TRAVERS FINISH MAKES SENSE

Street Sense (Street Cry {Ire}) was a little out of his element yesterday. The three-year-old who rode the rail

to a dramatic come-from-behind victory in the GI Kentucky Derby was rated just off the pace and raced three wide in yesterday's GI Travers S. at Saratoga. But, despite an unexpected challenge from 9-1 chance **Grasshopper** (Dixie Union), the champ prevailed, driving home a half-length winner under jockey Calvin Borel.

Trainer Carl Nafzger was not concerned as he watched the race unfold. "I never worry about where Calvin's going to have him," Nafzger said. "That's Calvin's business. When I saw where he was and saw the pace setting up slow, I knew Calvin had him right where he had to be." **Cont. p2**

A HARD-FOUGHT KING'S BISHOP

He had to fight off a determined challenge from **First Defence** (Unbridled's Song), but **Hard Spun** (Danzig) proved he was up to the test in the GI King's Bishop S. at Saratoga yesterday. "This is a very important race for making stallions, and that was one reason we looked at it," trainer Larry Jones said. CHASING THE CAT

They have yet to catch her. **Burmilla** (Storm Cat) led her rivals on a merry chase in the Aug. 3 GII Honorable Miss S. at Saratoga to run her record to a perfect four-for-four, and they will be trying to run her down once again in the GI Ballerina S. this afternoon. It won't be an easy task. The four-year-old dominated in two starts last season, and returned after a 358-day layoff to post a game nose victory in an allowance test at Churchill Downs June 21. Let go at 5-1 in the Honorable Miss, she cruised along through an opening half in :45 4/5 and had plenty left in the stretch, opening up to best **Indian Flare** (Cherokee Run) by 2 3/4 lengths. After carrying the Darley colors in her first four starts, the filly will sport Godolphin blue for the first time today. "I wasn't surprised she went over there," said Eoin Harty, who had charge of Burmilla until she moved to the Godolphin barn. "That's why they give me these horses-to find those that can run for Godolphin." Harty added, "It's hard to say how good she really is because she keeps moving forward. She's always found more when she needed to." Added Rick Mettee, who handles Godolphin's New York string for trainer Saeed bin Suroor, "Sheikh Mohammed and the Maktoum family want the best they have running in the blue silks. We thought thought this filly would fit the bill with her race record and her pedigree." **Cont. p9**

Near Perfect...

In his seven starts since finishing third in the GI Lane's Breeders' Futurity End last October, Street Sense has been just a neck away from a perfect record. After clinching an Eclipse Award with his 10-length GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile romp, the Jim Tafel homebred opened '07 with a nose win over Any Given Saturday in the GIII Tampa Bay Derby in March. He was beaten a nose by Dominican in the Apr. 14 GI Blue Grass S. and, after his Kentucky Derby triumph, missed by a head in the May 19 GI Preakness S. His connections opted to skip the June 9 GI Belmont S., instead pointing for the July 29 GII Jim Dandy S. That race produced a workmanlike 1 1/2-length score, and Street Sense was odds-on to become the third straight three-year-old to accomplish the Jim Dandy/Travers double, following Flower Alley (2005) and Bernardini (2006).

Playing It Safe...

Avoiding any chance of traffic trouble on the outside, Calvin Borel had Street Sense positioned off early leaders Grasshopper and C P West (Came Home) through a moderate half in :48.18 and six panels in 1:12.43. Borel was motionless as Street Sense ranged up alongside Grasshopper at the quarter pole, and it appeared he would pull away from that rival under his own courage. But Grasshopper, making his stakes debut, dug in at the rail, and it was only in the final strides that Street Sense was able to edge ahead. "I know how Street Sense is," Borel said. "Once he gets in front, he kind of gives it up a little bit. I let him mess around for 40 or 50 yards, and then I hit him left-handed quick and he pulled away." Street Sense will have one more prep before the Oct. 27 GI Breeders' Cup Classic, but Carl Nafzger has not yet decided between the MassCap Sept. 22, the GII Hawthorne Gold Cup or GII Kentucky Cup Classic Sept. 29, or the GI Jockey Club Gold Cup Sept. 30. "We'll look at all of them, but let's enjoy this one," Nafzger said. Grasshopper, coming off a six-length allowance win at Saratoga July 30, thrilled trainer Neil Howard with his performance. "It was a great effort," Howard said. "We got beat by an unbelievable horse. We might have to try him again."

A Star in the Making?

Bedazzle, in foal to Distorted Humor, was sent through the ring at Keeneland November in 2005 and was purchased by a partnership headed by Carl Nafzger for \$180,000. The partnership sold the now 10-year-old mare to Darley for an undisclosed price after the 2006 Breeders' Cup, but bought back her foal, a yearling filly now named Broadway Ticket, for \$850,000 at the 2006 KEENOV sale. The mare also has the unraced two-year-old filly Elusive Sparkle (Elusive Quality), and dropped a filly by Speightstown this year.

Hard Spun, a \$485,000 RNA as a KEESEP yearling, was purchased privately by Fox Hill Farm after the sale. He started his career in relative obscurity, breaking his maiden and taking the Port Penn S. at Delaware Park, and beat up fellow Pennsylvania-breds in his final start at two, the Pennsylvania Nursery S. at Philly Park. The colt proved he belonged with graded-stakes company when making it four in a row in the Jan. 13 GIII Le Comte S. at Fair Grounds. The handsome bay lost his unbeaten record when fourth in the Feb. 19 Southwest S. at Oaklawn, but rebounded with a win in the Mar. 24 GII Lane's End S. and was on his way to the May 5 GI Kentucky Derby. Many thought the 10 panels and the six-week layoff would prove his undoing, but after setting a solid pace, Hard Spun hung on to be second, beaten just 2 1/2 lengths by Street Sense. Third in the GI Preakness S., fourth in the GI Belmont S. and runner-up once again in the GI Haskell Invitational S., he was looking to pick up that elusive Grade I win yesterday. The crowd's choice was away alertly, shadowed Spin Master (Distorted Humor) through an opening quarter in :21.94 and forged to the front after a half in :44.20. First Defence made a run at him in the stretch and briefly got his head in front, but Hard Spun battled back to win going away. "He got to loafing when he made the lead, and I started to worry," jockey Mario Pino said. "As soon as he felt First Defence next to him, he switched leads and his class came out. It's 95 degrees and he didn't even take a deep breath. He wasn't laboring, he was just looking for competition." The winner will have one prep at a mile or a mile and an eighth before heading to the Oct. 27 GI Breeders' Cup Classic at Monmouth Park. "Tryst" Is Worth the Trouble...

A \$39,000 KEESEP yearling, Turkish Tryst (Turkoman) had a racing career compromised by injury and made just 15 starts over four seasons. The chestnut did capture the April Run S. on the Pimlico turf and was runner-up in the GII Vinery Matchmaker S. for owner/trainer Michael Moran. Retired to Betty Moran's Brushwood Stable in Pennsylvania after earning \$84,362, she has had a tough time in the breeding shed as well, but what she has produced can run. Her second foal was MSP Wild Current (Wild Again), who earned \$273,218; and her fourth was stakes winner Our Rite of Spring (Stravinsky). The 16-year-old mare was barren after being bred to Dixieland Band in 2001. Her 2003 foal by Thunder Gulch died, then she was sent to Danzig in what would be that stallion's next-to-last season at stud and produced Hard Spun. The chestnut mare failed to take when covered by Hennessy in 2004, and aborted a foal by Stravinsky in 2006, but foaled a filly by Kingmambo this year. She has been named Kissed by a Star.

Turkish Tryst is from the Darby Dan family that produced champion and Classic winner Little Current and GI Spinaway S. and GI Matron S. winner Prayers 'N Promises

Twice group-placed in France at three, Shakis was second in the G3 Al Rashidiya at Nad al Sheba in February of 2005, but managed only a handicap win in nine subsequent starts in the United Arab Emirates. He made his U.S. debut for trainer Kiaran McLaughlin in an optional claimer going nine furlongs at Belmont May 25 and came home a narrow winner. Beaten only a head by Better Talk Now and English Channel when third in the 10-furlong GI Manhattan H. June 9, the Irish-bred found the 11 furlongs of the July 15 GII Bowling Green H. too long and had to settle for fourth, but was back on top of his game at this shorter trip. The seven-year-old was tucked in along the rail on the first turn and maintained good position through three-quarters in 1:10.11. Ready to pounce at the head of the stretch, Shakis skimmed the hedge with a quick burst of acceleration and outgamed closer Big Prairie at the wire, setting a record for nine furlongs on the Mellon Turf Course. Trainer Jerry Hollendorfer kept his Monmouth batting average at 1.000 after saddling Hystericalady to this impressive score. Hollendorfer made his first Monmouth appearance with King Glorious in the '89 Haskell Invitational H. The colt was the 7-10 chalk and led nearly every step to win by three lengths. Hystericalady, Hollendorfer's second Monmouth starter, used the same tactics. After breaking sharply, she was pressed by India through a half in a sensible :48.08 and six furlongs in 1:11.81, then opened up down the lane to win easily. "I knew she was fast," said jockey Eddie Castro. "I just wanted to get her out there and get her to relax early on. She did just that." The winner of the GII Hollywood BC Oaks last year, the chestnut captured the May 5 GI Humana Distaff S. going seven panels in her third start this season. She stretched out to be second in the June 3 GII Milady BC H. and third in the GI Van-ity H. at Hollywood, and is likely to stay at a route for the Oct. 27 GI Breeders' Cup Distaff. Cool as ever at the ripe old age of eight, Le Cinquieme Essai successfully defended his title in this event over testing underfoot conditions. Runner-up to today's GII Nijinsky S. candidate Sky Conqueror in the GII King Edward Breeders' Cup S. last July, the chestnut then shipped to Chicago and just missed when second in the Sea O' Erin BC H. Aug. 5. He had subsequent GI Woodbine Mile winner Becrux (Ity) a half-length back in second in the 2006 edition of this event, but disappeared thereafter. Off for nine months, he prepped for this with a third to Awesome Action in the Ontario Jockey Club S. over track and trip July 21. Le Cinquieme Essai bounded away from the stalls and took the field along under restraint as a driving rainstorm softened the Woodbine turf. Just Rushing tried the winner in the stretch, but he had something left and won under steady encouragement. "He was still running strong at the finish," said jockey Steve Bahen. A half-sister to Chic (GB), who took this race in 2004 and 2005, Echelon fought off the attentions of fellow Cheveley Park homebred Cesare to post the mild upset. The winner of the G3 Dahlia S. at Newmarket May 5, Echelon successfully defended her title in Epsom's G3 Princess Elizabeth S. June 1 before finishing fifth in the G2 Windsor Forest S. at Royal Ascot June 20. Shipped to The Curragh 10 days later for the G1 Pretty Polly S., she was no match for Peeping Fawn when sixth on the testing ground. Restrained behind the early pace while tracking Blue Ksar here, she made her move as Cesare loomed alongside passing the quarter pole. Rallying between those rivals to lead with a furlong remaining, she quickly repelled the challenge and was firmly in command at the line. Cheveley Park's Managing Director Chris Richardson said, "Although Sir Michael [Stoute] says she stays 10 furlongs, I think she's better over a mile. Now she has her Group 2, we'll have to look at a Group 1--maybe the G1 Matron S. [at Leopardstown Sept. 8] is an option, but we'll see how she comes out of the race." "He's the European version of Secretariat," said Jim Bolger after New Approach's comprehensive victory yesterday. Proclaimed a ☆ **"TDN Rising Star"** ☆ following his course-and-distance debut success July 15, New Approach followed up in the G3 Tyros S. at Leopardstown 13 days later. 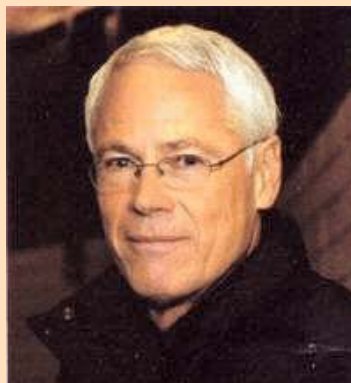

After Market bids for his fourth straight graded-stakes success. The four-year-old put together a similar streak to open his career, following up on a maiden win at two and an entry-level allowance score at three with wins in the GIII Lexington S. at Belmont and GII Hall of Fame BC S. at Saratoga. He hit a rough patch after that effort, finishing off the board in two East Coast outings and, after heading west and joining the John Shirreffs stable, was out of the money in two more at Santa Anita, but got on track this spring. After a handy success in the Apr. 28 GIII Inglewood H. at Hollywood, After Market took on Lava Man in the June 9 GI Charlie Whittingham H. and handed him a 1 1/2-length defeat. He added a victory in the July 22 GI Eddie Read H. at Del Mar and will be heavily favored to handle this field as well. **Runaway Dancer** is three-for-five on the Del Mar turf. The winner of the Escondido H. over course and distance last summer, he lost all chance after a nightmare trip in the 2006 edition of this race. The eight-year-old was beaten less than five lengths in six of his next seven attempts and finally returned to the winner's circle with a rallying score in the July 15 GII Sunset H.

AUSTRALIAN RACING KO'ED BY VIRUS Responding to an equine influenza virus outbreak in the country, officials have placed an indefinite ban on the movement of Thoroughbreds in Australia. The ban has stopped racing in every jurisdiction in the country and dramatically impacted the breeding industry, now posing a threat to many millions of dollars in potential breeding fees. "And who knows how long this ban will be in effect," sighed Andrew Harding, CEO of the Australian Racing Board. "It is a tragedy, but we must contain the virus." The first case of the equine influenza virus was found in a shuttle stallion that arrived at the quarantine barns of Eastern Creek in New South Wales in August. Another 17 shuttlers in quarantine were then prevented from leaving for their farms. According to experts, the virus was carried out of the quarantine facility on clothing and inadvertently transported to Centennial Park in Sydney, some 45 miles away. Eleven horses at Centennial Park have now tested positive, prompting government officials to enact the ban. According to Australian Jockey Club Chief Steward Ray Murrihy, the situation could get worse before it gets better. "Other countries have had their racing industries crippled for up to two months, and we fear that is a possibility here as well," Murrihy said. "We will know more by Monday, but things don't look positive at the moment." The cancellations included a huge day set for Royal Randwick, where five stakes races were scheduled, and could cost more than A\$25 million in handle. Breeding operations, too, were feeling the pinch. Coolmore's stallion parade, set for this weekend, will not feature their shuttlers, and its annual media day, slated for Tuesday, has been postponed indefinitely. "The smallest amount of risk is too much when it comes to exotic diseases finding their way into our country," said State Minister for Primary Industries Ian MacDonald. "That is why the State Government has moved quickly to respond and stop the disease from spreading." MacDonald added, "This means that horses cannot move from the property [where] they are located until more is known about the location of the disease. If animals are in transit, owners can take them on to their destination, or back to their property of origin--which ever is the safest and most sensible option. I want to make it absolutely clear that there have never been reported cases where humans have been infected with equine influenza."

HOLY BULL TO BECOME KY DERBY PREP The GIII Holy Bull S., which in the past has served as a lead-in to the GI Fountain of Youth S., has been moved to the end of the Gulfstream Park calendar. The \$150,000 event will be run Apr. 12 next year, three weeks before the GI Kentucky Derby, and the distance of the race has been changed from a flat mile to 1 3/16 miles, making it the Kentucky Derby's longest prep. The 2008 Derby will be run May 3. "In making a few adjustments to the Holy Bull, which has been one of our most attractive and competitive races, we give owners and trainers the opportunity to compete for graded-stakes money just a few weeks before the Kentucky Derby," Gulfstream Racing Manager Bernie Hettel said. "While their horse may not be ready to take on the best at a mile and an eighth the last Saturday in March, there is the possibility that, after racing in the Holy Bull, it will blossom to take on the best the first Saturday in May."

SPITZER MAY DELAY FRANCHISE DECISION New York Gov. Eliot Spitzer, on hand at Saratoga for yesterday's GI Travers S., said he may not have a recommendation as to who should be awarded the franchise to run New York racing by his Sept. 4 deadline. "We're going to try very hard to stick to the Sept. 4 deadline, but I think the thing to keep in mind is that there is a legislative enactment that is required," Spitzer told *Daily Racing Form*. "There's obviously going to be a back and forth, constructive dialogue with the legislature about what the right structure should be, who the right parties should be. We're looking at all these pieces with the appropriate intensity and scrutiny to figure out what is best for the sport." The New York Racing Association holds the current franchise, which runs through Dec. 31, 2007, but Spitzer said that an extension of that agreement is unlikely. "It would indicate an inability to make a decision and consequently failure of the process," Spitzer added. "Having said that, nobody will tolerate an expiration of a franchise such that there is no legal structure to permit the sport to continue. I don't want to say we won't do it--it is a legal possibility--but it is certainly not something I look forward to." It has been rumored that the governor is considering plans that would include closing Aqueduct, but the *DRF* reported that the track's immediate future is secure. "As part of this franchise, we're not going to suggest closing it immediately," Spitzer told *DRF*. "If nothing else, Belmont needs to be winterized. That will take some period of time, but I think over the long term, people would be fair to right to ask the question what is the best use of that property?"

HERB MCCAULEY READY FOR RETURN Jockey Herb McCauley turned 50 in May and hasn't ridden in a race in nine years, but he is getting ready to make his return. Sidelined after shattering his leg in a spill at Monmouth Park in 1998, the North Carolina native suffered through 3 1/2 years of physical therapy before getting back on his feet. He started thinking seriously about ending his retirement this year, but he has been on the comeback trail since March. "I'm feeling good, and I've got my weight down to 115 with the help of a physical trainer and a nutritionist," McCauley said. The leading apprentice at Monmouth in 1976, McCauley was a regular on the Jersey circuit for the next two decades. He topped the standings at the Meadowlands three times and took the 1983 GI Haskell Invitational H. with Deputed Testamony. He also captured the 1992 GI Travers S. with Thunder Rumble and the 1995 GI Kentucky Oaks with Gal in a Ruckus. When the spill put an abrupt stop to his career, he had 3,049 victories. McCauley considered becoming a steward, and he tried his hand as agent for jockeys Kyle Kaenel and Eddie King Jr., but after testing his leg while galloping horses for trainers Greg Sacco and Al Goldberg, and getting back down to riding weight, he decided to give it another try. "I'm looking to start back on Labor Day, either at the Meadowlands or Saratoga," McCauley said. "I'm looking forward to riding again."
