MABEE BABY LEADS KEESEP DAY FOUR

The decision by Larry Mabee, son of the late Golden Eagle Farm owner John C. Mabee, and his mother Betty to significantly reduce their Thoroughbred holdings was

welcomed by the buying public yesterday at Keeneland. A well-made colt by prominent sire El Prado (Ire) led the way during the fourth session of the September Yearling Sale, realizing a final bid of \$750,000 from European bloodstock agent Charlie Gordon-Watson, on behalf of "a normal client of mine in Ireland," he said. Consigned by Mill Ridge Sales on behalf of the reduction, the bay is the

second live foal produced by Favorite Funtime (Seeking the Gold), winner of the 2002 GI Santa Maria H., one of her seven career victories. She bankrolled \$507,900 for her owners, and her son added to the family's coffers yesterday. "I'm very thrilled about that," commented Janine McCullough, general manager of Golden Eagle. "The colt deserved that. He's the kind that the Mabees would have kept and raced, and we struggled with the decision of even putting him in the sale. It's nice to see somebody pay what the colt is worth. It went above expectations, but the horse was a solid half-million dollar horse. It was very nice."

RAGS TO RICHES RETURNS

Rags to Riches (A.P. Indy) makes her return in the GI Gazelle S. at Belmont Park Saturday. The three-year-old filly, making her first start since beating Curlin in the June 9 GI Belmont S., faces four rivals in the nine-furlong test. Her summer campaign was derailed by a trip to New Bolton for a complete physical and by a mild fever, but she worked six furlongs in 1:14 4/5 at Belmont Park last Saturday and is ready to get back to work. "Any time you have a horse like her, you worry about how she is doing," trainer Todd Pletcher said, but added, "She's not a filly that seems to need a race or hard training to run well, so I'm not concerned about the layoff." *Field*, p16

THE GREEN MONKEY TO DEBUT SATURDAY

The Green Monkey (Forestry) will make his long-awaited debut in the fourth race at Belmont Park Saturday. The three-year-old, who made headlines with his world-record \$16 million purchase as a FTFFEB juvenile, prepped for his first career start with a half in :47 out of the gate at Belmont last Saturday. Facing five rivals in the six-furlong test, he drew post 4. Jockey John Velazquez has the mount. "The Green Monkey has been a horse that's highly visible and followed closely," trainer Todd Pletcher told *Daily Racing Form*. "It would be difficult for any horse to meet expectations that have been laid on him. At the end of the day, he's ready to run, so we'll get started and hope he runs well."

Golden Eagle Takes Flight...

Things began a bit slowly for the Mabee reduction in Book 1, as two colts brought a combined \$220,000, but it gradually gained momentum. During Wednesday's session, Demi O'Byrne bought a Giant's Causeway colt out of GISW Notable Career (Avenue of Flags) for \$370,000, setting the table for yesterday's results. "I think, unfortunately, the pace of the sale takes a while to get started," Janine McCullough stated. "A lot of people think that they can't afford to buy a horse in Book 1, so they have a tendency to not look. This colt got the respect he deserved. Overall, I'm really happy." Come November, the Golden Eagle reduction will continue at Keeneland, but Favorite Funtime will not be going under the hammer. "She is one of about seven key mares that the Mabees are going to keep. She's one of Mrs. Mabee's favorites," McCullough said. Gordon-Watson said the El Prado colt was at the top of a short short-list. "I had a list of only four horses for today, one of which was the [\$700,000] Dynaformer earlier, the next one was this horse," he explained. "He was an outstanding athlete. He stood out a mile. I think it was clever planning to put him in this book."

Hoping Lightning Strikes Thrice...

Jim Bolger, the trainer of the outstanding European fillies Finsceal Beo (Ire) and Saoirse Abu will look to continue his luck with Mr. Greeley offspring. A handsome chestnut colt by the increasingly popular sire is headed across the pond to eventually join the Bolger yard after Tom Gentry was extended to \$625,000 on behalf of clients of the conditioner. "He looks like Secretariat," Gentry opined. "He's got a big rear end on him. He's just a very, very handsome colt. I'm so excited about him. That was my number one pick in the sale. It's a good family and I think he'll make more family." Consigned by Paramount Sales as agent, the March foal was purchased by an entity called Wright Brothers Bloodstock for \$330,000 as a weanling out of last year's Keeneland November sale. He is the first foal from Saintly Hertfield (Saint Ballado), a daughter of GSW Theresa's Tizzy (Cee's Tizzy), and a half-sister to GSW Got the Last Laugh. Paramount's Pat Costello, who declined to identify the partners of Wright Brothers, was also pleased with the sale. "He's a lovely horse," Costello said. "Jim Bolger is a great trainer and a great trainer of Mr. Greeley's offspring. Physically, he was gorgeous. He had a lot of presence and a great walk to him and he has a great mind. Mr. G is doing it on both sides of the Atlantic and in the sales ring."

O'Bryne Lands Hennessy Colt...

Positioned on opposite sides of the sales pavilion, bloodstock agents Omar Trevino and Demi O'Byrne fought a spirited duel for hip 1195, a handsome chestnut colt from Eaton Sales that strongly resembled his sire, the recently deceased Hennessy. In the end, the buying power of the Coolmore team that O'Byrne represents prevailed, and the hammered dropped on the Irishman's \$700,000 bid. Asked if the death of Hennessy, who stood at Coolmore, factored at all in the purchase, O'Byrne said, "No, he was just a nice horse." Produced by the 15-year-old Blushing John mare Sacred Promise, hip 1195 is a half to More Than Promised, a MSW and MGSP earner of \$278,000. The colt's second dam is French group winner Nonoalca (Fr) (Nonoalco), who was runner-up in the 1979 G1 Poule d'Essai des Poulaches. Nonoalca is also the dam of GI Hopeful S. winner Great Navigator (Gulch). Hip 1195 had been through the auction ring before. Bred by Highclere, he was sold to Blandford Bloodstock for \$275,000 at last year's FTKNOV sale and was being re-offered here "for a client," according to Eaton Sales' Tom VanMeter. VanMeter added, "We're very happy with the price. We actually under-appraised him; we didn't think he'd go for that much." Sacred Promise foaled an El Corredor colt this spring for Highclere, which purchased the mare for \$44,000 in foal to Buddha at KEENOV in 2004.

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Centennial Gets One from Red-Hot Dynaformer...

Offspring by Dynaformer continued to be popular at Keeneland September through yesterday's fourth session. A colt by the Three Chimneys stallion was the co-second-highest-priced lot on the day after Centennial Farms' Don Little, Jr. went to \$700,000 for the bay. Mill Ridge Sales bred the colt in partnership with Audrey Otto's Jamm Ltd. and consigned him as hip 939. The colt will join a Centennial string that's enjoying a banner year, highlighted by the win of Corinthian in the GI Met Mile in May. The operation also races Chelokee and the promising Vitruvius, a half-brother to Corinthian. Centennial's new acquisition was a reward for being patient, according to Little. "We've been here since the beginning, but didn't get anything," he explained. "We bought a couple of colts [Wednesday], but this colt was our pick of the sale for the kind colt we were looking for. He's a Corinthian type--just a fantastic individual, very athletic, he had the look, the eye. We saved up for him, and hopefully things will work out. He'll go to [trainer] Jimmy Jerkens." Little added that, while he's a big fan of Dynaformer, the colt didn't necessarily fit the mold of what's typical from his sire. "Dynaformer's always gotten very good horses," he said. "But a lot of his horses tend to be very coarse; this horse was an exception to the rule. Dynaformer can get you any kind of horse--grass or dirt or whatever--and we felt this was a special individual." The sire of horses like Barbaro and Perfect Drift, Dynaformer has seen his stock steadily rise since his days as a \$5,000 stallion at Wafare Farm, and nowhere has that been more evident than in that past few years at September. In 2005, a total of 20 sons and daughters of Dynaformer went through the ring at Keeneland during Books 1 and 2, bringing \$4,645,000 for an average of \$232,250. A year later, no doubt boosted by Barbaro's dazzling effort in the GI Kentucky Derby, another 20 Dynaformer yearlings sold during the same four days, this time for \$6,890,000. That equated to an average of \$344,500, or a 48.3-percent jump from 2005. Dynaformer's sharp rise in average continued this year, in no small part due to Monday's \$2.9 million session-topping colt. Thus far, 17 Dynaformer yearlings have grossed \$8,380,000 for an average of \$492,941. That's a 43.1-percent boost from last year, or a jump of over 112 percent from 2005 figures.

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Whiteley A Breed Apart...

With a thoughtful, scholarly demeanor that evinces his Ph.D. in psychology, Rob Whiteley might seem like he would be more at home in a college lecture hall than a breeding farm. But take a look at his track record, and there's no doubt where Whiteley belongs. Over the past 25 years, the 63-year-old has proven himself an astute horseman and breeder who has planned the matings that have produced such top horses as Henny Hughes, El Corredor, Strong Hope, Roman Ruler and Badge of Silver. Over the last month or so, Whiteley's enjoyed a particularly fruitful month in the auction ring, especially with the offspring of Mr. Greeley, a stallion Whiteley supported in his early days at stud. In August, a chestnut son of Mr. Greeley--Win My Heart that Whiteley's Liberation Farm bred in partnership with Oratis Thoroughbreds topped Fasig-Tipton's Saratoga sale at \$2.2 million. Through consignors Trackside Farm and Brandywine Farm, Whiteley brought a total of 11 Mr. Greeley yearlings to Keeneland September, and he was on hand yesterday to watch seven of those go through the ring during Thursday's fourth session. Of the seven, five sold for \$1,270,000, an average of \$254,000. That included hip 1050, a colt which Brandywine co-bred and consigned that was hammered down to B. Wayne Hughes for \$500,000. Two others failed to meet their reserve.

What first attracted Rob Whiteley to Mr. Greeley as a stud prospect? "My breeding method is first to start matching up physical qualities of mares with stallions," Whiteley explained. "Mr. Greeley is a beautiful horse

himself, and gets a high percentage of well-balanced, athletic horses, and I found he fit a lot of my mares. I was especially impressed with him after I co-bred El Corredor, who was my best individual that year. That made me fully appreciate Mr. Greeley. As a commercial breeder, I need to get a high percentage of ath-

letes who also gets a decent sale individual, and Mr. Greeley does that." El Corredor, whom Whiteley's Liberation Farm bred in partnership with Needham-Betz Thoroughbreds, sold for \$110,000 as a yearling in 1998 and went on to win seven of 10 races, including the GI Cigar Mile. He is now a successful young sire at Hill 'n' Dale. El Corredor's success compelled Whiteley to return to Mr. Greeley and, in a tactic he employs often, he bred a large block of his mares to the current Gainesway resident. Two years ago, he sent 15 mares to Mr. Greeley, and is now enjoying great success with the resulting offspring. While Mr. Greeley has been very good to Whiteley, it could also be said that Whiteley's been good to the stallion regarding mare support. Unfortunately, Whiteley was forced to abandon his blitzkrieg breeding to the stallion when his fee rose to \$75,000. "As they go up the ladder, I have to look for the next promising stallion," he laughed. "I'm a surfer looking for the next big wave on the horizon. I have to identify them as they're coming on." Other stallions who Whiteley supported heavily with blocks of mares include Grand Slam, the sire of Strong Hope; and Hennessy, the sire of Henny Hughes. Similarly, both stallions subsequently saw their fees rise to a level Whiteley didn't feel comfortable breeding at, though he says he is now using Grand Slam again since the Coolmore stallion's fee dropped to \$35,000. Whiteley currently sees a number of attractive opportunities out there, that "next big wave." "I bred a number of mares to Value Plus last year--and his foals impressed me very much," he said. "And I think since we got Bernstein, he's great value. And of course I'm partial to Henny Hughes, but he also fits a number of my mares. Basically, I'm trying to breed to talented milers who could maybe carry their speed a little farther."

A Pleasant Afternoon for Whisper Hill Farm...

It wasn't Magnier vs. the Sheikh, but it was still a tough, entertaining battle. Bloodstock agent Davant Latham and his client Mandy Pope of Whisper Hill Farm saw off a determined challenger in the rear of the sales pavilion to land the session-topping filly from the first crop of GI Breeders' Cup Classic hero Pleasant Perfect (Pleasant Colony). Latham signed the ticket for \$490,000 for the Lane's End consignor, who was bred by Kilroy Thoroughbred Partnership. "She has a great walk on her," Latham said. "She is big and has plenty of bone, and we're looking for that kind of filly: big, scopey types who look like they'll go two turns." Catalogued as hip 1087, the dark bay is a granddaughter of Lane's End blue hen Lassie Dear, who is also the granddam of A.P. Indy, Summer Squall, et al. Her dam is the 21-year-old Seattle Slew mare Lassie Connection, whose offspring include stakes winner Winning Connection (St. Jovite) and a quartet of graded performers. Two years ago, Whisper Hill went to \$250,000 for another offspring of Lassie Connection, the now-three-year-old filly Lassie's Ticket (Fusaichi Pegasus). "I love her half-sister," explained Pope. "She hasn't started yet, but we like her a lot. She's in training with Steve Klesaris at Fair Hill." Asked if the March foal reminded them of Pleasantly Perfect, Latham replied, "She actually reminds us more of her sister. This one's a little bit stronger at this point in her life and looks like she'll grow up to be a big, strong filly herself." Whisper Hill Farm is based in Ocala, Florida, where Pope maintains a broodmare band of about 20 mares. She typically adds a filly or two each year. "I only buy fillies, and only fillies with pedigrees that I want to race and then to make part of our broodmare band," Pope explained. "We might buy a mare in November, but then that'll be it." Pope, who's been involved in the Thoroughbred business for 25 years, offers her yearlings at auction and races what she can't sell. Before putting on her buying hat yesterday, Pope spent Tuesday playing the role of seller. She sent three horses through the ring Wednesday through consignor Darby Dan Farm. An Elusive Quality--Charming Lauren filly made \$250,000, while a Dynaformer--Song 'n Silk colt sold for \$170,000. Another colt, by Empire Maker, failed to meet his reserve and was bought back. Whisper Hill and Darby Dan will offer two more before the sale's through: hip [1409](#), a Tiznow--Extraordinary Lady colt from the family of Runway Model; and hip [3283](#), a Cat Thief--Affirmed Legacy colt who is a full-sibling to this year's GI Santa Anita Derby third Sam P.

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De Meric Gets His Greeley...

Nick de Meric has been trying all week to buy the offspring of Mr. Greeley at Keeneland, but has struck out on most of those occasions. The bloodstock agent finally found his pot of gold yesterday afternoon, going to \$250,000 for [hip 1149](#), a son of the Gainesway stallion from the consignment of Tom Evans' Tracksides Farm. "They're very hard to buy at the moment," de Meric commented, echoing the sentiments of many other buyers. "We've been identifying the same horses as people with deep pockets, I guess. We really liked this guy. He met all our criteria and we're delighted to have him." The April foal was produced by Ophidian (Ogygian), the dam of South African GSP Kelly's Olympics (Kingmambo) and a half-sister to the sire American Chance. The mare was purchased by Rob Whiteley for \$30,000 carrying a foal by Cat Thief at the 2004 Keeneland November sale. Whiteley sold that filly for \$15,000 at last year's September sale, but yesterday's foal yielded entirely different results. De Meric stated that he purchased the colt on behalf of "an unnamed client who races in New York." He indicated that Rick Violette Jr. is likely to train the colt.

Book Two a Rousing Success...

Following significant statistical declines in Book 1, sales officials were ebullient about the performance of Book 2. Yesterday's fourth day of bidding saw increases of 14.6 percent on the average and a whopping 25 percent in the median. Cumulative average losses have been pared down to 10 percent, while the median through Book 2 is actually ahead by eight percent. "It was a very good sale overall, both domestically and internationally," commented Keeneland Director of Sales Geoffrey Russell. "It's still very selective. It's not easy, but there's lots of money there for the right horse. With the selection that's on tap here, buyers can be selective so there are some weaknesses there that need to be addressed." Yesterday's session featured five horses to eclipse the half-million mark, one fewer than last year, which included two horses to make \$1 million or more. Russell was especially pleased with the progress made in the middle market. "I love medians being up," Russell said. "I think the median is the figure that we all look at. I think it shows that the money is being spread around more and when money is being spread around more, it makes consignors happy. We like consignors to be happy." There is no selling today in order to give the buying public a chance to survey Book 3 offerings. Bidding resumes tomorrow morning at 10 a.m.

Resellers Digging In...

The 2007 two-year-olds in training sales proved difficult for pinhookers, who struggled to turn large profits. But resellers are a hearty and persistent breed and are showing up with greater frequency on the sales sheets, now that the sale has entered the lower tier of the upper end of the market. Tough though it has been, they are getting it done. "I think the ethereal top isn't there right now," said bloodstock agent Peter Bradley. "I think [Wednesday] it was difficult to buy a good horse, [yesterday] it was even more so." Bradley described how some pinhookers have adjusted their game plans. "I think there is still a lot of money for the horses in the \$100,000-to-\$400,000 range," he explained. "It's hugely competitive. The pinhookers have dropped back to where they really don't want to spend more than \$150,000 a pop and so, in that range and in this book and beyond, it's going to be strong for pinhookers and racing people." Nick de Meric sees little slowdown in the market, despite the declines at the top. "I'm finding plenty of horses that I like and I think this market is as strong as it ever is for the A+ physical," de Meric offered. "I think what you saw in Book 1 was a little less competition on individual horses, but that money seems to be spread around more horses, which makes it hard to get the horses you want. It's been hard, but we're starting to get a few." Jimmy Gladwell, a prominent reseller, agreed that things have been rough at times, but he likes it that way. "It's been difficult to buy," Gladwell stated. "I've seen the pinhookers buy some horses, but I've also seen them run second and third a lot. It's still a tough atmosphere, but that's what we expect it to be and that's what we want it to be. We're in this two-year-old game, and if it was easy for us the first couple of days, it'd mean the market was in trouble; we want it to be strong." Added Randy Hartley, famous for having consigned The Green Monkey with partner Dean De Renzo to the 2006 Fasig-Tipton Calder sale, "It's a good sale... it's really strong. It's electric today and anything that looks good is bringing a lot of money. There's plenty of buyers here and it's a good, solid sale." Hartley is in this for the long haul. "We're just doing what we do. We're trying to buy nice horses and those are just hard to buy," he said.

Jimmy Gladwell, pinhooker:

"I think the market is good and strong. The good individuals are bringing plenty of money. We didn't have all the major clashes the first couple of days which made the gross go down, but the law of averages say that just a couple of horses can make a big difference in the market. I see a lot of people out looking. I've been in the barn area all day and it's full of people looking at horses for Saturday. I think the market is pretty healthy."

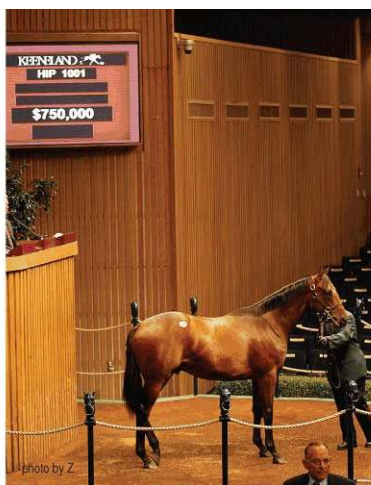

She is a big girl who doesn't worry about much and is a good 'doer'. We'll put her away now, as it's always a good idea to finish early if you want them to start early as three-year-olds. I'd love to have a shot at the G1 1000 Guineas, as she has the mentality for that sort of race if everything goes well with her preparation." Trainer Ed Vaughan said of the runner-up, "That will have put the finishing touches to her; Frankie [Dettori] said we should supplement her for either the G1 Prix Marcel Boussac [at Longchamp Oct. 7] or G1 Fillies' Mile [at Ascot Sept. 29]." July 31, he scorched the turf of the Knavesmire when dominating **Cake** in the Listed Roses S. three weeks later. "He's in cracking form," trainer Bryan Smart commented. "He came out of his York race absolutely fantastic. He did a piece of work on Friday and went very well, and he must go there with every chance." Following her success in the Molecomb, Fleeting Spirit tried six furlongs and was a highly creditable third in York's G2 Lowther S. Aug. 23. "I was very pleased with her effort at York," trainer Jeremy Nosedata said. "She ran a brave race over a trip that wasn't ideal. This return to five furlongs will be much more to her liking." Barry Hills saddled Gallic League (GB) and Sheer Viking (GB) to win this in 1987 and 1998, respectively, and relies on **Dark Angel**, who followed a fourth in the G2 July S. He was sidelined by a tendon injury, returning to finish off the board in the July 29 GII Jim Dandy S. Overall, he has three wins and a second from five starts for earnings of \$254,672 for Stonestreet Stables and trainer Steve Asmussen.

POMEROY RELOCATES TO VINERY FLORIDA Dr. Tom Simon's Vinery has acquired a major interest in Multiple Grade I winner **Pomeroy** (Boundary--Questress, by Seeking the Gold) and the six-year-old stallion will stand the 2008 season at Vinery Florida. Pomeroy began his stud career in 2007, covering 150 mares at Cloverleaf Farms, which closed operations this spring. Pomeroy set the stakes record of 1:20.99 while winning the 2004 GI King's Bishop S. He also captured the 2006 GI Forego S., the 2005 GII Alfred G. Vanderbilt H. and the 2004 GIII Jersey Shore Breeders' Cup S. He was second in the 2003 GII Saratoga Special S.

Velazquez, Castellano in Spill at Belmont:

Jockeys John Velazquez and Javier Castellano were involved in a spill in the fifth race at Belmont Park yesterday. The incident occurred when Unrestricted, ridden by Castellano, fractured his right front cannon bone on the backstretch and fell. 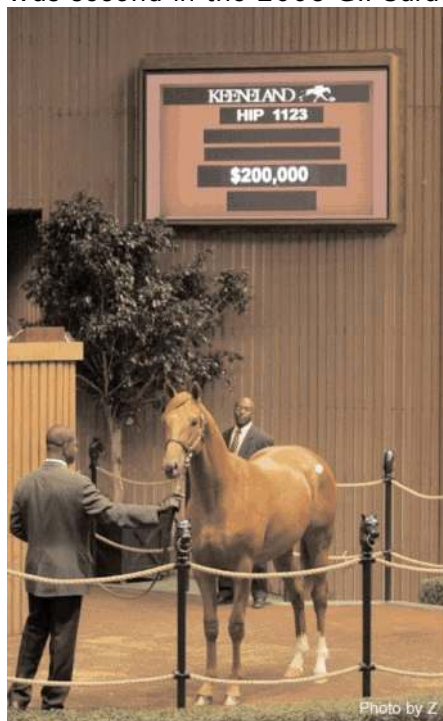

The Jockey Club Releases 2006 Breeding Statistics:

A total of 3,881 stallions covered 63,629 mares in North America in 2006, according to statistics released yesterday by The Jockey Club. Those matings resulted in 36,317 live foals of 2007, reported as of Sept. 6. "Although live-foal reporting is a little behind last year at this time, we will receive additional reports in the coming months and we expect our previously announced projection of 37,500 registered foals for North American in 2007 to be on target," said Matt Iuliano, The Jockey Club's vice president of registration services. "Breeders who have yet to report their 2007 live foals should do so immediately to complete the registration of their foals within the one-year deadline and avoid late registration fees." The number of stallions declined 2.8 percent from the 3,992 reported for 2005 at this time last year, while the number of mares bred decreased 0.8 percent from the 64,123 reported for 2005. Kentucky-based stallions accounted for 33.7 percent of the mares reported bred in 2006 and 40.8 percent of the live foals of 2007. The 21,455 mares reported bred to 372 Kentucky stallions in 2006 have produced 14,801 live foals, a 0.4 percent-increase on the 14,748 Kentucky-sired foals of 2006 reported at this time last year. Among individual stallions, Giant's Causeway sired the most live foals of 2007 with 168 reported as of Sept. 6. Hip [178](#), consigned by Peter Balding's Throckmorton Court Stud, is out of Society Rose (GB), herself a half sister to the 2000 G1 Cheveley Park S. winner Regal Rose (GB) and Saturday's G1 St Leger contender Regal Flush (GB). The Feb. 16th foal is from the extended family of the 1989 G1 Irish 2000 Guineas and G1 St James's Palace S. scorer Shaadi. Three lots were sold for €32,000 on the night, with the first falling to trainer Bryan Smart after a bidding battle with David Minton. Hip [142](#), from the draft of Robert Chugg's Little Lodge Farm, is a colt by Bertolini, the sire of Smart's G3 King George S. winner Moorhouse Lad (GB). Bobby O'Ryan matched that figure when outbidding Peter Doyle for hip [150](#), a son of Elusive City out of a half to the 2004 G3 Somerville Tattersalls S. winner Diktatorial (GB) from Willie Browne's Meadowlands Stud. Later in the session, O'Ryan paid the same after a tussle with James Stack for Woodtown House Stud's hip [183](#), a daughter of Johannesburg whose dam is a close relative of the listed scorer Hymn of Love (Ire). "We reintroduced the St Leger Festival Sales this year to provide an alternative for the large number of yearlings who could not be accommodated at the end of August and that has resulted in a solid commercial catalogue of typical St Leger Yearlings," DBS Managing Director Henry Beeby commented. "There is absolutely no doubt in our mind that this sale has a real future and will do what we have always done this week, which is pump out value-for-money winners." AUSTRALIAN EQUINE INFLUENZA UPDATE

AUSTRALIAN BREEDERS HOPING TO MOVE MARES

The Thoroughbred Breeders of Australia have agreed to approach the government about a potentially controversial plan that would allow Thoroughbred mares to leave their farms in order to be bred, even as the lockdown remains in force. The TBA sent the proposal to the New South Wales state government Sept. 13, and a decision is expected Sept. 17. If they can get it rubber stamped, mares will be able to be shipped while ovulating, check into a specially designated "Purple Zone," as it will be called, be served by a stallion in that zone, and then stay there until the equine influenza outbreak has run its course. After meeting with NSW Primary Industries Minister Ian Macdonald Thursday, TBA President John Messara confirmed the Purple Zone proposal was met by an "agreement in principle to the plan by the breeders," but there is a need for further discussion "on compliance aspects to reassure other jurisdictions." The plan will go to the Technical Committee this week. "All going well, the final plan will be presented for approval on Monday, Sept. 17," Messara said. Messara has joined the movement to get vaccination of mares approved immediately. "If this EI problem doesn't ravage us this time, it will in a year or two or three," he remarked. "It will come again, because human error in these days of international travel and the global horse economy will mean that at some stage in the future it will happen again. We need to vaccinate in NSW right now. It would be preferable to vaccinate across the whole of Australia, but our view in NSW is if the other states don't want to do it, we should vaccinate ourselves so we can have freedom of movement within our state and conduct racing in the normal way. If other states don't want to be in it, then that's very unfortunate. We'd rather other states be in it, as sooner or later they will understand how devastating this disease can be. We shouldn't be playing Russian roulette with the flu and we should just vaccinate."
