MAJESTIC WARRIOR UPSETS HOPEFUL

The short four-horse field was expected to be a match race between GII Sanford S. winner **Ready's Image** (More Than Ready) and \$4.6-million debut sensation **Maimonides** (Vindication), but **Majestic Warrior** (A.P. Indy) flew from last to first down the lane to win yesterday's GI Hopeful S. by a widening 2 1/4 lengths. "He put in a tremendous run and he has to be a good horse to make up that kind of ground," trainer

Bill Mott said of the Kinsman homebred. "He was 10 out of it

when they turned for home, and he rolled by them." The Hopeful victory, the first of his Hall of Fame career, capped a stellar 2007 spa meet for Mott, who captured his ninth trainer's title at the Spa with 27 wins. "Words can't describe [the meet]," Mott said. "It doesn't get much better than this." **Cont. p2**

'REBEL' RETIRED AFTER FREAK INCIDENT

This year's dual Guineas hero **Cockney Rebel** (Ire) (Val Royal {Fr}--Factice, by Known Fact) has been retired after sustaining a freak injury yesterday morning at Newmarket. Explaining the incident that prompted the colt's retirement, trainer Geoff Huffer said, "He was cantering [Monday] morning and spooked at a piece of paper, and his hind leg hit his near-fore on the tendon," Huffer said. "He pulled up sound, but there was a slight bump there when we took him back to the yard. The scan shows there is a slight injury which would take three months or so to heal, so I called [owner] Phil [Cunningham] and he has been over to see him and decided to retire him." **Cont. p4**

TIMBER FELLS THE COMPETITION

Trainer John Kimmel was concerned his **Timber Reserve** (Forest Camp) might not have the seasoning to win the GII Pennsylvania Derby, but the dark bay colt

proved he was more than up to the task with a determined neck victory in the nine-furlong contest at Philadelphia Park yesterday. Timber Reserve sat a stalking second as **Cable Boy** (Jump Start) set fractions of :23.04, :46.44 and 1:10.55. He moved to the lead in upper stretch as the pace-

setter began to tire and had just enough left to hold off the late rush of **Xchanger** (Exchange Rate) in stakes-record equaling time of 1:47 3/5. Timber Reserve's finish already has Kimmel looking ahead. "I think he had more gas in the tank," Kimmel said. "He galloped out well in front of them, which is a good sign of things to come." **Cont. p3**

GAME, SET, MATCH FOR SET PLAY

Set Play (Van Nistelrooy), a 14-1 longshot, bounded to the lead at the top of the lane and went on to take yesterday's GI Del Mar Debutante by a confident two lengths. The chestnut filly became the second graded stakes winner and first Grade I victoress for her Irish group-winning freshman sire. **Cont. p2**

Maimonides, who became an overnight sensation with an 11 1/2-length debut win sprinting 5 1/2 furlongs at Saratoga Aug. 8, appeared to be travelling easily on the front end of yesterday's Hopeful, setting fractions of :22.60, :45.00 and 1:09.40, while favored **Ready's Image** (More Than Ready) was being nudged along by John Velazquez to keep pace. Turning for home, Ready's Image began to assert himself and took over at the quarter pole while Maimonides faded. **Majestic Warrior** trailed the field after an awkward break, but closed powerfully with a four-wide move down the lane, inhaling the two favorites to win going away. "After three-eighths of a mile, I had to squeeze him," admitted winning rider Garrett Gomez. "Some of his greenness was showing. I just tried to give him some confidence. He's a nice colt. Class exudes from him." As for what is next for Majestic Warrior, Bill Mott said, "Obviously, he proved today that he can handle the best colts we have on the East Coast. Probably the next logical step is to look at the [Oct. 6 GI] Champagne." Connections of the second and third-place finishers were not discouraged by their charge's efforts. "When you are in a situation where you have two horses to beat, and one of them has speed and the other comes from way back, you have a decision to make," said Todd Pletcher, trainer of Ready's Image. "We wanted to keep [Maimonides] honest. Today, when [Ready's Image] got there and the other horse fell off, I think he got to wandering around a little bit. The winner had a nice set-up." Bob Baffert, trainer of Maimonides, commented, "He got tired. There is a big jump going to seven furlongs. I was hoping things would be easier on the front end. Once Ready's Image stayed with us, I knew it would be tough." Majestic Warrior is the son of another Kinsman homebred trained by Bill Mott, MGISW Dream Supreme (Seeking the Gold). Now 10, Dream Supreme won the GI Test S. and GI Ballerina S. at Saratoga in 2000. She is the dam of four-year-old stakes winner Crystal Current (A.P. Indy) and has a yearling colt by El Prado (Ire) and a weanling filly by Giant's Causeway. Timber Reserve broke his maiden in his third start at Churchill Downs last October and was then thrown into graded-stakes company where he set the pace before tiring to fourth behind Nobiz Like Shobiz in the Nov. 25 GI Remsen S. Put away after that effort, the dark bay colt returned with a front-running tally in a one-mile optional claiming race at Belmont July 21. He had been doing well since that effort, according to trainer John Kimmel. "He had trained so very, very well coming into the race, but still had lots of questions to answer," Kimmel admitted. "He'd never won around two turns, hadn't beaten this type of competition before. He hadn't really been tested. Today we saw what a nice horse he is." As for what is next for Timber Reserve, Kimmel said, "He started to shed out a frog last week and there was some blood in that foot, so we'll wait for that to toughen up and go from there." Rosinka had won three in a row coming into her graded-stakes debut and was just able to keep the streak going with a fast-diminishing neck triumph here. The bay filly captured an off-the-turf allowance at Keeneland in April before back-to-back front-running stakes wins over the Delaware turf--including a half-length victory over subsequent GI Beverly D. S. winner Royal Highness (Ger) in the July 14 R. G. Dick Breeders' Cup H. Rosinka shadowed pacesetter longshot Mabadi (Sahm) before taking control just past the one-mile mark. She quickly opened up six lengths on the field before losing much of that advantage while taking a few awkward steps at midstretch, but battled on to just outfinish Mauralakana. "She's kind of goofy-minded," admitted winning rider Jeremy Rose, aboard for Rosinka's previous two starts. "Sometimes, she gets out and sometimes, she gets into it. When she bumped the rail a little bit, she went back on with it. She's good, but I think that craziness in her head makes her so good." Trainer H. Graham Motion echoed Rose's sentiments. "She's like a time bomb," he said. "I thought it was frugal to keep her here. I was more nervous about getting a saddle on her than I was about the race. ‘REBEL’ RETIRED (cont. from p1)

Winner of the G1 2000 Guineas and G1 Irish 2000 Guineas this spring, Phil Cunningham's Cockney Rebel had been sidelined with a hairline pelvic fracture after a fifth in the G1 St. James's Palace S. June 19 at Royal Ascot, but had been training well in recent weeks and was scheduled to return to action later this month in the G1 Queen Elizabeth II S. at Ascot. Trainer Geoff Huffer said, "He worked brilliantly [last week], and I'm just sorry for the staff and Phil, but he's a dual Classic winner and he's given us some sensational times. He had enough speed for six furlongs when second in Doncaster's St Leger Yearling Sales S. last year and he's the best horse I've ever had or ever will have. He's given everyone such a thrill and was unlucky in the St James's Palace, when he was injured, but still was beaten only a length and three-quarters. He's the best miler we've seen for a while." Stud plans have not yet been announced, but, according to Huffer, Cockney Rebel is likely to stand in England, with five studs in the mix. Cunningham told *PA Sport*, "I had a few inquiries about the horse earlier in the year and had decided to wait until the end of the season before making any decisions, but this has brought the decision forward. I had been considering keeping him in training as a four-year-old, but he won't be back in full training for three months now, and will miss the QEII and Champion S., so we have to do what's best for the horse." A 15,000gns TATDEC weanling and 30,000gns DONSEP yearling, the bay colt compiled a record of 6-3-1-1 and earned £448,721 while carrying Cunningham's colors. In addition to his Classic triumphs, Cockney Rebel also finished third by a half-length in last year's G2 Champagne S.

‘INK’ LOOKING AT LEOPARDSTOWN Raymond Tooth's G1 Coronation S. winner **Indian Ink (Ire)** (Indian Ridge {Ire}) will return to action in Saturday's G1 Coolmore Fusaichi Pegasus Matron S. at Leopardstown, for which she was one of 17 fillies and mares remaining at yesterday's five-day stage. Trainer Richard Hannon's son and assistant Richard Jr. yesterday reported the impressive six-length Royal Ascot heroine in fine fettle as she prepares for battle with Terry Neill's **Red Evie (Ire)** (Intikhab) and, possibly, Princess Zahra Aga Khan's **Darjina (Fr)** (Zamindar). "She's in great order and the plan is to run on Saturday," the younger Hannon told *PA Sport*. "She worked fantastically on Sunday morning and looks very, very well. A lot has been made about the ground for her, but as long as it is good, that will be fine. She does go on any ground; it's just that heavy ground slows down the others more than it helps her." Cheveley Park Stud yesterday supplemented their G2 Celebration Mile winner **Echelon (GB)** (Danehill), while **Finsceal Beo (Ire)** (Mr. Greeley) was left in the mile contest despite having the G1 Tattersalls Millions Irish Champion S. as a preferred option.

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HIS SIRE **DANEHILL DANCER** WAS A CHAMPION 2-Y-O.
HIS GRANDSIRE **DANEHILL** WAS A CHAMPION SPRINTER.
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NO AUTHORIZED IN CHAMPION Authorized (Ire) (Montjeu {Ire}) will not reoppose **Dylan Thomas (Ire)** (Danehill) in Saturday's G1 Tattersalls Millions Irish Champion S.; connections admitted to an administrative error in leaving the sophomore in the Leopardstown contest. After the G1 Epsom Derby and G1 Juddmonte International S. winner's name appeared amongst the 10 entries at yesterday's five-day stage, trainer Peter Chapple-Hyam confirmed to *PA Sport* that the three-year-old would skip the race and head straight to the G1 Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe at Longchamp Oct. 7. "It was a mistake--I hold my hands up and I will not be declaring him," Chapple-Hyam said. "Authorized is fine, but he won't be running before the Arc." Aidan O'Brien is expected to commit Dylan Thomas, but has yet to confirm whether any of his other four entries, which include **George Washington (Ire)** (Danehill), will line up in the 10-furlong contest. Jim Bolger has declared **Finsceal Beo (Ire)** (Mr. Greeley), who has the alternative of the G1 Coolmore Fusaichi Pegasus Matron S. on the same card, while Sheikh Hamdan bin Rashid Al Maktoum may be represented by **Maraahel (Ire)** (Alzao). He may be joined by G1 Breeders' Cup Turf winner **Red Rocks (Ire)** (Galileo {Ire}). Jamie McCalmont, Reddam's racing manager, suggested that Red Rocks would be in the line-up. "There's a good chance he'll run, but we will decide later in the week," McCalmont told *PA Sport* yesterday. "His target has always been the Breeders' Cup again at the end of the year, but he will need a prep race for it somewhere."

DARLEY SECURES HALF OF NEW APPROACH
Having acquired the future stud services of top three-year-olds on both sides of the Atlantic, Darley has now announced the purchase of a 50-percent interest in unbeaten juvenile **New Approach (Ire)** (Galileo {Ire})--Park Express {Ire}, by Ahonoora {GB}. The purchase price was not disclosed. A €430,000 Goffs Millions purchase as a yearling by trainer Jim Bolger, the handsome chestnut has won all three outings thus far, including the G2 Futurity S. at The Curragh Aug. 25. Bolger's wife Jackie will retain a 50-percent share. New Approach will continue to be trained by Bolger.

John Ferguson, Sheikh Mohammed's bloodstock advisor said, "We are delighted to have purchased a half-share in New Approach. He is one of the outstanding two-year-olds of 2007 who has the scope, pedigree and quality to go on to be a top prospect for the Classics next year." The colt's dam captured the G1 Phoenix Champion S. at three and went on to produce GSW and MG1SP Dazzling Park (Ire) (Warning {GB}) and top Japanese performer Shinko Forest (Ire) (Green Desert) prior to her death in 2006. Darley has also secured last year's European champion juvenile Teofilo (Ire).

AUSSIE EI UPDATE The New South Wales Department of Primary Industries announced yesterday that 119 properties in the state have been infected with equine influenza (EI). "A total of 835 horses are infected on these properties, while another 2,900 horses are considered suspect on a total of 319 properties," said Steve Dunn, deputy chief veterinary officer for the NSW DPI. According to a statement, the state-imposed quarantine restrictions on infected properties "will be lifted 30 days after the onset of clinical signs of equine influenza in the last clinical case, but this would not override any movement restrictions in force at that time. Dunn added, "This is a highly contagious disease. Our experience is that all animals housed together, or close to infected horses, are likely to get the disease."

Racing, Sort Of...

Authorities yesterday granted in principle approval for a restricted race meeting at Warwick Farm Saturday, according to racingandsports.com.au. Only horses trained at Warwick Farm will be permitted to take part, and spectators will not be allowed. A tentative program of nine races has drawn 214 entries, including Group 1 winners **Camarilla (NZ)** (Elusive Quality), **Fiumicino (NZ)** (Zabeel {NZ}), **Mentality (Aus)** (Flying Spur {Aus}) and **Rena's Lady (Aus)** (Arena {Aus}), who meet in a 1400-meter handicap.

Magic Millions has announced that the Gold Coast Horses-in-Training Sale, slated to take place Oct. 8-11, has been postponed due to the EI crisis. 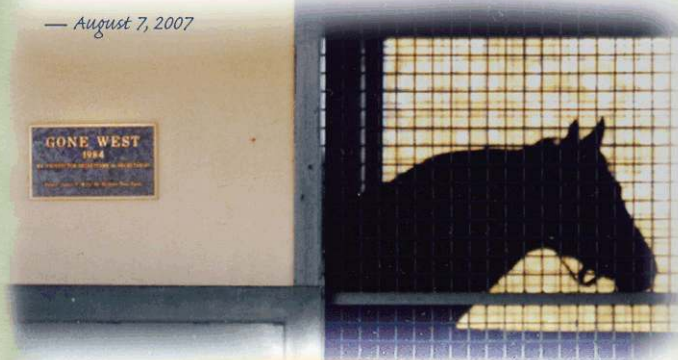

Originally known as the Rare Perfume, the GI Garden City Breeders' Cup S. was contested on the dirt when Personal Ensign won it in 1987, and November Snow and Sky Beauty took back-to-back editions in 1992 and 1993. It was moved to the grass in 1994, and renamed for the town just east of Belmont Park in 1998. It received Grade I status in 1999.

In its 13 runnings since changing surfaces, the Garden City has been won by some of the most accomplished distaff turf runners in the U.S. Perfect Sting took the race in 1999, and went on to earn the Eclipse Award in 2000 before retiring with more than \$2.2 million in earnings. Both Voodoo Dancer (2001) and Wonder Again (2002) bankrolled more than \$1.4 million during their careers.

Wonder Again is also the only winner to score by less than a length, beating Riskaverse to the wire by a half.

The Garden City honor roll also includes fillies who have gone on to make a mark after retirement. Juddmonte homebred True Flare captured the event in 1996, when it was still a Grade II. In the breeding shed, she has produced GISW Latent Heat (Maria's Mon), MGSW Art Master (Royal Academy) and the ill-fated GSW Indian Flare (Cherokee Run). Her current two-year-old, Eagle Strike (Storm Cat), made his debut at Saratoga Aug. 25 and finished third.

Gaviola, the shortest-priced winner at 2-5 in 2000, was eight-for-17 in her career with earnings of \$589,142. She has had four foals since she left the track. None have raced, but her first, the four-year-old filly Tiwintza (Storm Cat), brought \$500,000 from Calumet Farm at the 2006 Keeneland November Sale; and her third, the two-year-old colt Planetary Motion (Gone West) was purchased by John Ferguson for \$750,000 at the 2006 Keeneland September Sale. The mare, now 10, sold to ClassicStar for \$1.9 million at KEENOV 2004 while carrying that foal.

Jade Flush, who won the inaugural grass edition in '94, boasts the largest winning margin of 6 1/2 lengths, and the longest winning odds at 11-1. Her daughter Jade Queen (Giant's Causeway) took to the gate for the 2006 running, only to finish third, 2 1/2 lengths behind Magnificent Song.

According to the latest *Thoroughbred Times* Stallion Directory, at least 58 stallion sons of Gone West are plying their trade worldwide. Of this sizeable collection, the two highest-priced in 2007--and therefore arguably the most important to the American industry--were Elusive Quality at \$100,000 and Mr. Greeley at \$75,000 (although the connections of the unproven Speightstown and Johar might want to disagree with that statement, as might those of the distinctly promising Proud Citizen).

Of course, Elusive Quality and Mr. Greeley originally made their name at much lower fees, neither of them having won anything more prestigious than Grade III events during their careers as sprinter-milers. Elusive Quality spend his first four seasons at only \$10,000 before a strong showing from his first juveniles in 2002 created considerable demand for his 2003 services at \$30,000. The exploits of such as Omega Code, Great Notion, Gimmeawink and Chimichurri helped raise Elusive Quality's fee to \$50,000 for 2004--with this fee being set before a second-crop two-year-old called Smarty Jones gained his first stakes success.

Interest reached fever pitch during the 2004 covering season when Smarty Jones was establishing himself as the champion colt of his generation, and Elusive Quality's fee consequently rose to \$100,000 in 2005.

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The sire of 88 Stakes horses, including three Champions (among them Real Quiet), and the broodmare sire of five G1 winners (among them Bernardini). He has average earnings per starter of more than \$77,000, and he's had 14 Stakes horses in 2007 alone (among them the Nad Al Sheba mile-and-a-quarter record-breaker, Folk).

Mr. Greeley also started out at \$10,000 during his days at Dixiana Farm. Each of his four seasons spent at that fee yielded at least one Grade I winner--El Corredor in his first, Celtic Melody and Reel Buddy in his second, Nonsuch Bay in his third and Whywhywhy in his fourth--to set his fee rising, but it wasn't until 2003 that his fee reached \$50,000.

It's natural to expect a steep rise in fee to translate into a similarly steep rise in the stallion's achievements, but this doesn't always follow. This can happen because a rise in fee inevitably affects the type of mare sent to a stallion--perhaps switching the emphasis from hard-knocking mares below graded level to less tough types with classier bloodlines. The emphasis can also switch from speed to a more Classic type. Another possible factor is that rising nomination fees and escalating prices in the sales ring can put the stallion and his progeny beyond the reach the very people who helped make the stallion's name.

It is worth mentioning that Elusive Quality finished third on the international first-crop sires' list of 2002, which was headed by Grand Slam, another son of Gone West. Grand Slam's fee rose from \$25,000 in 2002 to \$30,000 in 2003 and then to \$75,000 in 2004 before peaking at \$85,000 in 2005. But his fee was on the

slide before his higher-priced crops had had a chance to prove themselves, and he was down to \$35,000 this year.

The question with Grand Slam is whether his current two-year-olds, the product of his \$75,000 season, will do well enough to set his fee climbing once again. Judging by his very talented English filly Laureldean Gale, a recent acquisition by Godolphin, they might just do it.

Elusive Quality's current juveniles (119 of them) were sired at \$50,000, and so were Mr. Greeley's. It was therefore good to see each of them represented by a possible champion over the weekend in Europe. Mr. Greeley's tough daughter Saoirse Abu followed up her Phoenix S. success with another Group 1 victory in the Moyglare Stud S. The filly's victories mean that Mr. Greeley now has the admirable record of having sired seven Grade I winners from his first nine crops (plus another from his single Australian crop).

Elusive Quality's potential champion is his unbeaten son Raven's Pass, who came home five lengths clear in a Listed race at Ascot in July before stretching seven lengths clear in the G3 Solario S. three days ago, when he smashed the track record for two-year-olds. This exciting Stonerside colorbearer appears to do everything easily and it doesn't require too big a stretch of the imagination to see him developing into a Group 1 winner. His dam, the Grade III turf winner Ascutney, has already produced the Grade III turf scorer Gigawatt and her sister Words of War has two very good winners to her credit in No Matter What (GI Del Mar Oaks) and the talented stallion E Dubai.

I must admit to being disappointed so far with Elusive Quality's 2004 crop. Not only was it comfortably his biggest crop up to that stage, at 108 foals, but it also represents his first step up the price ladder, to \$30,000 in 2003. Although it has produced a handful of minor stakes winners and Listed winners, only one of the 108 has so far managed to reach the first three in a group or graded contest. We are still also waiting for the first graded winner from Elusive Quality's 82-strong 2003 crop, despite the consistent efforts of such as G City Gal and Smart N Pretty, but this crop was sired at only \$10,000. Perhaps some of Elusive Quality's three-year-olds will make their mark at a later stage, just as his six-year-old daughter Maryfield has done this year with her victories in the GII Distaff Breeders' Cup H. and GI Ballerina S.

Although I am disappointed with Elusive Quality's 2004 crop, I appreciate that the pre-Smartie Jones Elusive Quality was a very different commodity to the post-Smartie Jones stallion. Whereas breeders had largely pigeon-holed the son of Gone West as a sire of sprinter-milers, Smartie Jones's victories in the Kentucky Derby and Preakness opened up a whole new range of possibilities.

It is therefore fair to think that Elusive Quality's first \$100,000 crop will prove an entirely different proposition. There are 19 youngsters from this crop in Book 1 of next week's September Sale (plus another 19 in Book 2) and among them are sons or daughters of the champion fillies Xtra Heat, Countess Diana, Farda Amiga and Queen's Logic.

Coincidentally, the 19 in Book 1 also include a colt from the same Morning Has Broken family as Mr. Greeley's rising star Saoirse Abu. The colt, hip no. 2005, is bred along very similar lines to Saoirse Abu. Both are by sons of Gone West, and the Elusive Quality colt's dam Subtle Breeze is by Storm Cat out of a daughter of Morning Has Broken, whereas Saoirse Abu's dam Out Too Late is by a son of Storm Cat out of Morning Has Broken.

Incidentally, Out Too Late, a daughter of GIII winner Future Storm, was foaled when Morning Has Broken was 23 years old. The incentive to continue breeding from Morning Has Broken was to produce close relatives to her remarkable granddaughter Balanchine. This daughter of Storm Bird won classics in Britain and Ireland and went close to winning a third. Although Balanchine has yet to prove as effective as a broodmare, her very talented three-parts-sister Red Slippers is the dam of this year's Prix de Diane winner West Wind. With these Classic-winning relatives, Saoirse Abu could easily follow in the footsteps of Finsceal Beo, Jim Bolger's other outstanding Mr. Greeley filly who went close to a tremendous classic treble earlier this year.

Saoirse Abu's success also raises the question of whether Balanchine's broodmare career could be turned around by her two-year-old--a colt by Gone West bred to a similar cross to Speightstown.

STREET SENSE BACK AT CHURCHILL GI Kentucky Derby winner **Street Sense** (Street Cry {Ire}) returned to his Churchill Downs base early Monday morning, but the colt's next start remains uncertain. The Carl Nafzger-trained colt arrived at the Louisville track at approximately 5 a.m. yesterday following an all-night van ride from Saratoga Race Course. Also on the van was stablemate and GI Alabama S. winner **Lady Joanne** (Orientate). Nafzger has not made a final decision on where Street Sense will prep for the Oct. 27 GI Breeders' Cup Classic, but possibilities include the Sept. 22 Massachusetts H. or GII Super Derby; the GII Kentucky Cup Classic or GII Hawthorne Gold Cup, both on Sept. 29; or the Sept. 30 GI Jockey Club Gold Cup. "I really can't rule any of those out, the way things are shaping up," Nafzger said. "There are a lot of incentives out there, but if the horse comes out of this race good, we could catch the right plane and could go anywhere." Both Gold Cups are run at 1 1/4 miles, while the rest of the races are nine-furlong events. Lady Joanne's schedule, meanwhile, has been set. The filly is expected to start next in the Oct. 7 GI Spinster S. at Keeneland and, if all goes well, in the GI Breeders' Cup Distaff. "It could get better, but it's been a great year," Nafzger admitted. "What's in front of us, that's the exciting part and the challenge, and we'll see what happens. We'll do what we've done all year. We'll take one race at a time and see where we end up."

CARLO VITTADINI DIES Racing is mourning the death of the celebrated owner/breeder Dr. Carlo Vittadini, who passed away Sunday at the age of 92. Chairman of the Banco Agricola Milanese in the 1980s, his famed dark blue and yellow silks were immortalised by the great Grundy (Ire), who captured the G1 Irish 2000 Guineas, G1 Epsom Derby and G1 Irish Derby before outbattling Bustino (GB) in what many claim to be the greatest race of the 20th century, the 1975 G1 King George VI and Queen Elizabeth Diamond S. Peter Walwyn trained that Luminary, and he paid tribute to the man who also made his name by chairing the Banca Agricola Milanese. "Dr. Vittadini was a most marvellous man and we had such wonderful times together," Walwyn told *Racing Post*. "After Grundy won the Derby, I had a disagreement with his racing manger because I wanted to go for the Irish Derby, and he wanted to drop down in trip to run in the Eclipse. Fortunately, the owner took my advice. Grundy won very easily at The Curragh. He was an owner who would always listen to his trainer, rightly or wrongly." Vittadini, who was born Apr. 20, 1915, became involved in racing as an amateur jockey and rode several winners on the flat in the early 1950s. Among his first purchases in Britain was Exar (GB), who went on to success in the Gran Premio d'Italia and Gran Premio di Milano, a feat matched by his Accrale (GB) six years later. Amongst the best horses he bred were the Derby Italiano heroes Ortis (Ity), Ardale (Ity) and Orange Bay (GB), with the former and latter both going on to finish runner-up behind Mill Reef and The Minstrel in their respective King Georges at Ascot. His daughter Franca Vittadini now runs Grundy Bloodstock, which recently enjoyed success at the top level with the 1999 G1 Prix de la Foret winner Field of Hope (Ire), the dam of last year's G1 2000 Guineas third-place finisher Olympian Odyssey (GB). The family's stud Agricola Oriano also bred Distant Way, winner of the last two editions of the G1 Premio Presidente della Repubblica at the Capannelle.

ABDULLAH SHUFFLES JUVENILE HAND Khalid Abdullah is set to launch a cross-channel attack on the major juvenile fillies' prizes with the ☆ **"TDN Rising Star"** ☆ **Proviso (GB)** (Dansili {GB}) and **Sense of Joy (GB)** (Dansili {GB}). While the former, who took the G3 Prix du Calvados for the Andre Fabre stable at Deauville Aug. 18, is likely to ship to Ascot to run in the Sept. 28 G1 Meon Valley Stud Fillies' Mile, the John Gosden-trained G3 Prestige S. winner Sense of Joy is set to travel to Longchamp for the Oct. 7 G1 Prix Marcel Boussac. "Sense of Joy is in good form and came out of Goodwood in very good shape," Racing Manager Teddy Grimthorpe told *Racing Post*. "I would think she will go for the Boussac next, with Proviso likely to go for the Fillies' Mile."



SOLDIER HOLLOW RETIRED TO ROTTGEN

Gestut Park Wiedingen's Baron Helmut von Finck and the executives at Gestut Rottgen have concluded a deal regarding the retirement of the multiple Group 1 winner Soldier Hollow (GB) (In the Wings {GB}--Island Race {GB}, by Common Grounds {GB}). The seven-year-old, who took his second renewal of the G1 Grosser Dallmayr-Preis in July, having won the Munich show-case in 2005, will stand at the prestigious Cologne-based stud. "It took me quite some time to decide what is best for the horse, but I feel to have done the right thing," von Finck said. "He was so good to me, I owe him." The bay has carved out a reputation as one of his country's finest performers with two successes in the G1 Premio Roma in 2004 and 2005 and last year's G2 Prix Dollar at Longchamp. He has also finished runner-up in the 2006 G1 Premio Presidente della Repubblica and third in last year's GI Arlington Million. He took his earnings past the €1-million mark in winning the Grosser Dallmayr-Preis in July, and was runner-up to Mi Emma (Ger) over an inadequate mile in Baden-Baden's G2 Darley Oettingen-Rennen last Tuesday. Soldier Hollow's record stands at 31-12-8-2.

SECRET HEADS SPRINT LIST

Bridget Swire's **Sakhee's Secret (GB)** (Sakhee) yesterday featured among the 25 horses remaining in Saturday's G1 Haydock Sprint Cup. Jockey Steve Drowne was in confident mood as he prepared to renew acquaintance with the impressive G1 July Cup hero. "It is a big ask after winning the July Cup, but I think mentally he is bound to be better," Drowne told *Racing Post*. "Without a doubt it taught him a lot; I think he is sharper. I thought the Haydock race was the one for him and he surpassed our expectations winning at Newmarket. He has got a little bit bigger and stronger; he is maturing all the time and he looks great. Sakhee's Secret goes there with a favourite's chance--I would imagine everyone is looking that they have got to beat us, not the other way round." Also in the list for the six-furlong contest is Susan Roy and Cheveley Park Stud's July Cup runner-up **Dutch Art (GB)** (Medicean {GB}), one of two from the Peter Chapple-Hyam barn alongside Ziad Galadari's G3 Phoenix Sprint S. winner **Al Qasi (Ire)** (Elnadim), but their stable companion Tariq (GB) was a notable scratch and may now head to Ascot's G1 Queen Elizabeth II S. Sept. 29. Sheikh Hamdan bin Rashid Al Maktoum paid the £17,500 supplementary fee to add **Per Incanto** (Street Cry {Ire}) to the contest, and the G3 Premio Tudini-winning sophomore will bid to better his sixth for new connections in Newbury's G2 Hungerford S. Aug. 18. "We'll see what the weather does this week," Racing Manager Angus Gold told i. "He wouldn't run if it went soft, but otherwise he is set to take his chance." Others of note include Carla Giral's G1 Prix Maurice de Gheest winner **Marchand d'Or (Fr)** (Marchand de Sable) and Budget Stables' G1 Golden Jubilee S. hero **Soldier's Tale** (Stravinsky).

FIREWORKS AT FAIRYHOUSE? Europe's yearling sales season has begun in sensational fashion, with figures up across the board at Deauville, Doncaster and Baden-Baden, and today it's Tattersalls Ireland's turn as they launch the three-day September Sale at their Fairyhouse venue. This season, the 2005 graduate Creachadoir (Ire)--who cost just €83,000--has finished runner-up in both the G1 Poule d'Essai des Poulains at Longchamp and G1 Irish 2000 Guineas at The Curragh, while the €16,000-purchase Valbenny (Ire) has proved a revelation Stateside when winning Hollywood Park's GII Honeymoon Breeders' Cup H. in June before finishing runner-up in the GI American Oaks the following month and GI Del Mar Oaks in August. Others to fly the flag in 2007 include the G1 Irish 1000 Guineas runner-up Dimenticata (Ire), bought for €50,000; and the G3 Prix du Lys winner Airmail Special (Ire), who fetched a mere €9,000 in 2005 and now races in the colors of Sheikh Mohammed bin Rashid Al Maktoum. All have added luster to the previous alumni which include the 2004 G1 Irish 1000 Guineas heroine Saoire (GB), the multiple group and graded stakes winner Silver Cup (Ire), top-class sprinter The Tatling (Ire), 2005 G1 Poule d'Essai des Poulains runner-up Indesatchel (Ire), 2002 G1 Dewhurst S. winner Tout Seul (Ire) and 2001 G1 Yorkshire Oaks heroine Super Tassa (Ire). Tatts Ireland also stages a €300,000 sales race in August at The Curragh, won this year by the €21,000-acquisition Sudden Impact (Ire); her Danetime (Ire) half-sister is a notable withdrawal.
