Listed Wolferton H. June 22 before finishing third in the G2 Summer Mile S. back at the latter venue last time July 14.

Doyle Digs Deeper...

Doyle was also responsible for securing the session's top-priced colt when paying €440,000 for a son of Coolmore's Hawk Wing, whose first crop includes the Listed Silver Flash S. winner Triskel (GB). From the draft of Eric Puerari's Haras des Capucines, hip 178 is out of She is Zen (Fr) (Zieten). The eight-year-old mare is a half to the 2004 G1 Prix Ganay winner Execute (Fr) and MGSW Tot ou Tard (Ire) as well as the 2001 G3 Prix Quincey victress Ing Ing (Fr). Doyle revealed that the colt had been bought for Norwegian trainer Wido Neuroth. "He is a strong, nice-looking individual and a very neat colt, but I didn't expect to pay as much as €440,000 for him," Doyle commented. "It tells you how strong the market is here in Deauville."

The French Collection...

Jean de Roualle has a big day ahead today as he saddles Satwa Queen (Fr) in the G2 Darley Prix Jean Romanet, and he can look forward to adding another choice filly to his team after that star's owner Steve Lamprell purchased hip 196 for €500,000. By Rock of Gibraltar (Ire), the chestnut is out of the 1997 G3 Premio Umbria winner Uruk (GB), and was another to hit the mark from Eric Puerari's operation. She is closely related to the talented stateside performer Urban King (Ire) and hails from the family of Nysaeen (Ire) and last year's G2 Grand Prix de Deauville hero Irish Wells (Fr). "I loved her," said the Dubai-based Lamprell as he sat beside the conditioner famed for his training of high-class fillies such as Caerlina (Ire) and Gorella (Fr). "She is very much like the Queen, with the same attitude and same conformation. I didn't attend the sale yesterday, but she was my first choice tonight and, hopefully, I might be back tomorrow." Paul Nataf underlined the strength of the domestic buyers when paying €430,000 for Etream's hip 138, a son of High Chaparral (Ire). Like Hawk Wing, High Chaparral stands at Coolmore and his first runners this year. Hip 138 is a half-brother to Plein d'Estime (Fr), who showed decent form in listed company in 2005. This is also the immediate family of the 1996 G2 Prix de Pomone winner Helen of Spain (GB). The bay colt is destined to race in the Enrico Ciampi silks made famous this year by Lawman (Fr).

Lots to Note...

- BBA Germany's Dirk Eisele, who had been denied the sale topper before securing a King's Best colt for €600,000 on day one, was not to be outbid for hip 147, a coveted son of Montjeu (Ire) from the Etream draft. The half to the GII San Clemente S. and GII Pucker Up S. winner Little Treasure (Fr) and stakes-placed filly Annee Lumiere (Ire) is from the family of Bigstone (Ire). He will race for the Norwegian owner Lars Nielsen after a final bid of €400,000.
- Demi O'Byrne, who had got the better of Eisele Friday for the €1.4-million Galileo (Ire) colt, took home a son of High Chaparral for €340,000. From the consignment of Haras de la Reboursiere et de Montaigu, hip 173 is out of a half to Goldmark, whose page also includes the 1989 G1 Prix de la Foret heroine Gabina and that year's G1 Prix Lupin scorer Galetto (Fr).
- A few moments later, Crispin de Moubray paid €280,000 for hip 180, a 3/4-sister by Bernstein to the top-class G3 Prix Miesque winner Magic America. That filly was also runner-up in the G1 Prix Morny on this day 12 months ago. From the draft of Haras du Quesnay, this is also the family of Delilah (Ire), King's Drama (Ire) and New Girlfriend (Ire).

Business is Booming...

After the fireworks of the opening session, it was more of the same on day two with a continuing rampant trade which seemed to surprise most assembled. The day's gross of €8,959,000 easily outstripped 12 months ago, while the median of €90,000 rose by 29 percent and the average of €124,431 was up by an impressive 36 percent. The total average is up a third on 2006 and the median up by a quarter, with last year's gross set to be swamped as early as tonight. Olivier Delloye, managing director of Arqana, has a lot to be satisfied about so far. "We are obviously on a good trail and the increase has followed the same trend as yesterday," Delloye said. "The average is significantly up, as well as the average--figures talk, as we had 33 horses sell tonight for €100,000 or more, compared to 19 last year. As yesterday, the colts have been very much in demand, even though two fillies topped the list. Evidently the new format is a success, and when you have strong activity on the first day and good horses to sell the following day, then people are willing to stay and those that could not buy on the first afternoon are then very active. We are pleased to note that again the French have been very active, but that the market remains very international." Selling continues today after racing at 5 pm.
