'DYLAN' PREVAILS DESPITE DRAMA

Drama may follow Kieren Fallon wherever he goes, but the jockey came out on the right side this time after **Dylan Thomas (Ire)** (Danehill) survived a lengthy stewards' inquiry to win yesterday's G1 Prix de l'Arc de

Triomphe Lucien Barriere. Susan Magnier and Michael Tabor's four-year-old crossed the line a head in front of **Youmzain (Ire)** (Sinndar {Ire}), but connections were forced to endure many nervous moments as the "commissaires" deliberated. When the official result was finally confirmed, it

marked an impressive double for the 5-1 shot, following his victory in the G1 King George VI and Queen Elizabeth S. For Aidan O'Brien, celebrating his first Arc success, it was Fallon who shone despite his well-documented trouble out of the saddle. "He's an iron man," the Ballydoyle conditioner said. "How he can ride like that, with all the pressures on his shoulders, I don't know. What can you say about him? He's an absolute master of his craft." Arc cont. p2

Panty Raid (Include) was already a Grade I winner on the turf and yesterday the dark bay filly added a Grade I triumph over the polytrack with a half-length victory in the G1 Juddmonte Spinster S. at Keeneland. Class Will Out...

Since finishing third in the G1 Epsom Derby last year, **Dylan Thomas** has met no equal over a mile and a half, winning the G1 Irish Derby at The Curragh and returning this season to take Ascot's midsummer jewel July 28. His form over 10 furlongs is not far short, with wins in the last two renewals of the G1 Irish Champion S. at Leopardstown and in the G1 Prix Ganay here Apr. 29. The strapping bay's Achilles heel has been testing ground, and Kieren Fallon faced an anxious build-up as the recent rain appeared to swing favor towards his stable companion **Soldier of Fortune (Ire)** (Galileo {Ire}). Helped by the sunshine that bathed Longchamp in the days leading up to the main event, the horse Fallon recently acclaimed as the best he has ridden fully justified that faith. Settled in mid-division throughout the early stages as the Ballydoyle rabbits carried out their duties, he was moved wide for his rally at the top of the stretch. He veered right as he quickened passing the quarter pole, crossing in front of **Zambezi Sun (GB)** (Dansili {GB}) and **Soldier of Fortune**. Dylan Thomas put his head in front approaching the eighth pole, moved over to the rail and dug in gamely as **Youmzain** and Richard Hughes ate into his margin with every stride. "It is hard to say what this means," Fallon commented. "This is probably one of the best days of my life. He's one of my favorite horses, and I've always had a lot of faith in him." Co-owner Michael Tabor has a dilemma now as he ponders a possible tilt at the GI Breeders' Cup Turf at Monmouth Oct. 27. "He's been on the go all year and is a very special horse--this is as sweet as it gets," Tabor said. "We always knew how good he was, but on this ground it is an extra-special performance. The plan was, if he got beat here, he would hopefully go for the Breeders' Cup."

"The truth is, I asked Aidan if we should not run here, as we had **Soldier of Fortune** and the ground was not right, but he told me this horse is the type that needs to run," Tabor added. "We'll see what our plans are now, but he's a four-year-old and has done everything that's been asked of him, so I doubt he'll stay in training. Let's hope he is the successor to **Danehill**."

Closing the Gap...

Youmzain trailed Dylan Thomas by four lengths in the King George, but his connections were left wondering what might have been yesterday after the four-year-old finished with a late flourish, only to run out of real estate. "I was absolutely cruising and, just when I went for him, he got on the wrong leg, and it took him 50 yards to get into full flight," said rider Richard Hughes. "The post came too soon, but maybe Kieren's horse was pulling out more. The ground definitely made a big difference today." Trainer Mick Channon was delighted with the 80-1 shot, who surpassed expectations. "We knew he was in good heart, but being realistic we probably didn't expect him to win," Channon said. "He has to be ridden like that and I'm absolutely thrilled with him. Hopefully, he'll stay in training next year." Alan Cooper, racing manager to the Niarchos Family, was also in positive mood afterwards after **Sagara** (Sadler's Wells) finished third at 32-1. "He ran a very good race and wasn't beaten far," Cooper said. "He has been progressing all year, and [trainer] Jonathan Pease and [jockey] Thierry Gillet have done a superb job with him." The G1 Epsom Derby and G1 Juddmonte International S. winner **Authorized (Ire)** (Montjeu {Ire}) was sent off the 11-10 favorite, but, after being detached in rear early by Frankie Dettori, found little when asked to quicken at the top of the stretch and trailed in 10th. "Right from the start, I wasn't getting a good feel from him," Dettori explained. "He had trouble negotiating the turn, and has shown he's not at ease on a right-handed track. I knew from over four furlongs from home that I was beaten and it is disappointing, but you win some and lose some. We have not seen the real **Authorized**."

Panty Raid won the GII Black-Eyed Susan S. over Pimlico's conventional dirt track in May and moved to the turf to capture the July 7 GI American Oaks. She moved back to the dirt for a dull fifth-place effort in the Aug. 18 GI Alabama S. A stalking fifth on the all-weather, the strapping bay was four wide into the lane to take dead aim on Alabama victoress Lady Joanne. She took charge with a furlong to run while drifting out and outfinished the game favorite. "She was all there," said winning jockey Garrett Gomez. "My main concern was around the first turn, just getting her off the bridle a little bit and she traveled really well for me." As for a possible Breeders' Cup start, trainer Todd Pletcher said, "The filly will tell us if she wants to come back in 20 days. The other question is what surface to run on, because she would fit in either the Filly and Mare Turf or the Distaff." Lady Joanne set the pace through moderate splits under snug restraint from Calvin Borel. "She ran good," Borel said. "No excuses. That was a real nice horse in front of her. I wish there had been some more pace. We were going very slow. She dug in and kept trying and trying." Defending Spinster champ Asi Siempre (El Prado {Ire}) will be retired after her fifth-place effort yesterday. "It's time for her to go be a mamma," trainer Patrick Biancone said.

Idiot Proof barely looked like he took a deep breath while flying to a 7 1/4-length win in the GIII Jersey Shore Breeders' Cup S., covering the six furlongs in 1:07 2/5, but the bay colt fell back to earth with a well-beaten third-place finish in the Aug. 10 Real Good Deal S. last time out. Idiot Proof raced close to pacesetting Bordonaro (Memo {Chi}) through fractions of :21.69, :43.87 and :55.28. He gained command at midstretch and then held off the late charge of Greg's Gold. "When Bordonaro made the lead, I was okay with that because I could see he was being asked," explained winning jockey David Flores. "When [Bordonaro] got out going to the far turn, Greg's Gold tried to sneak through there. He's at the top of his game right now and he likes Monmouth. I think this race is going to get him where he needs to be." Favored Greg's Gold was forced to wait for racing room on the turn and into the stretch. He bullied his way between foes and was closing late. "For a minute, it kind of opened up and then closed right up again," explained Victor Espinoza. "It's one of those things--if I get lucky, I get through and win the race, but not today." Tough Tiz's Sis capped off a short juvenile campaign with a 6 1/4-length maiden score at Hawthorne Park in December, and was sold to Cathy Watson and Paul Weitzman of Tucson by owner/breeder Gary Tussey after that performance. Shipped to trainer Bob Baffert, she opened her sophomore season with a second in an optional claimer at Santa Anita Jan. 25. The bay followed up with victories in an optional claiming test Feb. 25 and Sunland Park's WinStar Oaks Mar. 18, earning herself a trip to Louisville. A 23-1 shot in the May 4 GI Kentucky Oaks, she had a rough start, was caught in traffic and never factored, finishing seventh. Tough Tiz's Sis rebounded when trying all-weather for the first time in the June 10 GII Hollywood BC Oaks, cruising to a 3 1/2-length triumph, before hitting the road once again. The three-year-old tried her luck at a mile and a quarter in the Aug. 18 GI Alabama S. at Saratoga, but weakened to be sixth after setting the early pace. She fared somewhat better in the Sept. 15 GI Gazelle S. at Belmont, pressing the pace and holding on to be third behind Lear's Princess and Rags to Riches, and signaled her readiness to take on her elders with a bullet half in :46 Oct. 1. Jockey Victor Espinoza opted to press favored Hystericalady through a half in :48.54 and six panels in 1:12.11. The crowd's choice still had the advantage as they straightened for home and she dug in gamely in the final furlong, but Tough Tiz's Sis lived up to her name to get her nose in front on the line. The winner is not Breeders' Cup eligible, and it has not yet been decided if she will be supplemented, but Baffert said, "She worked really incredible the other day. Even Victor told me, 'She never worked like that.' I think she's finally coming around. She's blooming and her hair looks much better...I think today was her breakout race." Stage three came at Deauville's festival, and she kept to the script by winning the Aug. 19 G2 Prix Jean Romanet, but she had connections holding their breath here before delivering a last-gasp lunge to bring the best-laid plan to fruition.

Reserved towards the rear early, the chestnut was temporarily short of room with a quarter mile remaining and surrendered first run to Promising Lead. Gaining momentum when

in the clear, she showed tenacity to inhale that foe in the final stride as Legerete closed to her outer. "She has been prepared specifically for this all year and Thierry [Thulliez] rode a beautiful race,"

her conditioner said. Last year,

Satwa Queen took in the G1 Breeders' Filly & Mare Turf, where she was fifth, and the G1 Hong Kong Cup, running sixth, but only the latter option at Sha Tin Dec. 9 is in de Roualle's mind this time. "She might go to Hong Kong now if she is invited, and she is five now, so that has to be respected," he added. "She has won her Group 1, so will probably be retired at the end of the year, and we're thinking of breeding from her."

Coral Pritchard-Gordon, representing Sir Michael Stoute, trainer of runner-up Promising Lead, said, "She has run a blinder and we couldn't be happier. It is always disappointing to get beaten, but she ran her heart out."

smooth progress on the bri-
dle to lead with 300 meters remaining and was ridden
out to score in comfortable style. "Frankie kept him
close [to the pace] in a good position, and that's what
the horse likes," said winning trainer Saeed bin Suroor.
"I think the mile of the [G1 2000] Guineas will be the
target for him, but we'll keep all options open." As for
his immediate plans, Godolphin Racing Manager Simon
Crisford said, "We'll see what Sheikh Mohammed
wants to do. He's in the G1 Dewhurst S. [at
Newmarket Oct. 20], but it's only two weeks away,
which might come a little quick for him. He takes his
races so well that we'll reserve that judgment until the
end of next week." Regarding long-term ambitions,
Crisford continued, "He'll certainly go a mile and a
quarter as he is so switched off and relaxed. Whether
he'll go a mile and a half we don't know, but he's from
a stoutly bred Argentinian family, and there's no reason
why he won't get the [Epsom] Derby trip."

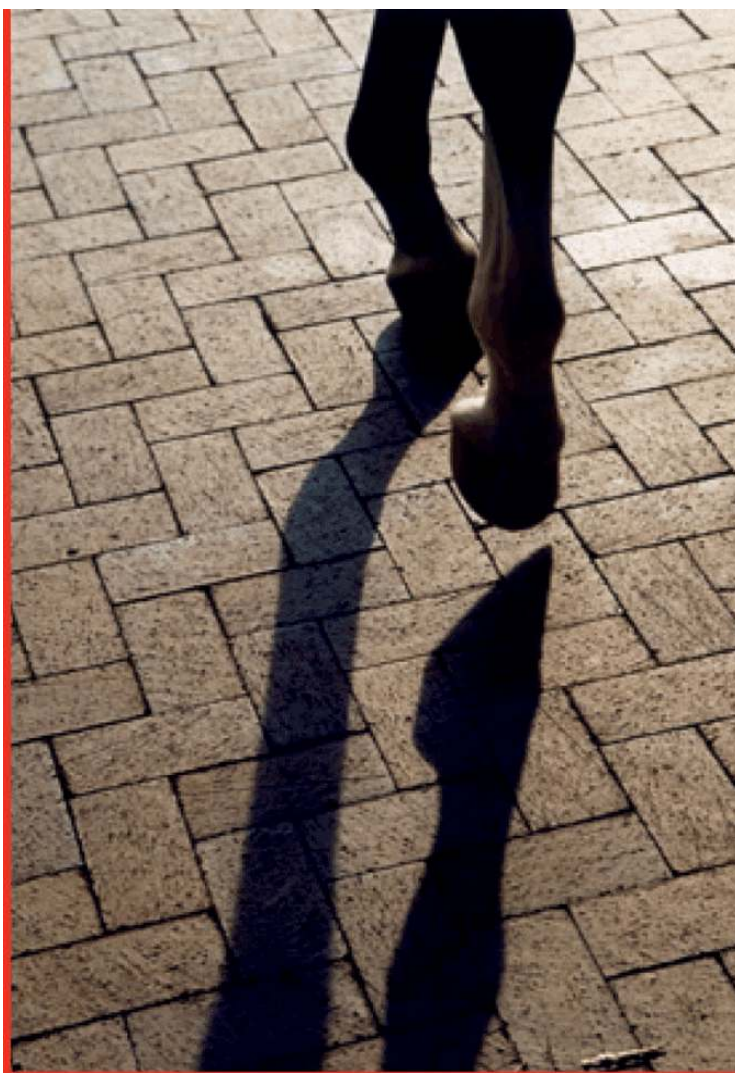

fancy Gipson Dessert (Orientate) was scratched after
breaking out of the gate and running loose, but that
incident did not detract from a high-class performance
by Zarkava once the race got underway. The Aga Khan
homebred burst onto the scene with a two-length
maiden victory over course and distance Sept. 9 and
gained the ☆ **"TDN Rising Star"** ☆ stamp of ap-
proval for that effort. Her connections were persuaded
to supplement the bay for this contest after a bristling
workout last week and, belying inexperience, she justi-
fied the €18,000 outlay with a hugely impressive dis-
play. Reserved off the pace in seventh from the outset,
Zarkava inched closer approaching the home turn, but
was caught in a pocket in early stretch. Angled out
once finding a gap approaching the final furlong, she
engaged turbo in the closing stages to overhaul pace-
setter Conference Call inside the last 100 meters.
Jockey Christophe Soumillon had further cause for
concern nearing the line when Zarkava launched her-
self, Dayjur-style, over the shadow of the post, but the
Belgian held tight to keep the partnership intact. "We
decided to supplement her for the race after her last
serious piece of work [Tuesday]," said trainer Alain de
Royer-Dupre. "We were worried two furlongs out as
she didn't have a gap, but her class overcame it. She'll
not run again this season, and she will go for the G1
Poule d'Essai des Pouliches next year." His Highness
The Aga Khan added, "It's a nice story as fifth dam
Petite Etoile produced only one filly, who was named
Zahra, so one can see genetics sometimes rely on sta-
ble connections!"

In his only previous trip to Longchamp, Benbaun finished 10th in the 2005 Abbaye, but the Curragh specialist erased the memory of that effort with this landmark success. Closing last year with a third in the G1 Hong Kong Sprint in December, he came back to bag the G3 Greenlands S. at The Curragh May 26, and suffered a burst blood vessel in his only loss this term, finishing 10th in the G2 King's Stand S. at Royal Ascot June 19. The bay rebounded with a third straight G3 Flying Five S. success at The Curragh Sept. 2 and lined up here off a score in the Sept. 15 G3 Renaissance S. Benbaun immediately secured a handy spot just behind the front rank. Pushed to the fore at the distance, he was not for catching thereafter and powered to the line for a comfortable win. "That was unbelievable; he's done nothing wrong this year and his form is still improving," said winning trainer Mark Wallace. "We've looked after him, and he's repaid us. I was concerned about the ground, but [jockey] Pat [Smullen] walked the track and told me it wasn't that soft, so we decided to give it a go. He's going out in a field for a couple of weeks, then we're going to the G1 Hong Kong Sprint [at Sha Tin Dec. 9]. We might go to Australia for the G1 Coolmore Lightning S. [at Flemington Feb. 2] after that." Runner-up Kingsgate Native, bidding to become the first juvenile winner since Sigy in 1978, was unable to reel in Benbaun. "The winner always had me, but we had a lot of good horses behind us," said jockey Jimmy Quinn. "He coped with the ground, but would be better on a quicker surface...he'll be able to win it next year." While all eyes were focused on Yeats in the hope that he could complete a lap of honor for Ballydoyle and Kieren Fallon, it was Le Miracle who staged the upset after a tussle with Varevees. The gelding stepped onto the stayers' scene with success in last year's G3 Prix Gladiateur here and quickly established himself as a major force in the division, finishing third in this contest last year in his 2006 finale. He hadn't visited the winner's enclosure this season, but finished third to Yeats in the G1 Ascot Gold Cup at the Royal meeting June 21. After a failed try at middle distances when down the field in this venue's G2 Prix Maurice de Nieuil, he was a respectable fourth in the Aug. 19 G2 Prix Kergorlay at Deauville. Coming here off a third to Varevees in this year's renewal of the Gladiateur Sept. 16, the dark bay settled in fifth off the slow initial gallop before being taken to the front by halfway. Varevees emerged as the main challenger as Yeats failed to threaten, but Le Miracle would not be denied in yet another pulsating finish on the day. "This is a dream come true," trainer Werner Baltromei said. "He worked superbly this week and I was very confident, although nobody would have believed that beforehand. Dominique [Boeuf] gave him a superb ride, and he is such a solid horse. He will probably stay in training next year and follow the same program, but first there is the [Oct. 28] G1 Prix Royal-Oak here." Varevees' conditioner Joel Boissard had been expecting to be racing for a place only, but the result came as a surprise. "I expected to be beaten by Yeats, so to beat him and still lose out to Le Miracle is a miracle in itself," Boissard commented. "In another stride she would have won, and has proved her class again. "[Trainer] Pascal [Bary] said she had a hard race, so she won't run again this year," Grimthorpe said. "She ran very well, but we were beaten by a daughter of Zamindar, so it is still a good result." Zamindar, a full brother to Juddmonte's now-deceased champion Zafonic, returned to Banstead Manor after a stint in Florida. "I told them he was going easy, even though they were going fast. I told them :22 and :44 is fast, but he took the lead when everyone else was off the bridle. He's a fast horse." Winning jockey Mike Luzzi was impressed with his mount's patience. "I don't want to call it rating, but he wasn't running off with me," Luzzi commented. "He finishes, too, it's not like he just beats everybody to it. If someone came to him, I still think he would fight them off. He just loves the game. He loves the running." As for what is next for Daaher, McLaughlin said, "The Breeders' Cup Dirt Mile [Oct. 26] is a possibility. The [Oct. 27 GIII] Pegasus is another possibility." KEENELAND STAKES WINNERS EYE CUP The winners of Saturday's stakes races at Keeneland came out of their races in good order and connections are considering future stakes engagements. **Wicked Style** (Macho Uno), winner of the GI Lane's End Breeders' Futurity, will likely tackle the dirt in the GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile at Monmouth. "He came back very good," confirmed trainer Rusty Arnold. Unbeaten in three starts, including the Sept. 1 GIII Arlington-Washington Futurity, Wicked Style has never raced on a conventional dirt surface. "My horse will go in the race with never running on a dirt track and people will look at it and think I tried to keep him off the dirt, but that is just the way it worked out," Arnold explained. **Purim** (Dynaformer) won Saturday's GI Shadwell Turf Mile, part of the Breeders' Cup "Win and You're In Challenge," but trainer Tom Proctor wasn't committing to a trip to Monmouth. "He seems fine this morning," Proctor said. As for a Breeders' Cup decision, Proctor said, "We will give it a week." GII First Lady S. winner **Vacare** (Lear Fan) may also skip the Breeders' Cup. "She came back in very good order and we'll discuss options for her next start after we see how she is next week," said Christophe Lorieul, assistant to trainer Christophe Clement. "She's not a big filly, so the three weeks to the Breeders' Cup may be a bit close to her. She may instead go to the [Nov. 25 GI] Matriarch at Hollywood."

THE TIN MAN POSSIBLE FOR THE CUP The Tin Man (Affirmed), second in Saturday's GI Clement L. Hirsch Turf Championship, could make his next start in the Oct. 27 GI Breeders' Cup Turf. "He came back real well," trainer Richard Mandella said of the nine-year-old veteran. "The Breeders' Cup is a consideration, but it's not as big a deal as if he was four or five and a stallion that could have a career at stud. It's more what's best for him. We'll size it up. The Breeders' Cup is under consideration, but it's not a sure thing."

STATEMENT FROM TRAINER PATRICK BIANCONI REGARDING HIS ONE-YEAR SUSPENSION BY THE KENTUCKY HORSE RACING AUTHORITY

I am profoundly disappointed, but not surprised, by the Stewards' Ruling issued against me [Friday] morning. Since the search of my barns at Keeneland Race Course and the Keeneland Training Center on June 22, 2007, when certain information was leaked to the media, I have been tried and convicted in the press and am well aware of pressures from certain elements of the industry to make an example out of me before all the facts were known and I had an opportunity to defend myself. I have remained silent rather than attempt to argue my case and defend myself in the media pending a hearing.

When the investigators searched my barns on the morning of June 22, 2007, a number of medications (mostly vaccines) and injectable solutions were discovered in a barn I occupy at Keeneland Training Center. None of these substances were mine. The uncontroverted evidence from the investigation was that a cooler containing vaccines was placed in a refrigerator in that barn the morning of the search by Dr. Rod Stewart, one of my veterinarians. Dr. Stewart had also apparently arranged to have certain injectables and medications for another client delivered to my barn that morning.

A search of the cooler revealed, in addition to the vaccines, three bottles of alpha-cobra toxin (snake venom). It is the discovery of these vials in my barn that has caused so much controversy. No needles or syringes were found in any of my barns. I had absolutely no knowledge whatsoever that the cooler had been placed in my barn that morning, that the cooler contained vials of snake venom, or that a delivery of drugs to my barn that morning had been arranged by Dr. Stewart.

I first became aware of this situation while the search was being conducted and, as I understand it, Dr. Stewart immediately took full responsibility for the presence of these substances in my barn.

Since the moment this investigation commenced, I have fully cooperated with the Kentucky [Horse] Racing Authority. I voluntarily and immediately furnished to them my training records, my computer, and anything else they requested. My staff was interviewed. I was never interviewed. I have had no contact with Dr. Stewart since the search. In an effort to prove my innocence from the insinuation that I use snake venom, and of my awareness of the medications and substances found in my barn, I submitted to a polygraph examination, suggested by and submitted to the Stewards at the hearing. The polygraph examination found that I was truthful and not deceptive in regards to my lack of knowledge that the cooler and medications and substances had been placed in my barn on June 22, 2007, and as to my use of cobra venom or its use on my behalf.

I must fight to restore my reputation and to ensure that the facts and truth are told. I hope that as this matter proceeds, I will be accorded some degree of fairness. Accordingly, I will appeal the Stewards' Ruling.

FALLON PREPARES FOR COURT ORDEAL Less than 24 hours after steering Dylan Thomas (Ire) to success in the G1 Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe, Kieren Fallon will appear at the Old Bailey in London as the well-documented alleged race-fixing trial gets underway today. After a series of delays, the jury will finally begin to hear evidence in the trial on a charge of conspiracy to defraud, to which Fallon and his five co-defendants have pleaded not guilty. For Coolmore's retained rider, the landmark victory in the Longchamp showpiece was the ultimate tonic. "I've waited a long time for this--it's been a long year," he told *Racing Post*. "I am going through a lot of stuff at the moment, and it is going to take time before it is all resolved. The likes of John Magnier, Michael Tabor and Derrick Smith --for what they have done for me, I owe them so much. Without them, I wouldn't be in the game anymore. I would have packed it in a long time ago. What's happened has affected my confidence and it has affected me all year. At moments like this, I feel I have repaid some of that trust."
