'WARRIOR' WORKS AT BELMONT

Kinsman Stable, Derrick Smith and Michael Tabor's **Majestic Warrior** (A.P. Indy), who left his connections scratching their heads when he ran sixth by 14 lengths as the favorite in the Oct. 6 GI Champagne S., was on the worktab for the first time since that race yesterday. The Bill Mott-trained colt worked an easy three furlongs in :38.26 at Belmont. "I just wanted to see him

move," Mott explained to *Daily Racing Form*. "It wasn't a serious move by any means. He seemed to be moving well. He looked fine. I was concerned in the Champagne that he got off his left lead so early. He got off his left lead before the three-eighths pole, which is very unusual. Basic Training 101 would tell you he was uncomfortable if he's doing that. But we haven't discovered any serious issues." Mott told the publication that Majestic Warrior, an impressive winner of the GI Hopeful S. in August, was not a definite for the GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile and that he would make a final decision after sending the colt out to a more serious work Monday. "The nice thing is I'm not getting pressure from anyone connected to the horse to run," Mott said. "If he's good, and I think he's good, I've got the green light. Everybody's been very supportive. If I don't want to run, I don't have to run. If he's not training well, he won't run."

BIANCONE SUSPENDED FOR SIX MONTHS

The Kentucky Horse Racing Authority has announced that trainer Patrick Biancone's license has been suspended for six months, beginning Nov. 1, in a settlement of a case regarded state medication regulations. He has also agreed not to seek a racing license in any jurisdiction for an additional six months, from May 1-Oct. 31, 2008. The suspension is in response to items seized during a search of Biancone's barns at Keeneland in June. "The loss of a trainer's license, for what is effectively a one-year period, is a serious penalty and supports the decision by the state racing stewards," said William Street, KHRA chairman. Biancone had appealed the original one-year suspension issued by the stewards. While Biancone's suspension does not begin until Nov. 1, Francois Parisel will be named trainer of record for the seven horses pre-entered by Biancone in the Breeders' Cup at Monmouth Oct. 26-27: Baroness Thatcher, F/M Sprint; Cosmonaut, Mile; Danzon, F/M Turf; Irish Smoke, Juvenile Fillies; La Traviata, F/M Sprint/Sprint; Nownownow, Juvenile Turf; and Slew's Tiznow, Juvenile. During his suspension, Biancone will be permitted to serve as a bloodstock agent, consultant or manager, and will be allowed in public areas at race tracks. While he can attend auctions in Kentucky, the French-born conditioner will not be permitted to attend the April 2008 Keeneland Sale of Two-Year-Olds in Training. Biancone issued a statement in response to the settlement. "It is now time to move on," the statement read. "I offered and accepted the settlement because I wanted to do what is best for racing, a sport that I love. Most importantly, I wanted to resolve this matter before the Breeders' Cup. Breeders' Cup is a celebration of our sport's greatest athletes--the horses--and their breeders and owners...I do not want to cast a cloud over racing's most important day." Parisel will take over Biancone's Kentucky string, while his West Coast-based horses will be transferred to Chris Crow.

GOTTCHA GOLD WORKS FOR DIRT MILE

Centaur Farm's local runner **Gottcha Gold** (Coronado's Quest) yesterday put forth his final serious work in advance of next Friday's \$1 million Breeders' Cup Dirt Mile at Monmouth Park. The four-year-old breezed five furlongs in a bullet 1:00 2/5 with jockey Chuck Lopez in the irons. It was the best of 11 works at the distance. Gottcha Gold galloped out six furlongs in 1:13 3/5. "Perfect," said trainer Eddie Plesa Jr., who added that he caught his charge in :59 4/5. "He did it just the way I wanted."

As far as I'm concerned, he's ready to roll." Gottcha Gold, a winner of five of eight at Monmouth, heads into the Mile as an intriguing longshot, having upset Lawyer Ron in the GIII Salvator Mile H. before adding the GIII Iselin H. in his next outing at the Oceanport oval.

STREET SENSE SCHEDULED TO ARRIVE TODAY

Jim Tafel's GI Kentucky Derby and GI Travers S. hero **Street Sense** (Street Cry {Ire}) is scheduled to arrive at Monmouth this morning after a van ride from trainer Carl Nafzger's base at Churchill Downs. Street Sense will be the first GI Breeders' Cup Classic contender to arrive at Monmouth. GI Goodwood S. winner **Tiago** (Pleasant Tap) is scheduled to arrive Saturday along with a large California contingent. **Curlin** (Smart Strike), now at Keeneland, is due in Tuesday, while **George Washington (Ire)** (Danehill) will also arrive Tuesday with the Aidan O'Brien-trained horses coming from Ireland. **Awesome Gem** (Awesome Again) arrives with another California group on Wednesday.

ALL MAJOR ADW PLATFORMS SIGNED FOR BC; HONG KONG TO SIMULCAST MILE

Breeders' Cup Ltd. announced yesterday that all major Account Deposit Wagering platforms have signed on in advance of the Breeders' Cup World Championships, including TVG, Youbet, America Tab, Express Bet, and RGS. The Breeders' Cup simulcast will reach more than 10,000 wagering outlets worldwide, the Breeders' Cup said, including all major U.S. racetracks, off-track betting locations and casinos. Last year, the total handle on the Breeders' Cup was \$140,332,198.

"We are very pleased with the overall distribution of the Championships," said Kenneth E. Kirchner, simulcast consultant for Breeders' Cup. "All of the major racetracks and account wagering service providers are on board for simulcasting and wagering. With the outstanding fields assembled, the fans can look forward to high payouts and plenty of action."

For the first time, the Hong Kong Jockey Club will offer its racing fans the opportunity to watch and wager on a Breeders' Cup Championship race, the \$2 million G1 Breeders' Cup Mile. Hong Kong is only permitted to import 10 races per year, and the Mile will be the first race from North America ever to be wagered upon by Hong Kong bettors.

"Our simulcasting into Hong Kong represents many years of effort and our new alliance with the Hong Kong Jockey Club is certain to expose the Breeders' Cup brand to new markets in Asia," Kirchner added.

Wagering on the 11 Breeders' Cup races includes substantial international distribution for the common pool include the following countries: Canada, United Kingdom, Ireland, Netherlands, France, Germany, Austria, Switzerland, Monaco, South Africa, Kenya, Panama, St. Kitts, St. Thomas, Venezuela, Uruguay, Brazil and Peru.

"The Breeders' Cup is truly the epitome of an international racing event and we are proud of the outstanding coverage and interest globally in the event," Kirchner continued.

Additional separate pool countries will include: Mexico, Australia, South Africa, France, Bermuda, Trinidad/Tobago, Jamaica and Argentina.

EMIRATES AIRLINE CHAMPION S.

Aidan O'Brien yesterday spoke of his two contenders **Mount Nelson** and **Eagle Mountain**, both of whom are returning from breaks in this contest. The former has not been seen on the track since his success in the G1 Criterium International at Saint-Cloud last October, but his conditioner is happy with his progress in recent weeks. "He's had a few hold-ups, nothing major but a series of niggling problems that seem to be sorted out now," he told *sportinglife.com*. "I'm really happy with him, he has been working well and is ready to race." Of the G1 Epsom Derby runner-up Eagle Mountain, who comes here off a 69-day absence following his win in the G2 Royal Whip at The Curragh, he said, "Eagle Mountain is in good form and I'm looking forward to running him. He should run a big race. I'm hoping the going won't be too extreme, but they both handle a little bit of cut in the ground and good-to-soft would be ideal." Mickey Fenton is reacquainted with last year's G1 1000 Guineas heroine **Speciosa** and she needs to rebound from a disappointing effort when down the field in the G1 Falmouth S. here a fortnight ago. "She seems well and is as fit as a flea," he commented. "She was in a bit of a funny mood the last day at Newmarket--she got very hot and sweaty and never felt like she was going to do anything. A mile and a quarter seems to be her trip these days and it could be her last run, so I'd love to see her in the first four." Newmarket's Director of Racing Michael Prosser gave an update on the ground yesterday, which remains soft after Tuesday's heavy rainfall. "There's marginal improvement since yesterday, as you would expect at this time of year following two dry and sunny days," he said. "I am leaving it as officially soft, though there is every chance that it will change to soft, good-to-soft in places by the time we start racing tomorrow."

Godolphin may scratch **Rio de la Plata** if the ground remains soft, the *Racing Post* revealed yesterday. Despite the confirmation of the G1 Prix Jean-Luc Lagardere winner yesterday, connections will see what the track is riding like before committing him to a rematch with his G1 National S. conqueror **New Approach**. "All being well, he'll run but obviously there is a doubt," Racing Manager Simon Crisford told the trade daily. "As we made clear after his last run, he wouldn't want it soft. We will see how the track rides on Friday and walk the course. We had a lot of rain, so let's hope it dries out." Aidan O'Brien scratched three of his four possibles yesterday, leaving Susan Magnier and Michael Tabor's **Greatwallofchina** as the sole representative. He needs to improve off his sixth in the Jean-Luc Lagardere to provide his trainer with a second renewal following the exploits of Rock of Gibraltar (Ire) six years ago. Outsiders Tout Seul (Ire) and Milk it Mick (GB) claimed some notable scalps in 2002 and 2003, respectively, but it will take a leap of the imagination to see **Dubai Meydan** record an upset. Third in a Warwick maiden on his sole start Oct. 2, he is saddled by Gay Kelleway who told the *Post*, "The owners want to run in the Dewhurst so we will go there, but he has never been better in his life--he's like a lion."

Just when I thought I was out, they pull me back in.

Glen Bromagen, owner of Ashbrook Farm, left the horse business in the 1990s when trainer Rusty Arnold moved his barn to New York. When Arnold decided to return to Kentucky last year, Bromagen felt it was time for a comeback. The 75-year-old focused on the commodities business during his time away from the game.

"I had decided that I wanted to get back into the business, and Rusty had been my trainer before," said Bromagen, who races under the Ashbrook Farm banner. "He was going to be around instead of being in New York."

Ashbrook Farm--a cattle farm in Woodford County, Kentucky--resurfaced at Arlington Park this past July with an unraced son of 2000 GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile S. hero Macho Uno. The chestnut, named Wicked Style, reported home a 1 1/2-length winner that day and went on to add the GIII Arlington-Washington Futurity in game fashion Sept. 1. He made it three-for-three with an 11-1 upset in the GI Lane's End Breeders' Futurity at Keeneland Oct. 6 and will make his dirt debut in the Oct. 27 GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile.

"You have to calm me down talking to you right now," said Bromagen, who also owns three other horses in partnership. "It's awfully exciting to have the kids here. They were all here for the race, and we had a great time."

Although Wicked Style was purchased at the OBS April two-year-old in training sale, Bromagen said he doesn't have a preference in two-year-old sales over yearling sales. Bromagen added that Arnold picked out Wicked Style and that he wasn't present at the sale.

So when did Bromagen first get involved in Thoroughbred ownership? "Around Pearl Harbor, I think," Bromagen joked. "I think it was back in the 70s."

During his first stint, Bromagen campaigned Tricky Creek, a MGSW of \$873,288. The bay rattled off wins in the 1988 GII Kentucky Jockey Club S., the 1989 GIII Omaha Gold Cup S. and GII Discovery H. and the 1990 GII Nassau County H. Tricky Creek came within a nose of becoming a Grade I winner when second in the 1990 GI Iselin H. at Monmouth Park.

"He was probably the best one I've owned," Bromagen said of Tricky Creek.

WOOD'S EDGE BEGINS WITH LATENT HEAT

The O'Callaghan family's Woods Edge Farm, a leading consignor in recent years, announced yesterday that it will stand its first U.S. stallion in the form of Grade I winner **Latent Heat**

(Maria's Mon--True Flare, by Capote), who retires to the Lexington-based operation for the 2008 season. He will stand for a fee of \$15,000 as the property of a syndicate. Woods Edge has sister farms in Ireland, Yeomanstown and Morristown Lattin Studs, which currently stand five stallions, including

G1 Epsom Derby winner Kris Kin (GB). "We are delighted to have a horse of his caliber as our first stallion," commented Peter O'Callaghan, head of Woods Edge's Kentucky base. "He has all of the important ingredients that are necessary for today's breeders: a high-class racehorse with great natural speed, good looks and a beautiful pedigree to back it up."

O'Callaghan continued, "Additionally, Latent Heat offers breeders a much needed outcross, especially in light of the unfortunate and premature loss of his highly regarded sire." The four-year-old Latent Heat was bred and raced by Juddmonte Farms and trained by Bobby Frankel. The colt's biggest victory came in last year's seven-furlong GI Malibu S., won in near-record time of 1:21 flat ([video](#)). He added the GII San Carlos H. ([video](#)) earlier this year. Latent Heat won or placed in nine of 12 starts and earned in excess of \$450,000. Latent Heat hails from one of Juddmonte's best families. Out of MGSW True Flare, a half to five stakes winners, he is a half to graded winners Indian Flare and Art Master.

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A BRIEF HISTORY OF THE DEWHURST

Conceived by Tom Gee in 1875 and named after his Sussex Stud, the Dewhurst S. has come to occupy a cherished place in the hearts of British racing fans. That is partly due to its timing, serving as a championship crescendo at the end of a long season of build-up. But it is due also to its ability to act as a promise of great things.

Since the inception of the International Classifications--now known as the World Thoroughbred Rankings--in 1977, winners of the Newmarket endgame to have been crowned champion juvenile include El Gran Senor, Zafonic, Alhaarth (Ire), Shamardal and Teofilo (Ire) and before that the Dewhurst's honor roll included the likes of Nijinsky, Mill Reef, Grundy (Ire) and The Minstrel.

Recently, Pennekamp in 1994 and Rock of Gibraltar (Ire) seven years later went on to garner the G1 2000 Guineas the following season. The 2004 hero Shamardal tasted success in the G1 Poule d'Essai des Poulains (French 2000 Guineas) the next term, at the close of which Sir Percy (GB) took this before going on to a G1 Epsom Derby victory. Who knows what last year's victor Teofilo would have achieved were it not for injury and it is remarkable that the memorable battle with Holy Roman Emperor (Ire) here 12 months ago was to prove the last sighting of that duo on a race-track.

John Porter saddled seven winners in the early days, including the great Ormonde in 1885, who was the first to go on to land the British Triple Crown with Nijinsky being the last to do so in 1970.

Other trainers with multiple wins are Alec Taylor with six editions and more recently Vincent O'Brien with seven.

Of the jockeys, Lester Piggott holds the enviable record of 10 successes aboard the likes of Crepello (GB), Nijinsky, The Minstrel and Diesis (GB). Pat Eddery boasts six editions, having partnered some of the race's best in Grundy, El Gran Senor and Zafonic. Of the riders still around, Michael Hills has the best tally of four winners since Huntingdale (Ire) opened the scoring in 1985.

On a quirkier note, the last filly to succeed remains Torbella III (Fr) in 1957, though few have attempted it, while the 1877 winner Pilgrimage actually won both the 1000 and 2000 Guineas at the track the following year. There have been only two dead-heats in the race, the latter coming courtesy of Prince of Dance (Ire) and Scenic (Ire) in 1988; Generous (Ire) returned the biggest price since the war when winning at 50-1 in 1990 en route to his Epsom Derby triumph and Nijinsky remains the shortest-priced winner since the war at 1-3, when only two rivals went to post in 1969.

Its enduring legacy as a precursor to greatness owes much to deep renewals such as the 1983 edition, when Robert Sangster's El Gran Senor defeated Khalid Abdullah's Rainbow Quest by a half-length, with the pair clear of the G1 Prix Morny winner Siberian Express. The first two returned the following spring to contest the Guineas, with Vincent O'Brien's giant easily confirming the form and keeping Chief Singer (Ire), Lear Fan and that rival safely at bay. It was a year ago on Thursday that the racing world lost El Gran Senor, but his legacy will live long in the memory of Newmarket's turfistes.

UPTICK IN NEWMARKET

After impressive 18 percent gains in gross and number sold at Tattersalls' flagship four-day October 1 Yearling Sale last week--followed by an equally impressive 18 percent gain in gross and 15 percent gain in average at its two-day October Book 2 sale on Tuesday and Wednesday this week--it now looks as though the 2007 North American and European yearling markets will very nearly match last year's record totals. Through the end of last week, we calculated that 9,963 horses had sold so far at second-half calendar-year sales, beginning with the Fasig-Tipton July Yearling Sale.

They've grossed an estimated \$787,645,090, an average of \$79,057. This is three percent more horses than had sold at the corresponding sales last year (9,670 horses), which grossed \$800,354,355, and averaged \$82,767; compared to last year, the gross is down two percent, the average down four percent.

That's far from the whole story, though. Last year, at Keeneland September, Goffs Million, and Tattersalls October 1, John Ferguson signed for 62 yearlings for Sheikh Mohammed, costing a total of \$77,945,000--an average of \$1,257,178 per horse. This year, at the same three sales, he signed for 44 yearlings, costing a total of \$29,509,000, and averaging \$670,659. Ferguson signed for 29 percent fewer horses this year, with a 62 percent drop in gross yearling spend and a 47 percent drop in average. So Sheikh Mohammed spent roughly \$47.5 million less on yearlings this year, of which about \$40 million of the drop came in Keeneland September Book 1, causing that book to drop 20 percent in gross and 25 percent in average.

After Book 1, though, as you'll remember, every single remaining session at Keeneland September was up. Goffs' two sales dipped by single figures from 2006, but it has to be remembered their gross doubled between 2004-2006. Then, last week, the Tattersalls October 1 sale got stronger as it went along, culminating in the new world record price for a yearling filly of 2.5 million guineas (over \$5.25-million), paid by new British owner Craig Bennett, through agent Charlie Gordon-Watson. Three things were particularly striking about the sale. First, several new buyers at the top, including significant domestic British, as well as fledgling Irish and even Spanish operations. The housing markets are undoubtedly 'correcting,' but the stock markets are still flying, and there is simply a lot of new wealth in circulation. Thankfully, some of it is finding its way into the horse business.

Watch for His First Weanlings at Keeneland November

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For years Tattersalls has struggled to get the main body of domestic British trainers to even attend, much less buy at, their premier sale. It was no doubt helped by a strong final day, but I thought the four-day, alphabetical-by-dam format worked very well. It was discussed whether Keeneland September, already a four-day first week, might be better in a similar format; the success of last week's sale at Tattersalls suggests it's an idea Keeneland may want to look at more seriously.

The third striking aspect of the sale, I thought, was the success of Tattersalls' £2.2 million sales race push, and their unique Betfair/Timeform sponsorship. The impact of both was rather more indirect than direct. It wasn't just buyers there, trying to find horses for 'the race'; rather, I think it gave the consignors the confidence that they could try Book 1 again, and continue selling in sterling. It was only a year ago the consignors were bleating that they'd be better off in Book 2. There won't be much of that this year, because whichever of the moves Tattersalls made to try and improve Book 1, they worked, and even better than they expected.

Now let's look again at the yearling sale season, with the last major sale in the books, and just this week and next week at Deauville to essentially wrap things up. And here's the tale of the tape: if you take Sheikh Mohammed's buying out of the totals, the other 99.55 percent of the horses sold in the second-half 2007 period have actually been up: 9,919 horses sold to everybody but John Ferguson have grossed \$758,136,090, averaging \$76,433. That is three percent more horses than last year (9,608), grossing five percent more (last year without Sheikh Mohammed: \$722,409,355), and they averaged two percent higher than last year's corresponding average of \$75,188. If you then factor in that Darley has probably spent \$200 million in acquiring stallion prospects and 'legs' of stallions privately, it doesn't look like the market is down at all; au contraire. But we've wondered for years how to gauge Sheikh Mohammed's impact on the marketplace, and now we have a number: there is a seven percent turnaround in the gross with his buys put in or out, and a six percent turnaround in the average. In an \$800 million market, his 62 percent decline in gross yearling spend amounted to a seven percent decline in the market's gross. That must translate into meaning that Sheikh Mohammed alone accounts for around 10 percent of the combined North American and European thoroughbred market.

Sales Sires...

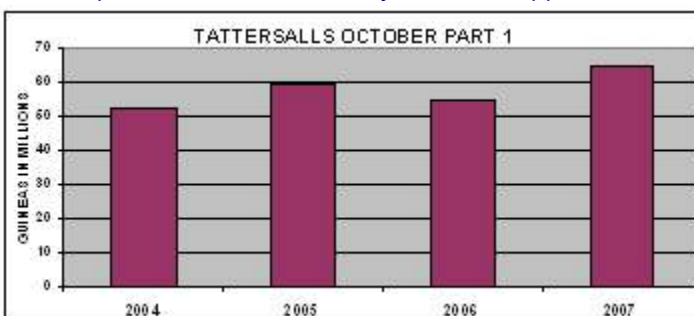
With Storm Cat's fall from commercial grace (and subsequent stud fee reduction to \$300,000 for 2008), two-time Leading North American (and four-time Leading APEX A Runner Index) sire A.P. Indy inherited the mantle of leading sales sire, outdistancing the field with an average of \$853,541 for 24 yearlings sold, according to the excellent *Insta-tistics* list compiled by BRIS for TDN, and updated through the end of the Tattersalls October 1 sale. Kingmambo, from a crop abbreviated by injury; Sadler's Wells (off a nominal €325,000 stud fee); and Storm Cat (averaging less than half the previous year) topped the \$500,000 average mark, while Unbridled's Song (off a \$125,000 fee; he was \$200,000 in 2007) and Distorted Humor (off a \$60,000 fee; \$225,000 in 2007) averaged in the \$400k's. Four more older proven sires were among five to average between \$375,000-\$400,000: Gone West, Seeking The Gold, Dynaformer, and Monsun. The only sire with three crops or fewer to crash the commercial top 10 was Galileo, with 51 yearlings (of 62 offered) averaging \$393,685. Besides Sadler's Wells and Galileo, Coolmore also had Montjeu and Giant's Causeway (with 90 sold of 102 offered!) among the 17 sires which averaged over \$300,000; Darley had Cape Cross, who averaged \$310,223 for 28 sold (of 31 offered), off his first book at €50,000. 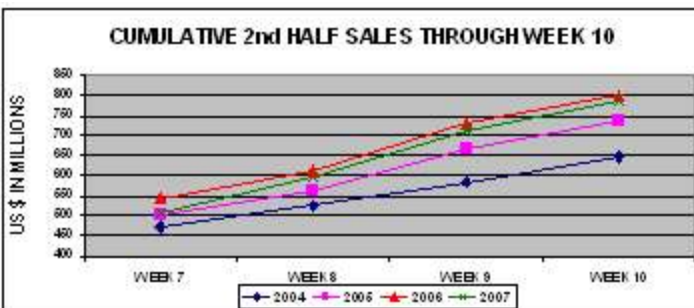
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"Nearing the end of the intensive three-month yearling sales season, prices mostly struggled to keep pace with last year's records; but last week's Tattersalls October 1 sale bounded ahead, selling 18% more horses for 18% more money and losing just one-tenth of one percent off the average. They followed up earlier this week with another 18% gain in gross, and a 15% jump in average, at Tattersalls October Part 2. As detailed in the accompanying article, the overall market, through the end of last week, is down 2% in gross, but when you take Sheikh Mohammed's spending out, the rest of the market is up 5%. A strong market performance, I would say." – Bill Oppenheim

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Darley's Elusive Quality had 34 average \$253,776 in his first post-Smartly Jones book; Coolmore's Danehill Dancer had 78 (of 82 offered!) average \$241,025, having stood for €40,000 in 2005 (€115,000 in 2007). Other sires with four or more crops racing in the commercial top 22 included 'neutral' Europeans Pivotal and Dansili, and Americans Awesome Again and Mr. Greeley.

Leading freshman sires Acclamation and Posse, who stood for popcorn and peanuts in 2005, didn't figure anywhere near the top 50 commercial sires this year-- Acclamation had 43 yearlings average \$99,098, of an €9,000 fee, while Posse had 30 average \$71,810, from a \$10,000 fee--but, unusually, six different freshman sires did figure among the top 50. Tops among them, perhaps surprisingly, was Dalakhani, the Aga Khan's top-class son of Darshaan who has been posting many promising signs since Aug. 1--before when he didn't even have a winner. Europe number two Oasis Dream sold great, particularly at October 1, and finished last week with 36 averaging \$249,905; the third European, Nashwan and Unfuwain's half-brother by Gulch, Nayef, had 16 average \$176,358, and I think that was even before Sheikh Hamdan went on a spending spree at Tattersalls October Book 2 earlier this week, when he bought 18 yearlings, including three high-priced Nayefs for a total of around \$1.5 million. The three American freshman sires were Mineshaft, Empire Maker, and Vindication; buyers have kept the faith with all three, not something that necessarily happens much with second-crop sires.

Only four sires with their first three-year-olds made the top 50, and not surprisingly they are the 'first foals 2004' sire crop's one-two on each side of the pond: Darley's Street Cry (36 averaged \$170,493) and Coolmore's Johannesburg (73 averaged \$157,981, both off \$30,000 stud fees); and the Irish National Stud's ('leg' bought by Darley) Invincible Spirit (46 averaged \$137,179 off an €10,000 fee) and Coolmore's Rock of Gibraltar (57 averaged \$155,807, of an €55,000 fee). The first three mentioned are all going to be standing for a lot more in 2008 than they were when this year's yearlings were bred.

Five sires with their first yearlings selling (first foal 2006) made the list, three American and two European. Smarty Jones (33 averaged \$205,454) topped the list, though not by much, ahead of Speightstown (51 averaged \$189,745). Strong Hope (38 averaged \$138,535) also made the top 50. The two European representatives are both Maktoum stallions: Darley's Refuse to Bend (39, averaged \$168,333), who stands in Ireland at Kildangan; and Shadwell's Haafhd (17 averaged \$154,091), who stands alongside Sakhee and Nayef in a pretty promising trio standing at Sheikh Hamdan's Nunnery Stud, in England.

JOCKEY CLUB RELEASES 2007 REPORT OF MARES BRED STATISTICS

The Jockey Club yesterday released Report of Mares Bred (RMB) statistics for 2007. The figures show an increase in breeding activity

in Kentucky and, for the second year in a row, a negligible decline in the number of North American stallions covering at least 100 mares. In North America during 2007, 125 stallions were bred to 100 or more mares, one fewer than covered that amount in 2006, and three less than the record 128 stallions to do so in 2005. Of those 125 stallions, 102 stood

in Kentucky, which in 2006 was home to 94 stallions that covered at least 100 mares. Other states and provinces in which stallions covered 100 or more mares were Florida (12 stallions), California (3), Maryland (3), New York (2), Arkansas (1), Louisiana (1) and Ontario (1). Hill 'n' Dale's **Stormy Atlantic** (Storm Cat) led all stallions in 2007 with 199 mares bred, four more than **Johannesburg** (Hennessy) (195). Rounding out the top five were **Wildcat Heir** (Forest Wildcat) (177), **With Distinction** (Storm Cat) (177) and **Giant's Causeway** (Storm Cat) (176). Based on RMBs received through Oct. 11, 2007, The Jockey Club reports that 2,808 stallions covered 56,796 mares in North America during 2007. The statistics include the number of mares bred to each stallion, and represent approximately 90 percent of the mares bred in 2007. The Jockey Club expects to receive an additional 800 to 1,000 RMBs from the 2007 breeding season, according to historical trends. The number of stallions fell 8.0 percent from the 3,053 reported at this time in 2006, while the number of mares bred declined 4.4 percent from the 59,434 reported at this time last year.
