International racehorse owners Michael Tabor and Derrick Smith have reached an agreement in principle to purchase a 50-percent interest in undefeated

two-year-old GI Hopeful winner **Majestic Warrior** (A.P. Indy--Dream Supreme, by Seeking the Gold) from the Steinbrenner family's Kinsman Stable. The proposed agreement to purchase, which stipulates the colt will stand at Coolmore America's Ashford Stud upon his retirement, was confirmed by Coolmore when con-

tacted by the *TDN* yesterday. Majestic Warrior will continue to run in the colors of Kinsman, who bred the colt, and will continue to be trained by Bill Mott. Ashford Stud Manager Dermot Ryan facilitated the introduction of Tabor and Smith to the Steinbrenners, who have done business with the Coolmore organization in the past. No financial details were disclosed. Majestic Warrior won his first start at Saratoga, a 6 1/2 furlong maiden special weight, by 3 1/2 lengths Aug. 4, and followed that up with his impressive last-to-first stretch run to win the Sept. 4 Hopeful by 2 1/4 widening lengths.

"We are very excited to be able to offer such a special representative of A. P. Indy in Majestic Warrior, only his second colt to win a Grade I race at two," said Ryan. "We don't currently have this sire line represented at Ashford and, with his pedigree and the career he has before him, we couldn't be more pleased to have him." A. P. Indy's other Grade I-winning colt at two, A P Valentine, won the 2000 GI Champagne S. and went to stud at Ashford in 2002. The bay suffered fertility problems. Majestic Warrior's dam, Dream Supreme, now 10, was also a Kinsman homebred trained by Mott, and was a multiple Grade I stakes winner who took the GI Test S. and GI Ballerina S. at Saratoga in 2000. She is the dam of four-year-old stakes winner Crystal Current (A.P. Indy).

MARIA'S MON DEAD

Pin Oak stallion **Maria's Mon** (Wavering Monarch--Carlotta Maria, by Caro {Ire}), the champion juvenile of 1995 and sire of GI Kentucky Derby winner Monarchos, was euthanized Friday morning at Hagyard-Davidson-McGee Equine Clinic near Lexington. The 14-year-old stallion suffered a severe case of laminitis that, according to a press release, might have been triggered by equine cushinoid disease, also known as Cushing's syndrome. The disease, usually caused by a tumor on the pituitary gland, results in a number of symptoms, including unexplained founder. Maria's Mon first exhibited signs of a problem at the end of August, and his condition, marked by multiple organ dysfunction, deteriorated to the point that it was determined to be irreversible. Bred and raced by Morton Rosenthal and trained by Rick Schosberg, Maria's Mon won four of his seven career starts, including the GI Champagne S., GI Futurity S. and GIII Sanford S., and was awarded the Eclipse Award as top juvenile. He started just twice at three, and retired with earnings of \$507,140. From eight crops to race, he has been represented by 62 stakes horses, including Monarchos, a member of his first crop; 2006 champion three-year-old filly Wait A While; and Grade I winners See How She Runs and Latent Heat. His progeny have earned nearly \$30 million to date. Maria's Mon, who stood for \$60,000 this year and covered a reported 132 mares, was owned by the partnership of Pin Oak, Stonerside and Overbrook Farm. He will be buried at Pin Oak.

WALDMAN ON 2008 PLANS FOR STORM CAT

Overbrook Farm resident **Storm Cat** (Storm Bird--Terlingua, by Secretariat) has been the world's most successful commercial sire for much of the past decade, but he has seen his yearling average take a hit in 2007. Last year, 25 Storm Cat yearlings averaged \$1,255,400, with a median figure of \$825,000. Thus far in 2007, a total of 25 yearlings by the 24-year-old sire have averaged \$564,600, with a median

of \$400,000. The drop in average and median had some people speculating whether Overbrook would drop Storm Cat's fee from its 2007 level of \$500,000, but farm officials say they haven't decided on anything yet. "All I can say is that we'll wait until the yearling sales are over before we analyze our stallion's fees for next year," said Overbrook advisor Ric Waldman. "But I can say that we will drop his book down. We haven't finalized a number yet." During the most recent breeding season, Storm Cat covered 96 mares and achieved a 70-percent in-foal rate, according to Waldman. He covered 111 mares the previous year. "His fertility suffered a little bit, but it's still very acceptable, especially for a stallion that's about to turn 25," added Waldman. "But the best thing he's got going for him is his libido. Physically, he's doing just great." Overbrook has traditionally bred a number of its own mares to Storm Cat, in addition to share holders who their exercise breeding rights to the stallion, and Waldman was asked about the number of outside mares that will be accepted into Storm Cat's book next year. "It's never a fixed number, but we'll definitely have seasons available," he said. "Whether they're our seasons or not, they will be available."

SET PLAY PREPS FOR OAK LEAF GI Del Mar Debutante heroine **Set Play** (Van Nistelrooy) worked an easy half in :50 4/5 at San Luis Rey Downs yesterday morning. The filly makes her next start in the Sept. 29 GI Oak Leaf S. "She worked beautifully," co-owner Sean Gerson said. "We brought her jockey, Brice Blanc, down, and she looked great. I anticipate a big race in the Oak Leaf." Coming off a runner-up finish in the GIII Sorrento S., Set Play was let go at 14-1 in the Debutante, and Gerson found himself heading to the window. "I'm not much of a gambler, but I know value," he said with a laugh. "I shop at Costco." If she runs a big race in the Oak Leaf, the filly will be pointed for the Oct. 27 GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies. "I expect we'll be there," Gerson said.

KEENELAND SEPTEMBER RESUMES TODAY

Friday was a dark day at Keeneland September, but you wouldn't know it by the number of cars in the parking lot or the number of potential buyers poring over their catalogs in the sales pavilion's dining room. Several consignors reported heavier-than-usual traffic as the backstretch was a flurry of activity. "This is the busiest I've ever seen it," confirmed Taylor Made's Frank Taylor. That could bode well for Keeneland, which, after a downturn in trade during the first book, rebounded with a very strong two days of selling for Book 2. Through Thursday, the auction house saw 854 horses change hands for a total of \$243,290,500. While the cumulative average was down 10 percent to \$284,883, the median has enjoyed an 8.1-percent boost to \$200,000. Action resumes this morning at 10 a.m. and runs uninterrupted through Tuesday, Sept. 25.

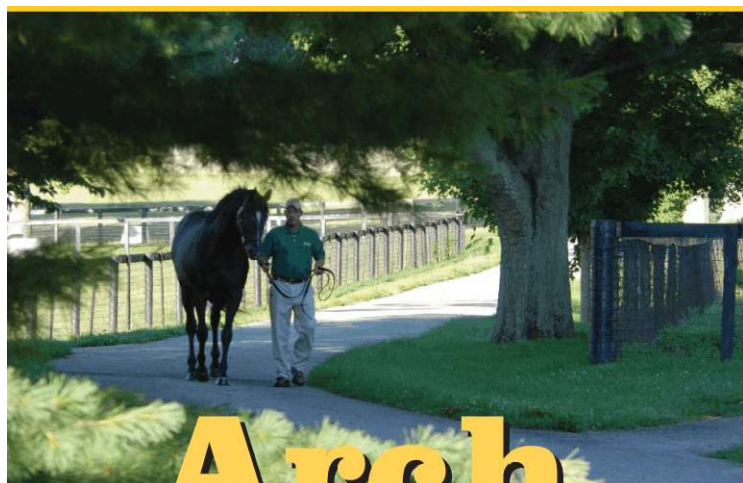
NEW RULES

Due to a \$40-million drop in Sheikh Mohammed's yearling spending, Keeneland September's flagship Book 1 was down \$37.5 million, almost exactly 20 percent of the gross. But the strength of Book 2--Wednesday and Thursday--demonstrated the depth of the market. Book 2 was up \$7.8 million in gross, or 9 percent, from just over \$90 million last year to \$97,913,500 this year. The Book 2 average was up 13 percent to \$189,388. Most significantly, the median for the first two books combined was actually up 8 percent from \$185,000 last year to \$200,000 this year. Keeneland Sales Director Geoff Russell referred to the median as "the statistic we all look at." Well, it's the statistic we all look at when it suits us, but in this case, it is a better measurement of the market than the Book 1-2 average, naturally down 10 percent because prices are top-heavy in Book 1.

If class is a pyramid--which it is--perhaps we can best describe what has happened in the market so far as the shape of the pyramid changing. When Sadler's Wells and Storm Cat were in their heydays--and they were the top young sires with APEX ratings in the 4s and 5s--the angle of the pyramid was steeper. There was more of a gap between the value of the very top sires and second-tier sires. Now, in the days of double-size books and 75 horses by one sire (see Giant's Causeway) in the first two books, the gap between the two tiers is narrower, and the angle of the class pyramid is leveling out to some extent. The fall at the top--Book 1--is being countered by the strength of Book 2, and the overall median shows this.

There are three other points I think we can take from the sale's first four days. First, clearly stud fees at the top need to contract. Since Distorted Humor was recently reportedly valued at \$135 million, his stud fee of \$225,000 in 2007 certainly isn't going to fall, but not too many others will be exempt. Given the Book 1 median of \$300,000, and the impressive combined Book 1-2 median of \$200,000, the owners of any stallion now standing for more than \$50,000 are likely to be thinking hard before setting their 2008 stud fees.

Second, a comment I've heard frequently this week is how "American" the sires in North America, and during Keeneland's first four days, are. The Book 1 successes of A.P. Indy and Unbridled's Song--both very American sires--is all the illustration you need of that. If you think back to the days of Northern Dancer, Blushing Groom, Lyphard, Nureyev and Riverman, you can see that those kinds of sires don't come to Kentucky any more. The success of Sadler's Wells heralded a revival in the European stallion market.



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Now the Europeans come to America because the dollar is in the ashcan, but they're somewhat scratching their heads as to what they should buy.

Third, Sheikh Mohammed's 'day off' Tuesday, when John Ferguson signed for just two horses, exposed what one Keeneland official referred to as the Book 1 Fallacy--I can't afford to buy in Book 1, so I won't show up. Another real advantage in talking about the median (half sell above, half below) is that the \$300,000 Book 1 and \$200,000 Books 1-2 medians do make a persuasive case to American buyers that they can afford to buy in Book 1. Even last year when Sheikh Mohammed spent \$57 million, the Book 1 median was \$310,000. There has been a lot of chat (evidently, mostly among journalists who cover the sales) about whether a different format for the first four days might be advisable. For example, just sell alphabetical by dam for all of the first four days instead of each day. But there are stabling concerns. The Uberconsignors would possibly have logistical difficulties with that kind of format, and there's no guarantee the Uberbuyers would actually stay here for four full days. Personally, my preference would be to see Book 1 on the first two days completely alphabetical by dam, then Book 2 the same and so on.

Meanwhile, Book 3 kicks off this morning with a renewed air of optimism following Book 2's strong performance (aside from the 7-1 percent clearance rate, especially considering 76 percent sold in Book 1), and yesterday's breather day. In 2005, Saturday's session averaged almost \$109,000. Last year, Saturday averaged nearly \$107,000. The big jump came during Sunday's session from just over \$70,000 in 2005 to more than \$90,000 last year.

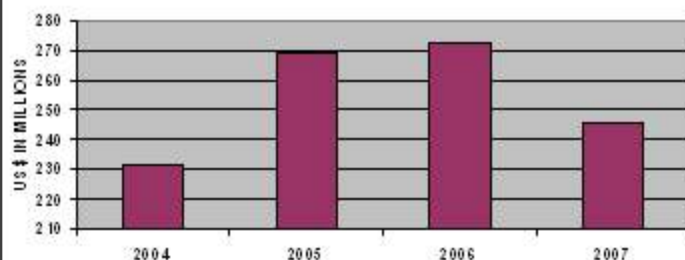

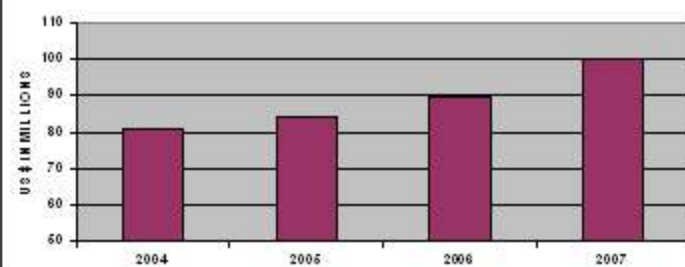
KEENELAND BOOK 1 & 2 CUMULATIVE GROSS

Quiet Resolve (Affirmed), who benefited from the disqualification of Hawksley Hill (Ire) in 1999; **Numerous Times** (Numerous) in 2001; and **Soaring Free** (Smart Strike), whose victory in 2004 was his sixth of an eight-race campaign. The latter earned Sovereign Awards as Canada's Horse of the Year and top turf horse. Both Soaring Free and Quiet Resolve were campaigned by Sam-Son Farm and trained by Mark Frostad.

would have had a fourth had Hawksley Hill's number stayed up. Drysdale's first win came in 1998, when the temperamental **Labeeb** (GB) (Lear Fan) touched off French invader Jim and Tonic (Fr). Drysdale later shipped in Gainsborough homebred **Touch of the**

Blues (Fr) (Cadeaux Genereux {GB}) in 2003, and added another score with **Becrux** (It) (Glen Jordan {GB}) last year. The Italian-bred gelding is seeking to become the first two-time winner of this \$1-million contest. Both Labeeb and Touch of the Blues were six years old when they won.

Bobby Frankel has trained two winners of the Woodbine Mile, six-year-old **Riviera** (Fr) (Kris {GB}) in 2000 and five-year-old **Leroidesanimaux** (Brz) (Candy Stripes) in 2005. The latter, a flashy chestnut, wired his rivals on his way to a 7 3/4-length success, establishing the largest winning margin in Woodbine Mile history. The Brazilian-bred went on to be second in the GI Breeders' Cup Mile at Belmont and earned an Eclipse Award as champion turf horse in the U.S.

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LOOKING TO LUCARNO

Despite his substantial big-race haul, owner George Strawbridge has yet to witness an English Classic winner in his silks, but that could all change today as **Lucarno** (Dynaformer) tackles the G1 St Leger at Doncaster. Lucarno has already proven more than a match for three of the Ballydoyle quartet in York's G2 Great Voltigeur S., but he has to do it again over that extra quarter mile and vital 132 yards if he is to emulate Rule of Law and Milan (GB), the most recent to complete the double. "Lucarno is out of a fast mare and the extended trip is an issue, which is why we have been hesitant," commented trainer John Gosden. "The track will suit him well. Doncaster is a lovely galloping course and, because of the redevelopment, they will be racing on nice fresh ground, but that last two and a half furlongs is a little bit like going into no man's land and you need to stay the trip."

Lucarno had **Acapulco (Ire)** (Galileo {Ire}) and **Mahler (GB)** (Galileo {Ire}) beaten when fourth in the June 2 G1 Epsom Derby, and may have been inconvenienced by a rain-softened turf course and a lack of pace when runner-up in Royal Ascot's G2 King Edward VII S. 20 days later. Following a fourth-place finish against his elders in Newmarket's G2 Princess of Wales's S. July 12, all the pieces came together when besting **Yellowstone (Ire)**, **Macarthur (GB)** (Montjeu {Ire}), **Acapulco** and **Mahler** in York's premier Leger prep Aug. 21. Trainer John Gosden also has Khalid Abdullah's **Raincoat (GB)** (Barathea {Ire}) in the line-up. The homebred has claims on his second-place finish to Authorized (Ire) in the May 17 G2 Dante S. at York. Subsequently down the field in the June 3 G1 Prix du Jockey-Club at Chantilly and third in the G3 Gordon S. at Goodwood July 31, his trainer offered excuses for the latter effort. "It was a falsely run race at Goodwood last time," Gosden added. "It was one of those where they might as well have started at the head of the straight and sprinted. He has been slightly forgotten by people. He was runner-up to Authorized in the Dante at York and ran really well there."

Cheveley Park Stud's Senior Manager John Marsh is hopeful Regal Flush can find extra improvement to snap Stoute's losing run. "We know Regal Flush stays the trip and we thought we'd give it a go," Marsh commented. "He'll get every yard of the trip and we hope he gives a good account of himself." Michael Jarvis saddles **Veracity (GB)** (Lomitas {GB}) in Sheikh Mohammed bin Rashid Al Maktoum colors which have been carried to success by Oh So Sharp (Ire) in 1985, Moonax (Ire) in 1994 and Shantou two years later. While Veracity has 3 1/2 lengths to make up on Mahler on the form of the G3 Queen's Vase at Royal Ascot June 22, he showed he has not stood still in the interim when runner-up to Allegretto (Ire) in the Aug. 2 G2 Goodwood Cup. "Veracity has been in good form since Goodwood," Jarvis said. "He stays very well and is fit and well. The big question mark is whether he is good enough, but we will find out [today]."

This race has eluded trainer Aidan O'Brien, but the odds are stacked heavily in his favor as he saddles **Yeats** and **Scorpion**. While the former claimed the scalp of Alkaased in the G1 Coronation Cup over 1 1/2 miles at Epsom two years ago, all subsequent wins have come going further than this trip, and he has to make up for two reversals here, most notably at the hands of Kastoria (Ire) when 2-7 last year. Susan Magnier and Diane Nagle's six-year-old enters off a near three-month break, having registered a second straight win in the June 21 G1 Ascot Gold Cup last time out. "Yeats had a good break after his Ascot Gold Cup win," O'Brien told the *Racing Post*.

"We're very happy with him and he has shown in the past that he is capable of running very well fresh." Susan Magnier and Michael Tabor's **Scorpion**, who conquered Doncaster's G1 St Leger in 2005, emulated Yeats when capturing this year's renewal of the Coronation Cup at the expense of subsequent G2 Lonsdale Cup and G2 Doncaster Cup winner Septimus (Ire) June 1. He failed by a half-length to Maraahel (Ire) when runner-up in the G2 Hardwicke S. at Royal Ascot June 23 before folding to finish fifth in the G1 King George VI and Queen Elizabeth Diamond S. at Ascot last time July 28. "We've been happy with Scorpion since his run in the King George," the Ballydoyle conditioner told the *Post*. "We've managed to get some good horses beaten in this race before." In what is effectively a trial for the Nov. 6 G1 Melbourne Cup, Sean Mulryan's **Bellamy Cay** adds further spice and holds claims of upsetting the Ballydoyle duo on the best of last season's form. He showed a consistent level of form for Andre Fabre, winning the G2 Prix Maurice de Nieuil at Longchamp in July before finishing fourth in the G2 Grand Prix de Deauville the following month and runner-up to Montare (Ire) in the G1 Prix Royal-Oak back on the Bois de Boulogne in October. Sold by Khalid Abdullah following an unplaced effort in the G1 Dubai Sheema Classic at Nad Al Sheba Mar. 31, he is now in the hands of Dermot Weld.

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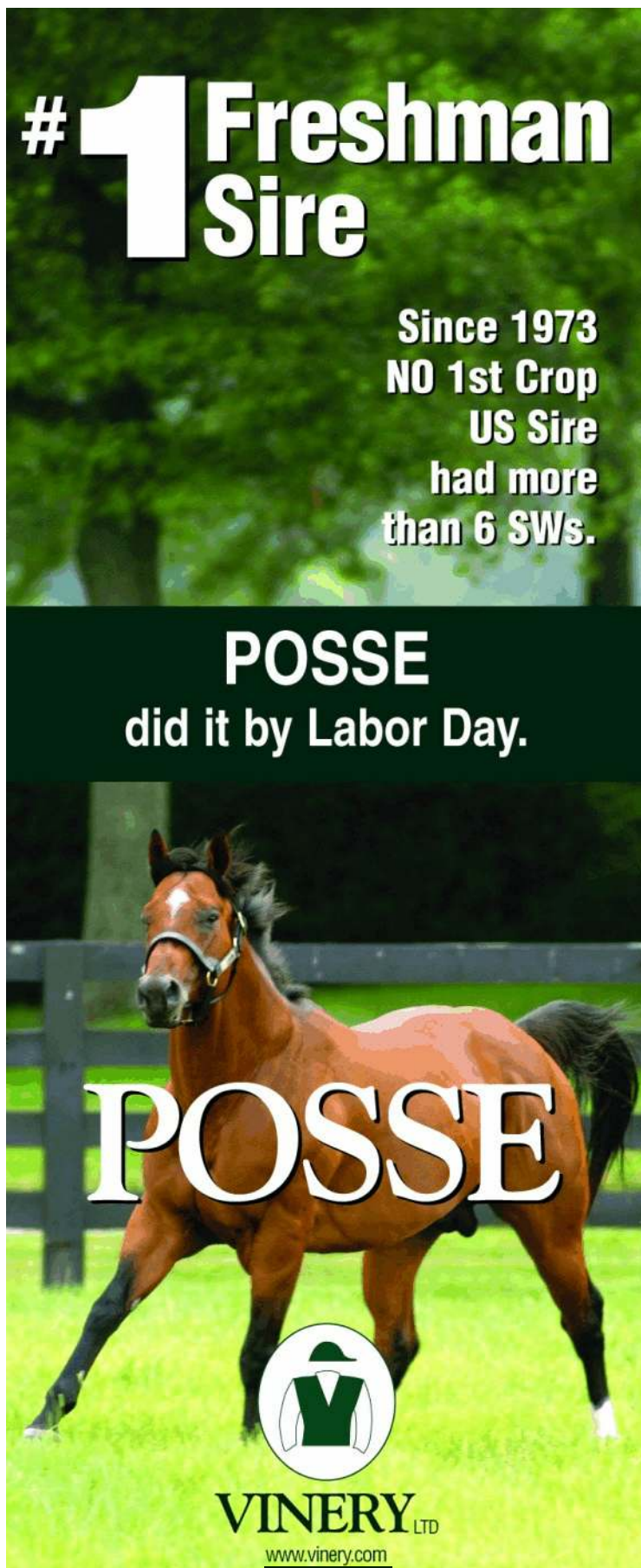

Fleeting Spirit is all speed and jockey Frankie Dettori turned that weapon against her peers to prompt serious consideration for a tilt at the G1 Prix de l'Abbaye. Raw pace had won against subsequent G1 Nunthorpe S. winner Kingsgate Native (Ire) in the G3 Molecomb S. over Goodwood's fast five furlongs July 31, but the extra panel proved too far when third in the G2 Lowther S. at York last time Aug. 23. 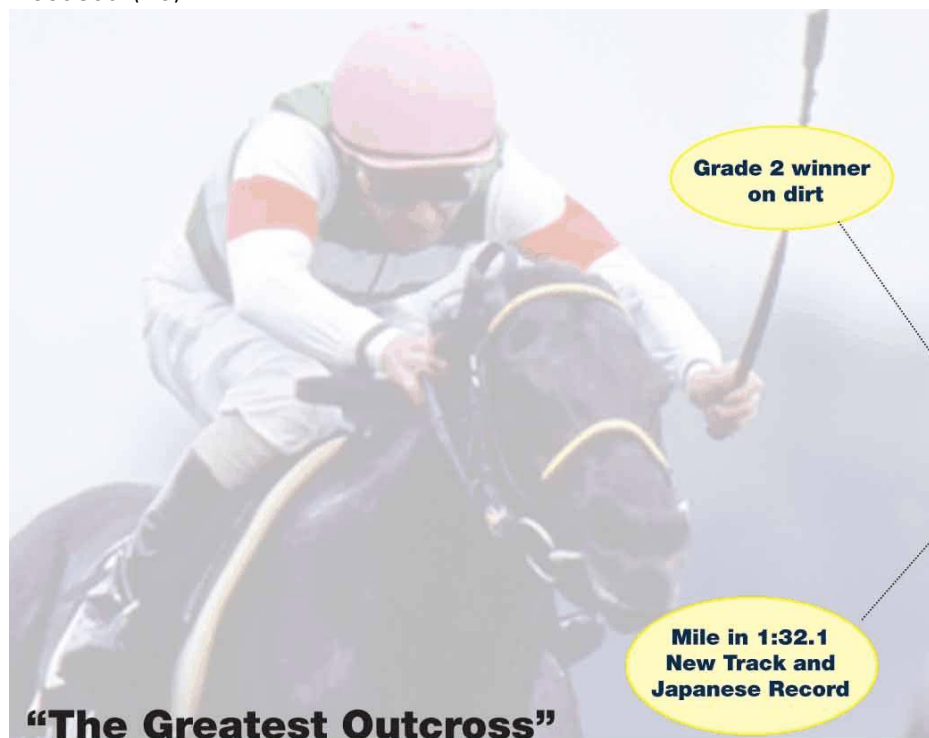

"He knows how to jump and travel and is a professional, so I didn't want to complicate things," Quinn explained. "He relaxes and when you ask he keeps lengthening--I think he'll get a mile as he had his head down and was starting to go away at the line. He's unexposed and has his future ahead of him." Trainer Paul Cole added, "The ground was a bit fast for him at Ascot and I was a bit worried it would be here and also he didn't have a good draw, but we've always thought highly of him. The plan was to give him a positive ride and I'm very pleased with the ride Richard gave him. The G1 Dewhurst S. [at Newmarket Oct. 20] is a possibility, but I'm not going to make a snap decision." 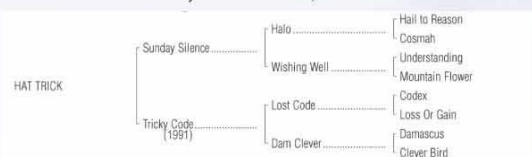

In a race which few got into contention from behind, the debutante Lush Lashes--who hails from the family of Saumarez (GB)--was well placed towards the fore by Kevin Manning early. Left in front with three furlongs remaining, the bay was joined and briefly headed by Rinterval, but was soon back in front and drew away under a drive. "She was due to run about a month ago, but got a shin," Jim Bolger said. "We'll try to get some black-type for her this season and she could go anywhere, but she will be going for the Guineas next season." Rinterval's rider Jimmy Fortune was pleased with her effort, but paid tribute to the victress. "She's a very nice filly and has done nothing wrong, but the ground was probably a bit quick for her and she was running around," Fortune said. Thoro-Graph Race of the Week

Sunday, Woodbine

WOODBINE MILE-GI, C\$1,000,000, 3yo/up, 1mT

The Woodbine Mile is the best grass race this year so far, and we expect horses that come out of it to be major players in both the Breeders' Cup Mile and Turf. Grass horses in general run figures in a much tighter range than dirt horses, and this is especially true of stakes horses, which run an extremely high percentage of "tops" (their best races). This means turf races are generally more competitive than dirt races, and weight carried and ground loss become major factors. Five pounds of weight carried is worth a point on the Thoro-Graph scale, or 1 1/2 lengths at this distance, and each path off the rail around the turn costs a length in ground loss. With the Woodbine Mile being run under allowance conditions with a big field, both come into play.

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Becrux (Ity) ran his best race on the right day to take this race last year, but this field is much, much tougher. His last two are decent, but the last looks better than it was because he saved all the ground (1w1w). 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Shakespeare obviously has very serious soundness issues, but when he's good, he's really good. His recent return at Saratoga was even better than it looked, and only close because he was wide both turns while Art Master saved ground. He's had six weeks to recover since then, and three of his last four figures make him a likely winner here at the weights with a decent trip, and a strong contender in either Breeders' Cup grass race.

Sky Conqueror is a (Sky) classic late developer, and his last four have been very strong. He got beat last time because he was spotting serious weight to the two that beat him, and he faces the same problem here, as he gets killed by the allowance conditions, in addition to having to come from way back in a big field. Not today, but definitely a contender for the Breeders' Cup Turf.

5 Kip Deville	Kipling	Velasquez	124
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Kip Deville is very unusual for a grass horse in that he cycles to and from big efforts. He earned a huge figure in winning the Maker's Mark, once you factor in the weight and the 5w4w trip. Not surprisingly he then backed up in two California starts five days apart, then after freshening moved forward nicely last time. With six weeks rest he could be set for a return to his top, and though he faces the same weighty issues as Sky Conqueror, he's a little better on his best, and has a much more favorable running style. Contender.

7 Storm Caller Stormy AtlanticMcAleney 117
Storm Caller is way too slow to contend here.

8 Estevan Grand Slam da Silva 117
Estevan is almost as slow as Storm Caller, and gives no indication he's ready to improve.

9 Remarkable News (Ven) Chayim Dominguez 121
Remarkable News (Ven) has become a very strong, solid grass horse, and it's very possible he's not through developing, since he's a Southern Hemisphere-bred, which means he really just turned five. Spotting four pounds to Shakespeare, he would need to improve to win if that one runs his race, but he's definitely a contender, especially with good tactical speed and a top grass rider.

10 Dead Red Out of Place Wilson 117
Dead Red ran a new lifetime top to win last time at 70-1, but he would still have to improve to be a factor here, and a bounce is more likely.

11 Art Master Royal Academy Leparoux 119
Art Master only finished close to Shakespeare last time because he had a much better trip. This horse has only one lifetime effort that even puts him in the mix here, has a history of running his best when fresh then falling apart, and is now making his fourth start of the campaign. Not for us.

12 Arravale Arch Valdivia Jr 118
Arravale takes on colts here, for no good reason. There are spots where her best figures would make her competitive this is not one of them.

13 Awesome Action Awesome Again Landry 117
Awesome Action has held his form well this year at age seven. But it's unlikely he's capable of the requisite improvement, and the post is no help.

14 Le Cinquieme Essai Fastness (Ire) Bahen 121
At eight, Le Cinquieme Essai is even older than Awesome Action, but he has better figures, and as the probable speed of the race, the post shouldn't hurt much, and he might even get over to the rail. Usable at a price, especially underneath.

Bottom Line: If Shakespeare stays in one piece, he's a likely winner, and since we don't like Becrux, Sky Conqueror or Art Master, the exotics look inviting. The others to use are Kip Deville, Galantas, Remarkable News and Le Cinquieme Essai.

"I always told myself that if I made money, I'd get into this game a little bit," Sean Gerson explained. "My business [a veterinary supply company] did well and, 250 horses later, here I am."

Gerson is the managing partner of Gerson Racing, the syndicate that co-owns GI Del Mar Debutante winner Set Play with Charleville Stables. The California native started out small, claiming a horse for \$2,000 at Los Alamitos in August of 2002. But soon friends and family were asking how they, too, could get involved.

"I always brought people along with me to the races, and they saw how much fun I was having," Gerson said. "They wanted to get into it, but this is an expensive game. I put together a syndicate, thinking there would be maybe 10 people; we ended up with 53 members."

One of the biggest Gerson success stories has been Star Over the Bay. Claimed for \$80,000 in 2004, the gray went on to win the GI Clement L. Hirsch S., GI Del Mar H. and Sunshine Millions Turf. To date, the various Gerson syndicates have won 164 races. After starting out with claiming horses, however, Gerson decided last year that a change in direction was needed.

"We wanted to get to the big races, and the way to do that was with two-year-olds," he remarked.

Gerson teamed up with trainer Peter Miller and headed to the sales in Ocala. Together, they bought six juvenile at OBS, then one at Barretts. The group included Set Play, as well as stakes winners Thoroughly and Whatever Whenever.

"I'd love to take the credit for our success, I really would, but Peter does a masterful job," Gerson said. "I get the money together, but he has the eye for the horse. The one thing I can take credit for is choosing Peter as our trainer. He is a tremendous guy."

Gerson and company take a conservative approach to buying, trying to keep their purchases in the \$40,000-\$80,000 range. Set Play was a bit over their limit, but Miller insisted, "I will win a stakes with this horse."

Miller proved to be a man of his word. Set Play will make her next start in the Sept. 29 GI Oak Leaf S. and, if all goes well, head to Monmouth Park for the Oct. 27 GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies. There are just nine members of the syndicate that co-owns her, but look for a crowd if she makes it to the winner's circle.

"Everyone will be bringing their friends and family, and I think it's great," Gerson said. "I'm a 'the more the merrier' kind of guy."

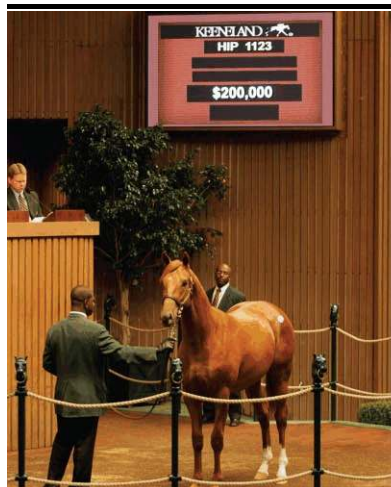

Magna Announces Debt Elimination Plan:

Magna Entertainment Corp. has unveiled a plan designed to eliminate the company's debt by Dec. 31, 2008. The plan includes the sale of various assets, including Great Lakes Downs, Thistledown and its share of Portland Meadows, as well as real estate adjacent to Gulfstream Park and Laurel Park and property in Ocala, Florida. According to a press release, MEC will also look into the possibility of "selling its membership interests in the mixed-use developments at Gulfstream Park...and Santa Anita Park...that it is pursuing under joint venture arrangements with Forest City Enterprises and Caruso Affiliated, respectively." The company will investigate partnerships or joint ventures for the gaming facility at Gulfstream and for Santa Anita, and may sell Remington Park. "MEC is at a crossroads," said Tom Hodgson, a former CEO of MEC whose firm, Greenbrook Capital Partners Inc, was hired to facilitate the debt reduction plan. "The elimination of MEC's net debt by Dec. 31, 2008 requires the company to raise approximately \$600-\$700 million from a combination of asset sales, partnerships and joint ventures, and a possible future equity financing. It is a tall order, but I believe that MEC's strong asset base makes this feasible and it is a target that all members of the company's senior management and Board, including [Chairman Frank Stronach] are firmly committed to."
