FERGUSON FIREWORKS AT TATTERSALLS

John Ferguson purchased a quartet of three-year-olds for a total of 10.1-million gns on a lively opening breeding stock session of the Tattersalls December Sale in Newmarket yesterday. Ferguson, acting on behalf of Sheikh Mohammed, set a new European record for a filly in training when buying G1 Prix de l'Opera winner

Satwa Queen (GB) (Muhtathir) for 3.4-million guineas. Niarchos family racing manager Alan Cooper was among the early players for the five-time group winner, but the final exchanges were fought out between Charlie Gordon-Watson, standing with Coolmore's Paul Shanahan, and Ferguson.

"She's an outstanding racemare and she won the Prix de l'Opera which is one of the great races for fillies every year," said Ferguson. "She has a wonderful character and is a great individual so we are delighted to have her." The record for a filly, established 12 months ago when Spinning Queen (GB) sold for 3-million guineas, had already been surpassed earlier in the session by G2 Cherry Hinton and G3 Albany S. winner **Sander Camillo** (Dixie Union). Ferguson bid against Shanahan himself for lot 1923, consigned from Jeremy Nosedá's stable, eventually getting her for 3.2 million guineas. "I thought she'd make a lot of money and can understand why she was in great demand," said Ferguson of Sander Camillo. "She oozed quality and was a top-class racemare at two. She was an exceptional individual and she's a likely candidate to be covered by Street Cry (Ire) in America. Street Sense is out of a mare by Dixieland Band, so we know the cross works well. We are consistently on the lookout for quality bloodlines throughout the world and we are very lucky to have such an exciting group of young horses at stud."

Ferguson Busy at Tattersalls (cont. from p1)

John Ferguson had earlier spent a total of 3.5-million guineas on two lots offered from the Niarchos family's Haras de Fresnay-le-Buffard. He paid 1.8-million guineas to outbid BBA Ireland's Adrian Nicoll for **Ama** (Storm Cat), a daughter of Miesque and half-sister to Kingmambo; while John Warren, standing with Newsells Park Stud manager Julian Dollar, came off second best for lot 1895. Ferguson went up to 1.7-million guineas on Bago (Fr)'s listed-winning half-sister **Beta** (GB) (Selkirk), who is from the well-established family of Coup de Genie through the bluehen mare Coup de Folie, dam of Machiavellian. "They'll both be retired, but mating plans are undecided," said Ferguson. "They are two of the best pedigrees in the book. Ama is a sister to Kingmambo, who is one of the great turf sires, while Beta is a sister to an Arc winner from a great family that we know well, having stood Machiavellian as a stallion." **Indian Ink** (Ire) (Indian Ridge), the 25,000gns yearling who won this year's G1 Coronation S. and last season's G1 Cheveley Park S. for owner Raymond Tooth, is another now in Maktoum ownership. Sheikh Hamdan Al Maktoum's racing manager Angus Gold fought off Anthony Stroud for the three-year-old. "It's all pretty obvious, you don't get too many chances to buy a filly who was a Group 1 winner at two and three. Sheikh Hamdan was very keen to have her and she won't run again," said Gold. Richard Brown of Blandford Bloodstock bought the dearest member of a dispersal from Haras de Bouquetot, the Normandy stud of Nicholas Springer, G1 Preis der Diana second **White Rose** (Ger) (Platini {Ger}). He paid 620,000gns to outbid Charlie Gordon-Watson, standing with Paul Shanahan and Tom Magnier. "She's a good racemare in foal to a top-class racehorse--it's what you look for," said Brown, who could not disclose his client's identity. The sale continues today at 9:30 am.

EDITOR'S NOTE: The list of top-priced horses at Tattersalls which appeared in Sunday's *TDN* referenced consignor Brick Kiln. In fact, Ellie Wright, the former stud manager at Brick Kiln, has leased the stud for the last two years and consigned all the Tattersalls December foals in her own name.

HOST TO AUSTRALIA Grade I winner **Host** (Chi) (Hussonet--Colonna Traiana {Chi}, by Roy) has been sold to Australian interests for stud duties, according to published reports. The seven-year-old was champion two-year-old, three-year-old and Horse of the Year in his native Chile. Transferred to the U.S., Host won the 2005 GI Shadwell Turf Mile, as well as the 2004 renewals of the GII Knickerbocker H. and GIII Tropical Turf H. for Melnyk Racing Stables and trainer Todd Pletcher. Host was on the board in 13 of 21 North American starts and earned \$789,399. Byron Rogers is syndicate manager for the stallion.

She was covered by the ill-fated George Washington (Ire) before being covered by Danehill Dancer (Ire).

Mandellicht is carrying a full-brother or sister to Manduro and could easily threaten this sale's record.

A 49,000gns TATDEC purchase in 2004, Stage Presence's first foal--a filly by Spectrum (Ire)--was sold for €30,000 at Tattersalls Ireland earlier in September. Her next foal, a filly by Danehill Dancer (Ire), brought €70,000 at the Irish venue in 2005. Subsequently named English Ballet (Ire), the filly went on to take the 2006 G3 Sweet Solera S. and place in the G2 May Hill S. and the G1 Fillies' Mile S. Her filly by High Chaparral (Ire) sold for €42,000 in 2006, but it was largely the efforts of English Ballet that saw the mare's stock rise this term when her latest foal, another filly by Danehill Dancer, was purchased by Hugo Lascelles Bloodstock for 375,000gns at the Tattersalls October sale. Lascelles returned to Tattersalls this time to secure the source--who is believed to be in foal to Danehill Dancer--and record a tidy profit.

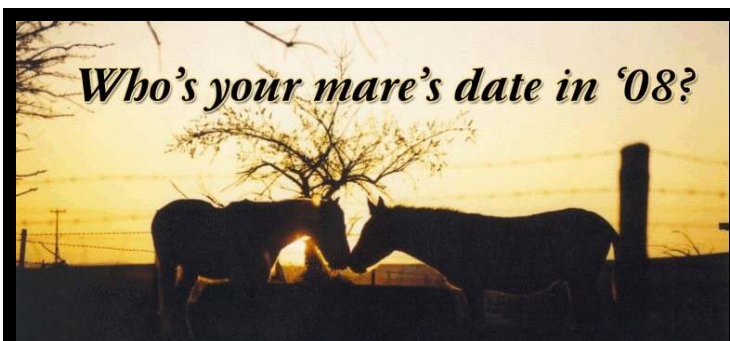

Bearing in mind that Distorted Humor's fee has risen from \$10,000 to \$300,000 in the space of seven years, I can't help wondering what the future might have held for End Sweep had he not been exported after the 1999 season.

After all, End Sweep, like Distorted Humor, was sired by Forty Niner from a graded-winning granddaughter of Northern Dancer. And, like Distorted Humor, he was placed in both the GI Jerome H. and GII King's Bishop S. In the process, End Sweep, like Distorted Humor, showed more speed than stamina, notably winning the Highlander H., GIII Jersey Shore Breeders' Cup S. and the Kentucky Cup Sprint.

One difference between these similar sons of Forty Niner was that, unlike Distorted Humor, End Sweep didn't start his stallion career in Kentucky. Instead he commenced stallion duties at the age of four in 1995 at Harry T Mangurian Jr's Mockingbird Farm in Florida. Apparently the original intention was for End Sweep to stay in training after the age of three, in a bid to add to his reputation in much the same way that Distorted Humor was later to do. Unfortunately Mockingbird lost Copelan, one of its leading stallions, in October 1994 and End Sweep was retired prematurely to fill the void. However, he had already had plenty of opportunities to display his talents, as he had faced the starter six times as a juvenile and on another 10 occasions at three. He failed to reach the first three only once in those 16 starts.

End Sweep quickly proved himself a capable substitute for Copelan. From a first crop of 74 named foals, he had 49 starters and he set new record figures when 33 of them won. In the process he landed the title of champion freshman sire, at the same time bringing himself to the attention of breeders in Japan, where his son South Vigorous was successful. South Vigorous went on to build a record of 16 wins from 33 starts and he achieved a string of group sprint successes at the ages of six and seven. Another durable performer from this first crop was Nany's Sweep, winner of the GI Santa Monica H. as a five-year-old.

End Sweep remained in Florida to stand the 1999 season at a fee of \$12,500, but he was sold to Arrowfield Stud in Australia. Some Kentucky studs reportedly tried to secure his northern hemisphere services, but Shadai Stallion Station in Japan proved to be End Sweep's destination. He proceeded to shuttle between Australia and Japan and was nearing the end of his third Japanese season when he suffered a fall. This led to a loss of coordination and he had to be euthanized at the age of 11.

While it is futile to speculate about what he might have achieved if Kentucky had been his destination, End Sweep's five American crops did enough to suggest that his fee, like Distorted Humor's, would have risen substantially. He took the titles of leading second- and third-crop sire, with his second crop featuring the Grade I winners Trippi and Swept Overboard, plus the Grade III winner Precise End. His third crop included Dark Ending, a Grade I winner in Canada.

But it has been in Japan that End Sweep's progeny have arguably been seen to finest effect. In Rhein Kraft and Sweep Toshio, he sired two of the toughest and most talented fillies of recent seasons and both achieved a Group 1 victory against the males. Sweep Toshio's victims in the 2005 Takarazuka Kinen included Sunday Silence's internationally proven sons Heart's Cry and Zenno Rob Roy, while Rhein Kraft took the NHK Mile Cup, having earlier defeated the future American Oaks winner Cesario in the Japanese 1000 Guineas.

But it was Admire Moon, a colt from End Sweep's final crop, who represents the stallion's finest achievement.

The Japanese community was given notice of Sheikh Mohammed's determination to develop Darley Japan into a major force when his team paid a reported \$33,000,000 for Admire Moon in July. The four-year-old justified his purchase when he landed the G1 Japan Cup. The versatile Admire Moon now has every chance of developing into a worthy successor to End Sweep.

Admire Moon indirectly represents another tribute to that great stallion Sunday Silence, as his dam My Katies is a daughter of this revolutionary stallion, who is much more than just a Japanese phenomenon.

The 1989 Kentucky Derby and Preakness winner is so far clear on Japan's list of leading broodmare sires that he is assured his first title in this sphere. In addition to being responsible for first and second in the Japan Cup, his daughters have produced numerous other stakes winners in 2007, including Vermilion, winner of the G1 Japan Cup Dirt.

Some of their success has come outside of Japan. The G3 Prix La Rochette at Longchamp was won by Young Pretender, an Oasis Dream colt whose dam Silent Heir is an Australian-foaled daughter of Sunday Silence. Six days later, at Belmont, the GII Futurity S. was won by Tale of Ekati, a Tale of the Cat colt out of Sunday Silence's daughter Silence Beauty.

Both Young Pretender and Tale of Ekati are two-year-olds and so is Natagora, Europe's leading juvenile filly over sprint distances. This admirably speedy filly is by Sunday Silence's son Divine Light, which encourages the belief that the new Kentucky stallions Hat Trick and Silent Name will have plenty to offer American breeders. At the same time, American breeders should also keep an eye on Sunday Break, who represents the same Forty Niner/Northern Dancer cross as End Sweep and Distorted Humor.

I once questioned whether Forty Niner was an ideal stallion for Japan, but End Sweep and Admire Moon have forced me to revise that view. Admire Moon is bound to be very popular with Japanese breeders, as his third dam is Katies, an Irish 1000 Guineas winner who produced three good Japanese winners. One of them, the Theatrical filly Hishi Amazon, built up huge earnings in the process of becoming champion of her sex at two, three and four.

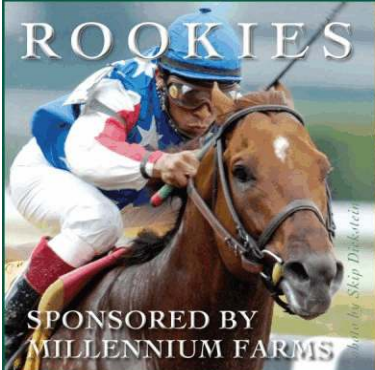

JIM FLEMING DIES Renowned NSW owner and breeder and supermarket magnate Jim Fleming, who suffered a stroke Nov. 3, died in St. Vincent's Private Hospital in Sydney Dec. 1. He was 75. The patriarch of the Fleming Group of Companies, Jim is survived by his three sons, Lee, Dean and Paul. Fleming, former chairman of the Sydney Turf Club, was instrumental in lifting the prestige of the Golden Slipper S., giving it a profile in Sydney to rival that of the Melbourne Cup. Fleming was Aushorse chairman in the 1990s and served on the STC board of directors between 1978 and 1992. He was chairman between 1983 and 1990, before retiring in 1992. Fleming was an active breeder with an elite band of 40 broodmares at Tyreel Stud in Richmond, NSW, which he bought in 1986. His stud is responsible for 54 group winners, with 17 at the Group I level, and earnings over A\$25 million. Among race mares that Fleming had success with in more recent times were Bonanova (Aus), Asia (Aus) and Moon Dragon (Aus) and his broodmare band includes Republic Lass (Aus), Dashing Eagle (Aus) and Starcraft (NZ)'s dam Flying Floozie (NZ). Fleming, who made his fortune with food stores that were sold to Woolworths in 1960, had a NSW property named Stone Lodge until 1985, which now forms part of the Vinery property at Scone. Tyreel Stud produced such luminaries as Bint Marscay (Aus), winner of the 1993 STC Golden Slipper, who was sold under the Tyreel banner at the 1992 Inglis Australian Easter Yearling Sale for A\$100,000. Fleming enjoyed success on the international stage selling the highest priced filly at the Keeneland September Yearling Sale in 2005 when his Storm Cat filly from Warrior Queen fetched \$3.8 million. He also enjoyed success as an owner in the Northern Hemisphere when the Woodman filly Hula Angel, now a Tyreel Stud resident, won the Group 1 Irish 1,000 Guineas in 1999. Funeral arrangements will be announced soon.

WADHAM PURCHASES NEWLANDS Peter Rowsthorn's Wadham Park has purchased Walter Alteri's 468-acre Newlands Thoroughbreds property at Seymour in Victoria for a reported A\$7.5 million. Alteri confirmed that he would retain resident stallion Kempinsky (NZ), who has stood at Newlands since he was retired from racing in 2005, and his current broodmare band. Rowsthorn has reportedly spent more than A\$15-million on developing a 135-acre training complex at his Wadham Park-base at Tylden, near Woodend, about 70 km north-west of Melbourne. Rowsthorn has also outlaid more than A\$10 million on his Woodside Park Stud, which spreads over 321 acres, adjacent to Wadham Park.
