

DYLAN THOMAS IN QUARANTINE LIMBO

Dylan Thomas (Ire) (Danehill), honored last week as Europe's Cartier Horse of the Year, has not yet been released from quarantine, and will not start in Sunday's G1 Japan Cup, according to published reports. The G1 Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe hero arrived safely in Japan last Friday (Nov. 15) and was originally slated to be transferred to Tokyo Racecourse Nov. 21, according to the Japan Racing Association. The G1 Hong Kong Vase Dec. 9 at Sha Tin could be a back-up plan for the champion four-year-old. In a statement trainer Aidan O'Brien said, "Dylan Thomas was vaccinated for EVA at the

Breeders' Cup in Monmouth, New Jersey. This is a standard procedure for all stallions going to stud as it is in the best interest of the stallion and mare owner. Many of our stallions in the past have entered Japan with the EVA vaccination before

entering stud. The Hong Kong Jockey Club, aware of our problem, have extended an invitation to Dylan Thomas to run in the G1 Vase at Sha Tin on Sunday, Dec. 9."

CHINEUR FILLY TOPS GOFFS TUESDAY

Prices at Goffs' November Foal sale improved each day at last season's fixture, and that trend was mirrored this time around as Book Two of this year's catalogue opened at the Kill venue yesterday. The only lot to break the six-figure barrier was Ringfort Stud's hip 793, a bay filly from the first crop of the fast Chineur (Fr) (Fasliyev). She was secured by Tally-Ho Stud, which stands Chineur, for a sheet-topping €100,000. Her page received a major update when half-brother Redolent (Ire) (Redback {GB}) finished second in the G3 Autumn S. at Ascot last month, and it was boosted even further when that juvenile returned to run third in the G1 Criterium International at Saint-Cloud Nov. 1. Leading the way until the last hour of the session was Steeple View Stud's hip 736, who was knocked down to Gay O'Callaghan's Yeomanstown Stud for €97,000. The February-foaled filly, by this term's leading first-crop sire Acclamation (GB), is out of a winning sister to G1 Deutsches Derby third Acamani (Ger). "As a very good-looking filly by the sire of Dark Angel (Ire), who we are standing next year, we were keen to get her and she was the standout foal today," said Yeomanstown's David O'Callaghan. "She's out of a winning two-year-old from a good German family and will have a Spinning World two-year-old with Eddie Lynam to run for her next year." Renowned pinhooking operation Camas Park Stud secured the third highest-priced lot of the day, another offering by Acclamation, when landing Carrigbeg Stud's hip 666 for €90,000. Out of a winning half-sister to stakes-placed Thea River (Ire), she will return to the ring as a yearling. "She's just a very nice and very good mover by a sire that did well with his first runners this year," commented Tim Hyde Jr. "She'll be coming back for re-sale, and has an own-sister with Richard Hannon to run for her next year." A colt by last season's record-breaking freshman sire Invincible Spirit (Ire) took joint-fourth place on the lists when going to Awbeg Stud for €70,000. Offered by The Castles Stud as hip 707, he is the first foal of a half-sister to the dual listed scorer Blue Corrig (Ire). That price was matched later when Blandford Bloodstock signed for JK Thoroughbreds' hip 767, a Fasliyev filly out of an unraced daughter of G3 Cherry Hinton S. victress Nasseem (Fr). **Cont. p2**

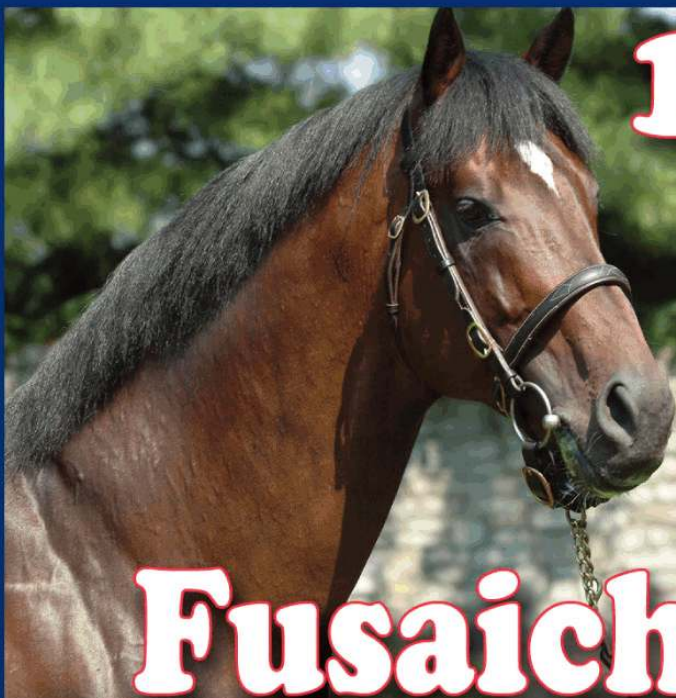

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ON THE FOX TRAIL

Conditioner Gregory Fox began training horses less than three years ago, but has been involved in the Thoroughbred industry for nearly 20 years. Fox became interested in horse racing during his tenure at Bard College in upstate New York following a visit to a nearby training center.

"In college, I was a distance runner and was studying human exercise physiology when I was introduced to horse racing through a friend and I was just immediately taken in, as we all are," the 45-year-old said. "Especially when you have a lifestyle that is geared towards sports and particularly running, and you see this whole other world full of runners. I thought at the time sports medicine application might provide a great opportunity."

Fox later transferred to Boston University, where he studied anatomy and physiology. Following graduation, Fox moved to Denmark for one year and had a paper published on muscle metabolism of Standardbred racehorses. The paper helped Fox gain entry to veterinary school at Tufts University in Boston, Massachusetts.

"I grew up in an academic home and [my parents] encouraged me to keep going with my education," he said. "I got this paper published based on the work I did in Denmark and that catapulted me into vet school."

After graduating from Tufts in 1989, Fox served an externship in Middleburg, Virginia, where he worked on Thoroughbreds. One year later, he was a racetrack veterinarian at Laurel and Pimlico.

"I practiced there successfully for about three years," Fox said of his time in Maryland. "I ended up getting a great education on the basic care of the racehorse while working there. I really became exposed to some tremendous horsemen like Vinny Blengs. I credit him with a tremendous amount of my education on the racetrack."

In 1993, Fox relocated his practice to Kentucky.

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"During that period I took care of some very nice racehorses, and was able to do everything from caring for a small stable of horses--veterinary wise--to traveling with the stallions as an attending vet for Coolmore's shuttle stallions," he commented.

Following a suspension in 1999, Fox left the world of day-to-day veterinary care and shifted gears to consulting at the sales. He took out a trainer's license in 2005 and currently operates a 24-horse stable at Fox Stable, located near the Thoroughbred Center in Lexington, Kentucky. Fox maintains his role as a veterinary sales consultant for a handful of clients.

"My wife Jamie [Brown] was training a small string of some pretty nice horses," Fox said. "We had a baby, Tyler, and we bought this farm [the former Garden Glens] and business looked like it was going to pick up. It was sort of like, O.K. you always wanted to be a trainer, well here's your chance."

Fox saddled **Slew's Tizzy** (Tiznow) to victories in the GII Coolmore Lexington S. and GIII Lone Star Derby this spring. The sophomore became Fox's first Classic starter when he finished seventh in the GI Belmont S.

"It looks like we'll start over 100 horses this year and I think we've had a good year," Fox said. "There have been some great high points and I've learned what it feels like to win a big race, but also to be at some big races that turn out to be severely disappointing."

Slew's Tiznow Pulled From Kentucky Jockey Club...

Fox confirmed yesterday that **Slew's Tiznow** (Tiznow) would sit out Saturday's GII Kentucky Jockey Club S. with a slightly low red blood cell count. He will instead point toward the GI CashCall Futurity S. at Hollywood Park Dec. 22.

"We thought it may be a little bit too much for him if he ran in this race," Fox offered. "It wasn't a sign that we were looking for. He is only two and our ultimate goals are down the line. He'll probably breeze early next week. It's not like this is something that interferes with his training, it's just a stressful thing like a race could work against us."

Fox took over the training duties for the suspended Patrick Biancone on the full brother to Slew's Tizzy in late October, but was already very familiar with the colt.

"[Owner] Joe Lacombe is one of the clients that I consult for, and part of the consultation is the evaluation of all of his horses as they grow up, and I've known Slew's Tiznow since he was born," Fox explained. "He's been outstanding physically every day of his life. We've had tremendous hope for him from the beginning. He's a very laid-back, kind and patient animal with a tremendous amount of potential. I think he's adjusted remarkably well to our traditional approach."

The Lacombe homebred graduated impressively in his second career attempt at Saratoga in August, then finished a good second in the GI Lane's End Breeders' Futurity S. last time Oct. 6.

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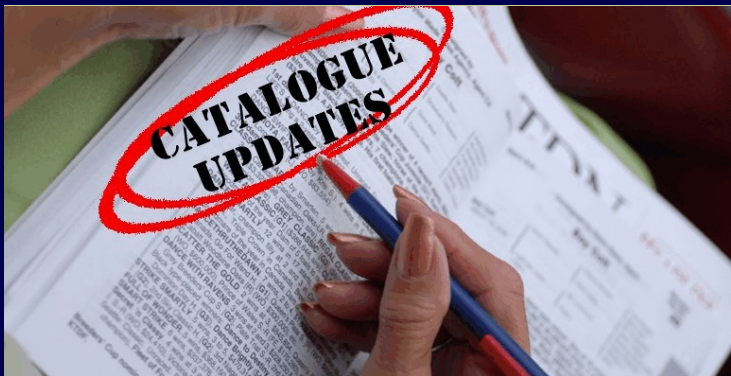

The California Horse Racing Board Medication Committee will hold a public meeting on the University of California campus Nov. 28. Items of discussion include: equine injury reporting and prevention measures, regulation of anabolic steroids, out-of-competition testing, emergency preparedness and Equine Herpes Virus monitoring. "All the time we hear of misperceptions about medication testing, injuries and other issues," said CHRB Chairman Richard B. Shapiro. "This is a rare chance to really understand the science and study of our efforts. I hope many people will avail themselves of this opportunity to better understand our efforts to protect the integrity of the sport and our horses."

YOUMZAIN HEADING CHANNON'S DUBAI CHALLENGE

Youmzain (Ire) (Sinndar {Ire}), a Group 1 winner at three and second by a head to Dylan Thomas (Ire) in the G1 Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe in October, will head to Dubai for the International Racing Carnival. Jaber Abdullah's four-year-old ran third in the G1 Dubai Sheema Classic in his 2007 opener.

"Youmzain came straight to the Dubai Sheema Classic last year without a run, but we might aim him first at the [G3] Dubai City of Gold [Mar. 6] over the same distance," trainer Mick Channon said. Channon plans to be solidly represented at the Carnival with the likes of **Majestic Roi** (Street Cry {Ire}), heroine of the G1 Sun Chariot S. Oct. 6; and **Halicarnassus (Ire)** (Cape Cross {Ire}), a two-time Group 3 winner in 2007. "We've got a great team for Dubai, with...Majestic Roi and also Halicarnassus, who I have a lot of faith in," Channon added. "The Carnival and Dubai World Cup meeting have both gone from strength to strength over the years, and I can tell you that any trainer who doesn't consider these races is not doing his job properly. It gives you the chance and incentive to keep good horses in training, and it's fantastic to see all these horses from all over the place coming to Dubai. It makes the world of racing that much smaller." The Dubai Racing Club received applications from 91 different trainers representing 19 countries. "The 2008 Dubai International Racing Carnival promises to be the classiest yet," said DRC Manager Martin Talty. "We have 21 individual horses who won Group 1 contests in 2007, compared to 16 the previous Carnival, and we received 16 percent more applicants than last time around."
