

RAGS TO RICHES INJURED

Rags to Riches (A.P. Indy) suffered a hairline fracture to her right front pastern when second behind **Lear's Princess** (Lear Fan) in Saturday's GI Gazelle S. at Belmont Park. "The injury is not career ending, and she is expected to make a full recovery," trainer Todd Pletcher said of the GI Belmont S. winner. "It appears as though she sustained the injury during the stretch run. When she switched to the right lead, she came off the bridle and lugged in a bit. Though she cooled out fine following the race, she appeared to be slightly off this morning. Subsequent X-rays discovered the hairline fracture. She is resting comfortably and will ship to Ashford Stud [Monday], where she will receive six weeks of stall rest to give the fracture time to heal. At the conclusion of her convalescence, she will be re-X-rayed to determine when she will resume training. She will not race again until 2008." Rags to Riches' only other career defeat came in her debut at Churchill Downs last June.

MANDURO INJURED IN PRIX FOY SCORE

Champion **Manduro (Ger)** (Monsun {Ger}) emerged victorious in negotiating 12 furlongs for the first time in the G2 Prix Foy yesterday at Longchamp, but may have suffered a career-ending injury. "I don't know the results of the examination yet, but he was lame behind after the race and has probably suffered a small fracture," trainer Andre Fabre told *Racing Post*. "The vets are carrying out X-rays now. I knew there was a problem a few minutes after the race. It's a terrible blow." **Cont. p6**

THE DIRECT APPROACH

Whether Jim Bolger's claim that **New Approach (Ire)** (Galileo {Ire}) is the "European version of Secretariat" was tongue in cheek after his last race, the chestnut proved yesterday that there was something to it with a pillar-to-post win in the G1 National S. at The Curragh. New Approach just edged **Rio de la Plata** (Rahy) and **Myboycharlie (Ire)** (Danetime {Ire}) as market leader for this stellar renewal, and the latest class act from Coolcullen was firmly in charge of that duo in the race itself, crossing the line 1 3/4 lengths to the good. "All the stars were here and this was the day when the title of champion two-year-old was decided," owner/trainer Bolger asserted. "He's a very talented horse; all we had to do was get him into the stalls, and he did do the rest." **Cont. p3**



DRAMATIC FINISH IN WOX MILE

Kip Deville (Kipling) forged his way to the front in deep stretch in yesterday's GI Woodbine Mile, but couldn't hold off a late rally from **Shakespeare** (Theatrical {Ire}), who came flying up the rail to take it by one length. Racing toward the back of the pack as **Remarkable News (Ven)** (Chayim) showed the way through fractions of :23.82 and :46.71, Shakespeare saved all the ground beneath Garrett Gomez and finished up full of run to deliver as the 9-5 favorite. "He is a true professional," Gomez said. "He has a lot of heart, a beautiful animal. When I turned for home, I was hoping to be able find a way through there; Becrux came off the fence a little bit and gave me a chance to get on through there. Once he saw the daylight, he hit overdrive for us; he got us home. He ran a really good race. I thought the mile might be a little too short for him, but he proved me wrong. He is a very talented horse." **Cont. p2**

Patience Pays Off...

Shakespeare began his career under the tutelage of trainer Bill Mott with a pair of wins at Gulfstream in February and March of his three-year-old season, then resurfaced the following term with a Saratoga allowance victory in July. The handsome bay added wins in the GII Belmont Breeders' Cup H. and the GI Turf Classic Invitational, but lost his unbeaten tag when finishing a disappointing 12th in the GI Breeders' Cup Turf behind Shirocco (Ger). After spending all of 2006 on the shelf, Shakespeare finally returned to action at the Spa this past summer, scoring by a half-length in a \$100,000 optional claimer Aug. 2, while making his first start for trainer Kieran McLaughlin. The six-year-old had two listed workouts since, including a smart four-furlong move over the Belmont turf in :46 3/5 Sept. 6. "He is a very classy horse," assistant trainer Art Magnuson said. "We are very lucky to have him in the barn. We could tell early that he was very special. [Owner] Mr. [Frank] Justice [Dell Ridge Farm] gets all the credit for all the time off and bringing him back slowly, and it paid off. I would say that he went into this race about the same as Saratoga. He always trains well. We thought he ran well the first time out. When New Approach registered the first of his three course-and-distance wins on heavy ground on debut July 15, he was merely hinting that he could emulate the tall feats of the stable's Teofilo (Ire) last year. While the **TDN Rising Star's** success in the G3 Tyros S. at Leopardstown 13 days later proved that he could win the same races as Teofilo (Ire), his performance there did not fire the imagination, and it was only in the G2 Futurity that the chestnut began to blossom. His three-length success in that Aug. 25 contest at The Curragh confirmed him as a colt out of the top drawer, and he hammered the point home here, turning up the pressure inside the final quarter to seal the verdict.

Despite the game efforts of Rio de la Plata late on, New Approach was not for catching, and crossed the line in a time virtually three seconds faster than Teofilo managed 12 months ago. New Approach had refused to enter the parade ring beforehand and was ponied

before the start, but he was straightforward in the race, and his trainer quashed any temperament fears afterwards. "He probably found the entrance to the parade ring a little bit claustrophobic and was a bit shy of the crowd, but he doesn't have any quirks," Jim Bolger explained.

"Everything went well in the race, and he had plenty in the tank at the line. He's a mile to

mile-and-a-half horse, and we will always be ensuring an adequate pace as long as he's running over seven furlongs, but when he steps up next year he can be [rated]." Bolger added, "Last year, the G1 Dewhurst S. [where Teofilo topped Holy Roman Emperor {Ire}] had the edge on this, but I don't have the same urgency to go to Newmarket with this horse as we did with Teofilo; today was the race that mattered. Whereas Teofilo always showed that the trip wouldn't matter, I would only be thinking of the G1 2000 Guineas and G1 Epsom Derby with this horse, as his dam didn't get beyond a mile and a half." Trainer Saeed bin Suroor was making no excuses for the runner-up, who will be seen in the Dewhurst Oct. 20 at Newmarket. "Rio de la Plata ran well behind a better horse," said Godolphin's conditioner. "We will aim him for the Darley Dewhurst S. as long as he comes out of this race in good shape." Mrs. Lindsay, who finished runner-up to West Wind in the G1 Prix de Diane, exacted her revenge in yesterday's G1 Prix Vermeille at Longchamp, repeating the achievement of her fourth dam, champion Mrs. Penny, 27 years ago. Ridden positively by Johnny Murtagh, the homebred had stolen a march on her archrival, who was locked up at the top of the stretch, and that proved decisive as she clung to a 3/4-length advantage late on. "This is a great win for Bettina Jenney, who bred Mrs. Penny to win this in 1980," trainer Francois Rohaut commented. "She settled nicely and quickened when it mattered." Mrs. Lindsay entered the June 10 Chantilly Classic on the back of a win in the G3 Prix Penelope at Saint-Cloud Apr. 9, and performed with credit when attempting to make all before succumbing to West Wind in the closing stages. Off the track until the Aug. 16 G3 Prix Minerve at Deauville, the chestnut raced with far too much zest in front and had no fight left when fading to sixth in the run to the line. Accepting restraint off the fast early fractions in second here, she was committed at the top of the home straight and dug in to hold Passage of Time as West Wind belatedly found running room. "Last time was very bad, as she was loose on the front and was very fresh," Rohaut added. "She is not in the G1 Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe [at this track Oct. 7] and, with the quality of that race this year, it would be too much for her. I am not considering the Breeders' Cup either, so I think it is almost certain that she is through for the season, and we will consider keeping her in training as a four-year-old." Mrs. Lindsay had been offered for sale at Keeneland September as a yearling in 2005, but was led out unsold for \$95,000. West Wind's trainer Henri-Alex Pantall is pondering a supplementary to the Arc for the runner-up. "I'd say we were quite unlucky there, as she took a long time to find an opening and was really flying at the finish," Pantall commented.

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"She is not in the Arc, but we will have to see," he continued. Passage of Time's connections also have a range of options. Khalid Abdullah's Racing Manager Teddy Grimthorpe said, "That was a good performance considering she had been off the track since June, and [jockey] Richard [Hughes] said the ground was probably a bit too fast for her. She could go for the Arc if it's very soft, or the G1 Prix de l'Opera on the same day. There is also the G1 Champion S. [at Newmarket Oct. 20], or the option of keeping her fresh for the G1 Breeders' Cup F/M Turf [at Monmouth Oct. 27]."

For many--including trainer Aidan O'Brien--Soldier of Fortune's emphatic nine-length success in the G1 Irish Derby came as a surprise, as it was a vast improvement on his fifth behind Authorized (Ire) in the G1 Epsom Derby June 2. What caused the turnaround is still uncertain, but the imposing bay proved again here that he is now amongst the very best of his generation, and he booked his ticket for the Arc in three weeks' time. Settled in the slipstream of his rabbit Song of Hiawatha (GB) (Sadler's Wells) by Johnny Murtagh throughout the early stages, he was angled off the rail in the middle of the false straight and sent to the front before the quarter pole. Given a tap with the whip as favored Zambezi Sun closed under Stephane Pasquier, Soldier of Fortune found extra to comfortably ward off that threat and was hand-ridden in the run to the line, while Sagara had worked his way into second. "He'll improve for the race, as he'd been off a long time," Murtagh said. "Once he got going, I gave him a smack with my left hand and he was off."

"The pacemaker did his job and got me to the two-furlong marker, and my fellow did the job in the style of a high-class horse," Murtagh continued. "He's got a great attitude and a great heart. He loved the track, but did get a bit tired in the last couple of hundred yards. It looked a solid race and, while he went on the ground, he would appreciate it slightly softer." Connections are now looking at a two-pronged offensive on the Oct. 7 G1 Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe alongside Dylan Thomas (Ire), where they will encounter a sharper Zambezi Sun. Trainer Pascal Bary said of the favorite, "He was blowing very hard afterwards and needed the race, as I had anticipated. He will come on a lot and will be back here, all being well, for the Arc." Minutes after Manduro had seen off Mandesha on his first attempt over a mile and a half in this trial for the Oct. 7 G1 Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe, gloom descended over Andre Fabre's team as the five-year-old returned lame. While the extent of the injury is not yet known, it is likely that he will not race again. In the race itself, the world's current top-rated older performer was guided to a comfortable win by regular pilot Stephane Pasquier. He settled off the steady early pace before gaining the lead and first run on Mandesha at the quarter pole, and he maintained control under hand riding as the pair drew clear. The German-bred, whose stud services have already been secured by Darley, enjoyed his easiest task of the year here, having won the G1 Prix d'Ispahan May 20, Royal Ascot's G1 Prince of Wales's S. June 20 and G1 Prix Jacques le Marois at Deauville last time Aug. 12. Manduro reigned as German's champion juvenile in 2004 after taking the G3 Preis der Winterfavoriten. He had a limited campaign at three, but returned in 2006 to take the G2 Prix d'Harcourt, and also ran second in both the G1 Prix d'Ispahan and Prix Jacques le Marois, and third in the G1 Prix du Moulin, G1 Prix Ganay and Prince of Wales's S. Essential Edge kicked off the season with back-to-back sixth-place finishes at Keeneland in April, including the GII Jenny Wiley S. She crossed the line a solid third behind Strike Softly in the GII Nassau S. June 2, then was a close fifth in the GII Dance Smartly S. July 22. Favored at 6-5 in the Belle Geste S. Aug. 25, the chestnut didn't disappoint, reporting home a three-length victress. Overlooked a bit in this spot, she broke on top from the nine hole, led by five lengths through a half mile in :47.87, but became leg weary in the stretch and was saved by the wire. "I guess they left me on the lead a bit longer than they should have," jockey Juno Jones said.

Essential Edge was purchased by Chiefswood Stables in utero at the 2002 KEENOV sale for \$1,950,000. The mare, in foal to Danzig, had previously sold at KEENOV in 2000 to Curragh Bloodstock Agency for \$1.6 million. She foaled a colt that was purchased by Shadwell for €350,000, but never raced. Prussian acheived 🍀 **"TDN Rising Star"** 🍀 status following a razor sharp 6 3/4-length wire-to-wire maiden win over the Saratoga lawn Aug. 17 and was heavily favored in this hike in class. Racing with the leaders from the git-go, Prussian tugged his way to the front on the turn for home, opened up a clear lead in the stretch and had enough left in the tank to hold Briarwood Circle safe. "He was very eager early," jockey Kent Desormeaux said. "He managed to settle. I kept him well away from the field down the backside. That helped him out tremendously. When I pulled him closer, next to the horse going into the turn, he really jumped into the bridle. It took a little bit of effort to make him wait, but when I let him go, there was a tremendous turn of foot. I think he idled a little bit, looking around. [In] the presence of the other horses, when galloping out, he got back into gear. I think there's more to come." According to trainer Bill Mott, Prussian will start next in the inaugural \$1-million Breeders' Cup Turf Juvenile Oct. 26. "I think that would be the most logical place for him to go," Mott said of the Turf Juvenile. "Obviously, he's still learning. As Kent said, he was a little anxious and jumped into the bridle maybe a little too early. The good part is, he has good tactical speed and he breaks well. For a course like Monmouth Park that would be beneficial."

Sue Vacek didn't bring a big consignment to Keeneland September, but made the trip from Florida worthwhile when a strapping Lion Heart--Whattacapote colt in her draft brought a session-topping \$440,000 yesterday. Mayberry Farm, acting on behalf of an of undisclosed

West Coast client, purchased the colt, who hails from the family of the speedy graded stakes winner Here's Zealous (Dehere). Vacek is the farm manager for John Penn's Pennston Farm, which is based in Ocala. "Coming in, I thought the horse was going to be around \$150,000, maybe \$175,000," Vacek admitted afterwards. "As the afternoon

wore on, I thought maybe \$250,000. I never thought we'd go this high." Yesterday's topper represented a big score for Pennston Farm. The operation purchased the winning Whattacapote (Capote) for \$150,000 at the 2006 Keeneland January sale, just over a month before she foaled this colt in Florida Feb. 24. Earlier this year, the mare's first foal, Forest Echoes (Forest Wildcat), was purchased by Darley for \$900,000 to top the OBS March sale. "I'd never seen the brother until OBS, and I thought, 'Wow,'" said Vacek. "And this one was always a nice foal." Forest Echoes missed the board in his debut in a Del Mar maiden event in August. The eight-year-old Whattacapote is a half-sister to GIII Gravesend H. winner Here's Zealous, as well as stakes winners There's Zealous (Broad Brush) and She's Zealous (Cozzene). Vacek said that Whattacapote aborted a foal last year and is currently in foal to Grade I winner Forest Danger. "The mare's big--she's 17 hands," said Vacek. "I think Forest Danger is an extremely attractive horse, and after I saw this guy and the brother from the Storm Cat line, I thought maybe that would be a good choice."

Vacek and Penn confer on breeding decisions. "I pick the stallions, then Mr. Penn and I go over it," she said. "He makes the final decision." Yesterday's score was Vacek's biggest ever. She previously sold a Broken Vow colt for \$225,000 at the Fasig-Tipton July sale a few years ago. Vacek has been working full-time with Pennston for five years. The farm currently boasts 26 broodmares on 170 acres. "We do a little of everything," Vacek explained. "We sell weanlings, yearlings and Mr. Penn races. Whatever we don't get sold goes to the racetrack."



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Lane's End Fillies Hot Commodities...

A mid-afternoon flourish that came by way of two Lane's End consignees helped energize the Keeneland pavilion. The spike in action was led by a Speightstown half-sister to Shaniko (A.P. Indy), who was hammered down to BBA Ireland's Eamonn Reilly, acting on behalf of an unnamed client based in Dublin, Ireland. Cata-

logued as hip 1978, the dark bay filly out of Grade II winner Sapphire n' Silk (Pleasant Tap) sold for \$360,000 to lead the way for the fairer sex. Reilly and a pair of cohorts were stationed at the back corner of the pavilion and saw off a determined foe who finally relented at Reilly's steady salvos. "She'll go in training with Jim Bolger,"

Reilly said. The filly is a half-sister to GII Kentucky Cup Classic S. winner Shaniko and a three-parts sister to stakes winner Silky Smooth (Mr. Greeley), which added to her appeal, according to Reilly. "The cross has worked before with the mare, with Mr. Greeley, another son of Gone West," said Reilly. "She looks like an early type who'll run as a two-year-old." The Irishman knows something about talented granddaughters of the Mill Ridge stallion, having bought Saoirse Abu, by Mr. Greeley, for \$260,000 at this sale in 2005. Under Bolger's tutelage, that filly has captured a pair of Group 1 races in Europe--the Phoenix S. and the Moyglare Stud S. Reilly was putting the finishing touches on a busy few days at Keeneland. In all, he purchased 19 yearlings, and a quick look at his buys confirms his affinity for the Gone West branch of Mr. Prospector. Of the 19, nine hailed from that line, not including Reilly's most expensive purchase, a Distorted Humor--Diamonds for Lil filly he bought on day one for \$550,000. Reilly concluded his spree with four Mr. Greeleys, three Speightstowns, a Proud Citizen and one Strong Hope, a grandson of Gone West. Reilly said he was buying for varied clients, but said that Bolger would train the majority of them. Hip 1978 was bred in Kentucky by William A Carl, who also bred and raced Sapphire n' Silk. Carl put the Pleasant Tap daughter through the 1997 Keeneland September sale, but bought her back for \$20,000. After her exploits on the track, Sapphire n' Silk has been equally good to Carl in the breeding shed. Shaniko, her first foal, brought \$550,000 at auction, while three others have made \$100,000 or more.

Selling just three hips prior to the top-priced mare was another Lane's End consignee in hip 1975, a blue-blooded daughter of Cherokee Run who was knocked down to Hertrich/McCarthy Live-stock for \$335,000. "We're buying for our own partnership," said Dr. Phil McCarthy, standing alongside Fred Hertrich. "We're commercial breeders, and just loved the pedigree. It's a very tough family to get into. She's a great big, beautiful physical, and that's what we're looking for." Asked who would train the filly, McCarthy replied, "We've got to

figure that out now." Typically breeding as Brilliant Stable, the duo can claim as past successes horses such as dual French Classic winner Shamardal and graded winner Even the Score. Bred by the Niarchos Family's Flaxman Holdings, Hip 1975 was produced by the Nijinsky II mare Salchow, the dam of French highweight and G1 Grand Criterium winner Way of Light (Woodman). Salchow is a granddaughter of Raise the Standard, a sister to Northern Dancer, and a daughter of the top producer Coup de Folie. Salchow's siblings include Grade I winners Coup de Genie, Machiavellian and Exit to Nowhere.

Book 3 Wrap-Up...

While yesterday's session lacked the dramatics of Saturday's, which was topped by a million-dollar horse, Book 3 closed with solid gains. A total of 288 horses exchanged hands yesterday for \$28,302,500, a 7.7 percent jump from a year ago. The session average of \$98,273 was up 8.1 percent from \$90,907 in 2006, and the median increased 11.1 percent to \$80,000. "Today was another strong day. There is a very good feel to the market; it's exciting," said Geoffrey Russell, Keeneland director of sales. "There was a strong presence of both domestic and international buyers, particularly from Argentina, Brazil and Mexico."

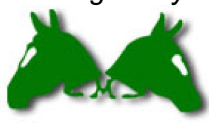

LEPRECHAUN MAKES ITS OWN LUCK

With horses like the undefeated GIII Victory Ride S. heroine La Traviata (Johannesburg) and Saturday's GI Matron S. runner-up Armonk (Mizzen Mast) as recent graduates of its juvenile pinhooking program, Mike and Britt Mulligan's Leprechaun Racing is enjoying a banner year. Or banner few years, if you choose to employ the unscientific method of listening to Keeneland announcer Kurt Becker as he trumpets a sire's accomplishments prior to a horse selling; one hears the

names of Grade I winners Adieu when an El Corredor sells, champion Fleet Indian for Indian Charlie, and Bishop Court Hill for Holy Bull. All of those runners received their early lessons on Leprechaun's Ocala, Florida farm, and Mike Mulligan admits to getting a kick out of hearing their names over Keeneland's PA system.

There are, admittedly, probably better ways to judge success. In its June 8 edition, *The Blood Horse's Market Watch* ranked yearling buyers by number of stakes winners purchased from 2000 to 2004. Leprechaun Racing sat in a tie for first with 23 stakes winners, equaling the figure of John Ferguson Bloodstock, which typically buys for Sheikh Mohammed's Darley operation.

During that stretch, Leprechaun Racing purchased 217 yearlings for an average price of \$61,729. All were offered at two-year-old in training sales. A total of 191 made the races--150 won, 57 of them as juveniles--which put Leprechaun atop the *Market Watch* list ranking two-year-old winners. Leprechaun's 23 stakes winners included six at the graded level and three (Adieu, Bishop Court Hill and Fleet Indian) in Grade I company.

Only Demi O'Byrne purchased more Grade I winners with five. Mike Ryan, Leprechaun and John Ferguson Bloodstock were tied in second.

Not bad for a former rental car executive who followed his dream of becoming a full-time horseman.

Only 15 years ago, the Brooklyn-born, Arizona-raised Mulligan was the New England regional general manager for Budget Rent A Car. Based in Florida, he owned a few race horses at Tampa Bay Downs and dabbled in pinhooking. One Britt Wadsworth, a native of Florida who was working in the horse business, sold him a horse that went on to become a winner, and it wasn't long before the two fell in love. They launched Leprechaun after marrying, and today the husband-and-wife team run one of the most respected pinhooking operations in the business.

"We learned with cheap horses and worked our way up," Mulligan said Saturday during a rare stretch of downtime. "We were buying horses for \$1,800 and selling them for \$25,000, and we were like, 'wow, this is okay.' And it's just like anything else: you do it long enough, and you get better at it."

Leprechaun has been busy reloading for the 2008 juvenile season, and through Sunday has purchased a total of six lots at Keeneland September. That includes its sole buy yesterday, a Smarty Jones--Xtreme Bid colt for \$40,000.

Mulligan said he doesn't have a set number of yearlings he'll wind up taking back to Ocala with him, but does expect to be busy examining prospects over the next few days.

Talking about Leprechaun's strategy, he commented, "We don't come up here and say we've got to spend \$1.5 million or buy a certain number of horses. It's sort of flexible, and we've got a really good group of partners. We come up and look for really good physical horses, evaluate them, vet them, and if we feel like there's an opportunity to bring those horses to the two-year-old sales and make money, then we're going to try and acquire those horses."

The process is an exhausting one that begins with the inspection of nearly every horse in the catalog.

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"At the smaller sales, my wife and I do it ourselves, but at a sale like this, we've got an excellent short-list crew," Mulligan explained. "I've got two guys for Books 1 and 2, and three for Books 3 and 4. And that gives me enough time to look at 30 or 40 horses myself during the day for the next day's session."

After putting together a short list that's typically not so short, Mulligan has his prospects vetted, which usually whittles down the list by 20 percent, he estimates. Then comes the sometimes frustrating job of actually bidding on the horses, which takes both patience and discipline.

"It depends on what sale we're at, but here, I'd say we probably get one out of every 15," said Mulligan. "So if we buy 40 horses, we'll have vetted 600."

Mulligan added, "Some horses we don't even get our hands in the air. We want to give \$200,000, and the horse brings \$600,000. We're trying to look for opportunities in the market. Maybe a horse that's in the wrong book. We got a really nice Came Home filly [hip [996](#), purchased for \$100,000] on the last day of Book 2. She was blank under her first two dams, but she was a *really* nice physical. If she was in Book 3 or 4, she would have brought more money than that."

For Leprechaun, Mulligan explains, it all comes down to how the horse in front of him looks.

"Regardless of how good the page is, if we don't like the horse physically, we're not going to buy him," he said. "To me, the pedigree just denotes how expensive it's going to get. I mean, if the mare's had 12 foals and three to the races, that's going to slow us down a little bit, but we don't have any process that overpowers the physical."

It's hard to argue with Leprechaun's success. In the summer of 2002, Leprechaun purchased a big Indian Charlie filly later named Fleet Indian out of Fasig-Tipton's Selected New York-breds sale for \$40,000. They resold her as a juvenile in training for \$230,000, and watched her win an Eclipse Award last season after capturing five graded stakes, including a pair of Grade 1s.

While that filly represented a solid if unspectacular pinhooking score, La Traviata was a blockbuster coup that seems to have worked out for everybody involved. Leprechaun acquired the daughter of Johannesburg for \$112,000 at the 2005 Fasig-Tipton July sale. Put through the following year's Calder sale, La Traviata realized \$1.1 million on Demi O'Byrne's bid, and looks worth every penny in her three starts this season. She broke her maiden by 13 1/4 lengths at Churchill on debut in June, captured Monmouth's Post Deb S. by five lengths in July and most recently won the Victory Ride by 9 1/4 lengths.

In addition to juvenile pinhooking, Leprechaun is expanding its scope a bit and yesterday played the role of yearling seller. Leprechaun purchased the winning Elusive Quality mare Elusive Road, in foal to Lion Heart, for \$75,000 at the 2005 OBS Fall sale, and saw that foal, now a handsome yearling, sell for \$170,000 to Roger Brookhouse during Sunday's sixth session.

"We've got a few mares, and we'll do some selling out of them," explained Mike Mulligan.

In the end, despite having a moniker that suggests luck, Leprechaun can attribute its success much more to hard work. By another unscientific measure--walking ring attendance--it's unusual not to see Mike Mulligan leaning against a rail in the rear of a sales pavilion, making last-minute judgements on prospects. His and Britt's perseverance is paying off, and two-year-old buyers are taking notice.

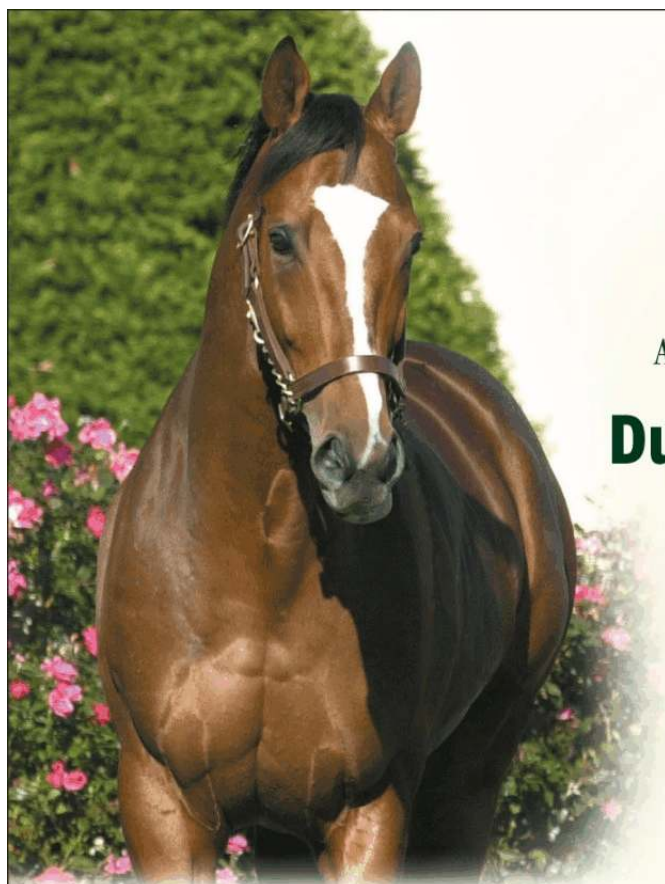
