FASIG-TIPTON MIXES IT UP

Fasig-Tipton's Selected November Mixed sale promises to be a high-octane affair when it kicks off this afternoon at 2 p.m. at the company's Newtown Paddocks in Lexington, Kentucky. A total of 185 horses have been catalogued for the event, including the late addition of dual Grade I winner Octave. The sale also includes Grade I winners Appealing Zophie, Asi Siempre, Cash Included, Cotton Blossom, Dream Rush, Ermine, Irish Smoke, Maryfield and Round Pond, who are catalogued as racing and/or broodmare prospects, as well as young Grade I winners Indy Five Hundred and Leave Me Alone, who sell in foal. "The action here has been good and the expectations are high," said Boyd Browning Jr., Fasig-Tipton's executive vice president and chief operating officer. "We've got a quality group of horses, and it looks like we've got a quality group of buyers." The impressive make-up of the catalogue is the result of a lot of elbow grease, said Browning. "We've had the opportunity to capitalize on past successes," he said. "It's a lot of hard work put forth by a lot of people." Many familiar faces could be seen at the barns at Fasig-Tipton yesterday, and Browning said he expected there to be an increased foreign presence. "This catalogue does hold more international appeal than others we've had in the past," he said. "We've seen a good number of Europeans and a good number of buyers from Japan." Approximately 110 broodmare prospects and in-foal mares and 70 selected weanlings comprise the catalogue. Also included are a number of stallion prospects that will sell at the end of today's proceedings. Hip [181](#) is the six-year-old **Liquor Cabinet (Ire)** (Hennessy), who earned one of the better Beyer figures of the year (113) winning the GIII Aqueduct H. in January; hip [182](#) is **Silver Wagon** (Wagon Limit), a Grade I winner of \$1.16 million; hip [183](#) is Grade II winner **Tap Day** (Pleasant Tap), a six-year-old who sells as a stallion/racing prospect; and hip [184](#) is the five-year-old **Wild Desert** (Wild Rush), winner of the 2005 Queen's Plate. O'BRIEN PLEASED WITH CUP DRAW

Trainer Aidan O'Brien was cautiously optimistic after lightly raced and lightly weighted **Mahler (GB)** (Galileo {Ire}) drew barrier 6 for Tuesday's A\$5.1-million G1 Melbourne Cup. "Obviously, we don't want to have to go too hard to get a position, [and] we didn't want to be too wide," O'Brien said. "He is a horse that will stay and he likes to be ridden handy, but we don't want to use up too much petrol; hopefully, he will go forward on the inside." Jockey Stephen Baster, who rode Mahler for the first time Friday, said the sophomore had a mature mental attitude. "He's a lovely horse with a really good nature, and I think that is a big plus going into the Melbourne Cup with a crowd of 120,000," Baster said. "He's the real deal, definitely." Mahler, who has been a little lost without regular work partner Scorpion (Ire), worked 1200 meters in 1:24 at Sandown, getting his final 400 meters in :25. Three-for-seven lifetime, he captured the G3 Queen's Vase going two miles at Royal Ascot and comes off a second in the G1 St Leger at Doncaster Sept. 15. The colt, in at 111 pounds, is 10-1 in the antepost betting. Melbourne Cup history will be made this year, as two female jockeys will ride in the great race for the first time. Top New Zealand jockey Lisa Cropp will partner GSW **Sculptor (NZ)** (His Royal Highness {NZ}), who earned himself a berth with a win in the G3 Saab Quality S. yesterday; and South Australia's leading female rider Clare Lindop will ride 40-1 shot **Dolphin Jo (Aus)** (Dolphin Street {Fr}), who will break from the inside. **Master O'Reilly (Aus)** (O'Reilly {NZ}), the morning-line favorite at 11-2, drew post 17. The five-year-old earned the role with his victory in the G1 Caulfield Cup Oct. 20. **Melbourne Cup Field, p7**

He's just a few days short of his 80th birthday, but the message at Flemington was loud and clear: never underestimate 12-time G1 Melbourne Cup winning trainer Bart Cummings. Cummings' charge Sirmione, a 60-1 outsider, exploded in the stretch here to earn himself a place in the gate for the 2007 Melbourne Cup. He eclipsed Princess Coup, who missed the start by three lengths, as Zippping made up 20 lengths to get third. The sectionals told the story--Zippping powered home in :22.93 and :11.73, while Sirmione clocked :11.86 for his final furlong. "He relaxed well and as soon as I showed him the whip he just took off," winning jockey Peter Merten said. Sirmione had been out of the frame in his five previous starts, including a 12th-place finish in the G1 Caulfield Cup last time Oct. 20. He has drawn the disadvantageous post 20 in the 24-horse Melbourne Cup field.

Miss Finland Off the Board...

Racing third from the rear, **Miss Finland** (Redoute's Choice {AUS}) made up considerable ground, but lacked her usual spark and finished fifth. "At the 600 meters, she got her head up and wasn't racing well," jockey Craig Williams said. "I'll have to find myself a new girlfriend." Trainer David Hayes confirmed that Miss Finland would not press on to the Cup. "She's out of form and off to the paddock," Hayes offered.

The lethal combination of David Hayes and Craig Williams struck again here with the rapidly improving **Kibbutz**. **Bammagera** (Encosta de Lago {Aus}) took the early lead and cantered in front with **Marching** as Williams nursed **Kibbutz** along in the middle of the pack. The gelding hit the afterburners in the stretch to reel in the leaders and draw clear. "David has timed this horse to perfection," Williams said. **Kibbutz**, who won the L. Hill Smith S. over 1800 meters at Cheltenham, was runner-up to **Marching** in the G2 AAMI Vase at Moonee Valley last week. "He's such a bad track worker that we originally weren't that excited with him at all," Hayes said.

Season Over for Haradasun...

Haradasun (Aus) (Fusaichi Pegasus), winless in six attempts this spring, pulled up sore in the MacKinnon and will immediately be sent to the paddock. "He's lame in front," trainer Tony Vasil said of the 13th-place finisher. "There are a lot of Haradasun knockers out there, but it is the first time he has finished out of the first four. After the race, everyone was clutching at straws to see what is wrong. We'll wait until he cools down to find out." **Haradasun** finished third in the G1 Cox Plate last Saturday.

With Brad Rawiller aboard, the three-year-old stalked the leaders until the 400-meter mark. Bel Mer took over from Husson Lightning (Hussonet) at the 500-meter mark, but was reeled in by Weekend Hussler. "He is unbelievable; he's unstoppable," Rawiller enthused. Trainer Ross McDonald added, "I thought he was the best I've trained after Caulfield and today he again proved just how good he is". McDonald is yet to decide whether the winner will take on older horses in next Saturday's G1 Emirates S. over 1600 meters.

Divine Madonna took her usual spot among the tail-enders before unleashing a demoralizing burst of speed down the outside. "She was always going to be the one to beat," jockey Michael Rodd said. "She was the best horse in the race and I rode her accordingly. She is just electric." Kavanagh has ruled out backing up Divine Madonna to try and win a second G1 Emirates S. next Saturday, saying the five-year-old deserved a break. "I just love her," the conditioner said. "She came into the mounting yard today as if she owned it. I just love her attitude. She's a super horse. If we get an invite to Hong Kong, she'll go."

combined 23 lengths. Third in the Apr. 21 GIII Sixty Sails H. at Hawthorne, she came back to take the GII Allaire DuPont BC Distaff S. at Pimlico May 19. The chestnut filly could do no better than fifth behind Indian Vale in the June 16 GII Fleur de Lis H. at Churchill Downs and was given a break. Sent off at 10 cents on the dollar in the Central Iowa S. in her Sept. 8 return at Prairie Meadows, she galloped home a 10 3/4-length winner, but she was 21-1 in the Oct. 7

GI Juddmonte Spinster S. at Keeneland and ran to her odds, finishing seventh. Rolling Sea was on the bit as she stalked the pace from third. She dashed to the front from the inside at the quarter pole, opened up daylight at midstretch, then was all out to hold off High Heels at the wire. "She has put together a great year," said trainer Steve Asmussen. "She was solid at the beginning of the year and won a couple of graded stakes. She's an excellent filly and great to be around." Added jockey Robby Albarado, "You have got to be real easy with her the first part of it and let her gather herself to get her to put herself in the race. Today, I didn't do anything with her, I just let her cruise on her own. I had a clean trip and she took care of them today." It has not yet been decided where the winner will go next, but runner-up High Heels will be pointed for the GII Falls City H. at Churchill on Thanksgiving. "She's been working good and she put her best game forward today," jockey Joe Johnson said. "She lost a couple of lengths and that might have cost her the last part of it, but she came running." Turfway Park Fall Championship S. Connections opted to try the turf and tough company in the Oct. 6 GI Shadwell Turf Mile S. at Keeneland, but the decision bore no fruit as Istan ended up seventh. Better spotted this time, he settled in midpack through a half in :45.85. Jockey Kent Desormeaux guided the five-year-old to the front as they raced out of the turn and the two powered away for an impressive score. "[Trainer Bill Mott] sent him here in the summertime to try to boost his confidence and he did that at Ellis Park, then he came back and ran a great race at Turfway," said Kenny McCarthy, the assistant who oversees Mott's stable at Churchill Downs. "The horse was doing good. I think [Mott] feels that not necessarily one-turn, but that the mile is probably his optimum distance."

MIDNIGHT CRY ATTORNEY DISPUTES CURLIN

CLAIMS Attorney Andre Regard, who represents Shirley Cunningham Jr. and William Gallion's company Tandy LLC, told *The Blood-Horse* yesterday that the Tandy-owned Midnight Cry Stables still retains its 20-percent interest in GI Breeders' Cup Classic hero Curlin. A Kentucky Circuit Court judge ruled Thursday that the 418 plaintiffs in the lawsuit against Cunningham and Gallion were entitled to control of Tandy, but Regard sent an e-mail to *The Blood-Horse* which read, "The Charging Order does not affect the actual ownership of Curlin in any fashion. The Order states that the judgment creditors will be treated as assignees of Tandy LLC as to any cash distributions made by the Company. This means that if Tandy LLC distributes cash or assets to members of the LLC, to the extent cash or assets are distributed to Cunningham or Gallion, then the judgment creditors may be eligible to receive them." Regard continued, "The judgment creditors do not have title to any assets of the company and no role in the management of the company." Michael Meuser, an attorney for Satish Sanan's Padua Stables, told *Louisville Courier-Journal* that his client would like to sell the colt at public auction. "The best way for us to find out [Curlin's value] is to have an auction," Meuser said.

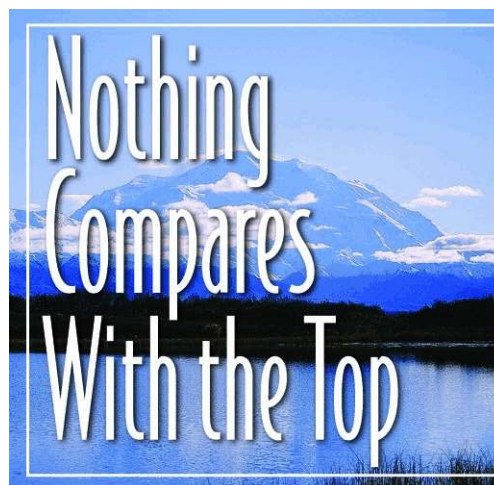

The handsome dark bay is coming off a fifth-place effort in the Breeders' Cup Filly & Mare Sprint and will be one of the finalists in the female sprinter category come Eclipse time.

PLENTY TO CHOOSE FROM AT KEENOV

The breeding stock sales season gets underway in earnest tomorrow when Keeneland kicks off its 64th annual November sale in Lexington. With a record 5,415 horses of all ages catalogued over 15 days, officials at the auction house are hopeful that the momentum created by a resilient September sale will trickle down to this marketplace. "I think the results of the September sale were stronger than a lot of people anticipated and the buoyancy of the September sale should carry over into November," offered Keeneland

Director of Sales Geoffrey Russell. "The catalogue has good strength and depth of quality all the way through and we are optimistic." The catalogue, some 389 horses (7.7 percent) larger than last year's, features 2,684 broodmares, 2,323 weanlings, 403 horses of racing age, four stallions and one breeding right. The 2006 November sale was one for the history books, as a trio of records fell by the wayside. Half Ours realized a final bid of \$6.1 million to top the event and became

the most expensive horse in training to be sold at Keeneland. A filly by Gone West out of GI Breeders' Cup Filly and Mare Turf winner Islington (Ire) was hammered down to the M.A. B. Agency for \$2.4 million--the highest price ever paid for a weanling filly at Keeneland. A colt by Montjeu (Ire) out of Elbaaha (GB) made a record \$2.7 million when purchased by Japan's Globe Equine Management Ltd. The colt's dam, an RNA at the 2006 Keeneland January Sale, is being offered in foal to Storm Cat as hip 411 during Tuesday's second session (related story, p6).

Russell admits it may be tough to match last year's numbers, particularly given the weakness and relative lack of participation at the top of the yearling market. "I think the results of the September sale could be mirrored here, with a little hesitation at the top," he commented. "But I think there are some special horses in this sale which fall outside of the normal purchasing decisions. You also have the reduction of Adena Springs, and the dispersal of Swettenham Stud, the wonderful operation of Mr. Sangster and his family. They are offering some wonderful mares."

High-Profile Outs an Unfortunate By-Product...

Entries for the November breeding stock sale close roughly three months ahead of the event and always result in the scratching of some prominent horses. Among those withdrawn from this year's sale are MGSW & GISP Wild Gams; MGISP Barancella (Fr); GSW & MGISP Baroness Thatcher; GISW and GI Breeders' Cup Distaff runner-up Hystericalady; and GISW Behaving Badly. There's not much that can be done about that, according to Russell. "Racehorses are always iffy," he explained. "You have to enter them back in August and some of them perform well between then and now and the decision is made to take them out. It's sort of the nature of the beast."

Dollar Weakness Should Factor...

Over the past several years, Keeneland sales officials have made a concerted effort to attract buyers from all corners of the planet. Prior to the September sale, Keeneland encouraged its overseas customers to remain mindful of the weakness of American economy and the corresponding relative strength of foreign currency on these shores. In the six weeks since the September sale, the American stock market has remained on shaky ground, and Keeneland makes no apology for motivating its buying base in this way. "It's like a broken record, but the weakness of the dollar should play a big role," Geoff Russell stated. "It had a huge effect in the September sale and I think it will play a big part here as well. The quality of our horses is the same as it's always been, it's just now the money goes a bit further." One group which was especially heavily recruited for this sale was Australasian buyers. Russell and some of his colleagues spent 10 days in Australia and New Zealand, accentuating the positives of the November sale. "Southern hemisphere people are able to come up here and buy our mares, where they can't really buy horses in September, so that adds another layer and a level of excitement to our sale," Russell commented. "The Australians realize that they have a dominance of Danehill stallions down there and they need to bring in some new blood. American-bred female families have done very well in Australia. Additionally, the American type of horse, which is a more speed-oriented type of horse, seems to cross very well with what they want down there. They love two-year-old racing and that should work in our favor."

Fleet Indian Gets Her Shot...

It was to be a story befitting a fairytale ending. **Fleet Indian** (Indian Charlie), a stout New York-bred mare, was the post-time favorite in the 2006 GI Breeders' Cup Distaff at Churchill Downs and was to take her place in last year's November sale two days later following a short van ride to Keeneland. But things didn't work out that way. Instead of heading to a stall on the sales grounds, Fleet Indian's destination became first Taylor Made Farm, then Rood & Riddle Equine Hospital, the renowned equine clinic, where she would undergo surgery on her ankle, badly injured when she broke down in the Distaff. Now fully healed, ankle fused and pregnant with her first foal--by Storm Cat, Fleet Indian figures to be one of the stars of the show at Keeneland.

Owner Paul Saylor had already experienced some of the highest highs Thoroughbred racing has to offer as a one-third partner in Ashado, who not only won the Kentucky Oaks and Breeders' Cup Distaff--two of her seven Grade I wins--but also topped the 2005 November sale at \$9 million.

Saylor took some of his profit and reinvested it in Fleet Indian, who he purchased through Dapple Bloodstock for \$290,000 at the 2006 Keeneland January sale. He admits that his goals weren't all that lofty.

"I bought her with fairly modest expectations," he said by phone Friday. "She'd been a good racehorse and she was spectacular looking--that's what kind of attracted me to her--but I said to Todd Pletcher, 'Let's have some fun in New York stakes and maybe our big day will be in the New York Showcase Day.' Obviously, she turned out to be a huge pleasant surprise."

Forced to wait two months before finding a suitable race, Fleet Indian won the GIII Next Move H. in March before taking the GIII Sixty Sails H., the Obeah H. and the GII Delaware H. by a combined 25 3/4 lengths. She added the GI Personal Ensign H. and was made the 5-2 chalk in the Distaff off her win in the GI Beldame S. in October. She had been catalogued as a broodmare prospect to last year's November sale prior to her injury.

Deemed healthy enough to commence her broodmare career, Fleet Indian was bred to Storm Cat this past February and was pronounced in foal on a single cover. Saylor admits to an internal tussle as he decided on whether to offer his mare at auction or to retain her and her foal, a colt based on fetal sex determination.

"The one side of me was emotional, the other side of me was more businesslike," Saylor explained. "I'm not in the breeding business. I'm in the game mostly on the racing end and that's what prevailed. Obviously, if you can take some money off the table in this business, you probably do it. I set aside all the concerns I had after the Breeders' Cup last year about her being not only repaired and healthy, but also her ability to lead a long and productive broodmare life. She's extremely normal right now as a broodmare."

Despite a somewhat uncertain buying atmosphere, Saylor believes that Fleet Indian is impervious to any market fluctuation or unease.

"My feeling is that horses of her caliber are going to sell well in up markets, down markets or markets that are confusing to people," he says. "There are only just so many horses like her. I thought she would sell well as a broodmare prospect and now she's in foal to Storm Cat. Storm Cat is still Storm Cat, their body types are so complementary and even their attitudes are so complementary, she should attract a lot of attention."

Selling a good horse is never boring, Saylor says, but acknowledges that this sale will be different from the last one.

"I really loved Ashado," he stated. "I had a third of Ashado and all of Fleet Indian, so there could be different financial consequences. I think the difference is that Ashado had a few minor setbacks, but was basically solid for three straight years. Fleet Indian was such a pleasant surprise, and then we ground through what happened to her in the Breeders' Cup, so I'm a little bit more attached to her. I witnessed her recovery and saw how she handled herself. I really respect the horse."

Saylor isn't taking anything for granted and admits that the butterflies will be fluttering about Monday afternoon.

"If you're not nervous in the business when big things happen, racing or otherwise, you might as well get out of the business," he said.

Fleet Indian is catalogued as hip [138](#) and is being consigned by Taylor Made on behalf of Saylor. The agency also consigned Ashado in 2005.

Adena Reduction Figures Prominent...

With a broodmare band in excess of 800 horses, it is only logical that Frank Stronach play the numbers game from time to time; Adena Springs has a draft of about 200 of those mares entered in the November sale. All horses are being consigned by Hidden Brook, agent.

Explaining the timing of the decision, Adena Springs' Jack Brothers said, "Our stallions are very fashionable right now, and we're not culling, just reducing. We have a very large broodmare band and the number we are selling is not even half of that. It's a very healthy market for mares at the top and the middle market has also remained strong."

The crown jewel of the 23 Adena horses catalogued in Book 1 is hip **294, Spun Sugar** (Awesome Again). The bay filly won three of her first four career outings, including the GII Black-Eyed Susan S. She was on the board in all three legs of New York's Triple Tiara, finishing second in the GI Mother Goose S. and GI Alabama S. and third in the GI CCA Oaks. The daughter of Irish Cherry (Irish Open) won half of her 2006 starts, including the GI Apple Blossom H. and the GI Go For Wand H. and retired with

earnings of \$929,171. Spun Sugar carries her first foal by A.P. Indy.

"She's special to us, but not only because she was a great racehorse," Brothers explained. "She's a homebred and by a homebred [sire] in Awesome Again. It's a rare opportunity when you have a mare being offered at this level and in foal to such a great sire."

Not that her page needed any embellishment, but the family is also very live at the moment. "You also have her full brother, Daaher, who looked great winning [the GII Jerome H. Oct. 7], and should be pretty tough in the [GI] Cigar Mile. It's a great emerging family."

Awesome Again, the sire of 10 stakes winners in 2007, is also responsible for GI Breeders' Cup Distaff heroine Ginger Punch, and has now produced the winners of four Breeders' Cup races. That number includes Round Pond, victorious in the 2006 Distaff.

Another highlight of the Adena consignment is hip **228**, the 11-year-old **Perfect Six** (Saratoga Six). A half-sister to MGSW Commitisize and to SW & GSP Rusty Spur, the dark bay mare carries a full sibling to MSW & GSP Buffalo Man (El Prado {Ire}), who returned from a seven-month absence to be second to C P West in the Wild Again S. at Aqueduct Nov. 1.

A terrific year for Adena promises to get that much better over the next few days.

"We're proud of our track record over the past years," Brothers commented. "It means a lot to the program when stallions like Macho Uno and Awesome Again really begin to emerge. Frank [Stronach] continues to raise the bar and the success has been terrific."

Capestro Hoping for Consolation Prize...

River's Prayer (Devon Lane) did little wrong in 2007, winning each of her five trips to the post, but a fractured sesamoid suffered in an Oct. 7 workout at Hollywood Park cost the four-year-old a start in the Breeders' Cup Filly and Mare Sprint, a race in which she would have been among the favorites. Instead, trainer Paula Capestro, who owns 50 percent of the filly, will look to the November sale for her moment in the sun.

Capestro purchased the grey filly privately after she failed to meet her reserve at the 2005 Barretts March sale, and thought from the start that she had something good.

"She was just a little immature, but we knew she could run," said Capestro, who is partners in the filly with Bantry Farms and Martin Racing Stable LLC.

Her hunch was confirmed when River's Prayer won the Cinderella S. in her second career start and went on to finish third in the GI Del Mar Debutante in 2005. Put away for the year off a third in the restricted Cover Gal S., she returned an even better horse the following season.

"She really came into herself in the summer of 2006," Capestro stated. "I brought her back off a layoff in the Fleet Treat S. at Del Mar and she won that, but when we put her on the grass on the downhill course at Santa Anita, she beat Cambiocorsa [in the 2006 Cal Cup Distaff H.], and we never looked back."

River's Prayer took her first two starts of 2007, including a narrow score from the talented but ill-fated Indian Flare in the GIII Las Cienegas H. down the hill Apr. 15, but showed her trainer a new dimension in winning Hollywood's Great Lady M. S. June 14.

"She got left at the gate and she ran up there so easily, laid second all the way around and then went by at the quarter pole," Capestro explained. "That race was a real turning point because she really understood laying off the pace at that point and that's what turned her into a Grade I horse. When you have tactical speed to lay right off it and still be strong enough to close, you know you have a serious horse. Her shortcoming before was that she'd run as fast as she could as far as she could, but once she learned how to relax, she was a monster."

River's Prayer was sent to Calder for the GI Princess Rooney H., but the 'monster' was let go at 11-1 in a field which included Shaggy Mane, Maryfield and Miraculous Miss. The latter duo formed the exacta in last weekend's Breeders' Cup Filly and Mare Sprint. Just off the flank of the fleet Shaggy Mane through fractions of :21.56 and :44.49 at Calder, River's Prayer pressed by and on to a half-length victory. In what would become her final career start, she posted a half-length victory in the GIII Rancho Bernardo H. at Del Mar. She was retired with a record of 16-9-1-2 and earnings of \$921,957.

So, how difficult does it figure to be to part with a Grade I filly who won on the main track, Polytrack and turf and closed her career on a five-race winning streak?

"It's very hard for me to go through this part of it right now," Capestro acknowledges. "But this is our business, this is what we do and I'm just hoping she brings enough money and if she does, she'll sell. If not, our partnership has agreed to breed her."

Lunsford Rooting in Abstentia for Madcap Baby...

Owner Bruce Lunsford is heading out of town and will monitor Monday's proceedings at Keeneland by telephone. He'd better have his cell phone fully charged when hip [196](#), the first foal from GISW Madcap Escapade (Hennessy), a filly by Pulpit, takes her place in the sales pavilion.

"She's a beautiful filly," Lunsford said, having paid a visit to her stall at the Hill 'n' Dale consignment on Saturday. "You never know what the market is and it always takes two buyers to make for some excitement. I think she'll do fine."

Lunsford offered Madcap Escapade for sale at last year's November sale and the 2004 GI Ashland S. winner proved a popular commodity, eventually falling to John Sikura for an even \$6 million, the top price for a broodmare at the auction.

Shortly after the sale, Lunsford, who admits freely that he has a soft spot for Madcap Escapade, approached Sikura, who agreed to sell back a half-interest in the mare to Lunsford. In the end, he just couldn't let go completely.

"Madcap Escapade is a horse that just keeps on giving," Lunsford commented. "This filly looks a lot like her. She has several markings which suggest that she's got more from mare than her sire. She might actually be longer and have a little more scope than Madcap Escapade. But John is a good partner and I am glad he has her looking so good."

Madcap Escapade was bred this year to Pulpit's sire, A.P. Indy.

If at First You Don't Succeed...

Elbaaaha (GB) (Arazi) looked to be one of the stars of the show when she took her place in the 2006 Keeneland January Sale, but the bidding on the dam of the late G1 Dubai World Cup hero Electrocutionist stalled out at \$1.175 million and the mare, carrying a foal by Montjeu (Ire), was led back to the Indian Creek barn.

"At the time I didn't think it would make a difference to have her in the January sale, but it probably did," admitted Indian Creek's Shack Parrish.

But things have a funny way of working out and so it was for Indian Creek and their client, who put the Montjeu foal--a colt--back into last year's November sale. A furious bidding war ensued and some \$2.7 million later, the colt was off to Japan, having established a North American record price for a weanling.

Life sometimes doesn't offer second chances, but buyers who missed out on Elbaaaha 21 months ago get another crack at the mare. Carrying a foal by Storm Cat, the 13-year-old mare is catalogued as hip [411](#) and is being offered again by Indian Creek.

"She'll be very well received here in November," Parrish said. "It's nice to have her in foal to Storm Cat, even if people were a little off of him this September. But for a nice producer like her, it certainly doesn't hurt. I'm pretty optimistic."

It was the first Santa Anita stakes win for 19-year-old rider Kyle Kaenel, the son of Jack Kaenel, who was 16 when he piloted Aloma's Ruler to victory in the 1982 GI Preakness S. "Before they went in the gate, I told [owner] Curt [Lanning], 'I've never loved a horse any more in my life at 50-1,'" commented winning trainer Ed Moger. "In her last race, she clipped heels real bad, and Kyle saw it. He came to me after the race and asked if he could ride her next time, and here we are."
