hip 72, observers were prepared for fireworks at yesterday's Fasig-Tipton Selected Mixed Sale in Lexington, Kentucky. Of course, GI Breeders' Cup Distaff winner **Round Pound** (Awesome Again)

needed no introduction, and

pyrotechnics were a given. Bidding for the two-time Eclipse Award finalist opened at \$500,000 and quickly sped to \$3.5 million--on audacious \$500,000 bids.

Soon after, My Meadowview Farm's Leonard Riggio, flanked by trainer Nick Zito and advisor Lincoln Collins inside the sales pavilion, and Darley representative John Ferguson, in back, locked horns and began exchanging \$250,000 salvos. In the end, Ferguson outlasted a game Riggio to land the five-year-old broodmare prospect for \$5.75 million. The price was a record for the current version of Fasig-Tipton's November sale, eclipsing the \$5 million paid for I'll Get Along, dam of Smarty Jones, in 2004; and equaled by Riskaverse two years ago. Back in 1985, Miss Oceana set a world record when she sold for \$7 million as part of the Newstead Farm dispersal. **Round Pound cont. p2**

Octave Sells Amid Controversy...

A dual Grade I winner from a strong female family, **Octave** (Unbridled's Song) was sure to attract plenty of attention as the supplemented hip 112A, and the three-year-old filly did just that, selling to Darley's John Ferguson for \$4 million. But not without generating a bit of controversy first. With bidding focused in the rear walking ring, the price on the board quickly reached \$3 million and was heading north. Tom Hudson, representing a California-based operation, bid \$3.9 million for Octave. To his left, a relaxed Ferguson, standing with several Darley representatives, offered \$4 million, and the hammer fell soon after. As Ferguson was signing the ticket, though, an angry Coolmore chief John Magnier and associate Paul Shanahan approached the auctioneer's stand, clearly under the assumption that their \$4-million bid had been recognized by the spotter. The spotter adamantly denied having acknowledged the bid, and, Fasig-Tipton officials later explained, that because the bid was never acknowledged, bidding could not be re-opened. "We never accepted the bid," said Fasig-Tipton's Walt Robertson. "It's unfortunate; I wish we'd seen him. They're pretty discreet on how they bid. It's unfortunate that it happened on such a nice mare." **Octave cont. p3**

KEENELAND NOVEMBER STARTS TODAY

With mares like champion **Fleet Indian** (Indian Charlie), in foal to Storm Cat; and **Sand Springs** (Dynaformer), in foal to Kingmambo, on offer, and Sheikh Mohammed and the Coolmore conglomerate looking to add to their broodmare bands, the record gross for the Keeneland November Breeding Stock Sale could be in jeopardy. "The November catalog has true international appeal, and attracts the largest, most influential group of buyers in the world," said Keeneland's Director of Sales Geoffrey Russell. "With such quantity and recognized quality throughout the catalog, Keeneland offers something for everyone." The 15-day auction, expanded from 14 days last year, starts this morning in Lexington. The record gross of \$317,666,000 was set in 1999, and the 2006 edition came close to the mark, realizing an aggregate of \$313,843,820. The 2006 gross was up 8.4 percent and the median remained unchanged at \$35,000, but the average was off slightly, down 2.9 percent to \$99,728. While the gross just missed setting a new high, there was a North American record set for a weanling colt when a son of Montjeu (Ire) brought \$2.7 million from Japanese agent Nobutaka Tada; and a Keeneland record for a weanling filly was reached by a daughter of Gone West, who was purchased by the M.A.B Agency for \$2.4 million. Round Pond Brings \$5.75 Million...

The man who campaigned Round Pond, Fox Hill Farm's Rick Porter, watched the proceedings from the press box on the second floor. He admitted to mixed emotions after selling his stable star, who was consigned to the sale by Taylor Made Sales Agency. "I put a reserve on her that I thought was fair, and I really didn't care [if bidders reached it]," said Porter afterwards. "I figured I'd let fate decide whether I was going to keep her or not. They went a little over the reserve, but not a lot." He added of the price, "I was thinking it would be somewhere in that range. I was hoping, of course, to do a

little better. That was the range I expected, unless we got a couple guys to really go to battle. I'm very happy with the price. They got one great mare. She really would have had a chance to be undefeated if she was healthy. I don't think you could get a better race filly." Round Pond became the second-highest-priced broodmare prospect in U.S. history, behind only Ashado, who achieved \$9 million across town at Keeneland in 2005.

Round and Round...

Purchased as a yearling by trainer John Servis, agent for Fox Hill Farm, for \$105,000, Round Pond quickly made it clear that she was worth much more. After running third in her debut in February of her three-year-old year, she went on a four-race winning skein that included the GII Fantasy S. and GI Acorn S. Her four-year-old campaign began the right way with an allowance win and a neck victory in the GIII Azeri BC S., but she wasn't quite right when runner-up in the GII Molly Pitcher BC S. and a well-beaten third in the GI Beldame S. Subsequently disregarded as a 15-1 shot in last year's GI Breeders' Cup Distaff, she put her best foot forward with a rousing 5 1/2-length triumph. The bay lost little luster after failing to win in two starts this year and was retired. "Any mare that can win the Breeders' Cup is very special," Ferguson pointed out. He added of her appeal, "She's a very good individual and her mother is a [half-] sister to three Group 1 winners. So, it's a very, very strong family and we're delighted to have her. Sheikh Mohammed is committed to the young horses he has now at Darley at Jonabell and, obviously, a mare like that is very appealing to him, and we were very keen to buy her." Round Pond was produced by the Trempolino mare Gift of Dance, a half-sister to Black Minnaloushe (Storm Cat), Pennekamp (Bering {GB}) and Nasr el Arab (Al Nasr {Fr}), all Grade/Group 1 winners.

Octave Sells for \$4 Million cont. from p1

For his part, Ferguson said he was unaware that there was an issue about Octave's sale. "Honestly, I just signed the ticket and left and I wasn't sure what happened after that." Asked how high he would have gone for her, he said, "\$4 million was a fair price for her." The controversy overshadowed the sale of a top racemare. Purchased by Starlight Stable and Don Lucarelli for \$350,000 at KEESEP, Octave has been as tough as they come through two seasons of racing for the partnership. Guided by trainer Todd Pletcher, she boasted a juvenile year that included a win in the GII Adirondack Breeders' Cup S. and a runner-up finish in the GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies.

Save for another Pletcher-trained filly named Rags to Riches, she'd likely be in line for an Eclipse Award this term after wins in the GI Mother Goose S. and GI CCA Oaks. Second to Rags to Riches in the GI Kentucky Oaks prior to that, she most recently was a closing third in last week's GI Breeders' Cup Distaff. "She obviously ran a big race last week--she's quite an athlete and looks like a fun prospect," said Ferguson. "Sheikh Mohammed obviously saw her run last week, and when he found out she was coming up here, he was very interested in her. When we got here, she was just a beautiful three-year-old." Ferguson added that, assuming everything was okay with Octave physically, she'd likely be returned to training as a four-year-old. "That's a decision that Sheikh Mohammed will make," he said. "But we bought her ultimately as a broodmare. She's by Unbridled's Song, and [Darley runner] Etched, who won the GIII Nashua S. [at Aqueduct Oct. 28], is out of Unbridled's Song mare." Controversial underbidder Hudson, general manager for Magali Farm in California, was bidding on behalf of an unidentified operation. "She was a beautiful filly, and with the Breeders' Cup being in Santa Anita next year, we felt she was an obvious contender for the Distaff," he said. "She's an incredible animal."

A Dream Come True...

With a come-and-catch me style that made her hard not to like, the three-year-old **Dream Rush** (Wild Rush) was one of the quickest fillies in her division this year for owner West Point Thoroughbreds. The attractive bay gave Terry Finley's operation one more thrill yesterday when she set came into the ring at Newtown Paddocks as a racing/broodmare prospect, sparking a hotly contested duel. Finley watched the action from inside the pavilion and was just a few rows away from eventual winning bidder Debbie Easter, who was alongside the man she was representing, Halsey Minor. Minor, who runs in the name of Minor Stable and owns a farm in Virginia, is a technology entrepreneur who founded CNET in 1993. Commenting on Dream Rush's appeal, Easter said, "She's a beautiful filly and she's fast, and I hope she can run like she did this year--that would be great." Easter said the filly was likely to be kept in training, but that a trainer would be decided upon at a later date. "We'll give her a little break and see what happens," she added. "Trained by Rick Violette, Jr.--the first to come over and congratulate Dream Rush's new connections--Dream Rush won this year's GIII Old Hat S., GI Prioress BC S. and GI Test S., and concluded her season with a fifth in the \$1-million Breeders' Cup F/M Sprint. Also sitting near the center of the action yesterday was Pete Bradley, who with Nick de Meric purchased Dream Rush as a yearling for D & B Ventures for \$90,000 at the 2005 KEESEP sale. They resold Dream Rush the following spring for \$285,000 to West Point. "She's a beauty," said Bradley. "Tom Ryan, who works for me, picked her out at the farm a few months before the Keeneland September sale, and ever since then she's been good to everybody. Everybody's who touched her has had good luck with her." Finley agreed with the sentiment and, although he said it was tough parting with his accomplished filly, it made sense financially. West Point also offered another GISW yesterday, the juvenile filly **Irish Smoke** (Smoke Glacken), who was knocked down to IEAH Stable for \$750,000. "We bought them both for \$285,000, so we paid \$570,000 for the two and sold them tonight for \$4,050,000," said Finley. "We did alright."

Indy 3,000,000...

From flagfall, yesterday's Fasig-Tipton sale enjoyed brisk trading, but it wasn't until hip 19 stepped into the ring that the action really took off. **Indy Five Hundred**, a seven-year-old Grade I winner by A.P. Indy out of Group 2 winner Lyphard's Delta, sparked the bidding duel that expired on bloodstock agent John Ferguson's

winning \$3-million bid. Ferguson was representing Sheikh Mohamed bin Rashid Al Maktoum. "She's a beautiful mare and a Grade I winner," explained Ferguson. "Her mother won the [G2] Nassau [S. in England] and her mother was a champion, so you've got three generations of real high performance. Therefore, we feel this mare has a huge

opportunity to continue the excellent record that the family has set so far." Lane's End, agent, consigned Indy Five Hundred, who sold in foal to the farm's Kingmambo. "At the end of the day, he's a horse we've been lucky with," Ferguson said of the covering sire. "It's a factor, but, ultimately, it's the mare we wanted." A maiden winner on dirt, Indy Five Hundred didn't really hit her stride until she was moved to the lawn. As a three-year-old of 2003, she ran a close second to Sand Springs in the GII Lake George S., then returned to beat Dimitrova by four lengths in the GI Garden City BC H. in her next start. With a race record that reflected her pedigree, Indy Five Hundred was an obvious choice, said Ferguson. "[She was] very expensive, but ultimately, for an attractive Grade I-winning daughter of A.P. Indy from that family, people who sell mares like that deserve to make good money." Lane's End's Bill Farish commented, "I thought that was a great price. She's a Grade I winner in foal to Kingmambo--we were expecting her to sell well, and she did." The owner of the mare was Peter Minikes, who paid \$210,000 for Indy Five Hundred as a Keeneland September yearling in 2001. Minikes sold a War Chant colt from the mare for \$150,000 at this year's September sale and owns a weanling Seeking the Gold filly, which he intends to keep, according to Farish. Indy Five Hundred is the fifth foal produced by Lyphard's Delta, by Lyphard, who also produced a year-old full sister to Indy Five Hundred named Delta Princess. That mare was a three-time Grade III winner who banked \$740,000 on the track. Indy Five Hundred's second dam is Proud Delta (Delta Judge), a dual Grade I winner and champion older mare in 1976.

Here Kitty, Kitty...

Roy and Gretchen Jackson, the owners and operators of Lael Stable, added to their bloodstock holdings yesterday, going to \$2.3 million to acquire hip 51, Mike Pegram's **Pussycat Doll** (Real Quiet). "We're just looking to upgrade, broodmare-wise, and thought she had all the qualities and thought we'd try to buy her," said Roy Jackson, who was not yet sure whether Pussycat Doll would race on, or be retired and bred. "We try to supplement and upgrade a little bit, and thought she was one of five or six that made our list. She has nice conformation, and she was the first one that came up. The price was a little bit more than I wanted to pay, but they always are, the good ones." A five-year-old daughter of Hookedonthe feelin' (Citidancer)--herself a \$2.9-million FTKNOV graduate from 2006--Pussycat Doll bested Leave Me Alone to win the 2005 GI La Brea S. and made the most of two starts the following season, taking the GI Humana Distaff H. over then-stablemate Behaving Badly. She won a race at the top level for a third consecutive year when taking down top honors in the GI Santa Monica H. in January 2007, and most recently splashed home a winner of the Storm Flag Flying S. at Belmont Park Oct. 19. She has a current race record of 17-7-2-2 for earnings of \$797,182. The Jacksons have 22 mares based in the U.S., two in England, and one, Bordighera--the dam of Grandera (Ire) and the late George Washington (Ire)--in Ireland. The Jacksons were advised on yesterday's purchase by Nicoma Bloodstock's Headley Bell and bought the mare from the consignment of Hill 'n' Dale Sales, agent.

"She's owned by two parties and they just couldn't get on the same page," explained Taylor Made's Mark Taylor. "The one partner was a motivated seller, but the other couldn't really decide what he wanted. Ultimately, both parties just had a bit of seller's remorse and decided to hang on to her."

Taylor confirmed that Magnificent Song would be retired and will likely be bred to A.P. Indy. Bred on the productive Unbridled's Song/Storm Cat cross, the grey four-year-old, trained by Todd Pletcher for L & D Farm and J & B Farm, won a trio of stakes at three, including the GI Garden City BC S. She retires with five wins from 13 starts and earnings of \$445,732.

Ferguson Continues Spree with Asi...

About an hour after acquiring Octave for \$4 million, John Ferguson was back at it for the talented racemare **Asi Siempre** (El Prado {Ire}), whom he purchased for \$3 million. It was the co-fourth-highest price on the evening for a filly or mare. "She won a Grade I, she's by El

Prado (Ire), she's fast and sound and looks a real athlete," Ferguson said of the five-year-old mare, who had some success in France before becoming a top-shelf runner in American while campaigning in the colors of Martin Schwartz. The grey mare won three graded events for Schwartz and trainer Patrick Biancone, including the 2005 GIII Valley View S. on turf and the 2007 GIII Doubledogdare S. on Polytrack. Her biggest win came last year at Keeneland, when she took

down the GI Juddmonte Spinster S. by 2 1/4 lengths. First or second in 12 of 21 career starts, Asi Siempre was retired in October with \$953,237 in earnings. With just one strain of Northern Dancer and a pedigree free of Raise a Native blood, Asi Siempre is compatible with a wide variety of stallions, suiting an impressive Darley roster that features new stallions Hard Spun and Street Sense in addition to Bernardini and the established Street Cry (Ire). As for a future mate, Ferguson said, "We'll decide on one when we get her home. We have so many stallions now that, matings wise, there's no need to decide now." After not signing a ticket at last year's sale, Ferguson was a major buying force in 2007, with four purchases for \$15.75 million. In addition to Asi Siempre and Octave, Ferguson bought Indy Five Hundred for \$3 million and salestopper Round Pond for \$5.75 million.

Proud Mary Rolls to Southern Equine...

As he was making what would ultimately be the winning \$1.25-million bid for Grade I winner **Maryfield** (Elusive Quality), trainer Eric Guillot jokingly flipped through a money clip filled with \$100s and quipped, "Hold on, lemme see if I've got enough!" He had enough, and now he has the recent winner of the Breeders' Cup Filly & Mare Sprint in his barn. Just which barn that is--broodmare or racing--hasn't been determined, but Guillot said that, in all likelihood, the six-year-old Maryfield would be retired. "I don't know if it's worth running her," he said. "I'll talk to Doug [O'Neill, who trained the mare]--he and I are friends--and he'll tell me if she's got any issues. But she's too valuable to risk breaking down. I'll probably breed her to A.P. Indy, if I had to guess, and probably sell the babies." Guillot bids on behalf of Michael Moreno's Southern Equine Stables, which was represented at the Breeders' Cup this year by Juvenile contender Salute the Sarge, a MGSW in California this year. Guillot and Southern Equine have been busy at the yearling and bloodstock sales over the last year, often focusing on well-bred fillies and mares. "Our philosophy is, we're in the commercial broodmare business and the racing business, and we just bought a Grade I winner who's a big, scopey filly," said Guillot. "I think her physical hurt her a bit; she was a bit underweight, and I think that scared away some buyers. But they're going to sell horses for a lot more money than that today who didn't accomplish nearly what she did. I thought it was a no-brainer. I was going to go higher than that, to be honest with you. I thought we got a great deal." Maryfield was claimed for just \$50,000 back in January of 2006 before going on to be one of the best in her division. Trained by O'Neill, she was owned by Mark Gorman, Nick J. Mestrandea and Jim Perry.

Blossom in a Storm...

Dogwood Stable's **Cotton Blossom** (Broken Vow--For Dixie, by Dixieland Band), who defeated Dream Rush in this year's GI Acorn S. at Belmont, proved a hot commodity with breeders yesterday. The good-looking filly, a half-sister to graded stakes winner Vicarage, was knocked down to representatives of Overbrook Farm, who won the day on a \$1.9-million bid. Consigned by Three Chimneys Sales, agent for Cot Campbell's Dogwood Stable, Cotton Blossom was sold as a broodmare prospect and has earned herself a date with one of the world's premier sires. "She'll definitely be bred to Storm Cat," confirmed stallion manager Ric Waldman, who sat with Overbrook's Chris Young and several farm employees. "She's a beautiful mare. She's got enough pedigree that makes you think she'll be a producer, but her price was determined by what she did on the racetrack." Waldman added that the purchase of Cotton Blossom, who was retired from Todd Pletcher's stable after suffering a career-ending injury in August, was part of an ongoing effort to replenish the broodmare band at Overbrook. Waldman said that he expected Overbrook to pick up a few more prospects in the coming days at Keeneland. "We're going to try to be active; more active than we were tonight," he said. "We were interested in a few earlier tonight, but I'm not sure we even got a bid in." As for Cotton Blossom's \$1.9-million price tag, he said, "It was more than we expected, but this sale's just as strong as I thought it would be. There aren't too many disappointed consignors, as long as they were realistic."

Trainer Todd Pletcher, when asked how tough it was to lose a filly like Octave from his barn:

"Who knows? Maybe I'll get lucky and they'll let me train her. I'd love to have her back. But she's a great filly and I wish them well with her. It's been a tough couple of weeks. We've retired a lot of great racehorses. That's why we're in the business--to develop horses and put them in a position where they can be stallion and broodmare prospects. All the same, when you lose horses like English Channel and Lawyer Ron and, earlier in the year, Half Ours and Master Command, and mares like Honey Ryder, Cotton Blossom and Octave, they're hard to replace."

Castleton Lyons Lands a Pair...

Following the death of Castleton Lyons founder Tony Ryan at the age of 71 in early October, his son, Shane Ryan, remains determined to carry on and yesterday picked up a pair of attractive prospects for the operation. With Stuart Fitzgibbon, Castleton Lyons' general manager, Ryan purchased hip 58, the nine-year-old Quiet American mare **Pocus Hocus**. Out of MGSW Cadabra Abra (Al Hattab) and a half-sister to the dam of South African Group 1 winner James Jaguar (SAf), Pocus Hocus was a Grade III winner who also placed in the GI Ruffian H. and GII Top Flight H. while earning \$407,802. Her first foal, a yearling filly by Mineshaft named Oakshela, made \$290,000 at this year's Keeneland September sale. Pocus Hocus sold carrying a full-sibling to that filly. "She's a very nice Quiet American mare--and he's become a very nice broodmare sire," said Fitzgibbon. "We've always tried to support [Castleton Lyons stallion] Bernstein, and she'll go to him." About 90 minutes later, Castleton Lyons stepped up to the plate again, this time for hip 97, the talented three-year-old grass filly **Super Freaky** (Smart Strike--Elrose, by Deputy Minister), a Grade I-placed graded stakes winner of \$313,070. "We'll probably put her back in training," Fitzgibbon commented. "As far as a trainer, that hasn't been decided. We'll bring her back to the farm and take a look at her. She's another one that eventually will go to Bernstein." Bred on the same Smart Strike/Deputy Minister cross that produced Curlin and Grade II winner Tenpins, Super Freaky was produced by a half-sister to champion Silver Charm. She was consigned by Bluewater Sales.

Another Super Sunday...

Fasig-Tipton's Selected Mixed sale has enjoyed exponential growth in the last five years, and the company enjoyed another very strong renewal on a bright, crisp early November day. Led by the spending of Darley's John Ferguson, the sale witnessed a 28.9-percent surge in average, from \$377,235 in 2006 to \$486,318. "We thought it was absolutely huge," Fasig-Tipton's Walt Robertson commented on the substantial gain in that category. With 163 fewer horses sold (last year's sale included the ClassicStar dispersal), gross was understandably down from \$64,130,000 to \$52,036,000, but the median remained robust, rising 2.9 percent to \$180,000. Asked to talk about the market, Robertson said, "They like young, successful racemares, I can tell you that. Is the market better than last year? I'd say no--I think we've got a comparable market. But we had an awful lot of of wonderful mares tonight."

HARADASUN HEADED TO IRELAND Dual Group 1 winner **Haradasun (Aus)** (Fusaichi Pegasus) has been transferred from Melbourne-based conditioner Tony Vasil to Aidan O'Brien and will now head to Ireland. Coolmore purchased 50 percent of Haradasun from owner/breeder Frank Tagg and his partners earlier this year. After the sale, the four-year-old was runner-up in three straight group races before finishing third in the G1 Turnbull S. and the G1 Cox Plate. He was eased near the finish of Saturday's G1 Mackinnon S. and beat just one home. Jockey Damien Oliver told stewards Haradasun felt "short in his action." Vasil later reported Haradasun was lame in his near foreleg, but X-rays revealed nothing serious. The bay colt, who has six wins from 16 career starts and earnings of A\$2,376,350, will get a vacation. O'Brien indicated Haradasun will be aimed for the G1 Queen Anne S. at Royal Ascot next year, and that the GI Breeders Cup Mile at Santa Anita is a possibility. The half-brother to MG1SW Elvstroem (Aus) will leave Australia on the first available flight.

MEDICI CODE POSITIVE TESTS CONFIRMED

The California Horse Racing Board has announced that **Medici Code (GB)** (Medicean {GB}) has been disqualified from two races at Del Mar this summer due to excessive levels of the bronchodilator clenbuterol in his urine samples. The Ken Maddy Laboratory at UC Davis identified the violation, and Industrial Laboratories confirmed both samples. The three-year-old finished second in the Oceanside S. July 18 before winning the GII La Jolla H. Aug. 11; he has been disqualified, and purses will be redistributed. The disqualification of Medici Code from the La Jolla score makes the top three finishers **Worldly (GB)** (Selkirk), **Latin Rhythms** (King Cugat) and **Ten a Penny** (Gulch). The Darrell Vienna trainee later captured the \$400,000 GII Del Mar Derby Sept. 2, but did not test positive after that race. The CHRB has a complaint pending against Vienna.

I got a little scared at the quarter pole because she likes competition and I was afraid she would slow down."
