A GODOLPHIN REPEAT AT LONGCHAMP?

Looking to take back-to-back renewals, Godolphin sends out **Ramonti (Fr)** (Martino Alonso {Ire}) in a strong renewal of the G1 Qatar Prix du Moulin de Longchamp today. Librettist carried the Godolphin blue to victory in the one-mile event 12 months ago. Ramonti has a progressive profile that stands comparison with many of the operation's past international stars, and his hard-working style has already garnered him the June 19 G1 Queen Anne S. at Royal Ascot and Aug. 1 G1 Sussex S. at Goodwood last time out. "Ramonti is in good form and has done really well since his last win," trainer Saeed bin Suroor said. "There are some very good horses in the French race, so it will be a tough challenge, but he is a dual Group 1 winner this year and has the class to win. He is fresh and ready for action, so we are looking to see a good run from him." **Cont. p14**

BALLYDOYLE BONANZA

Leopardstown witnessed another remarkable feat of Aidan O'Brien training yesterday as **Dylan Thomas (Ire)** (Danehill) led home stablemates **Duke of Marmalade (Ire)** (Danehill) and 100-1 **Red Rock Canyon (Ire)** (Rock of Gibraltar {Ire}) for a Ballydoyle 1-2-3 in the G1 Tattersalls Millions Irish Champion S. Although Ballydoyle whitewashes are almost customary in the major prizes, the sight of the 8-15 favorite drawing clear of his companions was one for the County Tipperary outfit to cherish. Susan Magnier and Michael Tabor's hardened campaigner settled the result with an irresistible sweep at the eighth pole after his teammates had judged the fractions to perfection, and he earned the ultimate tribute from rider Kieren Fallon. "He's the best I've ridden--you're not going to get any better than this lad," Fallon said. **Cont. p3**

DANCING BY HERSELF

Alexander Tango (Ire) (Danehill Dancer {Ire}) unleashed a devastating turn of foot in yesterday's GI Garden City Breeders' Cup S. to take it by 3/4 of a length. **Bit of Whimsy** (Distorted Humor) won a three-way photo for second, edging out **Sharp Susan** (Touch Gold) and **Costume (GB)** (Danehill) by a pair of noses. Making her U.S. debut here, Alexander Tango was settled in ninth as **New Edition** (Stormy Atlantic) set pedestrian fractions of :25.80, :50.32 and 1:14.52. Taken out five wide by jockey Shaun Bridgmohan on the turn for home, the chestnut began to pick off horses and came flying down the center of the course to win going away. "She's used to those kinds of races in Europe, where they go slow and pick it up late," Bridgmohan said. "Once she got daylight, she just picked it up and ran home." **Cont. p2**

A European Foundation...

Alexander Tango won her debut at The Curragh last July, then finished third, beaten a head, in the G2 Debutante S. at Leopardstown two weeks later. She finished a respectable fifth in the G1 Moyglare Stud S. in August and closed out her juvenile campaign with a seventh-place finish in the G1 Fillies Mile at Ascot Sept. 23. Making her sophomore debut in the Listed Loughbrown S. Apr. 15, she crossed the

line second and followed with a fourth-place finish in the May 7 G3 EBF Tetrarch S. Favored at 2-1 in the G3 Derrinstown Stud 1000 Guineas Trial May 13, the Noel O'Callaghan colorbearer posted a smart three-length tally. She ran well to finish fourth behind Finsceal Beo in the G1 Irish 1000 Guineas May 27 and resurfaced to annex the Listed Kilboy Estate S. July 15. Alexander Tango entered the Garden City off a runner-up effort in the G2 Royal Whip S. Aug. 12. James Stack, son and assistant trainer to conditioner Tommy Stack, thought his charge was in trouble following the slow fractions. "Ideally, we wanted to be mid-pack early," he said. "We thought she would be well-suited for American racing, because she runs best with a good pace in front of her. I thought we were done on the backstretch; the pace was slow and she was farther back than I thought she would be. She'll stay here for the [GI] Flower Bowl [Invitational, Sept. 29]."

Off Day For Rutherienne...

Rutherienne (Pulpit), favored at 8-5, never seemed to have her mind on racing yesterday, crossing the line last of 10. "Actually, all in all, it was a decent trip," jockey Garrett Gomez said. "When they started sprinting, she couldn't keep up. She threw in a clunker. Hopefully, she will come out of the race good. On the backside, she was almost too keen." Rutherienne won her previous five starts, including the GIII Lake George S. July 27 and the GI Del Mar Oaks Aug. 18. "The pace was slow, and she was toward the back," trainer Christophe Clement said. "It's kind of tough to judge her effort at this point. I'll have to watch the replay." 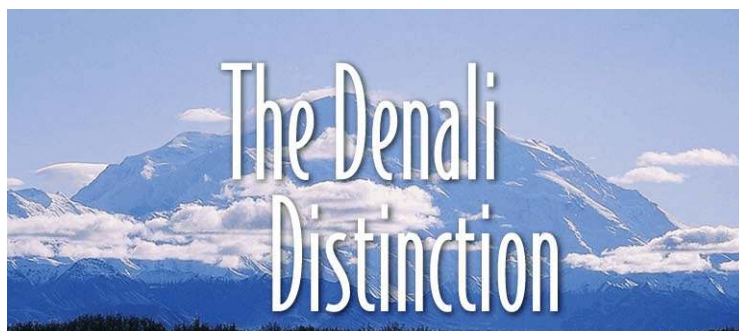

While it is common knowledge that Dylan Thomas needs fast ground to excel, Kieren Fallon maintains he is also a better horse going right-handed, a claim he upheld with stellar triumphs in last year's G1 Irish Derby at The Curragh and this year's G1 Prix Ganay and G1 King George VI and Queen Elizabeth Diamond S. His record going the other way also stands up to close inspection--a defeat of Ouija Board (GB) in this contest 12 months ago and a second to Authorized (Ire) after an interrupted run in the G1 Juddmonte International S. on his latest start Aug. 21. There were no waylaid plans this time, as the strapping bay settled fourth off the generous early tempo set by Red Rock Canyon. Seamus Heffernan committed Duke of Marmalade on the front end at the quarter pole, but his lead was short lived; Dylan Thomas rolled by a furlong later and into the history books as this race's first dual winner. He now faces a clash with his June 20 G1 Prince of Wales's S. conqueror Manduro (Ger) in the G1 Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe at Longchamp Oct. 7. "We think highly of the 'Duke' and he got four lengths on me, but luckily I had the horse to pick him up," Fallon said.

"When he got there, he pricked his ears, and this was basically a confidence-booster for him. I know he's won this twice and it's a funny thing to say, but he's better going right-handed, and he'll be a very hard horse to beat in the Arc if he gets fast ground." Aidan O'Brien added, "We'd love to go there if the ground is good." The Ballydoyle conditioner added that Duke of Marmalade could also step up in trip. "All the world is open to Duke of Marmalade now," O'Brien continued. "He looks like he'll get further and we'll look at the G1 Champion S. Doctor Dino was winless in four attempts after annexing last October's G3 Prix Andre Baboin S. in France, but wore down GII Bowling Green H. victor Sunriver after a long drive here. Following the Prix Andre, Doctor Dino finished fifth in the Listed Grand Prix de Marseille S. in November.

Freshened for his five-year-old campaign, he posted a trio of third-place finishes--the G1 Prix Ganay Apr. 29, the G1 Singapore Airlines International Cup May 20 and the G1 Arlington Million S. last

time Aug. 11. Kept within striking distance by Olivier Peslier as Sunriver mixed it up through fractions of :49.39 and 1:13.34, Doctor Dino split horses on the turn for home and dug down deep in the stretch to wear down champion Ashado's full brother. The winner will head

back to France, according to trainer Richard Gibson. "The Breeders' Cup is very unlikely; he's not Breeders' Cup nominated," Gibson said. "We'll speak to the owners, but before the race it was never an option. We always thought we would give him a break and prep him for the big Group 1s in Hong Kong." He added, "Coming off the last turn, I was sure we were going to win. I always thought he was going to chase down the leader. He'll stay here until Monday, and go back to Chantilly."

***Eastern Appeal** finished third, but was DQ'd and placed fourth.

Echelon carried the famous Cheveley Park red, white and blue to success here to avenge the runner-up finishes of the establishment's **Peeress** (GB) 12 months ago, and of her half-sister **Chic** (GB) in the 2005 edition. For Echelon, the build-up to this career best has been steady. The bay mare failed to make the transition to the top league last term after winning the G3 **Chartwell S.** at Lingfield in May and G3 **Princess Elizabeth S.** at Epsom the following month. Making her seasonal bow in Newmarket's G3 **Dahlia S.** May 5, she resumed winning ways before recording a second straight success in the G3 **Princess Elizabeth S.** June 1. Only fifth in the G2 **Windsor Forest S.** at Royal Ascot June 20, she floundered on The Curragh's deep ground when sixth in the G1 **Pretty Polly S.** 10 days later, but rebounded with success in Goodwood's G2 **Celebration Mile** after a break a fortnight ago.

Joining the Upper Echelon...

Sticking close to the early pace and the fence throughout the early stages, homebred Echelon was angled out for her rally on the final turn and comfortably tamed **Eastern Appeal** (Ire) (**Shinko Forest** {Ire}) at the furlong marker. Despite veering right close to the line, she had a safe cushion over the closing **Red Evie** and **Eastern Appeal**, who was demoted for interfering with **Arch Swing**. "She should have been entered for this race in the first place, but when she ran badly in the **Pretty Polly**, we didn't want to go back to Ireland," trainer Sir Michael Stoute explained. "After she won so well at Goodwood, it was my idea to supplement and have a shot and she looked the winner a long way out today. Echelon's second dam **Exclusive Order**, born in 1979 in Illinois, captured three group races in France. The chestnut was sold in foal to **Shadeed** for \$825,000 at the 1987 Keeneland November Sale to the account of David Minton Bloodstock on behalf of Cheveley Park. After producing a pair of stakes winners by Sadler's Wells--Sadler's **Image** and **Dance a Dream** (GB)--as well as the stakes-placed **Mizaaya** (GB) (**Riverman**) and **Dancing Surpass** (Ire) (**Dancing Brave**), **Exclusive Order** produced **Entrepreneur** (GB) (Sadler's Wells) in 1994. The big bay wound up co-topping the 1995 Tattersalls Houghton Sale at 600,000gns and, two years later, captured the G1 2000 Guineas under the tutelage of Sir Michael Stoute. Bred to **Polar Falcon**, **Exclusive Order** produced **Exclusive** in 1995. The chestnut filly captured the G1 **Coronation S.** in 1998, and also posted a third in the G1 1000 Guineas that season. Her first foal was **Chic**, a two-time winner of the G2 **Celebration Mile**; Echelon is her third foal.

Stonach Stables' colorbearer followed her 9 1/2-length Churchill maiden win last May with a 6 1/2-length Keeneland allowance tally in October. The chestnut closed out her sophomore campaign with a distant second-place finish versus allowance company at Churchill Nov. 1. She

kicked off the new year with a runner-up effort in Keeneland's GII Vinery Madison S. Apr. 11 and went one better versus allowance company beneath the Twin Spires May 5. Ginger Punch came within a neck of annexing the GI Ogden Phipps H. June 16, but has been unbeatable since, notching the GII First Flight H. July 8 and the GI Go For Wand H. July 28. Favored in this field of four, Ginger Punch kept Take d'Tour (Tour d'Or) within her scope after that one left the stalls slowly. Ginger Punch took over from take Take d'Tour following quick fractions of :23.28 and :45.93 and held off a late rally from GI Personal Ensign S. heroine Miss Shop. 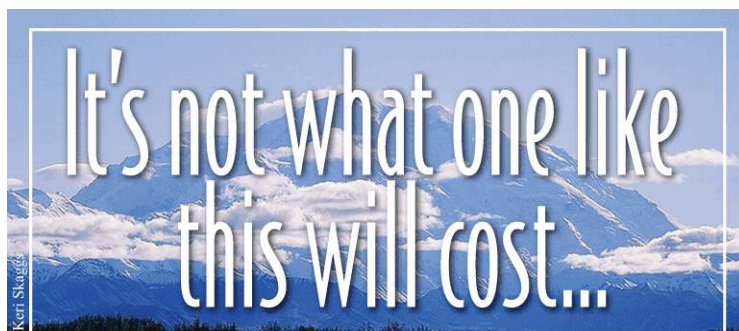

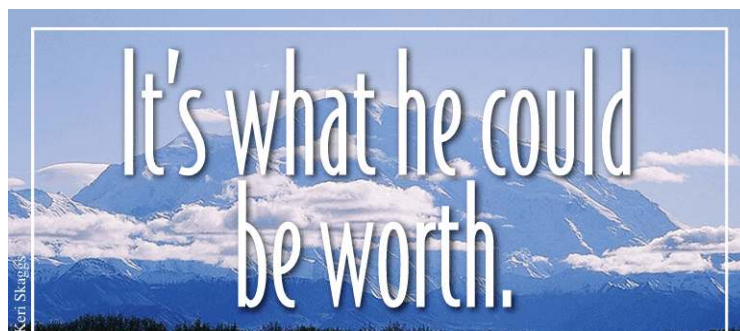

Aug. 5, prepped for the Sept. 22 GII Brooklyn H. with a sharp five-furlong move in :59.88. **The Green Monkey** (Forestry) worked four furlongs in :47.15, and **The Roundhouse** (Fusaichi Pegasus) turned in a five-furlong move in 1:01.03.

O’BRIEN WEIGHS UP ARC OPTIONS Aidan O’Brien announced yesterday that **Soldier of Fortune (Ire)** (Galileo {Ire}) would prep for the Oct. 7 G1 Prix de l’Arc de Triomphe in next Sunday’s G2 Prix Niel. Susan Magnier, Derrick Smith and Michael Tabor’s impressive G1 Irish Derby winner will tackle the course-and-distance trial instead of Saturday’s G1 St Leger at Doncaster to see if he will join G1 Tattersalls Millions Irish Champion S. hero **Dylan Thomas (Ire)** (Danehill) in the fall showcase. Tabor and Magnier’s multiple Group 1 winner **Peeping Fawn** (Danehill) had been touted as a possible for the Arc, but connections indicated she could miss that race, as well as next Sunday’s G1 Prix Vermeille. “Peeping Fawn is in the Arc and a lot will depend on how things go with the colts we are looking at running in the race,” O’Brien explained. “It’s not a priority for her at this stage and, although she is in the Prix Vermeille next weekend, we might decide to wait and run her next in the [Oct. 7] G1 Prix de l’Opera.” He added, “Soldier of Fortune had a long break after the Irish Derby, but he’s in good form and the plan is to run him on Sunday. Overall, she has compiled a record of 9-4-2-2 and earnings of £652,264.

A year after selling nearly \$400 million in horseflesh, including an eight-figure offering, Keeneland will offer the largest catalogue in its history, as 5,553 yearlings are set to go under the hammer at the auction house's September Yearling Sale in Lexington. To accommodate the inclusion of nearly 400 more horses this year, the sales company has added an unprecedented 15th day of selling this year, bringing into play the demand-

versus-supply issues that have faced the market repeatedly over the past several years. Geoffrey Russell, Keeneland's director of sales, admits to the slightest bit of trepidation.

"There's always a question, whether we have 4,000 horses catalogued

or 5,500 horses--will we have enough buyers for all these horses?" Russell stated. "It's always a concern whenever we put on a horse sale. But we have made a concerted effort to recruit more people, both internationally and domestically, and we'll look forward to seeing the fruits of our work. It's the largest yearling catalogue ever presented to the market, so there are always nerves. We think we recruited well and promoted it well, and we'll see if we were successful." Whether the buying public shows up in masses may be a moot issue, given the performance of the yearling sales thus far in 2007. Following years of steady growth, the market has declined and is exhibiting signs of weakness. Top-end buyers have been shy to dig as deep as in years past, and pinhookers have also been largely apprehensive to take chances in light of a static two-year-old market. Russell is taking a more patient approach and is not yet willing to characterize the market as down. "It's hard to say that, because, really, the market hasn't been established yet," he commented. He also sees something of a silver lining. "I think the perception out there is that this is a year of correction, but I think we need to wait and see," he remarked. "The old adage that a good horse is going to sell well is still true. When there is a perceived softness, it tends to attract other people to the market, so we hope for that. I think the strength is going to be in the weakness of the dollar." Bidding begins each morning at 10 a.m. through Tuesday, Sept. 25. There will be no selling Friday, Sept. 14.

A Two-For-One Kind of Sale?...

Keeneland has marketed the September sale aggressively, and Russell anticipates a broader overseas buying bench. "[Foreigners] know they can come here and buy, whereas they aren't so sure at the more boutique sales," Russell offered. "We've had lots of requests from Europe, more than we've had in the past. When it's \$2 to the pound, our horses look very attractive. The horses are the same. The quality is the same. It's the exchange rate that's different. If they like what they see, I think we'll be fine." And if the physicals match the pedigrees, the sale should be more than just fine. The sire power of Book 1 speaks for itself--you know who they are. Though spectacular, one need only look at a list of the "factories" to be even more impressed. Catalogued are siblings to outstanding racehorses such as Adieu, Afleet Alex, Ashado, Awesome Humor, Bluegrass Cat, Burmilla, Dreaming of Anna, Forestry, Half Ours, Harlan's Holiday, Hold That Tiger, Lewis Michael, Lion Heart, Malibu Moon, Pleasantly Perfect, Pollard's Vision, Purge, Sophisticat, Spain, Speightstown and Stravinsky, to name just a few. "We have the cream of the American yearlings here," Russell said. "The pedigrees are as strong as ever, physically we're pleased with the catalogue, and we feel it's a very strong, solid catalogue."

Tuning In...

The September Sale will be shown around the world on various media outlets. The select portion of the sale will be shown live in the United States on HorseRacing TV (HRTV), and on Racing World in the United Kingdom and Ireland. The Television Games Network (TVG) will provide coverage of the sales top-priced yearlings on a tape-delayed basis.

Deja Vu All Over Again...

If at first you do succeed, by all means, try, try again. That is the mindset of a handful of consignors who will lead over horses with immediate relations to Keeneland sales toppers of years past. The list is headed by hip [294](#), a Burleson Farms-consigned son of Storm Cat--Crown of Crimson (Seattle Slew). From a distinguished Mabee family, the chestnut is a half-brother to Meydan

City (Kingmambo), purchased by Sheikh Mohammed for \$11.7 million to top last year's September sale. Burleson consigns the colt for his breeder, Jayeff B Stables. Last November, Half Ours (Unbridled's Song) made history, becoming the first horse of racing

age to top the mixed sale on a bid of \$6.1 million from Aaron and Marie Jones, who were dissolving the partnership with Barry Schwartz. Through the Taylor Made agency, the couple is offering a yearling full sibling (hip [501](#)) to that recently retired four-year-old, who enters stud next season at Taylor Made. At this event in 2004, owner Fusao Sekiguchi made the most noise, going to an even \$8 million for a colt by Storm Cat--Welcome Surprise (Seeking the Gold) to top that sale. As was the case with that one, hip [490](#), a full sister to Mr. Sekiguchi, is being offered by Lane's End, agent. During the 2004 November sale, an Unbridled's Song half-sister to Shamardal (Ire) was hammered down to John Sikura for \$1.15 million, the top weanling of that year. That sale followed that of her dam, Helsinki (GB), who was purchased for \$3.9 million. The family is represented this September by hip [86](#). A Giant's Causeway colt, the bay, consigned by Hill 'n' Dale Sales, is a full brother to four-time Group 1 winner Shamardal.

With his first KY yearlings going before the judges this September, let's review his

Serena's Refrain...

Serena's Song was a force unto herself on the race-track and continues to be near peerless now as a producer of top sale horses. Bob and Beverly Lewis's brilliant daughter of Rahy has seen five sons and daughters go through the ring as yearlings. The five have grossed a staggering \$12.2 million for an average of \$2,440,000.

Interestingly, they've come from an array of sire lines. To Mr. Prospector and his grandson Unbridled, she produced, respectively, Serena's Tune (\$1 million

KEEJUL yearling in 1999) and Harlington (\$2.8 million KEESEP yearling in 2003). To the Bold Ruler/Seattle Slew-line A.P. Indy, she produced Spark Candle (\$1.5 million at last year's KEESEP renewal). And to Northern Dancer's inimitable grandson Storm Cat, Serena's Song has produced her two biggest sale horses,

and arguably her best race horse: the colt Colourful Score, her best seller to date, sold for \$3.5 million to John Ferguson in 2005, five years after the filly Sophisticat was knocked down to Demi O'Byrne for \$3.4 million. The latter validated her purchase price with a victory in the 2002 G1 Coronation S. and a third in that year's G1 Poule d'Essai des Poulisches.

That Serena's Song's offspring continue to be popular at the sales is a result, of course, of their success at the track. In addition to Sophisticat's Group 1 tally, Grand Reward (another son of Storm Cat who was not offered at sale) and Harlington have notched Grade II wins, while Serena's Tune was a multiple-stakes winner.

Buyers at this year's sale will have another chance to battle over a Serena's Song yearling in the form of hip [182](#), a colt by Storm Cat. The chestnut is being offered by longtime Lewis associate Denali Stud, which boards champion Serena's Song and has consigned each of her sale horses.

"He's a nice colt," said the understated Denali chief Craig Bendoroff. "At that level, you've got to be special. Is he special? We'll let the market tell us that. But he's a real nice horse, and his mother's done it all, and you hope the right guys get on him."

Bendoroff added that of all of Serena's Song's children, the colt probably reminded him of Sophisticat the most.

"He's a real strong horse; looks like a two-year-old and looks like he'll want to run early," he added. "And like all of her horses, he's real sound-looking and has a lot of bone." **Cont. p4**

The cross of Storm Cat over a Rahy mare has been a fruitful one, producing the likes of Giant's Causeway and this year's top turf star After Market, and Bendoroff said the success of that cross can't help but add further luster to a colt that needs little help on the page.

"I remember the first time I bred Serena to Storm Cat, my pedigree advisor said 'This cross hasn't really been tried,' and I said, 'Well, we're gonna try it,'" said Bendoroff with a laugh. "It's obviously worked well, and it's got to help. How could it not?"

Bendoroff added that Beverly Lewis, who will be attending her second Keeneland September sale following her husband's passing in February of 2006, was already on the sales grounds and had been inspecting yearlings with her son Jeff Lewis in tow.

"They've been around here looking at fillies," he said.

Whistling a Happy Tune...

John Fort knows his way around the Thoroughbred business, having been mentored by Max Hirsch and Woody Stephens before working as an assistant trainer for Calumet Farm. These days, Fort is better known for his Peachtree Stable partnership, which has raced successfully with trainer Todd Pletcher and has sold equally well, both privately and publicly. The racing stable has been represented by individuals such as GI Kentucky Derby runner-up Invisible Ink, GIII Virginia Derby hero and GI Secretariat S. second Red Giant and, most recently, Twilight Meteor, who just missed in the GIII Kent Breeders' Cup S. In 2002, Fort went to \$250,000 for an Elusive Quality two-year-old filly named Chimichurri, who won the GIII Tempted S., was Grade I placed at three and bankrolled nearly \$270,000. Fort subsequently sold her for \$675,000 at the 2003 Keeneland November sale. In 2004, Fort paid \$400,000 for India and sold her for a shade over \$2 million after she won her maiden at second asking by 12 lengths. A colt by Dixie Union out of Happy Tune (A.P. Indy) caught the horseman's eye at the 2004 Keeneland September sale and \$110,000 later, High Cotton was added to the Peachtree roster. A maiden winner and multiple graded-stakes placed at two, he would go on to take the GIII Northern Dancer Breeders' Cup S. at three en route to earning \$462,574. Cont. p5

Fort had so much success with High Cotton that he couldn't just stop there, as he explains. "We knew that High Cotton was going to turn into a nice horse, so I tracked down the mare and I bought her," he said, referring to his purchase in late 2005. "At that time, she belonged to a group of people from Chile and was

boarded at Ashford, and she was in foal to Tale of the Cat. The foal is for sale—it's how we hope to pay for the mare." Catalogued to the sale as hip 84, the dark bay is being consigned by Taylor Made. Fort admits that his involvement on the breeding end of things is somewhat rare. "If you're in the horse business, you try to get into anything that looks like it will be profitable," he commented.

"I go to every horse sale and a lot of horse races and I've been in the business for 30 years. You compile a lot of knowledge, not only about horses, but about the whole business end of it. This mare is a wonderful opportunity to make money. High Cotton went on to do what we thought he could do—become a graded-stakes winner—and everything fell into place." Things could get even better for Fort in a few months. Happy Tune is carrying a foal by Storm Cat and will take her place in the Keeneland November sale. But for now, Fort is focused on Monday, and his expectations are realistic. "You never know going into the sale," he submitted. "You just hope for the best. He looks great. There are limitations to what any horse might bring, but that's just the nature of the business. This colt will sell extremely well for a Tale of the Cat. The whole thing has been a happy tune for me," he said with a laugh.

A Seemingly Brilliant Purchase...

Through the Lantern Hill agency of Suzi Shoemaker, Frank Calabrese consigned **Justenuffheart** (Broad Brush), in foal to Distorted Humor, to the 2005 Keeneland January Sale. But the well-related mare was led out of the ring unsold after a final bid of \$800,000. Enter Jody Alexander, farm manager for Greg Goodman's Mt. Brilliant Farm. Underbidder on the mare, he made the owner an offer and the deal was sealed. "I was just trying to pick out some mares for Greg," Alexander stated. "She was a half to Kitten's Joy, who won a lot of money and, of course, went on to be a champion. I was just looking for something with a little black type in the family. I liked Broad Brush mares, but I was overwhelmed with the job that Suzi Shoemaker did with her at Lantern Hill. She could not have been prepped any better." Justenuffheart had it all and then some. Said Alexander, "She was a big, strong mare, bigger than most mares, around 16.2, but very balanced for as big as she was. I thought that would leave a lot of room inside for her to carry a nice foal. She just caught your eye. Mr. Goodman was flying into town and I called and told him that he needed to come out and look at her. We figured, if we get foals out of her that look like her, we'd be all right." The Distorted Humor colt sold for \$550,000 to Darley at last year's September sale, but a lot has happened since. "Everything fell into place after that," Alexander explained.

"After we bought her, Distorted Humor really caught on fire. The family, with [GISW] Precious Kitten (Catienus) hitting under the second dam, Lewis Michael (Rahy) winning the [GII] Washington Park H., Dreaming of Anna (Rahy) winning the Breeders' Cup and becoming a champion, just took off. I'd say that a big part of it was luck." Justenuffheart's September offering this year is a strong-looking daughter of the fashionable and successful Unbridled's Song, catalogued as hip [352](#). And she's a chip off the ol' block--mom, that is. "This Unbridled's Song that we have here now is probably near 16.3 herself," Alexander said. "She's got a lot of bone to her as well." Justenuffheart is the dam of a weanling filly by Giant's Causeway and is currently in foal to Storm Cat. Additional depth in the Mt. Brilliant draft is provided by hip [447](#). A colt from the second crop of Mineshaft, the chestnut is a half-brother to GISW Snow Ridge (Tabasco Cat) and a 3/4-sibling to Pavarotti (A.P. Indy). That \$2.5-million KEESEP yearling is the winner of Arlington's Round Table S. since the catalogue. Snow Forest is also the dam of Catmando (Storm Cat), a \$1-million graduate of last year's KEESEP sale.

WRITERS UP

FELD FLYING HIGH

By Lucas Marquardt

In its June 8 issue, *The Blood-Horse's* Market Watch ranked leading yearling buyers in several categories, including by percentage of graded-stakes winners purchased and by Average Earnings Index--the amount an individual Thoroughbred makes compared to the average of the breed. The rankings took into account yearlings purchased between 2000 and 2004, and shone an interesting light on who's been most successful lately in singling out talented young horseflesh. Some names, like Coolmore's Demi O'Byrne, are familiar. Some others might come as a surprise.

Surprising or not, Amerman Racing, the stable of John and Jerry Amerman, topped no fewer than three categories, namely percentage of graded-stakes winners (three, for a 13.6-percent strike rate from their buys); percentage of Grade I/Group 1 winners (two for 9.1 percent); and Average Earnings Index (a rate of 4.82 that equates to their runners earning 4.82 times that of what the average runner banks).

A big factor in the success of Amerman Racing is California agent Bob Feld, of Bob Feld Bloodstock, who advises the Amermans on their purchases. Through Feld's stewardship, the Amermans have acquired horses like treble Grade I heroine Balance (Thunder Gulch) and GI Hollywood Futurity winner Siphonic (Siphon {Brz}) at yearling sales, and GI Breeders' Cup Distaff upsetter Adoration (Honor Grades) through private purchase.

In fact, over the last decade, the native Californian has advised, as part of a buying team or alone, on the purchase of three Breeders' Cup winners and a pair of champions, including two winners on the 2003 Breeders' Cup card: Adoration and GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile victor and eventual Eclipse Award winner Action This Day (Kris S.) for B. Wayne Hughes.

Those successful runners followed Feld's first blockbuster purchase, Reraise, whom Feld bought privately after the colt captured a \$62,500 maiden claimer at Santa Anita in October of 1997. Reraise went on to win the following year's GI Breeders' Cup Sprint and was honored with the Eclipse Award as the nation's best sprinter.

In contrast to the many horsemen who were raised around horses and learned the craft from fathers, mothers and friends of the family, Feld represents the rare fan who parlayed his love of racing into a career in the sport.

Born and raised in Arcadia, California, near Santa Anita, Feld was first introduced to racing by his father, who would take Bob and his brothers to the track on Saturdays to catch the last race on the card.

"The last race of the day was free--there wasn't Sunday racing then--and he would take us once in a while, and it just went from there," said Feld. "I was around seven or eight or so."

Feld added, "My dad was a big handicapper; he loved the puzzle of handicapping. He was a real genius with numbers, being a draftsman. Numbers were his game, and he loved working with all the numbers and fractions."

The enjoyment Bob's father found in the sport became a family affair. Bob's uncle, Neil Barton, acquired a few horses in the 1970s, exposing both Bob and his brother Jude to another side of Thoroughbred racing: the backstretch.

"Once we got back there a few times, we just fell hook-line-and-sinker in love with it all, with the horses and the training," said Feld.

Jude eventually took out his trainer's licence and employed his younger brother Bob, first as a hotwalker, then as a groom, for the better part of three years.

After working as an assistant for conditioner Ron Ellis for a stint in the late '80s and early '90s, handling Ellis's second string at Hollywood Park when racing was being conducted at Santa Anita, Feld took a break from racing and worked for his father-in-law selling machine tools.

"After a while, though, I realized that I really belonged on the backstretch," said Feld.

Feld jumped back into the business and worked for Barry Irwin's Team Valor for several years, handling a group of clients that included John and Jerry Amerman. In the mid-1990s, the Amermans, having decided to strike out on their own as owners, approached Feld about beginning a racing stable. Feld, joining forces with Ellis once again, helped them on their way.

"I got into the bloodstock business really in a roundabout sort of way," he admitted. **Cont. p9**

The Verdict

Among all sires (F96-F04), his **3.93 A Index** ranks behind only **Distorted Humor** (\$225,000 fee), **Smart Strike** (\$75,000 fee) and **Forestry** (\$125,000 fee).

Feld and Ellis went to the Keeneland September sale to buy a few yearlings for the Amermans, and Feld has remained a close associate of the California-based couple.

Though Ellis no longer trains for or advises the Amermans, he and Feld have maintained a relationship that includes, along with bloodstock agent Seth Semkin, buying for prominent owner B. Wayne Hughes. In addition to Action This Day, Feld was involved with the purchases of GII Del Mar Futurity winner Siphonizer, GII Illinois Derby hero Greeley's Galaxy and the highly regarded, but ill-fated Atswhatimtalknbout, who was second in the 2003 GII San Felipe S. and a fast-closing fourth in that year's GI Kentucky Derby.

But it's been for the Amermans that Feld has truly made a name for himself, if only because he's the central figure on the buying team.

According to Market Watch, Feld and the Amermans purchased 22 yearlings from 2000 through 2004 for \$3,510,000, an average of \$159,545. Thus far, 17 of those horses have started (77 percent), with 12 going on to become winners (55 percent). While the latter number in particular is modest, the quality of those winners more than makes up for it. Four of them won stakes races (18.2 percent), three of the graded variety (13.6 percent), and two--Siphonic and Balance--scored in Grade I company (9.1 percent).

It's interesting to note that, as a sire, Siphon (Brz) has five graded-stakes winners to his credit, and Feld purchased two of them. Feld paid \$210,000 for Siphonic at the 2000 September sale and saw his buy go on to take the GI Hollywood Futurity and GII Lane's End Breeders' Futurity and run third in the GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile. Knocked off the Triple Crown trail by injury, Siphonic died minutes after running second in his return to the races, the victim of an apparent heart attack. Despite his tragic end, Siphonic had proven a top runner for the Amermans, earning \$774,778 in seven starts.

The Thunder Gulch filly Balance has proven another smart purchase by Feld. Off the board only once in 14 starts, the four-year-old filly, hammered down for \$260,000 at the 2004 September sale, has so far banked \$1,018,491 for the Amermans. Her resume includes wins in the GI Las Virgenes S. and GI Santa Anita Oaks at three and the GI Santa Margarita Invitational H. this term. She is trained by David Hofmans, who also conditioned Siphonic.

By anyone's standard, purchasing horses like Siphonic and Balance for, relatively speaking, a very reasonable amount of money, is a noteworthy accomplishment, and one that Feld takes great pride in.

"I'm real proud of the fact we've bought two Grade I winners from 22 purchases, and some of the bigger names had bought two from a much larger group," said Feld. "That's not speaking badly of them, at all. To be ranked next to guys I really respect, like the John Fergusons and the Demi O'Byrnes, who more or less are my idols, is just incredible."

Feld said he began to develop his eye for spotting good horses back in his days as a hotwalker, though he did so without ever planning to become a bloodstock agent.

"I was always interested in what good horses looked like," said Feld. "Just like in any other business, I was interested to find out who was successful and why they were successful."

Asked about how he goes about selecting prospects, Feld explained, "At this point, I've looked at tens of thousands of yearlings, and when I go to the sale I have a template in my head of what I'm looking for. Your first impression is instantaneous, whether you like the horse or not. You can pick them apart from there, but now it's a lot easier." **Cont. p10**

Feld elaborated about what in particular he looks for in a horse.

"I asked an agent recently about what their favorite aspect of a horse was and they said balance, and to me that's like saying cheese on a pizza," he said. "When you ask someone what their favorite topping is, nobody says cheese, because it's a given. That's how I look at balance--it's a given. After that, I really like a strong shoulder. But there's really a vibe that you get. The science of it is easy--anybody can tell if a horse toes out or is back at the knee or is offset--and not to be weird or goofy, but some horses have a look. It's the way they handle themselves, their class and how they act around the barn, and you can tell. Whether you're born with it or develop it, I don't know. It's a fine line between art and science."

Here is what Feld had to say about some of his best buys, both privately and at the sales:

Pewter Grey, by Grey Dawn II, who went on to become a graded stakes winner after being claimed:

"My brother was training at the time, and I advised him to claim him. I was actually at the track and had bet on the horse, and I thought the jockey didn't try real hard on him. The connections had a propensity for cashing tickets on their runners, so, having watched the race, I thought they were setting the horse up to cash a big ticket. I told my brother about him. He was 17 hands, bred to go long on the turf, and he was sprinting on the dirt. So he ended up talking some clients into claiming him, and Pewter Grey won a Grade III for them on the lawn at Santa Anita."

Reraise, by Danzatore, purchased privately after a maiden win:

"At that time people were using The Sheets a lot, and he got a really strong Sheet number off his maiden win. He was wide coming for home and he didn't change leads, and he still got a big number in what was the fall of his two-year-old season. And on top of that we had him vetted out and he had open knees. With all those things combined, it made sense to try and take a shot and purchase him. So we bought the horse and turned him out, because his knees were still open. Obviously, it worked out for us."

Balance, by Thunder Gulch, owned by Amerman Racing Stables, purchased for \$260,000 as KEESEP yearling:

"It's funny, because she does have great balance, but I named her after her dam's name, which is Vertigineux, which means 'dizzying heights' in French. To me, she was just the whole package. She was everything I look for in a horse. The shoulder, the balance, a real good eye--I like a good eye. She had a lot of class and presence, and she's always been that way."

Adoration, by Honor Grades, owned by Amerman Racing Stables, purchased privately:

"We bought her after she broke her maiden. She'd broken her maiden very impressively at Santa Anita in January of her three-year-old year. I called Mr. Amerman, and he was very hesitant. I've never sold Mr. Amerman a horse in my life--I've always presented to him horses I like, and he'll run with it. He actually didn't want to buy Adoration, and I really pushed him to buy the horse. I said, 'If you want to stay in the game, you really need to buy fillies like this.' Never before and never after have I pushed him to buy a horse. She was a very strong price at the time. It was right around when prices [for horses on the racetrack] were getting up there. She was a half-million dollars. Which was, at the time, very high end for a maiden winner. Now they break their maidens and they want a million. I recently got turned down on a horse that finished *second* in her maiden because they wanted a million."

Atswhatimtalkinabout, by A.P. Indy, owned by B. Wayne Hughes, purchased for \$900,000 as a FTFFEB two-year-old:

"I helped buy him at a two-year-old sale for Mr. Hughes with Ron Ellis. He was such an athlete; a big, leggy horse when we got him, but he'd worked in :10 1/5, I think, at the sale. And for a horse his size to work that quick, it was kind of a no-brainer. A little side story about his name: I was using that saying a lot at the time--At's what I'm talkin' 'bout--and we decided to name the horse after that. I had to whittle his name down to 21 letters. I wrote it down on a business card that night. Ron called me a while later and said, 'I just worked that A.P. Indy colt, and I need to know his name. I know it's At's What I'm Talking About, but how do you spell it?' I said, 'Man, I don't know how you spell it.' We'd bought him at the Fasig-Tipton Calder sale in February, and this was in October. I told him I had to call him back. So I quickly came up with it again right there, but later on I found the original business card and, sure enough, I'd spelled it differently. Of course, now, I could spell it backwards and forwards."

Action This Day, by Kris S., owned by B. Wayne Hughes, purchased for \$150,000 as a KEEJUL yearling:

"He was another one that I helped Ron buy for Mr. Hughes. It's funny, Wayne's really pedigree-oriented. And when he was signing the ticket for Action This Day, he was like, 'What am I doing buying a son of Kris S. for \$150,00?' He kind of begrudgingly signed the ticket, because he didn't think it was a stallion's pedigree. He was into the Mr. Prospectors and Storm Cats, but we just thought the colt was very athletic and liked Kris S. Of course, that became his first champion."

TOM AINSLIE DEAD Richard Carter, who penned more than a half-dozen books on Thoroughbred racing and handicapping under the pseudonym Tom Ainslie, passed away last Saturday in New York City. He was 89. Ainslie earned the George Polk Award in 1951 for a series of articles for the *New York Compass* about racketeering on the New York City waterfront. He also authored a biography of Jonas Salk, who developed the vaccine for polio, and collaborated with major league baseball player Curtis Flood on his memoir, "The Way It Is," published in 1971. His first racing book, "The Compleat Horseplayer," came out in 1966, and was followed by such standards as "Ainslie's Complete Guide to Thoroughbred Racing" and "The Theory and Practice of Handicapping." John Carter, Ainslie's son, told the *New York Times* that his father took a pen name because, "horse racing was a step above organized crime." In his preface to the third edition of "Ainslie's Complete Guide to Thoroughbred Racing," the author explained, "My own interest in racing arose more than a half century ago. But I was a serious-minded type with a thin billfold. I saw no profit in betting on something about which I knew nothing. I decided to buy some books. No such thing was to be had. I was appalled. Nostalgic volumes about the history of the turf were available for nine cents on the remainder counter of every bookshop, but a book on the art of picking winners was available at no price. 'The reason they don't publish books for horseplayers,' explained one merchant, 'is that horseplayers can't read.'" Ainslie filled that void, and also wrote guides to casino gambling and harness racing. In addition to his son, Ainslie is survived by his daughter, Nancy Carter, and three grandchildren.

BROKEN COLLARBONE FOR BRAVO Jockey Joe Bravo will be out of action for four to six weeks with a broken collarbone. Bravo was injured when his mount--Find the Chestnut--broke down in the stretch in Friday's third race at Belmont. "Joe is in good spirits and he will be released from the hospital tomorrow," Bravo's agent Drew Mollica offered. "If the healing process goes well, he could be back in four weeks."

captured a trio of Group 1 events. Miesque also produced the GSW & MG1SP Miesque's Son (Mr. Prospector), GSW Mingun (A.P. Indy) and SW Moon Is Up (Woodman). That sort of record has escalated the demand when her daughters venture into the sales ring. Monevassia (Mr. Prospector) placed at two in 1996, but sold for \$1.75 million in 1998 at Keeneland November and later produced European champion juvenile filly Rumpelstiltskin (Ire) (Danehill). While Myhrr didn't make it to the races, that didn't stop her from selling for \$4.6 million to Jayeff B Stables as a broodmare prospect in 2000. After producing a colt and a filly by A.P. Indy, Myhrr foaled this Storm Cat filly in 2005; after selling for \$1 million at KEESEP, the chestnut entered training for the partnership of Jayeff B and renowned chef Bobby Flay. Let go at 10-1 despite a solid worktab, Catmosphere settled in midpack, but was shuffled back a bit on the turn. She regrouped entering the stretch, hit the front in midstretch and, despite drifting out, maintained a 1 1/4-length margin at the wire over Madam Bling (War Chant), with Show 'Em All (Proud Citizen) a troubled third.
